BY THE NUMBERS: IRISH at WILDCATS

1	Even though Notre Dame and Kentucky have met 62 times, only 22 of those meetings have come on each team's respective home courts (see page 7 of this package for an in-depth look at the ND-UK series). The Irish will be looking to earn the program's first victory at Rupp Arena on Saturday afternoon. Under Mike Brey and since 2015-16, Notre Dame has earned its first program victories at Cameron Indoor Stadium (Duke) and the Dean Smith Center (North Carolina).
3	Potential home opening games canceled due to COVID-19 concerns on opposing teams this season. First to be scratched out was a visit by Tennessee on Dec. 4, then the home opener with Western Michigan on Dec. 2 was lost. Notre Dame pivoted to schedule Purdue Fort Wayne on December 5, but one day later that game was canceled. Eventually, Detroit Mercy was able to visit Purcell Pavilion on December 6 for the home opener - and second game of the season.
4.3	Junior guard Prentiss Hubb is eighth in the country (as of Dec. 9) in 3FGM per game at 4.33 and leads all ACC players in that category.
9	Junior forward Nate Laszewski has pulled down at least nine rebounds in each of Notre Dame's first three games this season. After averaging 7.4 ppg and 4.6 rpg last season, Laszewski has increased those averages to 15.0 ppg and 9.7 rpg in 2020-21.
15	At 44.1%, Notre Dame is 15th in the country in 3FG% (as of Dec. 9) and second in the ACC (NC State has a 44.9% average).
18.3	Points-per-game average over the past two seasons for Prentiss Hubb against ranked opponents (eight games). In those contests, Hubb is shooting .423 from three-point range with 4.6 assists per contest.
21	In his 21st season at Notre Dame (the longest tenure of any ND men's basketball coach), Mike Brey also has the ninth-longest tenure of any Division I head coach. Brey will face three of the coaches with longer tenures than himself this season (Jim Boeheim, Mike Krzyzewski, Tom Izzo). Greg Kampe, Bob McKillop, Fran O'Hanlon, Mark Few, Mike McConathy and James Jones make up the other coaches who have been at their current school longer than Mike Brey.
22.3	Points-per-game average for Prentiss Hubb , who has recorded two of his career 10 20-point games so far this season. All 10 of Hubb's 20-point career games have come vs. power conference opponents with five of those games against ranked foes.
23	A recent project by CBSsports.com ranked the 'Greatest College Basketball Programs Ever' with Notre Dame placing 23rd on the list and sixth in the ACC.
178	Career assists in ACC regular-season games for Prentiss Hubb , the most among any returning ACC player and 10th all-time on the career conference-game charts at Notre Dame.
200	Only two Notre Dame players have blocked 200 shots during their time in an Irish uniform. Jordan Cornette (2001-05, 201) and LaPhonso Ellis (1988-92). While the truncated 2020-21 season doesn't help graduate student Juwan Durham , he could become the third player to reach 200 blocks. With a 2.2 bpg average in his career, Durham is on pace to add 60 blocks to his career total - putting him above 180. An increase in his average per game (he has swatted seven shots thus far) could put the school blocked shot record in reach.
1905	Total victories in the history of Notre Dame men's basketball, as the Irish became the eighth program to reach 1,900 victories in 2019-20 (Kentucky, Kansas, North Carolina, Duke, Temple, Syracuse and UCLA have all reached that plateau). The Irish were 12th all-time in college basketball victories when Mike Brey took over the program in 2000-01 - they have since passed Oregon State, Pennsylvania, St. John's and Indiana on the all-time wins list into eighth place.

Also, as noted on the front page, against ranked opponents over the past two seasons, Hubb is averaging 18.3 ppg, 4.6 apg and shooting .423 from three point range (30-71).

DURHAM ALREADY AMONG TOP SHOT BLOCKERS IN NOTRE DAME HISTORY

Blocked shots are one of the youngest official NCAA official statistics, only becoming a part of a game boxscore for the 1985-86 season. With that in mind, it is still noteworthy that graduate student Juwan Durham has already established himself as one of the top shot blockers in Notre Dame history.

In 2018-19, Durham swatted 63 shots which ranks fifth on the Notre Dame single-season blocked shots list, he followed up with 66 as a senior last season.

Durham has pushed his career blocked-shot average to 2.2 and is one of just three Notre Dame players to average over 2.0 blocks per game in their career:

Durham's 136 total blocks at Notre Dame currently rank him sixth all-time (see sidebar, page 4). Jordan Cornette is the Notre Dame blocked shots record holder with 201 from 2001-05.

JUNIOR CLASS READY TO MAKE THEIR MARK

Notre Dame's junior class (Dane Goodwin, Prentiss Hubb, Nate Laszewski) is poised to build upon the program's tradition of a sharp increase in productivity during a student-athlete's third year in the program. A history of the 'junior year leap' is broken down on page 6 of this notes package, but Goodwin, Hubb and Laszewski have seen an increase in points per game, rebounds per game and minutes played through Notre Dame's first three games of the season:

IRISH TRADITIONALLY AMONG BEST IN THE COUNTRY AT TAKING CARE OF THE BALL

Notre Dame finished second in the NCAA last season in turnovers per game — posting the sixth consecutive season of ranking in the nation's top-10 for least amount of turnovers in a game. The Irish are also perennially one of the top teams in the country in assist to turnover ratio.

The Irish have not averaged over 10.0 turnovers per game since a 10.3 mark in 2013-14 (which was still good enough for 26th nationally).

RYAN HOPES TO BUILD OFF NOTRE DAME TRADITION OF TRANSFER IMPROVEMENT

Transfers have become a normal part of college basketball over the past couple of decades and the Notre Dame basketball program, under Mike Brey, has brought in seven student-athletes prior to Cormac Ryan (eligible this year) and Trey Wertz (eligible in 2021-22).

Those seven players ended up improving across the board in their first season in an Irish uniform, compared to their final season at their previous school.

Among these previous transfers are the 2011 BIG EAST Player of the Year (Hansbrough), three team MVPs (Humphrey, 2002, Hansbrough, 2011, Martin, 2012).

A DECADE OF 'NO FOUL' CONTINUES?

One of the mantras of Notre Dame basketball under Mike Brey has been to keep the amount of opponent foul shots down. Defend without fouling is a way of life for Irish basketball and the statistics bear out that trend.

In the last 11 years, Notre Dame has failed to finish among the top 10 in least amount of personal fouls committed just twice. They have also led the country in least amount of personal fouls three times.

The NCAA has been tracking the least amount of fouls committed in a season since 1993. Notre Dame is the only team since 1993 to lead the country in least amount of fouls more than twice (four times) and are on pace to make it five times this season.

PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT HIGHLIGHTED BY 1,000 POINT SCORERS

Notre Dame has produced 64 1,000 point scorers throughout the history of the program with 23 of those players reaching that statistical milestone during the Mike Brey era (2000-01 - current). Of the 85 players who have suited up for Notre Dame under Mike Brey, 36 of them were recruited by the staff and exhausted their eligibility with the Irish – 20 of those players have scored more than 1,000 points in a career.

FOUR VETERANS NAMED TEAM CAPTAINS FOR 2020-21

Glenn and Stacey Head Men's Basketball Coach Mike Brey has announced four student-athletes to serve as team captains for the University of Notre Dame men's basketball team.

Graduate students Nikola Djogo and Juwan Durham, along with juniors Prentiss Hubb and Cormac Ryan, will make up a four-player group of captains in 2020-21.

All four Irish players will be serving as team captains for the first time in their careers.

IRISH RECEIVE COMMITMENTS FROM TWO AREA PROSPECTS

Rising high school seniors **J.R. Konieczny** (Ko-nez-nee) and **Blake Wesley**, both from South Bend, Indiana, have signed National Letters of Intent to play basketball at the University of Notre Dame.

Rated among the top 150 high school players in the 2020-21 class, Konieczny (Kah-nez-nee) is a four-star recruit according to ESPN.com and earned third-team all-state honors as a junior in 2019-20. He averaged over 24 points a game last season, including a 42-point outburst in the 2020 sectional semifinal – a performance that earned him the Indiana Basketball Coaches Association Player of the Week honors.

A consensus four-star recruit, Wesley is ranked 96th nationally by Rivals and 113th by 247Sports. An honorable mention all-state selection as a junior in 2019-20, Wesley led all local area players with a 26.0 points-per-game average last season.

NOTRE DAME - KENTUCKY SERIES NOTES

Kentucky has played the spoiler role and ended three noteworthy Irish basketball seasons –

- In 1958, the Irish were fresh off a victory over Indiana and a game away from the Final Four and were powered by All-American Tommy Hawkins and John McCarthy. Saddled with early foul trouble on Kentucky's home court, Hawkins couldn't get going until late in the contest, and the Irish suffered the worst postseason in school history, 89-56.

- The 1970 postseason run powered by the greatest NCAA tournament scorer ended in Columbus, Ohio, at St. John Arena. Still remembered today for the tournament, Austin Carr poured in a record 61 points in the first-round victory over Ohio, but Kentucky bounced Carr (and his 52-point outing) in the next round.

- The third tough ending came in the aforementioned 2015 classic, with Kentucky earning a trip to the Final Four with a two-point victory as Jerian Grant's last-second corner three pointer sailed wide of the mark.

Before those postseason setbacks, however, Notre Dame had its own run of success in the series. Adolph Rupp, Kentucky's Hall of Fame coach from 1930-1972, went zero-for-six at The Notre Dame Fieldhouse – also known to opposing teams as 'The Snakepit.' Those victories included:

- A 28-7 first-half lead in 1936 on the way to a 41-20 victory in Rupp's first visit to Notre Dame. This marked the first of six consecutive wins for the Irish over Kentucky from 1936 through 1942.

- An amazing 64-55 upset of Kentucky in 1948, one of just three losses that season for the Wildcats. On Irish head coach Moose Krause's 35th birthday, his team delivered for their mentor who had installed a new 'high post' offense just for the Kentucky game. Leo Barnhorst (6-4) and John Foley (6-5) roamed the foul line, allowing Kevin O'Shea to burn the Wildcats with 25 points on the low post.

- The 1948 game convinced Rupp that a victory at Notre Dame was impossible for a visiting team. The Fieldhouse was notorious for its cramped environment, placing the Notre Dame band behind the visitor's bench and more than 300 seminarians of the Congregation of Holy Cross across from the visitor's bench in their signature black robes. Rupp swore he would not return to play at Notre Dame, but the contract called for one more visit in 1950.

- That 1950 game took place during finals week for the Irish, but the outcome was the same – a 64-51 victory for the home team. Kentucky would not head north to Notre Dame to play another men's basketball game until 1990.

Freedom Hall became the 'neutral' home for the Notre Dame - Kentucky series throughout the 1950s, 60s, 70s and 80s. It was during that time frame when Kentucky seized control of the series, earning victories in 26 of the 30 meetings between the two schools. When one school dominates a series in that fashion, the wins are sure to be memorable – and they were for the Irish –

- A high-scoring 111-97 triumph in 1964 that saw the Irish out-rebound the Wildcats 81-44. Ron Reed poured in 34 points, and Notre Dame became just the third team to score more than 100 points against Kentucky.

- A controversial start to the 1970 meeting which saw Irish head coach Johnny Dee refuse to use the 'Adolph Rupp Autographed Version' of the game basketball. After a delay at the start as the teams worked out which ball to use, Austin Carr grabbed the autographed ball, scored 50 points and led his team to a 99-92 win.

- Digger Phelps' third season at Notre Dame saw his surging 1973-74 team post a 94-79 victory in late December over an uncharacteristic middling Kentucky team. John Shumate led the Irish, who scored 51 points in the second half, with 22 points and 14 rebounds.

- A 67-61 win over No. 2/1 Kentucky in 1980 that might have been Kelly Tripucka's finest effort in an Irish uniform. Tripucka hit six consecutive free throws to ice the game and finished eight-of-14 from the field and 14-of-15 from the line for 30 points.

Notre Dame also broke through for two consecutive wins in 1988 and 1990, but Kentucky answered with another streak of eight victories including four straight over Mike Brey-coached teams in 2001, 2002, 2003 and 2004.

The last two visits by the Wildcats to Purcell Pavilion have ended with Irish victories, however. A 77-67 win in the 2009 NIT marked the end of the Billie Gillespie era in Lexington, while Notre Dame upset No. 8/8 Kentucky 64-50 in the 2012 BIG EAST/SEC Challenge.

NOTRE DAME MEN'S BASKETBALL GAME NOTES

MIKE BREY, GLENN AND STACEY MURPHY HEAD MEN'S BASKETBALL COACH

21st Season at ND | George Washington '82 | Career Record: 537-287 | ND Record: 438-235

In 20 full seasons as the men's basketball coach at the University of Notre Dame, Mike Brey has guided the Fighting Irish to over 430 victories and is the all-time winningest men's basketball coach in school history.

The Irish are enjoying a recent stretch of success that ranks among the best in the 115-year history of basketball under the Golden Dome. Notre Dame was the only school in the nation to make back-to-back appearances in the NCAA Championship Elite Eight at the end of the 2015 and 2016 seasons, claimed an Atlantic Coast Conference title in 2015 and has made two ACC title game appearances in four years of ACC competition.

Brey was named head coach at Notre Dame on July 14, 2000. In his first season with the Irish, his team claimed the 2001 BIG EAST West Division championship and returned to the NCAA Championship for the first time in 12 seasons. Notre Dame soon became a regular in the NCAA tournament by making 12 appearances in 17 seasons with Brey on the sidelines.

In 2011, Brey was the recipient of both the Associated Press and the Henry Iba/USBWA National Coach of the Year award. He was named BIG EAST Coach of the Year in 2007, 2008 and 2011 and three of his players have been named BIG EAST Player of the Year.

Before arriving at Notre Dame, Brey was the head basketball coach at the University of Delaware, where he compiled a 99-52 mark from 1995-2000 and won America East Co-Coach of the Year honors in 1998. Prior to his time at Delaware, he was an assistant coach at Duke University. During his eight years at Duke, the Blue Devils advanced to the Final Four six times and won back-to-back national championships in 1991 and 1992.

Brey graduated from George Washington University in 1982. He played for and coached with legendary high school coach Morgan Wootten at DeMatha High School.

Brey serves on the Coaches vs. Cancer National Council and has helped raise over three million dollars for the organization. He has also partnered with the American Heart Association to create the Men of Heart initiative, raising funds and awareness for men's heart health. Brey is on the National Advisory Board of the Positive Coaching Alliance and is midway through his one-year term as the president of the NABC. He has been inducted into the Delaware and George Washington Halls of Fame.
