STORY LINES

LAST TIME OUT

Behind running back Tyler Badie's 248 all-purpose yards and linebacker Blaze Alldredge's 6.0 sacks, the Mizzou Tigers bested Central Michigan, 34-24, in Game 1. Connor Bazelak was 21-of-32 for 257 yards and two touchdowns. Keke Chism led all receivers with four catches for 47 yards. The long catch of the day - 69 yards - came from D'ionte 'Boo' Smith on the first play of the game, setting up Badie's 12-yard touchdown run. Alldredge led all defenders with 10 total tackles and 6.0 tackles for a loss of 35 yards.

SERIES VS. KENTUCKY

- The Tigers' 2020 win over the Wildcats was Mizzou's first since 2014.
- Mizzou trails the all-time series with Kentucky, 7-4, and the Wildcats have won five of the last six meetings dating back to the 2015 season, however three of those setbacks have been by eight points or fewer.
- Mizzou won the first three meetings with UK when it joined the league, winning 33-10 in 2012, 48-17 in 2013 and 20-10 in 2014, winning a pair of SEC East titles in that span.

LAST TIME OUT: KENTUCKY

The Wildcats are coming off a 45-10 win over ULM on Sept. 4. Will Levis passed for 367 yards and four touchdowns. The Cats held the Warhawks to 87 total yards (70 passing, 17 rushing) in the game. ULM had 43 yards on its first drive of the game, then 44 yards the rest of the game.

THE "BELL HORSE" BADIE

- Senior running back Tyler Badie isn't a bell cow or workhorse, no, he's the best of both worlds, a "Bell Horse" as the dual threat back closes in on history.
- Badie is 141 receiving yards away from becoming the first Mizzou player to ever record 1,000 yards rushing and 1,000 yards receiving.
- In the season opener, Badie showed he was more than ready to step into the feature back role, toting the rock 25 times for a career-high 203 yards.
- The 203-yard performance was the first by a Tiger since Larry Rountree III went for 204 in Dec. 2018 against Oklahoma State.
- Badie's 203 rushing yards are the fourth most in the nation (yards/gm) to start the season. The total leads all SEC backs after week one. His 248 all-purpose yards rank fifth in the country and also lead the SEC.
- His 203 rushing yards in the season opener are the 15th most in Mizzou history.
- Badie surpassed the 2,000-yard mark in all-purpose rushing yards (2,198) and the 2,500-yard plateau in overall all-purpose yards (2,718).
- The senior grew stronger as the game progressed, reeling off his career long 69-yard run in the game-sealing drive late in the fourth quarter.
- The senior has a shot at Mizzou history in 2021, needing just 181 receiving yards to become the first Tiger to ever go for 1,000 yards rushing and 1,000 yards receiving in his career.
- Badie is already one of five Tigers to accumulate 500 yards on the ground and receiving alongside:

BLAZE-ING INTO THE BACKFIELD

- Graduate transfer Blaze Alldredge had a memorable debut in the Black and Gold, recording 3.5 sacks and a team-leading seven pressures.
- The 3.5 sacks were the most by a Tiger since 2006 when Brian Smith set the school record with four sacks against New Mexico.
- Alldredge is just the 10th Mizzou player to record three or more sacks in a single game since the year 2000.
- His 3.5 sacks paced a Mizzou defense that racked up nine total sacks in the game, the most since at least 2000.
- Alldredge leads the country in TFL (6.0), sacks (3.5) and sack yardage (32). He is second in the nation in TFL yardage (35).

STORY LINES

MEVIS MAGIC

- Sophomore kicker Harrison Mevis started his season with a bang, drilling a 53-yard field goal in the waning seconds of the first half to give Mizzou the lead. The kick was a career-long from Mevis and had plenty of leg to spare.
- Mevis is now 4-for-5 in his career from beyond 50 yards through his first 11 collegiate games.
- The kicker finished 2-for-2 on field goals, also hitting from 44 yards and a perfect 4-for-4 on extra points.
- His 53-yard kick is tied for the second longest in the country this season.
- Mevis has now made 10 consecutive field goals, a streak that ranks second in the SEC and fifth in the country.
- Affectionately nicknamed the Thicker Kicker by Mizzou's drove of fans on social media, capped a memorable freshman campaign by being named a Lou Groza Award semifinalist.
- In 2020, Mevis was successful on 17-of-20 field goals for the Tigers and a perfect 28-of-28 on PATs. He was 3-of-4 kicks from 50+ yards and is one of just four Tigers in program history to make three or more kicks of 50+ yards, joining Tom Whelihan (6, 1984-87), Jeff Jacke (4, 1988-92) and Tucker McCann (3, 2016-19).
- He matched a school record for a kicker with five field goals against Arkansas, the most by any kicker nationally las season, and reset the school record by scoring 20 of Mizzou's 50 points in the 50-48 win.
- Mevis became the first Mizzou player this century to make five or more field goals in a game, including a 50-yard attempt, with a 100 percent conversion rate, per the Sports Reference play index.
- Mevis ranked 12th nationally in field goals made per game (1.7) and eighth nationally with his 17 makes.

EVANS MAKES IMPACT

- Tulsa transfer Akayleb Evans was a notable addition to the Mizzou secondary on opening day, defending three passes including recording his first career interception.
- Evans ranks third in the country with his trio of passes defended and the total leads all players in the SEC after one week.
- According to PFF, Evans was targeted 11 times by the Chippewas but ceded just three completions for 55 yards.
- In his previous four years at Tulsa, Evans recorded 11 pass breakups. His single-season high is four, set in 2018.

BAZELAK STARTS STRONG

- Redshirt sophomore Connor Bazalak picked up right where he left off in 2020, going 21-for-32 for 257 yards and two touchdowns against Central Michigan.
- The 257 yards marked the fourth time Bazalak has thrown for 250 or more yards in a game.
- Bazalak and the Tigers jumped out of the gate fast, hitting a 63-yard shot on the first play of the season. The pass was the second-longest of Bazalak's career (69 yards – 2020 vs. LSU).

BOO'S BIG PLAY

- Senior Boo Smith was on the receiving end of Mizzou's electric first play, hauling in the 63-yard strike which set up a two-play touchdown drive.
- The 63-yard catch nearly doubled Smith's career yardage, after he hauled in eight passes for 65 yards.
- Smith added another reception to record just his second game with multiple catches as a Tiger. The only previous occurrence was a six-catch performance against LSU last season.

YOUNG FINDS PAYDIRT

- Sophomore Elijah Young ripped off a 32-yard scamper for his first collegiate touchdown against Central Michigan.
- Young, who saw action in seven games and recorded 10 rushes as a freshman in 2020 showed Tiger fans the 1-2 punch in the backfield is going nowhere after the departure of Larry Rountree to the NFL last season.
- The 32-yard run is the second-longest for Young in his Mizzou career. He went for 35 yards against Vanderbilt a season ago.

SPREADING THE LOVE

- Nine different Tigers hauled in a reception against Central Michigan on 21 completions.
- The game marked the sixth time in 11 games under Coach Drinkwitz that the Tigers have had nine players catch a pass.
- Six Tigers recorded multiple catches in the season opener, led by four receptions each from Keke Chism and Mookie Cooper.
- Badie recorded three catches for 40 yards out of the backfield, including a 30-yard touchdown. The running back has now caught a pass in 23 of the past 24 games.
- Tight end Niko Hea pulled in the other touchdown pass, earning his third career TD reception.

McKINNISS A WEAPON

- Veteran punter Grant McKinniss was stellar against the Chips, landing four of his six punts inside the 20 while adding two 50-yard kicks.
- Only one of the punts was returnable, going for just a single yard.
- McKinniss hit a 53-yard punt, one of two over 50 in the season opener. His 42.5-yard average ranks third among SEC punters through the first week.
- McKinniss will return to Kentucky this week where he played three seasons for the Wildcats from 2016-2019.

JEFFCOAT READY TO BUILD ON 2020

- Defensive end Trajan Jeffcoat produced a breakthrough season in 2020, recording 6.0 sacks and seven QB hurries en route to an All-SEC selection from both the coaches and media at season's end.
- His 6.0 sacks ranked second in the SEC last season and were the most by a Mizzou DE since Charles Harris produced 9.0 in 2016.
- Jeffcoat earned a second team All-SEC nod in the 2021 preseason honors and is also on the Bronco Nagurski watch list headed into the fall campaign.
- His 2020 sack total gave Mizzou a player with five or more sacks for the eighth straight season and the 22nd time in the past 23 years.

PRESEASON PROGNOSTICATIONS

- Mizzou was picked fourth in the SEC East by the media heading into the 2021 season.
- Tigers Michael Maietti and Trajan Jeffcoat were named to the media's preseason All-SEC teams.
- In the coaches' version of All-SEC preseason honors, four Tigers earned spots on the recognition list:

 QB Connor Bazalak – third team
 C Michael Maietti – third team

BAZELAK BACK FOR MORE

- In his first season leading the Tigers' offense, Connor Bazelak earned SEC Co-Freshman of the Year honors. Then a redshirt freshman, Bazelak threw for 2,366 yards while completing 67.3 percent of his passes.
- Bazelak was named SEC Freshman of the Week on three different occasions while leading the Tigers to a 6-3 record as the starting QB.
- In Mizzou's victory over LSU, he threw for 406 yards and four touchdowns. Bazelak was 29-of-34 in the game and earned Davey O'Brien Quarterback of the Week and a Manning National Star award as a result of his performance.

VETERAN TRANSFERS ON D

- Mizzou's defense gained three veteran playmakers over the offseason with the additions of Blaze Alldredge, Akayleb Evans and Allie Green IV. Combined, the trio brings over 70 career starts to Columbia.
- Alldredge started every game over the past two seasons at Rice and started eight games in his first season with the Owls. The veteran linebacker earned the George Martin Award in each of the past two years, becoming the first defensive player in school history.
- Alldredge was a two-time C-USA first team selection by the league coaches. He also excelled in the classroom, earning CoSIDA Academic All-District honors in 2020.
- Evans and Green are no stranger to one another, as both join the Tigers after playing starring roles in the Tulsa secondary. Green started 25 games for the Golden Hurricane while Evans made 23 starts in his Tulsa career.
- In 2020, the duo combined for 57 tackles, four pass breakups and an interception. The defensive backs made 3.5 tackles for loss as well in the nine-game Tulsa season.

- Mizzou returns 20 starters from a season ago, eight on offense, eight on defense and four special teamers.

- Mizzou blocked three kicks in the 10-game 2020 season. The total led the SEC and ranked seventh in the country. The Tigers pulled off an impressive feat, blocking each type of kick once in the season.
- The Tigers blocked an LSU field goal in Mizzou's 45-41 win over the Bayou Bengals. Mizzou also knocked down an Arkansas extra point in a 50-48 win.
- Mizzou's third blocked kick of the season came in the form of a punt against Georgia.

30+ CLUB

- Mizzou returns a pair of 30-catch receivers from the 2020 season in Keke Chism and Tauskie Dove.
- Chism led all Tigers in the 2020 season with 35 catches for a team-leading 458 yards. He was also the most efficient pass catcher, averaging 13.1 yards per catch on the year.
- Dove, meanwhile, finished with exactly 30 receptions on the year for an even 300 yards. He was one of four Tigers to average 10 yards per catch with at least 10 receptions.
- 31 of Chism's receptions came in the final six games of the season. The wideout had five or more receptions in five of the Tigers' final six contests.

ELIAH DRINKWITZ

A winner at every stage of his coaching career, Eliah Drinkwitz – considered one of college football’s top offensive minds – was introduced as Mizzou’s 33rd head football coach in December of 2019, and despite all the challenges presented by the COVID-19 pandemic, led his 2020 Tigers to a 5-5 record against an All-SEC slate.

Drinkwitz, who took over the Tiger program following an impressive 2019 season at Appalachian State that saw the 20th-ranked Mountaineers win the Sun Belt Conference title en route to a 12-1 record, joined Warren Powers as the only head coaches in Mizzou history to earn a bowl bid in their first season patrolling the sidelines in Columbia. Drinkwitz joins Frank Broyles, Dan Devine and Powers as the only first-year Mizzou head coaches to reach five victories in year one of their Tiger tenures.

Picked to finish sixth in the SEC East Division by many preseason pundits and projected to win only two or three games at most against the All-SEC schedule, the Tigers split their 10-game league slate at 5-5 to finish third in the SEC East, with four of the losses coming at the hands of teams that were ranked at

kickoff and three that finished at No. 1 (Alabama), No. 7 (Florida) and No. 8 (Georgia) in the final College Football Playoff ranking, while a fourth loss came in week two at then-No. 21 Tennessee. Mizzou’s five SEC wins are the second-most ever behind its 7-1 mark that it posted en route to winning back-to-back SEC East crowns in 2013 and 2014.

Despite playing with less than 60 scholarship players for more than half of their games in 2020 and having just three games played on their original dates, the Tigers overcame an 0-2 start to win five of their final eight games down the stretch, a run that included:

- A goal-line stand in the closing minute to hold off defending National Champion LSU, 45-41.
- Snapping Kentucky’s five-game series win streak with a 20-10 victory that wasn’t nearly as close as the final score indicated.
- Mizzou’s first win in Columbia East since 2014, a 17-10 decision at South Carolina and a thrilling come-from-behind 50-48 walk-off victory over Arkansas, its fifth-straight in the series.
- An appearance at No. 25 in the College Football Playoff rankings Dec. 7, only the third season the program has appeared in the CFP’s seven-year run.

Of the SEC’s four new head coaches to begin work in the nation’s toughest conference in 2020, Drinkwitz’s 5-5 regular-season record was the league’s best, ahead of Ole Miss’ Lane Kiffin (4-5), Mississippi State’s Mike Leach (3-7) and Arkansas’ Sam Pittman (3-7). In addition, Drinkwitz and his staff signed a top-25 recruiting class currently ranked No. 20 by Rivals.com (highest ranking in program history) to help secure a promising future for the storied Mizzou program.

Drinkwitz’s offensive acumen has been a key element in his team’s winning five conference championships while compiling a perfect 8-0 bowl game record in 11 seasons at the FBS level. The combined record of his teams from 2010-20 is 103-39 overall (.725), including a 62-27 conference mark (.687).

The 2019 campaign saw Drinkwitz turn in one of the most impressive FBS head coaching debut seasons ever. His Mountaineers set a Sun Belt record with their 12 wins, and also set the mark for the best regular season in conference history (11-1). They claimed the Sun Belt Championship with a 45-38 win against Louisiana on Dec. 7.

Also in 2019, App State became the first-ever Sun Belt program to earn a top 20 ranking in the Associated Press poll, while also becoming the first team in league history to receive an in-season ranking in the College Football Playoff poll. Drinkwitz’s team also made history in 2019 with a pair of Power 5 road wins (at bowl-eligible North Carolina, and later at South Carolina) – making it the first-ever Sun Belt team to register two Power 5 wins in a season. In all, the Mountaineers claimed an FBS-best six road wins en route to becoming the first-ever 12-win team among North Carolina’s FBS members.

For his efforts, Drinkwitz was named a finalist for the 2019 Eddie Robinson Award, a prestigious award which goes annually to the nation’s top coach. He was also named the North Carolina Coach of the Year by the North State Journal.

App State proved to be one of the nation’s most balanced teams in 2019, thanks in large part to an efficient offense that ranked ninth nationally in scoring (39.4 points per game), coupled with a stingy defense that ranked 22nd nationally in points allowed (20.2 ppg). The Mountaineers also excelled in the critical turnover category, ranking eighth nationally in 2019 with a plus-12 turnover margin. App State junior running back Darrynton Evans was named the Sun Belt Offensive Player of the Year, after rushing for 1,323 yards and 17 touchdowns.

Prior to App State, Drinkwitz spent three years as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for record-setting NC State teams (2016-18), after excelling in a similar role at Boise State for two years (2014-15), where the Broncos won the Mountain West title in 2014 and finished 12-2 and ranked 16th nationally. In 2015, Drinkwitz was promoted to offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach, and he helped the Bronco offense rank in the top 15 nationally in points (39.1) and yards (501.3) per game.

Before Boise, Drinkwitz was a key figure in back-to-back Sun Belt Championships in 2012-13 as running backs coach and co-offensive coordinator at Arkansas State. He got his first taste at the FBS level in the Southeastern Conference, as he served as a quality control assistant at Auburn for the 2010-11 seasons. The Tigers won the SEC in 2010, and went on to the BCS Championship that season with a perfect 14-0 record.

Following a 7-6 season in 2016 at NC State, Drinkwitz helped the Wolfpack to consecutive nine-win seasons (2017-18) for the first time since 1991-92. With an average of 35.6 points per game under his direction in 2018, NC State had a 1,000-yard rusher for the third-straight year, two 1,000-yard receivers and a quarterback with nearly 4,000 passing yards. The Wolfpack made a steady rise from 63rd nationally in total offense in his first season in 2016 to 25th in 2017 and 16th in 2018. He was a Broyles Award nominee as one of the nation’s top assistant coaches in his final year with the Wolfpack.

The Wolfpack offense had six players selected in the 2018 and 2019 NFL Drafts combined, including record-setting quarterback Ryan Finley, who was a fourth-round selection in 2019 by the Cincinnati Bengals.

In his six seasons as an offensive coordinator and head coach, Drinkwitz has produced five 1,000-yard rushers, four 3,000-yard passers and four 1,000-yard receivers. Three of those years (2015, 2017, 2018) his offenses produced at least one in each category.

Drinkwitz, 38, graduated magna cum laude and was the student body president at Arkansas Tech (bachelor’s, education) before beginning his coaching career at the prep level in his hometown of Alma, Ark., in 2005. He and his wife, Lindsey (Sivils), have four daughters: Addison, Emerson, Ella and Parker Lynn.
