» Junior Wendell Moore Jr., is a preseason All-ACC selection that averaged 9.7 points, 4.8 rebounds and 2.7 assists last season.

» THE OPENING TIP

- » The ninth-ranked Duke men's basketball team opens the program's 117th season with a marquee showdown versus 10th-ranked Kentucky in the State Farm Champions Classic on Tuesday in New York City.
- » A match-up between two of the four winningest programs in NCAA history, Duke has won eight of the last 10 meetings with Kentucky and its 6-2 versus the Wildcats under Mike Krzyzewski.
- » The Blue Devils' 6-4 record in the 10-year history of the Champions Classic is the best of the four Blue Bloods, followed by Kentucky and Kansas (each 5-5) and Michigan State (4-6).
- » Madison Square Garden has long been a home away from home for the Blue Devils as Duke's all-time record at the current version of MSG stands at 38-18, including 33-11 under Coach K.
- » Tuesday's game marks Duke's 100th all-time when playing in the greater NYC area (72-27, .727). That includes 44-25 in NYC, 7-1 in Brooklyn and 21-1 in East Rutherford, N.J.
- » Duke was picked as the preseason favorite in the ACC, with freshman Paolo Banchero tapped the ACC's Preseason Player and Freshman of the Year. Banchero (first team), Wendell Moore Jr. and Mark Williams (second team), were each named Preseason All-ACC.
- » Senior Joey Baker and junior Wendell Moore Jr., will serve as the team's captains for the 2021-22 season.
- » The 2021-22 campaign marks the 42nd season at Duke for Hall of Fame Head Coach Mike Krzyzewski, where he has won 1,097 games and five national championships. Entering his 47th season overall, Coach K is the winningest coach in D-I history with 1,170 victories.
- » Tuesday marks Coach K's 1,400th game as Duke's head coach.
- » Duke, which finished last season 13-11 overall and 9-9 in the ACC, played each of its home games at Cameron Indoor Stadium and a majority of its road games with no fans due to the pandemic.
- » Duke is set for its first regular season game with fans at Cameron Indoor Stadium in 616 days when it welcomes Coach K's alma mater Army West Point on Friday, Nov. 12.

» GAME NOTES

117TH SEASON OF DUKE BASKETBALL

- » The 2021-22 campaign marks the 117th season of Duke Basketball.
- » The Blue Devils have compiled a 2,214-904 all-time record to rank fourth all-time in victories.
- » Only Kentucky (2,329), Kansas (2,323) and North Carolina (2,293) have more all-time wins than Duke.
- » Duke's all-time .710 winning percentage is also the fourth-best in NCAA history, behind only Kentucky (.762), North Carolina (.734) and Kansas (.727).

DUKE-KENTUCKY HISTORY

- » Two of the four winningest programs in NCAA history, Duke and Kentucky have met 22 times with UK leading 12-10.
- » The recent history has favored the Blue Devils, with Duke winning eight of the last 10 meetings.
- » In the Champions Classic, the Blue Devils have won two of the three matchups -- UK won, 74-63, in 2015 in Chicago; while Duke won, 75-68, in Atlanta in 2012 and 118-84 in Indianapolis in 2018.
- » Coach K is 6-2 versus Kentucky.
- » Duke has opened a season three previous times versus Kentucky and won all three -- 82-76 in overtime on Nov. 17, 1979 (Tipoff Classic in Springfield, Mass.), 80-55 on Nov. 19, 1988 (Tipoff Classic in Springfield, Mass.) and 118-84 on Nov. 6, 2018 (Champions Classic in Indianapolis).

DUKE IN THE CHAMPIONS CLASSIC

- » As the Champions Classic enters its 11th year, the Blue Devils are looking to continue their success in the early-season marquee event that brings together Duke, Kansas, Kentucky and Michigan State.
- » Duke's 6-4 record is the best of the four, leading Kentucky (5-5), Kansas (5-5) and Michigan State (4-6).
- » The Spartans knocked off the Blue Devils, 75-69, last year in an empty Cameron Indoor Stadium despite a 21-13 double-double from **Matthew Hurt**, snapping Duke's three-game Champions winning streak.
- » Due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic and the individual institution's safety protocols, the Duke-MSU game was played in Durham, while Kansas-Kentucky was played at Bankers Life Fieldhouse in Indianapolis.
- » The last Champions game in the Garden saw Duke clip Kansas, 68-66 in 2019.
- » Duke's Champions Classic record book can be found on the final page of these notes (page 33).

CHAMPIONS CLASSIC: TOP-10 MATCHUPS

- » The Champions Classic will see its 14th AP top 10 matchup Tuesday night when No. 9 Duke battles No. 10 Kentucky.
- » Duke has played in eight of the 13 previous occurrences (4-4), with Kansas 4-2, Kentucky 3-4 and Michigan State 2-3.

DUKE AT MADISON SQUARE GARDEN

- » Tuesday's game at Madison Square Garden marks Duke's 57th game at current MSG, and the Blue Devils are 38-18 in the venue (33-11 under **Mike Krzyzewski**).
- » Duke has won four straight and five of its last six at the World's Most Famous Arena.
- » Duke is 44-25 in all versions of MSG, dating back to a February 4, 1938, game versus St. John's.
- » Duke has played at least once at MSG in eight of the last nine seasons, in 18 of the last 20, and 21 of the last 24.
- » Duke is 72-27 in 99 games all-time in the greater NYC area, including contests in Brooklyn (7-1) and East Rutherford, N.J. (21-1).
- » Current MSG has seen the sixth-most Duke wins (38) of any venue in the country, behind only Cameron Indoor Stadium, Greensboro Coliseum, Reynolds Coliseum, and former Duke home venues Card Gym and Duke Gym.

DUKE IN NBA ARENAS

- » For a college team that has produced 21 current NBA players, Duke has been tough to beat when playing in NBA venues.
- » Duke is a combined 87-30 (.743) in 11 current NBA venues, which includes a 38-18 mark at Madison Square Garden.
- » The Blue Devils have won 16 of their last 19 at NBA venues, including a 118-84 win over Kentucky at Bankers Life Fieldhouse in the 2018 Champions Classic, going 3-0 in the 2019 ACC Tournament at the Spectrum Center in Charlotte, and a win over Virginia Tech in the 2019 Sweet 16 at Capital One Arena in Washington, D.C.

COACH K AT MADISON SQUARE GARDEN

- » Coach K has achieved a pair of milestones at MSG: His 903rd career victory to pass **Bobby Knight** as the winningest coach in NCAA Division I history (74-69 vs. Michigan State, 11/15/11) and his 1,000th career (77-68 vs. St. John's, 1/25/15).
- » Tuesday marks his 45th career game coaching at MSG, where he has won 75 percent of his visits (33-11).
- » In his Duke career, Coach K has only coached more games at Cameron Indoor Stadium (630) and Greensboro Coliseum (72) than the 44 at MSG.
- » Krzyzewski played five times at MSG as a guard on Army West Point teams coached by **Bobby Knight**. The Black Knights were 0-1 at the Garden in 1968 and 2-2 during his senior year in which he was a captain to claim fourth place in the NIT.

- » With the release of the *Associated Press* preseason poll on Oct. 18, Duke was ranked No. 9 -- extending a notable streak.
- » The Blue Devils have now been ranked in the top 10 at least once in 26 consecutive seasons -- the longest active streak nationally.
- » The No. 9 ranking also marked the 14th consecutive season that the Blue Devils made their debut in the top 10.

ACC PRESEASON PICKS

- » Duke was selected as the favorite to win the 2021-22 ACC Championship, as chosen by media members.
- » Picked as the preseason ACC favorite for the seventh time in the last nine years, the Blue Devils received 47 first-place votes to top the poll, followed by Florida State, North Carolina, Virginia and Virginia Tech.
- » **Paolo Banchemo** swept the individual awards, as the newcomer from Seattle, Wash., was tapped both the Preseason Player of the Year and Freshman of the Year while landing on the Preseason All-ACC First Team.
- » Banchemo becomes the conference's first player to sweep both Preseason Player and Freshman of the Year accolades since at least 2000.
- » Junior **Wendell Moore Jr.**, and sophomore **Mark Williams** each earned a spot on the Preseason All-ACC Second Team, while **Trevor Keels** was second behind Banchemo in Preseason Freshman of the Year voting.

FOUR ON PRESEASON AWARDS LISTS

- » The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame has announced its preseason watch lists for national positional awards, with four Blue Devils earning recognition.
- » The National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) has Banchemo as one of 20 watch list candidates for the 2022 NABC Division I Player of the Year award.

DUKE'S COVID-19 PANDEMIC TIMELINE

- » It's been more than 600 days since the COVID-19 pandemic has impacted all phases of life and operation on Duke's campus.
- » In that time, the 2020 ACC and NCAA Tournaments were canceled due to the global pandemic, the Blue Devils played an entire season of basketball with no fans in attendance at Cameron Indoor Stadium, and Duke withdrew from the 2021 ACC Tournament due to its own COVID protocols.

BLUE-WHITE SCRIMMAGE RECAP

- » Fans of the Duke men's basketball program took their first look at the 2021-22 squad during the Blue Devils' 12th annual Countdown to Craziness event on Oct. 15 at a sold-out Cameron Indoor Stadium.
- » It was the first basketball event with fans at Cameron in 18 months.
- » To cap the night, Duke took to the court for two 12-minute intrasquad games. The first game ended in a 22-22 tie before the White Team flexed its muscles in the second game and pulled away for a 34-14 victory.
- » Freshman **Trevor Keels** led the Blue Devils with 19 points over both games, to go along with five rebounds and five assists while sophomore **Mark Williams** combined for a double-double with 15 points and 11 boards.

DUKE WINS LONE EXHIBITION GAME

- » The Blue Devils led 22-2 less than five minutes in and never looked back in a 106-38 exhibition win over Winston-Salem State on Oct. 30 at Cameron Indoor Stadium.
- » It marked the team's lone exhibition game, choosing to play one exhibition and one closed scrimmage (vs. Villanova on Oct. 23 in Washington, D.C.).
- » The Blue Devils had six players in double-figures vs. WSSU, led by the 21 points and nine rebounds from freshman **Paolo Banchemo**, while classmate **Trevor Keels** added 12 points and four rebounds.
- » Sophomore **Mark Williams** poured in 14 on 6-of-7 shooting with five rebounds and five blocked shots.
- » For the game, the Blue Devils had 26 assists against four turnovers on 38 made field goals. The starting backcourt of Keels and sophomore **Jeremy Roach**, along with forward **Wendell Moore Jr.**, combined for 17 assists and one turnover.

BAKER, MOORE NAMED CAPTAINS

- » Coach K announced in October that senior **Joey Baker** and junior **Wendell Moore Jr.**, will serve as team captains for this season.
- » Baker and Moore were elected to lead the Blue Devils via a player vote and both will serve as captains for the first time in their respective careers. The pair are two of Duke's six returnees from last season's team.
- » "This is such a tremendous and well-deserved honor for Joey and Wendell," said Krzyzewski. "Our team could not have selected two more worthy captains, who are each great leaders in their own way. Wendell and Joey are hardworking, selfless, and humble and set a daily example with how beautifully they represent our program. Our team is in great hands as we prepare for this season."

DUKE'S 2021-22 FRESHMAN CLASS

- » Duke was ranked No. 4 in ESPN's 2021-22 rankings, boasting a class with **Paolo Banchemo**, **AJ Griffin**, **Trevor Keels** and **Jaylen Blakes**.
- » Banchemo, Griffin and Keels were McDonald's All-Americans and were each set to compete in the 2021 Jordan Brand Classic.
- » Banchemo was the No. 3 ranked overall player in the class by ESPN and is the first Blue Devil from the state of Washington since **Quin Snyder** (Mercer Island) in 1986-89.
- » Blakes helped lead Blair Academy to the NJISAA Prep "A" State Championship in 2018-19 alongside junior **Keenan Worthington**.
- » Griffin won a gold medal with Team USA at the 2019 FIBA Americas U16 Championship, averaging 13.5 points and a team-high 3.3 steals per game in six contests.
- » Keels averaged 28.7 points, 9.1 rebounds, 7.2 assists and 3.8 steals as a senior at St. Paul VI in Virginia. He was high school teammates with sophomore **Jeremy Roach**.

MCDONALD'S ALL-AMERICANS

- » With the announcement of the 2021 McDonald's All-American Game rosters, Duke has now signed 85 McDonald's All-Americans all-time -- the most of any NCAA program.
- » The Blue Devils most recent selections are **Paolo Banchemo**, **AJ Griffin** and **Trevor Keels**, while current Blue Devils **Jeremy Roach** and **Mark Williams** were tapped to the 2020 team.
- » Duke joined Kentucky and Michigan as the only programs with multiple selections to the 2021 team.
- » **Mike Krzyzewski** has now signed 85 McDonald's All-Americans -- the most all-time by a coach -- and has added at least one to his roster in 37 consecutive years.

DUKE ADDS VETERAN PRESENCE

- » Coach K added a pair of grad transfers this offseason with forward **Theo John** from Marquette and forward **Bates Jones** from Davidson.
- » The 6-9, 242-pound John, who played for **Steve Wojciechowski** at Marquette and for **Chris Carrawell** while he was an assistant coach, racked up 191 blocks in his career -- the second most in program history.
- » Jones, who checks in at 6-8, 222, came to Duke after four years for the legendary Bob McKillop at Davidson. He is the brother of both former Duke and current NY Giants quarterback **Daniel Jones** and current Duke women's soccer goalkeeper **Ruthie Jones**.

NATE JAMES NAMED AUSTIN PEAY HEAD COACH

- » Long-time Duke Associate Head Coach **Nate James** was announced as the head coach at Austin Peay on April 2, after spending nearly two decades with the Blue Devils as a player and coach.
- » James is the 11th former Duke player or staff member under Coach K currently serving as a head coach at the Division I level or the NBA, joining **Tommy Amaker** (Harvard), **Kenneth Blakeney** (Howard), **Mike Brey** (Notre Dame), **Jeff Capel** (Pittsburgh), **Chris Collins** (Northwestern), **Johnny Dawkins** (UCF), **Bobby Hurley** (Arizona State), **Greg Paulus** (Niagara), **Mike Schrage** (Elon) and **Quin Snyder** (Utah Jazz).
- » On the current staff, **Chris Carrawell** was promoted from Assistant Coach to Associate Head Coach, while **Nolan Smith** was moved from Director of Operations to Assistant Coach.
- » Duke also added former national champion **Amile Jefferson** to the staff as Director of Player Development.
- » With Jefferson, Duke's coaching and support staff is comprised of all former captains under **Mike Krzyzewski**.

THREE-POINT STREAK

- » Duke has connected on at least one three-pointer in 1,114 straight games, the second-longest streak nationally.
- » It has been more than 30 years since Duke was held without a three-point field goal -- Dec. 30, 1989, versus Hawaii.
- » Vanderbilt had owned the second-longest streak before its January 18, 2020 game versus Tennessee (0-of-25).

WILLIAMS CLOSES STRONG

- » Freshman **Mark Williams** led all scorers with a career-high 23 points and a career-high 19 rebounds in the 70-56 win over Louisville in the second round of the ACC Tournament.
- » Williams scored 100 points over his final six games of the season, averaging 16.7 points, 7.8 rebounds and shooting 44-of-59 (.746) over that stretch, which included both of his double-doubles -- 18 and 11 vs. Syracuse and 23 and 19 vs. Louisville.
- » His 19 rebounds against the Cardinals set an ACC Tournament freshman record, surpassing the 18 by Virginia's **Ralph Sampson** vs. Clemson in the 1980 quarterfinals.
- » The 19 rebounds were the third-most by a Duke freshman in any game and tied for the second most by any Duke player in the ACC Tournament (20 by **Art Heyman** vs. Clemson in the 1962 semis).

MARCHING ON

- » The 7-foot freshman, Williams was an imposing figure down the stretch for Duke by averaging 18.5 points and 7.5 rebounds in the month of March -- the sixth best averages, respectively, in the ACC for the month of March.
- » His .775 field goal percentage (31-of-44) in March led all ACC players for the month.
- » After hitting just six field goals over his first nine game, Williams ended the season by connecting on 65-of-95 (.684) over his final 14 contests.
- » Twenty-eight of his 32 blocks came in the final 14 games.
- » He led Duke with 33 of the team's 58 dunks -- 33 of his 71 field goals were dunks (46.5 percent).

MOORE'S SEASON TURNS VS. BC

- » Snapping out of a 1-for-21 slump by banking in a three from the top of the key, sophomore **Wendell Moore Jr.**, dropped a career-high-tying 25 points on 8-of-13 shooting in the win over Boston College on Jan. 6.
- » The eight field goals marked a then career high, with none bigger than a baseline jumper at the shot clock buzzer in the final minute to give Duke an 80-77 lead.
- » The sophomore also hit 7-of-8 from the free throw line, including the game-clinching toss to make it a four-point game with 11 seconds left.
- » Following a slow start to his sophomore campaign, Moore averaged 11.3 points, shot .454 from the field and pulled down 5.3 rebounds over his final 19 games of the season.

- » Duke is 236-155 (.604) vs. ranked teams under Coach K, with a 156-83 (.651) mark since the 1996-97 season.
- » In the Coach K era, Duke is 221-126 (.637) overall when each team is ranked in the Top 25 ... 144-87 (.625) overall when each team is ranked in the top 15 ... 87-63 (.580) overall when each team is ranked in the top 10 ... 33-18 (.647) when each team is ranked in the top five.
- » With the win over No. 3 Virginia on Feb. 9, 2019, Coach K broke a tie with **Dean Smith** for most wins in top three games (11).

DUKE AWAY FROM CAMERON

- » In the Coach K era, Duke is 263-152 (.634) in true road games and 277-77 (.782) in neutral site games, for a combined mark of 540-229 (.704) in all games outside of Cameron Indoor Stadium.
- » In ACC regular season play, Duke is 192-127 (.602) away from home under Coach K.
- » Coach K's 192 ACC road wins are a conference record.
- » Coach K has also won 16 road games against AP top five teams, the most in the history of the AP poll.

ACC DOMINANCE

- » Duke has won 319 league games and eight regular season ACC championships since 1997. Duke is the only league team to win at least 70 percent of its conference games in that span.
- » The Blue Devils have also been outstanding in ACC Tournament play with 12 crowns in the past 23 seasons in what is considered the nation's toughest conference.
- » Duke's 12 ACC crowns since 1997 are seven more than the next closest program and more than all of the other league schools combined (11 by six programs).
- » Duke is also the only ACC program to win at least three league tournament titles in succession during that stretch. The Blue Devils won five straight ACC titles from 1999-2003 and three in a row from 2009-11.

CLOSE CALLS IN ACC PLAY

- » Of Duke's nine ACC losses last season, eight were each decided by seven points or less, including two in overtime.
- » The Blue Devils were outscored at the free throw by 47 points in those eight narrow losses, while outscoring the opposition from the field in five of the eight.
- » In seven of the eight decisions, Duke either led, or trailed by no more than two points, in final 66 seconds of regulation.
- » In the six-point loss at Pitt, Duke was out-scored at the free throw by 13 points (24-11).
- » In a five-point loss at Louisville, the Cardinals scored 11 more points at the line (18-7).
- » In both the Pitt and Louisville games, 70 percent of the possessions by each opponent ended with a free throw attempt.
- » In the four-point loss to UNC in Durham, the Heels scored nine more points at the line (13-4).
- » In the four-point loss to Notre Dame, the Irish scored 11 more points at the line (18-7).
- » Over the Notre Dame and North Carolina losses, Duke was a combined 0-of-3 in the second half at the free throw line, while the opponents were 19-of-27 combined.
- » In the home loss to Louisville in overtime, Duke led 65-64 with 38 seconds left, before a UL free throw forced OT with 14 seconds left.
- » In the overtime loss at Georgia Tech, Duke had two shots in the final 35 seconds of regulation with the game tied at 64.

» DUKE IN THE NBA



- » A total of 87 former Duke players have appeared on NBA rosters.
- » Overall, 42 Duke players have been selected in the first round of the NBA Draft in the Coach K era, including 24 in the past 10 years.
- » There are 21 Duke players on current NBA rosters (including inactive and two-way players) -- the most currently by any ACC school.
- » Duke had an ACC record 27 NBA players last season, breaking the previous record of 25, set by Duke in 2019-20.
- » Four Duke players have been selected No. 1 in the NBA Draft -- **Art Heyman** (1963), **Elton Brand** (1999), **Kyrie Irving** (2011) and **Zion Williamson** (2019).
- » Duke now boasts 68 players drafted under head coach **Mike Krzyzewski**.
- » Duke has had at least one player selected in 34 of the 41 drafts under Coach K, including at least one in 11 consecutive drafts. In that span since 2011, 28 Blue Devils have been drafted.
- » Coach K's 42 first-round selections remain a Draft record.
- » Duke has had 28 players selected in the NBA Draft Lottery, the most in the nation since the system was put into place in 1985.
- » Overall, between Duke and USA Basketball, Coach K has coached 113 NBA players.
- » In 1999, Duke became the first program in the history of the NBA Draft to have four players from the same school selected in the first round. Three of the four -- **Elton Brand** (Chicago), **Trajan Langdon** (Cleveland) and **Corey Maggette** (Seattle) -- were lottery picks.
- » In 2002, **Jason Williams** (2nd overall) and **Mike Dunleavy** (3rd) became the first college teammates in the history of the NBA Draft to be the first two collegians selected.
- » Six former Duke players -- **Jeff Mullins** (Golden State, 1975), **Danny Ferry** (San Antonio, 2003), **Shane Battier** (Miami, 2012 and 2013), **Kyrie Irving** (Cleveland, 2016), **Dahntay Jones** (Cleveland, 2016) and **Quinn Cook** (Golden State, 2018; L.A. Lakers 2020) -- have been part of NBA championship teams.
- » Through the 2020-21 season, Coach K's former Duke players have accumulated more than \$2.5 billion in NBA contracts.
- » Lottery selections who played for Krzyzewski at Duke have combined to earn more than \$2 billion in contracts, an average of nearly \$70 million per individual.
- » Duke's and Coach K's ties to the NBA run deeper than just the players on the floor. Including former Blue Devil **Quin Snyder** as the head coach of the Utah Jazz, more than 20 of Coach K's former players, assistant coaches, staff and managers occupy positions on NBA coaching staffs or in front offices.

It does not take long for a conversation about the highest levels of success in the basketball world to turn to the name Krzyzewski. In 41 seasons at Duke, Mike Krzyzewski - a Naismith Hall of Fame coach, five-time national champion and 12-time Final Four participant - has built a dynasty that few programs in the history of the game can match.

No coach in Division I men's basketball history has won more games than Coach K's 1,170.

Announcing his retirement in June ahead of his 42nd season at Duke, and 47th overall as a head coach at both Duke and Army West Point, Krzyzewski owns an 1,170-361 record as a head coach, including a 1,097-302 mark at Duke.

The numbers that illustrate Coach K's career are simply staggering:

- Five national championships (1991, 1992, 2001, 2010, 2015)
- Six gold medals as head coach of the U.S. Men's National Team
- Nine National Players of the Year (11 honors)
- Six National Defensive Players of the Year (nine honors)
- 10 consecutive top-10 AP poll finishes (1997-06)
- 12 National Coach of the Year honors (eight seasons)
- 12 Final Four appearances (tied for most in NCAA history)
- 12 ACC regular season championships
- 15 ACC Tournament championships (most in league history)
- 28 NBA Lottery picks (most in Draft history)
- 35 NCAA Tournament bids (most by one coach)
- 37 All-America selections (51 honors)
- 67 ACC Tournament wins (most in league history)
- 68 NBA Draft selections, including 42 first-round picks
- 97 NCAA Tournament wins (most in NCAA history)
- 126 weeks ranked No. 1 in the AP poll (most by a coach in poll history)
- 517 ACC wins (most in league history)
- 556 weeks ranked in the top 10 of the AP poll (most by a coach in poll history)
- 649 weeks ranked in the AP poll (most by a coach in poll history)
- 1,097 victories at Duke (most in NCAA history at one school)
- 1,170 career wins (most in NCAA history)

Coach K became the Division I men's career wins leader on Nov. 15, 2011, at Madison Square Garden, moving past his former coach Bob Knight with his 903rd victory. His historic 1,000th career victory came against St. John's at The World's Most Famous Arena on Jan. 25, 2015, as he became the first Division I men's basketball coach to achieve a four-figure win total.

Krzyzewski's 1,097 victories at Duke are an NCAA record by a coach at one school. With 1,097 of the Blue Devils' 2,214 all-time victories, Coach K has presided over nearly half (49 percent) of the men's basketball wins in Duke history.

Krzyzewski has won a league-record 517 ACC games (regular season and tournament), passing former North Carolina head coach Dean Smith (422) on Feb. 4, 2015. He has also won an ACC-record 192 conference road games.

Coach K's five national championships are the second-most in NCAA history. Krzyzewski and former Connecticut coach Jim Calhoun are the only coaches in NCAA history to win national championships in three different decades.

Coach K has led the Blue Devils into the NCAA Tournament 35 times - more than any other coach in history. His streak of guiding Duke to 24 consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances from 1996 to 2019 ranked as the longest streak in NCAA history, surpassing Dean Smith's 23 consecutive appearances from 1975 to 1997.

Krzyzewski holds NCAA Tournament records for games coached (127) and wins (97) while ranking second all-time and leading active coaches with a .764 NCAA Tournament winning percentage (min. 20 games). He has reached the Sweet 16 on 25 occasions, six more than any other coach in NCAA history, and has advanced to the Elite Eight 16 times.

Of the 1,399 games Krzyzewski has coached at Duke, 1,238 - 88.5 percent - have been as a ranked team. The Blue Devils are 1,007-231 (.813) as a ranked team under Coach K.

Coach K has taken top-ranked Duke teams into games on 254 occasions and compiled a 219-35 (.864) record as the AP's No. 1 team, ranking first in poll history in both number of games and wins as coach of a top-ranked squad.

Krzyzewski has tutored 68 NBA Draft picks during his time at Duke, including a total of 42 first-round selections that leads all active coaches. Duke has had at least one player taken in 34 of the 41 NBA Drafts during the Krzyzewski Era.

Since the inception of the NBA Draft Lottery in 1985, Coach K and Duke have produced 28 lottery picks - a draft-record total for both a school and a coach.

Through the 2020-21 season, Coach K's former Duke players have accumulated more than \$2.5 billion in NBA contracts. Lottery selections who played for Krzyzewski at Duke have combined to earn more than \$2 billion in contracts, an average of nearly \$70 million per individual.

Under Coach K's watch, Duke has produced multiple All-ACC Academic selections in 12 of the last 13 years. The 2015 NCAA championship team featured a program-high five All-ACC Academic honorees. Quin Snyder, Amile Jefferson and Grayson Allen are the only players in Duke history to earn All-ACC Academic honors four times. Jefferson, a three-time captain, departed the university in 2017 with both bachelor's and master's degrees.

Krzyzewski has had six players collect a total of nine CoSIDA Academic All-America honors, headlined by two-time first-team honorees Battier (2000, 2001) and Mason Plumlee (2012, 2013). Allen became the sixth in 2016 when he garnered second-team accolades.

Fittingly, Coach K has earned nearly every award imaginable. The crown jewel of that haul, however, came in 2001 when he was inducted into the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame.

Since his enshrinement in Springfield, Mass., Krzyzewski has also been inducted into the Army Sports Hall of Fame (2009), the Chicagoland Sports Hall of Fame (2010) and the Duke Athletics Hall of Fame (2011).

While establishing Duke as one of college basketball's dynastic programs, Krzyzewski simultaneously spent more than a decade as one of the architects of the revitalization of USA Basketball. During his tenure at the helm of the program, the U.S. National Team amassed an extraordinary 88-1 record and claimed gold medals at the 2007 FIBA Americas Championship, 2008 Beijing Olympics, 2010 FIBA World Championship, 2012 London Olympics, 2014 FIBA World Cup and 2016 Rio Olympics, as well as a bronze medal at the 2006 FIBA World Championship.

Coach K was 24-0 in the Olympics as head coach of the USMNT and his time at the helm ended with the team in the midst of a National Team-record 76-game winning streak that began in 2006.

Sustained success under Coach K has resulted in coaching opportunities for several of his former players, as well as his former assistant coaches from both Duke and Army. More than 25 of Coach K's former players or assistants are currently either coaching or working in front office roles across professional and college basketball.

The Coaching Tree

Ten of Coach K's former players or staff are currently Division I head coaches: Tommy Amaker (Harvard), Kenneth Blakeney (Howard), Mike Brey (Notre Dame), Jeff Capel (Pittsburgh), Chris Collins (Northwestern), Johnny Dawkins (Central Florida), Bobby Hurley (Arizona State), Nate James (Austin Peay), Greg Paulus (Niagara) and Mike Schrage (Elon). James assumed the Austin Peay position following the 2020-21 season.

Quin Snyder is currently the head coach of the NBA's Utah Jazz, headlining a long list of former players, staff and managers that are connected to the NBA. That list also includes Grant Hill as part-owner of the Atlanta Hawks, Elton Brand as general manager of the Philadelphia 76ers, Trajan Langdon as general manager of the New Orleans Pelicans and Shane Battier as vice president of analytics and development for the Miami Heat.

Krzyzewski has shown a firm commitment to taking care of his own, having at least three former Duke captains on his staff every season since 1996-97. The Blue Devils have won three NCAA titles, 12 ACC Tournament championships and eight ACC regular season crowns during that time.

The 2020-21 staff of Jon Scheyer, Chris Carrawell and Nolan Smith all held the captain role during their playing careers at Duke.

Giving Back

Krzyzewski has been diligently committed to public service, both locally and nationally, throughout his coaching career. He is currently serving on boards for, while also assuming vital roles with, the Duke Children's Hospital, the Jimmy V Foundation for Cancer Research, the NABC Foundation, the CEO Roundtable on Cancer and the Emily Krzyzewski Center.

Coach K's philanthropic activities also include the establishment and funding of the Emily Krzyzewski Center, a community center in Durham named in honor of his late mother. The Center's mission is to inspire economically disadvantaged students to dream big, act with character and purpose, strive for academic excellence and reach their highest potential as future citizen leaders.

In May 2018, Coach K and his wife Mickie announced their single-largest philanthropic gift, a \$3 million donation to the Emily K Center to kick start a \$15 million fundraising campaign for the Durham-based Center. That campaign concluded on December 31, 2020 and raised \$18.85 million to exceed the goal.

DURHAM, N.C. – The man who taught us all long ago there is no such thing as a “defending champion,” that falling short the following season does not mean anyone’s coming to tear down your banner, now is attempting to eradicate the word “last” from his program.

The execution on this one will be trickier, because even Mike Krzyzewski trips on it occasionally. He dropped the word, using it in the forbidden context, at least once on a routine Monday afternoon. And, in the few weeks Duke has been practicing, he has caught himself at least a couple of times wandering past the emotional barrier he has constructed around the 2021-22 college season.

One more time. That’s the K-friendly way to discuss what will transpire for the coach and his program over the next five – or, if things follow the fairytale script allowing him to depart a champion, like John Wooden and John Elway and so few others – six months. He announced in June his decision to coach the current season and then leave the Blue Devils to a successor, which he preferred to be Jon Scheyer, who turned out to be the school’s choice, as well.

Their approach to this succession process is not unique, but it is uncommon. It has allowed Krzyzewski the opportunity to enter this season with a focus unlike any in his previous 46 seasons as a head coach. He need not travel for recruiting, not for scouting nor home visits. He is able to work on building relationships and building his team, and that is most welcome after the COVID season of 2020-21 he refused to let become the closing chapter of his Hall of Fame career.

Now he looks on the floor at the practice facility that bears his name and sees the ingredients of a promising team that could make this a joyous season, principally 6-10 freshman forward Paolo Banchemo, whose size and skill might be described as a combination of Danny Ferry and Grant Hill if that didn’t feel a bit too extravagant.

“I don’t want to go through memory lane here, or whatever. The reason I love coaching, and the reason we’ve had a continuity of excellence, is because we’ve focused on the moment, and I’ve done that with every team,” Krzyzewski told Sporting News. “And so I’m going to do it with this team. I’ve told them: Don’t talk about ‘sixth,’ ‘last,’ ‘doing it for Coach K.’ Let’s just do it together. Let’s see what the hell happens.”

Krzyzewski will reach his 75th birthday in February. He has won two FIBA World Championships, three Olympic gold medals, five NCAA championships, 12 NCAA regionals and 1,170 games as a Division I head coach. It may seem exhausting to carry around such a weighty resume, but Krzyzewski insists he feels “youthful” and “passionate.” He understands there only are so many years to a lifetime, though, and there are other ways to spend them beyond the passionate pursuit of youthful basketball prospects.

He considers himself beyond fortunate to have enjoyed this degree of professional success, to have had the opportunity to coach so many great players and teams over such a long period of time. “How lucky ... now, again, you’ve got to be good,” he said. Krzyzewski first dreamed of becoming a coach at 16, played for Bob Knight at Army and then entered the business and took over that program four years after Knight left. Here he is, nearly 60 years later, on the verge of completing a career no one could have imagined.

“To do something you love doesn’t mean you love everything you do to do what you love,” Krzyzewski told SN. “For me, the time – how much time do you have? There’s got to be something more that I’d like to do with my time. As much as I love going to Peach Jam and all the recruiting, the amount of recruiting and the intensity that you do to get the level of player that we get is enormous. And, again, it’s not like I hated it. But you’ve got to make some decisions.

“That’s part of it. The other thing is, Mickie, we’ve been married 52 years. We have 10 grandchildren; they’re all here. They’ve made a lot of sacrifices. And again, my daughters and my family would be all for me, whatever I would do. But Mickie and I have talked about it for a couple years.”

If the year 2020 had developed differently, we might have had this conversation a year ago. Krzyzewski’s Blue Devils owned a 25-6 record on March 11 and finished the ACC regular season a game out of first place. There’s no way to know what course he would have followed if that season had ended with a loss somewhere in the NCAA Tournament or maybe a slightly improbable Final Four appearance.

Once the pandemic became an issue, though, Krzyzewski knew he was not going to leave. Navigating COVID last winter while trying to run a Division I basketball program was no kind of fun, but leaving it for someone less experienced to manage might have set back Duke basketball – and the person left in charge – for years. That never was an option.

“As soon as COVID hit, I said there’s no way. We have to shepherd – I didn’t know where it would end or whatever – but I said we have to shepherd the program,” he said. “I didn’t know that shepherding would lead the sheep through the Valley of Death and up the Himalayas. For everybody, it was tough.”

Leaving after last season was over was not a possibility, and not just because the Devils finished 13-11, missed the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1995 and chose to end their season following a member of the program testing positive for COVID during the ACC Tournament.

Krzyzewski explained that three of the most important pillars of the program were undermined by COVID restrictions: preparation, relationships and communication.

“We have prepared really well, and I learned that from when I was a player under Coach Knight,” Krzyzewski said. “We could not prepare. We lost the summer. Forget about that we were a young team and not as talented.

“We have been great with relationships with our players, as a team and a coaching staff. No way did we come close to the level that you needed to be really good.

“And how do you teach communication at the level it needs to be when, really, for the first month of individual work in September, I wasn’t even on the court. Our weight room is right there, and I was behind the glass and would come out at different times. So the ability to touch, communicate, just be able to pat somebody on the back. Or, ‘Come over here son,’ give him a little hug or get on his ass. All that level of communication, verbal and non-verbal communication, was just ... to me, it showed just how important it’s been for us.

“It was such a bad year.”

Krzyzewski responded by bringing the Duke freshmen to campus a month earlier than in past years and having them take an academic class to become familiar with the campus, the program and their coach, who was around them daily. In July, when the rest of the players arrived for summer classes, they entered an unofficial, program-designed course called “the Brotherhood curriculum” – the Brotherhood being what Duke calls the unofficial fraternity of players who’ve competed for the Blue Devils.

They were instructed by Duke basketball’s academic coordinator, its creative director for advice on social media and branding, and by a financial adviser on personal finance. And then the coaches would help teach the program’s culture.

“As a result, we’ve learned from doing it. We saw what we missed. And we needed to right the ship,” Krzyzewski said. “You were in the gym. I don’t know how many games we’re going to win or lose – I think we’ll win more than we lose, maybe be real good – but that was fun in there. There’s energy. Last year, there was no energy.

“We got away a weekend ago, and Mickie said, ‘Do you have any regrets about continuing to coach?’ Not stopping coaching, because I’ve already led the recruiting go ... I’m not calling every night and texting. And I said, ‘No. I’m good. I think I’ll be better. I’m anxious to feel people in Cameron and on the road.

“My whole career is feeding off that energy. You have a passion for what you do, but the energy of the environment you do it in – your own, the players’, the crowd’s – there’s energy. And that was not there last year.”

On the evening of June 3, the day he held an afternoon press conference to discuss his decision to retire as head coach following the 2021-22 season, Krzyzewski was at home watching David Muir report “World News Tonight” to a large segment of the U.S. population.

And it turned out, to the coach’s surprise, he was World News that night.

“I was knocked back by the response;” Krzyzewski said. “I told Mickie, I said, ‘Holy crap.’ I literally was surprised.”

It only has grown more intense as the season approaches. Jon Jackson, Duke’s deputy director of athletics for men’s basketball, has had the responsibility of handling the coach’s media requests. There were calls from “60 Minutes” and HBO. Eventually, if that interest still is there when the season ends, “I owe that to people,” Krzyzewski said. “Then I’ll do whatever.”

Keeping the attention off himself during the fall has allowed more to be paid to the job Scheyer is doing recruiting the first Duke team of which he will be head coach. The Devils already have commitments from three top-10 prospects.

Krzyzewski has not been uninvolved in that success, but he did not attend any summer tournaments or showcases to evaluate prospects or make them aware of his presence. Scheyer filled the role of Duke head coach at those events. The staff discussed with him what they learned on their various trips. And when players and their families visited campus, he met with them and explained his retirement does not equate to an evacuation.

“In June, we had a number of visits;” Krzyzewski said. “So I had meetings with the families to reassure them. I’m not going anywhere. I’m staying in this office. I’m going to be an ambassador for the school. I’m not going to coach your son, but I’ll be there for you. I’ll be there for you if you go pro after a year. Jon and these guys are going to coach you. I’m not going to interfere, but you should know I’ll be here if you need me for guidance and anything.

“So I know all of our recruits and their families, and will know them, but in a different way.”

When prospects visited Duke in previous years, the trip usually included a breakfast at Krzyzewski’s home. Now, that occurs at Scheyer’s home.

To accommodate the visitors, Krzyzewski said, he along the way picked up some “really nice extra chairs” so everyone would have a place to sit. “They’re not folding chairs. They’re really good,” he said. Scheyer, with a scout’s eye, figured those would be very helpful when the prospects’ families came to his house. So he asked to borrow them.

“We have two kids who are committed coming in this weekend, and another kid and his family that we’re recruiting,” Krzyzewski said. “Today in our meeting, I said, ‘So tell me what your plan is. Where do you want me?’ And I said, ‘By the way, when do I get my damn chairs back?’”

Adjacent to the Michael W. Krzyzewski Center for Athletic Excellence, where the Blue Devils practice each day, there is a rectangular courtyard fronted by a sign that reads “Krzyzewskiville.” That is where, for decades, students have camped out to be first to enter Cameron Indoor Stadium and claim the best seats for Duke’s home games.

To better manage this process, there are “line monitors” selected from among the student body. Recently, a line monitors “reunion” was arranged, and several dozen who handled that duty in the past came to campus to join the current group for an event that included a chance to visit last Friday’s Devils practice and a cocktail party afterward. Krzyzewski spoke to the group then.

“Right toward the end, in talking, I said something. I don’t even remember the exact words. I started, like, crying,” Krzyzewski said. “So I said: All right, we’ll see you all and keep up the good work.”

The following day, there was an “open practice” used as a fundraiser for the Duke Children’s Hospital, a favorite charity project for the Krzyzewskis for decades. Those willing to pay \$100 were granted a seat in Cameron to watch Banchemo and muscular freshman guard Trevor Keels and vets Wendell Moore, Jeremy Roach and Mark Williams continue their preparation for the opening game Nov. 9 in the Champions Classic at Madison Square Garden.

“I was doing different things and finally 10 minutes before – our guys were out there already – I came on the court and it’s a standing ovation,” Krzyzewski said, and he started to explain how that felt, then stopped, because it wasn’t necessary and might have provoked the same reaction, again.

“I’ve got to be careful it doesn’t hit me like that,” he said. “I wasn’t expecting either one. On the road, when they boo me, that’ll balance the scales.

“We’ll see what the hell happens. But I just wanted to coach for this ... like, I’ll go home tonight and watch the tape. I love watching tape. I love practicing planning. I love developing relationships with the players, and all that. And building a team.

“I hope it never hits me until it’s over that I won’t be able to do that again. But right now, that hasn’t hit me. If it does, then I won’t be as good, I don’t think.”

When he was close to reaching the ultimate decision to coach the Devils once more, and only once, Krzyzewski and his wife spoke with a close family friend, with his three daughters and then gathered assistant coaches Scheyer, Chris Carrawell and Nolan Smith and discussed it with them. All this took place over about a week in the spring.

“By the time I talked with the coaching staff, I was pretty sure that this is what we were going to do,” he said. “I brought up, ‘Look, in order to do this, I’m in an ethical dilemma. I can’t recruit a kid if I’m not going to coach him.’ And so it creates a situation if I still want to coach, it’s Duke’s decision then, will they allow me to do that? I didn’t think they’d ask me to retire, but again, you still have to show courtesy to everybody.

“And so we need to find the answer of who – it needs to be somebody from the Brotherhood. And Chris Carrawell said, ‘Coach, the answer is right here: Jon.’ And I already knew that. And Nolan said, ‘That’s right.’ And I said, you know what: ‘That’s a hell of a thing.’ I get chills just thinking about it. I said, ‘Jon, you’re ready.’”

Krzyzewski explained he would not have said that of Scheyer a year earlier, but it’s now been nearly a decade since he joined the staff. Scheyer was an All-American point guard for Duke’s 2010 NCAA Championship team, even though he wasn’t truly a point guard. He adapted to the position because that’s what the team needed. He had to do that with only a short time to prepare in practice.

Now Scheyer gets nearly a year to adjust to the demands not just of coaching in the ACC, or coaching a program that three different coaches have led to the Final Four, but to follow the man who is the greatest men’s basketball coach in NCAA history.

It’ll help to have the greatest coach around to guide him. Even now, with a team to prepare to chase an ACC title and perhaps another Final Four and possibly more beyond that, Krzyzewski is discovering another approach to coaching that can continue into his retirement. He even, as he is teaching, learning some new ideas about how to coach this one more season.

“Jon and I, as good a relationship as we’ve had, doing this is off the charts,” he said. “I’ve loved it. After we have a staff meeting, I’ll say, ‘Let’s the two of us spend a few minutes.’ This was like weeks ago, I had something to tell him, and I got in at 8 o’clock in the morning. And I was going to get – we have a Starbucks machine on the floor – and I open the door and Jon was right there, at the door. And we started laughing. He said, ‘I have a couple things.’ And I said, ‘I have couple things, too.’ And after we got through those couple things, we spent another 45 minutes.

“And I said: I haven’t talked to you about time. You’re going to be amazed that you don’t have enough time. And so before you commit to anything, make sure you know that’s time. With you, with a young family, you’ve got to be careful. It was really a good talk about time.”

Krzyzewski understands that clock is ticking. There will be a final buzzer, because that is how the game ends, no matter how one might endeavor to manipulate the language. It may be followed by confetti descending from the ceiling of the Superdome or tears dropping from the corner of some Devilish eyes, possibly even both. It is coming, though.

- Williams was named to the 2021 All-ACC Academic Team, with teammates Jaemyn Brakefield, Wendell Moore Jr. and DJ Steward.
- It marked the 27th consecutive season Duke has had at least one selection to the All-ACC Academic Team.
- With four named to the 2020-21 team, Duke now boasts 100 all-time All-ACC Academic selections.

WILLIAMS CLOSES STRONG

- Williams led all scorers with a career-high 23 points and a career-high 19 rebounds in the 70-56 win over Louisville in the second round of the ACC Tournament.
- Williams scored 100 points over his final six games of the season, averaging 16.7 points, 7.8 rebounds and shooting 44-of-59 (.746) over that stretch, which included both of his double-doubles -- 18 and 11 vs. Syracuse and 23 and 19 vs. Louisville.
- His 19 rebounds against the Cardinals set an ACC Tournament freshman record, surpassing the 18 by Virginia's Ralph Sampson vs. Clemson in the 1980 quarterfinals.
- The 19 rebounds were the third-most by a Duke freshman in any game and tied for the second most by any Duke player in the ACC Tournament behind 20 from Art Heyman vs. Clemson in the 1962 semifinals.
- He was a second-team All-ACC Tournament selection after averaging 18.0 points, 10.0 rebounds and shooting 15-of-21 (.714) over the Blue Devils' two wins in Greensboro.

MARCHING ON

- The 7-foot freshman, Williams was an imposing figure down the stretch for Duke by averaging 18.5 points and 7.5 rebounds in the month of March -- the sixth best averages, respectively, in the ACC for the month of March.
- His .775 field goal percentage (31-of-44) in March led all ACC players for the month.
- After hitting just six field goals over his first nine game, Williams ended the season by connecting on 65-of-95 (.684) over his final 14 contests.
- Twenty-eight of his 32 blocks came in the final 14 games.
- He led Duke with 33 of the team's 58 dunks -- 33 of his 71 field goals were dunks (46.5 percent).
