BIG ROAD WEEK STARTS IN CANDY-STRIPE LAND

- UK junior IF **Chase Estep** is one of Collegiate Baseball's National Players of the Week and has a 15-game hit streak. He previously was SEC Player of the Week for week three.
- He leads the SEC in hits, total bases and runs, and ranks second in OBP, slugging, home runs and steals.
- Kentucky started 7-0 for the first time since the 2012 team started 22-0.
- The Cats have walked it off 12 times since Nick Mingione took over as head coach, including three traditional walk-off wins this season.
- The UK pitchers have struck out 189 batters in 17 games. UK pitchers are striking out 11.7 hitters/game.
- UK shortstop **Ryan Ritter** is a Third-Team Preseason All-American and on the Golden Spikes Watch List.
- UK outfielder **John Thrasher** is a Third-Team Preseason All-American.
- UK has scored in 260 of 263 games in Mingione's tenure.
- Mingione now has 157 wins, fourth on UK's all-time list.
- UK is 105-33 vs. non-conference opponents during Mingione's tenure.
- **Daniel Harper** has made 82 appearances on the mound, fifth on the career list.
- **Sean Harney** has struck out 10.86 batters per nine innings in his UK career, which ranks seventh on the all-time list for pitchers with at least 50 innings pitched.
- UK and High Point have never faced each other on the baseball diamond.
- **Jacob Plastiak** has reached base safely in 20 consecutive games.
- Plastiak ranks third in the SEC in RBI and fourth in home runs.
- **Darren Williams** has not allowed a run in 15.1 innings pitched.
- **Seth Logue** has two quality starts and is coming off a career-high 7.0 IP. allowing 1 run on two hits.
- UK has stolen 20 bases in 22 attempts.
- UK's offense ranks in the top four in SEC as a team in average, OBP, at bats, runs, hits, RBI, doubles, and total bases.

SOMETHING OLD, SOMETHING NEW, SOMETHING BLUE

The Kentucky baseball team will have both a familiar look and air of freshness in 2022 as it mixes returning stars and established veterans from other programs while seeking to return to the postseason. Defensive wizard **Ryan Ritter** and heavy-hitting **Oraj Anu** will anchor a lineup that could be heavier on versatility than raw power, while right-handers **Cole Stupp**, **Sean Harney** and **Daniel Harper** headline a deep and experienced pitching staff.

The Wildcats added eight players from the NCAA transfer portal, including the 2021 America East Player of the Year, a former third-team all-american, a former freshman all-american, three all-conference performers, a former JUCO World Series most valuable player and a top arm for the 2023 MLB Draft. Add expanded roles for power threat **Jake Plastiak**, two-way threat **Chase Estep**, gap-loving **Kirk Liebert** and a sophomore class of pitchers that gained valuable experience a year ago and there is quiet optimism at Kentucky Proud Park.

ITTER ME THIS

Kentucky junior shortstop **Ryan Ritter** made an immediate impact on the program last season with his elite defensive skills and developing offensive game despite having played just 17 games of junior college ball before arriving in Lexington. The Chicago-area native's all-around skill set and tools have pro scouts drooling and Mingione calling him the "best defensive shortstop I've ever seen as a coach."

"Ryan Ritter is special," Mingione said. "Man, he's special. I saw guys like Dansby Swanson and Alex Bregman in college, and they are obviously better offensively, but I think he's better defensively. I think he's that good of a shortstop."

Ritter has been named a Third-Team Preseason All-American by D1Baseball.com and a Golden Spikes Award candidate by USA Baseball.

Ritter got off to an uneven start in the famed Cape Cod League last summer but turned a corner midway through and then punched it into overdrive at the plate down the stretch, earning all-league honors. He ranked fourth in the league in batting with a .330 mark, had a .410 OBP and posted a 12-game hitting streak the final few weeks. He's been ranked as high as the No. 23 college prospect for the

NO LEAD IS SAFE

UK has shown a knack for erasing large deficits this season, having come back from eight runs down and twice from seven runs behind. The Cats trailed Western Michigan 12-4 with nine outs remaining and responded to win the game 13-12 in 12 innings. UK also came back from seven-run deficits versus TCU and Ohio.

PORTAL POWER

UK hit the NCAA transfer portal hard in the offseason, signing eight players from the D-I ranks to provide immediate help. The group was rated as the No. 5 transfer class in the country according to *Baseball America*, while D1Baseball had two of the players ranked in the top 60 of all transfers.

The four position players – outfielders Adam Fogel, Hunter Jump and John Thrasher along with infielder Daniel Harris IV – have nearly 2,500 combined career collegiate plate appearances and 572 games started. Thrasher was the America East Player of the Year and Fogel a second-team All-Big West honoree in 2021, while Harris was a third-team All-American in 2020.

THE OLYMPIC TIES THAT BIND

UK's **Oraj Anu** and **Wyatt Hudepohl** hit the genetic gold mine, as both players have immediate family members who reached the Summer Olympics. Anu's mother, Oralee Fowler, was member of the 1980 and 1984 Bahamas track team as a sprinter, while Hudepohl's uncle, Joe, won three Olympic swimming medals during 1992 and '96 Olympics.

BIGGIE BOX

One of the pillars of UK's offense is working its game goals in search of the big inning - "Biggie Box" - which is defined as any inning where the Cats put four or more runs on the scoreboard. The approach has been so effective the lineup has opened its "Biggie Box" 131 times since Mingione took over (37 in 2017, 31 in 2018, 20 in 2019, 19 in 2021) and recorded 11 such innings in just 17 games during the pandemic-shortened 2020 season. The Cats also are 119-24 under Mingione when scoring six or more runs. (See box on page six for Biggie Box innings)

Their 11-run inning versus Western Michigan is the second in three seasons and the was the high-est-scoring inning for UK since plating 12 in the first inning at Vanderbilt on May 11, 2002.

HIT PARADE

Kentucky's offense has been one of the nation's elite the past five seasons under Mingione and his staff. In three of the five seasons, the Cats have averaged more than seven runs per game and are averaging 6.6 per game overall. Assistant coach Will Coggin will take over the main offensive duties this season and has a track record of producing success in the box.

- In five years under coach Nick Mingione the Wildcats have swiped 309 bases in 415 attempts, a success rate of 74.5 percent.
- In 2021, the Cats stole 78 bases in 86 attempts. It was the highest success rate (90.7) of any Division I-A team with 50+ stolen bases.
- The Cats were successful on their first 33 stolen base attempts last season, the most consecutive steals to open a season in school history and longest streak in D-I in 2021.
- John Thrasher, a NCBWA Third-Team Preseason All-American who transferred from Hartford, stole 37 bases in 40 attempts last season, averaging more steals per game than NCAA leader Enrique Bradfield Jr. of Vanderbilt. Thrasher has 69 career stolen bases.
- UK's returnees from last season were a perfect 18-of-18 on stolen base attempts in 2021.
- Transfer Daniel Harris IV stole 15 bags at Eastern Kentucky last season and is 31-of-35 in his career.

Kentucky has stolen at least 58 bases in each of the four full seasons Mingione has been head coach.

WALK-OFF KINGS

Kentucky has four walk-offs in the first 17 games this season, including three of the traditional variety and one on a mercy rule. The Cats scored three runs in their final at-bat to beat Bel-larmine, rallied from an eight-run deficit and scored in the 12th to defeat Western Michigan and scored a pair of runs to beat High Point, 4-3. Belief can be an amazing thing.

"SUPER" SENIORS

Four Wildcats opted to take advantage of the extra year of eligibility received when the 2020 season was cut short by the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, giving even more experience to this spring's roster. Pitchers **Sean Harney**, **Daniel Harper** and **Mason Hazelwood** all are back, as is outfielder Oraj Anu. The quartet has been an integral part of the program's success in recent years.

In 2021, Harney and Harper were huge pieces of the pitching staff. Harney, a transfer from UMass, became the first pitcher in school history to save six games and start at least six games in the same season. He was lights out as the closer to open the year and then moved into the weekend rotation when Hazelwood, who was off to a tremendous start as well, was injured in week two of SEC play. Harper battled back from hip surgery to have his best season yet in 2021 as the staff's most trusted arm out of the bullpen once Harney moved to the rotation. Harper needs 31 appearances to set the UK career record.

CATS LEAD THE SEC IN WEEKLY HONORS

Although the strength of our TEAM is our TEAM, the Cats have had standout individual performances that have caught the attention of observers across the country and in the SEC offices. Since the beginning of the 2017 season, UK players have been named SEC Player, Pitcher or Newcomer of the Week **eighteen** times, the most for any school in the conference.

ESTEP NAMED SEC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Kentucky junior infielder Chase Estep was named Southeastern Conference Player of the Week on March 7 after leading the SEC with 18 total bases and helping the Wildcats earn a series win against eighth-ranked TCU. Estep was 6-for-12 against the Horned Frogs with a home run, a pair of doubles, five RBI and four runs scored. He hit a three-run home run to help Kentucky clinch the series on Saturday. Estep added three hits in the midweek with a homer, a double and two runs scored. His accomplishments last week included:

- Had the first four-hit game for UK this season, vs. TCU, and just second since the start of 2021 season.
- Did not make an error at 3B.
- Helped rough up the terrific TCU pitching staff. Friday starter Austin Krob had not allowed a run and only six hits in two starts but UK tagged him with seven runs on seven hits. UK also hit closer River Ridings with his first run allowed on the season. For the week, Estep, from Corbin, Kentucky, batted .474 (9-19) with 3 doubles, 2 home runs, 6 RBI, 6 runs, 2 stolen bases, 4 walks, a .583 on-base percentage and 1.530 OPS.

MINGIONE RECEIVES CHARACTER IN COACHING AWARD

Nick Mingione is the 2022 Jerry Kindall Character in Coaching Award recipient by the Fellowship of Christian Athletes. Mingione was honored at the American Baseball Coaches Association convention in Chicago in January. Named after the late Jerry Kindall, former major leaguer and head coach at the University of Arizona, the award has been presented annually since 2006 by FCA to the college or high school baseball coach who best exemplifies the FCA values of integrity, serving, teamwork and excellence on and off the field baseball field.

He has made it a point to have his team involved in the community, part of his “Student. Person. Player.” guiding principle of the program, participating in numerous philanthropic events in Lexington while also taking time for more than 100 local speaking engagements. In his first season at UK his ethos for the program was on full display as UK players earned SEC Pitcher of the Year, SEC Scholar Athlete of the Year and SEC Community Service Team honors.

Troy Squires won the prestigious Senior CLASS Award in 2018, the first Kentucky athlete in any sport to do so, and Marshall Gei was First-Team Academic All-America in 2019. T.J. Collett then became the second Wildcat in four years to win the Senior CLASS Award when he was honored in 2021.

In five seasons, the Cats have had 159 players earn All-SEC academic honors, including a league-high 34 in 2020 and 39 in 2021. The program has earned the ABCA's prestigious Team Academic Excellence Award, which requires a cumulative team grade point average of at least 3.00, each of the 2018, 2019, 2020 and 2021 seasons, the only school in the SEC to accomplish that feat. Baseball also has had the highest UK male team GPA three straight semesters: Fall 2020, Spring 2021 and Fall 2021, including the highest team GPA of any program in Fall 2021 (3.69).

CATS LAND HERALDED 2022 RECRUITING CLASS

Kentucky made a splash during the November signing period, inking nine prep stars, including five ranked among the nation's top 200 high school players in the 2022 class. The class ranks No. 9 nationally by Perfect Game in terms of average ranking of the players signed.

The impressive class is highlighted by a pair of top 50 recruits – outfielder Tommy Specht (Dubuque, Iowa) and right-handed pitcher/infielder Caden Dana (Montgomery, New York). The other top 200 recruits include right-handed pitcher/infielder Drew Lafferty (South Park, Pennsylvania), middle infielder/right-handed pitcher Carson Applegate (Columbus, New Jersey) and outfielder Lukas Schramm (Apex, North Carolina).

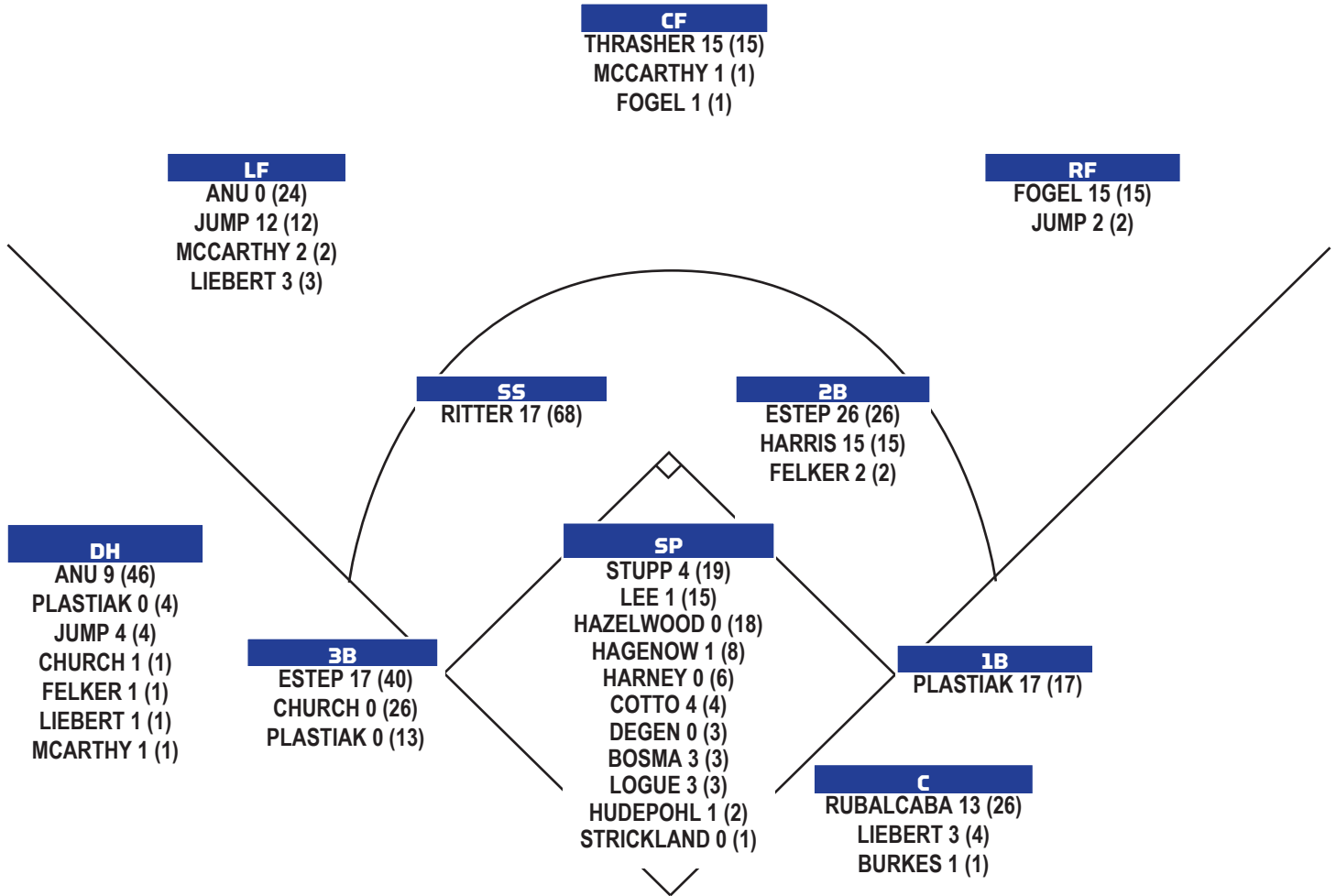

MLB TRAINING GROUND

Kentucky has made its presence felt in the Major League Baseball Draft in recent years with 27 players selected during the Nick Mingione era, including 21 in 2017 and 2018, which was the most of any college program in the country over that span. In Evan White (2017) and Zack Thompson (2019) the Cats have had two first-round selections under Mingione. In the last five drafts:

- 15 Wildcats were selected in the first 10 rounds.
- Seven were selected in the first five rounds, including first-rounders Evan White (2017) and Zack Thompson (2019).
- The 13 picks in 2018 are the second-most for any school in a single draft since 2006 and tied for an SEC record with Texas A&M (2016) and national champion Vanderbilt (2019).
- The 16 underclassmen drafted during that span earned \$11.960 million in signing bonus money, an average of \$747,500 per player.
- All but one draftee was selected higher than previously selected.
- 18 of the draftees had not previously been drafted.
- White was named a 2020 AL Gold Glove winner, the first rookie first baseman in either league to win the award since its inception in 1957.
- Along with White having already made his MLB debut, Zach Pop made the Miami Marlins 2021 opening day roster, while Zach Reks reached The Show last summer as well. Pitchers Sean Hjelle (SF Giants) and Zach Logue (Toronto) were added to the MLB 40-Man rosters during the offseason.

HAZELWOOD BACK

Senior left-hander Mason Hazelwood was shelved last March and underwent UCL elbow surgery. Bucking all the odds he made a triumphant return in less than a year, pitching 0.1 innings out of the bullpen vs. Evansville on March 2.

SUMMER STARS

The summer baseball circuit was good to the Cats again with several players turning in head-turning performances they look to carry over to the 2022 season. Ryan Ritter shook off a slow start to finish as one of the top players in the prestigious Cape Cod League, finishing fourth in batting while being named to the Cape Cod All-League Team.

Senior catcher/outfielder **Kirk Liebert** took advantage of extended at-bats to shine for Kenosha in the Northwoods League. He earned the Rawlings "Big Stick" Award as the top-hitting catcher and was named to the NWL All-Star Game and postseason all-star team.

Others that shined included **Chase Estep** (MLB Dreams Showcase, Northwoods League), **Seth Logue** (Valley League, 1.39 ERA in 19.1 IP) and **Jacob Plastiak** (led MLB Draft League in homers).

ON THE TUBE

The Kentucky baseball team featured on traditional television broadcasts at least nine times during the 2022 season. Nine conference games will air on ESPNU and the SEC Network. UK's remaining home and conference games will be streamed live on SECN+

"THE HOOK"

One of the personal touches to the Wildcats' home, Kentucky Proud Park, is "The Hook," which is the name of the visting bullpen just beyond the right field wall. The name is a tribute to former UK pitcher Jonathan Hooker, who pitched for the Cats from 1998-2001, and died in the plane crash of Comair Flight 5191 on Aug. 27, 2006 in Lexington.

Hooker and his wife, Scarlett Parsley, were married the night before and were on the early-morning flight headed to their honeymoon when the pilots attempted to take off from the wrong runway and crashed into a neighboring field. Forty-nine of the 50 people on board were killed, including both Hooker and Parsley.

The London, Ky. native was a beloved teammate and member of UK Baseball and his family were honored on Mar. 29, 2019 during an in-game ceremony to officially unveil "The Hook," which features a sign and memorial to the former Wildcat.

KENTUCKY PROUD PARK

Kentucky baseball moved into a new home for the 2019 season, opening the \$49 million Kentucky Proud Park, a state-of-the-art facility immediately considered one of the top facilities in all of college baseball. The Wildcats won their first game in their new home, defeating Eastern Kentucky, 7-3, on Feb. 26, 2019.

The stadium features permanent seating for nearly 2,500 fans with additional space on grass berms to accommodate 5,000 fans for regular season games. Beyond the outfield wall, temporary bleachers can be installed for NCAA Tournament games to bring the seating capacity to more than 7,000. Fan amenities also include suites and a new club area.

The team areas were a priority and give our players and coaches everything they need to compete at a high level in a single location. The facility features a team lounge, locker room, training area, indoor hitting and pitching areas, and coaching offices, as well as a recruiting room. All spaces are either new to UK baseball or significantly larger than previous ones.

The playing surface is the AstroTurf[®] Rootzone Diamond Blend, which will allow the team to maximize usage in all weather conditions. The pitcher's mound will remain dirt.

The video board that looms large beyond the right-centerfield wall measures 48 feet wide by 30 feet tall, making it the eighth-largest in college baseball.

The name is a tribute to farmers and businesses of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and the Big Blue Nation. Kentucky Farm Bureau secured the rights to name the stadium from JMI Sports, UK Athletics' multimedia rights partner. In turn, Kentucky Farm Bureau elected to name the stadium for Kentucky Proud, the state's official agricultural marketing program housed at the Kentucky Department of Agriculture. No state taxpayer dollars were used in funding the agreement. The Kentucky Proud program is funded through the generosity of the Kentucky Agricultural Development Fund. The fund is directed by the Kentucky Agricultural Development Board and administered by the Governor's Office of Agricultural Policy.

HEAD COACH NICK MINGIONE

Kentucky fans have quickly created a bond with **Nick Mingione**, whose infectious and unrelenting enthusiasm and down-to-earth personality has earned legions of new fans. Although it is certainly an ingredient in Mingione's on-field success, getting the best out of his players has been the biggest factor in the success he's achieved everywhere he's been. In 18 full seasons of coaching the teams he's been involved with have averaged 38 victories a year and advanced to the postseason 10 times with two national runner-up finishes.

Mingione had a brilliant playing career at Embry-Riddle - he ranks 10th on its career hits list - where he helped lead the program to 154 victories and three NAIA World Series appearances in three seasons as an assistant. When he arrived at Kentucky in 2006 he was immediately part of what is still the Cats' only SEC championship club, then smelled success at Mississippi State before returning to the one place he had always wanted to be a head coach - UK. First season, first Super Regional appearance for the Cats.

He made it a point to have his team involved in the community, part of his "Student. Person. Player." guiding principle of the program, participating in numerous philanthropic events in Lexington while also taking time for more than 100 local speaking engagements. In his first season his ethos for the program was on full display as UK players earned SEC Pitcher of the Year, SEC Scholar Athlete of the Year and SEC Community Service Team honors. He recently was named the winner of 2022 Fellowship of Christian Athletes Jerry Kindall Character in Coaching Award.

Mingione became the winningest UK coach during the first three seasons of his tenure with 103 total wins and 39 in SEC play. The success has carried over to the Major League Baseball Draft, where Mingione and his staff's ability to groom players for a professional career has led to 24 players being selected in the past five MLB Drafts. The 21 players selected in the 2017 and 2018 drafts were the most of any program in the country and Mignione has helped mentor two top 20 overall picks in first baseman Evan White (17th, 2017) and left-handed pitcher Zack Thompson (19th, 2019).

Mingione has a sterling reputation as a recruiter. Over the 14 seasons at Kentucky and Mississippi State for which recruiting rankings are final, he has helped land classes with an average ranking of 15th, including top-three classes in 2013-15. He also has an unmatched track record of player development, coaching 80 players selected in the MLB Draft, as well as 45 All-Americans and six conference players of the year. His first recruiting class at Kentucky was ranked in the Top 10 of all the major industry outlets.

During games, photographers and videographers may shoot from anywhere on the Kentucky Proud Park concourse, terraces and grass berms, provided **NO SPECTATOR'S LINE OF SIGHT IS BLOCKED AND SOCIAL DISTANCING IS BEING OBSERVED.
