#### SEASON IN REVIEW

With major roster turnover and a unique season due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Kentucky suffered its second losing season since 1927 and missed the NCAA Tournament for only the second time in the 12-season John Calipari era

Due to injuries to Keion Brooks Jr. and Terrence Clarke, UK played just one game -- the final game of the season -- with its full complement of scholarship players

The Wildcats were in just about every game and led in the second half in 12 of their 16 losses

Kentucky outscored its opponents by 65 points over the first 36 minutes of games but was minus-63 in the final four minutes of regulation (does not count any of the overtime periods vs. Mississippi State in the regular-season matchup)

Davion Mintz led UK in total scoring (288 points) and 3-pointers (56) and averaged 16.7 points over the final six games with a combined 24 treys

Isaiah Jackson led the SEC and ranked 15th nationally with 2.6 blocks per game en route to SEC All-Defensive and All-Freshman Team honors

Brandon Boston Jr., Terrence Clarke, Olivier Sarr and Isaiah Jackson declared for the NBA Draft following the season. Jackson has left open the option to return to school after going through the NBA Draft process

UK currently has four newcomers slated to join the team for next season with freshmen Daimion Collins, Nolan Hickman and Bryce Hopkins, plus graduate transfer Kellan Grady, a 2,000-point scorer at Davidson. UK added West Virginia transfer Oscar Tshiebwe in January

# POLLS, STATS, MEDIA INFO

## Media Information

### CREDENTIAL REQUESTS

Requests for single-game credentials should be made as far in advance as possible and no later than five days prior to game day online at [sportssystem.com/Kentucky](http://sportssystem.com/Kentucky).

### CREDENTIAL CRITERIA

The University of Kentucky's decision to issue credentials to a media outlet for the purposes of covering a UK basketball home or away event is determined by a variety of factors. They include the following:

- Amount of coverage given to Kentucky throughout the season
- Intention/ability to cover all 22 sports at Kentucky
- Distribution/size of publication: free, subscription, sale on newsstands, website traffic, etc.
- Radio or TV station program format and size of audience
- Length of existence of the publication, amount of original copy generated, number of full-time employees of the publication and the journalistic experience of the reporter(s)
- Attendance at Kentucky media sessions, including Olympic sport opportunities
- Space availability
- Professionalism, which includes but is not limited to conduct at games, press conferences, practices, on social media, etc.

The University of Kentucky has the right to revoke credentials under its own discretion.

### INTERVIEW POLICIES-GENERAL

All interviews with University of Kentucky basketball players or staff members must be arranged through the Communications and public relations office. Media should never contact a player or coach directly.

The Wildcat Coal Lodge, dormitories, team locker rooms and other team quarters are private team areas. Media members are not permitted in these areas unless accompanied by appropriate university personnel.

### PRACTICE/PRESS CONFERENCES

Other than announced exceptions, UK basketball practices are closed to the media. UK will accept requests to attend practice. All requests must be made by 10 a.m. the day before the practice. In cases in which practices are open to the media, no cell phones are allowed in the practice facility.

Player interviews are conducted prior to practices the day before a game and will be available to all UK media in the Joe Craft Center lower-level lobby. UK will accept requests for player interviews, but they must be submitted 24 hours prior to the scheduled availability.

Coach John Calipari or an assistant coach will meet with members of the media immediately following player interviews in the lower level lobby of the Joe Craft Center.

Game-day shoot-arounds are closed to the media.

### TELEPHONE PLAYER INTERVIEWS

Telephone interviews are available to the media on a call-back basis. Individual player and coach telephone numbers will not be given to members of the media.

Players are instructed not to conduct interviews when contacted directly by telephone. The communications and public relations office will arrange for telephone interviews at a time most convenient for the student-athlete.

Other special requests are handled on a case-by-case basis.

### POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Following each game, there is a cooling-off period, during which time the players shower and dress. Approximately 10 minutes after the game ends, Coach Calipari conducts his postgame press conference while a player is taken to the UK Sports Network.

Following Coach Calipari's press conference and the cooling-off period, selected UK players are brought to the media interview room.

## Despite Record, Wildcats Showed Signs of Improvement

The winningest program in college basketball does not accept moral victories. After going 9-16, posting the program's second losing record since 1927 and missing the NCAA Tournament, there is no other way to slice the season other than a disappointment.

"At the end of the day, we know this is Kentucky and it was unacceptable what just happened for the season," said John Calipari, who experienced just his second losing campaign in 29 seasons as a college head coach. "We can put it on COVID, no summer. We could do whatever we want to do. New guys, Keion (Brooks Jr.) didn't play, blah, blah, blah. It's still unacceptable."

There were so many could haves (struggling to close out games in the final four minutes), should haves (UK led in the second half in 12 of the 16 losses) and would haves (the Wildcats played just one game, the final one of the season, with its full complement of scholarship players), but ultimately UK simply fell short of every measure the program measures itself up to.

Having said that, Calipari walked away at the end of the season with a sense of pride for the kids and the staff because they never stopped fighting.

"All these kids have been through and they never stopped," Calipari said. "They gave us an effort every night in practice, every game. We were lacking and flawed in different ways as a team, but they fought. I would say disappointed in the record but not disappointed in these kids."

The fight showed over the course of the season, even if it didn't always show in the final results that mattered.

Although it won't make up for the bottom line of a historically down season, the staff and players could take pride in the improvements they showed over the course of 2020-21 season. A snapshot of those:

- The Wildcats averaged 72.6 points over the final 18 games. They averaged 64.9 points in the first seven nonconference games
- UK shot 36.5% from 3 in league play and the Southeastern Conference Tournament. In the first seven games, UK shot 25% from long range
- The Wildcats made 75.3% at the free-throw line over the final 18 games. In the first seven games, they shot 66.2% at the charity stripe
- UK averaged 6.3 rejections per game in league play and the SEC Tournament. In the first seven games, UK averaged 5.0 blocks per contest
- Kentucky held two of seven nonconference foes to 40% or less from the field. UK limited 10 of 18 opponents to 40% or less after that
- The Wildcats scored at least a point per possession in 10 of their final 18 games. They did it just once in the seven nonconference matchups

## Clarke Dies in Car Accident at 19 Years Old

Terrence Clarke died on April 22 after sustaining fatal injuries from a car accident in Los Angeles. He was 19 years old.

Clarke had recently completed his freshman season at UK and was preparing for the 2021 NBA Draft.

"(Clarke's) heart was overflowing with love for his family, his friends and his teammates," John Calipari said. "He was as caring of a person as I have ever coached. His enthusiasm and energy – not just for basketball, for life – are what we all hope to have in our journey. Terrence had figured that part out – that if you wake up every day with a smile on your face and a joy in everything you do, this life is beautiful. ... I loved Terrence Clarke and I was hard on Terrence Clarke. I made sure he knew both because I would tell him. I wanted what was best for him, and there is no doubt in my mind that he was headed towards greatness."

Clarke announced in March that he was pursuing his dreams of playing professional basketball and had declared for the NBA Draft. Despite missing most of the 2020-21 season with an injury, Clarke remained a talented prospect with a bright future.

"As an adolescent, having the privilege to put on the Kentucky uniform and play in front of the BBN was always a lifelong goal of mine," Clarke said last month when he declared for the NBA Draft. "Although it was hindered due to things out of my own control, the experience is something I will keep with me forever. I have grown a lot with this experience and I will never take it for granted. ... Thank you to Coach Cal, the coaching staff and my teammates. BBN, I hope to make you all proud as I pursue my dreams."

Clarke was limited to eight games in his lone season with Kentucky in 2020-21 because of a right leg injury. He made six starts and averaged 9.6 points, 2.6 rebounds and 2.0 assists per game.

The 6-foot-7 guard scored in double figures in four of his first five games and was shooting 49.1% prior to the North Carolina game, when he suffered his leg injury. Clarke played through the injury vs. UNC and the next game at Louisville before being sidelined for the conference season.

Despite missing more than two months of action, Clarke battled back to provide support and depth for his teammates in the Southeastern Conference Tournament game vs. Mississippi State.

Clarke's on-court UK highlights included a 22-point, three-assist game vs. Georgia Tech in early December. He was 9 of 14 from the floor with three 3-pointers. Clarke also scored 15 points and grabbed six rebounds vs. Richmond, posted 14 points with three assists vs. Notre Dame, and made his college debut with 12 points, four assists and three steals in the rout of Morehead State.

Clarke signed with Kentucky out of Boston as one of the top prospects in the 2020 high school class. A consensus five-star prospect, he was ranked as high as No. 8 in the final Rivals rankings.

The 2020 England Preparatory School Athletic Council AAA Player of the Year led Brewster Academy to the 2019 National Prep Championships and had his team back in the 2020 finals before the COVID-19 pandemic canceled the rest of the event.

Clarke is survived by his parents, Osmin Clarke and Adrian Briggs, and his three siblings, Tatyana Gray, Gavin Clarke and Madison Adrienne.

## Wildcats Land Transfers Grady, Tshiebwe

West Virginia transfer Oscar Tshiebwe, a formidable and productive forward with great size, signed with Kentucky in mid-January and joined the team on campus on Feb. 1. He began practicing with the team soon after clearing COVID-19 medical protocols. Then in late March, UK added graduate transfer Kellan Grady, who averaged at least 17.1 points in all four seasons at Davidson. He will join UK this summer after finishing up his degree at Davidson.

A look at the two additions:

### Kellan Grady

Grady, a 6-foot-5 guard, will join Kentucky after scoring more than 2,000 points in four seasons at Davidson.

Under NCAA graduate transfer rules, Grady will be eligible to play for the Wildcats in the fall after graduating from Davidson with an undergraduate degree in sociology. He is expected to graduate in May.

Grady will be Kentucky's fourth graduate transfer over the last four seasons. UK added Reid Travis from Stanford for the 2018-19 season, Nate Sestina from Bucknell for 2019-20 and Davion Mintz from Creighton this past season. Travis helped anchor a frontcourt that went to the 2019 Elite Eight, Sestina provided valuable depth and timely shooting for the 2020 Southeastern Conference champions, and Mintz was Kentucky's leading scorer and 3-point shooter in 2020-21.

"Kellan has established himself as one of the best players in the country," John Calipari said. "His size, his skills, his scoring ability and his playmaking ability speak volumes to the player that he is. Kellan played in a great program under a terrific coach, Bob McKillop. He is a four-year starter whose toughness and fight will add to our team. His game-to-game consistency – his scoring, his ability to share the ball and his defense – is part of what makes him special, and we are ecstatic to have him join a team that was close last season but needed what he gives us to get over to the top."

Grady was a prolific scorer at Davidson who scored 2,002 career points on 47.2% career shooting. With 240 career 3-pointers, Grady made at least 51 treys in all four seasons and shot a career-best 38.2% from behind the arc in 2020-21. He has 21 games with at least four 3-pointers. Grady reached the 2,000-point milestone in Davidson's final game of 2020-21 and was the sixth player in program history to achieve the mark.

The Boston native was one of the Atlantic 10's best players from the start of his college career. Grady is a four-time All-A-10 selection, including a two-time first-team pick. He won A-10 Player of the Week five times in his Davidson career in addition to five A-10 Rookie of the Week honors in his breakthrough 2017-18 campaign. Grady was named A-10 Rookie of the Year that season.

Grady averaged 17.4 points in his time at Davidson, scoring 18.0 points per game his freshman season, 17.3 as a sophomore, 17.2 as a junior and 17.1 this past season. With an ability to play either guard position, he averaged 4.6 rebounds and 2.4 assists per game in 2020-21.

The scoring consistency of Grady will be a welcomed addition to UK, which posted its lowest scoring average and field-goal percentage in the 12-season Calipari era. Grady has scored in double figures 96 times in his career, 20 or more points 44 times and 30 or more six times. His career high is 39 points, set his freshman season.

Davidson posted a winning record in all four seasons with Grady on the roster, including an NCAA Tournament appearance in 2018 that coincidentally pitted him vs. Kentucky in the first round. He scored 16 points in the 78-73 loss.

Grady was a top-70 prospect (Rivals and 247Sports) out of high school. He was an all-state selection out of Northfield Mount Hermon School.

### Oscar Tshiebwe

Under NCAA transfer rules, Tshiebwe, a 6-9, 260-pound forward with a 7-5 wingspan, was not eligible for competition for the remainder of the 2020-21 season after transferring to UK.

Tshiebwe made an instant impact at West Virginia, playing and starting in all 31 games as a freshman. He led the Mountaineers in scoring (11.2 points per game), rebounding (9.3 boards per game) and blocks (1.0) in 23.3 minutes per game, helping guide West Virginia to a 21-10 record. He shot 55.2% from the floor and 70.8% from the free-throw line.

"We recruited Oscar two years ago and absolutely fell in love with his effort, his energy and his desire to improve," Calipari said. "Oscar has a rare combination of strength and skill with tremendous length, not to mention he's a wonderful kid. There is no question his time at West Virginia was well spent playing for a terrific coach and friend in Bob Huggins."

Tshiebwe was named to the All-Big 12 Second Team and was a unanimous selection to the Big 12 All-Freshman Team. He also made the Big 12 All-Newcomer Team, the National Association of Basketball Coaches District 8 First Team, the U.S. Basketball Writers Association District II Team and the Academic Big 12 All-Rookie Team.

The Congo native scored in double figures in a team-high 19 games and posted 10 double-doubles in his freshman season. He was first in the Big 12 in offensive rebounds per game with 4.1, second in rebounding and led the country in offensive rebounding percentage (19.0%).

Tshiebwe was off to another solid start this past season, his sophomore season, averaging 8.5 points on 52.3% shooting in addition to 7.8 rebounds. In his last game, on Dec. 29, he recorded 12 points and 15 rebounds in 21 minutes.

Prior to West Virginia, Tshiebwe was considered a five-star prospect by Rivals and 247Sports. He was a McDonald's All American after leading Kennedy Catholic High School (Hermitage, Pennsylvania) to a 27-3 record and the Pennsylvania 6A state title as a senior.

Tshiebwe averaged 23.2 points as a senior and scored 1,480 points during his high school career. He was the 2019 Gatorade Pennsylvania Boys Basketball Player of the Year.

Originally from Lubumbashi, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Tshiebwe is the third undergraduate transfer the Wildcats have welcomed in the last calendar year. Senior forward Olivier Sarr transferred from Wake Forest and sophomore forward Jacob Toppin came from Rhode Island. They both established key roles with the 2020-21 Kentucky team.

### Boston, Clarke, Sarr Declare; Jackson 'Testing Waters'

Four Wildcats from the 2020-21 team -- Brandon Boston Jr., Terrence Clarke, Isaiah Jackson and Olivier Sarr -- declared for the NBA Draft after the season with one -- Jackson -- leaving open the option of a return.

Boston, Clarke and Sarr announced they were entering the draft and forfeiting their collegiate eligibility.

Jackson's scenario, at this time, is a bit different. When he announced his intentions in March, he indicated he plans to go through the draft evaluation process but is open to the possibility of a return.

Jackson will have some time to explore his options. The NBA recently announced the 2021 NBA Draft will take place July 29 and the NBA Combine will be June 21-27. Under NCAA rules, Jackson will have until July 7 to make a final decision as to whether he wishes to remain in the draft or return to Kentucky. He can sign with an NCAA-certified agent and receive feedback during that process.

Davion Mintz could also enter the draft. Although Mintz was a graduate student this season, he has the option to return to Kentucky with the NCAA's

additional COVID season of eligibility. He has not revealed his plans at this point.

Kentucky's current draft-eligible Wildcats all played key roles in the 2020-21 season.

Boston tied Mintz with a team-best 11.5 scoring average and 17 games in double figures. He led the team in steals and made 23 3-pointers over the final 12 games after making seven in the first 13.

Clarke's season was significantly shortened by a right leg injury that forced him to miss all of the Southeastern Conference regular season. Prior to getting injured, he was one of the Wildcats' leading scorers with double-figure scoring performances in four of his first five games. He died tragically April 22 in a car crash in Los Angeles at the age of 19.

Jackson quickly emerged as one of the best young frontcourt players in the country. The forward ranked 15th in the country and first in the SEC with 2.6 blocks per game. He developed into an offensive threat late in the season and scored in double figures in six straight games to end the regular season. He also grabbed 6.6 rebounds per game.

Sarr played a central part in UK's season both on and off the court. One of three team captains, Sarr averaged 10.8 points, 5.2 rebounds and 1.2 blocks per game and led the team with three double-doubles. He scored in double figures in nine of the final 12 game of the season with three straight performances of 14 points or more to end 2020-21.

Since John Calipari joined the Kentucky program for the 2009-10 season, UK has produced 41 NBA Draft picks over 11 seasons, far and away more than any other school. Included in the 41 are 31 first-rounders, three No. 1 overall picks and 21 lottery selections.

Of the 28 players at UK who have declared for the NBA Draft after their freshman seasons under Calipari, 26 have been first-round picks (and all 28 have played in an NBA game). Calipari is 30 for 32 in that regard when including his players from Memphis.

Of the 66 players who have finished their college careers at Kentucky under Calipari (through the 2019-20 season), 41 were selected in the NBA Draft, a 62.1% success rate. Another six of those made the NBA, and the majority of the rest were walk-ons.

Calipari's players are not only reaching the next level, they are succeeding when they do. Since 2010, eight of his players have garnered 26 All-Star selections. Derrick Rose (from Memphis) was named league MVP in 2011. Five of his players have been tabbed All-NBA (Rose, John Wall, Anthony Davis, DeMarcus Cousins and Karl-Anthony Towns), three have been named NBA Rookie of the Year (Rose, Tyreke Evans and Towns), and 14 players from Calipari's first 10 teams at Kentucky have made the NBA All-Rookie teams.

## Wildcats Ink Three in Fall Signing Period

In a year where a lot changed, one thing remained a constant: John Calipari and his staff can recruit better than anyone else, signing three of the nation's top players in the early fall signing period. Highly rated prospects Daimion Collins, Bryce Hopkins and Nolan Hickman all inked national letters of intent with UK in November.

All three players are consensus four- or five-star prospects and are ranked in the top 50 by at least one major national service. They will join the program for the 2021-22 season. Collins and Hickman were named 2021 McDonald's All Americans.

"Our fans have heard me talk a lot about what it means to be 'Built Different.' When you talk about this fall class, you've got three kids who are built to play here at Kentucky," Calipari said. "They wanted to be a part of this culture. They wanted to play against other really good players. They didn't need any promises or guarantees – only the promise that this is going to be the hardest thing they've ever done and that we will challenge them to become the best version of themselves.

"This place isn't for everybody and it takes a certain type of player – a 'Built Different' mentality – to come here and be in this competitive environment. These three are ready to take that step."

With the spring signing period still to go, UK is going to be in the mix for one of the top classes in the nation again. Rivals and 247 Sports ranked UK No. 3 following the fall signing period.

In every season in the Calipari era, the Wildcats have signed a top-three recruiting class according to the Recruiting Services Consensus Index, which tallies major recruiting rankings and plugs them into a formula to calculate a consensus ranking. With the fall additions, Kentucky has signed 62 top-50 recruits, 47 top-25 players and 26 top-10 players (according to Rivals) in what will now be Calipari's 13 recruiting classes at Kentucky.

UK can only comment on prospective student-athletes who have signed official paperwork to play at Kentucky.

Barbee departed UK after an impactful seven seasons in Lexington, where he served as a special assistant to the head coach in his first season, assistant coach for the next five years and associate to the head coach this past season.

In every position, Barbee played a major role in the strategy and game planning of an impressive run that included 187 wins, five NCAA Tournament appearances, a Final Four berth, three Elite Eight runs, four Southeastern Conference regular-season championships and four SEC Tournament titles.

"The last seven seasons at Kentucky have been incredible," Barbee said. "To have the opportunity to coach at a historic and tradition-rich school like Kentucky has been a dream come true, and I want to thank Coach Cal and Mitch Barnhart for placing their faith in me to be a part of this storied program.

"From the moment I first put on that jersey as a player at UMass through my time at Memphis and most recently at Kentucky as an assistant, Coach Cal has been a mentor to me. I have learned so much from him, and the players-first approach that we have instilled at every place we have been together will carry on with me at Central Michigan. I want to thank Mitch Barnhart for giving me the opportunity to work and grow as a coach.

"I will always cherish the incredible friends and memories we built over the last seven seasons. I enjoyed every second of it. Thank you to the Big Blue Nation for all of your love and support."

Barbee has been a part of John Calipari's Hall of Fame career both as a player and as a

coach. Barbee was an important player in the remarkable turnaround at UMass in the early 1990s and served as an assistant in all three of Calipari's college head coaching stops at UMass, Memphis and UK.

"Tony is one of the best coaches I have ever coached with or against," Calipari said. "He has an unbelievable basketball mind. The game plans that he put together for us, especially on defense, were second to none. I have known him since he was 15 and I know how much this game means to him. He is my brother and always will be. I expect big things to happen for Central Michigan and their players under Tony's leadership. He is ready for this and I look forward to watching his success."

Barbee completed his seventh season with the Kentucky men's basketball program and his first as the associate to the head coach in 2020-21. After playing a key role in Kentucky's game management and Xs and Os as an assistant for five seasons, he took on an increased responsibility in game planning, scouting opponents, and helping Calipari formulate the team's approach in practices and in games this past season.

As an assistant coach, Barbee took on the role of UK's defensive specialist on the bench, solidifying Kentucky as one of the best defensive teams in the country on an annual basis. In addition to his coaching and on-court development with players, Barbee helped secure a top-three recruiting class in every season, including the No. 1 hauls in 2016, 2017 and 2020, as designated by the Recruiting Services Consensus Index.

In his five seasons as an assistant coach, UK went to the NCAA Tournament in every season (the 2020 tournament was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic) and sent a combined 13 players to the NBA Draft with 10 first-round picks and eight lottery selections.

During the 2014-15 season, Barbee served as the special assistant to the head coach, where he assisted Calipari in a variety of roles, including game-plan preparation, practice plans and administrative duties within everyday basketball operations. With Barbee's help, the Wildcats enjoyed one of the best seasons in program history, becoming the first team in NCAA history to begin a season 38-0 while claiming the SEC regular-season and tournament crowns, advancing to the program's fourth Final Four in five seasons, and helping six players go in the NBA Draft.

Barbee was previously the head coach at UTEP and at Auburn. During his four-year tenure at the helm of the Miners program, starting with the 2006-07 season, Barbee averaged 20.5 wins per season and exceeded his win total from year to year. His most prolific season at UTEP was his last, in which he led the Miners to a 26-7 overall record, a Conference USA regular-season title and an NCAA Tournament appearance in 2010.

Barbee became Auburn's head coach prior to the start of the 2010-11 season. He spent four seasons as the head coach of the Tigers.

As a head coach, Barbee has a 131-127 record.

## Justus Accepts Assistant Coach Position at Arizona State

Joel Justus accepted an assistant coach position at Arizona State and departed UK after seven successful seasons on staff.

Justus joined UK for the 2014-15 season and made an immediate impression, first imple-

menting a more analytics-focused approach to the program in his first two seasons and then quickly growing into one of the nation's top young recruiters and on-court teachers as an assistant coach for five seasons.

With Justus on staff, UK totaled 187 wins, five NCAA Tournament appearances, a Final Four berth, three Elite Eight runs, four Southeastern Conference regular-season championships and four SEC Tournament titles over the last seven seasons.

"It is hard for me to believe that my time at Kentucky has come to an end," Justus said. "The memories I have of this place, the players I have been fortunate enough to coach and form lifelong relationships with, and the honor I have had to coach at the winningest program in college basketball is something I will never take for granted. It has been the opportunity of a lifetime.

"With that said, this was a challenge and an opportunity at Arizona State under Bobby Hurlley that I felt like was in the best interest of my career as I continue to chase my dreams in the coaching profession. I want to thank Coach Calipari for taking the chance on me seven years ago to work for the greatest tradition in college basketball and learn at the highest level. I also want to thank Mitch Barnhart for entrusting me with playing a part in this program to lead our student-athletes.

"Kentucky will always hold a special place in my heart. To the young men I have had the privilege of coaching at Kentucky, you will always be family."

Justus has solidified himself as one of the top young assistants in the country. The Athletic tabbed Justus as one of the top 40 people in college basketball under 40 and ESPN named him one of the nation's top 40 coaches less than 40 years old in 2020.

"Joel talked to me about this opportunity to be at Arizona State with a terrific coach in Bobby Hurlley to be the top assistant," John Calipari said. "He had my blessing, but I want to make sure we all recognize that we are losing someone who was a big, big part of all our success over the last several years. From Shai Gilgeous-Alexander to Keldon Johnson to Immanuel Quickley and others, Joel was not only the point guy with some of our players who became special, he helped develop them, teach them and challenge them. I wish him the best and I will always be a great supporter of his."

Justus joined the staff for the historic 2014-15 season as the director of analytics. Using Justus' analytics, Kentucky's players bought in to a two-platoon system that helped the Wildcats become one of the most efficient teams in the country, including the most dominant defensive team in recent history, as UK became the first team in college basketball history to start a season 38-0.

Justus analyzed player and team performance, utilizing various stats and data to help develop efficient strategies through video. He developed tools that streamlined the decision-making process of the coaching staff using advanced statistical modeling and analysis.

Justus also analyzed large data sets to aid the coaching staff's scouting reports as well as postgame analysis. He assisted in day-to-day operations of the program, which included coordinating with NBA personnel while assisting in many areas of basketball operations.

After successfully integrating analytics into the daily culture of the program, he was ele-

vated to special assistant to the head coach for the 2015-16 season. With his previous responsibilities remaining an active part of his duties, Justus' role expanded to include scouting future opponents, providing strategies to help advance the program and assisting with special projects assigned by Calipari.

In his first season as an assistant coach, Kentucky won both the SEC regular-season and tournament championships while advancing to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament. He played a key part in securing what the Recruiting Services Consensus Index calculates as the best recruiting class ever in 2017 and the No. 1 class in 2020.

In 2017-18, he was instrumental in the development of Gilgeous-Alexander, who developed from a rather overlooked piece of UK's 2017 signing class into the SEC Tournament's most valuable player as UK won its fourth straight tournament championship.

During the 2018-19 season, as Kentucky advanced to another Elite Eight, Justus played a major role in the development of SEC Co-Defensive Player of the Year Ashton Hagans. He also worked closely with NBA first-round picks Keldon Johnson and Tyler Herro. Justus played a similar role with Quickley, the 2020 SEC Player of this Year, and Tyrese Maxey, both first-round picks.

Justus came to UK after serving as the head coach at Davidson Day High School in Davidson, North Carolina. In both years at the helm, he guided the Patriots to the Elite Eight in the state tournament.

Prior to his time at Davidson Day, Justus served as the head boys' basketball coach at Woodberry Forest School in Woodberry, Virginia, from 2008-12. During his time at Woodberry Forest, he guided his team to the Virginia Prep League regular-season championship in 2010 while advancing to the Virginia Prep League championship game in consecutive years, a first in more than two decades.

Justus also spent time as an assistant coach at Elon University from 2004-08, where he helped guide the Phoenix to a Northern Division title in 2006 and the Southern Conference championship game in 2008.

## Mr. Jackson Was For Real

The blocked shots standard at Kentucky starts and stops with Anthony Davis.

In 2011-12, en route to nearly every major national player of the year award, the freshman blocked 186 shots, smashing the previous school record held by Andre Riddick and Melvin Turpin and threatening the NCAA Division I mark.

Just a year later, Nerlens Noel was on pace to challenge the record before a knee injury ended his season early. And coincidentally, just a season after that, Willie Cauley-Stein put up formidable numbers. They are the only players in school history with 100 or more blocks in a single season. Since those three players left for the pros, Kentucky hasn't had the type of elite rim protection that those three provided.

Enter Isaiah Jackson. The freshman forward was one of the nation's best rim protectors in 2020-21 -- and by the end of the season he became a pretty good offensive player too.

Jackson swatted 65 shots this season to lead the nation's No. 3 shot-blocking team. He ranked 15th nationally in blocks per game with 2.6 swats per contest and led the Southeastern Conference.

Jackson's block total obviously fell well behind UK's all-time best shot blockers because of fewer games and fewer minutes because of frequent foul trouble (5.2 fouls per 40 minutes and six foul outs), but his block percentage was in line with the Kentucky greats, Davis, Noel and Cauley-Stein.

The Pontiac, Michigan, native finished with a block percentage of 12.7%, ranked eighth in the country. For UK perspective, Davis had a 13.8 block percentage during the 2011-12 season, Noel posted a 13.2 in 2012-13 and Cauley-Stein was at 12.3 during 2013-14. Jackson also posted 5.0 blocks per 40 minutes, not far behind Davis (5.8) and Noel (5.5).

Jackson notched nine games with three or more blocks and led the Wildcats in blocks in 20 of 25 games. He swatted seven shots in just 23 minutes at home vs. Alabama, and in the second game of the season, vs. Kansas, Jackson blocked eight shots, the most for a UK player since Cauley-Stein had nine against Boise State on Dec. 10, 2013. The eight swats are also the most ever by a Wildcat against an Associated Press top-10 opponent in program history.

The bouncy forward did much more than just block shots for the Wildcats however.

Jackson's offensive game really developed throughout the sea-

son and he evolved into one of the Wildcats' best threats late in the year. He scored in double figures in six straight games to conclude the regular season and averaged 14.3 points per game and shot 65.1% in that span.

When he could consistently stay on the floor, Jackson was also an elite rebounder. He pulled in 6.6 rebounds per game in 20.8 minutes of action and averaged 12.7 boards per 40 minutes.

In the second half against LSU, after sitting much of the first with two fouls, he grabbed 13 rebounds alone. He ended up with 15 for the game in just 16 minutes of action, the most rebounds by a Wildcat since Nick Richards hauled in 16 boards vs. Arkansas on Feb. 26, 2019. According to STATS, Jackson became the first player with 15 or more rebounds in fewer than 20 minutes against a major conference opponent since VMI's Eric Mann had 17 boards in 19 minutes at South Carolina on Dec. 28, 2000.

Jackson's value was best represented in the plus/minus metric. Kentucky was plus-103 points with Jackson on the floor this season, far and away the best on the team. The next-closest player was Davion Mintz at plus-35.

Jackson declared for the NBA Draft in March to "test the waters" and go through the draft process. At the time of this notes publication, he had not made a final decision on his future.

## Jackson SEC All-Freshman, All-Defensive

Freshman forward Isaiah Jackson was named to the Southeastern Conference All-Freshman and All-Defensive teams after a dominant defensive season and an offensive surge to close league play.

Jackson was one of five players tabbed to the defensive team and one of eight who earned selection to the freshman squad, as picked by the league's head coaches.

Jackson became the 28th freshman under John Calipari to earn All-SEC Freshman Team honors and the 29th first-year player during his tenure to earn an all-league honor overall.

This season did, however, mark the first time since 1989 that neither of the coaches' All-SEC teams included a Wildcat. No UK players were included on the All-SEC media teams.

## Sarr Named to SEC Community Service Team

Senior Olivier Sarr was named to the Southeastern Conference's Men's Basketball Community Service Team. Sarr was Kentucky's representative on the 14-man team that honors players' exemplary service to their communities.

This season marked the 23rd year for the SEC Community Service Team for men's basketball. All 21 league-sponsored sports have had a Community Service Team since 2004. The team honors student-athletes beyond the court for their on-going efforts in the community.

Sarr engaged in nearly 100 hours of community service throughout his collegiate career at Wake Forest and UK. Some of his favorite projects included: "Project Pumpkin," which was a Halloween-themed carnival for kids, "Hit the Bricks," a run to raise awareness and funds for cancer research, "Campus Kitchens," where he would deliver meals to needy neighborhoods, and his visits to the local children's hospital. The hospital visits are what he listed as the most meaningful to him as he interacted with patients and families of children faced with life-threatening injuries and illnesses.

The COVID-19 pandemic halted a number of traditional Kentucky community service projects, but Sarr and his teammates did participate in the annual Christmas drive where the team -- with the support of the Caliparis and local businesses -- selected around 10-12 families to provide food, gifts, rent checks and other needs to identified families.

Sarr also has participated in several Zoom sessions to help inspire local elementary school children. He also participated in the team's "Read Across America" day video in which the squad read aloud the book, "Polar Bear, Polar Bear, What do you Hear?"

The Bordeaux, France, native was one of the team's three captains. He was also one of the leaders who helped initiate a player-driven message regarding social injustices in the country. The initiative resulted in the players producing a public message bring-

ing attention to the cause, as well as internal conversations with teammates and the coaching staff about their own experiences.

Sarr appeared in 110 career games with 56 starts. As a Wildcat, Sarr produced a team-best three double-doubles in 2020-21 and averaged 10.8 points and 5.2 rebounds per game. He reached double-figure scoring in nine of the final 12 games.

Prior to his season at Kentucky, Sarr was an All-Atlantic Coast Conference performer at Wake Forest. He was a third-team pick in 2019-20 and the runner-up for the league's Most Improved Player honor. Sarr was a two-time ACC Player of the Week selection and became just the 12th player in school history to win the award multiple times in a single season. He topped double-figure scoring in more than 35 games and has logged 13 career double-doubles.

Sarr is pursuing a degree in communication and is on track to graduate in May. He owns a 3.337 combined grade-point average between his time at Wake Forest and Kentucky, was an All-ACC Academic Team honoree three times and has been a Dean's List member every semester.

Sarr was one of 30 initial candidates for the 2021 Senior CLASS Award, which honors student-athletes of high character for their efforts in the community, classroom and in competition.

The senior is forgoing his extra season of collegiate eligibility to enter the NBA Draft.

## Davi-Onions

Long-time sportscaster Bill Raftery coined the phrase "onions" on Nov. 8, 1995 during a telecast of a New Jersey Nets game. The phrase is defined as, "A nice way of describing the toughness of a person."

There was one player in particular this past season who was called upon and continually stepped up in big moments.

Davion Mintz, a graduate transfer from Creighton who was initially expected to provide depth and experience, ended up becoming Kentucky's most consistent and lethal offensive threat. The 6-foot-3 guard led UK in total points (288, beating Brandon Boston Jr. by one), 3-pointers (56), assists (77) and double-figure scoring games (17).

For a player many envisioned as a complementary piece, he was a vital and indispensable part of the offense.

Mintz got better and better as the season wore on and ended the 2020-21 campaign on a tear. The stretch began when he caught fire from behind the arc. Mintz made multiple 3-pointers in 12 of the final 13 games and 33 over that 13-game span.

But Mintz got it done everywhere down the stretch as he finished the season with six straight games in double figures, including two with 20 or more points, and 23 combined assists in the final three games as he took on an increased role at point guard.

With all that said, Mintz's real value won't show up in a traditional box score. Beyond the leadership attributes he brought, it was his ability to step up and take the tough shot in big situations -- to have "onions" as Raftery would describe or "daggers" as John Calipari likes to call them.

Mintz's run of big shots began when he hit a corner go-ahead 3 with 47 seconds to play against Vanderbilt at home as Kentucky held on to win and go 3-0 to begin Southeastern Conference action. Mintz said the game-winning shot made him think of a similar 3-point shot he missed vs. Xavier during his junior season at Creighton. He said that miss "haunted" him.

"I just knew when I got that opportunity again and I didn't know where it would be at, but I was going to make that corner 3," Mintz said.

It seemed to propel him going forward. After that make, Mintz became Kentucky's go-to option.

Mintz appeared to win the game vs. Arkansas when he drilled the go-ahead 3-pointer with 14 seconds to play. Unfortunately for the Wildcats, the Razorbacks were able to hit two free throws to turn the outcome in their favor.

"Cool Mintz" got another opportunity later that week and drained his most clutch shot of the season vs. Auburn. With 33 seconds to go, Mintz nailed a 3-pointer to break a 77-77 tie and lead UK to an 82-80 victory over the Tigers.

In the next game, Mintz hit two crucial 3s at Vanderbilt during runs by the Commodores to get back into the game. The first came with 13:39 to play on the ensuing possession after Vanderbilt had tied the game for the first time since 0-0. The Charlotte, North Carolina, native also hit one as the Commodores made it a one-possession game again with 1:41 remaining.

Mintz ended the season with a bang with a combined 10 treys over the final two games,

including six vs. South Carolina in the regular-season finale. Providing what was the feel-good moment of the year, Mintz hit five 3-pointers in just over three and a half minutes early in the second half to turn a tight game into a double-digit rout.

Mintz's confidence was aided by a coach who implores his players to shoot whenever they were open.

"(Calipari) has never once told me that I've taken a bad shot," Mintz said. "He's always screaming to shoot the ball. He hasn't, and not just me. He hasn't told anyone on our team and I've never seen that before of any place I've been or watched or experienced playing myself. So, that's authentic and it's real."

At the time of this notes publication, Mintz had not revealed his future plans. Although a graduate this season, he could use the NCAA's extra COVID season of eligibility.

## UK Really Was THIS Close in 2020-21

In its 16 losses this season, Kentucky led in the second half in 12 of those games. Of those 12 games, seven of the opponents were either ranked or receiving votes at the time of the game and eight of them came away from the friendly confines of Rupp Arena.

The Wildcats were particularly close during the meat of UK's schedule from Jan. 23 to Feb. 9. During that stretch, Kentucky played five teams in the top 40 of the NCAA Evaluation Tool rankings at the time of the game and all five were at least receiving votes in the two major polls. The Wildcats beat LSU but lost their next four. UK had chances to win in each of those four games.

## Calipari Receives Guardians of the Game Award

John Calipari was one of eight coaches to receive the National Association of Basketball Coaches' Guardians of the Game Pillar Awards this season.

The Guardians of the Game Pillar Awards represent the NABC's core values of advocacy, education, inclusion and leadership. Calipari was one of three coaches, alongside Harvard head coach Tommy Amaker and South Carolina head coach Frank Martin, who received the award for inclusion.

Calipari, Amaker and Martin were honored for leading and launching the McLendon Minority Leadership Initiative, a coach-driven initiative to provide minorities a jump-start to their careers through practical experiences, opportunities to build their network, and instilling the values of John McLendon: integrity, education, leadership and mentorship.

Five other coaches received an NABC Guardians of the Game Pillar Award: Colorado head coach Tad Boyle for advocacy, Florida State head coach Leonard Hamilton for education, Michigan associate head coach Phil Martelli for leadership, and Saint Francis University head coach Rob Kimmel, and Georgia Tech assistant coach Eric Reveno for service.

The coaches were honored April 2 during the NABC Guardians of the Game Awards Show.

Calipari spearheaded the MLI after watching the nation confront issues of social injustice and racial inequality. In the middle of a Facebook Live series to raise funds for COVID-19 relief, "Coffee with Cal," Calipari paused the show and shifted his attention to the MLI. He recruited Amaker and Martin, both members of the NABC Committee on Racial Reconciliation, to join him to make change on college campuses and present opportunities for minorities. His idea was to recruit minority candidates, known as MLI Future Leaders, and provide access and opportunity with real-world experience and networking platforms designed to elevate talented young women and men of color.

The initiative has drawn more than 80 coaches nationally from basketball, football and baseball across the country to serve as both MLI Ambassadors and be the primary source of funding. The MLI recently reached \$1.5 million in funding.

A total of 33 Future Leader opportunities have been filled at 23 institutions and organizations less than a year after the program was launched. Additional opportunities will be available this spring as the MLI kicks off its second cohort. The MLI has generated almost 700 applicants to date.

## John, Ellen Calipari Pledge \$50k for Flood Relief

John Calipari and his wife, Ellen, pledged \$50,000 in matching funds for Kentucky flood relief at the beginning of March during a joint telethon between the American Red Cross and UK Athletics' television partner, WLEX.

Heavy rain to start March caused flash flooding in Eastern Kentucky. Gov. Andy Beshear declared a state of emergency.

Other coaches at UK Athletics participated in the telethon to help those reeling from the historic flooding that caused widespread damage in eastern parts of the state.

Calipari has been a servant leader and played a major part in times of need, not only in the state of Kentucky but across the country and world. In 2010, he used a telethon to raise more than \$1 million for victims of the devastating earthquake in Haiti. He followed that up with telethons in 2012, raising \$1 million for victims of Superstorm Sandy, and in 2017, for victims of Hurricane Harvey.

In 2019, when federal workers were without pay due to a government shutdown, he, his wife and his foundation assisted workers with financial help and grocery gift cards.

Calipari's foundation, the Calipari Foundation, has worked with several key partners, including Samaritan's Feet, 4 Paws for Ability, Team Focus, the Urban League of Lexington-Fayette County, One Parent Scholar House, and the Kentucky Banker's Association, which facilitates a program to teach Kentucky students the importance of financial management. To these groups alone, the foundation has donated more than \$1.5 million, a figure that does not include matching funds that have been contributed from individuals and corporations. Other nonprofits the foundation has supported through the years include the V Foundation, the Starkey Hearing Foundation, the Children's Home of Northern Kentucky, the Louisville Zoo Foundation and the American Red Cross – Bluegrass Chapter.

In 2013, Calipari initiated hosting an annual alumni weekend around his basketball fantasy experience with the intent to raise money for charity. After generating \$350,000 for selected organizations and charities during the inaugural game, the weekend has generated millions of dollars for charity since its inception.

## Too Close to Call

One thing that was consistent for Kentucky this season was playing in close games. The Wildcats were on the positive side of a few of them, but on the wrong side for far too many of them.

For just the second time in the program's storied history, UK lost three one-point games. The Wildcats also dropped three one-point heartbreakers during the 1957-58 season.

What was worse: The one-point losses were far from the only "could-have-been/should-have-been" wins (more on that below).

Kentucky had three consecutive Southeastern Conference games decided by four points or fewer vs. Arkansas, Auburn and Vanderbilt for the first time since Feb. 13-25, 1984 vs. Florida, Vanderbilt and Georgia.

Historically, the Wildcats have been good in one-possession games under John Calipari. In fact, UK is 32-30 (51.6%) in Calipari's 12 seasons in games decided by three points or less (that includes the 2-6 mark this season). In games decided by just two possessions, or six points or fewer, Kentucky is 66-51 (56.4%) under Calipari.

Only the 2014-15 team -- which won its first 38 games -- finished the season with a perfect record in both forms of the down-to-the-wire games and the 2012 squad's only blemish was the infamous last-second 3-pointer at Indiana.

The 2013-14 team, which made a memorable run to the NCAA national championship, was 2-2 in three-point games and 2-7 in six-point games during the regular season before finishing 4-2 in one-possession games and 6-9 in a two-possession contests after the memorable post-season run.

The Brandon Knight-led 2010-11 group was just 1-5 in one-possession games during the regular-season and 4-6 in two-possession games. That squad made Calipari's first Final Four as Kentucky's head coach winning a pair of one-possession games during the tournament run, while also losing by just two for a chance to play for the title.

UK is 6-1 under Calipari following a one-point loss, including 2-1 this season.

## Crunch Time Cost Cats

Amid a myriad of issues this season, perhaps none stuck out more and cost the Wildcats as dearly as their ability to close out games in the final minutes.

UK outscored its opponents by 65 points over the first 36 minutes of regulation in games this season but was minus-63 in the final four minutes of regulation in games (does not count any of the overtime periods vs. Mississippi State in the regular-season matchup in Starkville, Mississippi).

There are a bunch of games UK would have liked to have gotten back late, but a few stand out.

Against SEC regular-season champion Alabama on the road, Kentucky led 54-52 with 4:27 to play but was outscored 18-5 the rest of the way.

Then, at Missouri, after erasing a 13-point halftime deficit to pull to within one possession on a number of occasions, the Wildcats couldn't get over the hump. Heading out of the final media timeout trailing 68-65, Mississippi scored six straight points to take control.

UK also let a late six-point lead at Georgia slip away. The Wildcats had chances to beat Louisville and Notre Dame in the final minutes. Games against Kansas and Auburn were right there for the taking.

The Tennessee game at home wouldn't qualify as a final-minutes situation, but it was another game in which Kentucky had a prime opportunity to win with a 10-point lead midway through the second half.

Leading by one at home vs. Florida with 3:46 to play, the Gators scored seven of the next nine points to end a three-game UK winning streak and halt what appeared to be a late-season run to get back into postseason contention.

It was both fitting and cruel that the season ended in similar fashion. Needing to win the SEC Tournament to get into the NCAA Tournament, the Wildcat made an impressive 15-point second-half comeback vs. Mississippi State in the second round of the league tourney and took a five-point lead with 4:30 to play thanks to a barrage of 3-pointers from Dontae Allen. But the season ended just how it went so many other times as the Wildcats were outscored 8-2 the rest of the way to put the final nail in the coffin.

## Even by UK Standards, 2020-21 Was a Major Roster Overhaul

With an unmatched ability to prepare and produce players for the NBA Draft, Kentucky is used to major roster overhauls on an annual basis. But the one the Wildcats faced in 2020-21 was their most challenging yet.

Entering the season, UK said farewell to nine players, five starters and eight of the top nine scorers from the 2019-20 roster. Nick Richards, Immanuel Quickley, Ashton Hagans, EJ Montgomery and Tyrese Maxey all forfeited their remaining eligibility and declared for the NBA Draft, with three of them earning selection in the Nov. 18 draft. Nate Sestina's college eligibility expired, Johnny Juzang transferred, the late Ben Jordan returned to baseball full time and Kahlil Whitney departed for a professional career midseason.

That left the Wildcats with just one scholarship player who played in 2019-20: Keion Brooks Jr., who averaged 4.5 points and 3.2 rebounds in 31 games in his freshman season. And he missed the first nine games of this season with a lingering left leg injury.

UK was tasked with replacing 94% of its scoring from 2019-20, 98.6% of its minutes, 84.4% of its rebounds, 92.0% of its assists and 91.5% of its blocks. It was the highest loss of points and assists production of the John Calipari era, and according to an NCAA survey of communications directors across the country, UK replaced a higher scoring percentage than any other school in the country. Only the 2012-13 Kentucky team, which went to the NIT after the 2011-12 team won the national title, had to replace more minutes.

At season's end, UK's average lineup experience was 1.00 in the KenPom.com rankings, the 13th-most inexperienced team in the nation. Without Brooks for the first nine games and Terrence Clarke for league play, UK's minutes continuity was second to last in the country.

## The Injury Bug that Kept Biting

Kentucky played just one game -- the final game of the season -- with its full allotment of scholarship players.

Injuries to guard Terrence Clarke and forward Keion Brooks Jr. at different points in the

seasons prevented the Wildcats from ever truly playing at full strength.

Clarke missed the entire Southeastern Conference regular-season slate with a right leg injury. Clarke suffered the injury vs. North Carolina and was limited the next game vs. Louisville before he was medically withheld from league play.

Brooks missed the team's first nine games with a left leg injury and did not make his season debut until the road game at Florida. At that point Clarke was out for the foreseeable future. Their first game on the court together was the final game of the season.

## Mixing and Matching

Kentucky used nine different starting lineups in 2020-21. John Calipari continually shook up the lineup to try and find the right combination of players to give the Wildcats the best chance at a good start, as well as finding the lineup that finishes games. The most lineups UK has ever started under Calipari is 10 in both 2019-20 and 2015-16. Keep in mind that this group played fewer games than any other Calipari team because of the COVID-19 shortened schedule and a lack of a postseason.

According to KenPom.com, UK's minutes continuity at 7.6% was the second-worst mark in the country. Part of that can be attributed to Keion Brooks Jr. missing the first nine games of the season, as well as Terrence Clarke's absence in conference play. Both players averaged more than 23.0 minutes per game when available.

During Calipari's tenure, eight of his teams have ranged from 21.8% continuity to the highest at 49.6% during the 2014-15 season. This past season's rate was the second-lowest in Calipari's 12 seasons, with the 2012-13 team owning the low mark at 5.9%. That is the only other Calipari-led team at Kentucky to miss the NCAA Tournament in addition to this season's squad.

## 2020-21 Team Relied on the 3 as Much as Any Calipari Team

New rules that moved the 3-point line to the international basketball distance of 22 feet, 1.75 inches have had an impact on college basketball the last two seasons. The Wildcats have not been immune to the lower percentages.

Kentucky ranked in the bottom half nationally in 3-point field goals per game (ranked 255th with 6.4 per game) and 3-point scoring distribution (only 27.3% of UK's points came from 3s, ranked 266th). UK took 49 fewer 3-pointers than the opposition and made five or fewer 3-pointers in 12 of 25 games.

However, UK's perceived 3-point issues were probably a bit overstated (the Wildcats ended up ranking 177th nationally in 3-point shooting percentage) and Kentucky got considerably better shooting the long-range shot as the season wore on.

Kentucky was shooting just 25% from behind the arc (30 of 120) entering Southeastern Conference play, among the worst marks in the country, but the Wildcats shot 36.5% the rest of the way and became more reliant on the long ball during the second half of the season.

Brandon Boston Jr. made 21 over the last 10 games after hitting just 9 of 50 (18.0%) in the first 15 games. Olivier Sarr showed an ability to hit the long-range shot as a 7-footer and made 12 of 26 from long range.

And Kentucky's two best 3-point threats, Davion Mintz and Dontaie Allen, were very dangerous at times. Mintz continually drained "daggers" -- as John Calipari calls them -- over and over again in clutch situations, all from behind the arc. Mintz led the team with 56 3-pointers and made multiple 3-pointers in 11 of the last 12 games. Allen was second on the team with 31 3-pointers and had three games with four or more from long range.

UK's attempts and makes both went up in the back half of the schedule as the Wildcats made nine or more 3-pointers five times in the last 10 games.

The Wildcats hit 11 or more in back-to-back games against Arkansas and Auburn, which marked a first for the program since February 2016 vs. South Carolina and Tennessee, and a combined 25 in two straight, which was the most since making 25 vs. Arkansas and South Carolina in consecutive games in the 1998 SEC Tournament. Kentucky started that run with a

14-of-26 performance from behind the arc vs. Arkansas, tied for the third most of the Calipari era and the most since hitting 15 vs. Georgia on March 1, 2012.

UK nearly matched that run with a combined 24 treys in the final two games. The Wildcats drained 13 of 27 in the regular-season finale vs. South Carolina and then, thanks to six 3-pointers from Allen, made 11 in the SEC Tournament game vs. Mississippi State.

Having said that, if you have followed Calipari's teams over the years, Kentucky has never relied on the 3-point shot. While teams nationally are taking more 3-point shots than ever before, UK has generally bucked the trend and played to the style that's best suited for that particular group.

The highest percentage of 3-point shots taken under Calipari was the 2010-11 Final Four team that lofted 32.4% of its shots from beyond the arc. No surprise, that team consisted of Brandon Knight and Doron Lamb on the perimeter. That team is also Calipari's top 3-point shooting team at Kentucky. The most attempts per game in the Calipari era was the 2016-17 squad that took 19.89 3-point shots per game.

This group nearly topped both of those previous marks, finishing second in the Calipari era in both categories. The 2020-21 team took 32.2 of its shots from 3s and averaged 19.04 3-point attempts per game.

Not relying on the 3 certainly hasn't hurt the Wildcats. UK is 10-3 all-time under Calipari when making one or fewer from long range.

And for as much that was made about Kentucky's ability to hit the long-range shot, it was actually the Wildcats' percentage inside the arc that maybe cost the Wildcats the most this season. UK shot 45.5% on 2-point shots, ranked 312th in the country and the second-worst mark among major-conference schools.

## Free Points

In seven nonconference games to begin the season, Kentucky was shooting just 66.2% from the charity stripe, another reason the Wildcats got off to a 1-6 start to the season. The Wildcats rebounded to shoot 75.3% the rest of the way, including 76.1% during Southeastern Conference action, the best mark in the league.

Kentucky finished at 72.9%, which ranks as the third-best clip in John Calipari's 12-year tenure.

The Wildcats boasted a 24-for-25 (96.0%) day at Vanderbilt, the best free-throw performance since 1992 and best in program history on the road with a minimum of 25 attempts. UK also knocked down 24 of 25 against Georgia on Jan. 7, 1992, but that game was played inside the friendly confines of Rupp Arena.

Prior to a 15 of 25 (60.0%) day at Ole Miss, UK had made 66 of 74 in the previous three games, an 89.2% mark.

Six players -- all with 39 attempts or more -- shot at least 70% from the charity line, where the Wildcats got 21.1% of their scoring production from.

Most importantly, Kentucky made free throws when they counted the most. The Wildcats were 34 of 47 (72.3%) in the clutch, which is a two-possession game at any point with 3:00 minutes to play or less or in overtime. Brandon Boston Jr. shot 100% in that scenario, while Devin Askeew, who has had the most attempts with 15, shot 73.3%. Jacob Toppin (87.5%) and Davion Mintz (71.4%) both made 70.0% or better.

## The Rule of 76?

With the way the defense played this season, Kentucky didn't have to be great offensively to win. It just couldn't be poor.

UK was 8-1 when scoring at least 76 points but only 1-15 when scoring 75 or fewer. It's lone loss was against Mississippi State in the Southeastern Conference Tournament after erasing a 15-point deficit and nearly rallying for the win.

In a bit of a statistical oddity, the Wildcats had not scored between 66 and 75 points until scoring 70 and 71 in back-to-back games at No. 18/16 Missouri and against No. 11/10 Tennessee in early February, both losses.

Kentucky's offense did improve late in the season, scoring at least 80 points in four of the last eight games after reaching that total just twice in the prior 17 games.

## Brooks Made Major Leap in Year Two

Where would Kentucky have been this season without the experience and leadership of Keion Brooks Jr.? The Wildcats unfortunately found out during the first part of the season.

As the team's lone returning contributor, Keion Brooks Jr. was always going to be counted on as a leader by the coaching staff and his teammates entering the season. However, an injury kept him out of practice and out of the team's lineup over the first nine games of the season and the Wildcats subsequently struggled without him, starting 1-6 and ultimately going 3-6 before Brooks made his 2020-21 debut.

When Brooks finally entered the lineup early in Southeastern Conference play, his presence and importance were evident. He averaged 10.3 points per game and scored in double figures in 11 of the 16 games he played. He also led the team with 6.8 rebounds per game and was second on the team with two double-doubles.

Brooks' best performances came against two of Kentucky's rivals: Tennessee and Florida.

The sophomore forward nearly willed UK to a victory at home vs. No. 11/10 Tennessee with his first career double-double. He had a career-high 23 points and 11 rebounds. He made 8 of 16 shots. Brooks also recorded 10 points and a career-high 14 rebounds in the rematch upset vs. the No. 19/20 Volunteers.

But Brooks' season debut might have been his most impressive overall performance given the circumstances.

After missing nearly 10 months of game action and on just a couple of days of practice with all new teammates, Brooks scored 12 points on 6-of-8 shooting, grabbed six rebounds and dished out a game-high four assists in 25 efficient minutes in a runaway victory at Florida.

The Wildcats were plus-22 with Brooks on the floor in that victory at Florida. The game took place on the same floor he had played his last game, his breakthrough 2019-20 performance in early March when he scored 12 points in an 18-point second-half comeback victory.

## UK Named Jan. 11 NCAA March Madness Team of the Week

Kentucky was named the NCAA March Madness Team of the Week on Jan. 11 after wins over Vanderbilt at home and on the road at Florida.

Against Vanderbilt, Kentucky rallied from a nine-point second-half deficit and pulled out a thrilling 77-74 win when graduate guard Davion Mintz hit a game-winning 3-pointer with 47 seconds left. That gave UK its first back-to-back victories of the season.

The Wildcats officially made it a winning streak at Florida with their most complete performance of the season. With sophomore forward Keion Brooks Jr. in the lineup for the first time this season, UK beat Florida 76-58. Brooks was sensational in his return with 12 points (6-of-8 shooting), six rebounds, and (what was then) a game- and career-high four assists in fewer than 25 minutes.

The win in Gainesville, Florida, was UK's biggest margin of victory at Florida since 1998. It also marked UK's first three-game winning streak at Florida since winning three straight in Gainesville from 2002 to 2004.

## S-E-C! S-E-C! S-E-C!

Kentucky is the Southeastern Conference's gold standard. Since the SEC's inception in 1932-33, the Wildcats are the most dominant team in the league, recording a 1,020-293 mark (77.7%) in regular-season conference play. Only Alabama has won more than 800 regular-season SEC games and no other team owns a better winning percentage.

- UK has averaged 11.6 wins and only 3.3 losses per season in 88 seasons in the SEC
- Kentucky has won 49 SEC regular-season titles and 31 SEC Tournament championships
- The Wildcats have won 16 of the last 29 SEC Tournaments (the 2020 one was not played due to the COVID-19 pandemic)
- UK has captured at least a share of six of the last 12 SEC regular-season championships under John Calipari
- Kentucky has played in the championship game of the SEC Tournament in eight of Calipari's 12 seasons, winning six times
- UK won its 1,000th game in SEC regular-season action vs. Alabama on Jan. 11, 2020. Kansas has won 1,000 conference games when combining its records in the Big 6, Big 7,

Big 8 and Big 12, but no other team in the country had won 1,000 or more regular-season league games in one conference alone

- Six teams made the 2021 NCAA Tournament field with Arkansas reaching the Elite Eight and Alabama making the Sweet 16
- The SEC has had 21 NCAA Tournament selections over the last three tournaments, tied for the second most. Only the Atlantic Coast Conference (23) has had more
- The SEC went 7-6 in NCAA Tournament games in 2021. SEC teams are 73-43 (62.9%) in the NCAA Tournament since 2012
- The league has advanced at least one team to the Elite Eight in nine of the last 11 tournaments and nine different SEC teams have advanced to the Sweet 16 in the last four NCAA Tournaments
- The SEC has held its own in the annual Big 12/SEC Challenge. The SEC leads 25-24 over the last five seasons in the yearly January showdown and won outright in 2021
- Eleven SEC schools ranked in the top 100 and six were in the top 50 in the final NCAA Evaluation Tool rankings The SEC's 101 quadrant 1 and quadrant 2 wins ranked second among all conferences

## Cats Deliver the Knockout Punch

Kentucky is 286-12 (96.0%) in the John Calipari era when leading by at least 10 points at any time in the contest.

UK surrendered four such instances in 2020-21 (in 11 games). The Wildcats yielded a 13-point lead in a loss to No. 7/5 Kansas on Dec. 1, an 11-point advantage was swallowed up by No. 21/22 North Carolina on Dec. 19, the Wildcats couldn't hold on to a 10-point second-half lead vs. Tennessee on Feb. 6 and Florida rallied from 10 down in the first half to defeat UK at home.

Nine of the 12 losses in the Calipari era are to conference opponents.

Perhaps most impressive of all is that 69.1% of games Calipari has coached in at Kentucky have produced 10-point leads at some point during the game for UK. The Wildcats have led by 10 points or more in a whopping 84.4% of Calipari's 339 career wins at Kentucky.

## Hold Them to 55 Points, 40%

Defense has always been a recipe for success for the Wildcats under John Calipari. The special ingredient: 55 points. Kentucky is a perfect 79-0 under Calipari when holding the opponent to 55 points or fewer, including 2-0 this past season.

The Wildcats are 188-9 (95.4%) under Calipari but just 3-2 this season when limiting the opponent to 63 points or fewer. Five times this season UK lost despite holding teams to 66 points or less. Under Calipari, that had only occurred 12 times in 407 games prior to this season.

Kentucky also fares well when it keeps the competition to 40% or less from the floor. UK is 209-24 (89.7%) vs. opponents under Calipari when its field-goal percentage is 40% or less, but the Wildcats were only 7-5 this season when that occurred. UK held nine of its last 16 opponents to 40% or less to close the season.

## Three (Transfers) is More

The Wildcats added three high-impact transfers in Wake Forest forward Olivier Sarr, Creighton guard Davion Mintz and Rhode Island forward Jacob Toppin this past season. To say the Wildcats would have been lost without them is an understatement.

The trio of transfers accounted for 38.7% of the points, 30.9% of the rebounds and 39.9% of the assists. Those numbers only tell half the story.

Mintz was arguably Kentucky's most consistent player, especially down the stretch. He averaged a team-high 11.5 points, led UK in scoring a team-best eight times and led the Wildcats with 56 3-pointers.

Mintz scored in double figures in six straight games to close the season, averaging 16.7 points over that stretch. Included in the final six-game run were two 20-point games and two games with five or more 3-pointers (career-high six vs. South Carolina and five at Tennessee). In three straight games (Arkansas, Auburn, Vanderbilt) he drained a clutch 3-pointer with less than a minute to play. He made multiple 3-pointers in 11 of the last 12 games.

Sarr led the team with three double-doubles and a team-high-tying two 20-point scoring efforts. He had 22 points and seven rebounds against Notre Dame and then a 24-point game against Vanderbilt on 14-of-17 shooting at the foul line at home. He logged 13 points and 10 rebounds, including seven offensive, to go along with a career-best three 3-pointers and a career-high-tying four assists against Arkansas. Sarr scored in double figures in nine of the last 12 games.

Toppin was a key reserve and averaged 5.2 points and 3.5 rebounds with double-figure scoring games in two of the last six outings. He made a greater impact as the season wore on, including nine points against Arkansas, a season-high seven rebounds in the win over Auburn, a career-high 16 points at Vanderbilt, six points, four rebounds and two steals in the upset at Tennessee, 11 points at home vs. Florida, and five points, five boards and a career-high three steals in a season-high 30 minutes at Ole Miss.

Sarr, at 7-feet, 255 pounds, enjoyed a breakthrough season in 2019-20 at Wake Forest, averaging 13.7 points, 9.0 rebounds and 1.2 blocks per game. He shot 52.7% from the floor, made the All-Atlantic Coast Conference Third Team and was the runner-up for the 2020 ACC Most Improved Player award.

A 6-3 guard out of Creighton, Mintz played in 97 games with 79 starts for the Bluejays. Mintz redshirted in 2019-20 after battling an ankle injury in the pre-season and then re-aggravating it in practice upon his return, but he started all but one game in the previous two

seasons. He started all 35 games for Creighton in 2018-19, averaging 9.7 points, 3.0 assists and 3.0 rebounds in 28.8 minutes per game. Mintz was regarded as the Bluejays' best defender and ranked second on the team with 40 steals.

Toppin, a 6-8 forward, is the brother of Dayton's Obi Toppin, the consensus national player of the year in 2019-20. Jacob Toppin became an immediate contributor for a Rhode Island team that went 21-9 on the season and finished 13-5 in the Atlantic 10. He scored in double figures five times in his freshman season, highlighted by 12 points and eight rebounds vs. Richmond, and 12 points in 11 minutes vs. Saint Joseph's. He also performed well vs. Alabama and LSU, scoring 11 points and 10, respectively, in nonconference play.

## Top-Ranked Freshman Class Played Major Part

If it's not an annual certainty at this point, it's at least become a yearly expectation for John Calipari to reel in a top-ranked recruiting class every season. He has *only* done it in *every* year at Kentucky.

This year's freshman group was no exception as it shouldered a major load. Led by Brandon Boston Jr., the six true freshman scholarship players accounted for 45.1% of the points, 46.3% of the rebounds, 49.8% of the assists, 58.0% of the steals and 59.5% of the blocks.

All six started at least one game this season and each contributed in a multitude of ways.

Until the last game of the season, Devin Askew led the team in assists and dished out three or more a team-high 16 times. He had seven double-figure scoring games, including a 14-point, five-rebound, four-assist game vs. Tennessee at home.

Boston Jr. tied Davion Mintz for the top scoring average on the team and registered double-digit tallies in a team-high-tying 17 games. He scored a career-high 21 points in the final regular-season game vs. South Carolina with six 3-pointers. He also enjoyed back-to-back 18-point scoring games against Georgia and in a win over LSU.

Clarke recorded 22 points in a loss to Georgia Tech and posted four double-figure scoring games before his injury. He appeared in the final game of the season after missing all of league play.

Jackson was a monster defensively and on the boards all season long and became a threat offensively down the stretch. He finished eighth in the nation in block percentage and 15th in blocks per game. He had double-digit rebounds in a team-high seven games and scored in double figures in six straight games to close the regular season.

Lance Ware provided big minutes for UK during Southeastern Conference play. He snared a career-high 13 rebounds and added four assists in the overtime win over Mississippi State. He also nearly notched a double-double with eight points and 10 boards at Missouri.

Cam/Ron Fletcher was a spark off the bench in the team's season-opening win over Morehead State. He logged nine points, five rebounds, three assists and a steal.

## Big and Tall

This Kentucky team certainly passed the eye test.

The 2020-21 group had length at every position. Ten of the 15 eligible players on the roster were 6-foot-6 or taller, including nine of the 12 eligible scholarship players.

The eligible team had an average height of 77.7 inches, just a touch less than 6-6 per player. That's among John Calipari's tallest teams at Kentucky. Only the 2009-10 (79 inches), 2010-11 (78.6), 2017-18 (78.1) and 2019-20 (77.9) squads averaged more height. Remove UK's three walk-ons of Brennan Canada (78 inches), Riley Welch (72) and Kareem Watkins (68) and the average height went up to 78.9 inches, about 6-7 per scholarship player.

Senior forward Olivier Sarr was the 10th 7-footer in UK history and the first since Isaac Humphries in 2016-17.

According to KenPom.com, Kentucky's average used height of 79.0 inches was the fifth-tallest team in the nation.

But length isn't just measured by height. Wingspan is perhaps the most important factor of all, which this team had plenty of. Five players featured a wingspan of seven feet or more, led by Sarr at 87.5 inches, almost 7-4.

Measurable-wise, sophomore forward Jacob Toppin had the best maximum vertical leap on the team at 42.5 inches. Cam/Ron Fletcher checked in at 40.0.

Also of note, 6-9 freshman forward Isaiah Jackson ran the fastest 3/4-court spring at 3.21 seconds, and sharpshooting redshirt freshman guard Dontaie Allen has a hand width of 11.5 inches, tops on the team.

## Always Efficient

According to Ken Pomeroy's calculations on kenpom.com, Kentucky teams under John Calipari have consistently ranked among the most efficient teams in the country per possession.

## Kentucky's Schedule Among the Best in the Country

Kentucky's schedule is always among the toughest in the country and this last season was certainly no different. The NCAA Evaluation Tool ranked UK's slate as the 13th best in the nation.

The Wildcats' nonconference schedule pitted Kentucky vs. Kansas in the Champions Classic and featured nonconference games against Atlantic Coast Conference foes Georgia Tech, Notre Dame, North Carolina and Louisville.

The Southeastern Conference was once again one of the best leagues in the country. Six teams made the 2021 NCAA Tournament field with Arkansas reaching the Elite Eight and Alabama making the Sweet 16. The league won the SEC/Big 12 Challenge this season, and 11 SEC schools ranked in the top 100 and six finished in the top 50 in the NCAA Evaluation Tool rankings.

Ten of Kentucky's opponents made the NCAA Tournament, and of UK's 25-game schedule, 12 were against NCAA Tournament teams. Three more opponents (Mississippi State, Ole Miss and Richmond) made the NIT, meaning the Wildcats played 16 games against teams featured in the two major postseason tournaments.

In 2020-21, the 19 individual opponents UK played had a record of 312-205 (60.3%) with 15 of the foes posting winning records. All but three of the opponents ranked in the top 100 of KenPom.com and nine were in the top 50.

Despite their 9-16 record, the Wildcats were in virtually every game. UK led in the second half in 12 of its 16 losses. Six of the defeats were one-possession games (results of three points or less).

## Big-Game Cal, Cats

John Calipari's teams aren't just good against the best teams in the country, they're great. Not only does Kentucky own a 64-38 record (62.7%) vs. Associated Press Top 25 teams under John Calipari, UK is 7-4 when both teams are ranked in the AP top five.

All-time, Calipari is 13-8 when both teams are ranked in the AP top five. When both teams are ranked in the AP Top 25, Calipari's all-time record is 86-58, including a 55-30 mark at Kentucky. When both are ranked in the top 10 he has a 27-19 record, including 16-12 at UK.

By defeating top-ranked Michigan State to start the 2019-20 season, UK knocked off the No. 1 team in consecutive seasons for the first time in school history. Kentucky downed Tennessee on Feb. 19, 2019. With the win over MSU to begin 2019-20, the Wildcats have nine victories over the No. 1 team in 25 tries in program history.

Calipari improved to 6-4 vs. the No. 1 team in his career with the win vs. Michigan State, including 3-2 at Kentucky. According to ESPN, Calipari is the only coach with a winning (.600) percentage against No. 1 ranked teams with a minimum of 10 games faced against the No. 1.

## Taking Care of Business

Kentucky's 64-38 record vs. opponents ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 in John Calipari's tenure is impressive, but the Wildcats' ability to beat all-comers can't be overlooked. Under Calipari, UK is 275-55 vs. unranked competition, an .833 winning percentage.

## And the Winner is ... Kentucky!

Kentucky has dominated the weekly Southeastern Conference awards under John Calipari. UK has won more SEC honors (110) than any school during the Calipari era, including 85 SEC Freshman of the Week honors and 25 SEC Player of the Week awards.

The Wildcats won two SEC Freshman of the Week awards this season. Dontaie Allen won Jan. 4 honors after a career-high 23-point game at Mississippi State that featured seven 3-pointers. Isaiah Jackson won it Feb. 22 after averaging 15.5 points, 8.0 rebounds and 2.0 blocks per game in wins at Vanderbilt and in an upset at No. 19/20 Tennessee.

This season marked only the second season of the 12-year Calipari era a UK player failed to win SEC Player of the Week. It also happened in 2017-18.

## Brooks Leads On and Off the Court

Keion Brooks Jr. was one of 11 Division I men's basketball student-athletes selected to serve on the newly-formed National Association of Basketball Coaches Player Development Coalition this past season. The group is a diverse collection of players who are tasked with providing valuable perspective and feedback on college basketball-related issues.

In addition to creating a vehicle for student-athletes to address current issues, the Player Development Coalition provides members with numerous professional and personal development experiences. The coalition met quarterly and had regular opportunities to address the NABC Board of Directors and NCAA committees.

"The importance of the coalition is to make sure the players' voices are heard because the players are what make the NCAA go," Brooks said. "I also believe it's important to educate players beyond basketball, with social justice issues and how to carry yourself as a professional."

Members of the initial Player Development Coalition were North Carolina's Armando Bacot, Colorado's Evan Battley, Brooks, Harvard's Kale Catchings, Villanova's Collin Gillespie, Gonzaga's Corey Kispert, Michigan State's Joshua Langford, Duke's Wendell Moore Jr., TCU's RJ Nembhard, Syracuse's Bourama Sidibe and High Point's John-Michael Wright.

## Best in the Bluegrass

Kentucky is 20-3 against in-state foes with John Calipari at the helm, including an 11-3 mark vs. Louisville.

Two of the victories over the Cardinals were during postseason play. The Wildcats have won all six meetings played inside Rupp Arena, including a 29-point win in 2017-18, the third-largest margin of victory in the history of the series. UofL's three wins are by a combined nine points.

## La Familia's Fingerprints All Over the NBA

Amid all the changes to the NBA schedule and the uncertainty over the last year, one thing remains a constant in the professional ranks: No other program prepares its players for the NBA quite like Kentucky.

When the 2020-21 NBA season began in mid-December, 31 players on NBA opening-day rosters (including two-way and inactive lists) played and finished their college basketball careers at UK. Underscoring the fact that no other school in the country can match UK's ability to develop players and put them in the NBA, Kentucky's 31 players were once again the most of any college basketball program, beating the next-closest school (Duke with 26) by five players.

Of the 495 players in the NBA to start the 2020-21 season, 6.3% played and finished their college basketball careers at UK. There were actually fewer teams without a Wildcat (12) than there were NBA teams featuring Wildcats (18) to start the season.

Kentucky's NBA dominance is best represented in Charlotte, Minnesota, New York and Oklahoma City, where a combined 13 Wildcats started the season.

Former UK stars Kevin Knox II (2018), Nerlens Noel (2013), Immanuel Quickley (2019-20) and Julius Randle (2014) call New York their professional home, leading some to nickname the franchise the Kentucky Knicks.

Malik Monk (2017), Nick Richards (2018-20) and PJ Washington (2018-19) are all in Charlotte; Hamidou Diallo (2017-18) [since traded], Shai Gilgeous-Alexander (2018) and Darius Miller (2009-12) [since released] suited up for OKC; and Ashton Hagans (2019-20) [since released], Karl-Anthony Towns (2015) and Jarred Vanderbilt (2018) were with Minnesota to start the season.

Four other franchises – the Houston Rockets (DeMarcus Cousins [2010], John Wall [2010], Miami Heat (Bam Adebayo [2017], Tyler Herro [2019]), the New Orleans Pelicans (Eric Bledsoe [2010], Wenyen Gabriel [2017-18]) and the San Antonio Spurs (Keldon Johnson [2019], Trey Lyles [2015]) – opened the season with at least two Wildcats apiece.

With so many players in the NBA, it was an active offseason for the Wildcats. Several former UK players found new homes. Most notably, Wall and Cousins, the centerpieces of John Calipari's first Kentucky team in 2009-10, were reunited in Houston. Both returned after missing last season with injuries. Cousins has since been released and picked up by the Clippers.

Rajon Rondo (2005-06), now in his 15th season, is the most experienced Kentucky player in the league and landed with the Atlanta Hawks, his seventh different NBA team. He was recently traded to the Los Angeles Clippers to make it eight teams.

Of the 31 Wildcats on an opening-day NBA roster, Calipari coached 30 of them. With Derrick Rose (Detroit Pistons), who played for Calipari during the 2006-07 season at Memphis, Calipari coached 31 players on 2020-21 opening-day rosters.

It's worth noting that approximately 20 more Wildcats are playing in the NBA G League or playing professionally overseas. Former UK video coordinator Frank Vogel and former Kentucky assistant Kenny Payne are in the league as coaches. Vogel is the head coach of the Los Angeles Lakers and won the NBA title last season and Payne is an assistant with the Knicks. Other notable alumni include 1978 national champion Dwane Casey, who is the head coach of the Detroit Pistons, and Pat Riley continues to serve as president of the Heat.

Kentucky has not only put players in the NBA, they have been wildly successful, especially over the last few seasons.

Whether it was Anthony Davis playing a leading role in leading the Lakers to the 2020 NBA title, Adebayo and Herro captivating fans with a run to the NBA Finals, or Jamal Murray's record-setting scoring performances, former UK players had their fingerprints all over the NBA "bubble" when the league restarted last season in Orlando. Before the NBA Finals had even started, Kentucky alumni had already scored more points in the NBA Playoffs run than any other school in NBA postseason history.

Nothing has changed this season. De'Aaron Fox has become one of the best point guards in

the league; Devin Booker has led the Phoenix Suns to one of the best records in the Western Conference; Randle has a case as the league's most improved player and made his first All-Star Game this season; Gilgeous-Alexander continues to shine in Oklahoma City; Quickley is a rookie sensation; and Johnson is leading a youth movement in San Antonio.

Kentucky has enjoyed unprecedented success at putting players in the NBA under Calipari. In the 11 previous seasons of the Calipari era, 41 players have been selected in the NBA Draft, more than any other school. Included in the recent run are 31 first-round picks, three No. 1 overall selections (Davis, Towns and Wall) and 21 lottery selections.

Calipari's players have entered the league NBA-ready. After Booker, Davis and Randle were picked for the 2021 All-Star Game, Calipari's players have garnered 23 All-Star selections, with Davis winning the game's MVP honor in 2017. Rose was named NBA MVP in 2011. Five of his players have been tabbed All-NBA, three have been named NBA Rookie of the Year, and 14 players from Calipari's first 10 teams at Kentucky have made the NBA All-Rookie teams.

Using figures compiled by basketball-reference.com and spotrac.com, Calipari-coached players only (which includes Rose but not Rondo) have amassed nearly \$3 billion (\$2.96) in career NBA contracts. In the 11 seasons Calipari has been the head coach at Kentucky, his players have totaled nearly \$2.6 billion in NBA contracts.

In just the 2020-21 season alone, former UK players were slated to make more than \$295 million. Calipari-coached players only will make just about the same thing.

Calipari and Kentucky have had multiple players selected in the first round of the NBA Draft in 11 straight seasons, the only program since the draft went to two rounds in 1989 to accomplish such a feat. No other school or coach in the country has had a first-round pick in each of the last 11 seasons. Calipari is the only coach in the history of the sport to have four players drafted No. 1 overall (Rose – 2008, Wall – 2010, Davis – 2012, Towns – 2015).

## Wildcats Give Back for the Holidays

In good times and tough times alike, Kentucky's commitment to servant leadership didn't waver this past holiday season.

Dating back to his time at Memphis, John Calipari has worked with local businesses to partner and help families (usually around 10-12 families) in need for the holidays. Families are identified by local leaders and are uplifted with presents, gift cards, food for the holidays, a new mattress and even rent checks. In a typical year, there is a reception inside the Wildcat Coal Lodge with a holiday meal and Christmas carols sung by the players.

The COVID-19 pandemic forced Calipari and his team to get a little creative this past season, but the event continued on.

To practice social distancing and to continue to mitigate the coronavirus, the families pulled up in their cars and the players delivered bags full of gifts and food to the families. The Christmas carols continued -- from a distance -- as the players sang from the sidewalk as families watched from the front of their cars. Players, with personal protection equipment on, delivered the gifts and food to the trunks of the vehicles.

Local businesses Kroger, Tempur-Pedic, Kentucky Branded, Oneness and Lundy's assisted with the gifts and food this year.

## Mercer and Turner Selected to UK Athletics Hall of Fame

Kentucky basketball greats Ron Mercer (1996-97) and Wayne Turner (1996-99) are two of six former UK stars in the 2020 Hall of Fame class.

The UK Athletics Hall of Fame was started in 2005 to recognize and honor athletes, coaches and contributors whose participation and achievements enriched and strengthened the University's athletics program. The charter class included 88 individuals who had previously had their jersey retired by UK.

There is a five-year waiting period after leaving UK to be eligible for inclusion into the Hall of Fame. A committee consisting of Hall of Famers, media members, campus representatives and current coaches and administrators elects new inductees each year.

The honorees will be inducted during Hall of Fame Weekend at a date to be determined.

Mercer was a member of the 1996 national championship team as well as the 1997 national runner-up team. He was an NCAA Consensus All-America First Team member in 1997 and a two-time NCAA Tournament All-Final Four Team selection.

After making the SEC All-Freshman Team in 1996, he was one of the top players in college basketball in 1997. In that season, he was named the NCAA Tournament West Regional Most Outstanding Player, Southeastern Conference Player of the Year by both the league's coaches and the Associated Press, and the 1997 SEC Tournament MVP. He scored 725 points in his sophomore season, at the time the fifth most in a season in program history.

Mercer is a member of Kentucky's 1,000-point club (1,013). He declared for the 1997 NBA Draft after his sophomore season and was drafted sixth overall by the Boston Celtics. He played eight seasons in the NBA.

Turner was a member of the 1996 and 1998 national championship teams as well as the 1997 national runner-up team. He finished his career as UK's and the NCAA's all-time games played leader with 151 games (now ranks second), UK's all-time steals leader with 238, and a member of UK's 1,000-point club (1,170).

During his career, Turner helped the Wildcats to two SEC regular-season championships and three SEC Tournament titles.

Turner was named to the 1997 NCAA Tournament All-West Regional Team, the 1998 NCAA Tournament All-South Region Most Outstanding Player and the 1998 SEC Tournament MVP. He was also selected for the All-SEC Third Team and the SEC All-Tournament Team in 1999. He played one season in the NBA.

## **Three Wildcats Set to Graduate**

Three Wildcats from the 2020-21 team are set to graduate this offseason.

Seniors Olivier Sarr and Riley Welch are on track to receive their respective degrees at the May commencement ceremonies and redshirt sophomore Zan Payne will graduate at the conclusion of the summer term.

Sarr will graduate with a degree in communication, Welch will receive a bachelor of liberal studies and Payne's diploma will also be for communication.

Once Sarr, Welch and Payne graduate, all 23 players in the John Calipari era who have been eligible to receive their diploma by the end of their senior years and exhausted their athletic eligibility will have graduated. Of that group, Brad Calipari, Patrick Patterson, Jarrod Polson, Alex Poythress and Payne will have completed their degrees in three years.

The Wildcats received an NCAA award in the spring of 2020 for placing in the top 10% of all men's basketball teams in the country in the NCAA's annual Academic Progress Rate. UK scored a 994 out of a possible 1,000.

It marked the sixth straight year the men's basketball team has received the award and the seventh time since 2009.

The APR provides a real-time look at a team's academic success by the progress of each student-athlete on scholarship. The APR measures academic eligibility, retention and graduation. The scores are a four-year composite, covering the 2015-16 through 2018-19 school years.

Every Division I sports team across the nation calculates its APR each academic year, similar to a report card. Scholarship student-athletes each semester earn one point for remaining eligible and one point for staying in school or graduating.

UK has received a perfect 1,000 mark in six of the last seven single-year APR rates. Teams scoring below 930 can face consequences intended to direct additional focus on academics. Those penalties can include practice restrictions and playing-season reductions.

The current Wildcats have also performed admirably in the classroom. This group posted a 3.122 grade-point average in the 2020 fall semester.

## **Anderson Returns for College Degree**

Utilizing UK Athletics' Post-Eligibility Program, former Kentucky men's basketball star Derek Anderson graduated from the University of Kentucky and participated in the December 2020 commencement.

Anderson lettered at Kentucky in 1996 and 1997. He was a part of the 1996 national championship team and a key part of the 1997 national runner-up squad, a team many thought would have repeated as national champions had Anderson not injured his knee and missed the second half of the season.

Through the Post-Eligibility Program, UK Athletics pays for tuition and books for scholarship student-athletes who return to school after completing their eligibility. Since its inception in 1989, more than 150 Wildcats have returned to graduate via the program. Several other former men's basketball players, including Nazr Mohammed, Kelenna Azubuike, Jodie Meeks, Gerald Fitch and Erik Daniels, have returned to school to complete their degree in recent years.

Anderson, who transferred from Ohio State scored 674 points in a season in a half at Kentucky. He averaged 9.4 points and 2.4 assists for the Wildcats during the unforgettable 1995-96 season and was averaging 17.7 points, 4.1 rebounds and 3.5 assists before suffering the season-ending knee injury.

The Louisville native made the NCAA All-Regional Team in 1996 and was an All-Southeastern Conference Second Team pick by the league's coaches and an All-SEC Third Team selection by the Associated Press that season.

Anderson was drafted 13th overall in the 1997 NBA Draft and played 11 seasons in the NBA. He won an NBA Championship with the Miami Heat in 2006.

## **Rupp Arena Renovations Continue**

Originally announced when UK agreed to a new lease in December 2016 and formalized the agreement last year, upper-level chair-back seating and new club areas were installed to Rupp Arena for the 2019-20 season with construction ongoing for club areas.

Two clubs for season ticket holders opened this past season with a third scheduled to open in 2021-22. Fans in these new clubs will be able to enjoy first-class amenities before, during and after games. These new clubs are crucial to providing the funds necessary for both the new lease agreement and the ongoing renovation of Rupp Arena.

Club membership does not include a ticketed seat and club members may have seats throughout Rupp Arena. Season ticket holders may purchase club memberships to accompany their season ticket package. Club membership pricing and amenities will be announced as soon as details are finalized, and sales will begin shortly thereafter. Memberships will initially be offered to season ticket holders based on K Fund priority ranking.

This latest phase of Rupp renovations comes on the heels of the addition of a new center-hung scoreboard, ribbon boards, new sound system and lighting that have created a more dynamic game experience in Rupp.

The chair-back seating that was installed last season was undertaken in response to years of feedback from fans asking for more comfortable seating in the upper level. The seating was installed in sections 211-217 and 228-234.

After the seat renovations, Rupp Arena now seats 20,500.



## Cats Rock at Rupp

The Wildcats are 615-77 (88.9%) in Rupp Arena. Among the most notable marks of dominance as the nation's toughest venue to play include:

- School record 54-game winning streak to begin the John Calipari era
- Kentucky is 336-46 (89.0%) in regular-season SEC games in Rupp
- The Wildcats set a program home record of 19 wins in 2014-15
- UK has gone undefeated at home in five of Calipari's 12 seasons
- Kentucky has a perfect mark in 13 of Rupp Arena's 45 seasons

## 600 Wins at Rupp in Record Time

With a victory over Fairleigh Dickinson on Dec. 7, 2019, Kentucky reached the 600-win mark at Rupp Arena faster than any other program in NCAA Division I level history. UK needed just 670 games to reach win No. 600 in Rupp Arena.

It took UCLA, which previously owned the fastest pace to 600 wins, 689 games in Pauley Pavilion. Only one other team, Kansas, achieved win No. 600 in fewer than 700 games at its home venue. The Jayhawks reached the significant win in their 699th game.

## Cal Owns Longest Win Streaks in Rupp

With UK's 2011-12 season-opening victory over Marist, UK head coach John Calipari recorded his 34th consecutive win in Rupp Arena as UK's head coach. It broke former UK head coach Rick Pitino's longest streak of 33 games in the venue.

The winning streak reached as long as 54 games. Calipari didn't suffer his first loss in Rupp Arena until losing to Baylor in his fourth season, in 2012-13. The 54-game run, however, was his longest career home winning streak. He also had the second-longest streak in the arena as the Cats won 42 straight from March 4, 2014 to Nov. 25, 2016.

## New Chairbacks, Fewer Seats

After receiving a \$16 million upgrade over the 2014-15 and 2015-16 seasons that enhanced the fan experience with the likes of a new Daktronics center-hung scoreboard, ribbons boards, new corner video boards and a new audio system, Rupp Arena is undergoing an additional transformation as a part of UK's new leasing agreement with the Lexington Center.

Chair-back seating in the upper-level sideline was installed in sections 211-217 and 228-234 for the 2019-20 season. Club areas will be available to season ticket holders starting with the 2020-21 season.

The new seating reduced Rupp Arena's capacity to 20,500.

## Pack the House

Until reducing capacity for the 2019-20 season, Kentucky had led the nation in average home attendance in 20 of 24 seasons. That number included a Rupp Arena record of 24,110 in John Calipari's first season (2009-10) as head coach.

Kentucky averaged 20,160 fans during the 2019-20 season, the first season with a reduced capacity at 20,500. UK averaged 23,000-plus fans in seven of Calipari's first 10 seasons.

After receiving guidelines from state health officials, attendance for this past season at Rupp Arena due to the COVID-19 pandemic was limited to 15% of normal arena capacity (3,075), which included participants, essential personnel, media and a limited number of spectators.

## The Top-Ranked Team at Home

Kentucky has lost just four times at home as the Associated Press top-ranked team in the history of the program and just three times in Rupp Arena. Prior to the losses to Evansville (Nov. 12) and UCLA (Dec. 3, 2016), the other two losses came by just one point.

The Wildcats are 54-3 all-time as the AP No. 1 team in Rupp Arena since its opening in 1976. The first loss was to Auburn, 53-52, on Jan. 9, 1988.

## Coach Cal in Rupp Arena

It's been downright difficult to beat Kentucky in Rupp Arena during the John Calipari era. UK is 188-17 (91.7%) in Rupp Arena under Calipari.

- Kentucky is 22-6 (78.6%) vs. Associated Press Top 25 opponents in Rupp in the Calipari era
- UK is 166-11 (93.8%) vs. unranked teams in Rupp under Calipari
- The Wildcats are 95-6 (94.1%) at home vs. nonconference foes under Calipari
- Calipari notched his 100th career win in Rupp Arena as Kentucky's coach with the Wildcats' 110-75 rout of Auburn on Feb. 21, 2014. It took Calipari 104 games to reach the century mark, the fastest of any UK coach

## Cal Passes Hall for Rupp Record

With a 101-70 victory over Cleveland State on Nov. 23, 2016, John Calipari passed former UK head coach Joe B. Hall for most wins in Rupp Arena. Calipari currently has 188 wins inside the historic venue. Hall won 122.

## Calipari Ahead of the Pack at Kentucky

Through 12 season at Kentucky, John Calipari's time in Lexington has been every bit as successful -- and more -- as fans hoped it would when he agreed to become the head coach at Kentucky in the spring of 2009.

By just about every measure, he is the most successful coach in college basketball during the last decade-plus. Among schools who have been to at least two Elite Eights and a Final Four since 2009-10, Calipari ranks:

- First in NCAA Tournament wins (31)
- First in Final Four appearances (four)
- First in Elite Eight appearances (seven)
- First in Sweet 16 appearances (eight)
- Second in league tournament titles (six)
- Third in wins (330)
- Third in regular-season conference titles (six)
- Fourth in NCAA titles (one)

## First-Ballot Hall of Famer

Kentucky men's basketball coach John Calipari joined basketball's fraternity of legends in September 2015 after being elected to the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame on the first ballot.

Calipari joined an elite group of basketball players and coaches in the Naismith Hall of Fame, considered to be one of the ultimate honors in the sport. The Class of 2015 included Calipari, Dick Betvetta, Wildcat Louie Dampier, Lindsay Gaze, Tom Heinsohn, John Isaacs, Spencer Haywood, Lisa Leslie, Dikembe Mutombo, George Raveling and Jojo White.

Calipari was inducted in Springfield, Massachusetts. Nearly 70 former players joined him on stage during his acceptance speech.

## Calipari Named Coach of the Decade

Underscored by more victories than any other coach or program in his first 10 seasons at the helm at Kentucky, more Final Four appearances, a record number of NBA Draft picks, and the 2012 national championship, John Calipari was named the College Basketball Coach of the Decade by Sporting News in January 2020.

In a piece penned by national writer Mike DeCourcy, Sporting News credited Calipari for changing the college basketball landscape. Detailing Calipari's success -- what DeCourcy described as a "college basketball revolution" -- DeCourcy wrote that "no one defined the 2010s in the same way as Calipari ... nor achieved the same degree of consistent success."

In an era where kids can enter the NBA Draft at 19 years old, Calipari masterfully balances the priority of players' long-term professional dreams with individual and team development, leading to on-court success that no other team has matched.

"I knew we were going to make the team -- and I said it at the press conference -- it was going to be a players-first program," Calipari told Sporting News. "We were going to make decisions based on them and their needs. And it's not just about the name on the front. It'll be about the name on the back. That's how we're going to do this."

## Calipari Named 2020 SEC, USBWA District IV, NABC District 20 Coach of the Year

Unflinching to early growing pains when his team stumbled out of the gate and resolute in his belief in his players and the annual process of preparing young teams for March, John Calipari was recognized for another stellar coaching job in 2019-20 by winning Southeastern Conference Coach of the Year, U.S. Basketball Writers Association District IV Coach of the Year and National Association of Basketball Coaches District 20 Coach of the Year honors.

It was Calipari's fourth SEC Coach of the Year award at Kentucky and his 10th conference coach of the year honors as a college head coach.

Calipari was also a semifinalist for the Naismith Coach of the Year for a second consecutive season in 2020. He is one of just two coaches to win the Naismith Coach of the Year three times (Duke's Mike Krzyzewski is the other).

## Moving Up the Kentucky Career Wins, Games Coached List

With an 80-53 victory vs. Auburn on Feb. 23, 2019, John Calipari moved past Joe B. Hall for the second-most wins in program history. Calipari trails only the legendary Adolph Rupp (876 wins) for the most wins at UK and earned win No. 300 at Ole Miss on March 5, 2019. When Calipari tied Hall with his 297th win at Missouri on Feb. 19, 2019, he did so 32 games faster than Hall and just two games slower than Rupp.

Although he's still climbing the charts, he's doing it nearly as fast as anyone else in NCAA history. With the aforementioned win over Ole Miss, Calipari became the fourth-fastest coach to 300 wins (369 games) at one program in NCAA history. Only Bill Self (358 games at Kansas), Claire Bee (359 games at Long Island) and Rupp (366 at UK) got there faster.

Calipari also passed Hall for the second-most coached games at UK. Hall's 13-year career with the Wildcats ended with his 397th game. Calipari and Kentucky's win over Mississippi State on Feb. 4, 2020, marked his 398th career game at the UK helm. Rupp is first in games coached with a 41-season tenure spanning 1,066 career games.

## Calipari Coaches in 1,000th Career Game

John Calipari coached in his 1,000th career game on Jan. 2, 2021, vs. Mississippi State. He was 777-223 (77.7%) after his 1,000th game with stops at Kentucky, Memphis and UMass. He just completed his 12th season at Kentucky, the longest stop of his 29 seasons as a college head coach.

Calipari remains the only coach in NCAA history with at least 189 victories at three different schools and is the second-winningest coach in school history. Only two Division I coaches posted more wins through their first 1,000 career games than Calipari.

## 700 Victories and Counting

With Kentucky's win over UIC on Nov. 26, 2017, John Calipari reached 700 on-court wins. At the time he was one of just 41 coaches, regardless of NCAA level of classification, to reach that barrier. Only 29 coaches have done it with at least 10 seasons at

Calipari's run of consecutive on-court 20-win seasons came to an end with the unique 2020-21 season. The streak ended at 26 seasons, starting with his 1990-91 UMass team and extending all the way through the 2019-20 Kentucky team.

Until the streak ended, Calipari led all active coaches with 26 consecutive seasons of 20 or more on-court wins. Ironically, the coach immediately trailing Calipari, Krzyzewski, also saw his streak come to an end at 24 straight seasons. Kansas' Bill Self now leads the active streak with 23 seasons and Mark Few from Gonzaga is at 22 straight years.

## There's No Place Like Home

John Calipari-coached teams have posted an all-time record of 427-49 (89.7%) record at home in his stops at UMass, Memphis and Kentucky. At UK, Coach Cal is 188-17 (91.7%) in Rupp Arena.

In five of Calipari's 12 seasons at Kentucky, the Wildcats have posted an undefeated record at home, including a school-record 19-0 mark during the 2014-15 season.

Calipari owns both of UK's longest winning streaks in the arena. He began his career at UK with a 54-game winning streak at Rupp Arena. It was the longest winning streak since the arena opened in 1976. With a win over Georgia on Feb. 9, 2016, he secured the second-longest streak in the storied building at 34 games (which ended at 42).

## Life Away From Home Isn't So Bad Either

As good as John Calipari's team's have been at home, they're pretty good in hostile environments on the road. Dating back to the 2005-06 season, Calipari has recorded a 112-53 (67.9%) record on the road. At neutral-site venues, Kentucky is 79-27 (74.5%) under Calipari.

## Calipari at No. 1

John Calipari is one of just two coaches (Frank McGuire) to lead three programs to a No. 1 ranking in the Associated Press Top 25.

Calipari has led seven of his 12 UK teams to the No. 1 ranking and eight of his last 14 teams to the top (he's done it 10 times overall). When Coach Cal's teams are at the top, they're difficult to knock off:

- Calipari is 110-13 (89.4%) as the top-ranked Associated Press Top 25 coach in the country
- He's 69-8 (89.6%) when his team is atop the AP Top 25 as UK's head coach
- Calipari tallied a 32-4 mark at UMass at No. 1 and he was 9-1 at Memphis
- He (110) trails only Duke's Mike Krzyzewski (219) in active coaches with victories at No. 1
- Calipari has coached 123 career games as a No. 1 team, fourth most in NCAA history, trailing Krzyzewski (254), John Wooden (228) and Adolph Rupp (127)
- Among coaches who have owned a No. 1 ranking in at least 119 games, Calipari's winning percentage of 89.4% trails only Wooden (95.2%) and is ahead of active coach Krzyzewski (86.2%)
- Calipari is 6-4 vs. the AP top-ranked team in the land, including 3-2 at UK after defeating Michigan State in 2019-20
- According to ESPN, his 60.0% winning percentage against AP top-ranked teams is the best for any head coach

## The Success Rate

John Calipari has graduated 100% of the players (20 of 20) who have been eligible to receive their diploma by the end of their senior years and exhausted their athletic eligibility. Of that group, Brad Calipari, Patrick Patterson, Jarrod Polson and Alex Poythress completed their degrees in three years. Zan Payne, Olivier Sarr and Riley Welch are expected to join the graduates in the spring and summer commencement ceremonies.

In the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate, which measures eligibility, retention and graduation, Kentucky has posted a single-year Academic Progress Rate of 977 or higher in every season under Calipari, including a perfect 1,000 in six of the last seven single-year reports. UK's four-year composite score in the most recent report, which was released in May 2020, was a 994 out of 1,000, earning the team an NCAA academic award for the sixth year in a row for finishing in the top 10% of Division I men's basketball programs. The Wildcats posted a 3.122 grade-point average in the 2020 fall term.

## Dream Maker

As someone who prides himself on helping young men reach their dreams, John Calipari has helped 52 players earn selection in the NBA Draft during his college coaching career, including 41 in his first 11 seasons at UK, more than any other coach.

- Four No. 1 overall selections (Derrick Rose, John Wall, Anthony Davis and Karl-Anthony Towns) during the nine drafts from 2008 to 2016. No other coach has more than three No. 1 picks
- In 2010, five of his UK players were selected in the first round for the first time in NBA history
- His six players in the 2012 and 2015 NBA drafts are the most in the two-round era
- Churned out 41 NBA Draft picks, 31 first-rounders (more than the entire Big Ten during the same time span), three No. 1 selections, seven top-five picks and 21 lottery picks at Kentucky
- Of the 66 players who have finished their college careers at Kentucky under Calipari (did not transfer or leave the program early), 41 have been selected in the NBA Draft, a 62.1% success rate (through the 2020 NBA Draft). Another seven of those made the NBA, and the majority of the rest were walk-ons
- Of the 28 players at UK who have declared for the NBA Draft at the conclusion of their freshman seasons, 26 have been first-round picks (through the 2020 NBA Draft). All previous players have played game in the NBA. He is 30 for 32 when including his players from Memphis
- Only coach to produce the top two picks in the same draft (2012, Davis and Michael Kidd-Gilchrist)
- Produced a top-10 pick in 12 straight drafts from 2008-19, the only school to do so during that time period
- Eight of his former players have been named NBA All-Stars (26 total and all since 2010), five have been tabbed All-NBA

## Developing Talent

John Calipari hasn't just signed the best talent in the country while he's been at Kentucky; he's been the best at developing that talent and getting it ready for the next level.

Of the 39 top-25 Rivals.com players Kentucky has signed who did not transfer or leave the program early, 33 were drafted and 26 were selected in the first round. But that's only half the story. Calipari's players don't just make it to the pros, they're better prepared than anyone else. The proof is in the numbers.

Entering the 2020-21 NBA season, Calipari's NBA pros had amassed nearly \$3 billion in career NBA contracts, which doesn't include endorsement deals and overseas contracts. Of his UK players in the NBA, they have nearly \$2.6 billion in career contracts.

There's more: Of UK's 21 lottery picks in the Calipari era, 16 have earned second contracts in the NBA with nine of them cashing in on max contracts. Of the four who haven't earned second contracts, all have been drafted in the last five years and are still on their rookie deal. Over the last 11 years, there have been 27 lottery picks who earned max contracts in the NBA. Nine of them attended Kentucky.

## Double-Digit Win Streaks

John Calipari's teams have posted 19 streaks of 10 or more wins at Kentucky, Memphis and UMass, including six at UK. They have won 15 or more straight games nine times, 20 or more six times, 25 or more five times, and 30 or more once. Of course, the most famous streak was the 38-0 start during the 2014-15 season.

# COACH CALIPARI

A “players-first” coach with a penchant for helping people reach their dreams, John Calipari, a Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Famer, has guided six teams to the Final Four, led one to a national championship and helped 52 players earn selection in the NBA Draft during his 29-year college coaching career.

Calipari guided Kentucky to its eighth national championship and his first national title in 2012. In becoming only the second coach in NCAA history to lead three different schools to the Final Four, he has racked up nearly 800 on-court victories, 20 NCAA Tournament on-court appearances, six Final Fours and numerous national coach of the year honors.

From UMass to Memphis and now Kentucky, Calipari’s career has been successful throughout, but his most recent run in Lexington has been the best stretch of his career. During Calipari’s first 12 seasons at UK, he has led all coaches in NCAA Tournament wins (31), Final Fours (four), Elite Eights (seven) and Sweet 16s (eight). He is in the top three in total wins (339) in that time span.

In 2015, Coach Cal led college basketball’s first ever 38-0 team, and became one of just three coaches to make four Final Fours in a five-year span. At the end of the season, Calipari became the 96th coach to join the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.

While building a program out of obscurity at UMass, laying the foundation at Memphis and restoring luster at the sport’s greatest program at Kentucky, he totaled the second-most wins in NCAA history in the first 20 years of a college coaching career.

Quite honestly, though, Calipari’s on-court success overshadows a much more significant picture.

In his goal to lead a players-first program, he has helped more than 50 young men realize their dreams and reach the NBA level with 52 players earning NBA Draft selections, including a record five first-round draft picks in 2010. Two years later, six Wildcats heard their names called at the 2012 draft, the most in the two-round draft era. UK, with Calipari’s help, would tie those six picks again in 2015, including a record-tying four lottery selections. His four No. 1 overall picks are more than any other coach, and he has had 41 players drafted during his first 11 years at Kentucky, including 31 first-round picks, more than the entire Big Ten combined in that time span.

Calipari’s players have entered the league NBA-ready. His players have garnered 26 All-Star selections -- all since 2010 -- with Anthony Davis winning the game’s MVP honor in 2017. Derrick Rose was named NBA MVP in 2011. Five of his players have been tabbed All-NBA (10 times), three have been named NBA Rookie of the Year and 14 players from Calipari’s first 10 teams at Kentucky have made the NBA All-Rookie teams.

Much like he did at UMass, where his players graduated at nearly 80%, Calipari has stressed academics. Fifteen of his last 18 seniors at Memphis earned their bachelor’s degrees, and all 20 players at UK who were eligible to graduate by the end of their senior years walked away with a diploma in hand (with three more scheduled to this spring and summer), including four players who earned their degree in just three years. Calipari’s teams routinely have posted a combined team grade-point average of 3.0 or better.

Calipari has raised millions of dollars to help the lives of those in need in the Commonwealth and beyond. He has had a particular passion to assist those impacted by natural disasters. For instance, in 2010, he used a telethon to raise more than \$1 million for victims of the devastating earthquake in Haiti. He followed that up with telethons in 2012, raising \$1 million for victims of Superstorm Sandy, and in 2017, for victims of Hurricane Harvey.

Calipari launched his foundation in 2012, and since then the foundation has worked with several key partners and donated more than \$1.5 million, a figure that does not include matching funds that have been contributed from individuals and corporations. In 2013, Calipari initiated hosting an annual alumni weekend around his basketball fantasy experience with the intent to raise money for charity. After generating \$350,000 for selected organizations and charities during the inaugural game, the weekend has generated millions of dollars for charity since its inception.

In 2019, when federal workers were without pay due to a government shutdown, he, his wife and his foundation assisted workers with financial help and grocery gift cards. He and his wife, Ellen, teamed up with Fayette County Public Schools to help families in need during the COVID-19 pandemic.

His latest efforts include spearheading the creation of the John McLendon Minority Leadership Initiative, a nationwide coach-driven initiative to provide minorities a jump-start to their careers through practical experiences, opportunities to build their network and instilling the values of John McLendon: integrity, education, leadership and mentorship. Participants in the initiative will be known as MLI Future Leaders.

In 2017, Coach Cal was named the head coach of the 2017 USA Basketball Men’s U19 World Cup Team, which finished third at the 2017 FIBA U19 World Cup in Cairo.

Author of five books, including the New York Times Best Seller “Players First: Coaching from the Inside Out,” Calipari is a master of communication and maximizing talent. He lives by the motto that “it’s never a matter of how far you have fallen, but instead it’s about how high you bounce back.”


