### **RIVALRY RENEWED: WILDCATS HEAD TO KNOXVILLE**

Kentucky's most-played football rivarly renews its 116th edition Saturday as the Wildcats travel to Knoxville to take on the No. 18/17-ranked Tennessee Volunteers. Game time is noon EDT and it will be televised on the SEC Network.

The Wildcats (1-2) are coming off their first victory of the season, a 24-2 decision over visiting Mississippi State. Kentucky intercepted six passes in the game, tying for the second-most in school history. Two of those pickoffs resulted in points, including linebacker Jordan Wright's eight-yard return for a touchdown and defensive end Josh Paschal's 76-yard pick-and-ramble that set up a two-yard scoring run by Chris Rodriguez. UK also got interceptions from CB Kelvin Joseph, LB Boogie Watson, LB Jamin Davis and LB D'Eryk Jackson. The game marked the first time in 11 years that the UK opponent had not scored a touchdown or field goal and the first time in 24 years that a Southeastern Conference opponent had not tallied a TD or field goal.

After opening the season with wins over South Carolina and Missouri, Tennessee is coming off a 44-21 loss at No. 3-ranked Georgia. Veteran QB Jarrett Guarantano has thrown for 664 yards and four touchdowns while the defense is led by sophomore linebacker Henry To'o To'o, who has 23 tackles and an interception.

### **QUICK NOTES**

- Kentucky is in its 130th season of intercollegiate football.
- Kentucky is coming off its first win of the season, a 24-2 defensive clinic vs. Mississippi State.
- The Cats did not allow a touchdown or field goal for the first time since 2009 (a 42-0 shutout of Miami University). It marked the first time UK has held an SEC opponent without an TD or field goal since a 25-0 shutout of Vanderbilt in 1996.
- The six interceptions against Mississippi State were the second-most in school history and most since grabbing seven vs. Florida in 1993. UK now leads the SEC and ranks fifth nationally in passes intercepted.
- Kentucky is looking for its first win over Tennessee since 2017 and first in Knoxville since 1984.
- Coach Mark Stoops is in his eighth season in Lexington. He is 45-46 overall.

- Kentucky has rushed for at least 400 yards in four of its past seven games and currently lead the SEC and rank 19th nationally in rushing offense (212.3).
- Against Ole Miss, UK had its most total offense in an SEC home game (559 yards) since Nov. 13, 2010 vs. Vanderbilt (580 yards).
- The Cats had three players (Chris Rodriguez Jr., A.J. Rose and Terry Wilson) rush for more than 100 yards vs. Ole Miss, the first time in the modern era (since 1946) the program has had three 100-yard rushers in a game.
- Against Ole Miss, the Cats had their most rushing touchdowns against an SEC opponent (six) since Oct. 6, 1973 at Mississippi State (six).
- UK had allowed 34 points or less in 28 straight games, the longest active streak in the nation, before Ole Miss tallied 42. The 28 straight games at 34 points or less was the longest for Kentucky since a 45-game streak from 1976-80.
- UK has allowed 30 or fewer points in 28 of the past 30 games.
- By allowing just 20 yards rushing to Mississippi State last week the Cats now have held an opponent to 20 rushing yards or less twice in the past six games.
- UK allowed just 91 rushing yards at No. 8 Auburn, fewest against a top-10 ranked opponent since 2010 vs. South Carolina and fewest against a top-10 ranked opponent on the road since 1999 vs. Mississippi State.
- The Wildcats had the third-most wins among SEC East schools from 2017-19 (25). Only Georgia (36) and Florida (26) had more.
- Thirteen true freshmen have see action so this season: WR Izayah Cummings, LB Torrance Davis, DL Josaih Hayes, LB D'Eryk Jackson, RB JuTahn McClain, DL Octavious Oxendine, DB Andru Phillips, DL Justin Rogers, DL Tre'Vonn Rybka, WR Earnest Sanders IV, DB Vito Tisdale, DB Carrington Valentine and DB Joel Williams. Additionally, transfer DB Kelvin Joseph and sophomore LS Cade Degraw saw their first action in blue and white.
- UK is aiming for a fifth-consecutive winning season. It would be the first time the program has accomplished that since posting 11 straight winning seasons from 1946-56.
- UK set new single-season records in rushing yards (3,624), rushing touchdowns (36) and yards per rushing attempt (6.32) in 2019.
- Punter Max Duffy was named the 2019 Ray Guy Award winner and earned first-team All-America honors by seven national selectors.
- Duffy is the school's all-time leading punter at 46.50 yards per kick. He bombed a career-long 75-yard punt in the opener at Auburn. It is the third-longest in school history behind Paul Calhoun's 80-yarder vs. Indiana in 1983 and Randy Jenkins' 78-yarder vs. Tennessee in 1983.
- Once again, Kentucky ranks amongst the nation's best in net punting with a 43.87 average, ranking 11th in the country.
- The Wildcats finished in the top 25 of total defense in 2018 and 2019. UK ranked 23rd in 2018 (337.9) and is 21st in 2019 (324.6) in yards allowed per game. The mark was the lowest since 1989 (320.3).
- Since 2016, UK is 13-7 in games decided by seven points or less.
- Kentucky won 32 games from 2016-19, the most in a four-season span since 1950-53, when Paul "Bear" Bryant was coach of the Cats.
- During Stoops' tenure the Wildcats have had eight different starting quarterbacks win a game.
- Stoops has 45 wins during his tenure, the third-most in school history. Stoops also has 33 home wins at Kentucky, tied with Bear Bryant for the most in school history.
- The Wildcats signed the No. 20 recruiting class in the nation for 2020, featuring one 5-star recruit and eight 4-star recruits. It marked the fifth consecutive season the program has landed a top 30 class.

#### **SERIES VS. TENNESSEE**

- Tennessee leads the all-time series 81-25-9, including 43-10-6 in Knoxville.
- Kentucky has not won in Knoxville since a 17-12 victory in 1984.
- With 115 total games played, it is third-most played rivalry in Southeastern Conference history.

  Only Auburn-Georgia (124 games) and Ole Miss-Mississippi State (116) have been played more.
- Last season, Kentucky fell to Tennessee, 17-13, in Lexington despite dominating the time of possession and piling up more than 300 rushing yards.

### **MILESTONES TO LOOK FOR...**

- Head coach Mark Stoops has 45 career victories at Kentucky, ranking him third on the school's all-time list. He needs two more wins to tie Fran Curci (1973-1981) at No. 2.
- Senior running back Asim Rose Jr. has rushed for 1,475 yards in his career, which ranks him 23rd on the school's all-time list. He needs nine more yards to pass Mike Fanuzzi (1971-74) for 22nd
- Rose averages 5.57 yards per carry in his career, fourth on the UK all-time list (min. 200 att.)
- Senior OLB Jamar "Boogie" Watson has 15.5 career sacks. He needs two to tie Jeremy Jarmon (2006-08) for fifth on the school's all-time list.
- Senior QB Terry Wilson has 812 career rushing yards. He needs 188 to become the 39th player in school history to reach 1,000.
- The Cats had two plays from the Tennessee two-yard line in the final two minutes with a chance to win but were unable to push across the goal line.
- UK lead 13-0 after the first quarter and marched into Tennessee territory on five of its last six possessions but were unable to score again.
- The two teams have played annually since 1919 except for 1943 (war year, no team for either
- Biggest UK win: 56 (56-0) in 1893 in Knoxville
- Biggest Tennessee win: 52 (52-0) in 1994 in Knoxville
- Games decided by 7 points or less (excluding ties): Tennessee leads 28-12
- UK coach Mark Stoops is 1-6 vs. Tennessee during his tenure.

#### **KENTUCKY-TENNESSEE CONNECTIONS**

- · Kentucky has three players on its roster from the state of Tennessee: DL Quinton Bohanna (Cordova), DL Tre'vonn Rybka (Dickson) and OT Darian Kinnard (Knoxville).
- · Despite its proximity, Tennessee has only one player from the Commonwealth on its roster: DB Trel Riley (Princeton).
- UK offensive coordinator/running backs coach Eddie Gran was the special teams coordinator and RB coach at Tennessee in 2009. He coached in the Chick-fil-A Bowl that season.
- UK co-offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach Darin Hinshaw spent three seasons at Tennessee. He was the QB coach in 2010 and 2011, and the receivers coach in 2012.
- UK Director of Athletics Mitch Barnhart worked in Tennessee's athletics department from 1986-98.
- Tennessee defensive coordinator Derrick Ansley coached cornerbacks under Stoops from 2013-14 and was the co-defensive coordinator and secondary coach in 2015.
- Tennessee co-defensive coordinator and defensive line coach Jimmy Brumbaugh is in his first season with the program. He was UK's defensive line coach from 2013-16.
- Tennessee assistant head coach/passing game coordinator/wide receiver coach Tee Martin coached wide receivers at Kentucky under Joker Phillips in 2010-11, adding passing game coordinator responsibilities in 2011.
- Tennessee quality control analyst Mike Colosimo is a native of Villa Hills, Kentucky and was a graduate assistant at Kentucky from 2016-18, working closely with Vince Marrow and the tight
- Tennessee director of recruiting content Clay Bollinger is a native of Louisville, Kentucky and a 2017 graduate of Kentucky. He worked as a student manager and a student recruiting assistant during his time at UK.

### **LAST TIME OUT**

- Kentucky suffocated Mississippi State on the way to a 24-2 victory at Kroger Field.
- It was the first time the Wildcats held an opponent without a touchdown or field goal in 11 years and the first time since 1996 they did not yield a TD or field goal to an SEC opponent (25-0 win vs. Vanderbilt).
- It was the first time UK has had three consecutive wins against Miss. State in Lexington since 1958-1990 (five straight) and the largest margin of victory against Miss. State since Oct. 25, 2003 when UK won by 25 points.

- It was the first time Kentucky has defeated an SEC opponent in consecutive home games by at least 21 points since 1996-98 vs. Vanderbilt and the first time Kentucky has recorded a SEC home win by at least 21 points in three consecutive seasons since 1949-1952.
- The win gave Mark Stoops a school-record 33 wins at Kroger Field/Commonwealth Stadium, surpassing Jerry Claiborne's mark of 32 and tied Paul "Bear" Bryant for the most home wins in school history.
- The Cats' defense was unyielding, holding the "Air Raid" offense to just 275 passing yards on 70 attempts (3.99 yards per pass attempt) and intercepting six passes. The six INTs were the second-most in school history and most since grabbing seven vs. Florida in 1993.
- The defense also held the Bulldogs to just 20 rushing yards, the second time in the past six contests UK has not allowed more than 20 yards rushing.
- D'Eryk Jackson, Kelvin Joseph, Josh Paschal, Boogie Watson and Jordan Wright each had the first INT of their career.
- LB Jamin Davis, wearing No. 22 to honor teammate Chris Oats, had a critical INT in the end zone and recorded a career-best 11 tackles. UK also won the game by 22 points the same week Oats returned home for the first time in months due to a serious medical condition.
- Wright's INT went for an eight-yard touchdown return. He now has both an INT and fumble return touchdown in the past four games. Wright's INT return for a score was the first for a Wildcat since Mike Edwards vs. Middle Tennessee in 2018.
- True freshmen to make their collegiate debut included: DL Josaih Hayes, DL Octavious Oxendine, DB Andru Phillips, DL Justin Rogers, DL Tre'Vonn Rybka.

#### A UK WIN WOULD...

- Give Kentucky its 11th all-time win in Knoxville.
- Be the first win in Knoxville since a 17-12 victory in 1984.
- Even the series at two wins apiece over the past four seasons.
- Give Stoops 46 career victories at UK, putting him just one shy of tying Fran Curci (1973-81) for second on the school's all-time list.
- Give Stoops his 11th road victory as head coach.
- Improve Terry Wilson to 14-5 as UK's starting quarterback.

#### **KENTUCKY VS. THE RANKED**

- Kentucky has played 252 ranked teams in the Associated Press Poll in its history. The Cats are 44-203-5 in those games.
- Since 2015, the Cats are 5-7 against ranked teams. The wins were over No. 12 Penn State, No. 14

#### **DAUNTING SCHEDULE**

- With the Covid-19 pandemic creating a 10-game Southeastern Conference-only schedule this season, Kentucky will face one of the most difficult slate of games in its history.
- Of the 10 games, nine feature an opponent that was either ranked or receiving votes in one of the two major polls (AP, Coaches) when play started on Sept. 26.
- UK will face four teams ranked in the AP Top 10 as the season opened: No. 2 Alabama, No. 4 Georgia, No. 5 Florida and No. 8 Auburn. Three of those games are on the road.
- When the schedule was adjusted to conference-only games the Cats added contests against No.
   8 Auburn and Ole Miss, in its first season under coach Lane Kiffin.

#### **KENTUCKY TO HONOR CHRIS OATS BY ROTATING NO. 22**

- Kentucky football has been honoring junior linebacker Chris Oats this season, who has been battling a serious medical condition since May, when a different player is chosen each week of the season to wear Oats' No. 22. Fellow linebacker DeAndre Square was the first to wear No. 22 in the season opener vs. Auburn, while Oats' roommate Keaton Upshaw took the honor in UK's first home game on Oct. 3 vs. Ole Miss.
- LB Jamin Davis wore No. 22 last week vs. Mississisppi State. While wearing the jersey he intercepted a pass in the end zone on the final play of the first half to secure UK's 14-0 lead at the break. He also recorded his first double-digit tackle game.
- LB Jordan Wright will don No. 22 this weekend vs. Tennessee.
- The team is wearing #22OATSSTRONG wristbands to show their support and they
  conclude each team practice with "22!" Members of the team have also created a website
  www.22OATSSTRONG.COM with a GoFundMe page to help the family with medical bills.

### **OFFENSE**

- "Balance" has been the hallmark of the Kentucky offense under Eddie Gran, UK assistant head coach for offense. The Wildcats have totaled more than 2,000 rushing yards and 2,000 passing yards in three of the four seasons that Gran has been here. Prior to Gran's arrival, this had been accomplished in only two seasons total in school history. The Cats just narrowly missed 2,000 passing yards in 2019, despite a receiver-turned-quarterback, Lynn Bowden Jr., taking over the starting QB spot in the final eight games of the season.
- Nine offensive starters return in 2020, including quarterback Terry Wilson (2018 starter) who sat out most of last season with a knee injury. Also returning are running back A.J. Rose, wide receiver Josh Ali, tight end Justin Rigg, along with four members of the "Big Blue Wall" in LT Landon Young, RG Luke Fortner, C Drake Jackson and RT Darian Kinnard.
- The Cats have averaged at least 25.5 points per game from 2016-19, the first time in school history that UK has done it four years in a row.
- In the first four years of the Gran era, UK has rushed for 11,362 yards, most in a four-year period in school history.
- UK has had a 1,000-yard rusher in four straight seasons (Boom Williams, Benny Snell Jr., Lynn Bowden Jr.); prior to this, UK had never had 1,000-yard rushers in back-to-back seasons, let alone four straight seasons.
- Despite having starting quarterbacks who had never played in a major-college game in 2016 (Stephen Johnson) and 2018 (Terry Wilson) and a receiver-turned-quarterback in 2019 (Lynn Bowden Jr.), UK won 32 games from 2016-19 and advanced to four straight bowl games.
- Kentucky currently ranks 19th nationally and leads the SEC in rushing offense (212.3).

#### Quarterbacks

- Gone is the receiver-turned-quarterback, Lynn Bowden Jr., who led the Wildcats for the final eight games of the 2019 season before declaring for the NFL draft, but returning is senior Terry Wilson, who won the starting QB job at the start of the 2018 season and led the Wildcats to their first 10-win season since 1977. He began the 2019 season right where he left off as the starting QB in the first two games, before suffering a torn patellar tendon in his right knee in the third quarter vs. Eastern Michigan.
- Wilson returned to game action this season and has completed 61.3 percent of his passes for 463 yards and two touchdowns. He's also seventh in the SEC in rushing with 73.7 yards per game and three TDs.
- Nicknamed "Terry Touchdown" in high school, the signal caller has completed 65.6 percent of his career

- Wilson, who redshirted as a freshman at Oregon (2016), threw for 2,133 yards and 26 touchdowns in one junior college season (2017).
- Wilson proved he is back from his injury in a blistering performance vs. Ole Miss where he became the third Kentucky quarterback in school history to have at least 150 passing yards and 125 rushing yards in the same game (Pookie Jones vs. Kent State, Sept. 4, 1993; Shane Boyd vs. Indiana, Sept. 18, 2004).

The senior is returning to the field after missing most of the 2019 season due to a knee injury, although he had exploded out of the gates before he went down. In two games he completed 63.5 percent of his passes for 360 yards and two scores with another 44 rushing yards and a score.

Wilson's value to the Wildcats runs deeper than raw numbers, as he is 13-5 as a starter, and entered the season with the best record for any UK quarterback in his first 15 starts with starting lineups available since 1993. In 2018, he started all 13 games and led UK to its first 10-win season since 1977, including a VRBO Citrus Bowl victory. He is the only SEC quarterback to have had at least five games with a completion percentage of at least 70-percent (min. 20 attempts).

The namesake of the Golden Arm Award has a storied history. Johnny Unitas was an 18-year veteran of the NFL, who played his collegiate career at the University of Louisville before joining the Baltimore Colts in 1958. His NFL career passing figures include 2,830 pass completions for 40,239 yards, 290 touchdowns and throwing a touchdown pass in 47 consecutive games.

This award is presented annually to the top senior and upperclassman guarterback set to graduate with their class by the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Educational Foundation and Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Selection Committee. Candidates are chosen based on player performance on and off the field.

### **Running Backs**

- Gran's running-back room goes six deep and features a three-headed monster from last season in senior A.J. Rose and sophomores Chris Rodriguez Jr. and Kavosiey Smoke.
- Rose was the team's second-leading rusher behind Bowden in 2019 with 826 yards and six scores. He became the 37th player in school history to reach 1,000 career rushing yards and his total of 1,475 moves him to 23rd on UK's all-time list. Rose also ranks fourth on UK's career yards per attempt list at 5.57 rushing yards per carry, behind only Bowden, Boom Williams and Randall Cobb.
- Rodriguez saw action in all 13 games last season and totaled 71 carries for 533 yards and six scores. He averaged 7.5 yards per carry (second on the team behind Bowden's school record 7.9 ypc). He rushed for a career-best 133 yards and two scores vs. Ole Miss on Oct. 3, 2020.
- Smoke was UK's third-leading rusher in '19 with 616 yards on 101 attempts and six scores, averaged 6.1 yards per attempt. He ranked in the top 10 among SEC freshman leaders in the following categories: fifth in rushing (47.5 per game), ninth in all-purpose yards (50.7) and 10th in total offense (47.5) and scoring (2.8).
- Sophomore Tyler Markray and redshirt freshman Travis Tisdale are looking to make an impact along with mid-year enrollee and freshman JuTahn McClain. Tisdale showed his flash last season with a 53-yard run and averaged 11.4 per carry in limited action.
- In 2019, UK set single-season records in rushing yards (3,624), rushing touchdowns (36) and yards per rushing attempt (6.32).

### **PART OF THE GRAN-D DESIGN**

- Since taking over the Kentucky running game upon his arrival in 2016, Eddie Gran has fashioned the Cats into one of the more physical and prolific rushing attacks not only in the SEC, but in the country.
- The work culminated in 2019 with 278.8 rushing yards per game, ranking fourth nationally. The Cats currently rank ninth nationally with 212.3 yards per game.
- The Cats averaged 234.2 rushing yards per game in 2016, Gran's first in Lexington, 161.7 yards per game in 2017 and 199.4 in 2018. Those numbers are significant in that only twice in the previous 20 seasons had a UK offense rushed for more than 162 yards per game (2015 and 2009) and not for more than 200 per game since 1993 (210.5).
- Gran has mentored the likes of Benny Snell Jr. and Stanley "Boom" Williams at Kentucky, Chris Thompson, Devonta Freeman and James Wilder Jr. (Florida State), Montario Hardesty (Tennessee), Carnell Williams, Ronnie Brown, Kenny Irons and Rudi Johnson (Auburn) and Deuce McAllister (Ole Miss). During his 26 seasons as a running backs coach he's spent 20 of those against top-shelf competition in the SEC and Atlantic Coast Conference, making the numbers even more impressive.

#### Wide Receivers

- · First-year wide receivers coach Jovon Bouknight, who was added on the coaching staff in March after one season at Oregon, has a mix of experience and young talent at his disposal this season.
- The top returning pass catcher, Josh Ali, is back for his senior season after 23 catches for 233 yards and a team-high three receiving touchdowns last year. Perhaps two of the biggest plays in his career came in the Belk Bowl on UK's final drive of 2019. He made a diving grab of a low pass on fourth down to extend the drive and then hauled in the game-winning 13-yard strike from Bowden with 15 seconds remaining.
- Ali made a strong start to the 2020 season with nine catches for 98 yards, both career highs, at Auburn. He followed that up with seven catches for 88 yards vs. Ole Miss. His 6.0 pass receptions per game rank ninth in the SEC.
- · Sophomore Akeem Hayes made two catches vs. Auburn, including an eight-yard grab that is his first collegiate touchdown.
- · Redshirt freshman DeMarcus Harris had four catches at Auburn and Allen Dailey Jr. had two receptions in the opener.

#### Tight Ends

- Tight ends coach Vince Marrow has one of the most experienced position groups with four returning players in Brenden Bates, Nik Ognenovic, Justin Rigg and Keaton Upshaw.
- Rigg had at least one catch in six games last season, totaling 11 catches for 128 yards, while Upshaw had seven catches for 78 yards and one TD. Rigg has four catches for 35 yards so far this
- Upshaw caught a 12-yard touchdown vs. Mississippi State, his second career score.
- Bates made his first career catch in the Mississippi State game, hauling in a 14-yard pass.
- The tight ends were key blockers for UK's explosive running game which led the SEC and ranked fourth nationally with 278.8 rushing yards per game.

· Offensive line coach John Schlarman can be described in one word - tough. A 2018 and 2019 Capital One Orange Bowl-FWAA Courage Award nominee, he was diagnosed with cholangiocarcinoma in the summer of 2018. - Schlarman was a four-year starter with the Wildcats from 1994-97, earning first-team All-SEC honors as a senior. He is entering his eighth season at UK, and along with Vince Marrow, one of the two remaining coaches from Stoops' original staff in 2013.
- The O-line return four of five starters from last season in RT Darian Kinnard, LT Landon Young, RG Luke Fortner and C Drake Jackson. The only loss is a big one in left guard and All-American Logan Stenberg.
- Overall, the O-line has totaled 99 career starts.
- The "Big Blue Wall" has helped Kentucky post four consecutive seasons of 2,000 or more rushing yards, with at least one 1,000-yard individual each season.
- In 2019, the O-line gave up the third-fewest sacks allowed in the SEC with 1.31 per game and allowed Lynn Bowden Jr., to become the third straight Wildcat to total 1,000 rushing yards. The "Big Blue Wall" also helped UK set single-season records in rushing yards (3,624), rushing TDs (36) and yards per rushing attempt (6.32).
- Senior Landon Young is back for his final season at left tackle after an impressive junior year that saw him total 64 knockdown blocks. He had only one missed assignment in 754 plays in 13 starts.
- The graduation of Stenberg has freed up the left guard spot, with sophomore Kenneth Horsey starting the first two games. An interesting note about Horsey he had open-heart surgery in April of 2018.
- Senior Drake Jackson is once again UK's starting center as he has 35 consecutive starts under his belt. He earned first-team All-SEC accolades last year and is a preseason All-American and a Rimington Trophy candidate for 2020.
- The right guard spot is locked up by senior Luke Fortner, who started in all 13 games last season and totaled 27 knockdown blocks.
- Junior Darian Kinnard has been holding down the right tackle position since he entered the starting lineup at the end of the 2018 season. He had 32 knockdowns in 2019, and only one penalty in 706 snaps and has been rated by Pro Football Focus as the top returning offensive lineman in the country this season.

### FORTNER NAMED TO ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM; SEMIFINALIST FOR 2020 WILLIAM V. CAMPBELL TROPHY

For the second straight season, the University of Kentucky football team has a representative on the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team as senior offensive guard Luke Fortner has received the honor. Fortner is one of only 22 players named to the prestigious team made up of college football players who step up to help those in need. Last year, fellow "Big Blue Wall" member Landon Young was named to the team and was voted team captain in a fan vote.

Fortner has also been named a semifinalist for the 2020 William V. Campbell Trophy which recognizes an individual as the absolute best in the country for his academic success, football performance and exemplary leadership.

Named in honor of the late William V. Campbell, the former chairman of Intuit, former player and head coach at Columbia University and the 2004 recipient of the NFF's Gold Medal, The William V. Campbell Trophy® Presented by Mazda has become the most prestigious and desirable "academic" award in college football.

Fortner, of Sylvania, Ohio, has been a standout in all three categories throughout his Wildcat career. In the classroom, he graduated in December of 2019 with a degree in mechanical engineering and is currently working on a master's degree in mechanical engineering. He

#### Danny Trevathan, Football (2008-11)

Two-year All-America linebacker ... First All-America linebacker in school history ... Chosen National Linebacker of the Year by the College Football Performance Awards after monster senior season in which he totaled 143 tackles, 11.5 tackles for loss, four interceptions, five caused fumbles and five pass breakups ... Led the SEC in tackles as a junior and senior, earning first-team All-SEC honors both years ... First-team All-America as a junior with 144 stops ... Selected in the NFL Draft by the Denver Broncos ... Led Denver in tackles two years, with the team advancing to the Super Bowl in both of those seasons, including one Super Bowl championship ... Eight-year veteran with Denver and the Chicago Bears.

is on track to graduate with his master's degree in December of 2020. He's a three-time member of the Southeastern Conference Academic Honor Roll and has three times been named to the Dean's List. In 2019, Fortner was inducted into the school's Frank G. Ham Society of Character which honors Wildcats who have shown an extraordinary commitment to academic excellence, athletic participation, personal development, career preparation and serving as a role model.

Fortner put his degree to good use last fall when he, along with other UK engineering students, played a significant role in helping a team of Toyota Manufacturing engineers design, test and manufacture a specially-built push cart vehicle through a project called "Lift Them Up." The push cart vehicle provides a Kentucky Children's Hospital patient the chance to both accompany the Wildcats on the Cat Walk and attend a game at Kroger Field.

Because of his experience with project "Lift Them Up," Fortner was compelled to continue making an impact at the Kentucky Children's Hospital. He began visiting the kids in September of 2019 as part of the "Tuesdays with the Wildcats" program, created by former Wildcat C.J. Conrad in 2018.

When COVID19 hit, Fortner didn't want to stop interaction with the kids so, along with teammate Max Duffy, they asked what they could do. With the help of the Child Life team at the Kentucky Children's Hospital, they set up a program called "In the Huddle with KCH." For eight weeks,

Fortner and Duffy taped a video of themselves answering questions from kids who submitted through the Kentucky Children's Hospital Facebook Page. The video was then posted back to the KCH Facebook page every Tuesday morning to replace what would have been their in-person visit.

This opportunity was open to all Wildcat fans, not just KCH patients. During a difficult time for our nation, Fortner and Duffy provided a fun time for young fans to forget about the virus for even a short time to share a smile.

In addition to "In the Huddle with KCH." Fortner and his teammates got creative in how they could continue their weekly visits with KCH patients. Each week, Fortner spends 1-1.5 hours on Zoom calls with patients who are currently "in-patient" at KCH. They discuss football, favorite hobbies, favorite color, etc. Patients are able to ask the players questions about anything and everything. Fortner and his teammates always offer up words of encouragement. Zoom calls are intimate because it's just one patient with Fortner and his teammates for about 7-10 minutes each so the focus is all on one patient at a time. More of Fortner's community service projects:

- Volunteered with other engineering students at UK's 2020 "Engineers Day" to celebrate engineering and showcase the "Lift Them Up" cart
- Volunteer at Urban Impact at the Woodhill Community Center, an organization that strives to enable youth to grow, succeed and lead
- Volunteer reader at Athens-Chilesburg Flementary
- Volunteer for Read Across America at Fayette County public schools
- Volunteered with Habitat for Humanity On the field, Fortner has been an integral part of the "Big Blue Wall" during his three seasons. In 2019 at right guard, he totaled 27 knockdown blocks, no missed assignments, allowed only one sack, and had just one penalty in 646 plays. He also was a key cog in helping four Wildcats rush for at least 500 yards, only the second time in school history that has happened, also 1976. Lynn Bowden Jr., the Paul Hornung Award winner, become the first player in college football history with at least 1,400 rushing yards, 300 passing yards and 300 receiving yards in the same season.

#### **SPECIAL TEAMS**

• Special teams coordinator Dean Hood left

- to become the head coach at Murray State University following the 2019 season and the special teams unit is being coached by committee this season.
- Australian transplant and 2019 Ray Guy Award winner Max Duffy is back for his final season and is the oldest player on the team at age 27. Duffy led the FBS in punting at 48.1 yards per kick in 2019. He also became the school's all-time leading punter at 46.28 yards
- With Duffy's punting and hustling coverage by the punt team, UK led the nation in 2019 with 44.6 net yards per punt.
- In the season opener at Auburn, Duffy bombed a career-long 75-yarder that is the third-longest in school history. He's averaging 48.1 yards per punt this season. He doesn't mind contact either. He has three career
- · Senior Matt Ruffolo won the starting placekicking job during preseason practice. Ruffolo is 1-2 FG and 9-of-10 PATs this season.
- · Chance Poore handles kickoffs for the Wildcats. He also has placekicking experience, as he made 5-of-9 FGs and 24-of-26 PATs last
- Sophomore Cade Degraw is the new long snapper following the graduation of four-year starter Blake Best.
- Senior Zach Johnson is UK's kick returner, while Josh Ali handles punt returns. Ali has two returns 23 yards for an 11.5 average. Johnson is averaging 24 yards per return this season.

#### **DEFENSE**

- Defensive coordinator in Brad White is in his second season as the defensive coordinator, his third season as the outside linebackers coach at UK.
- After the return of only four starters from 2018's nationally ranked unit, last season's defense was expected to have growing pains. However, the growth came remarkably quickly, and UK became one of the nation's best defenses for the second year in a row.
- In 2019, UK ranked 14th nationally in scoring defense, allowing 19.3 points per game. The defense also ranked 21st nationally and fourth in the SEC in total defense yards per game (324.6), second in passing yards allowed (167.8) and 12th nationally in team passing efficiency defense (113.03 rating points).
- UK has allowed 30 or fewer points in 28 of the past 30 games.







- Kentucky currently ranks third in the SEC in rushing defense, allowing just 83.3 yards per game. The Cats are 8th in passing defense with 276.0 ypg.
- With six interceptions vs. Mississippi State, UK leads the SEC and ranks fifth nationally in passes intercepted.
- White welcomes back 19 returning letter winners in the spring, including seven starters in DE Josh Paschal (OLB last season), NG Quinton Bohanna, SLB Jamar "Boogie" Watson, WLB DeAndre Square, DB Cedrick Dort Jr., DB Yusuf Corker, and DB Brandin Echols.
- The positions where a starter from 2019 does not return are middle linebacker (Kash Daniel), defensive tackle (Calvin Taylor Jr.) and defensive end (T.J. Carter).

#### Linebackers

- The linebacking unit runs 20 deep and returns five letter winners and two starters in senior outside linebacker Jamar "Boogie" Watson and junior Will linebacker DeAndre Square.
- The group corralled four of the Cats' six interceptions in a 24-2 win over Miss. State on Oct. 10, 2020. Jamin Davis, D'Eryk Jackson, Boogie Watson and Jordan Wright each grabbed one.
- Watson is poised for a huge senior season after totaling 36 tackles, a team-high 11.5 tackles for loss, 6.5 sacks and a team-high seven quarterback hurries in 2019. He has two sacks this season and an interception vs. Mississippi State where he ripped the ball out of the receiver's hands just before he crossed the goal line for a score.
- Another junior outside linebacker the coaching staff has been impressed with is Jordan Wright, who sealed the Miss. State win with an eight-yard interception return for a touchdown. He also has a fumble return TD in his career.
- Adding depth to the outside linebacker position are redshirt freshmen J.J. Weaver and K.D. McDaniel, who showed significant promise in limited action last season.
- The inside linebackers are led by Square, who was UK's second-leading tackler last season with 69.
- At the Mike linebacker spot, it's junior Jamin Davis who is turning heads. He is currently UK's leading tackler and against Mississippi State, he had a career-high 11 tackles and intercepted a pass in the end zone on the final play of the first half, the third pickoff of his career.



Former Kentucky quarterback Tim Couch has been named to the 2021 ballot for induction into the College Football Hall of Fame, the National Football Foundation (NFF) & College Hall of Fame announced today. Couch is one of 78 players and seven coaches from the Football Bowl Subdivision and 99 players and 33 coaches from the divisional ranks.

A storied name of the Kentucky program, Couch, was the team's quarterback from 1996-98. After giving up his senior season of eligibility, he was drafted as the No. 1 pick by Cleveland in the 1999 NFL Draft. In 1998, the junior quarterback was named a first-team All-American and consensus Southeastern Conference Player of the Year. Couch completed 400 of 553 passes for 4,275 yards and 36 touchdowns and led the nation in pass completions while ranked second in completion percentage, passing yardage and touchdown passes, and fourth in total offense. After guiding the Wildcats to the Outback Bowl, UK's first New Year's Day bowl appearance in 47 years, Couch finished fourth in Heisman Trophy balloting. He was also a finalist for the Davey O'Brien National Quarterback Award as a junior and sophomore. His breakout sophomore campaign featured 363 of 547 passes completed for 3,884 yards and 37 touchdowns while leading the nation in pass attempts, completions, yardage, and completion percentage. Also during his sophomore year, Couch earned second-team All-SEC honors and finished ninth in Heisman voting. He played in seven games as a true freshman, with two starts. Career wise, Couch completed 795 passes on 1,184 attempts for 8,435 yards and 74 touchdowns. The legend ended his career with seven NCAA records, 14 SEC records, and 26 school records.

The announcement of the 2021 College Football Hall of Fame Class Presented by ETT will be made in early 2021, with specific details to be announced in the future.

The 2021 College Football Hall of Fame Class Presented by ETT will be officially inducted during the 64th NFF Annual Awards Dinner on Dec. 7, 2021, at the New York Hilton Midtown. They will also be honored at their respective schools with an NFF Hall of Fame On-Campus Salute, presented by Fidelity Investments, during the 2021 season.

Stewart, who also served as a student assistant under Stoops from 2017-18, has a veteran defensive line this spring with eight returning letter winners, including two starters in nose guard Quinton Bohanna (18 tackles, 3.0 TFL, 1.0 sacks, 1 PBU) and Joshua Paschal (34 tackles, 9.3 TFL, 3.5 sacks, two FF, 1 PBU and 1 blocked kick), who has moved from outside linebacker to defensive end.
- Helping make up for the loss of defensive tackle Calvin Taylor Jr., to graduation (starter in all 13 games last season with 9.5 TFL and a team-high 8.5 sacks) is senior Phil Hoskins, who received a sixth year to complete his eligibility after missing last season with a knee injury.
- Senior Kordell Looney has moved from end to tackle and is the backup at that position.
- · Josh Paschal has moved from outside linebacker to defensive end and is shining in his new role. Paschal has 12 tackles, 2.0 TFL and had a crucial INT vs. Mississippi State that he returned 76 yards to set up a 2-yard score on the next play.
- · Backing up Bohanna at nose guard, UK's starter the last two seasons, is junior Marquan McCall.

#### Secondary

- Coach Steve Clinkscale's position group returns eight lettermen, including three starters in cornerback Cedrick Dort Jr., senior free safety Yusuf Corker and senior cornerback Brandin Echols.
- UK led the SEC and ranked second nationally in passing yards allowed (167.8 yards per game) in 2019 behind Ohio State.
- The Cats allowed only nine touchdown passes all season, tied with Clemson and Ohio State for the fewest in the nation.
- LSU transfer Kelvin Joseph has started the first three games after sitting out the 2019 season. He notched his first career INT in the win over Mississippi State.
- Junior Tyrell Ajian, sophomore Jamari Brown and senior Quandre Mosely also return, each with at least one starting assignment on their resumes.
- Senior Dayonte Robinson is back after a

season-ending quadriceps injury in 2019. He has 69 career tackles, 4.0 sacks and two fumble recoveries, including the game-sealing one at Florida in 2018 that ended the Cats' losing streak to the Gators.

#### COACHING CHANGES

• Defensive line coach, Anwar Stewart, was hired in January of 2020 to replace Derrick



LeBlanc, who left for a similar position at Arkansas. Stewart is very familiar with the Kentucky football program after playing linebacker/ defensive end at UK from 1996-99 under head coaches Bill Curry and Hal Mumme and having served as a student assistant and defensive assistant under Stoops from 2017-18. He helped UK advance to two bowl games as an student assistant and was an integral part of the Wildcats' 10-3 season in 2018 as he assisted with the development and success of Josh Allen winner of three National Defensive Player of the Year Awards (Nagurski, Lott, Bednarik), unanimous first-team All-America and SEC Defensive Player of the Year.

• Wide receivers coach, Jovon Bouknight, came on board Stoops' coaching staff in March of 2020. Bouknight replaces Michael Smith, who resigned following the 2019 season. Bouknight arrived in the Bluegrass after coaching receivers for one season at Oregon. Prior to Oregon, he spent three months at Texas Tech before taking the same position with the Ducks. The majority of Bouknight's career was spent at Utah State, where he coached for 10 years primarily focusing on working with the wide receivers. He was also the co-offensive coordinator in 2016 and the passing game coordinator for two seasons from 2014-15.

- · Kentucky was the only school in the nation to have first-round picks in the 2019 NFL (Josh Allen), MLB (Zack Thompson), and NBA (PJ Washington, Tyler Herro, Keldon Johnson) drafts.
- This is the 130th season of intercollegiate football for Kentucky.
- Kentucky enters its eighth season under head coach Mark Stoops, who has energized the UK fan base with record-setting recruiting classes, facility upgrades and an influx in talent.
- A picture of longevity, UK Equipment Manager Tom Kalinowski is in his 43rd season in that role. # **KROGER FIELD**

On game day, Kroger Field often becomes the third-largest city in Kentucky.



- Since its opening in 1973, Kentucky has played 309 games within the friendly confines of newly-named Kroger Field. UK has a 169-136-4 record (.554), 33-20 (.623) under Mark Stoops.
- UK set a new Kroger Field attendance record when 63,543 fans packed the stadium for the Nov. 3, 2018 game vs. No. 6 Georgia.
- Two of the top five crowds in Kroger Field history came in 2018.
- UK announced its first sellout since 2015 when 62,945 fans attended the Florida game on Sept. 23, 2017.
- Since the 1999 expansion, UK has averaged 62,382 fans per game and ranked in the nation's top 30 teams in attendance in 15 of the last 17 seasons. Both the single game and season attendance record has been broken in recent years. (\*Note: Does not include 2020 season due to Covid-19 protocols).
- The playing surface is named C.M. Newton Grounds at Kroger Field in honor of the former UK Director of Athletics.

### **KROGER FIELD**

Commonwealth Stadium was renamed to Kroger Field in May of 2017. The agreement--which is between Kroger and JMI Sports, UK's multimedia rights partner-begins at approximately \$1.85 million annually with a term of up to 12 years. With the partnership, Kroger becomes the Official Fuel Partner of the University of Kentucky and the Official Grocery Partner of Move-In at UK while also providing additional engagement opportunities with UK students. Per the agreement, Kroger is also the Official Nutrition and Pharmacy Partner of UK Athletics.

Kroger Field was transformed into a state-ofthe-art facility after a \$126-million reinvention which was completed prior to the 2015 season. The project was handled by HNTB. The outside of the stadium underwent a dramatic external facelift, receiving a modern look, but one that remained uniquely Kentucky. Inside, the capacity of Kroger Field was reduced over the course of the two-year project to approximately 61,000, but the value of all remaining seats were increased, from the top of the upper deck to front-row seats at midfield. Concourses were revamped and widened throughout the stadium with improved concessions, restrooms and security. Players and coaches reaped the benefits of the new Kroger Field as well, as hometeam facilities were built, and a multi-purpose recruiting room hosts future Wildcats on their on-campus visits.

#### **FACTS AND FIGURES**

<u>Seating Capacity:</u> 61,000, including the Commonwealth Suites

Playing Field: UK switched from natural grass to synthetic turf for the 2015 season. Other SEC schools with a turf surface are: Arkansas, Ole Miss, Mississippi State and Missouri. The end zones and team sideline areas feature a checkerboard pattern in alternating shades of blue. It was designed to mimic the pattern of Secretariat's silks, which has been part of the football uniforms for five seasons. The school's new interlocking "UK" logo is positioned in the center of the field.

<u>Video Boards:</u> Video boards by Daktronics measuring at 39 by 79 feet, each, bring a total of 6,162 square feet of video capability. The video boards put UK among the nation's leaders in video square footage. The interior seating bowl also has LED ribbon boards.

<u>Sound System:</u> Sportsound system delivers pounding bass energy, smooth mid- and high-range frequencies, and high-impact entertainment. Components of the sound system include a main speaker cluster behind the end

zone, under-balcony speakers and concourse speakers.

#### **GAME DAY EXPERIENCES**

The "Cat Walk" on Talbott Todd Way: With the unveiling of the new \$45 million Kentucky Football Training Facility in August of 2016, the headquarters of the program moved next door to Kroger Field. That means the Cat Walk presented by Chevy will still begin outside Gate 1 two hours and 15 minutes prior to kickoff, but the team roceeds past Gate 1 and between Kroger Field and Nutter Field House which has been dedicated to former Wildcat Talbott Todd (1963-65). Todd, who passed away from ALS in August of 2017, was an avid supporter of the program. From Talbott Todd Way the team will walk to the locker room in the Joe Craft Kentucky Football Training Facility.

Pregame concerts: The Kentucky Football Pregame Concert Series has returned for the 2018 season. Concerts will begin on the stage outside Gate 12 immediately following the Cat Walk and last until 30 minutes prior to kickoff. The Cat Walk takes place two hours and 15 minutes prior to kickoff.

### **AUBURN 29, KENTUCKY 13**

### SEPT. 26, 2020 • AUBURN, ALA. JORDAN-HARE STADIUM (17.490)



Terry Wilson passed for 239 yards and a touchdown and rushed for 42 yards, but No. 23 Kentucky lost its season opener, falling at No. 8 Auburn 29-13.

Wilson was 24 of 37 through the air, connecting with Josh Ali nine times for 98 yards. Kavosiey Smoke led the UK ground attack with seven carries for 62 yards and a touchdown.

Auburn got a couple of first downs on its first possession before being forced to punt. Kentucky took over inside its own 10 yard line. The Cats drove into Auburn

territory and, on a third and short, Smoke scampered 35 yards off the right side for the first touchdown of the season. Matt Ruffolo added the PAT and the Cats led 7-0 after an 11-play, 93-yard drive.

The Tigers responded with a scoring drive of their own. Auburn covered 70 yards in just seven plays, capped by a one-yard touchdown run by D.J. Williams. The Tigers faked the extra point and Grant Loy hit John Samuel Shenker with a pass for the two-point conversion, giving Auburn an 8-7 lead with 4:30 to play in the first quarter. That would be the score after the first period.

As the second quarter got underway, Kentucky faced a fourth and three from the Auburn 39, but Wilson's pass intended for Clevan Thomas Jr. was broken up and Auburn took possession.

Auburn promptly drove into Kentucky territory and eventually faced a fourth and one from the UK 16. The Tigers handed the ball to Williams, who was stuffed by UK linebacker DeAndre Square, giving the ball back to the Cats on the UK 16.

Kentucky was able to drive into Auburn territory, but a holding penalty hampered the Cats' progress and UK was forced to punt.

After an Auburn punt, Kentucky again drove into Auburn territory, aided by a 40-yard completion from Wilson to Allen Dailey Jr., setting up the Cats at the Auburn 12. The Cats drove inside the Auburn one, and Chris Rodriguez Jr. appeared to score, but replay indicated that he did not get in. On second and goal from the one, Wilson was stuffed, giving UK third and one from the one. That's when Wilson threw an interception that was returned 100 yards by Roger McCreary for a touchdown. However, after review, Auburn was called for targeting, negating the score. Auburn took an 8-7 lead into the half.

In the second half, Kentucky opened with a three-and-out. After a UK punt, Auburn took over and immediately marched into UK territory. However, the UK defense stood tall, forcing the Tigers to go for it on fourth and eight. Quarterback Bo Nix pooch punted the ball to the UK two yard line.

The Cats could do nothing with the possession but Max Duffy boomed a 75-yard punt, the third-longest in school history, giving the Tigers the ball on their own 24. From there Auburn drove into UK territory and into the red zone. Nix connected with Seth Williams on an 11-yard touchdown pass and Anders Carlson added the PAT to give Auburn a 15-7 lead with 5:42 to play in the third quarter.

Kentucky responded with a drive of its own, methodically marching into Auburn territory. The Cats would get into the red zone and Wilson connected with Akeem Hayes for an eight-yard touchdown, the first of Hayes' career, to make it 15-13 with 1:00 left in the third. The Cats would go for two, but Wilson could not find anyone open and the try failed.

Auburn added a pair of fourth-quarter touchdowns on passing touchdowns by Nix to Seth Williams and Eli Stove to lead 29-13.

### **OLE MISS 42, KENTUCKY 41**

### OCT. 3. 2020 • LEXINGTON, KY KROGER FIELD (12,000)



Kentucky rushed for 408 yards and six touchdowns, but the Wildcats fell to Ole Miss 42-41 in overtime.

Kentucky got career-high rushing efforts from Chris Rodriguez Jr., who had 133 yards and two touchdowns, Terry Wilson, who had 129 yards and three touchdowns, and Asim Rose, who had 117 yards on the ground and a touchdown.

Wilson was also 14-of-18 through the air for 151 yards in the game.

Ole Miss took the opening kickoff and methodically

marched down the field. The Rebels covered 75 yards in eight plays and just 2:22, ending with a one-yard touchdown rush by Jerrion Ealy. The PAT from Luke Logan was good and the Rebels grabbed an early 7-0 lead.

Kentucky's opening possession started with a 72-yard rush from Rose, taking the ball to the Ole Miss three yard line. Rose carried on the next play, getting the Cats to the one. But on the third UK play, out of the Wildcat formation, Rose fumbled and Ole Miss took over at its own one yard line.

The Rebels were unable to do anything with the ensuing possession and were forced to punt. Josh Ali returned the punt 17 yards to the Ole Miss 29, giving the Cats outstanding field position with which to start their second possession. From there, the Cats needed only four plays and 1:54 to get into the end zone, with quarterback Terry Wilson rushing it in from four yards out. Matt Ruffolo added the PAT to tie the game at 7-7 with 7:36 left in the first period.

On its next possession, Ole Miss made it to midfield, but was forced to punt after a sack from Marquan McCall and J.J. Weaver on third down. Kentucky would take over at its own 20 with 5:58 left in the first.

The Cats again moved right down the field, quickly getting inside the red zone. On third and goal from the two, Rose pushed his way into the end zone, giving UK its first lead of the game. Ruffolo's PAT was good and the Cats led 14-7 with 1:33 left in the first. That would be the score after 15 minutes of play.

As the second quarter began, Ole Miss was driving. The Rebels would tie the game on a 14-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Matt Corral to Kenny Yeboah. Logan's PAT tied the game at 14-14 with 13:19 left in the half.

The next four possessions would end in punts, two by each team. But just before the half, Kentucky mounted a drive that would cover 83 yards in nine plays, ending



with a 22-yard touchdown run from Wilson. Ruffolo added the PAT, giving Kentucky a 21-14 lead with 29 seconds left in the half. That would be he halftime score.

Kentucky got the ball first in the second half, and the Wildcats used the ground game to effectively drive the ball down the field. UK covered 75 yards in 10 plays, all on the ground, ending with a 22-yard touchdown run from Chris Rodriguez Jr. Ruffolo's PAT gave the Cats a 28-14 lead with 10:41 left in the third quarter.

Ole Miss had a response, quickly assembling a scoring drive of its own. The Rebels needed just four plays to go 75 yards, ending with a 24-yard pass from Corral to Jonathan Mingo. Logan's extra point was good, and Ole Miss climbed within seven, 28-21, with 9:17 still to play in the third quarter.

On its next drive, Kentucky drove into Ole Miss territory, again riding the run game. But Ole Miss would stop the Cats, forcing a field goal. But Ruffolo's try from 49 yards hit the right upright and bounced back onto the field.

The Rebels would take possession and would promptly drive into UK territory. The Rebels would go 68 yards to the UK one-yard line, but the UK defense, led by Kelvin Joseph and Josh Paschal, came up with a stop on fourth-and-goal, keeping the Rebels from scoring.

Pinned at its own goal line, Kentucky was unable to do much with the ensuing possession and was forced to punt. Ole Miss took over and had the ball as the third quarter ended with UK leading 28-21.

But on that same drive, Ole Miss would tie the score, as Corral hit Mingo with a 16-yard touchdown pass. Logan's PAT tied the score at 28 apiece with 13:37 to play in the game.

Kentucky took over and was able to get into Ole Miss territory. However, the Cats suffered yardage losses on third and fourth down and Ole Miss got the ball back at its own 47. The Rebels got a 47-yard completion from Corral to Yeboah on first down, then a pass interference call against UK gave the Rebels possession at the two-yard line. Two plays later, Connor scored from one yard out as Ole Miss took its first lead since the first quarter, a 35-28 advantage with 8:23 to play.

Just as Ole Miss kept doing, Kentucky responded. The Cats rode the arm of Wilson, who had 66 yards passing during a 75-yard drive that ended with a one-yard touchdown carry from Rodriguez. Ruffolo nailed the extra point and the game was tied 35-35 with 2:04 to play.

Kentucky forced at Ole Miss punt on the next possession, and the Cats ran out the clock and the game went to overtime.

The Cats got the ball first in overtime and needed just four plays, all on the ground, to score. Wilson covered the final 10 yards, rushing for his third touchdown of the game. But Ruffolo missed the PAT and the Cats led 41-35.

Ole Miss quickly drove inside the UK 10, aided by a pass interference call in the end zone. The Rebels had first and goal from the two, and on second down, Corral hit Elijah Moore with a three-yard TD pass. Logan made the PAT and Ole Miss claimed the win.

Kentucky defense forced six turnovers and held Mississippi State to just two points as the Cats won for the first time this season by beating the Bulldogs 24-2 on at Kroger Field.

In the process, Kentucky held the Mike Leach-coached Bulldogs to the fewest points that any Leach-coached team has ever scored. Previously, Leach-coached teams, which feature the Air Raid offense that Hal Mumme used at Kentucky, had never been held below three points.

Offensively, Kentucky could never get much going.

Quarterback Terry Wilson hit on only eight of 20 passes for 73 yards and a touchdown. Wilson also led the Cats in rushing, carrying 13 times for 50 yards. Kentucky had just 157 yards of offense in the game compared to Mississippi State's 296. But the six turnovers were the difference.

The teams exchanged punts twice to open the game. Neither team was able to get anything going in the first period, as UK had just 53 yards of total offense, while MSU was held to 48. That resulted in a scoreless tie after 15 minutes of action.

Early in the second quarter, MSU had a chance to get on the board, but a 56-yard field goal attempt by Brandon Ruiz came up short and the game remained scoreless.

On the ensuing possession, Kentucky appeared to be going nowhere until Wilson scrambled for a 51-yard run, getting the case to the MSU 14. Two plays later, Wilson hit Keaton Upshaw over the middle for a 12-yard touchdown pass, breaking the scoring drought. Matt Ruffolo made the PAT and the Cats grabbed a 7-0 lead with 12:13 left in the first half.

Later in the second quarter, MSU drove into the UK red zone before Josh Paschal intercepted a KJ Costello pass and returned it 76 yards to the MSU two yard line. From there, Kentucky needed just one play, a two-yard touchdown rush from Chris Rodriguez Jr. to extend the lead. After Ruffolo's PAT, the Cats had a 14-0 lead with 3:48 left in the half.

MSU drove deep into Kentucky territory near the end of the first half. On the final play of the half, Costello threw into the end zone and was picked off by UK's Jamin Davis. That ended the half with the Cats leading 14-0.

In the second half, MSU went for a fourth-and-inches from their own 34 yard line. But Costello's pass intended for Cameron Gardner was incomplete and Kentucky took over in excellent field position. But the Cats' AJ Rose fumbled on the second play of the possession, giving the ball right back to the Bulldogs.

But the Bulldogs gave it right back to the Cats. On the fourth play of the ensuing drive, Costello was intercepted by UK's Kelvin Joseph at the UK 30 with 10:37 left in the third quarter. But the Cats would do nothing with the possession and were forced

MSU would finally get on the board when, on a fourth down, Kentucky snapped the ball over Max Duffy's head on a punt attempt. Duffy scrambled to kick the ball out the back of the end zone, resulting in a safety and making it 14-2 with 5:49 left in the third quarter.

The third quarter would end with MSU driving into UK territory. But the Cats led 14-2 with 15 minutes to play.

As the fourth quarter started, reserve quarterback Will Rogers was intercepted by Jamar "Boogie" Watson in the end zone, thwarting another MSU scoring opportunity.

Another interception was the final straw as UK's Jordan Wright picked off Rogers and returned it eight yards for a touchdown the put the Cats ahead 21-2.

### **HEAD COACH MARK STOOPS / EIGHTH SEASON / IOWA, 1989**



When Mark Stoops was asked before last season how he could continue success after major personnel losses from the 2018 team, the coach replied, "We didn't come here to build a team. We came here to build a program."

It appears that Stoops is doing exactly that. Stoops followed the landmark '18 season with a remarkable 2019 campaign that represented Kentucky's fourth consecutive winning season and fourth straight postseason bid, topped by a dramatic win over Virginia Tech in the Belk Bowl. However, it didn't come easily.

Stoops had to overcome the departure of 14 starters from 2018, including three All-Americans, and by September three quarterbacks had been lost to injury. The coach relied on the conventional – physical play on both sides of the ball – and the unconventional, moving a wide receiver to quarterback, to navigate the challenging season.

With receiver Lynn Bowden Jr. manning the QB spot, UK went 6-2 down the stretch. UK closed the season with four straight wins, including a 45-13 regular-season finale vs. instate rival Louisville, featuring a school-record 517 rushing yards.

Bowden went on to earn first-team All-America honors and the Paul Hornung Award as the nation's most versatile player. Punter Max Duffy was first-team All-America as well being named the Ray Guy Award as the nation's top punter. Guard Logan Stenberg checked in as a second-team All-American, giving UK three All-Americans for the second year in a row.

Meanwhile, a young defensive unit continued to mature and became UK's first team in 40 years to hold every opponent to 30 or fewer points.

Stoops is only the second coach in Kentucky history to take his team to four straight bowls and UK's 32 wins over the last four seasons are the most in a four-year span since Paul "Bear" Bryant piloted the Wildcats in 1949-52.

This 2019 team followed the success of the 2018 squad that went 10-3, UK's best season in 41 years, topped by a win over Penn State in the VRBO Citrus Bowl. It was only the third 10-win season in school history.

In addition, the 2018 campaign featured a win at Florida -- the Wildcats' first victory over the Gators in 32 years -- resulting in UK being named the National Team of the



### STOOPS AND CO. MAKING A HIT IN RECRUITING

Week by the Football Writers Association of America. The regular season concluded with a 56-10 win at in-state rival Louisville, the largest margin of victory in the history of the Governor's Cup series.

UK was No. 11 in the final USA Today coaches' poll and No. 12 in the final Associated Press tabulation, the school's first appearance in the final rankings since 1984.

CollegeFootballNews.com listed Stoops as the best coaching performance of the season and he was named Southeastern Conference Coach of the Year by The Associated Press, Athlon Sports and the league coaches.

Stoops' individual accolades also extended to his players. Linebacker Josh Allen earned three National Defensive Player of the Year Awards and was a unanimous first-team All-American. Offensive guard Bunchy Stallings also was a first-team All-American and running back Benny Snell earned second-team All-America while becoming UK's all-time leading rusher.

The 2018 season continued a remarkable trend – since Stoops took over as coach of the Cats in 2013, UK was the only school in the nation that tied or improved its win total in six straight seasons.

How has Stoops accomplished all of this? The coach would tell you that there's been nothing magical about the process.

True to his blue-collar roots in Youngstown, Ohio, the methodical advancement made by Stoops' teams is a reflection of the coach's rock-steady work ethic, tireless recruiting, and ability to adapt.

Stoops' ability to adjust when necessary shone its brightest at the beginning of the 2016 season. After losing the first two games of the schedule, and seeing his starting quarterback out for the season with an injury, and seeing his defense struggle in the early stages, Stoops didn't retreat. The Wildcat coach chose determination over despair and went

back to work, revising the offense for a new QB while becoming more involved in helping coach the defense.

The results? The Wildcats went 7-3 in the last 10 regular-season games, highlighted by a win at No. 11-ranked Louisville and a trip to the TaxSlayer Bowl. Stoops was named 2016 SEC Coach of the Year runner-up by Athlon Sports. That was followed by another seven-win season in 2017, topped by a berth in the Franklin-American Mortgage Music City Bowl.

Stoops came to Kentucky from Florida State, where he was defensive coordinator from 2010-12. He inherited a unit a unit ranked 108th in the nation in total defense and turned it into one of the nation's best. In the 2012 season, the Seminoles were second in the nation in total defense, allowing 254.1 yards per game, and sixth nationally in scoring defense at 14.7 points per game. Playing well against the run and the pass, FSU was third in the country in rushing defense and led the nation in pass defense. FSU led the ACC in seven defensive categories. Stoops also coached the defensive backs under head coach Jimbo Fisher.

Eight Seminoles on defense earned 2012 All-ACC honors, including four first-team selections, highlighted by one of the nation's top defensive end duos in Bjoern Werner and Cornellius Carradine, who combined for 24 sacks and 31 tackles for loss. Werner was a finalist for the 2012 Bronko Nagurski Award as the National Defensive Player of the Year and was among the national leaders in sacks with 13. Stoops also coached cornerback Ronald Darby to ACC Defensive Rookie of the Year.

The Seminoles' prowess was a continuation of the 2011 season, when Stoops' defenders led the nation in fewest yards allowed per carry (2.3), ranked fourth in the nation in total defense (275 yards per game), second in rushing defense (82.7 ypg), fourth

in scoring defense (15.1 points per game), and eighth in tackles for loss (8.6 per game) and quarterback sacks (3.1 per game). FSU led the ACC in eight defensive categories.

Stoops overhauled the Florida State defense in 2010, his first season as defensive coordinator. The Seminoles gave up 19.6 points per game, third-best in the ACC and 20th nationally. FSU ranked 42nd nationally in total defense that season; in contrast, the team was 108th nationally in total defense and 94th in scoring defense in 2009, the year before Stoops' arrival. FSU improved its overall defense by more than 80 yards per game, primarily by limiting opponents to 75 fewer rushing yards per game. The Seminoles ranked third in the nation in quarterback sacks and were 21st in tackles for loss. In the secondary, Stoops coached Xavier Rhodes to ACC Defensive Rookie of the Year honors and National Defensive Freshman of the Year accolades.

During Stoops' three seasons, FSU went 10-4, 9-4 and 12-2, including wins over South Carolina in the 2010 Chick-fil-A Bowl, Notre Dame in the 2011 Champs Sports Bowl and Northern Illinois in the 2013 Orange Bowl.

Stoops was defensive coordinator and DBs coach at Arizona from 2004-09, working for his brother, Mike, who was head coach of the Wildcats. During Mark's time there, Arizona's records improved steadily, going 3-8, 3-8, 6-6, 5-7, 8-5 and 8-5. The Wildcats advanced to the Las Vegas Bowl and Holiday Bowl during the last two years. Mark and Mike are also brothers of Bob Stoops, who spent 18 years as the Oklahoma head coach and now leads the XFL Dallas Renegades. The eldest Stoops brother, Ron Jr., is retired after coaching at Youngstown State.

Stoops inherited an Arizona unit that was 109th in the nation in total defense and 107th in scoring defense in 2003, the year before he arrived. By the end of his term at

Arizona, the Wildcats ranked in the nation's top 25 in total defense his final two seasons and ranked as high as 33rd in scoring defense.

Prior to Arizona, Stoops coached the defensive backs three years at Miami (Fla.). The 2001 national champion Hurricanes led the nation in pass efficiency defense, scoring defense and turnover margin. That team also established a school record with 27 interceptions and 45 total takeaways.

Stoops' 2002 secondary led the nation in pass defense and pass efficiency defense. Despite having to replace all four starters in the defensive backfield, the 2003 team led the nation in pass defense. In his three seasons, Miami went 35-3, including the 12-0 Rose Bowl title campaign, plus appearances in the Fiesta and Orange bowls. Ten Miami defensive backs who played at least one season under Stoops were eventually selected in the National Football League draft – seven in the first round.

Stoops got his first experience in leading a defense as co-defensive coordinator at Houston in the 2000 season. He coached the secondary at Wyoming from 1997-99 and the Cowboys notched three straight winning seasons. A highlight of his time there was a school-record 24 interceptions in the '97 season. His first full-time coaching job was in 1996 at South Florida, helping USF in the start-up of its program before the Bulls had their first kickoff in '97.

Stoops has recruited and developed numerous outstanding defensive backs,

Stoops was raised in Youngstown, Ohio. As did brothers Bob and Mike, Mark played in the secondary at the University of Iowa for Hall of Fame coach Hayden Fry. He participated in four bowl games as a player. Fry hired Stoops as a graduate assistant coach at Iowa in the 1990 and '91 seasons. The Hawkeyes won the 1990 Big Ten title and played in the Rose Bowl, duplicating feats Stoops also achieved as a player. Stoops went on to coach four years in high school before entering the collegiate ranks.

Mark and his wife, Chantel, have two sons, Will and Zack.


