**CAROLINA VS. KENTUCKY:** This is the 33rd meeting between the Gamecocks and Wildcats in a series that dates back to 1937. Carolina leads the all-time series 18-13-1, including a 9-5-1 advantage in Columbia. The teams played just three times (1937, 1978 and 1981) before Carolina joined the SEC in 1992. Since then, they have met every year. Since joining the SEC, the Gamecocks own a 17-12 record against UK, including wins in 14 of the 21 meetings in this century.

**THE LAST TIME THEY MET:** Due to COVID altering the schedule, the Gamecocks and Wildcats did not meet until the final regular season game of the 2020 season, a Dec. 5 contest in Lexington. Kentucky posted a 41-18 win over Carolina that night, the largest margin of victory for the Cats in 32 meetings with the Gamecocks. Both teams moved the ball effectively on the ground, with South Carolina rushing for 297 yards, behind **Kevin Harris's** 210 yards on 21 carries. Kentucky countered with 291 rushing yards as Chris Rodriguez Jr. and A.J. Rose each went over the century mark. **Luke Doty**, making just his second career start at quarterback, completed 11-of-25 passes for 85 yards with a touchdown and an interception.

**THE LAST TIME THEY MET HERE:** Tavien Feaster (107) and Rico Dowdle (102) combined for 209 rushing yards, nearly matching Kentucky's entire offensive output of 212 yards, as the Gamecocks rolled to an easy 24-7 win in Columbia on Sept. 28, 2019. Feaster scored twice and Dowdle once as the Gamecocks rolled up 387 yards in the win. The Carolina defense pitched a shutout until Kentucky finally got on the board with just 2:32 left in the contest. The seven points was the fewest the Wildcats had scored against the Gamecocks since being held to three points in the 2011 contest. The Carolina win snapped a five-game losing streak in the all-time series.

**A GAME OF RUNS:** South Carolina won 10-straight games over Kentucky from 2000-2009, and 13-of-14 from 2000-2013. Since then, the Wildcats posted five-straight wins from 2014-18 and have won six of the last seven overall.

**OLD FRIEND ALERT:** Kentucky offensive line coach Eric Wolford, has logged two stints on the South Carolina coaching staff. Wolf served as the run game coordinator and offensive line coach under Steve Spurrier during the 2009 season, then returned to Columbia for four seasons (2017-20) as the offensive line coach under Will Muschamp.

## A South Carolina win over Kentucky would...

- ◆ Be the Gamecocks second in three years over Kentucky and improve their all-time record against the Wildcats to 19-13-1.
- ◆ Be the Gamecocks' ninth win in 11 games against Kentucky at Williams-Brice Stadium since the turn of the century.
- ◆ Give the Gamecocks their third win of the season, one more than their win total from 2020.

**QUICKLY:** It's the SEC home lidlifter for first-year head coach Shane Beamer as the South Carolina Gamecocks (2-1, 0-1 SEC) host the Kentucky Wildcats (3-0, 1-0 SEC) in a 7 pm ET game on Saturday, Sept. 25, at Williams-Brice Stadium (77,559) in Columbia. The SEC Eastern Division matchup will be televised nationally on ESPN2.

**OVER THE AIRWAVES:** Brian Custer will call the action for the deuce. He will be joined in the booth by Kelly Stouffer. Lauren Sisler will patrol the sidelines. The familiar voices of Carolina Hall of Famers Todd Ellis and Tommy Suggs handle the call for the Gamecock Radio Network with Jamar Nesbit on the sidelines.

**A LITTLE HISTORY:** 2021 marks the 128th season of intercollegiate football at the University of South Carolina dating back to 1892. It is the 115th consecutive year in which South Carolina has competed on the gridiron. The University did not field a team in either 1893 or 1906. Carolina owns an all-time record of 616-596-44, a .508 winning pct.

**IT JUST MEANS MORE:** The 2021 season marks South Carolina's 30th year in the Southeastern Conference. South Carolina and Arkansas joined the league prior to the 1992 campaign. The Gamecocks earned the SEC Eastern Division title in the 2010 season. The Gamecocks are 99-135-1 (.423) all-time in SEC regular-season play.

**ABOUT LAST WEEK:** South Carolina forced three turnovers but the Georgia Bulldogs showed why they were the second-ranked team in the country, as they posted a 40-13 win over South Carolina in Athens last Saturday night. JT Daniels threw for 303 yards and three touchdowns to lead the undefeated Bulldogs. **Josh Vann** turned in a second-straight big game for Carolina, catching three passes for 128 yards and a score. **Jaylan Foster** picked off two passes, giving him three on the season.

**QUARTERBACK SHUFFLE:** Former graduate assistant coach **Zeb Noland** made his third-straight start for the Gamecocks at Georgia and completed a 61-yard pass to Josh Vann on the first offensive series, but had his hand stepped on early in the contest and was unable to continue. **Luke Doty** took over the reins in his first action this season. Doty, who was the projected starter at QB, had been sidelined since suffering a mid-foot sprain in his left foot on August 13. Doty responded by going 13-for-26 for 153 yards with one touchdown and one interception. He also rushed six times for 15 yards.

**GONE GREENE:** Fifth-year senior **Sherrod Greene**, the Gamecocks' top linebacker, suffered a serious lower leg injury on the second play from scrimmage in the loss at Georgia and will be out for an extended period of time after undergoing surgery. It's the second-straight year that the season ended very early on for Greene, as he suffered a fracture in his hip in the 2020 season opener against Tennessee and missed the remainder of the season.

**VANN IS THE MAN:** Senior wide receiver **Josh Vann** continues to impress and has established himself as the Gamecocks' top wide receiver. The Tucker, Ga. native caught three passes for a career-high 128 yards in the loss at Georgia. Included was a career-long 61-yard reception on the first series from scrimmage and a 36-yard touchdown reception. He was credited with one more receiving yard than he had in the previous game at East Carolina.

**REMEMBERING DEEBO:** With back-to-back games of 127 receiving yards at East Carolina and 128 at Georgia, **Josh Vann** is the first Gamecock to record consecutive 100-yard receiving games since **Deebo Samuel** went for 112 vs Chattanooga and 210 at Clemson at the end of the 2018 regular season.

**FOSTER JUBILEE:** Sixth-year senior safety **Jaylan Foster** intercepted a pair of passes Saturday at Georgia, picking off both JT Daniels and Stetson Bennett. Foster became the first Gamecock with two interceptions in a game since **Jaycee Horn** had a pair against Auburn in 2020. With three interceptions this season, Foster is tied for second in the nation behind Boise State's Seyi Oladipo (4). The Gamecocks have had just one player (Israel Mukuamu with 4 in 2019) log more than three interceptions in a season since 2015.

**YOU GET ONE AND YOU GET ONE:** The Gamecocks have intercepted six passes this season, two in each of their three games. **Jaylan Foster** leads the way with three, while both **Jordan Burch** and **Damani Staley** have returned interceptions for scores. The Gamecocks are tied for third in the NCAA in interceptions behind only Boise State and Kent State, who each have eight. South Carolina had eight interceptions in 10 games last season.

**SO FAR, SO GOOD:** The early returns on the defense under defensive coordinator Clayton White show the Gamecocks are much improved over last year's unit, despite losing three starters (**Jaycee Horn**, **Ernest Jones** and **Israel Mukuamu**) to the NFL. The Gamecocks are surrendering just 19.0 points and 287.7 yards per game this season. Last year, Carolina allowed 36.0 points and 451.5 yards per contest. In addition, opponents are converting on 30 percent of its third-down opportunities in 2021, compared to 48 percent a year ago.

**FINISH STRONG:** The Gamecocks have been very good in the fourth quarter of their games this season. Carolina has outscored its opponents by a 27-3 margin in the final period through three contests. The Gamecocks have been outscored by a combined score of 54-52 over the first three quarters of their games so far in 2021.

**NEVER SAY NEVER:** The Gamecocks overcame a 14-0 deficit to defeat East Carolina, 20-17. The 14-point deficit was the largest that resulted in victory for the Gamecocks since they trailed Michigan by 16 points, 19-3, in the third quarter of the 2018 Outback Bowl before storming back for a 26-19 win.

## Offense

**SATT ATTACK:** The Gamecock offense is under the direction of **Marcus Satterfield**. Satterfield most recently was part of Matt Rhule's staff with the Carolina Panthers. He and Coach Beamer first knew each other as graduate assistants at Tennessee. His first outing had to be considered a huge success, as Carolina scored 46 points and rolled up 439 yards of offense on 74 plays against EIU. The offense was plagued by three turnovers at East Carolina, but came up big in the fourth quarter with a touchdown and a pair of fields goals on the final three possessions to escape with the win. The offense was challenged by one of the best defenses in the country at Georgia, but gained over 300 yards and went a respectable 8-for-17 on third-down opportunities.

**DOTY WAS QB1:** Sophomore **Luke Doty** came out of the spring as the projected starter at quarterback and did nothing to change that early in fall camp. However, he suffered a mid-foot sprain in his left foot on August 13 and missed the first two games. Doty started the final two games of the 2020 campaign as a true freshman and played in eight games overall. He completed 43-of-71 passes (60.6 pct.) for 405 yards with two touchdowns. He also rushed 41 times for 91 yards.

**DOTY'S 2021 DEBUT:** **Luke Doty** replaced an injured Zeb Noland at Georgia, his first appearance of the season. He responded by going 13-for-26 for 153 yards with one touchdown and one interception. He also rushed six times for 15 yards.

**BEEN THERE, DONE THAT:** **Luke Doty** was the Gamecock starter at Kentucky in the 2020 season finale. He was 11-for-25 for 85 yards in that contest with one touchdown and one interception. He also rushed 10 times for 29 yards, as the Wildcats posted a 41-18 win.

**STORY WORTHY OF THE BIG SCREEN:** In what could be taken straight from a Hollywood script, **Zeb Noland** transitioned from graduate assistant to active player during preseason camp following the foot injury to Luke Doty, and earned the start in the opener against Eastern Illinois. Noland, who began his career at Iowa State, then transferred to North Dakota State where he played behind his best friend, Trey Lance, joined the Carolina staff as a G.A. in late May. When Doty was injured, the wheels were put into motion to get Noland back on the field for one final season. His first practice came on Aug. 17, one day after his 24th birthday.

**IN A PREVIOUS LIFE:** **Zeb Noland** began his career at Iowa State. In two seasons in Ames (2017-18), he completed 106-of-176 passes (60.2 pct.) for 1,255 yards with six touchdowns and two picks in nine contests. His best performance came against Oklahoma on Sept. 15, 2018, when he completed 25-of-36 passes for 360 yards with two touchdowns. He played in seven games in the spring of 2021 for the North Dakota State Bison, completing 51-of-100 passes for 721 yards with five touchdowns and six interceptions.

**CAROLINA DEBUT:** **Zeb Noland** made the most of his Carolina debut, completing 13-of-21 passes with no interceptions for a pedestrian 121 yards, but threw four touchdowns, one shy of the school record, all in the first half in the win over Eastern Il-

linois. His touchdown passes came from 4-, 3-, 12- and 10-yards out. It was the first time the Gamecocks threw four TD passes in a game since Jake Bentley threw five at Clemson in 2018.

**COLONEL ZEBULIAH:** **Zeb Noland** is 2-1 as the Gamecock starting quarterback. He became the first signal-caller to post victories in each of his first two starts since Jake Bentley in 2016. He is 27-for-47 (57.4 pct.) for 406 yards with five touchdowns and one interception in 2021.

**WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU?:** **Jason Brown**, a transfer from FCS-level St. Francis (Pa.), joined the squad in the spring to compete in the quarterback room. He played in 18 games, making a dozen starts for the Red Flash, completing 253-of-411 passes (61.6 pct.) for 3,124 yards with 28 touchdowns and just six interceptions. He was QB2 in the season opener and saw second-half action, completing 4-of-5 passes for 45 yards. He did not appear in the win at East Carolina and got in one snap, an incomplete pass, at Georgia.

**AN EMBARRASSMENT OF RICHES:** New running backs coach **Montario Hardesty** inherited a room that could be as talented as just about any in the country. **Kevin Harris**, **MarShawn Lloyd**, **ZaQuandre White**, and **Juju McDowell** provide Hardesty with four viable options.

**WHITE DOES NOT MEAN INVISIBLE:** Not talked about a lot by the media, but **ZaQuandre White** has done nothing but impress the new coaches since they've come aboard with his enthusiasm and competitive nature. A running back who started his career at Florida State, White is looking to make a mark in his fifth collegiate season. He carried just 16 times a year ago for 59 yards, but was instrumental on special teams.

**MORE ON QUAN:** **ZaQuandre White** started the first two games at running back. He is the Gamecocks' leading rusher with 167 yards gained on 22 carries, an average of 7.6 yards per tote. In the season opener against Eastern Illinois, he turned in the best game of his career, rushing 12 times for a career-high 128 yards, including a 63-yard touchdown burst up the middle early in the fourth quarter. He was also the team's top receiver with four catches for 39 yards, accounting for 167 all-purpose yards.

**OPENING DAY BESTS:** Here are the top opening day individual rushing performances in South Carolina history:

**HARRIS HAS MADE HISTORY:** Junior **Kevin Harris** burst onto the scene a year ago, rushing for 1,138 yards in just 10 games, earning first-team All-SEC accolades while leading the conference in rushing. He entered the season as the school's career leader in rushing average per carry at 6.4 for those backs with at least 1,000 career rushing yards. He is tied for 10th on the school's all-time list with 19 rushing touchdowns. He ranks 29th in school history with 1,371 career rushing yards. Alex Hawkins is 28th with 1,490. Harris was slowed in fall camp after have a minor procedure on his back and was

not dressed for the opener due to illness. He carried seven times for 23 yards at East Carolina and rushed 16 times for 31 yards in his first start of the season at Georgia.

**THAT WILL DO 'ER, LLOYD:** Gamecock fans waited patiently for the debut of **MarShawn Lloyd**, who suffered a knee injury on the second day of fall camp in 2020. Lloyd was a highly-regarded talent when he joined the squad. Lloyd, a redshirt freshman, is the self-proclaimed "Lightning" to Harris's "Thunder." He responded with a team-high 14 carries for 55 yards in his debut against EIU and added 21 yards on seven carries at East Carolina before rushing five times for 19 yards at Georgia.

**WHO DOESN'T LOVE JUJU?:** One of the favorites among his teammates in fall camp was freshman running back **Juju McDowell**. McDowell brings a different dimension to the attack. He carried a dozen times for 42 yards in his collegiate debut versus Eastern Illinois, then boasted a game-high 71 yards on 11 carries at East Carolina, including 46 in the fourth quarter, along with a 63-yard kickoff return, setting up the game-tying score. He did not get a touch at Georgia.

**JUJU ON THAT BEAT:** When the East Carolina game was in doubt, the Gamecocks turned to diminutive running back **Juju McDowell**. The freshman responded, leading all rushers in the game with 71 yards on 11 carries, including 46 yards on seven carries in the final period. McDowell had a 63-yard kickoff return midway through the 4th quarter that set up the game-tying field goal, then had runs of 15 and 16 yards in the game's final possession, setting up the game-winning field goal. His 63-yard kick return was the longest for a Gamecock since Deebo Samuel raced 90 yards to paydirt on the opening kick against Ole Miss in 2018.

**STEPPIN' INTO THE WR1 ROLE:** Senior **Josh Vann** has become the go-to receiver under new wide receivers coach Justin Stepp, coming out of the shadows of **Deebo Samuel**, **Bryan Edwards** and **Shi Smith**. Vann has shown excellent hands and has the most career catches among the wideouts with 57 career receptions. He had a pair of catches for 27 yards with a touchdown in the season opener against EIU, then had the best game of his career at East Carolina, catching five passes for 127 yards, his first 100-yard receiving game. He topped that with a three-catch, 128-yard, one touchdown effort at Georgia. For the season, he is tied for the team lead with 10 catches for a team-high 282 yards, an impressive 28.2-yard average, with a pair of scores.

**AMONG THE SEC LEADERS:** **Josh Vann** ranks fourth in the SEC in receiving yards per game at 93.7. He is ninth in the conference in all-purpose yards, averaging 100.0 per game and is eighth in yards per catch at 28.2, logging more catches (10) than anyone else in the top-10 in that category.

**BROOKS IS NOT DONE:** **Jalen Brooks** returns for his second year at Carolina and looks to improve after catching 11 passes a year ago. His journey started at Wingate, then he spent a semester at Tarleton State before joining the Gamecocks. He did not gain NCAA eligibility until the fifth game of the 2020 season. A deep play threat, Brooks showed his ability with a highlight-reel one-handed catch at Georgia, finishing the night with three catches for a career-high 54 yards. He has four receptions for 72 yards in 2021, 18.0-yards per catch.

**DK IS BETTER THAN OK:** Junior **Dakereon Joyner**, who began his Gamecock career at quarterback, continues to make strides at wide receiver. He was the co-Offensive Player of the Spring and can make plays with the ball in his hand. The Gamecocks targeted him five times in the opener and he also rushed three times out of the shotgun formation. He caught five passes in the win at ECU, including a touchdown grab on a 13-yard reception that tied the game late in the third quarter. He also rushed twice from the quarterback position. He caught a team-high four passes at Georgia and is tied with Vann for the team lead with 10 receptions on the season.

**THE PIZZA MAN DELIVERS:** **Trey Adkins**, who was delivering pizzas to help pay for his tuition as a walk-on wide receiver, was placed on scholarship for the 2021 season. Adkins, who was sidelined with a knee sprain for much of fall camp, caught a 19-yard pass in the season opener. He has caught six career passes for 97 yards, a 16.2-yard average.

**GO DEEP YOUNG MAN:** Georgia Tech transfer **Ahmarean Brown** brings the ability to stretch the field. In two seasons in the ACC, Brown averaged 18.1 yards per catch with eight touchdowns. He tied Calvin Johnson's mark for most receiving TDs by a freshman at Tech with seven in 2019. He has three receptions this season for 21 yards.

**AN ORTRE SIGHTING:** **OrTre Smith** is back and could be a "wild card" in the receiving corps. He caught 30 passes as a freshman in 2017, but has just 12 catches since, as injuries have taken a toll. He caught a 15-yarder in the season opening win.

**NICK'S MUSINGS:** "Super Senior" **Nick Muse** is back for another campaign. A preseason All-SEC tight end candidate who began his career at William & Mary, Muse caught 30 passes a season ago, most among the returning players. His best performance came in the Georgia game last year when he caught eight passes for 131 yards. He caught two passes for 15 yards and a touchdown in the opener against EIU, and also scored on a two-point conversion. For the season he has five catches for 26 yards.

**IT TOLLS FOR THEE:** Regarded as a "Swiss Army Knife," sophomore **Jaheim Bell** could lineup just about anywhere on offense. Listed as a tight end, Bell showed he could also run the ball effectively in the spring game. He caught two passes for 11 yards and a touchdown and rushed twice for 16 yards in the opener against EIU, but also had a 65-yard TD run called back. He caught a 48-yard pass in the win at ECU.

**EXPERIENCED O-LINE:** New offensive line coach **Greg Adkins** has experience to work with, as eight of his linemen have made starts for the Gamecocks. The starting five at Georgia of LT **Jakai Moore** (9 starts), LG **Jaylen Nichols** (7), OC **Eric Douglas** (14), RT **Jovaughn Gwyn** (24) and RT **Dylan Wonnum** (27) have combined for 81 starts. **Jazton Turnetine** (5 starts), **Hank Manos** (2) and **Vershon Lee** (1) have also earned a starting assignment. Only nine schools have more offensive linemen who had started games entering the 2021 season than the Gamecocks' eight. Gwyn and Wonnum have both received some preseason All-SEC recognition.

## Defense

**4-2-5 IS RIGHT WITH WHITE:** New defensive coordinator **Clayton White** brings a 4-2-5 scheme to Columbia. A three-time nominee for the Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach, White most recently served as the defensive coordinator at Western Kentucky. He had an impressive debut, as his unit blanked Eastern Illinois while limiting the Panthers to just 109 total yards, 31 on the ground and 78 through the air. His unit was nearly as effective at East Carolina, allowing just 268 yards (152 through the air and 116 on the ground). 75 of those yards came on a trick play on the first play of the game.



**PICK-SIX DEJA VU:** The Gamecock defense scored on a pick-six in each of the first two games. In the opener, it was defensive end **Jordan Burch** who picked off a pass and rumbled 61 yards to paydirt in the Eastern Illinois win. That was Carolina's first pick-six since Israel Mukuamu went 53 yards for a score at Georgia in 2019 and the first for a Gamecock defensive lineman since Devin Taylor raced 48 yards at Arkansas in 2011. Linebacker **Damani Staley** got the Gamecocks on the scoreboard with just a minute left in the first half on a 63-yard interception return against East Carolina. The Gamecocks are tied for third in the country with two defensive touchdowns. Iowa and Wyoming lead the nation with three. The two interception returns for touchdowns is the most for Carolina in a season since 2017.

**JUST THE SACKS, MA'AM:** South Carolina has recorded eight sacks this season, including a season-high five against East Carolina. That was the most sacks in a game for the Gamecocks since they notched five against Akron on Dec. 1, 2018.

**THIRD DOWN IS OUR DOWN:** After limiting Eastern Illinois to 0-of-9 and East Carolina to 2-of-16 on third-down conversions, Georgia was able to convert 9-of-12 third-down opportunities. For the season, South Carolina ranks 22nd in the nation in third down defense, allowing just a 29.7 percent (11-of-37) conversion rate.

**BEST MARKS SINCE:** The 109 yards of offense allowed in the opener against Eastern Illinois was the best since holding Kentucky to 96 in 2011. The 31 yards rushing was the low mark since UCF ran for just 26 in 2015. The 78 yards passing was the lowest since Vanderbilt had just 76 in 2019.

**LONG LIVE THE KING:** Senior EDGE **Kingsley (JJ) Enagbare** gained most of the off-season attention, and rightly so. A 2020 first-team All-SEC selection, Enagbare has not rested on his laurels, but was named the 2021 Rex Enright Defensive Player of the Spring for Carolina Football. With 19.5 career tackles for loss including 13.0 sacks, He is just two sacks shy of moving into a five-way tie for ninth on the school's all-time career sacks list. Enagbare has put himself in position to possibly become the third Gamecock defensive player in as many years to be an NFL first-round draft pick, following in the shoes of Javon Kinlaw (49ers) and Jaycee Horn (Panthers).

**WHY JJ?:** **Kingsley Enagbare** was tagged with the nickname "JJ" as a youngster in deference to the children's television series Jay Jay the Jet Plane.

**GETTING IN THE SACK:** The Gamecocks have an aggressive defense that is able to cause havoc in the backfield and get to the quarterback more frequently. EDGE rusher **Kingsley Enagbare** is a returning All-SEC selection, and the Gamecocks added the nation's sack leader from a season ago in **Jordan Strachan**. Enagbare led the Gamecocks with 6.0 sacks, ranking second in the SEC with 0.75 sacks per game a year ago. Strachan had a Georgia State school record 10.5 sacks, tying for first in the FBS.

**THREE IN DOUBLE FIGURES:** The Gamecocks have three players who have recorded double-digits in career sacks with **Kingsley Enagbare** (13.5), **Jordan Strachan** (11.5) and **Aaron Sterling** (11.0) all in double figures. South Carolina and Colorado are the only two FBS schools that can boast three players with 10-or-more career sacks.

**MEET YOU AT THE QB:** The Gamecocks have eight sacks this season, notching two in the season opener against Eastern Illinois, then recording five at East Carolina and one at Georgia. **Kingsley Enagbare** (2.5) and **Brad Johnson** (2.0) lead the way. Here are the career sack numbers:

**BRAD IS A BAD MAN:** Fifth-year senior linebacker **Brad Johnson** is off to a big start this season. He had a nice performance in the opener against EIU, collecting a pair of tackles for loss including a sack. He followed that up with a game-high nine tackles at East Carolina, including his second sack of the season. He is third on the squad with 13 tackles.

**REVAMPED SECONDARY:** The defensive secondary took the biggest hit in the offseason, as Jaycee

Horn and Israel Mukuamu both gave up their eligibility to turn pro while Jammie Robinson, John Dixon and Shilo Sanders all elected to transfer. The Carolina coaches hit the transfer portal hard and brought in several players who could contribute immediately, including **B.J. Gibson** (Navy) **Carlins Platel** (Assumption), **Tyrese Ross** (Washington State), and **David Spaulding** (Georgia Southern). Platel, Ross and Spaulding are all listed on the two-deep and see regular playing time.

**TOP COVER CORNER:** **Cam Smith** has established himself as the Gamecocks' top cover corner. Despite missing much of camp with an injury, Smith has acquitted himself nicely in the first three games, collecting 12 tackles and a team-leading three pass breakups.

**FOSTER HAS BEEN BANANAS:** "Super Senior" **Jaylan Foster** is off to an outstanding campaign. The former walk-on who began his career at Gardner-Webb, leads the team with 16 tackles from his safety position and leads the SEC and is tied for second in the NCAA with three interceptions.

**PICK THIS:** The Gamecocks have intercepted two passes in each of the first three games, including a pair of pick-sixes by **Jordan Burch** and **Damani Staley**. With six interceptions, the Gamecocks are tied for third in the NCAA behind only Boise State and Kent State, who each have eight. Carolina had eight interceptions in 10 games last season. ## Special Teams

**BEAMER BALL 2.0:** "Beamer Ball" is alive and well in Columbia, as the Gamecocks blocked not one but two Eastern Illinois punts in the season opener, both credited to **Debo Williams**, who was making his collegiate debut and was named the SEC Co-Freshman of the Week for his efforts. Williams, a 6-1, 235-pounder from Smyrna, Del., became the first SEC player to record two blocked punts in a game since Florida's Chris Rainey accomplished the feat in 2010. The Gamecocks had not blocked a punt since the 2014 season. With two blocked punts, the Gamecocks are one of six schools that are tied for the NCAA lead in that category.

**BIG RETURNS:** The Gamecocks got a big 63-yard kickoff return from **Juju McDowell** to set up the game-tying field goal midway through the fourth quarter in the win at East Carolina. The return was the longest for a Gamecock since Deebo Samuel raced 90 yards to paydirt on the opening kick against Ole Miss in 2018. The Gamecocks rank 26th in the country in kickoff return average at 25.2 yards per return.

**WHITE ON THE MONEY:** **Parker White** is the first four-year returning starter in school history. He took advantage of the NCAA ruling to allow him to return for a sixth year and fifth season. White is

on a quest to become the school's all-time leading scorer. With 311 points, he needs 49 more to surpass Elliott Fry's school record of 359 points scored. He has converted 40-of-45 (88.9 pct.) field goal attempts from inside 40 yards and owns a career long of 50 yards. He is tied for second among active kickers with 61 career field goals. White owns six fourth-quarter or overtime game-winning field goals in his career, providing the deciding points in wins over Louisiana Tech (2017), Tennessee (2017), Missouri (2018), Tennessee (2018), Georgia (2019) and East Carolina (2021).

**PARKER'S BEEN PERFECT:** Parker White has been perfect so far this season, connecting on all five field goal attempts and all six of his extra point attempts. He is the Gamecocks' leading scorer with 21 points.

**HIGH PRAISE:** Parker White was recognized as the SEC Co-Special Teams Player of the Week following his performance at East Carolina. He connected on a 39-yard game-tying field goal with 6:46 remaining in the contest, then converted a 36-yard field goal as time expired to lift the Gamecocks to the win. Carolina had trailed the entire game until White's game-winner. It marked the second time that White has been recognized by the SEC. He was also named the Co-SEC Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance in the 2018 win over Missouri when he hit on all three of his field goal attempts on a soggy field, including a 33-yard game-winner with two second remaining.

**KROEGER KICKS IT:** Sophomore Kai Kroeger handles the punting chores. The second-year punter was named to the SEC Coaches' all-Freshman team in 2020. He averaged 43.3 yards per punt with a long of 53 yards in 2020. He registered seven punts of 50 or more yards, put eight of his 39 punts inside the 20 and had just 2 touchbacks. So far this season, Kroeger has punted 15 times for a 41.3-yard average with a long of 52 yards. Kroeger also handles the holder duties on placements with short snapper Matthew Bailey and placekicker Parker White. He is considered one of the top holders in the country.

## Miscellaneous

**RING THE BELL:** **Shane Beamer** got off to a 2-0 start as the South Carolina head coach. He became the first coach to win his first two games since Richard Bell got off to a 2-0 start in 1982. The last head coach to win his first three games at South Carolina was Billy Laval in 1928.

**BIG SCORE:** The Gamecocks lit up the scoreboard for 46 points against the outmanned EIU Panthers in the season opener. It was the most points scored by Carolina since they tallied 72 in a 72-10 rout of Charleston Southern on Sept. 7, 2019.

**PITCHING A SHUTOUT:** The Gamecocks recorded their first shutout in the opener against EIU since August 28, 2008, a 34-0 win over NC State. The Gamecocks were one of five FBS teams to pitch a shutout in its opener, joining Boston College, NC State, UAB and Virginia.

**CASE FOR THE DEFENSE:** The Gamecocks held EIU to just 109 yards of total offense. It was the fewest allowed by the Gamecocks since Kentucky logged just 96 yards on Oct. 8, 2011.

**FEELS LIKE THE FIRST TIME:** Seven players made their first start in a Gamecock uniform in the win over Eastern Illinois, including **Jaheim Bell**, **Zeb Noland** and **Zaquandre White** on offense and **Marcellas Dial**, **Jaylin Dickerson**, **Darius Rush** and **David Spaulding** on defense.

**THE POWER OF FIVE:** Since the turn of the century, the Gamecocks have a 48-4 mark against teams not currently in a Power-5 conference. The only four losses in that stretch came to UConn in the 2010 Papajohns.com Bowl, to The Citadel in 2015, to South Florida in the 2016 Birmingham Bowl and to Appalachian State in 2019. It should be noted that UConn was in the Big East, which was a BCS automatic qualifier during the 2009 season.

**THEY'RE BACK:** The Gamecocks had 49 returning letterwinners to open the 2021 fall season. The lettermen consist of 22 offensive players, 23 on defense and four special teams players.

**START HERE:** The Gamecocks list 14 returning starters from the 2020 squad, seven on offense, five on defense and both specialists. The returning offensive starters are OC **Eric Douglas**, RG **Jovaughn Gwyn**, RB **Kevin Harris**, WR **Xavier Legette**, LT **Jakai Moore**, TE **Nick Muse** and RT **Dylan Wonnum**. The returning defensive starters are DT **Jabari Ellis**, DE **Kingsley Enagbare**, DT **Zacch Pickens**, S **RJ. Roderick** and LB **Damani Staley**. The specialists are P **Kai Kroeger** and PK **Parker White**.

**IT'S A NUMBERS GAME:** Carolina returned 86 percent of its rushing yards, 23 percent of its passing yards and 60 percent of its receiving yards from 2019. **Kevin Harris** (1,139 yards) is the top returning rusher, while **Nick Muse** (425 yards) is the top returning receiver. The Gamecocks top returning passer is **Luke Doty** (405 yards). Three of the squad's top eight tacklers return for the 2021 season, including **Damani Staley** (51 tackles), **Jaylan Foster** (43) and **Zacch Pickens** (35). **Kingsley Enagbare** returns after leading the team in tackles for loss (7.0) and sacks (6.0), while **Cam Smith** was one of three Gamecocks to log two interceptions.

**SUPER SENIORS:** The Gamecocks list eight players whose eligibility would have expired had not the NCAA allowed the 2020 season to be a "free" year. Those "super" seniors are LB **Spencer Eason-Riddle**, DT **Jabari Ellis**, DB **Jaylan Foster**, TE **Nick Muse**, QB **Zeb Noland**, LB **Damani Staley**, EDGE **Aaron Sterling** and PK **Parker White**.

**ONE FOR THE THUMB:** With the NCAA rule allowing for an extra year, three Gamecocks - LB **Damani Staley**, EDGE **Aaron Sterling** and PK **Parker White** - can become the first players in school history to letter five times in their career.

**UTILIZING THE PORTAL:** The Gamecocks' roster features 10 scholarship transfers, including seven who enrolled at Carolina in January. The list includes WR **Ahmarean Brown** (Georgia Tech), QB **Jason Brown** (St. Francis, Pa.), DT **Keem Green** (Nebraska), WR **E.J. Jenkins** (St. Francis, Pa.), DB **David Spaulding** (Georgia Southern), EDGE **Jordan Strachan** (Georgia State) and LB **Debo Williams** (Delaware). QB **Zeb Noland** (North Dakota State), DB **Carlins Platel** (Assumption) and DB **Tyrese Ross** (Washington State) joined the roster in the fall.

**COACH SPEAK:** The SEC Coaches tabbed EDGE **Kingsley Enagbare** to their preseason All-SEC first-team unit. RB **Kevin Harris** was a second-team selection, while TE **Nick Muse** and DL **Zacch Pickens** were selected to the preseason third-team unit by the league's 14 coaches.

**WEARING THE PATCH:** Nineteen Gamecocks, have their undergraduate degrees in hand. The list includes: **Wyatt Campbell**, **Devontae Davis**, **Eric Douglas**, **Jabari Ellis**, **Kingsley Enagbare**, **Jaylan Foster**, **Spencer Eason-Riddle**, **Sherrod Greene**, **Tyreek Johnson**, **Hank Manos**, **Sean McGonigal**, **Zeb, Noland**, **Carlins Platel**, **Darius Rush**, **OrTre Smith**, **Damani Staley**, **M.J. Webb**, **Parker White** and **Dylan Wonnum**. Eason-Riddle has both a bachelor's and master's degree.

**NFL TIES:** **Dylan Wonnum** is the younger brother of former Gamecock, D.J. Wonnum, who is with the Minnesota Vikings. **Damani Staley** is the son of former South Carolina and NFL standout Duce Staley. Duce is currently the assistant head coach/running backs coach for the Detroit Lions. **Landon Grier's** father, Chris, is the general manager of the Miami Dolphins.

**FAMILY TIES:** Walk-on running back **Bruce Staley** is the first-cousin of **Duce Staley**, **Damani Staley's** father.

LEXINGTON, KY. (AP) — Chris Rodriguez Jr. rushed for three touchdowns, Terry Wilson and A.J. Rose each rushed for one, and Kentucky rolled South Carolina 41-18 Saturday night in the regular season finale for both schools.

Looking to halt a two-game slide and remain in consideration for the postseason, the Wildcats (4-6, 4-6 Southeastern Conference) scored on five of their first seven possessions to lead 27-3 at halftime. Their highest first-half output this season was aided by 10 points off two of their three takeaways, including two fumble recoveries by Jordan Wright.

Rodriguez returned from a two-game absence to rush for first-half TDs of 1 and 2 yards around Rose's 8-yard score before sealing the rout with a 79-yard burst down the left side with 4:56 remaining. Wilson added a 1-yard TD run early in the third quarter as the Wildcats outgained the Gamecocks (2-8, 2-8) 492-404.

Wilson, the senior quarterback, finished 17 of 26 passing for 201 yards and rushed for 46 to break 1,000 career. Rodriguez had 139 yards on 14 carries and Rose 101 on 14 carries as Kentucky dealt South Carolina its sixth consecutive loss.

Kevin Harris rushed for 210 yards and a touchdown on 21 carries to become the 11th Gamecock with 1,000 in a season. Luke Doty's 30-yard TD pass to Dakereon Joyner and two-point conversion to Nick Muse with 5:12 left made it 34-18 before Rodriguez's big TD run.

GAME CHANGER

South Carolina looked to get on the board on its first possession, but a holding call negated the score and led to a missed field goal. Kentucky had a field goal on its first possession, scored 10 points in the first frame and had 27 in the first half on its way to victory.

KEY STAT

1,138 – Kevin Harris became the ninth Gamecock to reach 1,000 yards in a season as the Hinesville, Ga., native rushed for 210 yards on 21 carries in the Kentucky game. Harris now has 1,138 yards in 2020 and it's the 11th time a Gamecock has had 1,000-plus rushing yards in a season. Harris also rushed for 200-plus yards for the second time this season (245 vs. Ole Miss).

**COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP)** — Rico Dowdle and Tavien Feaster like sharing the football, especially when it leads to South Carolina victories like this.

Dowdle and Feaster, the Gamecocks' two senior tailbacks, both ran for more than 100 yards and accounted for three touchdowns as South Carolina (2-3, 1-2 Southeastern Conference) snapped a five-game series losing streak to Kentucky with a 24-7 victory Saturday night.

Dowdle had 102 yards and a 30-yard TD while Feaster had 107 yards and scoring runs of 2 and 19 yards in a dominant win over the Wildcats (2-3, 0-3).

The Gamecocks also ended a run of six consecutive losses to Power Five opponents. And they did it just the way coach Will Muschamp wanted with an effective running attack.

Dowdle surpassed the century mark for the second time in three games.

Feaster gave South Carolina a second 100-yard rusher with 107 yards (67 in the final period) and touchdown runs of 2 and 19 yards. It's the first time the Gamecocks had a pair of 100-yard rushers in SEC play since 2001 when Andrew Pinnock and Derek Watson did it in a win over Vanderbilt with Lou Holtz as coach.

Feaster won a pair of national titles with Clemson, but wanted a new setting where he could showcase the skills that made him a five-star prospect coming out of high school. It had been slow going at times for South Carolina's run game this season until the breakthrough against Kentucky.

The win "proves a lot," Feaster said. "Just that hard work and dedication will take you far. Even if the results weren't immediate, just keep pushing, keep fighting."

The Gamecocks certainly did, pressuring Kentucky quarterback Sawyer Smith throughout and giving up just 111 yards total the first three quarters. The Wildcats broke up a shutout on Chris Rodriguez's 2-yard scoring run with 2:32 left in the game.

"This was a commanding win and that's what we needed going into an off week," Muschamp said.

Kentucky last started SEC play with three losses in 2013.

The Wildcats had averaged better than 200 yards rushing against South Carolina during the win streak. They managed just 115 yards on the ground in this one.

Kentucky coach Mark Stoops said Smith was dealing with injuries and struggled to move the ball.

"We need to hit the reset button and get some guys healthy," he said. "And get some of these mistakes that we're making corrected."

**GAME CHANGER**

Rico Dowdle gave the Gamecocks a 17-0 lead just 1:01 into the second half with a 30-yard touchdown run. Dowdle also moved over 2,000 career yards rushing in the Kentucky win.

**KEY STAT**

269 — The Carolina running game had a pair of 100-yard runners (Tavien Feaster 107, Rico Dowdle 102) and had 269 total yards on the ground in the Kentucky win. It was the second time this season that the Gamecocks had a pair of 100-yard runners.

# SHANE BEAMER



Shane Beamer, considered to be one of the rising stars among coaches in college football, was named the University of South Carolina's 36th head football coach on Dec. 6, 2020.

Beamer, 44, has been an assistant coach at seven Football Bowl Sub-division schools for 21 seasons. During his career, he has coached in 17 bowl games, including a College Football Playoff National Championship Game, has posted 18 non-losing seasons, six of those with double-digit victories and his teams have won 63.0 percent of its games.

Beamer has been a part of building programs throughout his career. He has been a part of three coaching staffs, where the head coach was in his first or second season at the school. He joined Sylvester Croom's staff at Mississippi State in his first season, Kirby Smart's program at Georgia in his first season, and Lincoln Riley's unit at Oklahoma in his second season.

He comes to Carolina from Oklahoma, where he has served as the assistant head coach for offense, coaching tight ends and H-backs, for the last three seasons. In 2020, Oklahoma ranked sixth in the country in scoring (43.0), 11th in total offense (494.7) and 14th in passing offense (315.0). The Sooners led the nation in yards per play (8.0) and ranked third in total offense (537.6) and fourth in passing efficiency rating (187.0) in 2019. Oklahoma led the nation in total offense (570.3), scoring offense (48.4) and yards per play (FBS-record 8.6), and ranked second in passing efficiency rating (194.9) in 2018.

The Charleston, S.C. native, returns to one of his previous coaching stops, having been with the Gamecocks for four seasons (2007-10). In 2007, he served as the outside linebackers coach and co-special teams coordinator. He mentored the cornerbacks in 2008, then coached the Spurs and strong safeties and was both the special teams coordinator and recruiting coordinator in 2009 and 2010 under Steve Spurrier.

In 2009 at South Carolina, Beamer was nominated for the Frank Broyles Award, which goes annually to the nation's top assistant coach. His special teams' units recorded five blocked kicks that season, tying for the SEC lead and tying for the eighth-highest total in the nation. He also helped coach a defensive unit that ranked third in the SEC and 15th in

the country in total defense, and second in the league and eighth in the country in passing defense.

As the Gamecocks' recruiting coordinator, his 2009 class was ranked 12th-best by both Rivals and Scout, and the 2010 and 2011 classes were ranked in the Top 25.

During Beamer's tenure as recruiting coordinator at Carolina, nine of his signees were selected in the NFL draft. Those include first round selection Stephen Gilmore (Buffalo Bills) and second round selections Alshon Jeffery (Chicago Bears) and D.J. Swearinger (Houston Texans).

The Gamecocks all-time winningest quarterback, Connor Shaw, and rushing touchdown leader, Marcus Lattimore, were also in the 2010 class.

Prior to his arrival in Norman, Beamer spent two seasons on the staff at Georgia as tight ends coach and special teams coordinator under Kirby Smart. The Bulldogs posted a 21-7 combined record with Beamer on staff. In 2017, the Bulldogs won the SEC Championship and finished second in the nation, falling in the CFP title game to Alabama in overtime. His special teams ranked eighth nationally in net punting (41.7), and 20th in kickoff returns (23.5) while blocking four kicks.

The son of Hall of Fame coach, Frank Beamer, he worked with his father as the associate head coach and running backs coach at Virginia Tech from 2011-15. In his first year, he coached David Wilson, who broke the Tech single-season rushing record and was named All-American and ACC Player of the Year and went on to become a first-round NFL draft selection by the New York Giants. Shane served as the Hokies' acting head coach in the 2014 Military Bowl win while his father watched from the press box following throat surgery.

Beamer's first full-time coaching position was at Mississippi State, joining the Bulldogs in 2004 as cornerbacks coach and recruiting coordinator. In his first two seasons at State, he guided three defensive backs to SEC All-Freshman Team accolades. He maintained the recruiting coordinator title but made the move to running backs coach in the spring of 2006 where he tutored running back Anthony Dixon to SEC All-Freshman honors.

Beamer spent three seasons (2001-03) as a graduate assistant at Tennessee, helping with the cornerbacks, coaching the placekickers, punters, and long snappers, and assisting in all special teams areas. He also oversaw game opponent scouting while earning a master's degree in sport management in December 2003.

Before joining the staff at Tennessee, he worked one season (2000) as a graduate assistant at Georgia Tech, helping with the Yellow Jacket quarterbacks and wide receivers.

A 2000 graduate of Virginia Tech, Beamer was a member of five bowl teams (1995-99 seasons) and three Big East Conference championship squads on the Hokie football team as a long snapper and wide receiver. He was a long snapper on the 1999 Tech team that played for the BCS National Championship.

Beamer and his wife, Emily, are the parents of three children - two daughters, Sutton and Olivia, both born in Columbia, and a son, Hunter, born in Blacksburg, Va.

**COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP)** — South Carolina coach turned quarterback Zeb Noland threw for four touchdowns on 13 completions as the Gamecocks beat Eastern Illinois 46-0 on Saturday night.

It was the debut for South Carolina coach Shane Beamer. He promised “Beamer Ball” just like his dad Frank Beamer played at Virginia Tech and his team delivered, holding the Panthers (0-2) to 109 yards and getting its first shutout in 13 years.

The Gamecocks version of Beamer Ball blocked two punts, picked off two passes with one going back for a 61-yard touchdown, ran a successful two-point trick play with the kicking team on the field after their first touchdown, converted all three fourth downs it tried including a fourth-and-goal from the 3, had two sacks and hit hard.

“People talk about Beamer Ball — that’s what it was. You have the ability to score on offense, defense or special teams no matter who is on the field. We want to have that mentality,” Shane Beamer said.

Beamer, 44, brought joy and enthusiasm to a team that had lost six in a row and 11 of its past 14 games — at least for a night and against a Football Championship Subdivision opponent.

Beamer won his opener with an unusual quarterback. Noland came to Columbia this spring to be a graduate assistant after playing seven games for North Dakota State in a season delayed to spring 2021 because of COVID-19.

Chris Katrenick was 13-for-22 for 78 yards and Tyler Hamilton caught five passes for 32 yards for Eastern Illinois.

**GAME CHANGER**

Jaheim Bell caught a 3-yard pass from Zeb Noland with 5:04 left in the first, giving Carolina a 15-0 lead on its way to the shutout of the Panthers. It was Bell’s first career touchdown.

**GREENVILLE, N.C. (AP)** — Parker White kicked a 36-yard field goal as time expired as South Carolina rallied from 14 down to beat East Carolina 20-17 on Saturday, earning its first road win under first-year coach Shane Beamer.

Damani Staley had a 63-yard interception return for a touchdown just before halftime to give the Gamecocks a needed spark after trailing 14-0 in a mistake-filled opening half. Former graduate assistant Zeb Noland also had a game-tying touchdown pass to Dakereon Joyner in the back of the end zone late in the third quarter.

In the end, the Gamecocks (2-0) did enough to give themselves a shot, then rode the legs of Juju McDowell - who gained 45 yards on six carries on South Carolina's final 10-play drive - to set up White's winner that had the Gamecocks spilling onto the field from the sideline to celebrate.

South Carolina won despite committing three turnovers in its first five drives, including a goal-line fumble that went through the end zone for a turnover in the first half.

Tyler Snead hit on a 75-yard trick-play touchdown pass to Jsi Hatfield on the game's first offensive snap for the Pirates (0-2), while Holton Ahlers also ran for a short touchdown for the 14-0 lead. But East Carolina struggled to generate consistent offense, with Ahlers completing 11 of 24 passes for just 77 yards and two interceptions.

The Pirates were hosting a Southeastern Conference team for the first time since South Carolina's last visit here in 1997.

The Gamecock defense stopped East Carolina on a 3rd-and-5 to force a punt, giving the Gamecocks the ball for its game-winning drive. Jaylan Foster and David Spaulding made the tackle to hold ECU's Tyler Snead to just a one-yard gain.

**ATHENS, GA. (AP)** — JT Daniels returned to the lineup with three touchdown passes, Georgia's fearsome defense nearly made it three-straight games without allowing a TD and the No. 2 Bulldogs romped to a 40-13 victory over South Carolina on Saturday night.

Daniels completed 23-of-31 for 303 yards, including scoring throws of 43 yards to Jermaine Burton, 38 yards to freshman Adonai Mitchell and 4 yards to James Cook.

Georgia (3-0, 1-0 Southeastern Conference) finally gave up a touchdown while on defense when Luke Doty, getting the ball on the Bulldogs' side of the field after a fumble, connected with Josh Vann on a 36-yard touchdown pass with 10:55 remaining.

To that point, the only touchdown against Georgia this season had come on an interception return.

With Doty playing for the first time this season, South Carolina (2-1, 0-1) gave up three sacks and a safety, along with two turnovers that led to Georgia touchdowns.

Daniels sat out a 56-7 victory over UAB with an oblique injury, watching as backup Stetson Bennett tied a school record with five touchdown passes.

Daniels wasted no time re-establishing his hold on the No. 1 spot, completing a 21-yard pass to Brock Bowers on his very first snap and guiding the Bulldogs to the end zone on their first two possessions.

Bennett got a shot the third time the Bulldogs had the ball. He promptly threw an interception that was returned to the Georgia 12, setting up a field goal.

Daniels returned to the game and didn't leave until early in the fourth quarter with the outcome no longer in doubt.

After punting the ball away in the closing seconds of the first half and content to settle for a 21-6 lead, Georgia wound up scoring five more points.

Backed up on their own 1, the Gamecocks explicitly attempted to throw out of the end zone. Doty was sacked by Jordan Davis and Nolan Smith for a safety.

Then, after receiving the free kick, Daniels completed three passes for 39 yards to set up Jack Podlesny's 36-yard field goal as time expired, sending Georgia to the locker room up 26-6.

Georgia put it away in opening minute of the second half, again sparked by a huge defensive play.

Doty's pass was picked off by Derion Kendrick, who returned it to the South Carolina 20. Zamir White ripped off a 15-yard run, then took it in from the 5 to pad the lead to 33-6.

Cook had two touchdowns, also scoring on a 23-yard run.

**GAME CHANGER**

Jaylan Foster picked off a JT Daniels pass at the Georgia 47 and returned it 35 yards to the Bulldog 12. Carolina was not able to punch it in the end zone, as Parker White's 27-yard field goal made it 14-6 Georgia with 1:34 left in the first quarter. The Bulldogs responded with a second quarter touchdown drive, a safety and a field goal as the Gamecocks did not get any closer in their first loss of 2021.
