THE STORYLINE

- The Gators' 313 points mark their third-highest total through the first seven games of any season in school history. only trailing the 1996 Gators (366) and 1994 Gators (339).
- Florida has scored 35-plus points in nine consecutive games, breaking a school record set in 2008 (eight games from Oct. 4-Nov. 29) and 1996 (first eight games). The seven straight 35-point outings against SEC teams also broke a school record put together within the 1996, 2008 streaks.
- The Gators have beaten three SEC opponents by at least 20 points for the first time since 2009 (also three such wins).
- Florida is coming off its third game of 400-plus passing yards this season, marking the first time since 2001 and sixth time in program history it has three such outings in a season. Previous occurrences were: 2001 (seven times), 1998 (five), 1995 (four), and 1994 and 1993 (three apiece).
- With a win this week, **Dan Mullen** would pass Steve Spurrier and Urban Meyer for the best 34-game start by a head coach in UF history. All three posted identical 27-6 records through 33. Spurrier and Meyer both lost their 34th game.

GATORS FEATURE WIDEST PASSING DISTRIBUTION IN FBS

- **Kyle Trask**'s 31 touchdown passes not only lead the nation by five, they are tied with Tulsa's David Johnson (2008) and Texas Tech's Graham Harrell (2007) for the second-highest total through seven games in FBS history. Only Texas Tech's B.J. Symons (32 in 2003) threw for more in his team's first seven games.
 - » The two other FBS quarterbacks with over 23 touchdown passes have played at least eight games.
- In just seven games, Trask broke the SEC record for touchdown passes in league games, eclipsing the record jointly held by LSU's Joe Burrow (28 in 2019) and Florida's Danny Wuerffel (28 in 1995).
- Trask ranks second nationally in passing yards per game (364.9) and fifth in passer rating (197.09).
- As a team, Florida's 33 touchdown passes lead the nation by four, and the only other teams with more than 24 touchdown passes this season have all played at least eight games compared to Florida's seven.
- The Gators are the only FBS team featuring three players with at least six touchdown receptions this year, numbers reached by **Kyle Pitts** (eight), **Kadarius Toney** (seven), and **Trevon Grimes** (six). They are the first Gators trio with six-plus touchdown receptions since 2001 (Reche Caldwell, Jabar Gaffney, Taylor Jacobs).
- **Grimes** has a touchdown reception each of the last four games, joining **Toney** (first four games of this season), Percy Harvin (six games from Sept. 20-Nov. 1, 2008), and Dallas Baker (five games - the final two of 2005, and first three of 2006) as the only Gators since 2002 with touchdown catches in four straight games.
- Florida is the only FBS team featuring five players with at least three touchdown receptions this season, and it is one of five FBS teams (Arkansas State, Liberty, Marshall, Texas) with 10 different players with a touchdown catch.



FUN 'N' GUN? MULLEN'S OFFENSE CERTAINLY COMPARES

- Florida ranks eighth nationally and second in the SEC with 7.42 yards per play -- which is on pace for the school record of 7.40 set by the 1995 Gators. Last year, UF's 6.5 yards per play ranked 16th nationally, far and away its best average since 2009 (7.0 yards per play).
- The Gators' 44.7 points per game this season rank eighth nationally and second in the SEC. The only Florida teams in history to average at least 44 points per game were the 1996 Gators (46.6) and 1995 Gators (44.5).
- Florida's 36.4 points per game since the start of the 2018 season rank seventh among Power Five programs and 12th in the FBS. From 2015-17, Florida ranked 110th nationally and averaged just 23.1 points per game.
- UF has scored 40-plus points 12 times under Mullen, equaling its number of 40-point outings it had in 101
 games from 2010-17. Prior to last week, the Gators had three consecutive 40-point games against SEC opponents for the first time since a five-game run from Oct. 11-Nov. 15, 2008.
- Florida has scored five offensive touchdowns in seven consecutive games for the first time since 2008, when it
 compiled an eight-game streak from Oct. 4-Nov. 29.
- This is the first time since 1996 UF has scored five offensive touchdowns in seven games against SEC teams.
- While the Gators' 522.3 total yards per game rank ninth nationally, they are only running 70.4 plays per game. Among the 15 FBS teams averaging at least 500 total yards per game this season, only Florida, Western Michigan (63.3), BYU (68.1), and Alabama (69.3) are averaging fewer than 73 plays per game.
- UF has four consecutive games of 500-plus total yards for the first time since the first four games of 2007, but
 it is the first time since a four-game streak from Oct. 5-Nov. 2, 1996 the Gators have done it in four straight
 games against SEC teams. The Gators have five games of 500-plus total yards against SEC opponents this year,
 marking the first time since 2001 (also five times) they had five such games against SEC teams in a season.
- Last Saturday was also the eighth time under Mullen UF logged 500 total yards against an SEC team, one more
 than the program's total number of 500-yard outings against SEC teams from 2008-17.
- Junior tight end Kyle Pitts and senior all-purpose athlete Kadarius Toney have combined for 15 touchdown
 receptions this year. The last time two Gators combined for 15-plus receiving touchdowns was 2006, when
 Dallas Baker led the team with 10 and Andre Caldwell ranked second with six.
- Pitts' eight touchdown receptions are tied for eighth among all FBS players, and Toney's seven are tied for 12th.
- Pitts' eight touchdown catches are the most by a Gator in a season since Riley Cooper finished 2009 with nine.
- Six Gators have multiple receiving touchdowns this season. Last year, seven Gators finished with two or more, marking the first time since 2007 that many Gators caught at least two touchdowns in a season.

TRASK'S HOT START COMPARED TO HEISMAN WINNERS

Trask planted himself firmly in the Heisman Trophy conversation with his eye-popping statistics through seven
games. Here is a look at the top yardage and touchdown numbers among all Heisman-winning quarterbacks
through seven games. The first table is sorted by passing yards, the second is sorted by total touchdowns.

TRASK ON PACE TO SHATTER SEC, GATORS RECORDS

- **Kyle Trask** continues to be the best Gators quarterback, statistically, since Tim Tebow, but his numbers also resemble 2001 Heisman runner-up Rex Grossman and other Gators from Steve Spurrier's "Fun 'n' Gun" era.
- With six-touchdown outings against at Ole Miss and against Arkansas, Trask became the seventh quarterback in SEC history with multiple six-touchdown passing performances in a career. The only Gators with two such games are Danny Wuerffel (two) and Terry Dean (two).
- With four-plus passing touchdowns in six games this year, Trask is the first player in Gators history to throw
 four touchdown passes six times in a season, Danny Wuerffel (1995, 1996) was the only one to do it five times.
- Trask is the only FBS quarterback to throw four touchdown passes in five different games this season, and he's done it in six. He was also the first player in SEC history and fourth FBS quarterback since 1996 to throw at least four touchdown passes in six consecutive games (Colt Brennan, Hawaii nine games in 2006; Graham Harrell, Texas Tech six games in 2007; Logan Woodside, Toledo, six games in 2016).
- Trask's seven career games of four-plus passing touchdowns are tied with Grossman for third in school history, trailing Wuerffel (12) and Doug Johnson (eight). All seven of Trask's performances have come against SEC teams, the second-highest total in school history only behind Wuerffel's 11.
- Trask's pair of 400-yard passing games this year join him with Wuerffel (four) and Grossman (two) as the only Gators in history with multiple 400-yard outings in a career. It also ties Wuerffel's and Grossman's school record for 400-yard passing games in a season (two in 1996 for Wuerffel, two in 2001 for Grossman).
- Trask's five games of 350-plus passing yards the last two seasons are two more than the combined number of 350-yard passing outings by all Gators guarterbacks since the start of 2002.
- Trask's six games of 300-plus yards passing this year join him with Grossman as the only other quarterback in school history to post four 300-yard outings against SEC teams in a season. Grossman did it in all eight of UF's games against league opponents in 2001.
- From an overall perspective, Trask's six games of 300-plus passing yards this season mark the third time in school history a quarterback logged six such outings. Grossman has the other two (10 in 2001 / six in 2002).
- Trask's six (2020) and four (2019) games of 300 passing yards each of the last two years make him the fourth quarterback in Gators history with multiple seasons of four 300-yard passing games, joining Grossman (2001, 2002), Wuerffel (1995, 1996), and Matthews (1990, 1991, 1992).
 - » From 2010-18, Gators quarterbacks combined for three 300-yard passing games.
- With six 300-yard passing games this season, Trask has 10 career 300-yard outings, which ranks fourth in school history behind Grossman (17), Shane Matthews (15), and Wuerffel (14).
- Eight of Trask's 10 career 300-yard outings are against SEC opponents, which ranks fourth in school history.
 Only Grossman (12), Wuerffel (10), and Matthews (nine) recorded more.
- Trask also has four 300-yard outings against ranked opponents in his career. The only Gators in history with 300-plus yards against at least four top-25 teams are Trask, Matthews (five), Grossman (nine) and Wuerffel (nine).
- Trask's 31 touchdown passes rank fifth on UF's single-season record list, while his 57 career touchdowns passes
 are seventh in UF history.
- Trask is also one of three Gators (Tebow, Wuerffel) with two seasons of 25-plus passing touchdowns in a career. Tebow had 32 in 2007 and 30 in 2008, while Wuerffel had 35 in 1995 and 39 in 1996.

GATORS' AERIAL APPROACH HAS OFFENSE HUMMING

- Despite losing 173 career starts from last year's offensive personnel, mostly from its veteran receiving corps and dual-threat running back Lamical Perine, Florida's passing offense is still humming along.
- Florida ranks sixth nationally with a 193.41 passer rating this year, which is on pace to shatter the school record of 171.8 set in 1995. The Gators' 162.0 passer rating since the start of 2018 ranks fifth among all FBS teams.
- Florida's 377.6 passing yards per game lead the nation, putting it on pace for a historic passing season. The only team in UF history to throw for more than 368 yards per game was the 2001 Gators (405.2).
- UF finished 2019 ranked 16th nationally in passing offense (300.8 yards per game), which was the first time in nearly two decades it threw the ball that consistently. UF's highest national finish in passing offense since the start of 2010 was 79th (in 2016), and it finished outside the top 100 in four of the nine seasons from 2010-18.
- Florida has logged 300-plus passing yards 15 times under Mullen (and 10 times in its last 11 games). In the 156 games spanning the 2007-17 seasons, UF threw for 300 yards a total of 16 times.



PITTS SETS A NEW STANDARD FOR TIGHT ENDS

- "He's that matchup problem. You get backers matched up on him, and that's a problem in the pass game.
 You put DBs on him in the run game, and he's a physical blocker at the point of attack. That's what you want at the tight end position." --Dan Mullen on Pitts following UF's season-opening win at Ole Miss
- **Kyle Pitts** hauled in his eighth touchdown reception of the season in the win over Georgia, meaning it took him just five games to break the single-season school record for touchdown receptions by a tight end -- which was previously set by Cornelius Ingram (seven in 2007) and Kirk Kirkpatrick (seven in 1990).
- Additionally, Pitts' eight receiving touchdowns this year are one shy of the FBS receiving touchdown leaders
 among tight ends last season -- SMU's Kylen Granson and Louisiana-Monroe's Josh Pederson had nine in 13
 and 12 games, respectively.
- Pitts' 5-yard touchdown reception in the first quarter at Texas A&M was the 13th of his career and broke the school record for touchdown receptions by a tight end, which was established at the end of the 2009 season.
- Pitts' four touchdowns in the opener and two the following week made him the first Gator since Taylor
 Jacobs (Sept. 21-28, 2002) with multiple touchdown receptions in consecutive games. Kadarius Toney also
 accomplished the feat with a pair of touchdown receptions against both Texas A&M and Missouri.
- According to ESPN Stats & Info, Pitts' six touchdowns in the first two games were tied for the second-most
 over a two-game span by ANY SEC player the last 25 seasons (Vanderbilt's Earl Bennett had seven in 2005).
- With his 170-yard outing against Ole Miss, and his 108-yard outing at LSU last season, Pitts is one of four Gators tight ends in history (Kirk Kirkpatrick, Ben Troupe, and a third) with two career 100-yard receiving games.
- Even without playing the last two weeks, Pitts' 24 receptions this season are tied 13th among all FBS tight ends; he is one of two players inside the top 15 with fewer than six games played this season.
- Pitts is one of 10 FBS tight ends with five-plus receptions in three games this season; he had eight in the opener at Ole Miss, five at Texas A&M, and five against Missouri.
- Pitts is also one of 10 FBS tight ends with multiple games of at least 80 receiving yards this season; he had 81 against Missouri, and 170 in the season opener at 0le Miss.
- Pitts' 81 career receptions put him within one catch of Kirkpatrick (82 from 1987-90) for the second-most career receptions by a tight end in school history.
- Last year, Pitts -- who had 54 receptions for 649 yards and five touchdowns -- became one of nine FBS tight ends
 since the start of 2015 with over 50 catches, 625-plus yards, and five touchdowns in a season. That group includes
 Oklahoma's Mark Andrews (2017) and Ole Miss' Evan Engram (2016), both of whom are starring for NFL teams.

TONEY'S DEVELOPMENT AS A RECEIVER ON DISPLAY

- Kadarius Toney has been regarded as a dynamic playmaker since his career debut in 2017, but his development
 as a receiver this season truly makes him one of the most unique threats in college football.
- Toney ranks ninth in the SEC with an average of 109.6 all-purpose yards per game, and he is one of eight SEC players with a combined eight rushing and receiving touchdowns this season (seven receiving, one rushing).
- Toney's eight scrimmage touchdowns this year are more than double the number of career total touchdowns he entered the 2020 season with (three -- two receiving, one rushing).
- Toney is coming off his first career 100-yard receiving game (six catches for 107 yards and a touchdown).
- Toney flashed his dual-threat prowess versus Missouri, catching two touchdown passes and running in another; he is one of four FBS players this year with two receiving touchdowns and a rushing touchdown in a game.
- In the season opener at Ole Miss, Toney's dual-threat production amounted to five receptions for 59 yards and a touchdown, along with two carries for 55 yards.
- In just seven games this year, Toney has the highest sesaon totals for receptions (42) and receiving yards (503) of his career. His previous season highs (25 receptions and 260 yards) came in 2018, when he played 12 games.
- Toney has posted a career-high seven receptions three times this season, and he has six games of five-plus
 receptions this year. Toney entered the season with one career game of five-plus receptions (six against Idaho
 on Nov. 17, 2018).
- Toney had a breakout game as a receiver at Texas A&M, setting career highs for receptions (seven), receiving

DEFENSE TAKING STEPS FORWARD

- Florida got off to a rough start defensively, but it has played well for extended stretches of late.
- UF leads the SEC with 3.00 sacks per game and is tied for second in the league with 6.43 TFLs per game.
- Florida has 10 takeaways this season, bringing its total since the start of 2018 up to 59 -- which is tied for 13th
 among FBS teams.
- Although it fell into a 14-0 hole and gave up 136 yards on Georgia's first two possessions, the Gators' defense responded and allowed just 141 yards on 51 plays (2.76 yards per play).
- That finish resembled its start to the Missouri game. Prior to the final two defensive drives against Missouri -- by which time UF built a 41-10 lead -- the Gators gave up just 172 total yards and did not cede a touchdown to the Tigers' offense.
- Also against Missouri, Florida also had its best performance when facing at least 15 third down attempts (3-15 / 20 percent) since last year's rout of Vanderbilt, when it held the Commodores to three of 15 on third down.
- In consecutive weeks against Georgia and Arkansas, Florida allowed Georgia to convert just two of its 13 third downs (15.4 percent), and Arkansas to convert just three of nine third downs.
- The Gators snared three interceptions in the win over Georgia, setting a season high for takeaways.
- Florida, Florida Atlantic, Oklahoma State, San Diego State, and Tennessee were the only FBS teams with at least three interceptions in three different games last season.
- Last season, UF finished seventh nationally in scoring defense (15.5 points), posted three shutouts for the first time since 1988, and was one of two FBS teams (Oregon being the other) to hold five opponents without an offensive touchdown. The 23 offensive touchdowns allowed by the Gators last season were tied for the fourth-lowest total nationally, and the fewest they surrendered since 2012.

HUGE NUMBERS FROM STATEMENT WIN OVER GEORGIA

- UF notched its fourth win over an AP top-10 team under Mullen. From 2010-17, it was 5-11 against top-10 teams.
- In its win over Georgia, the Gators amassed 571 total yards (the most allowed by a Georgia defense since 2001, when UF racked up 584), tallied 474 passing yards (the most allowed by a Georgia defense since Kentucky threw for 528 in 2000), and scored 44 points (the third-highest total Georgia surrendered since Kirby Smart took over in 2016) with the vast majority of that production coming after it fell behind 14-0 three minutes in.
- Following the 14-0 deficit, Florida closed the first half with 38 points and 408 total yards on 43 plays. Within that same span, the Gators held Georgia to 30 yards on 18 plays and only gave up points via a pick-six.
- Florida's 38 points set a single-half school record for points against Georgia, topping the 35 points scored in the second half of the Gators' 49-10 rout of the Bulldogs in 2008.
- UF's five offensive touchdowns -- all in the first half -- tied the highest total allowed by Georgia under Smart.
- **Kyle Trask** broke Kerwin Bell's school record for passing yards against Georgia (408 in 1985)... by the end of the third quarter, which he finished with 412 yards.
- Trask's 474 passing yards were the second-highest total in school history, behind Tim Tebow's 482-yard outing
 in the 2010 Sugar Bowl. UF's 474 passing yards were the seventh-highest single-game total in school history.
- UF's backs combined for 212 receiving yards on 10 catches, led by Malik Davis' five for 100 yards -- the sixth 100-yard receiving game by a back in UF history, and first since Chris Rainey's 104 versus Tennessee in 2001.

MONSTROUS FIRST HALF LEADS TO ROUT OF ARKANSAS

- The Gators threw seven touchdown passes for the seventh time in school history, and they tossed five in a single half (five in the first) for the eighth time in program history.
- UF posted its first 60-point game against an SEC team since a 63-5 win over Kentucky on Oct. 25, 2008.
- Florida recorded its second 50-point game against an SEC opponent this year, marking the first time since 2008 and ninth time in program history the Gators posted multiple 50-point outings against SEC teams in the same season. The Gators have three 50-point games against SEC teams under Mullen, who trails Spurrier (18) and Meyer (six) for the most in school history.
- The rout of Arkansas was UF's fifth 50-point outing under Mullen, equaliing the program's total of 50-point games from 2010-17.
- With his 31-yard pass to Keon Zipperer in the first quarter, Trask became the 10th player in Gators history to eclipse 5,000 career passing yards.



ADDITIONAL ACTIVE / HISTORICAL STREAKS

- Florida has been a top-10 team in each of the last 17 Associated Press Top 25 Poll releases, which is the sixth-longest streak in school history, and its longest streak since a run of 31 consecutive top-10 appearances from Oct. 12, 2008 Sept. 26, 2010. The Gators are five releases shy of the program's fifth-longest streak.
- The Gators have won 11 consecutive home games, marking their longest streak since a 13-game run which spanned the final four homes games of 2008, all six home games in 2009, and the first three games of 2010.
- UF has finished with fewer than 10 penalties in 27 consecutive games. Dating back to the start of 2019, UF has been charged with five or fewer penalties in 13 of their 20 games, including seven of the last nine.
 - » The Gators were consistently among the most penalized teams in the SEC during the 2010s, finishing dead last in the league in 2011, 2012, 2013, and 2016.
- Kyle Trask has thrown for 300-plus yards each of the last five games, extending the second-longest streak
 of 300-yard passing games in school history. Rex Grossman set the school record with nine in a row in 2001.
 Trask also has an active streak of 15 games with 200-plus yards passing -- the second-longest streak in
 school history. The school record of 17 is held by Shane Matthews.
- UF has five straight games of 300-plus passing yards for the first time since a 14-game run which began with the 2001 Sugar Bowl, spanned all of 2001, and ended the week after the 2002 season-opening rout of UAB.
- UF has scored in 405 consecutive games -- which is an NCAA record. The Gators broke Michigan's record of 365 consecutive games (1984-2014) against LSU on Oct. 7, 2017.
- Since 2008, Florida and Alabama are the only FBS programs without a loss to a team that finished the season with a losing record. UF is one of four teams since 2013 to stave off such a loss (Alabama, LSU, Michigan).

WILD NUMBERS FROM RECORD-SETTING OPENER

- Pitts' four touchdown receptions tied the single-game school record, previously set by receivers lke Hilliard (Sept. 16, 1995 against Tennessee) and Jack Jackson (Sept. 3, 1994 against New Mexico State).
- Pitts became the 16th player in SEC history to haul in four touchdown receptions in a game, and the ninth to accomplish the feat against a conference opponent; he was one shy of the SEC's single-game record of five touchdown receptions, which is shared by four players.
- Pitts tied the SEC's single-game record for touchdown receptions by a tight end, equaling Kentucky's Al Bruno (1950 against North Dakota), Georgia Tech's Buck Martin (1951 against Auburn), Vanderbilt's Allama Matthews (1982 against Virginia Tech), and Kentucky's James Whalen (1999 against Georgia).
- Last year, the five FBS players with 150-plus receiving yards and four touchdown receptions against an FBS opponent were all receivers: Alabama's DeVonta Smith, LSU's Ja'Marr Chase and Justin Jefferson, and Hawaii's Cedric Byrd II and Jojo Ward. Smith is the only other FBS player with such a game this year.
- Pitts is one of three FBS tight ends since the start of the 1996 season to amass 150-plus receiving yards and four touchdown receptions in a game, joining Stanford's Colby Parkinson (six receptions, 166 yards, four touchdowns against Oregon State in 2018) and Kentucky's James Whalen Jr. (10 receptions, 151 yards, four touchdowns against Georgia in 1999).
- Pitts' 170 receiving yards broke the single-game school record for receiving yards by a tight end, which was previously set Oct. 20, 1990 by Kirk Kirkpatrick (122 yards against Akron).
- Trask's six touchdown passes were one shy of the SEC single-game record held by seven players, including UF's Terry Dean (seven against New Mexico St. in 1994) and Doug Johnson (seven against Central Michigan in 1997).
- Trask became the 16th player in SEC history to throw six touchdown passes in a game. He also became the sixth Gators quarterback to throw six in a game. Aside from Florida (six) and Kentucky (three), no other SEC program has produced multiple quarterbacks who threw for six touchdowns in a game.
- Trask became the 10th player in SEC history to throw six touchdown passes against a conference opponent; he is one of three Gators quarterbacks to accomplish the feat, joining Danny Wuerffel (six against Tennessee in 1995) and Chris Leak (six against South Carolina in 2004).
- Trask's 416 passing yards were the ninth-highest total in school history, and the fifth-highest total by a Gators quarterback against an SEC opponent. They marked the highest total by a Gators quarterback against an SEC opponent since Rex Grossman threw for 464 yards at LSU back on Oct. 6, 2001.
- Since the start of 2018, the only FBS quarterbacks to throw for at least 400 yards and six touchdowns
 without an interception against a Power Five opponent are: Trask, Alabama's Tua Tagovailoa, LSU's Joe
 Burrow, Oklahoma's Kyler Murray, Washington State's Gardner Minshew II, and Ole Miss' Matt Corral.
- Trask's six touchdown passes tied 2019 Heisman winner Joe Burrow's record for passing TDs in a SEC opener.

Offensive Upticks Continued in Mullen's Second Act

- Florida recorded seven games of 500-plus total yards in Mullen's first two seasons. In 75 games from 2012-17, UF had six 500-yard outings.
- Florida recorded 14 games of 400-plus total yards in Mullen's first 26 games as head coach. In the program's 50 games from 2014-17, UF had 400-plus yards just 14 times.
- The Gators had eight games of 400-plus total yards in 2019, their most such games in a season since 2008 -- Mullen's final year as O.C. -- when they did it 10 times.
- UF scored 40-plus points nine times in Mullen's first 26 games (three in 2019, six in 2018). In the 88 games spanning 2011-17, Florida scored 40 points on nine occasions.
- Florida also produced six games of 35-plus points in consecutive seasons (six in 2019, eight in 2018) for the first time since 2007-09.
- Florida scored 105 offensive touchdowns in Mullen's first 26 games. In the three seasons prior to his arrival (2015-17), the Gators scored 93 offensive touchdowns in 38 games.

Mullen Revived Florida's Offense in Debut Season

- The Gators finished in the top 100 in scoring offense for the first time since 2014. They had not finished higher than 96th in total offense since 2010 (when they were 83rd), and their only passing offense to rank higher than 85th following the 2009 season checked in at 79th (2016).
- Florida's averages in each of the following categories were also its highest since 2009: scoring offense, total offense, rushing offense (and average), touchdown-interception ratio, passing touchdowns, and scrimmage touchdowns.
- Here is a look those massive improvements:

 Florida also had its most games of 500-plus total yards (four), 400-plus total yards (six), and 350plus total yards (10) since 2009, when it had five, six, and 10, respectively.

- Mullen joined Stanford's Chuck Shaughnessy (1-7-1 in 1939; 10-0 in 1940) and Auburn's Gus Malzahn (3-9 in 2012; 12-2 in 2013) as the only other head coaches in history to win 10 games in a debut season at a current Power Five program after inherting a team that won less than five games the year prior.
- Oversaw the second-highest wins turnaround in school history (4-7 to 10-3 / +6), with it only being behind the 1980 Gators, who went 8-4 following a 0-10-1 campaign in 1979.

In Perspective: Mullen's Mississippi State Turnaround

- Mullen took over in Starkville with the Bulldogs coming off a 4-8 season and a nine-season stretch from 2000-08 in which they went 37-69 and made just two bowl appearances.
- The Bulldogs went 69-46 overall, 33-39 in SEC play, and made eight bowl games in Mullen's nine sesaons as head coach. Of his losses, 34 (or 74 percent of them) were to ranked opponents.

Mullen made Mississippi State one of 11 FBS programs to produce six different 1,000-yard rushers from 2009-17. The others were: Auburn (9), Nevada (7), Alabama (6), Army (6), Baylor (6), Boise State (6), Georgia Tech (6), Navy (6), Ohio State (6), and Wisconsin (6).



DAN MULLEN - FLORIDA HEAD COACH

- Mississippi State produced 26 NFL Draft picks in Mullen's tenure, including a pair
 of first-rounders. From 1996 through 2008, MSU had 27 NFL Draft picks.
- Seven of MSU's top nine (and all of its top four) highest total offense per game season averages were produced with Mullen as head coach
- MSU broke over 112 game, season, and career school records under Mullen.

In Perspective: Mullen Takes Mississippi State to No. 1

- Mullen led Mississippi State to a 9-0 start in 2014, allowing the Bulldogs to secure the No. 1 ranking in the Associated Press Top 25 for a five-week stretch from Oct. 12 through Nov. 9.
- MSU held the No. 1 ranking until after a 25-20 loss at No. 4 Alabama on Nov. 15.
- Since 2001, only 16 FBS programs -- predominantly "blueblood" schools -- have been ranked No. 1 in the AP Top 25. And 11 of those 16 were ranked No. 1 in the AP Top 25 at least five weeks: Alabama, Clemson, Florida, Florida State, LSU, Miami, Mississippi State, Oklahoma, Ohio State, Oregon, and Southern California.
- Since 2013, only six FBS programs have been the No. 1 team in the AP Top 25.

In Perspective: Mullen as Florida's O.C.

- During Mullen's four seasons as the Gators offensive coordinator (2005-08), UF ranked 3rd in passer rating (155.9), 8th in scoring offense (36.3), 15th in total offense (418.9), 21st in rushing offense (185.6), 39th in passing offense (233.2).
- Coordinated an offense that ranked 4th nationally in points per game (43.6--also fourth in school history) and 15th in yards per game (445.1), eventually helping the Gators win the 2009 BCS National Championship Game.
- Coordinated a Gators offense that scored 41 points to rout Ohio State--which had the nation's top scoring defense--in the 2007 BCS National Champ. Game.
- Coordinated the 2007 offense to 457.2 total yards per game -- 8th in UF history.
- Helped Chad Jackson garner Biletnikoff Award semifinalist status after he set UF's single-season record with 88 receptions in 2005. Jackson led the SEC and ranked 6th nationally in receptions.
- Also in 2005, center Mike Degory was named a Rimington Trophy finalist.

In Perspective: Mullen's Quarterbacks Track Record

- In 2002 at Bowling Green, Mullen helped Josh Harris account for the 2nd-most total touchdowns (41) among FBS players and 3,213 total yards.
- In 2004 at Utah, Mullen helped Alex Smith account for the second-most total touchdowns (42) among FBS players, and amass 3,604 total yards.
- Smith finished fourth in the 2004 Heisman Trophy voting and was the No. 1 pick in 2005 NFL Draft.
- In 2007, Mullen helped Tim Tebow account for the 2nd-most total touchdowns (55 -- an SEC record) among FBS players, and amass 4,181 total yards.
- Tebow was the first quarterback in FBS history to pass for 20+ touchdowns and rush for 20+ touchdowns in a season (2007), and his 2007 season remains the

- only one in history of more than 30 passing and 20 rushing touchdowns.
- Tebow won the Heisman Trophy in 2007 (first-ever underclassman winner).
- Tebow's numbers dipped slightly in 2008, but he still ranked 7th nationally in total touchdowns (42) and accounted for 3,419 total yards.
- In 2014, Mullen helped Dak Prescott finish tied for fifth nationally in total touchdowns (42) in 2014, in addition to totaling 4,470 yards (3,449 pass / 986 rush / 35 receiving).
- Prescott was eighth in the Heisman voting and a Maxwell Award finalist in 2014.
- Prescott's rushing production dipped in 2015, but he increased his passing production and finished the season ranked 15th nationally in passing yards (3,793).
 He also ranked 11th nationally with 39 total touchdowns.
- In 2016, Mullen helped first-year starter Nick Fitzgerald, a redshirt sophomore, tie for 14th nationally with 37 total touchdowns. Fitzgerald also ran for 1,375 yards--ranking 3rd among FBS quarterbacks.
- In 2017, Fitzgerald accounted for 2,766 yards (1,782 passing, 984 rushing) and 29 touchdowns (15 passing, 14 rushing) despite missing nearly all of the Egg Bowl and Mississippi State's bowl game due to a gruesome ankle injury.
- Much of Florida's offensive success in 2018 could be attributed to Feleipe Franks' turnaround, which Mullen engineered. Franks finished the year tied for 17th nationally in touchdown-interception ratio, and his 24 touchdown passes (to six interceptions) were the highest season total since Tim Tebow threw 30 en route to the 2008 national title. Franks threw nine touchdowns and eight interceptions, and ranked 99th nationally with a 113.31 passer rating in 2017.



WHAT HAPPENED: Quarterback Kyle Trask passed for 416 yards and six touchdowns, with four of those scores going to beastly junior tight end Kyle Pitts, as the fifth-ranked Gators outgained, outscored and outlasted the host Rebels to win their 2020 season and Southeastern Conference opener Saturday at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium in Oxford, Miss.

Trask, who immediately vaulted into the early Heisman Trophy conversation, was masterful in guiding an offense that cranked out 642 yards, including 196 on the ground, for the most ever amassed by a Florida team against a league opponent. Trask staked his team to a 28-14 halftime lead by hitting 18 of 25 for 241 yards and four scores, with TDs to Pitts bracketing the first and last of those touchdowns, including a 16-yarder with just five seconds to go before intermission. Two plays out the locker room, Trask dropped and bombed a 71-yard scoring strike to Pitts to give the Gators a 21-point cushion. The Rebels never got closer than 14 after that, with UF adding a trio of consecutive field goals from junior Evan McPherson, including a 55-yarder that marked the third-longest in program history.

When Trask hit Pitts for a 17-yard touchdown with 5:14 left, he joined last year's Heisman winner, LSU's Joe Burrow, as the only QBs in league history to throw six touchdowns in an SEC opener. Florida wasn't the only team on the field to put up fat offensive numbers, which is something that figures to concern UF defensive coordinator Todd Grantham. The Rebels totaled 613 yards -- the third-most ever gained against the Gators -- with quarterback Matt Corral, once a UF commitment, finishing 22-for-31 for 395 yards, three touchdowns and one interception.

WHAT IT MEANS: The Gators have a win in their SEC opener for the second straight season and now have now started 1-0 in league play 15 of the last 16 seasons, dating to 2005. It's always good to not have to play catch-up in the SEC East. Even better when considering the 10-game SEC schedule.

IN THE SPOTLIGHT: Hard to believe there's a better tight end in the country than Pitts, but Trask is the guy who was throwing him the ball and, boy, was he good at it. There's a reason he was named the preseason All-SEC First Team quarterback. He finished 30 of 42 for 416 yards, with those half-dozen touchdowns, no interceptions, and a whopping QB rating of 201.8. The six TDs fell one shy of the school and SEC record of seven, with UF's jointly held by Terry Dean (1994 vs. New Mexico State) and Doug Johnson (1997 vs. Central Michigan), and the conference's shared by another six players.

STAGGERING STATISTIC: Pick any number of numbers from the Florida offensive box score. We already mentioned Trask tying Burrow's SEC opener touchdown record, so how 'bout Pitts' four touchdown receptions tying the single-game school record set previously by Ike Hilliard against Tennessee in 1995 and Jack Jackson against New Mexico State in 1994.

WHAT HAPPENED: Fifth-year senior quarterback Kyle Trask continued his torrid start to the 2020 season, as did sidekick tight end Kyle Pitts, for that matter, as the third-ranked Gators took care of business against the Southeastern Conference East Division rival Gamecocks with a win Saturday before a socially distanced crowd of 15,120 at Spurrier/Florida Field. Trask completed 21 of his 29 throws for 268 yards, four touchdowns and one interception, piling on his fat numbers from a week ago when he passed for 416 yards and six TDs without a turnover in a win at Ole Miss. Pitts, the 6-foot-6, 240-pound matchup nightmare, caught four passes for 47 yards and two scores, as the featured threat in an offense that ended up with just 348 yards because of a bizarre fourth quarter dominated by the Gamecocks. South Carolina scored on the game's first possession on a 75-yard march over 12 plays. Florida countered with a 75-yard scoring march of its own, capped by a 2-yard run by junior tailback Dameon Pierce. The UF defense forced a punt on USC's second possession, and Trask again marched the Gators to the end zone, this time finding Pitts for the first of his two scores. The Gamecocks answered, but only after Trask was hit and fumbled for his first turnover of the season. South Carolina's Collin Hill hit wideout Shi Smith for a 4-yard TD to tie the game at 14-all. From there, Florida dropped 24 unanswered points -- a field goal from Evan McPherson, plus Trask touchdown tosses to Pitts (again), redshirt freshman wideout Trent Whittemore and 57-yard catch-and-run from senior wingback Kadarius Toney -- to lead 38-24 late in the third quarter. Hill, who completed 28 of 47 passes for 211 yards and two TDs, worked the Gamecocks for 10 straight points to make it 38-24 with just over 10 minutes left, and had a chance for more. South Carolina got the ball back with 8:11 to go needing a pair of touchdowns, but the Gamecocks took their sweet time in marching all the way to the UF 4 with less than a minute to play. Hill's fourth-and-goal pass attempt to cut the lead in half fell incomplete with 48 seconds left, sealing the deal for the home team.

WHAT IT MEANS: Two games, two victories, and both in league play. The Gators will be no worse than one of two unbeaten SEC East teams by day's end (Tennessee defeated Missouri early Saturday, as well), with three-time reigning division champ Georgia slated for a big game tonight at home against Auburn.

IN THE SPOTLIGHT: South Carolina held the ball for 11:12 of the fourth period and ran 29 plays to Florida's 10 and outgained UF 99-9 in the period. Of those Gators plays, three of them were kneel-downs to run out the clock on the final possession of the game.

STAGGERING STATISTIC: Florida (2-0, 2-0) is back on the road, with the Gators heading to Texas A&M. The Aggies (1-0) began the day ranked 13th, but with a date at No. 2 Alabama, the preseason favorite to win the league. UF is 1-1 against A&M since the Aggies entered the league, with both teams winning on the road. The Gators were victorious at College Station in 2012, with a 20-17 come-from-behind win over Johnny Manziel and the Aggies in what was A&M's first-ever game as a member of the SFC

WHAT HAPPENED: Junior Seth Small kicked a 26-yard field goal as time expired Saturday and the 21st-ranked Aggies upset the No. 4 Gators in a game devoid of defense at Kyle Field. Senior quarterback Kellen Mond, making his 37th career start, passed for 338 yards and three touchdowns, while tailback Isaiah Spiller shredded the Gators for 174 rushing yards and two more scores. But it took the Aggies' defense to make the play that changed the course of the outcome. The score was tied at 38 when Florida quarterback Kyle Trask, already with 312 yards, four touchdowns and no interception, took over with 3:40 remaining and a chance for the game-winning drive. After hitting senior tailback Malik Davis for 23 yards to near midfield, Davis fumbled the ball away two plays later and the Aggies recovered at the UF 48. Mond needed eight plays to move his team 40 yards, hitting a big third-and-8 completion (a troubling trend on the day against the UF defense) to wideout Chase Lane for 16 yards to the UF 19. On the next play, Spiller rushed 11 yards to the 8 and, after an A&M timeout, basically gave Small an extra point to win the game. Mond finished 25 of 35 against a UF defense that yielded 543 yards and an astounding 12-for-15 conversions on third down. Trask was 23-for-32, but was denied a chance at a game-winning drive. Florida finished with 402 yards of offense, but just 90 on the ground, compared to A&M's 205. The Aggies trailed 38-31 with just over six minutes left, but got a 51-yard scoring bomb from Mond to wideout Caleb Chapman to tie the game, then the turnover that turned the game. A&M started the day 0-7 against teams ranked in the top five during Coach Jimbo Fisher's three seasons since bolting from Florida State. In those games, the Aggies had been outscored by an average of 19.1 points, including last weekend's 28-point loss at No. 2-ranked Alabama. They're

WHAT IT MEANS: The Gators will be chasing the winner of Saturday's game between Tennessee and Georgia, both of which began the day unbeaten and tied with the UF atop the SEC East. (Update: Georgia won 44-21). The defeat wasn't a death knell to their hopes of winning division (not with dates against the Volunteers and Bulldogs down the road), but in the bigger, College Football Playoff picture, a loss to a team that was steamrolled 52-24 at Alabama last week won't help the Gators pass the eye test down the line; if it comes to that. There's also the more closer-to-home issue of that defense, which will be under serious reevaluation.

IN THE SPOTLIGHT: Mond and Spiller accounted for 515 of their team's 543 yards. That's 94.8 percent.

STAGGERING STATISTIC: The Aggies averaged 7.3 yards per snap. The Gators averaged 7.2, but 18 fewer plays, and thus nearly 170 fewer yards.

UP NEXT: The Gators (2-1, 2-1) return home to facing reigning national champion LSU (1-2, 1-2), which Saturday was stunned at unranked Missouri, 45-41, in a game that was moved from Baton Rouge to Columbia due to Hurricane Delta. The Tigers are a shadow of the team they were last year with Heisman Trophy winner and No. 1 overall draft pick Joe Burrow, what with 14 players taken in the NFL draft, but still quite talented and formidable, regardless of their two losses, including those 600-plus yards passing surrendered in a season-opening home loss against Mississippi State.

WHAT HAPPENED: Florida started slow offensively, but its defense held firm until a scoring surge late in the second quarter gave the Gators a two-score lead they extended with a pair of touchdowns in the third quarter. UF carried its 34-7 lead into the fourth quarter, and never allowed Missouri to get closer than 24 points en route to its 10th consecutive home win. Until mop-up duty late in the game, the only touchdown scored against the Gators came when redshirt senior quarterback Kyle Trask was hit on a throw, which led to a wounded duck of a pass and a 59-yard interception return touchdown by Missouri's Jarvis Ware. The pick-six put Missouri up, 7-6, a little over two minutes into the second quarter, as the Gators settled for a pair of field goals (both made by redshirt junior backup kicker Chris Howard) on their first two drives, despite some explosive passing plays from Trask to junior tight end Kyle Pitts and running backs Malik Davis and Dameon Pierce. Florida's offense got on track late in the second quarter, as a 36-yard pass from Trask to redshirt sophomore wide receiver Jacob Copeland drove the Gators to Missouri's 24-yard line. Then senior all-purpose athlete Kadarius Toney delivered his latest video game-esque escape for an 18-vard touchdown run. Missouri faced a third-and-1 on the ensuing drive, and Brenton Cox Jr. recovered a fumbled exchange between Tigers quarterback Connor Bazelak and running back Tyler Badie, giving the Gators the ball at the Missouri 30-yard line with 1:15 remaining. They only needed seven seconds, as Trask found Toney for a 30-yard touchdown reception on the very next play, securing a 20-7 halftime lead. Florida faced a fourth-and-1 at Missouri's 31-yard line on its opening drive of the second half, which Trask converted himself with a 15-yard run. Toney capped the 8-play, 75-yard touchdown drive with a 16-yard touchdown run on the next play, making it 27-7. The Gators kept the ball on the ground for much of their next drive, which transfer receiver Justin Shorter capped with a 2-yard touchdown reception, the first of his collegiate career. Trask delivered his fourth touchdown pass of the night on an 18-yard connection with Trevon Grimes midway through the fourth quarter. The Texas native became the first Gators quarterback in history to throw at least four touchdown passes in four consecutive games, and brought his season total up to 18 (read on for more on how remarkable that feat is).

WHAT IT MEANS: Florida shook off the rust in its first game since a tough loss at Texas A&M on Oct. 10, and shored up some of the defensive issues it displayed through the first three outings this season. Most importantly, the Gators generated some momentum heading into next week's highly-anticipated rivalry matchup.

IN THE SPOTLIGHT: The Florida defense. The unit entered the night ranked near the bottom of the FBS in rushing and passing defense, but until Missouri's final two drives – by which time Florida built a 41-10 lead – the Gators allowed just 172 total yards. Florida also limited Missouri to just three conversions on 15 third-down attempts (20 percent). The last time UF held its opponent to 20 percent or worse on third downs when it faced at least 15 was last year's rout of Vanderbilt, a game in which the Gators finished with the exact same 3-for-15 stat line on third down.

STAGGERING STATISTIC: 18. Trask's touchdown total through four games this season – which set an SEC record for touchdown passes in the first four games of a season. Entering Saturday's games, the FBS leader was UCF's Dillon Gabriel, who threw 19 touchdowns. In five games.

WHAT HAPPENED: Quarterback Kyle Trask and the eighth-ranked Gators spotted their rival a two-touchdown lead in the first quarter, but Trask and friends quickly flipped the script and bombarded the fifth-ranked Bulldogs with an offensive barrage that made a mockery of the Southeastern Conference's top-rated defense and put Florida in control in the race for the East Division title. Trask passed for a career-high 474 yards and four touchdowns, all coming in the first half, as the Florida offense flatened Georgia, which came in allowing only 300 yards per game, to the tune of 571 total yards for the Gators' first win in the series since 2016, UGA tailback Zamir White total yards for the Gators' first win in the series since 2016. UGA tailback Zamir White went 75 yards on the first play from scrimmage to put the Bulldogs ahead just 12 seconds into the game. After a UF three-and-out, UGA marched 61 yards in six plays with Stetson Bennett hitting Marcus Rosemy-Jacksaint with a 32-yard touchdown pass to go up 14-0 barely four minutes in. From there, the rest of the half was all Gators, as UF outgained UGA 433 yards to just 44 in taking a 38-21 lead into the locker room, including a gorgeous 14-yard touchdown reception by a leaping Trevon Grimes with just 11 seconds to play in the half. Trask also had touchdown strikes of 14 yards to wideout Justin Shorter, 25 yards to tight end Kyle Pitts, who later left the game following a vicious helmet-to-helmet strike from UGA's Lewis Cine (ejected), and 25 yards to pitts backin Kempre Gamble, but also a pick 6 that temporarily out his team yards to Pitts backup Kemore Gamble, but also a pick-6 that temporarily put his team down 21-14. Not for long, though. Junior running back Dameon Pierce had a 2-yard rushing TD in the first quarter and sophomore Evan McPherson kicked field goals of 50, 51 and 34 yards, the last coming with 1:19 to play. Bennett completed just five of his 16 passes for 78 yards, one touchdown and an interception and eventually was benched for redshirt freshman D'Wan Mathis, who marched the Dogs to a touchdown with a 25-yard dart to Kearis Jackson to close within 41-28 late in the third quarter. That would be it for the Dogs, though. The two UGA quarterbacks completed only 9 of 29 passes for just 112 yards, two touchdowns and three interceptions. The Dogs' inability to sustain offense with either QB allowed the Gators to win despite scoring just six points after halftime

WHAT IT MEANS: Florida has a a spot in the driver's seat to the Southeastern Conference East Division title. The Gators now hold a one-game lead on the second-place Bulldogs, as well as the all-important head-to-head tiebreaker, with the rest of the other division teams at least two games back. The win was UF's first over UGA since 2016 (and first in three tries for Coach Dan Mullen), meaning the Dogs now lead the series 52-43-2.

IN THE SPOTLIGHT: Hmmm. Guess we'll go with Trask, whose season numbers now show 125 completions in 182 attempts (that's 68.7 percent) for 1,815 yards, 22 touchdowns (with four in each of the last four games) and three interceptions. That TD total is one shy of the record-setting mark LSU's Joe Burrow established through five games a season ago. Burrow went on to win the Heisman Trophy.

STAGGERING STATISTIC: In each of the last four meetings, Florida fell behind by double digits in the opening period. In 2017, in what turned out to be Coach Jim McElwain's final game, UF trailed 21-0 in the first quarter on the way to a 42-7 loss. In 2018, it was a 10-0 deficit in 36-17 loss. In 2019, again 10-0 in a 24-17 loss. It was 14-0 this time, but the outcome was way different. Also, for the first time since 2005, the team that rushed for the most yards did not win. Georgia out-gained Florida 165-97 on the ground Saturday, starting with that 75-yard blast on the first snap, but what Trask did through the air was enough to snap the 14-game streak for the dominant running team running team.

The Quick Slant

WHAT HAPPENED: UF quarterback Kyle Trask continued his assault on the Florida (and Southeastern Conference) record book, throwing for 356 yards and six touchdowns Saturday night — his sixth straight game with at least four TD strikes — to lead the sixth-ranked Gators past the Razorbacks at Spurrier/Florida Field. In facing grad-transfer and former teammate Feleipe Franks, the QB who beat him out twice (2018 and '19), Trask completed 23 of his 29 throws, with TD strikes of 9, 23, 21, 33, 5 and 11 yards, the combination of which gave him 28 on the season, which broke the six-game SEC mark, set by Alabama's Tua Tagovailoa in 2019. Florida scored on its first possession, with Trask hitting Trevon Grimes (6 catches, 109 yards, 2 TDs), but Franks answered almost instantly by lofting a gorgeous 47-yard strike to Mike Woods (2 catches, 129 yards, 2 TDs) on the Razorbacks' fifth snap. The Gators, though, scored touchdowns on their last four possessions of the half to open a 35-14 lead at intermission, with Trask going to the locker room with 281 yards and five TDs. Arkansas tailback Trelon Smith's 83-yard touchdown run cut the lead to 14 points lead, but the margin soon was padded (and then some) by backup quarterback Emory Jones' 1-yard run, Trask's early fourth-quarter pass to tight end Keon Zipperer (3 catches, 47 yards, 2 TDs) and a 35-yard fumble return by defensive lineman Zach Carter — all coming within six minutes — that quickly made it 56-21 with inside 13 minutes left. The Gators outgained the Hogs in total offense with 593 yards to 458. Of that Arkansas total, 212 yards came on a trio of scoring plays.

WHAT IT MEANS: The Gators, with a comfortable lead in the SEC East Division, inched closer to their goal of winning the East and clinching a first berth in the league championship game since 2016. With its lone loss coming on the road at No. 5 Texas A&M, Florida also remains in the mix for a potential first berth in the College Football Playoff, but that is chatter for another (and later) day.

IN THE SPOTLIGHT: This space, it seems, could be reserved for Trask every week (more on him below), but we'll single out his counterpart, instead, given the juicy pregame storyline. Franks (unfortunately) was booed when he took the field for the first Arkansas drive and took out his frustration after that big early touchdown throw, pointing at the UF bench as he sprinted down the field with his teammates. Franks finished 15 of 19 for 250 yards, two touchdowns, no interceptions and was sacked three times.

STAGGERING STATISTIC: Trask not only broke the SEC record for most TD passes through six games, but also became just the fourth FBS quarterback over the last 25 seasons to throw at least four in his first six games, joining Hawaii's Colt Brennan (nine straight in 2006), Texas Tech's Graham Harrell (six in '07) and Toledo's Logan Woodside (six in '16). On the home front, Trask, who had his second six-TD game of the season (matching his output from the season-opening win at Ole Miss), also joined Danny Wuerffel and Tim Tebow as the third QB in Florida history to throw for at least 25 touchdowns in consecutive seasons. Wuerffel had 35 in 1995 and 39 in '96, while Tebow had 32 in 2007 and 30 in '08. For the season, Trask has completed better than 70 percent of his attempts and thrown just three interceptions.

WHAT HAPPENED: Quarterback Kyle Trask threw for 383 yards and three touchdowns and the sixth-ranked Gators shook off a slow start with a run of 24 consecutive points over the two halves to claim a victory over the winless Commodores in their Southeastern Conference game Saturday at Dudley Field/Vanderbilt Stadium. Trask threw touchdown passes of 27 yards to wingback Kadarius Toney, 34 to wide receiver Trevon Grimes and 2 to tight end Kemore Gamble. The latter two scores, along with a field goal from Evan McPherson and 1-yard run by tailback Dameon Pierce, accounted for the Florida scoring run of two-dozen straight. After a Vandy TD closed the margin to 14 points late in the third quarter, UF backup quarterback Emory Jones fired a 30-yard catch-and-run TD to Gamble to take the margin back out to 21 points with less than seven minutes to go, allowing the Gators to leave Nashville with their 15th straight road win in the series. Vanderbilt scorched UF for 138 first-quarter yards and led 10-7 on a 16-yard touchdown pass from freshman Ken Seals to Chris Pierce Jr. and 25-yard Pierson Cooke field goal. That's when Florida went on its 24-point roll, starting with a tying field goal by McPherson of 33 yards. Trask and the Gators then drove to touchdowns with 49 seconds to go in the first half, when Grimes made a terrific catch between two defenders, and Pierce finished a 75-yard march to start the second half that included a fourth-and-1 gamble by UF coach Dan Mullen from his own 34-yard line. Trask's 2-yard score to Gamble pushed the Gators in front 31-10 with 2:55 to go in the third period. Vandy temporarily cut the lead back to 14, but Florida answered with a six-play, 99-yard touchdown drive to ice the game. Trask finished 26 of 35, with completions to nine different receivers and no interceptions, as UF rolled up 586 yards of total offense. With the three touchdown passes, he ran his season's total to 31 through seven games, which was one shy of Texas Tech's B.J. Symons' NCAA record of 32. Trask tied both Texas Tech's Graham Harrell (2007) and Tulsa's David Johnson (2007) for the second-most scoring throws after seven games. For Vandy, Seals completed 22 of 34 passes for 319 yards, two scores and one interception for a Vandy unit that totaled 406 yards.

WHAT IT MEANS: A fourth straight win and a step closer to clinching the program's first berth in the SEC Championship Game since 2016. The Gators maintained their one-game-plus lead over Georgia in the SEC East Division, with the "plus" being the all-important head-to-head tiebreaker edge, courtesy of UF's 44-28 defeat of the Bulldogs earlier this month. Florida can wrap up the East's title-game bid by winning two of its last three games, no matter what Georgia does.

IN THE SPOTLIGHT: With superstar tight end Kyle Pitts sidelined for a second straight week since going into concussion protocol, Gamble stepped up with a trio of big plays. After snaring his second TD of the season late in the third quarter, Gamble added a 35-yard reception to get his team off their own 1-yard line, then five plays later had a 30-yard catch-and-run for a score on a pass from backup quarterback Emory Jones. Gamble had three catches for 66 yards and the two TDs.

STAGGERING STATISTIC: UF has scored at least 35 points in nine straight games, including seven consecutive SEC games. Those are both school records, which is pretty impressive given the numbers Steve Spurrier and Urban Meyer put up back in the day.



June 9, 1992. Once The Gainesville Sun hit newstands that Tuesday, Ben Hill Griffin Stadium's fitting nickname came to life.

Steve Spurrier, entering season three as Gators head coach, called writer Mike Bianchi the day prior and pitched him the storyline. It was seven months after the Gators ended the 1991 regular season with consecutive wins over Kentucky (which clinched an undefeated SEC record and the first league title in school history) and a thrilling 14-9 defeat of No. 3 Florida State, snapping a four-game losing streak to the Seminoles. It also gave UF a perfect 12-0 home record under Spurrier.

"The 'Swamp' is where Gators live." Spurrier told Bianchi. "We feel comfortable there, but we hope our opponents feel tenative. A swamp is hot and sticky and can be dangerous."

Initially, the UF athletic department didn't embrace the nickname. No posters, bumper stickers or marketing campaigns were put together right away. But Spurrier continued to use it. Then he and then-UF communications director Norm Carlson did some research. Turns out, in 1930, UF President John J. Tigert selected the location for the school's football stadium and described the area as a "swampy depression." The school hired engineers to drain the area and install pipes that funneled water down the hill along North-South Drive and dumped it into what is now known as Graham Pond.

Needless to say, the nickname caught on, and Spurrier delivered the perfect quote for the athletic department to utilize once it eventually did embrace the moniker: "The 'Swamp' is a place where only Gators get out alive."

- Since 1990, Florida has outscored opponents 7,297 to 3,025 in 193 games inside The Swamp, putting the average outcome at 37.8 to 15.7 (22.1 points).
- The Gators had two significant win streaks in The Swamp in the 1990s: a 23game run from 1990-93, and a school-record 30-game streak from 1994-99.
- In 193 home games from 1990 through today, the Gators have...

Scored 50+ points.....51 times Scored 40+ points.....84 times Scored 30+ points.....129 times Shut Out Opponents.....16 times Allowed 3 points or less......31 times Allowed 14 points or less points......105 times

- Florida's school-record crowd of 90,916 on Nov. 28, 2015 marked the largest crowd ever to watch a football game in the state of Florida. The state has hosted 15 Super Bowls, four BCS National Championship Games and the 2017 College Football Playoff National Championship Game.
- The largest crowd for a home opener was 90,707 (Sept. 3, 2005 Wyoming). The 2009 opener (90,621) remains the second-largest.
