#### GAME 7

- Carolina concludes the non-conference portion of its regular-season schedule when it plays Kentucky in the CBS Sports Classic in Cleveland, Ohio, on Saturday, December 19.
- Tip time is 2 p.m. The Tar Heels were originally slated to play Ohio State in this year's Classic, but the matchups changed due to Covid testing protocols this week.
- Carolina is 4-2 after a 73-67 home win over NC Central on December 12. The Eagles replaced Elon on the schedule after Elon paused its season due to Covid-19.
- Armando Bacot had 19 points (most by a Tar Heel in the first six games) and 11 rebounds to lead UNC. He scored 15 of UNC's 30 points in the first half to help the Tar Heels overcome an early 11-point deficit to take a 30-28 lead.
- The Tar Heels led 73-58 with 87 seconds to play, but the Eagles scored the next nine points to close the final margin to six (more notes from this game on page 8).
- Kentucky has lost four in a row and is 1-4.
- UNC is ranked No. 22 in the Associated Press poll, while Kentucky is unranked.
- Carolina and Kentucky are one-two all-time in appearances in the AP poll. UNC is first with 927; the Wildcats are second with 920. Duke is next with 837.
- This is the first time the teams have played when one team was unranked in the AP poll since the Tar Heels were unranked on 12/4/10.
- This is the first time in 21 games when the teams have played when neither team is ranked in the AP top 20.
- Both Carolina and Kentucky field relatively inexperienced squads. The Tar Heels play six freshmen among their first 10 players, with two freshmen in the starting lineup and three rookies among their top five scorers. Five of Kentucky's top seven scorers are freshmen and the other two are first-year transfers.
- Carolina is averaging 4.0 three-pointers per game and is shooting 27.0 percent from three-point range; the Wildcats are making 4.4 threes per game and shooting 24.4 percent from beyond the arc.

- Carolina is averaging 4.0 turnovers more than assists; the Wildcats are averaging 4.6 more turnovers than assists.
- Through December 16, both teams had an effective field goal percentage of 46.9, tied for 224th in the NCAA.
- Defensively, UNC is holding its opponents to 67.2 points and 40.1 percent shooting from the floor; Kentucky's opponents are averaging 65.8 points and shooting 40.5 percent from the floor.

### TAR HEELS IN THE CBS SPORTS CLASSIC

- This is the seventh season in which Carolina has played in the CBS Sports Classic with Kentucky, Ohio State and UCLA.
- The Tar Heels are 4-2 in the Classic.
- Carolina is 0-2 against Kentucky in the Classic.
- Cleveland is hosting the CBS Sports Classic for the first time.
- UNC will be playing in Cleveland for the first time since the third game of the Roy Williams era on 11/29/03, when the Tar Heels won at Cleveland State.
- Carolina will be playing in Rocket Mortgage FieldHouse, home of the Cleveland Cavaliers, for the first time.

### SERIES VS. KENTUCKY

- Carolina is 24-16 all-time against Kentucky.
- Carolina is the only D-I program in the country that has 10 or more wins and a winning record against Kentucky.
- Carolina is 12-6 against Kentucky at neutral sites, including 2-1 in Charlotte, Greensboro and Louisville; 1-0 in Atlanta, Birmingham, College Park, East Rutherford, N.J., Memphis and Raleigh; and 0-1 in Chicago, Newark and Las Vegas.
- Roy Williams is 8-7 against Kentucky at North Carolina and 9-10 overall.
- This is the 18th time the Tar Heels enter the game as the higher-ranked team in the AP poll. UNC is 11-6 against UK in those games.
- Carolina is 0-2 against Kentucky in the CBS Sports Classic. The Wildcats beat UNC, 103-100, in Las Vegas on 12/17/16. Malik Monk scored 47 and De'Aaron Fox had 24 points

and 10 assists to offset a career-high 34 points by Tar Heel junior Justin Jackson.

- That game was just the second in UNC history, and the first in a regulation-length game, in which the Tar Heels lost when scoring 100 points.
- On 12/22/18 in Chicago, Carolina committed 18 turnovers that led to 23 points in an 80-72 Kentucky victory.
- Cameron Johnson led UNC in scoring (17). Garrison Brooks had seven points, eight rebounds and two assists. He is the only healthy active Tar Heel on the roster who scored in that game (Sterling Manley had two points and three rebounds, but is rehabbing a knee injury that caused him to miss all of last season and has yet to be medically cleared to practice this season).
- Kentucky point guard Ashton Hagans had eight steals, which equaled the second-most by an opponent vs. UNC.

### NOTABLE

• Carolina begins a three-game swing away from home (Kentucky in Cleveland, at NC State on Dec. 22 and at Georgia Tech on Dec. 30). UNC is scheduled to play at home just twice in the first nine games for the first time since the 2007-08 season. The Tar Heels played six consecutive neutral site or away games in November-December that season.

top three in scoring (Brandan Wright and Wayne Ellington in 2007; in that season freshman Ty Lawson was also fourth).

- The last time a Tar Heel led the team in scoring with less than 12 points a game was 1946-47, when Jim Hamilton averaged 11.4 points.
- Carolina has started a freshman point guard to begin each of the last three seasons (Coby White in 2018-19, Cole Anthony in 2019-20 and Caleb Love in 2020-21).
- The opponents have out-scored UNC by a combined 12 points in the first half, but the Tar Heels have outscored the opponents by 53 points in the second half (8.8 per game).
- Carolina has fallen behind by double digits in the first half in four of its first six games and rallied back to take the lead in all four, beating UNLV and NC Central but eventually losing to Texas and lowa.
- UNLV led 13-0, but the Tar Heels took their first lead with 3:24 to play in the half and led by seven at the break. UNC trailed both the Longhorns and Hawkeyes by 16 in the first half. Against Texas, Carolina went ahead for the first time with 2:35 remaining in the game. At lowa, the Tar Heels grabbed one-point leads with 9:52 and 9:30 to play in the game. Iowa went on a 16-2 run after UNC took its first lead to pull away. NC Central led 19-8 before the Tar Heels closed the half on a 22-9 run to lead by two at intermission.
- The Tar Heels are averaging 46.7 rebounds, including 16.2 offensive rebounds per game.
- This is the seventh consecutive season UNC is averaging at least 40 rebounds per game (the 14th time in Roy Williams' 18 seasons as UNC's head coach).
- UNC has a rebound margin of plus 15.5 per game. The school record is +12.3 in 2016-17.
- Carolina has finished first, first, first and second in the nation in rebounds per game in the last four seasons and in the top 10 nationally in rebound margin in each of the last six seasons.
- Sophomore Armando Bacot and freshman Day' Ron Sharpe lead UNC in rebounds per 40 minutes at 15.5 and 14.6, respectively.
- Carolina is third nationally in offensive rebound percentage, grabbing 42.5 percent of its own missed shots. New Mexico and Connecticut are the only schools with have a higher offensive rebound percentage than UNC.
- UNC has 75 assists and 99 turnovers. The 99 turnovers are the most by UNC in the first six games since 2009-10, when the Tar Heels committed 113.
- Among the eight Tar Heels averaging 10 or more minutes, freshman guard Kerwin Walton leads the team in assist/error at 2.25 to 1. He had three assists in 12 minutes at lowa.
- Carolina has a 20.7-11.5 edge in average second-chance points per game, but the opponents are out-scoring UNC 17.0-15.5 in points off turnovers.

### PRESEASON HONORS

- Senior forward Garrison Brooks and freshman guard Caleb Love are two of 50 players on the Naismith Trophy's preseason list (National Player of the Year). Brooks is also on the preseason list for the John R. Wooden Award and the NABC Player of the Year award.
- Brooks was selected by the media as the ACC's Preseason Player of the Year. He was the ACC's Most Improved Player and earned second-team All-ACC honors in 2019-20.

- Brooks is a first-team preseason All-America by Jay Bilas, second-team by The Athletic and Dick Vitale and third-team by CBS. ESPN named him the fifth-best player in the country.
- Sophomore Armando Bacot and freshman Walker Kessler are on the Basketball Hall of Fame's Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Award list as the top center in the country.
- Brooks is a candidate for the Karl Malone Award (best power forward).
- Love was listed by The Athletic among the top 20 guards in the country and Lindy's named the St. Louis native one of the best freshman shooters and playmakers in the ACC and a third-team preseason All-ACC selection.
- Lindy's named Freshman guard RJ Davis the best freshman shooter in the ACC, one of the best rookie playmakers and a third-team preseason All-ACC selection.
- Freshman Puff Johnson was on Lindy's list of the best freshman shooters in the nation.

### 1,000 FOR BROOKS, 78TH TAR HEEL

- Garrison Brooks scored his 1,000th career point in the win over UNLV on November 30. He is the 78th player to score 1,000 points as a Tar Heel and the first to do so since Luke Maye, who reached that figure in 2018-19.
- The LaFayette, Ala., native has 1,062 points, 72nd most by a Tar Heel. Ahead of him are Hook Dillon (1,063), Bill Bunting (1,069) and Jerry Stackhouse (1,080). Next up among four-year players is Dante Calabria (1,098).
- Brooks scored 167 points in 37 games as a freshman, 285 in 36 as a sophomore and 539 in 32 games in 2019-20.
- He led the ACC in scoring in conference play last season with 18.8 points per game.
- Carolina holds the NCAA record with 78 1,000-point scorers. Louisville is second with 69.

### FOUR-YEAR STARTERS

- Garrison Brooks should become the 20th Tar Heel to start for at least a large portion of four different seasons, the first since Kennedy Meeks (2013-17) and the fourth to do so in the Roy Williams era (with Tyler Hansbrough from 2005-09, Marcus Paige from 2012-16 and Meeks).
- Only 13 Tar Heels have started for most of four seasons since freshmen became eligible to play in 1972-73 (Walter Davis, Phil Ford, Mike O'Koren, Sam Perkins, Brad Daugherty, Kenny Smith, Jeff Lebo, Ademola Okulaja, Jason Capel, Kris Lang, Hansbrough, Paige and Meeks).

### **FAMILY TIES**

• Five Tar Heels on the active roster this season have brothers or fathers who played at UNC, including senior Walker Miller (brother of Wes Miller), senior K.J. Smith (son of Kenny Smith), junior Ryan McAdoo (son of Bob McAdoo), freshman Puff Johnson (brother of Cameron Johnson) and freshman Creighton Lebo (son of Jeff Lebo).

### **ROY'S 48TH SEASON IN COACHING**

- The 2020-21 season is Roy Williams' 18th as head coach of the Tar Heels, 33rd as a collegiate head coach (15 years at Kansas), 43rd in college coaching (10 years as an assistant to Dean Smith at UNC) and 48th in coaching (five years at Owen High School in Asheville).
- Williams has an all-time head coaching record in college of 889-255, including 471-154 at Carolina.
- He has the fourth-most wins by a Division I head coach behind Mike Krzyzewski (1,160), Jim Boeheim (969) and Bob Knight (902). He needs 11 wins for 900 and 14 to pass Knight.
- Williams is the only coach to win 400 games at two schools (470 at UNC, 418 at Kansas).

### AP POLL

- Carolina fell to No. 22 in the December 14 Associated Press poll.
- UNC is ranked for the 927th time in the AP poll, which is more than any other school in college basketball history (Kentucky is second with 920).
- The Tar Heels have now been ranked at some point in 64 of 73 seasons in the AP poll.

- D'Marco Dunn, a 6-5 guard from Tucson, Ariz., and Dontrez Styles, a 6-7 wing from Kinston, N.C., signed National Letters of Intent to play for the Tar Heels.
- Dunn moved in 2019 to Fayetteville, N.C., where he plays at Westover High School for Coach George Stackhouse. He led Westover to a 30-0 record and conference title. Westover was named co-state champions by the North Carolina High School Athletic Association after the playoffs were canceled due to the pandemic.
- Dunn was an all-state selection in 2020 and was named PAC 9 Conference, Cumberland County and District Player of the Year. He previously attended Marana High School in Tucson for two years before moving to Fayetteville.
- Styles played for Coach Perry Tyndall at Kinston High School. He averaged 19.7 points and 11 rebounds as a junior when he led Kinston to a 26-4 record.
- A four-time honor roll student, Styles was the 2019-20 Eastern Conference Player of the Year, a three-time all-conference selection, all-state honoree and an all-tournament pick at the John Wall Holiday Invitational.

- The Class of 2021 includes Jamison, the late Len Bias of Maryland, UCLA's David Greenwood, Bradley's Hersey Hawkins, Ohio State's Jim Jackson, Kansas's Paul Pierce (coached by Roy Williams) and coaches Rick Byrd and Tom Penders.
- Jamison was the 1998 National Player of the Year and first player in ACC history to earn first-team All-ACC honors as a freshman, sophomore and junior.

### GAME 1: UNC 79, CHARLESTON 60

- Caleb Love and RJ Davis started at guard, the first time two freshmen guards started in a game for UNC since Ty Lawson and Wayne Ellington started vs. Georgetown in the 2007 NCAA East Regional final (they started together 32 times that year).
- This is the third pair of Tar Heel freshmen guards to start under head coach Roy Williams. In 2005-06, freshmen guards Bobby Frasor and Marcus Ginyard started 14 times, including the season opener.
- Love became the eighth freshman to start at the point in Roy Williams' 18 seasons at UNC (Quentin Thomas in 2004-05, Bobby Frasor in 2005-06, Marcus Paige in 2012-13, Nate Britt in 2013-14, Jalek Felton in 2017-18, Coby White in 2018-19, Cole Anthony in 2019-20 and Love).
- Five Tar Heel freshmen combined to score 50 points, the most in a season opener since 2002-03 (Rashad McCants, Sean May, Raymond Felton and David Noel scored 58 vs. Penn State, the most ever by UNC freshmen in their first game).
- Carolina did not allow a field goal until the 11:23 mark of the first half (it was a three-pointer by Zep Jasper to make the score 16-5, UNC).
- Charleston took its only lead of the game at 43-42 with 15:00 to play, before the Tar Heels went on a 17-0 run over the next 4:43 to take a 59-43 lead.
- Love led UNC with 17 points. It marked the second straight season a freshman point guard led UNC in scoring in the season opener (last year Cole Anthony set the ACC scoring record for freshman in a debut with 34 against Notre Dame).
- Love was 8 for 8 from the free throw line, the best performance ever by a Tar Heel in his first game (Danny Green went 6 for 6 as a freshman in the 2005-06 opener vs. Gardner-Webb).
- Love became the seventh UNC freshman point guard to play 25 or more minutes in his first game (with Phil Ford, Kenny Smith, Ed Cota, Raymond Felton, Marcus Paige and Cole Anthony). His 17 points are the second most among those seven players (Anthony had 34 last year) and he is the only player with as few as one turnover (Kenny Smith had two ys. Missouri).
- Sophomore Armando Bacot (11) and freshmen Love (17), Day'Ron Sharpe (13) and Davis (11) scored in double figures. It was the first time three Tar Heel freshmen scored in double figures since 12/21/19 against UCLA when Bacot, Anthony Harris and Jeremiah Francis did that.
- It was the first time three freshmen scored in double figures in the season opener since the 2010-11 season when Harrison Barnes (14), Reggie Bullock (12) and Kendall Marshall (10) against Lipscomb.
- Sharpe had a double-double (13 points and 10 rebounds) in his debut (Anthony also did that last year).
- Sharpe became the 11th Tar Heel with a double-double in his first game. The list includes sophomores Lennie Rosenbluth, Larry Miller, Rusty Clark and Bobby Jones, and freshmen James Worthy, Sam Perkins, Pete Chilcutt, Sean May, Ed Davis, Cole Anthony and Sharpe.
- Garrison Brooks had 11 rebounds, the 15th time in his career he grabbed double-figure

rebounds.

- Andrew Platek made a career-high four steals (previous was two twice) and tied his career high with two blocked shots. He won UNC's defensive player of the game award for the first time in his career.
- Puff Johnson played 2:53 (made a three) and Walker Kessler played 4:23 (six points and four rebounds) due to missing several recent practices because of Covid safety protocol.
- UNC shot under 40 percent for the first time in a win since the Yale game on 12/30/19. UNC had lost its previous six games when shooting under 40 percent.
- UNC scored 30 second-chance points for the first time since beating Tennessee Tech on Nov. 16, 2018.
- Carolina committed only nine turnovers and equaled that number by blocking nine shots.
   UNC turned the ball over 18 times in the season opener vs. Notre Dame a year ago.
- The nine turnovers equaled the second fewest in a season opener in the Roy Williams era.
- Carolina is 99-12 in season openers, including 17-1 under head coach Roy Williams.

### GAME 2: UNC 78, UNLV 51 (Maui/Asheville)

- UNLV scored the first 13 points. That's the most points by an opponent to begin a game since Miami led 14-0 in the 2018 ACC Tournament quarterfinal in Brooklyn.
- Platek scored UNC's first points with 13:42 to play in the first half on a three-pointer.
- UNC took its first lead with 3:22 left in the first half on a drive by Davis to go ahead 29-27.
- Carolina closed the first half on a 37-17 run and began the second half on a 13-1 run.
- UNC out-scored UNLV 78-38 over the final
- Carolina held UNLV to 16.7 percent shooting from the floor in the second half (6 of 36) and 29.0 percent from the floor for the game (18 of 62)
- UNLV's second-half FG percentage was the lowest in a half by a UNC opponent since Elon shot 16.1 percent in the second half at Elon on 11/9/18.
- UNLV made its first five field goal attempts to begin the game, then made 13 of 57 (.228) over the final 35:22.
- Carolina missed its first eight field goal attempts to begin the game, then made 25 of its next 51 shots from the floor (.490).
- Brooks scored eight first-half points, finished with 14 and has 1,012 in his career.
- Brooks became the 78th player to score 1,000 career points as a Tar Heel. The 78 players are an NCAA record. He's the first Tar Heel to reach 1,000 since Luke Maye in 2019.
- Platek scored in double figures for the third time in his career and the first time since his freshman year (12 vs. Portland and 11 vs. Western Carolina on 12/6/2017).
- Black had a game-high 10 rebounds, tying his career high (10 at Notre Dame on 2/17/20).

### GAME 3: UNC 67, STANFORD 63 (Maui/Asheville)

- Carolina reached the finals of the Maui Invitational for the seventh time in eight appearances.
- UNC had lost its last 18 games when scoring under 70 points. The previous win with less than 70 points was a 69-68 victory on Jan. 13, 2018 at Notre Dame.
- Carolina had 24 turnovers, which equal the sixth most in any game under Roy Williams. The last time UNC won with at least this many turnovers was March 23, 2012, when UNC committed 24 turnovers in an overtime win over Ohio University in the 2012 NCAA Sweet 16.
- Carolina trailed at the half for the first time this year (Stanford led, 33-29).
- Carolina had lost the previous 13 times when trailing at the half.
- Five Tar Heels (the five starters) scored in double figures for the first time this season (Love 16, Davis 11 and Bacot, Brooks and Black 10 apiece).
- Sharpe led UNC in assists with four. He also became the first Tar Heel ever to have at least seven rebounds, four assists, four blocked shots and two steals in a game.
- Carolina held Stanford to 10 of 30 from the floor in the second half (.333).
- Williams improved to 11-1 in games against former players as head coaches, including 5-1 against Stanford's Jerod Haase.
- Carolina is 13-0 against the Cardinal.
- UNC's 13-0 record is the second-most wins without a loss against any opponent. The Tar Heels are 19-0 all-time vs. The Citadel.
- UNC has won 16 in row against Pac-12 opponents and is 17-1 under Roy Williams against the Pac-12.

### GAME 4: TEXAS 69, UNC 67 (Maui/Asheville)

- The Tar Heels fell to 22-4 in the Maui Invitational, including 4-3 in title games.
- Carolina led 15-10 before Texas ran off 14 straight points. UNC trailed by 16 in the first half and 12 at the break before tying the game on a Love free throw with 3:54 to play. UNC took its first lead of the second half at 65-63 on a baseline jumper by Brooks with 2:35 left, but that was UNC's last field goal of the game.
- Carolina missed its final four field goal attempts over the last 1:46.
- Black tied the game by making two free throws with 25 seconds remaining.
- Matt Coleman III made the winning jumper for Texas with 0.1 seconds to play.
- It was the first winning basket by the opponents with less than a second to play since Virginia's Tomas Woldetensae hit a three with 0.8 to play on 2/15/20.
- It was the fifth time in UNC's last 17 games an opponent hit a game-winning shot with less than three seconds to play (0.4 seconds in the second overtime at Virginia Tech on 1/22/20; 0.0 on the clock in OT by Duke on 2/8/20; 0.8 seconds by Virginia on 2/15/20; 2.4 seconds at Notre Dame on 2/17/20; and 0.1 seconds by Texas).
- Brooks led UNC in scoring for the first time this season with a season-high 18 points.
- Brooks was selected to the All-Tournament
- Bacot had his first double-double this season and the 12th of his career with 10 points and a

season-high 12 boards.

- Black tied his career high in rebounds with 10 for the second time in three games.
- Carolina had only six assists on 24 baskets. The six assists are the fewest since the Tar Heels had six at Virginia on 12/8/19 and equal the second fewest by a UNC team under Williams.
- Carolina was 1 for 9 from three-point range. No starter made a three. Kerwin Walton made the only three for the Tar Heels.
- UNC out-rebounded the Longhorns, 50-32.
- UNC grabbed 20 offensive rebounds and scored 25 second-chance points.
- In the first half, UNC had only one assist and 10 turnovers and went 5 for 13 from the line, including missing two front ends of 1 and 1s.
- Texas has beaten UNC five straight and nine of 10 and leads the series, 9-3.

### GAME 5: @IOWA 93, UNC 80

- Carolina scored 80 points and shot 47.7 percent from the floor, both season highs to date.
- lowa's 93 points and 44.7 percent shooting from the floor were season-highs by an opponent through five games.
- Iowa made 17 of 40 from three-point range, including 11 of 22 in the first half.
- lowa's 17 threes were the most by an opponent since Auburn made 17 in the 2019 NCAA Sweet 16.
- The 17 threes equaled the third most ever against the Tar Heels.
- The 40 three-point attempts equaled the third most by an opponent in the Roy Williams era and equaled the sixth most in any game.
- Three lowa players made five or more threes (seven by Jordan Bohannon and five by both CJ Fredrick and Joe Wieskamp).
- It was the first time three opponent players made five or more threes in a game (it was the 19th time an opponent made 15 or more threes in a game). The last time two opponents made five threes in a game was William & Mary in the 2010 NIT.
- lowa scored 33 of its 43 points in the first half on three-pointers.
- It was the second game in a row the Tar Heels trailed by as many as 16 points in the first half and by 12 at the break, but took the lead in the second half.
- Carolina led twice at 66-65 (on a pair of Davis free throws) and 68-67 (on a layup by Platek).
- Carolina was 13 for 20 from the floor (65 percent) in the first 10:30 of the second half when it out-scored lowa, 37-24, to lead 68-67. The Tar Heels then made 5 of 13 field goal attempts and 4 of 9 from the free throw line over the final 9:30.
- Carolina shot 40 percent from three-point range (6 of 15), its best percentage in its first five games this season.
- UNC had 22 assists, 10 more than its previous high in a game this season (12 vs. Charleston).
- Carolina dropped to 10-12 in the ACC-Big Ten Challenge, including three straight losses.
- Brooks (17 points) led UNC in scoring for the second straight game.
- Bacot had a team-high 11 rebounds, his second consecutive game with double-figure rebounds (12 vs. Texas).
- Platek scored 10 points. It was the second time in five games he has scored in double figures (he did that twice in his first three seasons as a Tar Heel).

- Sharpe made 5 of 6 field goal attempts for a season-high tying 13 points and had six rebounds and two steals in just 14 minutes.
- Davis had eight assists, most by any Tar Heel this season, and scored 12 points. He is the only Tar Heel to score in double figures in each of the first five games.
- Love had a season-high six assists.
- Black grabbed nine rebounds he has 36 in the last four games (9.0 per).
- UNC scored 24 fastbreak points. It came into the game averaging 9.0 fastbreak points and had not scored more than 11 in a game in the first four games.
- lowa's 23 points off turnovers and 21 second-chance points were both season highs in the first five games against the Tar Heels.

### **GAME 6: UNC 73, NC CENTRAL 67**

- UNC made 17 consecutive free throws its last four of the first half and 13 for 13 in the second.
- UNC made 25 of 31 free throws for the game, its highest percentage (.806) to date this season.
- The 25 made free throws were the most for UNC in the first six games.
- Carolina trailed by 11 points in the first half (NCCU led 19-8 with 11:26 to play in the half). It was the fourth time in the first six games UNC trailed by double figures in the first half (13-point lead by UNLV, 16 by Texas and Iowa and 11 by NCCU).
- Carolina finished the first half on a 16-5 run over the final 8:30 to lead 30-28 at intermission.
- UNC also had a 15-5 run midway through the second half to take a 57-42 lead with 9:11 to play.
- Carolina made 25 free throws and 23 field goals. It was the first time UNC made more free throws than field goals since 2/26/19 vs. Syracuse.
- Carolina shot 51.9 percent from the floor in the second half. It was the third time in four games UNC shot 50 percent or better in the second half.
- Platek made both of UNC's three-pointers (team was 2 for 15 from 3FG). It was the second time in three games (Texas) no starter made a three-pointer.
- Platek made two 3FGs, the third time this season and ninth time in his career he made multiple threes.
- Platek scored in double figures for the third time this season with 11. He previously scored in double figures twice as a freshman.
- UNC had 13 assists and committed 18 turnovers, the fourth time in the first six games UNC had more turnovers than assists.
- UNC improved to 173-18 against in-state, non-conference teams and 210-17 in the Smith Center against non-conference teams.
- Bacot led UNC with a season-high 19 points and 11 rebounds. It was the third straight game Bacot grabbed 10 or more rebounds (12 vs. Texas, 11 at lowa, 11 vs. NCCU).
- Sharpe had 12 points, six rebounds, two assists, two blocks, a steal and no turnovers.



### #1 - RECHON "LEAKY" BLACK 6-8, 195, Junior, Guard/Forward, Concord, N.C.



**Career:** Made 37 starts • Career highs include 14 points vs. Syracuse in the 2020 ACC Tournament, 10 rebounds three times and nine assists vs. Duke as a sophomore.

**2020-21:** Carolina's top perimeter defender • Has won UNC's defensive player of the game award twice (four career) • One of four Tar Heels averaging six or more rebounds with a career-high 7.5 • Averaging 8.6 rebounds over the last five games with 10 against UNLV and Texas and nine at lowa • Made 11 of 25 (44 percent) from the floor after a 3 for 17 start to the season • At least one steal in all six games.

Season-high four field goals with nine points, nine rebounds, two assists and two steals at lowa • Tied his previous career high of 10 rebounds against both UNLV and Texas • Had eight points, 10 boards and two assists vs. the Longhorns – made two free throws with 25 seconds to play to tie the game at 67 • Scored in double figures for the fifth time in his career with 10 points vs. Stanford, including a driving layup with 1:02 to play that gave UNC a 66-63 lead • Tied his career high with 10 rebounds (four offensive) and sparked UNC's defensive effort in win over UNLV • Won his first defensive player of the game this season and the third of his career for his efforts, primarily for defending Bryce Hamilton, in the win over UNLV • Held Vegas's leading scorer without a point for nearly 14 minutes mid-game as UNC went from trailing by three to leading by 19.

**2019-20:** Averaged 6.5 points, 5.0 rebounds and 2.6 assists • Started 31 games – 25 at small forward and six (Clemson through Boston College) at the point • Led the team with 40 steals and was second in assists with 83 • Scored in double figures four times with a career-high 14 points against Syracuse in the ACC Tournament, three 3FGs at Virginia Tech, 10 rebounds at Notre Dame and nine assists at home vs. Duke • Played 30 or more minutes 15 times and 40-plus twice.



### **CREDENTIALS**

Media seating in the Smith Center will be limited to approximately 15 seats (not including broadcast and radio networks) due to the pandemic. Seats will be reserved in this order: media that regularly cover Carolina Basketball, the visiting team and national media.

Credentials will be issued on a game-by-game basis (no season credentials).

### Please make credential requests online at SportsSystems.com/UNCBasketball

Media will be able to request credentials beginning two weeks before each scheduled game for a window of time that ends one week prior to the game. For example, the system will accept credentials for the Jan. 23 game vs. NC State from 8 a.m. on January 9 to 5 p.m. on January 16.

We are not accepting photo or minicam requests for credentials. There are only a limited number of photo opportunities, which will be handled directly by Steve Kirschner, Senior Associate A.D. for Communications.

Approved credentials may be picked up at media will call at Smith Center Entrance D, which will open one hour before the scheduled starting time. Entrance D is diagonally across the building from the media entrance last season. Entrance D is closest to the reserved parking lot behind the natatorium and the Smith Center/basketball offices.

All briefcases, computer bags and photo equipment are subject to search.

### AWAY GAME CREDENTIALS

ACC Games: email Kirschner (each school will have different access...the schools will let Kirschner if, and how many, media/photographer seats will be available for the visiting team).

#### PARKING

Parking will be emailed to you by Emilee McCollum of the Smith Center staff. Please note that at least for the first few games, media parking is in the Manning Drive lot (this is a recent change). To access: from Manning Drive, turn onto Bowles Drive (turn on the end of Bowles Drive closest to 15-501, not up the hill by the dorms). Once on Bowles, turn on Tar Heel Boulevard (which is just a driveway that leads behind the natatorium and the arena). Just before the security hut turn left and that's the Manning Drive lot.

### **HEALTH & SAFETY**

Acceptance of a credential acknowledges and assumes risks associated with Covid-19 and the bearer agrees not to use the credential in the event that he or she is sick or

An online health survey must be completed before media is allowed to enter the Smith Center. The survey will be emailed to you several days before the game; please go online and fill it out the day of the game (it takes about a minute to complete). Temperature checks will be done at the media entrance (Gate D). Once you have passed a temperature check and are allowed to enter the arena, please proceed to the media seating in section 212.

A mask must be worn at all times in the Smith Center. Media representatives must bring their own mask that fully covers their nose and mouth, plus any other personal protective equipment they wish to use. We ask that you do not attend the game if you are experiencing any symptoms of Covid-19.

Hand sanitizer dispensers will be available throughout the arena.

Individuals must sit in their assigned seat and adhere to physical distancing guidelines (at least six feet apart) while moving within the arena.

### MEDIA WORK ROOM, MEDIA SEATING IN ARENA

The media work room adjacent to the visiting team's locker room will be closed this season. Upon entering the arena, media should proceed directly to their assigned seats in section 212 and plan to work there for the duration of your visit to the Smith Center.

### PHOTO SPOTS/PHOTO WORK SPACE

A limited number of photographers may be allowed to shoot from designated areas around the arena. Those assignments will be coordinated by Steve Kirschner. Availability will be very limited and may change over the course of the season due to the pandemic. Other than a photographer and videographer who travel with each team and are tested on a regular basis, photo/video spots that are assigned will be at least 15 feet (and could be farther away) from the edge of the essential personnel perimeter that has been established by the ACC.

There will be a pool photographer and pool videographer assigned to each game who will provide still and video images for media use through a digital sharing site managed by the Atlantic Coast Conference. Check with Kirschner for details.

### POSTGAME AVAILABILITY

All postgame interviews with Coach Williams and UNC players will be via Zoom or another digital platform. The raw files for UNC will be archived to GoHeels.com and a select number of quotes may be posted and distributed.

### **NON-GAMEDAY INTERVIEWS**

All interviews will be done this season via Zoom or by phone.

Throughout the season, Williams and players should be available via Zoom a day or two before select games. A schedule of these sessions will be posted in the game notes.

Interview requests should be made through the athletic communications office. Contact Kirschner with interview requests for Coach Williams. Due to contractual obligations, Williams is unable to participate in live radio call-in shows.

Media should direct player interview requests to Matt Bowers (mattbowers@unc.edu, 919-619-7021). Player interviews typically occur before practice. Players are not available for interviews on game day or on non-practice days.

### ACC TELECONFERENCE

Beginning in January, Roy Williams will be available on most Mondays for 10 minutes on the ACC teleconference. Coaches do not participate on the Monday call if their teams play that evening (UNC plays on Monday on Feb. 8 and March 1). Media should contact Kirschner or the ACC for the teleconference number.

### ONLINE & SOCIAL MEDIA

Carolina's official website is GoHeels.com, which features the yearbook, record book, statistics, game notes, roster, schedule, archives and other information. Archived recordings of the weekly and postgame Zoom press conferences will be posted to the site. Follow the Tar Heels on Twitter and Instagram at @UNC\_Basketball.
