- Vanderbilt plays its final home contest of the 2021 season on Saturday when Kentucky visits Nashville. Kickoff is set for 6 p.m. CT on ESPN2. The Commodores will sport black helmets for the first time this season, along with black jerseys and pants for a blackout game.
- Prior to the game, head coach Clark Lea and the Vandy football program will recognize 30 seniors who are on pace to graduate from Vanderbilt this year.
- Vanderbilt ranks among the nation's leaders in interceptions, with 11 in nine games this season. The Dores have recorded at least one interception in the last six games, marking the third-longest streak since at least 1996. The longest stretch in that time frame is eight consecutive games with an interception from late in the 1997 season into the 1998 campaign.
- Prior to having one interception against Missouri, Vanderbilt had secured two picks in four straight games. It marked the first time since 2011 Vanderbilt has recorded multiple interceptions in four straight games. That season, the Commodores recorded 14 interceptions over the first four games of the year against Elon, UConn, Ole Miss and South Carolina.
- As a team, Vanderbilt has recorded 11 interceptions this season. That mark is tied for 15th in FBS and third in the SEC. The 11 picks are more than the last two seasons combined for Vanderbilt (two in 2020 and six in 2019).
- With three interceptions on the season, Dashaun Jerkins is tied for third in the SEC in the category and he is one of just seven players in the conference with three or more interceptions this season. With two interceptions each on the year, Ethan Barr, Jaylen Mahoney and Maxwell Worship join Jerkins in a group of 26 players in the league with multiple interceptions this year.
- Vanderbilt is the only team in the SEC to have four different players with multiple interceptions this season.
- Freshman running back Patrick Smith had a breakout performance against Missouri, rushing for 95 yards and a touchdown, with a long rush of 19 yards. That marked the second performance of at least 75 rushing yards for the rookie, who went for 75 at Florida. With 38.8 rushing yards per game in SEC play, Smith ranks second among all freshmen in the league in that category.
- Sophomore quarterback Mike Wright continued to help the Commodore offense find big plays against Missouri. Wright had a 70-yard rush in the third quarter to mark Vanderbilt's longest play from scrimmage on the year. Wright also broke a 69-yard run in the first quarter and connected on three passes of at least 15 yards.
- Wright made his first career start in a heartbreaking road loss to South Carolina on Sept. 16. Wright rallied the Commodores from a 14-3 deficit to a 20-14 lead before the Gamecocks scored with 37 seconds left to win the game, 21-20. Wright was 11-for-21 for 206 yards and a touchdown, while rushing for 41 yards. Wright started in place of an injured Ken Seals, who is week-to-week.
- The Commodore defense helped Vanderbilt rally at South Carolina, keeping the Gamecocks off the board for 10 straight drives during the game. During that stretch, Vandy forced four punts, had two interceptions, recovered two fumbles and turned it over on downs once. The four takeaways were the most in a game for the Vanderbilt defense since Sept. 8, 2018 against Nevada.
- The Vanderbilt offense found explosiveness for the first time on the season at South Carolina. The Dores completed three passes longer than 40 yards in the game. Mike Wright connected with Cam Johnson for 44 yards and Will Sheppard for 50 yards in the opening quarter before hitting Sheppard for a 52-yard touchdown in the third quarter. At the time, those plays constituted the three longest plays of the season for Vanderbilt. The Dores had not had a play from scrimmage longer than 40 yards entering the South Carolina game.
- The UConn victory was the first home win for head coach Clark Lea. The Vanderbilt graduate recorded his first career win at Colorado State on Sept. 11.
- In Lea's first six games at Vanderbilt, the Commodores have snapped several inherited streaks. Vandy's win at Colorado State snapped an 11-game losing streak, as well as a 10-game road losing streak and a 13-game losing streak versus FBS foes. The UConn win snapped an eight-game losing streak at Vanderbilt Stadium.

- This marks the 94th meeting between Vanderbilt and Kentucky.
- The Commodores and Wildcats have met annually since 1953.
- The Vanderbilt-Kentucky series ranks 15th among most frequently played in the SEC. The Commodores have played only two schools more frequently: Tennessee (115) and Ole Miss (96).
- Vanderbilt controlled the infancy of the Kentucky rivalry, holding a 16-0-1 record against the Wildcats in the first 17 games played (1896-1938).

1901 • In a 22-0 win, Vanderbilt back John Tigert scored one of the Commodores' three touchdowns. Later, Tigert would go on to become a Rhodes Scholar, University of Florida president and U.S. Commissioner of Education (1921-28). He also served as a professor at the University of Kentucky, where he worked as the Wildcats' head basketball coach in 1913 and head football coach from 1915-16. Tigert was elected to the College Football Hall of Fame in 1970.

1940 • With Vanderbilt head coach Red Sanders ill in the hospital, fans poured on the field to salute Vanderbilt players after a 7-7 tie with favored Kentucky. Filling in for Sanders was Vanderbilt assistant/line coach Paul "Bear" Bryant. Six years later, Bryant accepted the Kentucky head coaching position, guiding the Wildcats to a 60-23-5 record in eight years.

1970 • Down 17-0, the Commodores roared back behind quarterback Steve Burger and end Jeff Peeples to score 18 second-half points in a 18-17 road victory.

1995 • Tailback Jermaine Johnson rushed for 137 yards and Damian Allen hit Kenny Simon with a touchdown pass in the fourth to help Vanderbilt claim its fifth straight in the series.

2000 • Quarterback Greg Zolman and right end Tom Simone hooked up for a 7-yard touchdown pass with 1:34 left to give Vanderbilt a 24-20 win.

2003 • Three touchdown passes from Jay Cutler gave Bobby Johnson his first SEC victory as Vanderbilt's head coach.

2005 • A classic in the series due to individual performances from both teams. Kentucky back Rafael Little produced 372 all-purpose yards. Vanderbilt quarterback Jay Cutler set team records with 39 completions and five touchdown passes - all to freshman receiver Earl Bennett, who tied a SEC

mark in the process.

2008 • Vanderbilt reached six victories and bowl eligibility behind versatile D.J. Moore, who put together one of the most remarkable performances in Commodore and SEC history. Moore posted two interceptions as a cornerback and two catches for touchdowns as a receiver.

2011 • Behind the rushing of Zac Stacy and the catching of Jordan Matthews, the Commodores earned their sixth victory of the season with a 38-8 home victory over the Wildcats. Stacy produced 135 rushing yards and three touchdowns, while Matthews had 131 yards on six catches. The Vanderbilt defense also held Kentucky to nine first downs and just 32 rushing yards.

2015 • Using trick plays and two interceptions from linebacker Oren Burks, the Commodores upended Kentucky 21-17. The winning touchdown came off the "Sneaky Pete" trick play - a 37-yard pass from quarterback Kyle Shurmur to wideout Caleb Scott.

- The UConn victory saw **Will Sheppard** make his first career touchdown grab, while **Rocko Griffin** posted his first career rushing touchdown and **Maxwell Worship** made his first career interception.
- Linebacker **De'Rickey Wright** and wide receiver **Devin Boddie Jr.** made their first collegiate starts against Stanford. Vanderbilt has had seven players make the first career start this season.
- Running back **Re'Mahn Davis** recorded his first touchdown with one-yard burst against the

COMMODORE COMEBACK

- After falling behind to an early 14-0 deficit, Vanderbilt scored 21 unanswered points en route to claiming a 24-21 win at Colorado State on Sept. 11.
- $\bullet \ \, \text{Before the win over the Rams, Vanderbilt's last time overcoming a 14-point deficit in a win was Nov. 26, 2016, against Tennessee. The Commodores battled back from a 21-7 deficit to claim a 45-34 victory over the Volunteers.$

STREAK BREAKERS

- The Commodores snapped an 11-game losing streak with a 24-21 win over Colorado State. Before the win over the Rams, Vandy's last win came against East Tennessee State on Nov. 23, 2019, marking a span of 659 days between victories.
- Versus Kentucky, Vanderbilt will attempt to snap an 18-game SEC losing streak. Vandy's last SEC win came against Mizzou, 21-14, on Oct. 19, 2019 at Vanderbilt Stadium.
- Vanderbilt also snapped a 10-game road losing streak with the win against Colorado State, as Vandy's last win on the road came at Arkansas on Oct. 27, 2018, a span of 1,051 days.
- The victory marked the first career win for first-year head coach **Clark Lea**.
- Vandy then broke an eight-game home losing streak with its win over UConn.

FINDING RIG PLAYS

- Vanderbilt has started to find big offensive plays in recent weeks, with the four longest pass plays to two longest running plays of the season coming in the last three games.
- After not completing a pass longer than 40 yards during the first six games of the season, **Mike Wright** connected with **Cam Johnson** for a 44-yard gain in the first quarter.
- Less than five minutes later, Wright hit Will Sheppard for a 50-yard gain.
- Wright again found Sheppard for 52-yards and a touchdown in the third quarter.
- Vanderbilt also had four runs of over 10 yards, with Wright's third-quarter run of 15 yards marking the longest rush of the day.
- Wright then found **Devin Boddie Jr.** for a 61-yard completion against Mississippi State.
- Against Missouri, Wright broke a pair of massive runs. He went for 69 yards in the first quarter before topping that with a 70-yard rush in the third quarter.

WRIGHT TAKES FLIGHT

- Sophomore quarterback Mike Wright made his first career start at South Carolina in place of injured OB Ken Seals.
- \bullet Wright was 11-for-21 for 206 yards and a touchdown passing, while adding 41 rushing yards.
- He completed Vanderbilt's three longest pass plays of the summer and rallied the Commodores from a 14-3 deficit to take a 20-14 lead before the Gamecocks scored with 37 seconds left to secure the victory.

GETTING GOING ON THE GROUND

- Vanderbilt put together its best rushing performance of the season against Stanford, posting its first 100-yard rusher of the season and running for nearly 250 yards as a team.
- **Rocko Griffin Jr.** ran for 104 yards against the Cardinal, becoming the first Vandy rusher to eclipse 100 yards since **Keyon Henry-Brooks** against Kentucky in 2020.
- Griffin paced the Commodores who ran for 247 yards in the game. It was the highest rushing total in a game for Vandy since the Texas Bowl at the conclusion of the 2018 season (287 rushing yards).
- In paving the way for that performance, Vanderbilt's offensive line earned a 79.8 runblock rating from Pro Football Focus. It marks the second-best run-block rating for the Commodores since the start of the 2019 campaign (24 games).

PASSING PAST THE HUSKIES

- The 333 passing yards by **Ken Seals** helped Vandy top UConn, 30-28. Seals was 27-for-40 passing with two touchdowns.
- It was just three yards shy of a career-best for Seals, who threw for 336 yards against Mississippi State in 2020.
- Seals is now one of seven Vanderbilt signal callers to have multiple games of at least 330 passing yards since 1946.

- Vanderbilt wide receivers Will Sheppard and Chris Pierce Jr. both eclipsed 100 receiving yards in the victory over UConn. Sheppard made eight catches for 119 yards and two touchdowns. Pierce caught nine paces for 103 yards.
- It marked the first time since Nov. 26, 2016 the Commodores had two 100-plus-yard receivers in the same game. Trent Sherfield (184 yards) and Caleb Scott (117 yards) both reached that mark against Tennessee.

SECOND-YEAR SUCCESS FOR SHEPPARD

- After playing sparingly during his rookie season, sophomore wideout **Will Sheppard** is having an elevated impact for the Vanderbilt offense in his second year.
- Sheppard had a breakout performance in the win over UConn, hauling in eight catches for 119 yards and two touchdowns. Chris Pierce was the last Vandy receiver with multiple touchdown receptions in one game, grabbing a pair against Florida in 2020.
- He then had three catches for a career-high 120 yards and a touchdown at South Carolina.
- On the season, Sheppard leads the team with 35 receptions and 457 receiving yards.

ROCKO'S MODERN EMERGENCE

- Sophomore running back **Rocko Griffin Jr.** is taking on a bigger role following a season ending injury to **Re'Mahn Davis** against Stanford.
- Griffin ran for 77 yards and his first career touchdown in Vanderbilt's win over UConn. He scored for the second time in three games as part of a 57-yard performance at South Carolina and went for 107 on the ground against Stanford.
- He is the team's leading rusher with 296 yards on 89 carries.

BODDIE PRDUCES IN DEBUT

- Junior wide receiver **Devin Boddie Jr.** made his Vanderbilt debut in the Commodores' season opener with East Tennessee State.
- Boddie was targeted three times, registering catches in all three of his targets, while finishing with 33 receiving yards on the night.
- The junior wideout followed up the season opener with a career-high six-catch performance at Colorado State.
- He had is first career touchdown reception against Stanford, hauling in a three-yard pass from **Ken Seals** to tie the game at 14 in the second quarter.
- On the season, Boddie has tallied 27 catches for 254 yards, with both totals ranking third on the team.

FIRST CAREER STARTS

- Seven Commodores on the offensive side of the ball have made their first career starts across 2021
- Three Commodores made their first career starts in the season opener, as the duo of sophomore **Will Sheppard** (WR) and senior **Michael Warden** (OL) earned their first-ever starts against East Tennessee State, while transfer **Re'Mahn Davis** earned his first start at Vanderbilt.
- At Colorado State, the tight end duo of senior Gavin Schoenwald and junior Brayden Bapst made their first career starts.
- Boddie made his first start against Stanford and made a touchdown reception against the Cardinal
- Delfin Xavier Castillo made his starting debut at left guard against Mississippi State.
- RB Patrick Smith made his first start against Missouri, running for 95 yards and a score.

A RECORD-SETTING ROOKIE

- A year ago **Ken Seals** established the Vanderbilt record for passing yards by a freshman with 1,928 and 300-yard passing games by a freshman with three.
- Seals' four 300-yard passing games are tied for the fifth most in a Commodore career.

QUADRUPLE-DOUBLE THE PICKS

- For the first time since 2011, Vanderbilt's defense produced multiple interceptions in four consecutive games.
- Most recently, Jaylen Mahoney and Dashaun Jerkins each intercepted a pass against Mississippi State.
- Ethan Barr and Jerkins each recorded their second interceptions of the season at South Carolina.
- Jerkins was joined by Elijah McAllister in recording interceptions the week prior versus No. 18 Florida
- Maxwell Worship and Gabe Jeudy-Lally recorded interceptions in the win over UConn on
- The last time Vanderbilt recorded multiple interceptions in four straight games was 2011 against Elon, UConn, Ole Miss and South Carolina.
- The streak came to an end with one interception against Missouri.
- In that same time period, this is the ninth time Vandy has had an interception in at least five straight games. The Dores had eight straight games with an interception starting with the season finale of the 1997 season against Tennessee, then stretching the first seven games of the 1998 season (Mississippi State, Alabama, Ole Miss, TCU, Western Michigan, Georgia, & South Carolina).

STUFFING THE RUN

- In holding the South Carolina rushing attack to 117 rushing yards on 32 carries, the Vanderbilt defense posted its best run-defense grade of the season per Pro Football Focus (79.3).
- It was the fewest rushing yards Vanderbilt allowed in an SEC game where the opponent attempted at least 15 runs since Nov. 25, 2017, when the Commodores limited Tennessee to 55 rushing yards on 21 attempts.
- It marked the best PFF run defense rating against an FBS opponent for Vandy since recording an 83.0 grade against the Gamecocks in 2018 (37 games).

ORJI LEADING THE WAY AGAIN

- Vanderbilt's leading tackler from 2020 is back in junior linebacker Anfernee Orji.
- Orji has led the team in tackles in five games this season, recording 13 at Colorado State, six against Stanford, seven at No. 20 Florida, nine at South Carolina and 11 versus Missouri.
- The Rockwall, Texas, native leads the team with 71 total tackles, a number which is eighth in the SEC.
- After shifting down from safety in 2019, when he had six total tackles, Orji ranked 17th in the SEC in tackles/game with 7.3 in 2020.
- Orji, a communication of science and technology major, booked a career-high 13 tackles in the season finale against Tennessee, marking the most for a Commodore during the season.
- Among underclassmen in the league last fall, Orji stood seventh in tackles/game with 7.3.

RAISING THE BARR

- After ending the 2020 season on a high note, sophomore linebacker **Ethan Barr** has continued his impressive play in 2021.
- The second-year linebacker registered at least five tackles in eight of nine games this season, including a career-best 11 in the first two games of the year.
- The Flower Mound, Texas, native is second on the team with 64 tackles. That mark places him 18th in the SEC.
- He recorded his first career interception against Georgia and his second at South Carolina.

TALE OF TWO HALVES

- After giving up 14 points to Colorado State in the first half, the Vanderbilt defense settled in to limit the Ram offense the rest of the game.
- The Commodores allowed 245 total yards on Colorado State's first five drives of the game, before holding the Rams to just 75 yards of offense on the next five drives, including two 3-and-outs.
- Vanderbilt held Colorado State to five three-and-outs across its final 10 drives of the game, while the Rams were just 2-of-8 on third downs in the second half.
- The Commodores kept Colorado State off the scoreboard in the third quarter, while holding the Rams to just 44 yards of total offense, including 12 passing yards.

BACKFIELD GATHERING

- Vanderbilt collected 9.0 tackles for loss in its win over UConn, paced by three TFLs from Anfernee Orji.
- It marked the most in a game for Vanderbilt since the Commodores made 12 tackles for loss against East Tennessee State on Nov. 23, 2019.
- The UConn performance marked the most tackles-for-loss against an FBS foe since recording 9.0 against Middle Tennessee State on Sept. 1, 2018.

MAHONEY SETTLES INTO STARTING ROLE

- Junior cornerback **Jaylen Mahoney** picked up his second career interception in the win over Colorado State. His interception set up a Vanderbilt scoring drive, as the Commodores marched down the field to even the score at 14. He made his second interception of the year against Mississippi State.
- Mahoney is third on the team in total tackles with 45 this season, including four for a loss. Last year, the Rock Hill, South Carolina, native finished second on the team in tackles with 57 in 2020, a year after totaling 23 in 12 games as a freshman.

- Anfernee Orji isn't the only Orji on the Commodore roster as his older brother, Alston Orji, is in the same position room as a fellow linebacker.
- Alston is a senior in 2021 with 22 games played and two starts, both in 2020, to go along with 22 tackles
- The youngest Orji brother, Alex, is a dual-threat high school quarterback.

MARRIED AND BACK FOR MORE

- On July 2, 2021, **Allan George** and Vanderbilt cheerleader Katlyn Richardson married at The Reserve at Fat Bottom Brewery in Nashville.
- George proposed to Richardson on Aug. 30, 2020, on a day that George said would be used to take senior photos of the two on Vanderbilt's practice field. Former Commodore linebacker **Andre Mintze** was there to record the proposal. The video that went viral upon its release
- On the field, George, now a fifth-year senior, has made 31 career tackles.

Special Teams

GAME WINNERS

- Fifth-year kicker **Joseph Bulovas** earned SEC Co-Special Teams Player of the Week honors for the second time this season after making the game-winning field goal against UConn.
- Bulvoas connected from 31 yards out as time expired to secure a 30-28 win over the Huskies. It was Vandy's first walk-off field goal since 1996 against Duke.
- It capped a 3-for-3 field goal performance in the game, making Bulovas the first Commodore kicker with three field goals in a game since 2016. Bulovas was also 3-for-3 in point-after attempts against UConn.

BULOVAS EARNS WEEKLY CONFERENCE HONORS

- Fifth-year kicker **Joseph Bulovas** was named SEC Co-Special Teams Player of the Week on Sept. 13 for his efforts at Colorado State.
- Bulovas converted the game-winning field goal from 38 yards out to help Vanderbilt pick up its first win under Clark Lea.
- The graduate transfer from Alabama connected on a 53-yard field goal in the season opener against East Tennessee State, marking the longest made field goal since Oct. 13, 2018, when **Riley Guay** connected on a 53-yard attempt against Florida.
- Only four field goals of greater length have been made in school history, with the program record of 55 yards.

SMITH CONTINUES TO SHINE

- Senior **Harrison Smith** posted a standout performance at Colorado State, punting nine times for 411 yards.
- Four of Smith's nine punts traveled over 50 yards, while three landed inside Colorado State's 20-yard line.
- The Franklin, Tennessee, native tied his career-long with a punt of 66 yards in the first quarter against the Rams. It remains the longest punt by an SEC punter this season.
- Thirteen of Smith's 60 punts this season have landed inside the opponent 20-yard line.
- A fourth team preseason all-SEC selection by Athlon, currently ranks fifth in the conference in punting average with a mark of 43.14 yards per punt.
- Smith has maintained that average while interspersing a rugby-style punt starting with the Georgia game on Sept. 25.

VANDY UNITED FUND

- In March, Vanderbilt publicly launched the Vandy United Fund, an ambitious fundraising vehicle that will invest \$300 million in Vanderbilt's student-athletes and athletics programs through major facilities and operational enhancements.
- For Commodore football, the Vandy United Fund will aid in the construction of a football operations center, which will house team-specific needs, such as meeting rooms, offices, training room, expanded locker room and more. The fund will also allow for the construction of an indoor football practice facility, including a full-length practice field, which will be adjacent to outdoor practice fields.
- Construction on the football operations center is expected to begin after the conclusion of the 2021 football season.



Dores Fall in Opener

 $NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Visiting \ East Tennessee \ State scored \ 23 \ unanswered \ points \ and \ ruined \ the Vanderbilt head coaching \ debut of \ Clark \ Lea \ with \ a \ 23-3 \ win \ at \ Vanderbilt \ Stadium.$

The Commodores (0-1) took a 3-0 lead early but couldn't dent the scoreboard after that. East Tennessee State had a 10-3 lead at the break before adding on 13 more points in the second half

Lea's team will hope to put together a stronger performance in that contest than what transpired at Vanderbilt Stadium on opening night. The Dores had 318 yards of total offense – just 82 on the ground – and were penalized eight times.

Defensively, the Dores surrendered 5.3 yards per play and registered only four tackles for loss.

Vandy had 11 offensive drives – six ended in punts, one ended with a turnover on downs, another with a field goal and three resulted in turnovers.

Vanderbilt opened the scoring with 4:15 left in the first quarter thanks to a Joseph Bulovas field goal from 53 yards out. That would be the only lead they enjoyed.

East Tennessee State retook the advantage midway through the second quarter. An 80-yard drive ended on the ninth play, a third-down pass from Tyler Riddell to Malik Murray from the 5 that gave the Buccaneers a 7-3 lead.

Tyler Keltner added to the East Tennessee State lead with a 41-yard field goal at the 2:24 mark making it 10-3.

That's the way the score looked at the half. The Commodores mustered just 130 yards of offense, had five penalties and were 2 of 9 on third down.

Keltner booted a 25-yard field goal with 8:42 remaining in the third quarter upping the East Tennessee State lead to 13-3. That completed a 10-play drive that ate 6:18 off the clock and covered 68 yards.

The Buccaneers (1-0) would take that 10-point lead into the fourth quarter.

East Tennessee State linebacker Stephen Scott ended all doubt by picking up a Ken Seals fumble and returning it 22 yards for a touchdown with 8:26 to play. That made it 20-3.

Vandy looked like it may finally punch one into the end zone late in the fourth, but Seals was picked off at the 1 yard line. Keltner added a 34-yard field goal moments later to provide the final margin.

Vanderbilt running back Re'Mahn Davis ran for 54 yards on 14 carries. Seals finished the night 20-for-34 for 195 yards.

Dores Fall in Opener

FORT COLLINS, Colo. - Joseph Bulovas drilled a 38-yard field goal with 19 seconds left and Vanderbilt beat Colorado State 24-21 at Canvas Stadium.

The victory was the first for head coach Clark Lea at his alma mater.

The Commodores (1-1) trailed 14-0 at one point, but scored 21 straight and then recovered from a late Rams touchdown to break an 11-game losing streak dating to 2019. Vandy had also lost 10 straight road games and 13 straight against Football Bowl Subdivision opponents.

Vandy started the final quarter leading 21-14 and held that lead until less than four minutes remained on the clock. But Colorado State quarterback Todd Centeio found tight end Trey McBride on a fourth-down pass from the 3 that tied the score at 21-all with 3:07 to play.

That gave the Dores plenty of time to march down the field and set up Bulovas' heroics.

Vanderbilt quarterback Ken Seals finished the night 26 of 41 for 236 yards and accounted for all three of his team's touchdowns – two passing and one rushing. Re'Mahn Davis ate up 77 yards on the ground and Anfernee Orji made a team-high 13 tackles.

Vandy's end to the night, however, was in stark contrast to its start.

Colorado State wasted no time getting on the scoreboard after the opening kickoff. A five-play, 75-yard drive ended with Todd Centeio rolling right and finding an open David Bailey in the flat for an easy 3-yard touchdown pass making it 7-0.

On the first play of the second quarter, Seals fumbled the ball away on his own 27. Two plays later Bailey split the Vanderbilt defense up the middle for a 20-yard touchdown run making it 14-0.

Vandy got right back in it before halftime thanks to a key special teams play. Allan George came off the left edge on a Colorado State (0-2) and got his hand on the kick making for a short, wobbly punt that rested at the Vandy 42.

The Commodores offense quickly took advantage and drove to the 20 – after a Colorado State personal foul penalty – and scored when Seals found Chris Pierce down the right side of the field

That allowed Vanderbilt to head into the break down just 14-7 with 30 minutes left to play.

Vandy had only 120 yards of offense, lost a fumble and have five penalties in the first half – yet found itself down a single score at halftime.

The Vanderbilt defense came big in the third quarter when Jaylen Mahoney picked off a Centeio pass at the Vanderbilt 47. That placed momentum firmly in the hands of the Commodores and Seals led the offense on a nine-play drive that ended with a 9-yard touchdown pass to Cam Johnson

With 9:36 to go in the third quarter, Vandy had tied the score at 14-all.

Seals would give the Commodores the lead four minutes later with a 1-yard plunge over left guard making it 21-14 at the 5:32 mark.

That's where the score would remain going into the fourth quarter.

Commodores Succumb to Cardinal

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Stanford quarterback Tanner McKee threw for 218 yards and two touchdowns and the Cardinal used a 13-point blitz at the end of the first half to pull away from Vanderbilt 41-23 at Vanderbilt Stadium.

The Commodores (1-2) were outscored 27-9 after having tied the game at 14-14 in the second quarter

Vanderbilt got 107 rushing yards from Rocko Griffin and 247 as a team. Quarterback Ken Seals finished 16 of 37 for 120 yards and a touchdown, but was also intercepted once. The Dores were 5-for-18 on third down.

The Cardinal averaged 7.5 yards per play in the victory.

Stanford wasted little time finding the end zone a little more than 2 1/2 minutes into the contest. A 61-yard run by Austin Jones set up the Cardinal inside the 10 before McKee took an option keeper to the right and scored untouched from seven yards out.

Vanderbilt countered immediately with a 14-play drive that resulted in a Re'Mahn Davis 1-yard touchdown run on a 4th-and-goal call. Davis was hit at the line but spun and twisted across the goal line to knot the score at 7-7 with 7:35 left in the opening quarter.

The Cardinal needed just 4 1/2 minutes to retake the lead and went ahead 14-7 on Nathaniel Peat's 21-yard touchdown sprint through the left side of the line.

Vandy's defense stood tall early in the second quarter by stuffing a 4th-and-goal run that could have put the Cardinal up two scores.

That momentum shift led to the Commodores marching 98 yards down the field with precision and poise on 14 plays, the last of which was a Seals 3-yard pass into the left corner of the end zone for Devin Boddie. That tied the game at 14-14 with 4:19 to go in the half.

Stanford (2-1) got a 46-yard field goal from Joshua Karty with 1:53 left in the quarter – and then the Cardinal defense caught a break.

Jimmy Wyrick picked off a Seals pass at the Vandy 31 and, one play later, McKee hit Brycen Tremayne with a 5-yard jump ball into the left side of the end zone.

The Cardinal weren't quite done either. A 3-and-out from the Vandy offense followed by a long Casey Filkins punt return set up Karty for a 35-yard field goal. His kick was true as time expired making it 27-14.

Stanford scored 13 points in the final 1:53 of the half, a half in which it averaged 8.9 yards per play.

After the Cardinal defense forced a punt to start the second half the Stanford offense quickly put another touchdown on the board with a four-play, 55-yard drive that was polished off by McKee's 5-yard touchdown pass to fullback Jay Symonds. The score read 34-14 after 3 1/3 minutes of the third quarter.

Neither team scored again until E.J. Smith punched in a 1-yard touchdown run with 1:44 to go. Quarterback Mike Wright found Cam Johnson for a 26-yard touchdown pass as time expired.

Davis finished with 76 yards rushing and a touchdown on 12 carries before leaving the contest in the third quarter with an injury. Jones totaled 80 yards on the ground for the Cardinal.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Visiting No. 2 Georgia put up 35 points in less than 12 minutes to begin the day and never looked back in a 62-0 win over Vanderbilt at Vanderbilt Stadium.

The Commodores turned the ball over twice in the first quarter and didn't earn a first down until the end of the opening period. Georgia scored a touchdown on each of its first five drives to leave no doubt.

Georgia opened the scoring by marching 37 yards to the Vandy 12 where tight end Brock Bowers took an end around past right end for a touchdown run making it 7-0. Three minutes later, on a third-down play, JT Daniels found Bowers on a 25-yard touchdown pass putting the Bulldogs up 14-0 midway through the opening period.

Vanderbilt return man James Ziglor fumbled the ensuing kickoff and Daijun Edwards returned it to the 4 going in. One play later Zamir White plunged in from a yard out making it 21-0.

Vandy's next offensive play evolved into a Ken Seals interception into the arms of safety Christopher Smith. Moments later Daniels found Ladd McConkey on a 12-yard touchdown pass into the right corner of the end zone making it 28-0.

McConkey put the Bulldogs up 35-0 with a 24-yard touchdown run on a reverse around left end. There remained 3:08 in the first quarter at that point.

But Vanderbilt caught its breath and settled down from there. The Commodore defense got an interception from Ethan Barr and fourth-down stop inside the five to keep Georgia off the scoreboard for much of the second quarter.

Jack Podlesny's 31-yard field goal just before halftime sent the teams to the locker room with the scoreboard reading 38-0.

Vanderbilt finished with 50 yards of offense – 44 of which were on the ground – in the first half and went 1 of 7 on third down. Georgia, meanwhile, averaged 7.6 yards per play.

The Bulldogs began the third quarter with a 29-yard touchdown pass from Stetson Bennett to Bowers. Kenny McIntosh punched in a 4-yard scoring run less than three minutes later making it 52.0

Podlesny booted a 36-yard field goal putting the Bulldogs ahead 55-0 going into the fourth quarter

Edwards scored on a 15-yard touchdown run to begin the fourth quarter putting the Bulldogs up 62-0 and providing the final margin.

Daniels finished 9-for-10 passing for 121 yards and two touchdowns. Bowers made four grabs for 69 yards and two scores.

Vanderbilt, which dropped its 14th SEC game in a row, finished with 77 total yards of offense and went 5 of 18 passing.

Bulovas at the Buzzer

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Joseph Bulovas connected on a 31-yard field goal as time expired, and Vanderbilt broke a seven-game home losing streak by defeating Connecticut 30-28 at Vanderbilt Stadium.

Bulovas' kick capped a seven-play, 47-yard drive over the final 1:07 of the game after the Commodores had seen a 27-16, fourth-quarter lead evaporate. But a personal foul on a kickoff return and a pass interference penalty on the Huskies helped Vandy slide down the field into position to win.

The winning kick snapped Vanderbilt's slide of eight home defeats in a row and nine defeats in a row at Vanderbilt Stadium against FBS opponents.

Clinging to a 17-16 lead to start the fourth quarter, Vanderbilt got a 27-yard field goal from Bulovas for a 20-16 cushion.

On the ensuing possession, Gabe Jeudy-Lally picked up his first career interception on the Vanderbilt 33 yard line with 9:43 to play. That set up a rapid, four-play scoring drive that saw Ken Seals hit Will Sheppard on a 38-yard touchdown pass to make it 27-16.

Sheppard used a double move to streak free down the right seam, then he spun free from two defenders to waltz into the end zone. Vandy looked to be in great shape.

But Connecticut answered with an impressive drive that covered 79 yards in a little less than three minutes. Steven Krajewski, on the drive's ninth play, hit Kevens Clercius with an eightyard touchdown pass with 5:21 on the clock.

Their attempt at a two-point conversion was unsuccessful, leaving the score at 27-22.

Connecticut forced a Vandy 3-and-out and then went 78 yards in less than two minutes to take a 28-27 lead on Krajewski's 17-yard quarterback keeper straight up the gut. That left 1:07 on the clock for the Commodores.

Just enough time for Bulovas' heroics.

Seals finished 27 of 40, passing for 333 yards and two touchdowns, while Sheppard caught eight balls for 119 yards and two scores.

Connecticut opened the scoring Saturday with the initial drive of the ballgame. A Joe McFadden 38-yard field goal capped a 10-play, 50-yard drive and gave the visitors a 3-0 lead.

McFadden added a 45-yard field goal at the 7:28 mark of the first quarter, putting UConn ahead 6-0.

Vandy finally dented the scoreboard four minutes later, thanks to a 39-yard field goal off the right foot of Bulovas. That completed a nine-play, 54-yard scoring drive for the Commodores.

A 26-yard touchdown pass from Seals to Sheppard – on the first play of the second quarter – gave Vanderbilt its first lead of the day. On 3rd and 8, Seals dropped back and hit Sheppard in stride down the right sideline for the score, making it 10-6.

McFadden's third field goal of the night was of the 31-yard variety and made the score 10-9 with 10:28 left in the half.

Vanderbilt answered emphatically with a 13-play drive that ate more than six minutes off the clock and chewed up 77 yards. Rocko Griffin polished off the series with a 1-yard touchdown run untouched through the left side of the line, giving the Dores a 17-9 lead.

The Huskies got some momentum back going into halftime when, faced with a 4th-and-8 from the Vandy 40, Krajewski threw a 40-yard touchdown pass to Keelan Marion.

That put the scoreboard at 17-16 in favor of Vanderbilt going into the locker room.

Vandy defense came up big twice in the third quarter with a third-down stop inside the 5 that led to a missed field goal and a fourth-down stop on its own 17 on the heels of a Seals interception. Those plays were a major reason Vandy took that 17-16 advantage into the final period.

Commodores Drop Contest at No. 20 Florida

GAINESVILLE, Fla. — Florida quarterback Emory Jones threw for 273 yards and four touchdowns and the 20th-ranked Gators ran away from Vanderbilt 42-0 at Ben Hill Griffin Stadium.

Vandy trailed just 21-0 at halftime and had knocked on the scoring door multiple times, but the Gators left no doubt over the final 30 minutes. Florida scored three touchdowns in less than seven minutes to start the third quarter to put the result out of reach for the visitors.

Vanderbilt quarterback Ken Seals threw for 192 yards. The sophomore, however, was picked off twice. Chris Pierce, Cam Johnson, Will Sheppard and Devin Boddie each had four receptions for Vandy while Patrick Smith rushed for 75 yards.

After Vanderbilt's first offensive drive went 3-and-out, the Gators scored on a 1-yard run by Dameon Pierce at the 11:16 mark. An eight-play, 78-yard drive was highlighted by a 34-yard run by Nay'Quan Wright.

Florida's second touchdown came via a 5-yard touchdown pass from Jones to Ja'Quavion Fraziars. That play capped a seven-play, 49-yard drive in a little more than 2 1/2 minutes.

Vanderbilt's defense showed some life at the end of the opening period by getting an Elijah McAllister interception. But the ensuing possession ended with a 39-yard field goal going off the left upright no good.

The Commodores' defense held Florida to 17 yards and two punts and forced that interception over the course of three drives to keep Vandy within striking distance. But a Seals pass with 5:04 left until halftime was picked out of the air by Gators linebacker Daquan Newkirk.

Three plays later Jones found Trent Whittemore on a 9-yard touchdown pass putting Florida up 21-0.

Vanderbilt showed some more resiliency and put together a 75-yard drive that took nearly 3 1/2 minutes off the clock. On the 13th play of that drive, a fourth-down call at the 2, Seals lobbed a ball into the left side of the end zone to Pierce that appeared to be a touchdown – but officials overruled the call and termed it an incomplete catch.

Thus, Florida took a 21-0 lead into the halftime break.

Vandy totaled 200 yards of offense, averaged 9.3 yards per completion and was 5 of 11 on third down in the first half, but two missed field goals, an interception and a turnover on downs were major factors in the scoreless first half.

Florida began the second half by using a fake punt run to keep a drive alive. Jones then hit Pierce on a 61-yard touchdown pass putting the Gators ahead 28-0.

Jones' fourth touchdown pass of the day, a 25-yarder to Jacob Copeland less than two minutes later, made it a 35-0 lead for Florida. A Pierce 1-yard plunge coming on the heels of Seals' second pick of the day made it 42-0 with 8:46 left in the quarter.

That proved to be the final margin.

Heartbreak in South Carolina

COLUMBIA, S.C. — Vanderbilt got 206 yards passing and 41 rushing from Mike Wright and forced four South Carolina turnovers, but a last-minute touchdown gave the Gamecocks a 21-20 win at Williams-Brice Stadium.

The Commodores (2-5, 0-3 SEC) were 96 seconds away from breaking a 12-game losing streak to South Carolina and 10-game road SEC skid, but South Carolina backup quarterback Zeb Noland came in and led and eight-play, 75-yard drive that ended with his 9-yard touchdown pass to Xavier Legette with 37 seconds left.

That proved to be the game winner.

Wright, a sophomore, got his first career start at quarterback with sophomore Ken Seals out due to injury. His efforts, coupled with a mostly dominant defensive performance almost helped change the trajectory of Vandy's season and derail recent history.

But it wasn't meant to be.

Clinging to a 17-14 lead late in the fourth, and having overcome a 14-3 deficit, an Ethan Barr interception got the Commodores the ball back with 5:08 to play. A little more than 3 1/2 minutes later Joseph Bulovas kicked a 28-yard field goal making it 20-14.

No land completed passes of 29, 15 and 21 yards to get the Gamecocks (4-3, 1-3 SEC) in position to score and win the contest.

South Carolina took the opening kickoff and put together a methodical drive that chewed up more than five minutes off the clock. Gamecocks' starting quarterback Luke Doty threw a 2-yard touchdown pass to tight end Nick Muse making it 7-0 and capping a 75-yard series.

Vanderbilt answered with a seven-play drive that stalled on the South Carolina 24. Bulovas kicked a 42-yard field goal from there making it a 7-3 game.

That bit of momentum for Vandy was short-lived as Doty hit Jaheim Bell on an 82-yard bomb putting the Gamecocks up 14-3 with 5:07 left in the opening stanza.

The Commodores settled down from there and got a big break late in the second quarter when a big Terion Sugick hit on South Carolina running back MarShawn Lloyd caused a fumble giving Vandy the ball at the 14 going in. Two plays later Rocko Griffin scored from the 1 to cut the deficit to 14-10.

That would be the way the score would read going into halftime. Vanderbilt held South Carolina to 33 yards, forced three punts, a fumble and a turnover on downs after falling behind in a 14-3 hole.

Late in the third quarter, Vandy's defense came through again thanks to a fumble caused by De'Rickey Wright and a recovery by Jaylen Mahoney. That led to a Mike Wright's 52-yard touchdown pass to Will Sheppard giving the Commodores their first lead at 17-14 with 5:17 left in the quarter.

Vanderbilt took that lead into the fourth quarter.

Anfernee Orji led the Commodores with eight tackles. Sheppard had three receptions for 120 yards and Griffin finished with 57 yards rushing.

Dores Drop Contest to Mississippi State

NASHVILLE, Tenn. — Visiting Mississippi State had five scoring drives of 10 plays or more and controlled the narrative from the outset in a 45-6 win over Vanderbilt at Vanderbilt Stadium.

Quarterback Will Rogers threw for 386 yards and completed four touchdown passes – two to Makai Polk – and the Bulldogs (4-3, 2-2 SEC) had more than 39 minutes of possession.

Vanderbilt (2-6, 0-4 SEC) mustered just 155 total yards of offense and was 1 of 11 on third down. It was the third time this season the Commodores failed to score a touchdown in a league game.

Mississippi State opened Saturday's game with a long, methodical drive that ended with a 9-yard touchdown pass from Rogers to Polk giving the Bulldogs a 7-0 lead less than four minutes into the game. Brandon Ruiz kicked a 36-yard field goal for Mississippi State later in the quarter making it 10-0.

Joseph Bulovas got Vanderbilt on the board with a 27-yard field goal on the first snap of the second quarter.

The Bulldogs added to their lead when Rogers found Polk again, this time on a 32-yard deep ball, that made it 17-3 in favor of the visitors with 9:01 left in the half.

Rogers' third touchdown pass of the half went to Rufus Harvey from six yards out. The Bulldogs took that 24-3 lead into the break.

Mississippi State put up 282 yards of offense and held possession for 22:35 of 30 first-half minutes. Vanderbilt ran just 16 offensive plays and totaled only 76 yards – zero of which were via the run.

Vandy scored the first points of the second half, a 41-yard Bulovas field goal, set up by a Dashaun Jerkins interception.

Rogers and the Bulldogs responded with a 10-play, 63-yard drive that was capped off by a 9-yard pass to Malik Heath putting Mississippi State 31-6. Jo'quavious Marks ran in a 5-yard score early in the fourth making it 38-6.

Chance Lovertich tossed a 28-yard touchdown pass to Rara Thomas with 51 seconds left to close the scoring.

Gabe Juedy-Lally and Jaylen Mahoney each had 10 tackles for the Commodores. Mahoney also had an interception.

Missouri Pulls Away from Vanderbilt

 $NASHVILLE, Tenn.-Missouri scored 13\ points in the fourth quarter to stave off Vanderbilt and win 37-28\ at Vanderbilt Stadium.$

Tyler Badie rushed for 254 yards on 31 carries for the Tigers (4-4, 1-3 SEC) and scored twice.

Vandy got 152 yards rushing and 122 passing from quarterback Mike Wright who also threw three touchdown passes. Running back Patrick Smith rushed for a career-high 95 yards.

With Missouri leading 24-21 to begin the final frame, Harrison Mevis kicked a 32-yard field goal on the first play of the quarter to up the lead to six. Nine minutes later Mevis made a 52-yarder to give the Tigers a 30-21 lead.

With 5:59 left on the clock, Vanderbilt put together a 10-play drive that ended with Wright's 6-yard touchdown pass to Cam Johnson in the right corner of the end zone. That cut the score to 30-28 with 3:11 on the clock.

But Missouri delivered the knockout blow in seconds thanks to a 73-yard run from Badie. Tyler Macon punched in a touchdown from the 2 right after that to provide the final score.

Tigers' quarterback Connor Bazelak threw for 218 yards on 22 of 28 passing.

Missouri opened the scoring Saturday with a 46-yard field goal from Mevis. A little less than five minutes later Badie capped an eight-play, 59-yard drive with a 13-yard touchdown run making it 10-0.

After a second 3-and-out by the Vanderbilt offense, Stephen Benson broke through the Vandy line and blocked a punt which was recovered by the Tigers. But one play later Maxwell Worship picked off a Tyler Bazelek pass.

Two plays later, one of which was a Wright 69-yard run, Wright pitched a 7-yard pass to Johnson for a touchdown cutting the score to 10-7.

Vandy then put together a 13-play, 84-yard drive that lasted exactly seven minutes and ended with Smith's 10-yard touchdown run on an option pitch. That gave the Dores its first – and last – lead at 14-10 with 8:42 left in the half.

With the score still reading 14-10 and with 22 seconds left in the half, Vanderbilt tried a fake field goal with kicker Joseph Bulovas trying to find running space to his right – but he was slammed down at the Missouri 39. Two Missouri pass plays later, Bazelak heaved a 45-yard desperation pass into the end where Keke Chism leapt and hauled in a half-ending touchdown.

The Tigers ran to the locker room with a 17-14 lead.

Missouri kept that same lead for much of the third quarter until Badie ran in a 15-yard score with 5:28 left in the period. That put the Tigers ahead 24-14.

Vandy answered quickly thanks, in part, to a 70-yard run from Wright. Wright then shoveled a pass to tight end Gavin Schoenwald from the 4 cutting the score to 24-21.

That set up the final and decisive fourth quarter.

Anfernee Orji led the Vanderbilt defense with 12 tackles.
