# [RV] RICHMOND SPIDERS (1-0) at #10 KENTUCKY WILDCATS (1-0)

- The Spiders are 13-22 vs AP Top 25 opponents under Chris Mooney. Over that span (since 2005-06), the only current A-10 school with more wins vs ranked opponents is Dayton (14-27). Mooney has been Richmond's coach for nearly half (13 of 28) of the Spiders all-time wins vs AP Top 25 opponents.
- Mooney's Richmond teams are 1-9 vs AP Top 10 teams, with the win coming against #10 Purdue (65-54) on 11/27/2010 at the Chicago Invitational Challenge. The Spiders would advance to the Sweet 16 later that season.
- Kentucky is the first of at least three power-conference teams UR will play this season. Chris Mooney has a win vs a power-conference team in 13 of his 15 seasons at Richmond, including wins over Wisconsin, Vanderbilt, and Boston College last season.
- The Spiders are 5-5 vs current SEC opponents under Mooney, with wins vs Florida, Alabama, Mississippi St, and Vanderbilt (2).
- Nathan Cayo scored a game-high 23 points while making all 10 of his shots from the field against Morehead State. Cayo is the seventh Atlantic 10 player to ever go 10-10 or better from the field in a game and the first since Dayton's Obi Toppin vs Western Michigan on 12/19/18 (11-11).
- The Spiders were picked to win the Atlantic 10 in the conference's preseason poll, receiving 19 of the 28 first-place votes from a panel of the league's head coaches and media members. It is the first time Richmond has been picked to win the A-10 since joining the conference in 2001.
- Earlier this month, Jacob Gilyard was named to Preseason All-Atlantic 10 First Team and Grant Golden and Blake Francis were named to the Second Team. Richmond is first team to have three players on the Preseason All A-10 First Team or Second Team since Xavier in 2011.
- Gilyard was also named to the Bob Cousy Award (nation's top point quard) watch list and Golden was named to the Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Award (nation's top center) watch list. Richmond is one of four schools, along with Illinois, Virginia, and Wisconsin, to currently have a player in the running for D-I's best point guard AND center.
- Richmond received 40 votes in the Associated Press Top 25 preseason poll, 32nd among all teams and the most votes the Spiders have ever received in the AP's preseason poll. It's the best showing by Richmond in ANY AP Top 25 poll since the final poll of 2010-11, when Richmond received 47 votes prior to its run to the Sweet 16.

#### WITH A WIN ...

- UR would beat an AP Top 10 team on the road for the first time in school history (currently 0-25).
- UR would beat an AP Top 25 team on the road for the first time since 1/31/15 (64-55 at #14 VCU).
- UR would improve to 14-22 vs AP Top 25 opponents under Chris Mooney and 2-9 vs AP Top 10 opponents.
- UR would improve to 6-5 vs SEC opponents under Chris Mooney.
- Chris Mooney would have defeated a power conference team in 14 of his 16 seasons at Richmond.
- UR would have won 6 straight games dating back to last season, its longest win streak since winning 6 straight during the 2014-15 season.

# THE BIG PICTURE

#### ATLANTIC 10 FAVORITES

For the first time since joining the conference in 2001, Richmond was picked to win the A-10 when the league's official preseason poll was released in November. The Spiders received 19 of the 28 first-place votes in the poll, with Saint Louis (7) and Dayton (2) receiving the others.

Prior to 2020, Richmond had never been picked higher than third in the A-10 preseason poll. The Spiders were third in both the 2009 and 2010 preseason polls and advanced to the NCAA Tournament each time.

#### **ALL-LEAGUE TRIO**

Guard Jacob Gilvard was named to the Preseason All-Atlantic 10 First Team in November and guard Blake Francis and forward Grant Golden were named to the Preseason All-A-10 Second Team. Richmond is the first team since Xavier in 2011 to have three players named to the A-10's Preseason First Team or Second Team.

Last season, Gilyard was named First Team All-Atlantic 10 and Francis and Golden were Second Team selections, making Richmond the only team in the conference with three players on the top two All-Atlantic 10 teams.

#### **POLL POSITION**

The Spiders received 40 votes in the Associated Press Preseason Top 25 Poll released on November 9, the Spiders best showing ever in the AP's preseason poll. Richmond's 40 votes were the 32nd most among all teams and the most for any team in the Atlantic 10.

The only other season in which the Spiders were represented in the AP preseason poll was 2010-11, when Richmond received 17 votes, 34th among all teams.

The 40 votes the Spiders received in the poll were their most in any AP poll since the final poll of the 2010-11 season, which was released prior to Richmond's run to the 2011 Sweet 16. The Spiders received 47 votes in that poll.

The Spiders received six votes in the final AP poll of the 2019-20 season. Richmond has now received votes in three straight AP Top 25 polls dating back to last season.

#### **EXPECT BIG THINGS**

Richmond appeared in several preseason top 25 rankings during the offseason, including NCAA.com, NBC, Blue Ribbon College Basketball, and Stadium, where Jeff Goodman had Richmond 13th at one point over the summer, UR's best showing in any preseason rankings during the offseason.

March Madness's Andy Katz chose the Spiders as one of his seven "Final Four sleepers" in October and ESPN's Dick Vitale said Richmond is this year's Dayton, "a mid-major that can surprise the elite powers," in November.

#### GILYARD, GOLDEN UP FOR NATIONAL AWARDS

Jacob Gilyard and Grant Golden, who are roommates, were both named to watch lists for national awards in November. Gilyard was one of 20 players named to the watch list for the Bob Cousy Award, given to the nation's top point guard. Golden was was one of 20 players named to the watch list for the Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Award, given to the nation's top center.

Richmond is one of four schools to currently have a player in the running for the nation's top point guard and the nation's top center along with Illinois, Virginia, and Wisconsin.

#### GILYARD = THE NATION'S BEST DEFENDER

Gilyard, the reigning Atlantic 10 Defensive Player of the Year, led Division I with 3.2 steals per game last season and was one of 10 semifinalists for the Naismith National Defensive Player of the Year Award.

Gilyard, who set the Spiders career steals record in January of his junior year, has the three highest single-season steals totals in school history, including a record 99 last season.

Were it not for COVID-19, there's a good chance Gilvard could have ended his career as the all-time Division I steals leader (and he still might!). Even after COVID-19 forced the cancellation of multiple Spiders games at the end of 2019-20, Gilyard entered his senior season with 276 career steals, just 109 shy of the Division I career record owned by Providence's John Linehan, who registered 385 steals from 1997

The only players to enter their final season with more career steals than Gilyard (276) over the last 20 years are VCU's Briante Weber (296), Kansas' Mario Chalmers (283), and Temple's Pepe Sanchez (280)

#### SHEROD GOES DOWN

The Spiders suffered a major blow on October 15 when guard Nick Sherod suffered a season-ending injury, tearing his right ACL, MCL, and meniscus.

Sherod, who missed all but six games of the 2018-19 season after tearing his left ACL in a game against Hampton in November 2018, was the Spiders second-leading rebounder (5.4 RPG) and tied for UR's third-leading scorer (12.7 PPG) last season. He made a team-high 78 three-pointers, tied for the sixth-most in a season in school history, and shot 43.8 percent from three-point range, 10th best among all players in Division i.

Sherod underwent successful surgery on November 2.

#### THE SPIDERS SYSTEM

Over his 16 seasons at Richmond, Chris Mooney's offense has evolved into a system that embodies the concept of "position-less basketball." While shorter players will begin most possessions further away from the basket and taller players will begin most possessions on the wing or in the paint, they will rarely end up anywhere near where they started. On each possession, every player on the court is equally as likely to handle the ball, shoot a three, cut back door, or set up in the post. The Spiders offense places a premium on passing, cutting, and outside shooting, and Richmond's coaches focus on developing those skills in each Spider.

Richmond's offense often results in a high team field goal percentage, a ton of opportunities for assists, and relatively few turnovers. Over the previous five seasons (2015-16 through 2019-20), Richmond ranks 20th in D-I in field goal percentage (47.0), 10th in assists per game (16.0), 11h in fewest turnovers per game (10.9), and third in assist-turnover ratio (1.47).

#### FROM ZONE TO MAN

While Richmond's offense has been one of the best in Division I for years, the Spiders made a major improvement on defense last year after switching from a matchup zone scheme to a man-to-man system during the offseason.

Richmond ranked 54th in adjusted defensive efficiency last season, according to KenPom, after ranking 287th in 2018-19.

Richmond was the A-10's top defense during conference play last season, allowing just 92.9 points per 100 possessions. NCAA.com named Richmond a "Defense to Watch" this season.

#### TITANIC TURNAROUND

Richmond finished 24-7 in 2019-20, an 11-win improvement from its 13-20 mark in 2018-19 that was tied for the third-best wins increase of any D-I program

The Spiders tied a school record for regular-season wins and won a program record 14 conference games en route to earning a 2-seed in the Atlantic 10 Championship, Richmond's highest since joining the conference

Over 82 percent of industry bracketologists had the Spiders in the NCAA Tournament field in their final bracket, according to BracketMatrix.com.

#### **NATIONAL EXPOSURE**

At least 13 of the Spiders 27 regular-season games this season will be broadcast on national television: six on the ESPN family of networks, six on CBS Sports Network, and one on NBC Sports Network.

The Spiders are slated to play a primetime game on ESPN on four of the final five Fridays of the regular season, a stretch that begins with January 29th's home game against Saint Louis, picked as runner-up to UR in the conference's preseason poll.

#### **VOICE OF THE SPIDERS**

For the 38th straight season, Bob Black will handle play-by-play duties for Spider men's basketball broadcasts. Black also hosts a morning show on ESPN Richmond, the Spiders radio rights-holder.

For home games, Black will be teamed with analyst Greg Beckwith, a member of the Richmond Athletics Hall of Fame who is still the program's career leader in

In addition to doing the ESPN Richmond radio broadcast for all Robins Čenter games on national TV, Black and Beckwith will anchor the SpiderTV broadcast for all of Richmond's home games on regional TV. Those broadcasts will be produced and directed by Richmond Athletics Video Specialist Blake Ellett.

#### REPLACING UR'S "BEST CLASS EVER"

Richmond currently has five scholarship seniors/grad students on the roster: Nathan Cayo, Blake Francis, Jacob Gilyard, Grant Golden, and Nick Sherod. Chris Mooney predicted during the 2018-19 season that this group would eventually be known as "the best class Richmond's ever had."

The tall task of replacing that class will fall to Richmond's incoming class of freshmen, currently a group of four:

- 6'4" guard Malcolm Dread of Gonzaga High School is the 2nd-ranked 2021 recruit in Washington, DC, according to 247 sports.com. His brother Myles is a two-year starter at Penn State.
- 6'7" forward Aidan Noyes of Cincinnati's Archbishop Moeller is Ohio's 13th-ranked recruit in 2021 and led

his team to a final No. 1 ranking in the state in 2020.

- 5'10" guard Jason Nelson attends Richmond's John Marshall High and led his team to a Class 2 state championship in 2020 while being named Class 2 State Player of the Year. He chose UR over Vanderbilt and VCU.
- 6′5″ guard Marcus Randolph from Archbishop Wood outside Philadelphia received 13 D-I offers. Archbishop Wood is expected be one of the best high school teams in the nation this season.

#### **FAMILY BUSINESS**

Several Spiders have family members who participated in college athletics.

Grad student Nick Sherod is the son of E.J. Sherod who played basketball at ODU. Nick's grandfather, Edmund, was a Hall-of-Famer at VCU before playing for the New York Knicks.

Jacob Gilyard's father Rodney is a member of Ottawa University's Athletics Hall of Fame and graduated as the school's all-time leader in assists and steals in 1992.

Sophomore Tyler Burton's father Quinton played at Providence and helped the Friars to a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances in 1989 and 1990. He scored 11.1 PPG as a senior. When he was being recruited, his final two schools were Providence and Richmond.

Grant Golden's father played at Fairfield University and he had two grandfathers that played collegiate football. Grant's brother Bryce is a sophomore on Butler's team this season.

Grad student Jordan Gaitley is the son of Stephanie Gaitley, currently the head coach of the women's basketball team at Fordham University and the head coach of Richmond's women's team from 1985-91, when she amassed a 116-63 record over six seasons at the Robins Center. Gaitley also has two older brothers who played collegiately. His oldest brother Dutch is currently an assistant coach for the Charlotte Hornets.

Sophomore Gabe Arizin is the grandson of Basketball Hall-of-Famer Paul Arizin, a 10-time NBA All-Star who twice led the league in scoring. He attended Villanova and led the nation in scoring as a senior in 1950. His No. 11 jersey has been retired by the school. He was inducted into the College Basketball Hall of Fame in 2006. Gabe's father Mike played at William & Mary and La Salle. He earned All Southern-Conference honors following his freshman and sophomore seasons at W&M.

Freshman Quentin Southall is the son of Cornelius Southall, who played defensive back for Notre Dame and led the Irish to a national championship in 1988.

Grad student Blake Francis' father Carl attended Virginia Union University and played linebacker for four seasons. He is currently the Director of Communications for the NFL Player's Association. Also in Francis'

- Brother Branden played football at Liberty from 2010-13
- Cousin Tyler Thornton played basketball at Duke from 2010-14
- Cousin Marques Hagans started at QB for Virginia from 2004-05 and played in 10 NFL games after being picked in the 2006 NFL Draft.

# WHERE THE SPIDERS DWELL

#### **ROBINS CENTER**

Built in 1972 through the generosity of the E. Claiborne Robins family, the Robins Center is in its 49th season as one of the premier small-school college basketball arenas in the nation.

Last season, Richmond averaged 6,001 fans per game, a five percent increase from 2018-19 and the second-highest attendance for any Division I program among schools its size (enrollment of 4,002) or smaller. The only school Richmond's size or smaller to play in front of larger crowds in 2019-20 was Siena (6,228).

The Spiders average attendance ranked fifth in the Atlantic 10 last season behind Dayton, VCU, Saint Louis, and Rhode Island and among the top quarter of all Division I schools (85th out of 350). Richmond's crowds swelled as the Spiders fought their way into the NCAA Tournament conversation. An average crowd of 6,826 attended the Spiders final six home games of 2019-20, a stretch that included four sell-outs.

Renovations to the lower level of the building in 2018 resulted in the creation of the Blandford-Everett Student-Athlete Performance Center, which provides Richmond's student-athletes with the latest strength and conditioning equipment, access to a nutrition fueling center, and a state-of-the-art sports medicine facility.

The arena underwent a \$17 million renovation in 2013 that revamped the lighting system and installed four 33' x 15' video boards in the corner sections. The renovation also reduced the arena's capacity from more than 9,000 to its current 7,201.

#### **QUEALLY ATHLETICS CENTER**

The Queally Athletics Center is the new home of Spiders basketball.

Opened in October following 18 months of construction, the \$15 million practice facility's centerpiece is the Spiders new practice gym. The gym includes a replica of the Robins Center court plus two additional half-courts and two more retractable baskets on the sidelines of the main court, for a total of six in the facility. Steps from the court is a 20-seat theater that allows for instant review of practice film and diagramming of offensive and defensive schemes.

The Spiders new strength and conditioning area abuts the court's endline, separated only by a pair of seethrough retractable overhead doors. A six-table Sports Medicine suite, a hydrotherapy room with two pools, and a nutrition station all border the strength and conditioning area.

Locker rooms and lounges for the men's and women's team are also located on the ground floor, while the second floor includes Spider Hall, the main entrance to the Queally Athletics Center. The space, which serves to engage fans and alumni in celebration of the proud tradition of Richmond Athletics, features a giant video board as well as entrances to Millhiser Gymnasium and the University's new Student Well-Being Center, which are both adjacent to the QAC.

Head coach Chris Mooney believes that the facility will have a tremendous impact on his team. "The Queally Athletic Center will transform our entire basketball program. Our student-athletes will utilize the amenities of the physical structure each and everyday as prospective Spiders see the facility and anticipate their future at Richmond," said Mooney.

The facility is named for 1986 alumni Paul and Anne-Marie Queally, longtime supporters of the University of Richmond who contributed a \$7.5 million lead gift to launch the fundraising efforts for the new center.





## MILLHISER GYMNASIUM (MILL-high-zer)

As it nears its 100th birthday, one of the most historic and celebrated buildings on Richmond's campus has been completely renovated and is now home to Richmond Athletics Student-Athlete Development Center and offices for both the men's basketball and women's basketball staff.

The newest version of Millhiser Gymnasium opened in fall 2020 after being refurbished as part of the University's construction of the Queally Athletics Center and Student Well-Being Center. A mezzanine level was installed to provide office suites for Richmond's basketball programs while the first floor, which still includes the historic gymnasium court surface, is the site of the Student-Athlete Development Center. The Center includes work and meeting space for Richmond's student-athletes as well as offices for the Spiders Academic Services and Leadership Development departments.

Millhiser's entry hall also includes a classroom that overlooks the Queally Athletics Center's practice court and a recruiting room with end zone views of Robins Stadium.



As part of Richmond Athletics commitment to a sensitive restoration of the facility, many of Millhiser's iconic Gothic windows, which had been bricked in for decades, were re-opened. Millhiser (Gymnasium opened in 1921 and was Richmond's home court between 1922 and 1946.

# PIDER BITES

When asked what sport they are best at besides basketball, there was little agreement among the Spiders. Three each chose baseball (Bailey, Crabtree, and Golden) and football (Francis, Weir, Wilson), with lacrosse (Arizin, Grace), soccer (Cayo, Gustavson), and tennis (Burton, Gilyard) also receiving multiple votes. Perhaps unsurprisingly, no one echoed Sullivan Kulju, who claims his best non-basketball sport is badminton, or Jordan Gaitley, who chose cornhole.


Freshman Quentin Southall said his favorite quarantine activity was painting, while Sullivan Kulju said it was playing Pokemon. The most popular answer (six of 17) among the Spiders was playing video games. When it comes to preferred gaming system, 76 percent of the Spiders (13 of 17) prefer PlayStation to Xbox.

The race for favorite podcast was a runaway, as more than half (eight of 17) of the Spiders chose The Big Guard Podcast, hosted by current Spiders Grant Golden and Nick Sherod along with Grant's brother Bryce, currently a junior at Butler.

While Tyler Burton professes to cook an excellent filet mignon and Connor Crabtree says he makes an stellar pasta dish with shrimp or chicken, more than 40 percent (seven of 17) of this year's Spiders said the best thing they can cook is simply some version of eggs. Asked how they like their eggs, 65 percent (11 of 17) chose scrambled.

Speaking of chicken, 71 percent of the Spiders say chicken is their meat of choice, with 29 percent opting for beef. There are no self-professed vegetarians on this year's roster.

The majority of Spiders who were willing to reveal their nicknames are called something close to their given name by friends and teammates, including Q for Quentin Southall, Zay for Isaiah Wilson, Crab for Conor Crabtree, Goose for Andre Gustavson, and T-Burt for Tyler Burton. Among the more creative nicknames are Stick Work (Nick Sherod), School You (Sullivan Kulju), Swerve (Grant Golden), Blizz (Blake Francis), and Pill (Jacob Gilyard).



There was a wide variety of choices when the Spiders were asked to choose their favorite non-basketball athlete ever, with no individual picked more than twice. Bo Jackson was the choice for freshmen Dji Bailey and Andre Weir, despite the fact that Jackson played his last pro sporting event in 1994, more than seven years before either Bailey or Weir were born. Portuguese soccer superstar Cristiano Ronaldo also received two votes (Connor Crabtree and Andre Gustavson), while teammates Tyler Burton and Nathan Cayo chose Serena Williams.

More bus trips due to COVID-19 protocols are bad news for the 53 percent of Spiders (nine of 17) who would rather fly than drive.

Faced with the eternal question of whether they prefer ninjas or pirates, a whopping 82 percent (14 of 17) of Spiders chose ninjas. That's hARRRRRRd news for Grant Golden, Jacob Gilyard, and Quentin Southall, who picked pirates.

The Spiders were divided on whether they prefer Netflix or YouTube, with each service receiving eight votes. Sullivan Kulju declined to choose, instead naming Hulu as his streaming service of choice.



More than half (nine of 17) of this year's Spiders chose the ocean as their preferred body of water, more than river (three) and lake (five) combined. Jacob Gilyard is such a fan of spending time at lakes he said that going to the lake was his favorite activity during quarantine.

There are 16 Spiders on this year's team who say they prefer showers to baths. And then there's Isaiah Wilson.

Only four Spiders have tattoos: Dji Bailey and Connor Crabtree each have one while Isaiah Wilson has two. Jacob Gilyard has three, all of which he got this October.

# CHRIS MOONEY HEAD COACH 16th SEASON PRINCETON, 1994

Chris Mooney is the winningest coach in Richmond basketball's storied history, having compiled a 274-222 record in his first 15 seasons with the Spiders. In 2019-20, Mooney led Richmond to one of the best regular seasons in program history and was on the verge of taking the Spiders to the NCAA Tournament for the third time when the postseason was canceled due to COVID-19.

Despite not having a senior on the roster, the Spiders went 24-7, tying the school record for regular-season wins, and posted three wins over power-conference opponents, including a victory over eventual Big Ten champion Wisconsin in the Legends Classic. Richmond went 14-4 in conference play, a program record for conference wins in a season, and finished second in the Atlantic 10, the highest regular-season finish for UR since joining the conference in 2001. Mooney's Spiders relied on a starting lineup comprised entirely of juniors, three of whom -- Jacob Gilyard, Blake Francis, and Grant Golden -- earned All-Atlantic 10 honors following the season. Gilyard was also named A-10 Defensive Player of the Year and was a semifinalist for the Naismith National Defensive Player of the Year Award after leading D-1 with 99 steals, a single-season school record. The Spiders received votes in the AP Top 25 six times, including a season-high six in the final poll of the season. Richmond's turnaround was one of the most impressive in the nation, with the Spiders 11-win improvement from 2018-19 tying for the third-highest of any team in Division 1

Hired by Richmond prior to the 2005-06 season, Mooney has led the Spiders to seven postseason appearances, including two NCAA Tournaments and two NIT Quarterfinals, and is the second longest-tenured coach in the Atlantic 10, trailing only Bob McKillop (Davidson). Mooney enters 2020-21 fifth all-time in conference history in both A-10 wins by a head coach (138) and overall wins by an A-10 head coach (274).

Mooney has earned many honors at Richmond. He was tabbed the Sporting News Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year in 2010, while also being selected as a finalist for the Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year Award. That same year, he won Richmond's Voice of the University Award, given to a faculty or staff member for being a voice that represents the University of Richmond in a positive manner to the wider community. Later in 2010, Richmond Style Weekly tabbed him for the 40 Under 40 list, spotlighting UR's community involvement with the homeless, Special Olympics, Arthritis Foundation, Friends of Jaclyn Foundation and the ASK Foundation for Childhood Cancer Research. For the last five years, Mooney has headlined the Coaches' Cookoff which raises money for Max's Positive Vibe Cafe, a non-profit dedicated to training and employing people with learning disabilities.

22 of Mooney's former players have gone on to play professionally in either the NBA, the G League, or overseas, including at least one from 11 of the last 14 graduating classes.

In 2018-19, the Spiders became the first team in four years to place a pair of sophomores on the Atlantic 10's All-Conference teams, as Jacob Gilyard earned Second Team honors and Grant Golden was named to the Third Team. Gilyard and Golden were forced into bigger roles after junior Nick Sherod, the Spiders most experienced starter, suffered a season-ending knee injury in late November. In December, the Spiders knocked off ACC-foe Wake Forest for Chris Mooney's 240th win at Richmond, moving him past Dick Tarrant as the winningest coach in school history.

In 2017-18, Mooney oversaw the development of one of the nation's youngest teams with a junior, two sophomores, and two freshmen in the starting lineup. Facing one of the 25 most difficult out-of-conference schedules in Division I, the Spiders entered A-10 play with a 2-10 record. But Richmond exceeded expectations in the conference, finishing tied for fifth with a 9-9 record that included a pair of wins against crosstown rival VCU and a 2-0 mark against eventual league champion Davidson. Following a 3-13 start, Richmond went 9-7 over the final two months of the season.

In 2016-17, the Spiders swept the two major Atlantic 10 awards, with senior T.J. Cline winning A-10 Player of the Year and freshman De'Monte Buckingham earning Rookie of the Year honors. It was just the third time one school swept the awards in A-10 history. UR rebounded from a 6-6 start to finish third in A-10 play and earn an NIT bid where the Spiders won games at Alabama and home vs Oakland.

In 2014-15, Richmond finished the regular season on a six-game winning streak, and was one of the "Last Four Out" of the NCAA Tournament at-large field, thereby securing the No. 1 seed and

home-court advantage in the NIT, where they would reach the tournament's quarterfinals.

2009-10 and 2010-11 are remembered as two of the top seasons in Mooney's coaching career and in Spider basketball history. In the spring of 2010, Richmond earned its first NCAA at-large bid since 2004, garnering a seven seed before falling in the first round of the tournament. Mooney was named the 2010 Sporting News Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year, and was a finalist for the 2010 Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year award. The Spiders finished the season ranked 24th in the final APTop 25.

In 2011, Richmond defeated Dayton in the A-10 championship game to earn Mooney's first conference championship, the Spiders first and only league title since Richmond joined the Atlantic 10 in 2001. The 2010-11 Spiders would go on to the second Sweet 16 in program history by downing Vanderbilt and Morehead State in the NCAA Denver Subregional. The Spiders run came to an end at the hands of Kansas in San Antonio. Richmond finished 29-8, set a school record for wins, and finished 21st in the coaches poll.

Mooney previously coached at Air Force for five seasons: three as an assistant, one as an associate head coach and his final season as head coach. In 2004-05, Mooney led the Falcons to an 18-12 record and votes in the national polls. His 18 victories were the most by a first-year head coach at Air Force.

Mooney began coaching at the high school level, taking a job at Lansdale Catholic High School in Lansdale, Pa., in 1994. His first college coaching experience came at Division III Beaver College, now known as Arcadia University. He spent two seasons there from 1998-2000. While at Beaver College, Mooney only coached part-time, spending much of his time as an event coordinator. He helped plan weddings and events while also serving as the team manager. Mooney is married to the former Lia Chomat, a Princeton graduate who also has a doctorate in psychology from Penn. The couple has two sons, Danny and Ryan.




