### **2021 SEASON IN REVIEW**



- Kentucky was 29-23 overall and 12-18 in SEC play this season.
- · UK finished sixth in the SEC East.
- UK was 5-16 vs. ranked teams, 4-10 vs. Top 10 foes finished the season with 13 of 14 games vs. Top 25.
- UK had three road wins vs. Top 5 teams (No. 2 Vanderbilt, No. 4 Tennessee and No. 5 Louisville).
- UK was only team all season to defeat No. 2 Vanderbilt when the Commodores led after 8 innings (38-0).
- UK has scored in 243 of 246 games in Mingione's tenure.
- The Cats are 78-for-86 on stolen base attempts and stole their first 33 of the season. They have the highest success rate (90.7) of any Division I-A team with 50+ stolen bases.
- UK set a single-season school record for fielding percentage at .979. The Cats made just 39 errors in 52 games and ranked 16th nationally in fielding percentage.
- Senior 1B T.J. Collett proved to be one of the nation's top hitters. He finished with 42 career HR, sixth among active D-I players and now second on UK's all-time list with AJ Reed. He had a 1.008 OPS and led team with 48 RBI. He reached safely in 26 of last 28 games.
- For his efforts, Collett was named National Player of the Week by both Collegiate Baseball and the NCBWA and SEC co-Player of the Week for the week of April 19-25.
- · Collett is the winner of the 2021 Senior CLASS Award that honors excellence on and off the field.
- Junior IF/OF Austin Schultz has proven to be a stick of dynamite for the Cats. He has reached safely in 100 of 110 career games with a plate appearance, has multiple hits in 24 games this season (second in the SEC), and is 22-for-24 in SB attempts (second in SEC in steals).
- Schultz has 37 career stolen bases, 12th on the school's career list.
- Senior C Coltyn Kessler is ninth in the SEC in batting (.349) and hit a game-winning, three-run HR at No. 2 Vanderbilt with the Cats down to their final strike in the regular season finale. Kessler finished seventh in the conference in on-base percentage.
- Sophomore OF John Rhodes led Division I-A with eight outfield assists in 2021.
- Ouch! Rhodes was hit by 18 pitches, tying him for the seventh-most in a single-season at UK.
- Junior OF Cam Hill had nine bunt hits on the season.
- · Senior LHP Mason Hazelwood, UK's Saturday starter, missed the final nine weeks of the season after undergoing Tommy John surgery on his pitching arm. He was 3-0 with a 2.13 ERA in six games.
- · Senior RHP Sean Harney became the only pitcher in school history to record at least six saves and start six or more games in a single season.
- Harney hit 20 batters, tying the single-season school record previously set by Brandon Weeb in 2000. Sophomore RHP Zack Lee hit 12, tying him with Sean Hjelle (2017) for sixth.
- Freshmen RHPs Ryan Hagenow and Austin Strickland each proved difficult to hit in their rookie seasons. Hagenow held opponents to a .195 average, the fourth-lowest for a freshman with at least 20 innings since 1979. Strickland held opponents to a .221 mark, tying him with former Freshman All-American Justin Lewis for sixth on that list.
- Hagenow finished the season 2-2 with a 3.00 ERA that ranks as the sixth-lowest for a freshman since
- · Sophomore RHP Cole Stupp served as the Cats' Friday night starter the entire season and was excellent in his first foray into the SEC. Stupp was the inaugural SEC Newcomer of the Week (given to Covid-19 freshman) after a dominant performance vs. Missouri in his first SEC outing.
- Stupp recorded eight quality starts (6.0 IP, 3 or fewer earned runs), including five straight. In road starts at Auburn, No. 5 Miss. State, No. 20 Georgia and No. 2 Vanderbilt he pitched at least 7.0 innings in each start (29 total) with a 2.48 ERA and 23 strikeouts to just three walks.
- Team finished with highest GPA among all male teams at UK in both Fall 2020 & Spring 2021.



T.J. Collett is the winner of the 2021 Senior CLASS Award for baseball, which honors the senior who most excelled as a student-athlete both on and off the field of play.

Collett, from Terre Haute, Indiana, has exemplified Kentucky baseball's core values of being a student, person and player through his talent on the field and commitment to the betterment of others off it. He recently earned his master's degree in communication after completing his undergraduate degree in communication in May 2020.

To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, class-room, character and competition. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.

Collett credited his time at Kentucky for helping him delve deeper into his desire to helping others.

"My experience at the University of Kentucky has prepared me for whatever life throws at me," Collett said. "First, the standard set in our program by the coaches on the field has taught me what it means to give all that I have for my teammates. Second, the academic support given to me throughout my undergraduate degree and master program allowed me to realize my full potential outside of sports. My education was a constant reminder that being a baseball player was just a small part of who I am as a person.

"Lastly, the athletics department and coaching staff welcomed my dream and vision of helping children with cancer in partnership with The Jessie Rees Foundation. It shows what our program stands for and believes in. Ultimately, I learned that confidence in yourself comes from within and who you surround yourself with. The University of Kentucky has provided me the confidence to be great in all aspects of life."

Collett proved to be one of the nation's premier power hitters during his career and he passed 2014 Golden Spikes Award winner and fellow Terre Haute native AJ Reed for second on UK's career home run list with 42. The 6-foot-1, 220-pounder is a three-time National and Southeastern Conference Player of the Week who has hit .280 with 71 extra-base hits, 145 RBI and a .549 slugging percentage in 170 career games. He also ranks in UK's top 10 for career RBI.

Collett also has starred off the field while at UK, being named the athletic department's Mr. Wildcat and being inducted into the prestigious Frank G. Ham Society of Character for his work in the community. He is a 2020 SEC Brad Davis Community Service Award recipient and a two-time member of the SEC Community Service Team who has been instrumental in UK baseball's community outreach and service initiatives. He is heavily involved with the NEGU/Jessie Rees Foundation, whose mission is connecting with families of young cancer patients, bringing awareness to their stories, offering them a network of helpful resources and sending the entire family encouragement throughout their journey.

NEGU, which stands for Never Ever Give Up, has worked with Collett on bringing children and their families to UK home baseball games to experience pregame activities on the field and in the dugout, as well as be announced during the game. As part of his work with NEGU, Collett has spearheaded an effort where members of the UK baseball team delivery Joy Jars to young cancer patients. The jars are stuffed with toys, games, and other things to brighten patients' days while fighting the disease.

#### **RITTER ME THIS**

Kentucky sophomore shortstop Ryan Ritter has made an immediate impact on the program with his elite defensive skills and developing offensive game despite having played just 17 games of junior college ball before arriving in Lexington. The Chicago-area native's all-around skill set and tools that have pro scouts drooling were never more evident than in the Wildcats' victory at No. 5 Louisville on April 6, the program's first win on its rival's home turf since 2014. Ritter went 3-for-4 with three runs, a double, a home run and six RBI while also delivering three dazzling defensive plays that saved at least three runs. It was just the seventh time since the beginning of the 2011 season a Wildcat had 6+ RBI.

#### **COLLETT-ING HARDWARE**

T.J. Collett earned two National Player of the Week honors (Collegiate Baseball, NCBWA) and was named the SEC co-Player of the Week for the week of April 19-25. It is the third time Collett has won the SEC's weekly award during his Kentucky career, including once in each of the past three seasons. He also has been named Collegiate Baseball's National Player of the Week three times, including in 2018 and 2020.

Collett made a powerful point – literally – with four home runs in the Wildcats' critically important series win over Alabama that included a sweep of Sunday's doubleheader. The senior first baseman home runs in three consecutive at bats in the second game, making him just the third Wildcat in the past 13 seasons to crack three in one game (Ryan Johnson, vs. Western Kentucky in 2019; Gunner Glad vs. South Carolina in 2009).

For the week, Collett batted .333 with five runs, seven RBI, four home runs and an OPS of 1.486. He drove in a career-high five RBI vs. Alabama on Sunday as the Cats slammed seven home runs in the second game, tying for the most in a game since the 2005 season.

Collett's three homers vs. Alabama on April 25 saw him rocket up UK's career home run list into a tie for second place with AJ Reed, the 2014 Golden Spikes Award winner and fellow Terre Haute, Indiana native. Collett now has 41 career blasts after passing Reed and also entered the school's top 10 list for career RBI with 144. He ranks fourth among active Division I-A players in home runs.

#### CATS LEAD THE SEC IN WEEKLY HONORS

Although the strength of our TEAM is our TEAM, the Cats have had standout individual performances that have caught the attention of observers across the country and in the SEC offices. Since the beginning of the 2017 season, UK players have been named SEC Player, Pitcher or Newcomer of the Week **seventeen** times, tied for the most for any school in the conference.

#### **BIGGIE BOX**

One of the pillars of UK's offense is working its game goals in search of the big inning - "Biggie Box" - which is defined as any inning where the Cats put four or more runs on the scoreboard. The approach has been so effective the lineup has opened its "Biggie Box" 118 times since Mingione took over (37 in 2017, 31 in 2018, 20 in 2019) and recorded 11 such innings in just 17 games last season. The Cats also are 110-22 under Mingione when scoring six or more runs. (See box on page six for Biggie Box innings)

The 11-run third inning vs. Oakland on March 8, 2020 was the highest-scoring inning for UK since plating 12 in the first inning at Vanderbilt on May 11, 2002. The Cats also had a 10-run inning last season.

#### **PRODUCTION AT THE PLATE**

Kentucky's offense has been one of the nation's elite the past four seasons under Mingione and his staff, in particular renowned hitting guru Todd Guilliams. The Cats have been a devastating offensive club under Guilliams' direction, leading the SEC in a total of 15 offensive statistical categories, while also producing seven All-Americans. In three of the four seasons, the Cats have averaged more than seven runs per game, including 7.9 in 2020.

In 2018, UK led the SEC in home runs per game, slugging percentage, on-base percentage, scoring, doubles per game and sacrifice bunts, while ranking in the nation's top 20 in five of those six categories - and top 10 in three. In 2017, the Cats registered the most hits in a single-season (706) in UK history and ranked near the top of the single-season charts in numerous other categories. The offense also ranked in the top 12 nationally in doubles (2nd), hits (4th), hit by pitches (4th), on-base percentage (7th), walks (10th), sacrifice bunts (10th), slugging percentage (11th) and batting average (12th).

#### **ON-BASE MACHINE**

Sophomore infielder Austin Schultz has been a catalyst at the top of the lineup, using his combination of hitting ability and patience at the plate to find his way onto the bases. In fact, there have been only eight instances since the beginning of 2012 where a UK player has reached base safely in at least 25 consecutive games. Schultz is the only freshman to have accomplished the feat during that time. Overall, he has reached base safely in 99 of 109 games in his career in which he's had a plate appearance, also had a 22-game streak, and a 14-game hit streak earlier in 2021.

#### ALL RHODES LEAD TO LEXINGTON

John Rhodes already has made presence felt on the college baseball scene, earning 2021 preseason All-America status from Baseball America, D1 Baseball, the NCBWA and *Collegiate Baseball*, which named him the 2020 National co-Freshman of the Year after a blistering start to his collegiate career. He is considered one of the top prospects for the 2021 Major League Baseball Draft, ranking as high as the No. 32 overall prospect by MLB.com/MLB Pipeline.

Rhodes, from Soddy Daisy, Tennessee, ranked second nationally in doubles in 2020 with 10, twice as many as any other rookie in the talent-rich SEC. He batted .426 overall in 61 at bats with 11 runs, 26 hits, 10 doubles, a triple, a home run, 19 RBI and five hit by pitch. He slugged .672 as part of a 1.157 OPS. The .426 average was the highest for any UK player with at least 50 at-bats since Jeff Abbott batted .445 in 1994.

The 6-foot, 200-pounder was one of the top hitters in the SEC regardless of class. He ranked sixth in the SEC in total hits and 10th in RBI, led all SEC freshmen in batting average, hits, on-base percentage, doubles and total bases and ranked second in slugging percentage.

Rhodes' biggest moment came when he clubbed the first home run of his career for a walk-off winner vs. Murray State on March 4. In just 34 career games he already has 12 multi-hit games and 10 multi-RBI games while logging a career-high three hits three times.

UK coach Nick Mingione isn't big on hyperbole so when both he and hitting guru Todd Guilliams talk about his talent you're bound to pay a little closer attention

"John Rhodes is special," Mingione said. "He's a guy I think we're going to be sitting here looking back one day going, 'Wow, that's one of the better players we've had come through here."

#### STUPP NAMED INAUGURAL SEC NEWCOMER OF WEEK

Cole Stupp, a sophomore right-hander, was named the inaugural SEC Newcomer of the Week for his standout performance vs. Missouri on opening weekend in the league. He dominated on the mound in his SEC debut while helping UK cruise to a 10-2 victory over Missouri on March 19. Stupp pitched seven innings, allowing only an unearned run on five hits while striking out a career-high 10 batters. Three of the five hits were of the infield variety.



#### FLY HIGH, 3

The Kentucky baseball program suffered a devastating loss when junior pitcher Ben Jordan passed away on Jan. 11 at the age of 22.

Jordan, from Olive Hill, Kentucky, arrived on campus in fall 2018 and redshirted his freshman season while recovering from an arm injury. He returned to the mound in 2019, appearing in 10 games and then dominating the Cal Ripken Collegiate Baseball League that summer.

In fall 2019, Jordan joined the storied men's basketball program as a walk-on with John Calipari's team low on post players and appeared in two games.

He is - and will forever be - greatly missed.



#### **MLB TRAINING GROUND**

Kentucky has made its presence felt in the Major League Baseball Draft in recent years with 24 players selected during the Nick Mingione era, including 21 in 2017 and 2018, which was the most of any college program in the country over that span. In Evan White (2017) and Zack Thompson (2019) the Cats have had two first-round selections under Mingione. In the last four drafts:

- 13 Wildcats were selected in the first 10 rounds.
- Six were selected in the first five rounds, including first-rounders Evan White (2017) and Zack Thompson (2019).
- The 13 picks in 2018 are the second-most for any school in a single draft since 2006 and tied for an SEC record with Texas A&M (2016) and national champion Vanderbilt (2019).
- The 14 underclassmen drafted during that span earned \$10.435 million in signing bonus money, an average of \$745,358 per player.
  - All but one draftee was selected higher than previously selected.
  - 15 of the draftees had not previously been drafted.
- White was named a 2020 AL Gold Glove winner, the first rookie first baseman in either league to win the award since is inception in 1957.
- Along with White having already made his MLB debut, Zach Pop made the Miami Marlins 2021 Opening Day roster and Zach Reks is on the defending World Series champion Los Angeles Dodgers 40-man roster.









#### **HOLT UP! PITCHER'S LEXINGTON ROOTS DATE 240+ YEARS**

Senior pitcher Holt Jones joins the Shelby family as having deep ties to Lexington, despite having grown up in Southern California and playing his first three seasons at Clemson. His sixth-great-grandfather was William McConnell, who founded the city of Lexington. McConnell and his group settled camp in the area in 1775 and to this day has a neigborhood, McConnell Springs, named in his honor. Additionally, both his father, Penn Sr., and grandfather, Gordon, played baseball at USC, with Gordon being the leadoff hitter on the 1948 national championship team that defeated Yale, whose first baseman was George Bush Sr..

#### **TAKE 'EM TO CHURCH**

Freshman infielder Reuben Church has made an immediate impact as the starting third baseman, flashing his hit tool and raw power, plus a strong arm at hot corner. Church recorded a hit in each of his first 10 games, the fourth-longest such streak for a freshman in UK history. He came up huge in the Cats' first SEC road game, driving in five runs, the most for a freshman since A.J. Reed had six vs. Buffalo on Feb. 24, 2012. He blasted a critical three-run home run late in that win at Auburn.

#### THE OLYMPIC TIES THAT BIND

UK's Oraj Anu and Wyatt Hudepohl hit the genetic gold mine, as both players have immediate family members who reached the Summer Olympics. Anu's mother, Oralee Fowler, was member of the 1980 and 1984 Bahamas track team as a sprinter, whole Hudepohl's uncle, Joe, won three Olympic swimming medals during 1992 and '96 Olympics.

### KENTUCKY PROUD PARK

Kentucky baseball moved into a new home for the 2019 season, opening the \$49 million Kentucky Proud Park, a state-of-the-art facility immediately considered one of the top facilities in all of college baseball. The Wildcats won their first game in their new home, defeating Eastern Kentucky, 7-3, on Feb. 26, 2019.

The stadium features permanent seating for nearly 2,500 fans with additional space on grass berms to accommodate 5,000 fans for regular season games. Beyond the outfield wall, temporary bleachers can be installed for NCAA Tournament games to bring the seating capacity to more than 7,000. Fan amenities also include suites and a new club area.

The team areas were a priority and give our players and coaches everything they need to compete at a high level in a single location. The facility features a team lounge, locker room, training area, indoor hitting and pitching areas, and coaching offices, as well as a recruiting room. All spaces are either new to UK baseball or significantly larger than previous ones.

The playing surface is the AstroTurf® Rootzone Diamond Blend, which will allow the team to maximize usage in all weather conditions. The pitcher's mound will remain dirt.

The video board that looms large beyond the right-centerfield wall measures 48 feet wide by 30 feet tall, making it the eighth-largest in college baseball.

The name is a tribute to farmers and businesses of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and the Big Blue Nation. Kentucky Farm Bureau secured the rights to name the stadium from JMI Sports, UK Athletics' multimedia rights partner. In turn, Kentucky Farm Bureau elected to name the stadium for Kentucky Proud, the state's official agricultural marketing program housed at the Kentucky Department of Agriculture. No state tax-payer dollars were used in funding the agreement. The Kentucky Proud program is funded through the generosity of the Kentucky Agricultural Development Fund. The fund is directed by the Kentucky Agricultural Development Board and administered by the Governor's Office of Agricultural Policy.







### HEAD COACH NICK MINGIONE

Kentucky fans have quickly created a bond with **Nick Mingione**, whose infectious and unrelenting enthusiasm and down-to-earth personality has earned legions of new fans. Although it is certainly an ingredient in Mingione's on-field success, getting the best out of his players has been the biggest factor in the success he's achieved everywhere he's been...In 17 full seasons of coaching the teams he's been involved with have averaged 38 victories a year and advanced to the postseason 10 times with two national runner-up finishes.

Mingione had a brilliant playing career at Embry-Riddle - he ranks 10th on its career hits list - where he helped lead the program to 154 victories and three NAIA World Series appearances in three seasons as an assistant. When he arrived at Kentucky in 2006 he was immediately part of what is still the Cats' only SEC championship club, then smelled success at Mississippi State before returning to the one place he had always wanted to be a head coach - UK. First season, first Super Regional appearance for the Cats.

He made it a point to have his team involved in the community, part of his "Student. Person. Player." guiding principle of the program, participating in numerous philanthropic events in Lexington while also taking time for more than 100 local speaking engagements. In his first season his ethos for the program was on full display as UK players earned SEC Pitcher of the Year, SEC Scholar Athlete of the Year and SEC Community Service Team honors.

Mingione became the winngest UK coach during the first three seasons of his tenure with 103 total wins and 39 in SEC play. The success has carried over to the Major League Baseball Draft, where Mingione and his staff's ability to groom players for a professional career has led to 24 players being selected in the past five MLB Drafts. The 21 players selected in the 2017 and 2018 drafts were the most of any program in the country and Mignione has helped mentor two top 20 overall picks in first baseman Evan White (17th, 2017) and left-handed pitcher Zack Thompson (19th, 2019).

Mingione has a sterling reputation as a recruiter. Over the 13 seasons at Kentucky and Mississippi State for which recruiting rankings are final, he has helped land classes with an average ranking of 15th, including top-three classes in 2013-15. He also has an unmatched track record of player development, coaching 78 players selected in the MLB Draft, as well as 45 All-Americans and six conference players of the year. His first recruiting class at Kentucky was ranked in the Top 10 of all the major industry outlets.


