### NOTING THE WOLFPACK

- The 2020 Wolfpack squad set a new record with seven ACC victories. In 68 ACC seasons, the most league wins ever posted by an NC State squad was six.
- The Wolfpack has now posted two nine-win seasons and two eight win seasons under Doeren with one game left to play.
- 14 members of the 2020 squad have already graduated from NC State.
- NC State faced five ranked teams in 2020 (Virginia Tech, Pitt, UNC, Miami & Liberty). The Pack won two of those contests. Five ranked opponents are the most in a season for the Pack since 1997 - when Mike O'Cain's team also faced five ranked opponents.
- Wolfpack head coach Dave Doeren ranks second in career victories in NC State history with 55 - only Earle Edwards had more.
- NC State closed the season with four straight wins. That's the most consecutive wins to close out a regular season since 2008.
- In his 8th season with the Wolfpack, Doeren is tied for second among the longest tenured coaches in NC State history behind Edwards (17, 1954-70) and Beattie Feathers (8, 1944-51).
- Wolfpack linebacker Payton Wilson leads in the ACC in tackles per game (10.8) and his 108 total stops ranks third in the FBS.
- Junior PK Christopher Dunn broke the school record for career field goals in the win over Georgia Tech (he now has 56, the record was 55).
- The Pack's come-from-behind win at Pitt on Oct. 3 marked the first time since Doeren's first year at NC State that his squad won a game with a last minute score. That season, the Pack kicked a field goal to beat Richmond with 33 seconds remaining.
- Junior Levi Jones has three blocked kicks for the season (2 punts, 1 FG). He is tied for 2nd in Wolfpack history with those 3 blocked kicks and is the first Wolfpack player since 2010 to block two punts in a season. He is now tied for first nationally in blocked kicks.
- Only one player in school history ever had more receiving TDs in a game than Thayer Thomas' three scoring grabs against Syracuse: Hall of Famer Torry Holt.
- In his last two games, quarterback Bailey Hockman has completed 46 of 67 passes for 622 yards, a .687 completion percentage and has thrown for four TDs with just one interception. His passing efficiency and completion percentage marks this season rank fourth and seventh respectively in school history.
- NC State offensive coordinator Tim Beck and Kentucky head coach Mark Stoops were high school teammates at Cardinal Mooney in Youngstown, Ohio.

**GOING BOWLING**

NC State will be making its 33rd bowl appearance in school history in the TaxSlayer Gator Bowl and its sixth appearance in the past seven years. The Wolfpack has played in four previous Gator Bowls - including its first bowl game in 1947, in 1992, perhaps its most exciting bowl game in 2002 and its last bowl game (2018).

This marks the Wolfpack's sixth bowl bid in Dave Doeren's eight seasons as head coach. NC State went to five straight bowl games from 2014-18 - the second-longest bowl streak in school history and tied as the longest under the same coach.

In Doeren's 10 seasons as a head coach, eight of his squads have now qualified for bowl games: both of his teams at Northern Illinois and all but two of his Wolfpack squads.

NC State boasts a 17-14-1 all-time record in bowls.

**TURNAROUND TALE**

Just a year after going 1-7 in league play and posting a 4-8 overall record, NC State has a chance to tie for the second-highest number of wins in a season in school history. The Wolfpack has doubled its win total (in less games) from an injury-plagued 2019 campaign.

That turnaround is more notable when looking at the circumstances surrounding the turnaround. An overhaul of the coaching staff brought five new assistants in for 2020 as well a new coordinator. That new group had only five practices to see the team in action before the pandemic began in March. In August, the team had to shut down again for two weeks due to COVID (OC Tim Beck had never seen some of his quarterbacks play against live action until an actual game).

Under head coach Dave Doeren, the Wolfpack has now posted two nine-win seasons and two eight win seasons with one game left to play. The Wolfpack has ranked in the top four in the ACC in league victories and overall wins in three of the past four seasons.

Here's a look at where the Pack has ranked in ACC record and overall record among ACC teams - regardless of division - in the last four years.

**ACC SUCCESS**

The 2020 Wolfpack squad set a new record with seven ACC victories. In 68 ACC seasons, the most league wins ever posted by a previous NC State squad was six.

Not only did the 2020 Wolfpack squad post the most ACC victories in school history, but it also posted one of the top winning percentages against conference teams ever - winning 70% of its league games. Even more impressive is that NC State posted that record just a year after going 1-7 in league play in an injury-ridden 2019 campaign

If you look at the top seven league winning percentages in the past 50 years, two of those seasons have come under head coach Dave Doeren.

**FINISHING STRONG**

The NC State closed the season with four straight wins. It ties as the strongest finish in school history and is the most consecutive wins to close out a regular season since 2008. The Pack also finished with four straight victories in 1992 and 1965.

**DOEREN FINE**

With the win over Georgia Tech, Wolfpack head coach Dave Doeren now boasts 55 victories in his tenure as head coach of the Wolfpack. That mark ranks second in school history, as Doeren passed Hall of Famer Dick Sheridan when the Pack defeated Florida State earlier this season.

Only long-time head coach Earle Edwards has posted more victories than Doeren's 55.

The Wolfpack will be vying for its ninth victory of the season in the bowl game. With two other nine-win seasons at NC State already under his belt, Doeren would become the first coach in school history ever to post three campaigns with nine or more victories.

**RANKING THE PACK**

Riding a four-game winning streak to conclude the 2020 regular season, NC State comes into the TaxSlayer Gator Bowl ranked in the final CFP Rankings and also in both the AP and Coaches Polls.

NC State was ranked No. 23 in the final College Football Playoff Rankings. The Pack is also ranked No. 24 in the current AP poll and No. 22 in the Coaches Poll.

Since the CFP Rankings started in 2014, this year marks the second time the Pack was ranked in the final poll, and its highest ever. In 2017, NC State was No. 24 in the final CFP Rankings.

Along with the 2017 season, NC State also enters the 2020 bowl season ranked for only the second time since 2002 (that season, No 17 vs. Notre Dame in the 2002 Gator Bowl).

### WELL REPRESENTED

The Wolfpack is well represented on the league's All-ACC teams, which a total of 10 players earning honors on the official league list.

DT Alim McNeill and LB Payton Wilson won first-team honors (that duo was also named to the Associated Press's first team). OT Ickey Ekwonu, RB Zonovan Knight, Spec. Thayer Thomas and OG Joe Sculthorpe earned third-team honors and Cary Angeline, Christopher Dunn, Emeka Emezie, and LB Isaiah Moore earned honorable mention honors.

Ekwonu earned second-team All-ACC from the AP at offensive guard *and* offensive tackle, as he started games at both positions this season.

### ON PRO FIELDS

NC State will face Kentucky in the TaxSlayer Gator Bowl at TIAA Bank Field, which also doubles as the home of the NFL's Jacksonville Jaguars. It will mark the seventh time the Wolfpack has played in an NFL Stadium under head coach Dave Doeren, second at TIAA Bank Field.

NC State is 3-3 in those games, with all three losses coming in neutral site matchups (Charlotte's Bank of America Stadium in the 2015 Belk Bowl and vs. South Carolina in 2017 and at TIAA Bank Field at the 2018 TaxSlayer Gator Bowl). The Pack is 3-0 as a visitor on a pro field, winning at USF's Raymond James Stadium in 2014 and at Pitt in 2017 and 2020.

### PAYTON'S PLACE

For only the second time in school history, a Wolfpack defender has finished the season as the ACC's leading tackler. Redshirt sophomore Payton Wilson finished the season with 108 total stops, the third-highest total in the FBS. In terms of tackles per game, he ranks 13th in the FBS.

The first-team All-ACC performer finished the regular season tied for eighth in the league in tackles for loss (11.5) and was a three-time ACC LB of the Week, including for each of the Pack's final two games. His sack in the waning seconds at Syracuse sealed that Wolfpack win.

In the win over Duke, Wilson posted 19 tackles - most for a Pack player since 2012 and pulled down two interceptions.

In the regular season finalé against Georgia Tech, he led the team in tackles with 11 even though he had dislocated both shoulders.

The only other time a player from NC State led the league in tackles was Levar Fisher in 2000 - the

year he won ACC Defensive Player of the Year honors.

### RETURNS ON INVESTMENT

Todd Goebbel's special teams units have been outstanding in many areas in 2020. Not only is NC State tied for sixth nationally in blocked kicks, but the squad enters the bowl game ranked second in the ACC and 25th in the FBS in punt return average (11.7) and ranking second the ACC and 24th nationally in kickoff return average (23.7).

If the season ended today, that would be the 13th-best punt return average in school history and the sixth-best kickoff return mark.

Zonovan Knight's 26.4 yards kickoff return average this season would rank ninth in school history if the season ended today and would rank second in the ACC and 18th in the FBS if he had enough attempts to qualify.

The Pack has also found the end zone via both routes, as Knight scored on a 100 yard kickoff return against Miami and Max Fisher returned a blocked punt for a TD vs. Duke.

NC State is one of just 10 FBS schools nationally that has returned both a kickoff and a punt for a touchdown this season, and one of just four Power 5 schools to do so (Penn State, Rutgers, Texas).

### WELL DUNN

Although the Wolfpack offense's ability to score touchdowns has slowed down the process, junior placekicker Christopher Dunn is now the NC State career record holder for field goals.

Dunn's 56 career kicks ranks bettered the mark of 55 set by Niklas Sade (2011-14). Dunn also ranks fourth in career percentage (.862), third in scoring (287 points), third in PATs (119) and has posted two of the top five longest consecutive field goal streaks in school history.

Between 2018 and 2019, Dunn connected on 19 straight FGs - the second-longest streak in school history - before missing a 51-yarder at West Virginia last season. Over the last six games of last season and the first three of 2020, he posted another streak by hitting 14 straight. That's the third-longest streak in school history.

### ICK YOUR POISON

Sophomore offensive lineman Ikem Ekwonu, better known as "Ickey," confused postseason honors voters this season, as least when it came to the Associated Press. After starting the first four games of the season at guard and the last seven at tackle, he ended up earning second-team all-conference honors at *both* spots.

The recipient of the team's Jim Ritcher Award for top offensive lineman, Ekwonu was named co-ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week for the opener and for the win over Duke. He graded out an unheard of 90% twice in 2020.

He led the team with 46 pancake blocks for the season.

### CLOSE ... AND THE CIGAR

This season NC State has picked up a pair of one-point wins - and has done so in dramatic fashion. Those two victories mark the first ... and second ... one-point wins for the Pack in Dave Doeren's eight seasons as head coach. Those are the only one-point games in Doeren's tenure - win or lose.

At No. 24 Pitt back in early October, then starting QB Devin Leary led the offense 79 yards in eight plays to set up the game-winning TD with 23 seconds left in the 30-29 road win.

Last week against previously unbeaten and 21st-ranked Liberty, the Pack used a blocked field goal with 1:18 left to preserve the home win.

During Doeren's eight seasons in Raleigh, NC State posts a 16-12 mark in one-score games (eight points or less). NC State is 4-1 in such games in 2020, notching wins over No. 21 Liberty (15-14), No. 24 Pitt (30-29), Wake Forest (45-42) and Syracuse (36-29).

### CARY GOOD

He's not fast. He's not flashy. But senior tight end Cary Angeline is pretty good.

After leading the Pack in touchdown receptions last season with five, he is tied for the team lead

with six in 2020. Over the last three seasons, 12 of his 61 catches have resulted in a Pack TD.

This season, he is tied for fifth nationally among all tight ends in touchdown receptions with six. That mark leads all ACC tight ends and ranks 33rd overall in the NCAA.

For his NC State career, Angeline has 61 receptions - the seventh-best total for a tight end in school history. He now ranks 14th in school history in receiving TDs.

Angeline in the end zone was a big reason the Pack pulled off the 30-29 upset at No. 24 Pitt on Oct. 3. Not only did he have a career-best two TD catches, but both came on third down.

In the first quarter after Pitt jumped out to a 7-0 lead, the Pack took its first offensive possession right down the field and QB Devin Leary found Angeline from six yards out on a third and goal.

The duo struck again in the fourth quarter with the Pack down 23-17. This time, it was a third-and-16 that was converted into another score with a wide-open 25 yard score down the middle of the field.

**DOING IT ON DEFENSE**

The Wolfpack's defense has struggled at times this season - with a young secondary and key players missing games for injury. However, in the last four games - all Wolfpack wins - the defense has come up big.

In the first seven games of the year, the defense allowed an average of 472.1 yards and 34.4 points per game. In the last three outings, the opponent has tallied just 323.75 yards and 19.5 points per game. (In two of those four outings, the Pack held the opponent (Liberty - 279 and Syracuse - 257) to under 300 yards of total offense.

Previously unbeaten and 21st-ranked Liberty came into the Nov. 21 contest averaging 490.9 total yards per game - the No. 18 mark in the FBS and their 40.5 points per game ranked 17th nationally. Tony Gibson's fired up defense held the Flames to just 279 total yards and a season-low 14 points.

Flames' QB Malik Willis had thrown just one INT all season prior to the game - threw three. Even more impressive, all three passes were picked off by young defenders: sophomore safety Jakeen Harris, true freshman corner Aydan White and former walkon RS-sophomore Isaac Duffy.

In the 15-14 win, the defense scored two points on Isaiah Moore's tackle for loss in the endzone that resulted in a safety. White's pick gave the ball to the Pack for the winning touchdown.

The defense came to play again the next week in the win at Syracuse, holding the Orange to just 257 total yards - the lowest opponent total all season. Cuse could manage just three rushing yards for the day - the lowest total allowed by the Pack since a -3 total by Old Dominion in 2015. It was the lowest rushing output by an ACC opponent since UNC rushed for 3 yards in 2011.

**PICK A PECK OF PASSES**

Good things come in threes for the Wolfpack .. or at least they do when it comes to interceptions.

The Wolfpack defensive has picked off a trio of passes in a trio of games this season: Virginia, Duke and Liberty. Prior to this season, the last time the Pack had three picks in a game was the win over Arizona State in the 2017 Sun Bowl and the last time it happened in a regular season game had been FSU in 2015. You have to go back to 2012 to find a Wolfpack squad that had at least three picks in three or more games.

With 10 interceptions in 2020, NC State is tied for 21st in the FBS. That mark is even more impressive when looking at last year's numbers. In 2019, the Pack D picked off just four passes in 12 games - ranking 127th in the FBS!

NINE different players have pulled down an opponent pass this season - with LB Payton Wilson the only player on the team with more than one INT (he has two).

**SIX DEGREES OF WOLFPACK NATION:** The 2020 Wolfpack coaching staff boasts six new members and nine of the 10 assistant coaches are either in their first or second season at NC State.

On offense, new coordinator Tim Beck is in his first year, while OL coach John Garrison, TE coach Todd Goebbel and RB coach Kurt Roper are in their second campaigns with the Pack.

On defense, Tony Gibson, who joined the staff in 2019, is the only returning coach, while Joe DeForest (Saf), Brian Mitchell (CB), Charley Wiles (DL) and Freddie Aughtry-Lindsay are new.

Wide receivers coach George McDonald, now in his sixth season at NC State, is the only coach on the staff with a tenure of more than two seasons.

But just because these coaches are new to NC State doesn't mean they're new to each other. In fact, five of the six new members of the staff have coached with at least one other coach at a previous stop (and the sixth, Freddie Aughtry-Lindsay, is an NC State graduate). Also, the Pack's new Assistant to the Head Coach Ruffin McNeill has previous coaching ties with the current staff.

**BLOCK PARTY**

Well that didn't take long.

Redshirt junior Levi Jones, who is in his first season playing for the Pack (he sat out last season after transferring from USC) has already worked his way into the NC State record books. With blocked punts in the wins over Virginia and Duke and a blocked field goal against Liberty, Jones is now tied for third in school history in blocked kicks for a season. His three are the most for a Pack player in 18 seasons and only two players have ever blocked more in a single season.

Two of his blocks have been particularly crucial. The blocked punt vs. Duke resulted in a Max Fisher touchdown and his FG block vs. Liberty in the waning minutes of the game sealed the win for the Pack.

**WHAM, SLAM, THANK YOU, BAM**

Running back Zonovan "Bam" Knight doesn't rank in the top 10 in the ACC in rushing yards per game - as he and Ricky Person split time and have combined to rush for 127.6 ypg.

But the sophomore does have a knack at finding the endzone. With 10 total TDs this season, he ranks sixth in the league in total touchdowns - t26th in the FBS - and his nine rushing TDs is the ACC's fourth-best mark. He ranks sixth in the league in all-purpose yardage (106.5 ypg).

Knight scored six of those nine TDs in the last four games and scored both of the Pack's in the win over No. 21 Liberty.

With a 5.55 yards per carry average for his career, Knight currently boasts the top rushing average IN SCHOOL HISTORY for players with more than 200 carries.

**RANKED OPPONENTS**

Although the national polls have been different in 2020 with the chaos of covid, Liberty was the fifth ranked opponent the Wolfpack has faced in its

nine games. The Pack has won two of those contests.

Those five ranked foes are the most faced by a Wolfpack squad since 1997 - when Mike O'Cain's team also faced five ranked opponents.

You also have to combine the 2019 (2), 2018 (2) and 2017 (4) seasons to come up with the last five ranked opponents NC State faced prior to this stretch.

**SCORING POINTS**

The Wolfpack has dramatically improved its scoring output in 2020. Last season, NC State's offense ranked 107th in the NCAA - averaging 22.1 points a game. This season, the squad sits at 45th in the NCAA in scoring offense at 31.1 ppg (that number was obviously higher prior to a season-low output in the win vs. Liberty).

Last season the Pack had a season-high of 27 points scored in a game against a Power-5 team. This season, NC State eclipsed that mark in seven of its 11 games. NC State has increased its points scored: 22.1 points per game in 2019, compared to 31.1 points so far this season.

If the season ended today, that would be the eighth-best mark in school history and would mean that four of the top 10 scoring marks in school history have come during Dave Doeren's tenure.

**PERFECTING THE PASS**

After starting three different QBs in 2019, the Wolfpack has had two starting quarterbacks in 2020 - with Bailey Hockman starting eight games and Devin Leary starting three before he was injured. Despite those changes at the signal caller spot, NC State has seen great improvement in its passing

numbers from last year.

The Pack's passing offense ranked 67th in the NCAA in 2019, averaging 229.1 yards per game. That ranking is up to 37th this season, and 262.4 yards through the air per game.

At UNC, the Pack's 358 yards passing were the most for a Pack team since the 2018 regular season finale against East Carolina (421).

### HOCKMAN GETS IT DONE

Although RS-junior quarterback Bailey Hockman's path to starting quarterback hasn't always been a smooth one, he has ended up posting some of the best numbers in school history and showing great improvement over the course of the season.

Hockman got the starting nod in two games last season - including the Wolfpack's only ACC win (vs. Syracuse) before being beat out by Devin Leary. After Leary missed time in the preseason of 2020 due to Covid contact tracing, Hockman was named the starter to open the season, winning the opener vs. Wake and then being pulled in the loss at Virginia Tech.

When Leary broke his foot against Duke, Hockman began his third stint as the starter. He posts a 4-3 mark as a starter this season, with all three losses have come against ranked opponents.

Hockman had the best outing of his career in Game 10 at Syracuse, even though he was under intense pressure the entire game (he was sacked six times). He threw for a career-high 313 yards in the win, while throwing four touchdown passes.

Through the regular season, Hockman posts the fourth-best passing efficiency mark in school history (141.81 - 40th in the FBS) and his completion percentage of .637 is the seventh-best single season mark ever by a Pack QB (36th in FBS).

His improvement can be seen by looking at his numbers in his three stints as a starter:

### THAYER HE GOES

On Nov. 14 against Florida State, graduate wide receiver Thayer Thomas hauled in a career-high 11 catches - including four to convert on third down. That was the highest reception total for NC State in 2020. He also tallied a career-high in terms of yardage with 135 - also tops for the Wolfpack in 2020

On the night, Thomas scored two touchdowns, a 10-yard pass in the 2nd quarter and a 24-yarder in the 3rd quarter.

After not catching a single pass the following week in the win over No. 21 Liberty, Thomas was on fire again at Syracuse, catching nine passes for 102 yards and a career-high *three* touchdowns. The only player in school history ever to catch more TDs in a game for the Wolfpack is Hall of Fam-

er Torry Holt (who incidentally was one of Thomas' high school coaches).

### GIVE US MOORE

Middle linebacker Isaiah Moore - a team captain and player honored with the No. 1 jersey for 2020 - has been on fire for the Pack in the last three games. The redshirt junior currently ranks 10th in the ACC in tackles per game for the season (7.7). He's also posted 5.5 of his 9 tackles for loss in the last five outings and led the team in tackles in the wins over Florida State and Liberty.

Moore scored what may have been the most important points of the season against No. 21 Liberty. He became the first Pack player since Terrell Manning in 2010 to score a safety when he had a three-yard TFL in the endzone in the one-point NC State win.

Moore was named ACC Linebacker of the Week for his performance against Liberty.

### #PACKUNITED

NC State athletics' PackUnited initiative has been led by the student-athletes and the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) since its inception in late spring. LB Isaiah Moore and C Grant Gibson have been driving forces behind the movement.

#PackUnited encourages NC State's student-athletes to use their platform to push for change and is focused on three platforms: awareness, action, and education.

Awareness: Increasing awareness of racial injustice and racial inequity, through education and social media campaigns that tell the stories of our Black student athletes as well as Black community members.

Education: Teaming with local and community resources to educate and better articulate the narratives surrounding social injustice in black communities.

Action: Taking the initiative as student-athletes to step up and commit to improving the community through continued service for those in need.

### TURNOVER TALE

It's (usually) a simple formula:

Win or tie the turnover battle = Wolfpack win.

Lose the turnover battle = Wolfpack loss.

The math was different (although it worked out in the Pack's favor) in Game 10 at Syracuse. Even though NC State turned the ball over twice and did not force a miscue, it still emerged victorious.

In every previous game where the Pack has less or the same TOs as the opponents, the Pack has won. In its three losses, the Pack has not managed to force a turnover.

### THE BREAKFAST CLUB

Every Sunday during the football season, the Wolfpack offensive staff hands out bottles of syrup to his players in commemoration of their pancake blocks from the previous game. (Against Pitt, the Pack earned 10 bottles).

Pitt entered the game with the Wolfpack (Oct 3) game leading the nation in sacks with 17 in three games - 5.7 per game. That highly vaunted defense was stymied by the Pack's offensive line, which allowed just one of

Pitt's two sacks on the day.

At this point in his young career, sophomore Ikem "Ickey" Ekwonu would need a LOT of pancakes to use up all the syrup he's received. He has 83 pancakes in his 23 career contests. Ekwonu has manhandled opponents all season, sometimes registering multiple pancakes on one play.

Ekwonu was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week for the opener and vs. Duke and has also tallied 14 knockdown blocks and scored 90% in two games this season.

### LEADING LINEBACKERS

NC State's starting linebacker trio of Payton Wilson, Isaiah Moore and Drake Thomas currently rank 1st, 10th and 31st respectively in the ACC in tackles per game in 2020.

Wilson leads the league with 10.8 stops per game - the No. 15 mark in the FBS this week. Moore is averaging 7.7 stops per contest, while Thomas stands at 5.8.

In the Oct. 17 win over Duke, the linebacking corps was spectacular. Although the starting three combined for 41 tackles, 3.5 tackles for loss, and a pair of INTs (both by Wilson), the reserves did work as well. Reserve MLB Jaylon Scott also had a pick, while reserve Levi Jones blocked a punt that was returned for a score.

### WHAT'S UP, BRO?

To find the last time a pair of brothers played such significant roles on the Wolfpack football squad, you'd have to go back to the 1990s, when Torry Holt was a unanimous All-American at wide receiver (1995-98) and then his brother won All-America honors on defense (1999-02). However, those brothers did not play on the same team.

Almost a couple of decades later, Torry was coaching at local Wakefield High School when another pair of brothers were playing: Thayer and Drake Thomas. Holt coached Thayer, who ended up coming to NC State, where he has played in 36 games, starting 21 and posts one of the top punt return averages in school history. The RS-junior (who has already graduated) had three touchdowns in the win over Syracuse.

Younger brother Drake currently ranks fourth on the team and 31st in the ACC in tackles from his starting linebacker spot.

The pair have started in the same game nine times in their careers.

### ANOTHER NOTE ON BROTHERS

If it seemed a little familiar to see a player with "FINLEY" on the back of his jersey in the last outing at UNC, it's because it hasn't been that long since another player by that name was in that same position for the Wolfpack.

True freshman Ben Finley came off the bench to play 33 snaps at UNC, moving the offense down the field twice (once resulting in a TD and once resulting in a bobbled pass in the endzone that was picked off).

Ben's older brother Ryan - who now plays for the Cincinnati Bengals - holds the school record for career completion percentage (.645), and ranks second in passing yards (10,505), second in completions (881) and fourth in touchdowns (60). Finley was the Wolfpack starter from 2016-18.

Incidentally, senior wide receiver Emeka Emezie has caught a touchdown pass from *both* of the Finleys.

### GIVE A DAWG A BONE

Defensive coordinator Tony Gibson says he wants 'dawgs' on his defense,

aka tenacious, relentless, aggressive players. To commemorate those who play with those characteristics, the defensive staff introduced TAKEAWAY BONE in the win at Virginia.

When a Wolfpack defender recovers a fumble or intercepts a pass, the BONE comes out on the sideline. The player who got the takeaway signs it and at the end of the season, whoever has signed it the most times gets to keep the bone.

### YOUTH IS SECONDARY

If the Wolfpack defense is a bunch of 'dawgs', then the secondary is a group of puppies.

There have been only two seniors (Val Martin and Daniel Joseph) in the playing rotation on defense this season and Joseph has been the only senior to start on the defensive side of the ball (five games).

The only two upperclassman to see any significant action in the secondary this season are juniors Tyler Baker-Williams and Tanner Ingle, and that duo has missed a combined 35 of 88 quarters played through the first 10 games.

### THICK SIX

When junior nose tackle Alim McNeill tipped a pass, caught it and then rumbled 18-yards for a touchdown in the win over Virginia, it drew national attention. Everybody loves a seeing the big guy score (when center Garrett Bradbury - a first-round draft pick of the Minnesota Vikings ran for a score vs. ECU in 2018 it became the stuff of legends) but McNeill's highlight was shown on every outlet following the game.

It marked the first time since 2015 that a Wolfpack defensive lineman scored a touchdown since Darian Roseboro returned an interception 20 yards for a score vs. Syracuse in 2015.

### EXPERIENCED LEADERS

Dave Doeren has almost completely revamped his coaching staff over the past two seasons. In fact, only one assistant coach - WR coach George McDonald - was at NC State prior to 2019.

Prior to last season, Doeren brought in co-DC Tony Gibson, TE/FB coach Todd Goebbel, OL coach John Garrison and QB coach Kurt Roper. After the 2019 campaign, Gibson took over as sole defensive coordinator, and heads an entirely new defensive staff: Charley Wiles (DL), Joe DeForest (SAF), Brian Mitchell (CB) and Freddie Aughtry-Lindsay (NIC). On offense, Roper moved over to running backs and OC Tim Beck joined the staff.

The Wolfpack's 10 assistant coaches boast 250 years of combined experience - *two and a half CENTURIES!*

### GOOD WORKS GILL

Back in April, when NC State students had been sent home and football had come to an abrupt halt, Pack punter Trenton Gill was thinking about ways he could help those in need. The junior record-setter wanted to help small businesses in his hometown of Hillsborough that were struggling through the shutdown, but he also wanted to help families who were struggling to pay bills and buy groceries. He came up with a way to do both!

Gill decided he would raise money to buy meals from restaurants in Hillsborough that were struggling, and then donate the meals to families in need.

He started a GoFundMe page to raise donations. Then he partnered with OCIM (Orange Congregations in Missions) to identify families who would

benefit from the meals. Then he contacted *eight* different local restaurants. By the time he was finished, his efforts ended up purchasing more than 1,000 meals - giving much needed business to those eight establishments and feeding many families.

Because of his efforts, Gill was named to the Allstate AFCA Good Works Teams® for 2020 - marking the third time in the past four seasons that NC State has had a player recognized on that prestigious team (A.J. Cole, III in 2017, James Smith-Williams in 2019).

### QBU

NC State IS #QBU - it's not even debatable. Five former Wolfpack signal callers are on 2020 NFL rosters. Those five have a combined 35 years of experience playing in the NFL, with 409 career starts among them entering 2020.

Russell Wilson (a three-year starter and graduate of NC State) has started every single game since his NFL career started in 2012, and has made two Super Bowl appearances with the Seattle Seahawks.

Philip Rivers is in his 17th NFL season, including his 15th as a starter, but 2020 is with a new team as he signed as a free agent with the Indianapolis Colts.

Jacoby Brissett is the backup to Rivers in Indianapolis this season, after he started 15 games last season for the Colts. As a rookie with Cincinnati last season, Ryan Finley started three games. Mike Glennon is in his seventh NFL season as the backup in Jacksonville.

During the 2019 NFL season, NC State led all other schools with four alums to start at QB during the season (Cal and Oklahoma each boasted two).

### NO. 1

Since 2014, NC State head coach Dave Doeren has honored a member of the Wolfpack squad by giving them the No. 1 jersey. For 2019, redshirt junior linebacker Isaiah Moore, who has also been elected a team captain, will don that special number.

Moore is only the second underclassman to earn the privilege (Jaylen Samuels wore the No. 1 jersey as a junior and senior). He returns in 2020 for this third year as a starter and was the third-leading tackler on the team last season.

Moore has also been the de facto leader of the team's involvement in the #PackUnited movement, which stands out against racial violence and social justice.

### RUFFIN IT:

One of the bright spots of a bizarre offseason in 2020 was that head coach Dave Doeren was able to bring his mentor and friend Ruffin McNeill to his staff. McNeill, one of the most well-liked and respected people in college football, is serving as the special assistant to the head coach and has been a great resource for Doeren as well as the entire program.

Doeren has known McNeill, who boasts four decades of coaching experience, for more than 20 years and their professional paths have crossed several times. When Doeren was a graduate assistant at USC in 1999, McNeill was the defensive line coach at nearby Fresno State. The two coached in the Big 12 together from 2002-05 - Doeren at Kansas and McNeill at Texas Tech - and for Doeren's first three years at NC State, McNeill was the head coach at East Carolina.

McNeill most recently served as the assistant head coach at Oklahoma, where he led the defensive tackles and outside linebackers during his

three seasons with the program. He also served as defensive coordinator for much of the 2018 campaign. He left the program in January in order to return to North Carolina to help care for his elderly father.

He was the head coach at East Carolina, his alma mater for six seasons (2010-15). He posted a 42-34 record at ECU and his Pirates' teams played in four bowl games and beat Ohio 37-20 in the 2013 Beef O'Brady's Bowl.

# CARTER-FINLEY STADIUM

One of the landmarks of North Carolina's capital city, Carter-Finley Stadium has gained a national reputation as being one of the toughest places to play. The home of the Wolfpack, which celebrated its 50th birthday in 2016, boasts 57,600 permanent seats and is surrounded by acres of convenient parking.

The playing surface at Carter-Finley Stadium was reconstructed in 2009. Named for Wolfpack alumnus Wayne T. Day in 2002, it is built to USGA specifications for a golf green.

The south end zone is the home of the 103,254 square-foot Murphy Center, which is the football team's home for training and preparation.

NC State practices just a stone's throw away at the Wolfpack Practice Complex and the mammoth Close-King Indoor Practice Facility. The outdoor complex covers seven acres and boasts three full fields, a training room, restrooms and a video/coaching tower. The indoor facility boasts a full, 120-yard football field and roof height sufficient for kicking game, with suspended goal posts, additional training and conditioning space beyond both end zones

The A.E. Finley Fieldhouse in the north end zone houses two spacious, state-of-the-art locker rooms that can be divided into smaller locker rooms when NC State plays host to high school championship games. There are also halftime locker room areas for the cheerleaders, the dance team, game referees and coaches.

# HEAD COACH DAVE DOEREN

- In his eighth season at NC State, his 10th season as a head coach overall.
- Is tied for second among the longest tenured coaches in NC State history behind Earle Edwards (17, 1954-70) and Beattie Feathers (8, 1944-51).
- Ranks third in Wolfpack history in coaching victories.
- In the past three seasons, has had 13 players drafted by the NFL - including an ACC-best seven in 2017. That was the sixth-highest total nationally.
- 257 members of his Wolfpack teams have earned their degrees.
- NC State has boasted 26 Academic All-ACC performers under his guidance and in 2018, Ryan Finley was named to the prestigious NFF National Scholar-Athlete Team.
- With nine victories, the 2018 Wolfpack was one of just six teams in the 126-year history of NC State football to post nine or more regular season wins. It marked the first time since 1991-92 that State posted back-to-back nine-win seasons (only the third time in school history).
- His teams qualified for five consecutive bowl games - the second-longest bowl streak in school history.
- Has coached bowl eligible teams in 14 of his 18 years in Division I.
- One of his players has won one of college football's national award in 2017 and 2018: Bradley Chubb (2017 Nagurski & Hendricks) and Garrett Bradbury (2018 Rimington).
- In 2014, the Wolfpack posted its best rushing average since 1992.
- Members of his teams have turned in over 8,000 collective hours of community service during his tenure at NC State.
- Led Northern Illinois to the most successful two years in program history.
- His first Husky squad won the school's first MAC Championship since 1983 and tied the school record with 11 wins.
- His 2012 NIU team repeated as league champ and set a new school mark with 12 victories, earning a trip to the Orange Bowl - the first BCS berth ever for a MAC school.
- Was a finalist for several national coach of the year awards in 2012.
- NIU boasted the nation's longest conference winning streak (17) and never lost a home game during his tenure.
- Spend five seasons in the Big Ten, serving as defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at Wisconsin.
- The Badgers posted a 49-15 mark while he was on staff.
- Spent four seasons at Kansas and was on staff when the Jayhawks ended a seven-year bowl drought.
- In 2000 and 2001, coached the secondary at NCAA Division I-AA powerhouse Montana. The Grizzlies advanced to the national title game in 2000, losing by two points, but returned in 2001 to win the championship.
- Montana posted a 28-3 record and won two Big Sky titles during his tenure.
- Planned to go to medical school following college and become an orthopedic surgeon. He took the MCAT but after helping coach high school between his junior and senior years, fell in love with coaching.
- Lettered at tight end at Drake and was an Academic All-American.
- Earned his undergraduate degree in pre-medical biology. Earned his master's from Drake in educational leadership and began work on a Ph.D. while serving as a graduate assistant at the University of Southern California.
