KELLY MORRONE Head Coach First Season Kelly Morrone begins her second season as head women's basketball coach at Merrimack College in 2021-22 Morrone – who becomes the seventh head coach in school history arrived at Merrimack after an impressive seven-year stint at John Carroll University. She guided the Blue Streaks to 117 wins over the last seven years, claiming a pair of Ohio Athletic Conference (OAC) regular season titles, the 2018-19 OAC Tournament Championship and three NCAA Division III Tournament berths, the first three appearances in school history. The last two years of Morrone's tenure before arriving at Merrimack were particularly impressive, posting backto-back 20-win campaigns including a 23-win season in 2019-20. She totaled four seasons of at least 20 victories over her seven-year stint at John Carroll, while coaching 19 OAC All-Conference selections, 16 OAC All-Academic honorees, three NCAA Division III All-Americans and one National Semi-Finalist for DIII Player of the Year. She won a pair of OAC Coach of the Year honors (2013-14, 2018-19), while boasting a roster that featured four OAC Player of the Year award winners over seven years, a pair of OAC Freshman of the Year recipients and two OAC Defensive Players of the Year. Morrone's head coaching career started spectacularly, winning the first 11 games of the 2013-14 season with John Carroll. She went on to post a 22-win effort in her inaugural season, leading the Blue Streaks to their first-ever OAC Regular Season Championship, first NCAA Tournament bid and first NCAA Tournament victory. She matched that effort in 2014-15 with an identical 22-5 record that featured a 16-1 start to season and a follow-up bid to the NCAA Tournament. After reaching the OAC Tournament in four of her first five years on the sidelines, Morrone guided John Carroll to its first-ever OAC Tournament Championship in the 2018-19 season. The Blue Streaks won 22 games for the third time in six years under Morrone, taking down Ohio Northern University, 61-58, to claim the title. The 2019-20 campaign featured a career-best 23 wins, and a return trip to the OAC Championship game. Prior to her arrival at John Carroll. Morrone's background features a myriad of Division I assistant coaching positions. In 2012-13, she served as the assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at the College of William & Mary where she focused on the development of the Tribe's guards, acted as offensive coordinator and focused on skill instruction, game preparation, and scouting as well as all aspects of recruiting. She also has New England roots with a stop at the University of Rhode Island (2010-12) as the Rams' Assistant Coach/Recruiting Coordinator. She held the same title at Davidson College (2008-10), while her coaching career began at the University of Buffalo as an assistant coach (2005-08). Morrone was a student-athlete at the University of South Carolina, where she contributed to a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances for the Gamecocks. South Carolina reached the Elite Eight during her junior season (2001-02), and followed that up with an appearance in the second round of the NCAA Tournament during Morrone's senior year (2002-03). Morrone ranks third all-time in South Carolina history in career three-point percentage, threepointers made and three-point attempts. She was also a three-year captain while a player at South Carolina and a four-year SEC Academic Honor Roll selection. EMILY TAYLOR Assistant Coach First Season


Emily Taylor begins her second season as an assistant coach with the Merrimack College women's basketball program in 2021-22.

Taylor arrived at Merrimack from John Carroll University where she played and coached under current Merrimack head coach Kelly Morrone. While coaching at John Carroll, Taylor helped coach the Blue Streaks to the first OAC Tournament Championship in school history. In her three seasons with John Carroll she coached 2 OAC Players and Defensive Players of the Year.

After transferring to John Carroll from Walsh University, Taylor was a two-year starter for the Blue Streaks. She helped lead John Carroll to back-to-back NCAA tournament appearances, including the programs first in 2014. She ranks ninth all-time in Blue Streaks history in three-pointers made, as well as 13th in assists.

Before getting into coaching Taylor was an Ohio Police Officer and a Non-Profit County Juvenile Courts Case Manager.

Taylor graduated from John Carroll in 2015 with a degree in Sociology and Criminology, then again in 2020 with a master's in Education; School Counseling .



BRITTANY MORRISON Assistant Coach First Season

Following a one-year stint as an assistant coach with Kelly Morrone at John Carroll University in 2019-20, Brittany Morrison begins her second year as an Assistant Women's Basketball Coach at Merri-

mack College in 2021-22.

Her first year on the JCU coaching staff followed a four-year career as a student-athlete at The University at Buffalo . Morrison's tutelage made an immediate impact at John Carroll as the Blue Streaks posted a 23-win season one year ago, and finished as the runner-up in the Ohio Athletic Conference Women's Basketball Tournament. While at John Carroll, Morrison coached JCU's own 2020 OAC Player and Defensive Player of the Year.

In four seasons at UB, Morrison helped lead the Bulls to their first MAC Championship in program history as well as their first NCAA Tournament appearance. (2015-16) Morrison was a member of the Bulls' 2018 squad that made their first NCAA Sweet 16 Appearance in school history following victories over South Florida and Florida State (2017-18). This team was the first MAC team to win back-to-back NCAA Tournament games since 1991-92; this also being the first back-to-back NCAA tournament wins in UB program history. During her senior campaign, Morrison helped her team win 2019-20 MAC Championship; their second in school history. This lead to their third NCAA Tournament appearance in four years. (2016, 2018, 2019). As a senior, she ranked first on the team with 87 offensive rebounds and second in total boards with 194.

Morrison made the Mid-American Conference All-Academic Team during her senior year and graduated Cum Laude in May of 2019 with a BA in Health and Human Services.
