## Kentucky Takes on Border Rival in SEC Tournament Semifinals

Kentucky (26-6), the No. 3 seed of the Southeastern Conference Tournament, will take on No. 2 seed and border rival Tennessee (24-7) on Saturday in the semifinals of the SEC Tournament. UK's game will begin 25 minutes after the conclusion of the 1 p.m. semifinal between Texas A\&M and Arkansas.

It is an intriguing matchup between teams ranked No. 5 (Kentucky) and No. 9 (Tennessee) in this week's Associated Press poll. The teams split their two meeting this season. On Jan. 15 in Lexington, Kentucky had a record-setting offensive performance en route to a 107-79 win. TyTy Washington Jr. led UK with 28 points and Sahvir Wheeler had 21 while Santiago Vescovi paced Tennessee with 20.

Exactly one month later in Knoxville, Tennessee turned the tables with a $76-63$ triumph. Vescovi led all scorers with 18 points while Oscar Tshiebwe's 13 led UK.

Kentucky leads the all-time series with the Volunteers, 158-76, including 8-4 at neutral sites. In the SEC Tournament, UK leads 12-5, including 5-2 in semifinal games.

The Wildcats are seeking their seventh SEC Tournament championship under John Calipari and 32nd overall. UK will need to win Saturday to advance to its ninth SEC Tournament title game in 12 tourneys under Calipari (tournament canceled in 2020).

Kentucky leads the league with 31 SEC Tournament titles, more than the rest of the league combined (29). Counting Friday's win, the Wildcats are 135-27 all-time in the SEC Tournament.

Calipari's teams at UMass, Memphis and Kentucky have been to 19 conference championship games in his 28-year career, winning a remarkable 15 of them. Calipari is 58-13 (.817) all-time in conference tournaments, including 24-5 (.828) at UK. Calipari is tied for third in SEC Tournament wins since the event was renewed in 1979.

## Calipari Chasing Another Milestone

With a win over Vanderbilt in the quarterfinals on Friday, UK head coach John Calipari has amassed a 24-5 all-time record as coach of the Wildcats in the league's tournament. The 24 wins currently rank tied for the third-most by any head coach since the event was renewed in 1979. Billy Donovan is first with 27 wins, Wimp Anderson amassed 25. Former Wildcat (and Georgia) head coach Tubby Smith also had 24 victories.

Calipari has led the Wildcats to the championship game in eight of the possible 11 tournaments his team has appeared thus far and has captured the crown on six occasions (2010, 2011, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018).

## SEC Quarterfinals: Kentucky Outlasts Vanderbilt

TyTy Washington Jr. scored 25 points, Oscar Tshiebwe tied a half-century-old school record and No. 5-ranked Kentucky beat Vanderbilt 77-71 in the quarterfinals of the Southeastern Conference Tournament on Friday night.

Washington was at his best during a second-half spurt, scoring eight straight points that helped the third-seeded Wildcats (26-6) create a little breathing room in a back-and-forth game. The freshman hit consecutive 3-pointers from the corner, just a few steps from Kentucky's bench, and then sank a floater in the lane that barely tickled the net and made it 69-60.

He added four free throws in the final 19 seconds to seal the victory inside a packed, pro-Kentucky crowd at Amalie Arena. Washington made 8 of 17 shots, including 4 of 5 from behind the arc.

Tshiebwe, the National Player of the Year, notched his 14th consecutive double-double and 26 th of the season with 12 points and 14 rebounds. That matches the single-season mark set by Kentucky great Dan Issel in 1969-70.

Kentucky won for the 15th time in its last 18 games and moved a step closer to securing a No. 1 seed in the upcoming NCAA Tournament. A win Saturday should do it: The Cats advanced to play No. 2 seed Tennessee in the second of two semifinals. Texas A\&M and Arkansas will meet in the other.

Tshiebwe also had a career-high five blocks, and the Wildcats needed every one of them and then some to hold off the pesky Commodores (17-16) for the third time in two months.

Kentucky looked like it was going to pull away in the second half when it used a 15-1 run to turn a seven-point deficit into a sev-en-point lead. But Vandy coach Jerry Stackhouse called timeout to regroup, and the Commodores clawed their way back.

Scotty Pippen Jr., with his famous NBA father cheering behind the Vandy bench, wasn't nearly as effective as he's been all season or in either of his first two games against Kentucky ( 32 and 33 points, respectively).

Pippen ended up with 10 points and seven assists in the quarterfinal matchup, missing 15 of 17 shots from the field and 6 of 7 from 3-point range. He only got to the free-throw line five times, an off night for a guy who essentially lives at the charity stripe.

Jordan Wright picked up the slack, scoring 27 points on $10-\mathrm{of}-12$ shooting. It wasn't enough against a Kentucky team with so many options and answers.

Jacob Toppin, who played the second half with a plastic face shield after sustaining a bloody nose, added 10 points. Davion Mintz also added 10.

## MORE GAME NOTES

- It was a tightly contested game with four ties and 10 lead changes, with neither team leading by more than nine points.
- Kentucky won the rebounding 37-27, leading to an 11-4 advantage in second-chance points and a 20-9 edge in fastbreak points. UK has a 23-3 record this season when leading the rebounding.


## \#OscarWorthy: National Player of the Year, All-America, SEC Honors Have Begun

The honors began rolling in this week for Oscar Tshiebwe.
The burly Kentucky junior, who has 26 double-doubles this season -- including the last 14 games in a row -- this week was named National Player of the Year and first-team All-America by Sporting News, National Player of the Year by College Hoops Today and The Field of 68, along with Southeastern Conference Player of the Year and first-team All-SEC by both the league's coaches and the media. The coaches selected him to the SEC All-Defensive Team as well.

These honors are likely the tip of the iceberg for Tshiebwe, who is on the radar for at least three more National Player of the Year awards -- Naismith Trophy Midseason Watch List, Wooden Award Late Season Top 20 and Lute Olson Midseason Watch List -- plus the Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Top 5 list for the best center in the country. He's also been named among the 15 players on the Naismith Men's Defensive Player of the Year Watch List.

It's easy to see why he's getting all the attention. Tshiebwe is not only averaging a double-double but doing so with a considerable margin -- averaging a team-best 17.1 points and a nation-leading 15.3 rebounds per game. He is looking to become the first Division I player to average at least 15.0 points and at least 15.0 rebounds per game since Drake's Lewis Lloyd and Alcorn State's Larry Smith each did during the 1979-80 season, and the first major-conference player to average at least 16.0 points and at least 15.0 rebounds for a season since Bill Walton at UCLA in 1972-73. He would be the first Wildcat to do it since Bob Burrow tallied 19.1 points and 17.7 rebounds per game in 1954-55.

In addition to his offensive and rebounding prowess, on the defensive end Tshiebwe is the only major conference player averaging

at least 1.5 blocked shots and 1.5 steals per game. He has also snared 39 more rebounds than the next closest player this season, through games on March 10. Setting records what seems like every other night, Tshiebwe has captivated the country with his relentless work ethic and never-ending fight to grab every rebound and loose ball.

But has the fact he continually produces a double-double every night and has snared double-figure rebounds in all but two games begun to be overlooked by some?
"I would say there may be a couple players that are having more of an impact on games than him, but I'd have to see them, and I'd have to say over the long haul, he's doing things that haven't been done for 45 years," UK head coach John Calipari said recently.

What Tshiebwe has done for the entirety of the season is not only historic, but it has impacted the Wildcats and turned them into a top-five team in the eyes of the voters and in terms of efficiency per KenPom.com.
"There was actually a moment on the bench ... I was like, 'Yo, Oscar is really good.' It wasn't the fact we were surprised, but sometimes you've got to take the time to appreciate what somebody does," teammate Keion Brooks Jr. said after his eye-popping performance Jan. 11 at Vanderbilt. "Oscar has been tremendous for us all year. He's playing exceptionally well."
When Tshiebwe told everyone before the season that his goal was to average 20 rebounds per game, it was understandable for everyone to chuckle and chalk it up to a little hyperbole.
"We all laughed," teammate Davion Mintz said. "Like, c'mon man. Twenty rebounds?"

Nobody -- most notably opponents -- is laughing now.
"Big O," as his teammates call him, now has five performances of 20 or more rebounds this season, including back-to-back outings to open the season and two straight vs. Western Kentucky and Missouri.
"Now, it's normal," Mintz said. "We're expecting him to get 20."
It seems unreasonable to expect it on a night-in and night-out basis considering the attention the opposition is paying him, but Tshiebwe continues to raise the bar -- and it's not just rebounding now.

On Jan. 25, Tshiebwe had a 21-point, 22-rebound showing in the overtime win vs. Mississippi State, the first 20-20 game for a Wildcat in 46 years, when Mike Phillips produced two such outings in 1976.

Another eye-popping stretch was a combined 59 points and 30 rebounds in wins vs. Georgia and at Vanderbilt on Jan. 8 and 11. A game after posting 29 points and 17 rebounds vs. Georgia -- the first UK player with at least 29 points and at least 17 rebounds in a game since Jamal Mashburn totaled 38 points and 19 boards vs. Eastern Kentucky on Dec. 8, 1992 -- he went for 30 points and 13 rebounds at Vanderbilt. That marked the first 30-point, 10 rebound-game for a Wildcat since Patrick Patterson did it vs. Tennessee State on Dec. 22, 2008. The back-to-back performances also marked the first time a Kentucky player has scored at least 29 points in consecutive SEC games since Kenny Walker in February 1985.

Tshiebwe has corralled at least 10 boards in all but two games this season, and is in the midst of a stretch of 19 straight games with double-digit rebounds. That's a record for the Wildcats dating back to the 1967-68 season with complete game-by-game rebounding records. It's the longest streak by any collegiate player since Kevin Marfo of Quinnipiac had a 20-game stretch in 2019-20.

In addition to the season-long honors, Tshiebwe has earned national player of the week distinction from four outlets, the Naismith Trophy (Jan. 31), ESPN's Dick Vitale (Jan. 31), U.S. Basketball Writers Association (Dec. 28), NCAA March Madness (Dec. 28 and Feb. 14) and ESPN's Jay Bilas (Dec. 28).

Tshiebwe has been elite on the glass from the very beginning of the season. He set new records for the Champions Classic and UK debut with 20 boards vs. Duke in the season opener, nearly tied the Rupp Arena record with 20 rebounds in his first home game, and then shattered that Rupp record with 28 boards vs. Western Kentucky. That easily surpassed Shaquille O'Neal's previous mark of 21. It's worth noting Tshiebwe did that primarily against the tallest player in college basketball, Jamarion Sharp, who stands at 7-foot-5.

With 20 boards the following game against Missouri, his 48 boards tied for the most over a two-game span by any Division I player over the last 25 seasons (according to ESPN Stats \& Info).

His 19 rebounds against Florida on Feb. 8 were the most yielded by the Gators since O'Neal had 19 on Feb. 5, 1992.
"He was unbelievable," said Florida head coach Mike White.
With 488 rebounds on the season, Tshiebwe has the third-most in one season in UK history. Two players have corralled more than 500 in a season (Bill Spivey -- 567 in 1951 and Cliff Hagan -- 528 in 1952). If Tshiebwe continues to average 15 rebounds per game, he should become the third player to reach the 500 -rebound plateau on Saturday vs. Tennessee.

Only two players under John Calipari have averaged double-figure rebounds for a season: Anthony Davis (2012) and Randle (2014) who both hauled in 10.4
per game. Tshiebwe has already surpassed both Davis and Randle in total rebounds for a season. Both Randle and Davis played in 40 games in their respective seasons, Tshiebwe needed just 28 games to pass them.
"Everybody wants to do fancy, different things, but for me, rebounding means a lot," Tshiebwe said. "Rebounding can help your team to win the game. You give one more chance to your team. Since I figured it out, if I have to fight, I have to work for the rebound, I'm going to fight for that rebound like no one believes."

Tshiebwe's focus on rebounding has paid dividends with second-chance scoring opportunities. He has scored at least 20 points in a team-high 11 games. He is the first UK player to register three straight games of 20 or more points since Immanuel Quickley in February of 2020 and is also the first Wildcat to score at least 30 points in a game since Quickley had 30 at Texas A\&M on Feb. 25, 2020. He's also the first player since Quickley to have a stretch of at least 14 straight games scoring in double-figures.

Tshiebwe is in the midst of notching 14 straight double-doubles, the longest streak for a UK player since at least 1968, which is the date that complete game-by-game rebounding records are available. Tshiebwe has 26 double-doubles for the season, tying Dan Issel (1969-70) for the single-season school record. Through games on March 10, Tshiebwe was second in the country in double-doubles.

Some more of Tshiebwe's absurd numbers that haven't already been mentioned:

- He is currently leading the Wildcats in points per game (17.1), rebounds per game (15.3), steals per game (1.81), blocks per game (1.59) and field-goal percentage with a minimum of 100 attempts ( $60.5 \%$ ). Since the 1978-79 season, only one Wildcat has led the team in those five categories (minimum 130 field-goal attempts) in a single season -- Anthony Davis in 2011-12
- He is responsible for $38.0 \%$ of all of UK's rebounds thus far. Taking away team rebounds, that number jumps to 41.4\%
- Tshiebwe's 28 rebounds vs. WKU tied for the sixth-most rebounds in UK history and the most in more than 45 years, when Mike Phillips corralled 28 caroms in an overtime game vs. Tennessee on Jan. 10, 1976
- The 28 rebounds marked the most for a Wildcat in a regulation-length game in more than 52 years, when Dan Issel grabbed 29 rebounds vs. LSU on Feb. 22, 1969
- According to STATS, his 28 rebounds vs. WKU are the most in Division I college basketball since Kendall Gray from Delaware State recorded 30 at Coppin State on March 5, 2015 and tied for the fourth-most rebounds in Division I college basketball dating back to the 1996-97 season
- Tshiebwe had more rebounds than Western Kentucky's entire team (27)
- His 80 rebounds through the first five games were the most by an SEC player in any five-game span since Ben Simmons during the 2015-16 season
- His 56 rebounds in his first three games were the most by a Wildcat to start a career since at least 1956-57 (as far back as comprehensive box scores go)
- His 56 boards through the first three games were the third-most through three games over the past 25 seasons in all of college basketball, behind only Kansas State's Michael Beasley $(60,2007)$ and Oklahoma's Blake Griffin $(58,2008)$
- His 22 offensive rebounds in the first two games tied Louisiana Tech's Paul Millsap for the most by an NCAA Division I player in any two-game span over the last 25 seasons
- Through games on March 11, he leads the nation in offensive rebounding percentage at a $19.8 \%$ clip. As a freshman in 2019-20 at West Virginia, Tshiebwe led the nation at
$19.0 \%$. The best offensive rebounding percentage dating back to the 2003-04 season is $23.6 \%$ by DeJuan Blair from Pitt in 2008-09
- He also leads the nation in defensive rebound percentage at $34.7 \%$
- Tshiebwe surpassed last season's rebounding leader, Isaiah Jackson, in total rebounds through 11 games with 170. It took Jackson 25 games to grab 165
- He is the first UK player with six games of at least 20 points and at least 15 rebounds since Jim Andrews did it six times during the 1972-73 season
- First UK player to have at least 30 points and at least 18 rebounds in an SEC road game since Issel at Ole Miss on Feb. 7, 1970 (53 points, 19 rebounds)


## Calipari a Semifinalist for Naismith Coach of the Year

With his team firmly in the discussion as one of the nation's best, Kentucky coach John Calipari was recognized for another stellar coaching job is a semifinalist for the Werner Ladder Naismith Men's College Coach of the Year.

Calipari finds himself leading a $26-6$ Kentucky squad that is ranked No. 2 in the country overall (KenPom.com) and is one of only nine teams in the nation to rank among the nation's top 30 in both offensive and defensive efficiency (through games of March 11) and is in the mix for one of the top seeds in the NCAA Tournament.

Calipari is already one of just two coaches to win the Naismith Men's Coach of the Year three times, tied with Duke's Mike Krzyzewski $(1989,1992,1999)$ for the most Naismith honors. Calipari is looking to become the first four-time winner of the award. He last won it in 2015.

This season has featured a few milestones for Calipari.
Calipari earned his 800th career win in 2021-22. At the time he was on of just 22 coaches, regardless of NCAA level of classification, to reach that barrier. Only 14 coaches have done it with at least 10 seasons at the Division I Level.

In reaching the 800-win plateau, Calipari became the fourth-fastest coach to the milestone. He achieved the feat in 1,037 games. Only Adolph Rupp (972), Roy Williams $(1,012)$ and Dean Smith $(1,029)$ did it faster.

Now with 810 on-court victories, Calipari is 12th for the most victories in Division I history.
He also surpassed 200 wins inside of Rupp Arena which is the most of any Kentucky coach in the venue. The Wildcats have won 19 straight inside the building dating back to last season and are 18-0 on the year.

## Wheeler One of Five Finalists for Bob Cousy Award

As UK's primary floor general, Sahvir Wheeler has shown the ability to lead an offense in a variety of ways. He's risen to the occasion, and his ability to both distribute and score has led to him being named one of five finalists for the Bob Cousy Award and an All-Southeastern Conference Second Team selection.

Through games on March 11, the Georgia transfer leads the SEC and ranks third in the country with 7.1 assists per game. He has dished out double-digit assists five times this season -- including a career-high 14 in the win vs. North Florida -- at least eight assists 12 times, and at least six assists in 20 games. He dished out 11 in the SEC Tournament quarterfinals vs. Vanderbilt on Friday.

Wheeler's ability to get the entire team involved is shown by the fact that UK has five players averaging double-figure scoring. The only team in the Calipari era to finish the season with five players averaging double figures was the 2012 national champion team.

"He's running it down your throat," Robert Morris head coach Andrew Toole said of the pressure Wheeler puts on defenses. "The way that he pushes the ball down the floor just encourages all those other guys to run so hard because he's so unselfish and he's able to get them shots early in the offense. ... He has such a good understanding of the pace, so as soon as there isn't anything there, he's able to organize and get into whatever action they're trying to execute. There were times in the game that even after a made basket where our guys were sprinting back as fast as they can just trying to keep up. It just adds an incredible amount of pressure to your transition defense. There's not many guys that can do what he does."

Wheeler led the SEC in assists per game and assist-to-turnover ratio last season at Georgia. His 193 assists in 2020-21 broke Georgia's previous single-season assists record by 24 dimes despite a shortened season. In the Feb. 15 game at Tennessee, he reached both the 500 mark in career assists and 100 mark in career steals.

Wheeler's current rate of 7.07 assists per game is a shade ahead of Tyler Ulis' 7.03 average when he set the UK single-season assists record in 2015-16 with 246 dimes. He entered the season ranked sixth among all returners nationally in career assists per game.

With 198 assists in 2021-22, Wheeler ranks fourth in UK single-season history, despite missing four games this season with injuries.

It might surprise some to learn that the guy most responsible for setting up his teammates to score also is one of five Wildcats who have scored at least 25 points in a game this season. That would be a sensational 26-point performance vs. North Carolina in the CBS Sports Classic.

Just a week removed from going 0 for 5 at Notre Dame, a game in which the Fighting Irish backed off Wheeler and dared him to shoot, Wheeler bounced back with a 12-for-15 shooting night vs. the Tar Heels. Even when UNC tried to back off, Wheeler continued to drive the ball, probe the defense and eventually get to the rim. His 26 points were one off a career high.

Adding eight assists and a season-high four steals, Wheeler -- according to BigBlueHistory. net -- became the first player in school history post at least 26 points, at least eight assists and at least four steals in the same game.

## Ware Earns SEC Community Service Team Honors

Sophomore Lance Ware was named to the Southeastern Conference's Men's Basketball Community Service Team. Ware is UK's representative on the 14-man team that honors players' exemplary service to their communities.

Known for his tenacity on the court, Ware's passion has been equally as evident away from basketball as he's emerged as one of the most engaging and compassionate student-athletes on campus. During his two years at UK, Ware has spent more than 100 hours working with children at basketball camps or volunteering for community engagement projects across the state of Kentucky.

This past summer, Ware visited with hospital staff in Covington, Kentucky, which served as the region's primary COVID-19 hospital, to thank the staff for its work during the pandemic and also visited Pillar in Crestwood, Kentucky, to share in a field day with adults living with
developmental disabilities
Throughout this season, Ware has also participated in food packaging and delivery for God's Pantry and multiple holiday outreach projects through the Salvation Army, as well as helping with UK Athletics' tornado relief telethon with the Red Cross that raised more than \$5 million for those in need in the western part of Kentucky.

Ware's popularity as the emcee of summer basketball camps has also carried over into his work during the season as he's visited with military families at Fort Knox and visited with elementary students in Fayette County Schools.

Last season, with more strict health and safety protocols in place, Ware participated in multiple Zoom sessions to inspire local elementary students and holiday outreach projects through the Salvation Army. He and his teammates also participated in a virtual "Read Across America Day" session.

## Mintz Tabbed Academic All-District

Graduate student guard Davion Mintz was named to the College Sports Information Directors of America Academic All-District Team and is eligible to earn Academic All-America honors.

Mintz's honor is the first of his career and the first for a UK player since Alex Poythress was tabbed a Second-Team Academic All-American in 2016.

Prior to enrolling at Kentucky as a graduate student, Mintz earned a degree from Creighton University in marketing. He is now pursuing a master's degree in kinesiology and health promotion with an emphasis in sport leadership and will graduate in May. Mintz owns a 3.50 grade-point average as a graduate student.

He was named to the first-year Southeastern Conference Academic Honor Roll a season ago and has also earned Big East Academic honors during his collegiate career.

## The Cats are Winning Any Way They Can

Through games on March 11, there were only seven teams in the country that ranked in the top 30 in efficiency in both offensive and defensive rating per KenPom.com. The Wildcats, with the second-ranked offense and 27th-best defense, join Gonzaga, Arizona, Baylor, Auburn, Houston, Kansas, Illinois and UCLA with that distinction.

UK has won in a variety of ways this season: double-digit wins, an overtime win, wins dominated by offensive brilliance, and ones in which defense has made the most impact.

This season the Wildcats have set a number of records both offensive and defensively:

- The Wildcats defeated LSU at home despite only dishing out three assists. It was the fewest assists in a game in the Calipari era and the fewest for any UK team since 1976
- Kentucky came from double-digit points down for wins at Texas A\&M (-13), at home vs. Alabama (-13) and at home vs. LSU (-11)
- The Wildcats won at home over Alabama despite the Crimson Tide making 14 3-point shots. The Tide attempted 40 3-point shots, a Rupp Arena-record

- The nation's leader in rebound margin, UK won three straight games (Vanderbilt, at Alabama, at South Carolina) despite being outrebounded in each contest
- UK has limited four teams this season to $10 \%$ or lower from 3-point range (at Alabama, at Texas A\&M, North Carolina, Duke)
- Alabama's $10 \%$ shooting percentage from 3-point range was the lowest by a Power 5 team since at least 2010-11 with at least 30 attempts
- Kentucky limited Alabama on Feb. 5 to the Crimson Tide's season lows with 55 points, 28.1 percent field-goal percentage and 10 percent on 3 -point percentage.
- Kentucky is the first team ever to defeat both North Carolina and Kansas by at least 18 points in the same season, with both wins being away from Rupp Arena
- UK's 18-point margin of victory at Kansas on Jan. 29 was the largest in school history against a top-five opponent in a true road game
- UK earned an overtime win over Mississippi State on Jan. 25. It marked the fourth straight win in an overtime game for the Wildcats. UK improved to 63-49 in such games
- On Jan. 19, Texas A\&M shot $4.5 \%$ from 3-point range (1 of 22) which marked UK's best 3-point field-goal percentage defense ever in a game in which the opponent attempted at least 203 -pointers
- Kentucky's 107 points against Tennessee on Jan. 15 were the most for UK against an AP Top 25 ranked team since scoring 107 against Vanderbilt on Jan. 4, 1994
- It was the most points Tennessee had yielded in 15 years
- Kentucky made 38 of 56 from the floor, $67.9 \%$ against the Volunteers. That marked the highest field-goal percentage in any game at UK under John Calipari
- UK became the first team to post a 60-60-90 shooting line in an SEC conference game over the last 25 seasons against Tennessee
- The Wildcats became only the second team in the nation this season to shoot at least $65 \%$ and $60 \%$ from 3 vs. a Division I opponent when it turned the trick vs. Tennessee. It had only happened six times in SEC play since 1996-97 and only five times vs. a ranked foe since 1996-97
- The Wildcats have scored 90 or more in seven games this season, the most since having 14 such games in 2017-18
- Kentucky held High Point to just 48 points on Dec. 31. It was the fewest points UK has allowed since holding Morehead State to 45 points on Nov. 25, 2020
- With 95 points against Western Kentucky and 98 against North Carolina, Kentucky scored 95 points in consecutive games for the first time since Dec. 29, 2016, and Jan. 3 and 7, 2017, when the Wildcats scored at least 95 against Ole Miss, Texas A\&M and Arkansas, respectively

The Wildcats have battled injuries and illnesses all season. This does not include CJ Fredrick who is expected to miss the entire season with a hamstring injury.

Kentucky has played 15 games at full strength this season.
Keion Brooks Jr.: Missed the North Florida game with an illness Davion Mintz: Missed the Albany, North Florida and Central Michigan games with an illness
Jacob Toppin: Missed the Robert Morris, Mount St. Mary's, Ohio and Albany games with a shoulder injury; played six minutes at South Carolina, left game because of sprained ankle, then missed the Florida game
TyTy Washington Jr.: Played nine minutes at Auburn, missed the Mississippi State game with an ankle injury; played 26 minutes
vs. Florida before leaving with a lower-leg injury; played $12 \mathrm{~min}-$ utes at Tennessee before leaving with an injury and missed the Alabama and LSU home games
Lance Ware: Missed the Mount St. Mary's, Ohio and Albany games with an ankle injury
Sahvir Wheeler: Played four minutes at LSU, missed the Georgia and at Vanderbilt games with a neck injury; was injured late in the game at Tennessee with an upper extremity injury and missed the Alabama and LSU home games

## Next Man Up

Kentucky coach John Calipari has always insisted on the "next man up" attitude for his teams. The depth of his rosters has enabled him to go to the hot hand, or exploit matchups with specific advantages a certain player may have.

That has been a key to success for the 2021-22 edition of the Kentucky Wildcats this season. The normal starting five of Sahvir Wheeler, TyTy Washington Jr., Kellan Grady, Keion Brooks Jr. and Oscar Tshiebwe are all averaging at least 10 points per game and playing at least 24 minutes per game. They've been on the floor together for 244 minutes.

That core group is one of the best starting fives in the country. But what makes Kentucky a top-five team in the eyes of the poll voters and a top-five team in terms of overall efficiency (KenPom. com) is the impact its bench can have on a game.

Here are some key performances that led to victories from the following players:

Dontaie Allen: With Washington injured and Wheeler in foul
trouble early in the game, he scored five points, three rebounds and a block in the win over Mississippi State
Daimion Collins: Utilized to take advantage of a collapsing defense, he recorded 10 points and six rebounds in nine minutes at Alabama
Bryce Hopkins: With Kentucky playing short-handed in the home game vs. LSU, he scored nine points in an 11-0 spurt in the second half that overtook the Tigers for good; finished the game with a season-high 13 points
Lance Ware: Had four points and four rebounds in 10 effective minutes at Kansas and the UK offense is able to run more drib-ble-drive motion with him away from the basket; four points and season-high seven rebounds in 14 minutes vs. Florida (home)

## The Winner is ... Kentucky!

Kentucky has earned nine Southeastern Conference weekly awards this season. Oscar Tshiebwe has captured SEC Player of the Week twice, while Sahvir Wheeler and Keion Brooks Jr. have each won SEC Player of the Week once and TyTy Washington Jr. has claimed five SEC Freshman of the Week honors.

Kentucky has dominated the weekly SEC awards with John Calipari at the helm. UK has won more weekly SEC honors (119) than any other school during the Calipari era, including 90 SEC Freshman of the Week awards and 29 SEC Player of the Week honors.

## Big-Game Cal, Cats

John Calipari's teams aren't just good against the best teams in the country, they're great. Not only does Kentucky own a 67-43 record ( $60.9 \%$ ) vs. Associated Press Top 25 teams under John Calipari, UK is 7-4 when both teams are ranked in the AP top five.

All-time, Calipari is 13-8 when both teams are ranked in the AP top five. When both teams are ranked in the AP Top 25, Calipari's all-time record is 89-63, including a 58-35 mark at Kentucky. When both are ranked in the top 10 he has a 27-20 record, including 16-13 at UK.

By defeating top-ranked Michigan State to start the 2019-20 season, UK knocked off the No. 1 team in consecutive seasons for the first time in school history. Kentucky downed Tennessee on Feb. 19, 2019. With the win over MSU to begin 2019-20, the Wildcats have nine victories over the No. 1 team in 25 tries in program history.

Calipari improved to $6-4$ vs. the No. 1 team in his career with the win vs. Michigan State, including 3-2 at Kentucky. According to ESPN, Calipari is the only coach with a winning (.600) percentage against No. 1 ranked teams with a minimum of 10 games faced against the No. 1.

## Jacob Toppin Emerging in Year Three

Watch Jacob Toppin in warmups and one is blown away by the sheer athletic ability the 6 -foot-9 forward possesses. A late-bloomer to the game, he was not recruited heavily out of high school and signed with Rhode Island before transferring to UK following one season with the Rams.

Toppin averaged 5.2 points and 3.5 rebounds in 24 games a season ago in his first year with the Wildcats. He showed flashes of the player he can become -- including a 16-point performance at Vanderbilt.

As a junior, Toppin has been plagued by a few nagging injuries that have prevented a "breakthrough" season -- but over the last month, Toppin has never played better.

He had three consecutive double-figure scoring games, at South Carolina and Tennessee plus the home game vs. Alabama, the first time in his career he had consecutive double-figure games. He nabbed at least six rebounds four times in a six-game stretch. On Friday in the SEC Tournament quarterfinals, Toppin scored 10 points, had two rebounds and added a trio of blocks -- including a leaping swat off the backboard in the first half that changed the momentum in Kentucky's favor.

Toppin's versatility makes him dangerous. He has the ability to guard all five positions and can play inside or on the perimeter.

## Brooks Enjoying Best Stretch of Career

Entering the season, Keion Brooks Jr. was looked to as the leader of the team. He was the only player within the program who had suited up for key minutes in each of the last two seasons.

However, Brooks had yet to have a traditional season in a Kentucky uniform. Following a breakthrough performance his freshman season as the Wildcats overcame an 18 -point sec-ond-half deficit on the road at Florida with Brooks scoring 10 points, the team never took the floor again as the entire postseason was canceled by the COVID-19 pandemic. Last season, the team played in empty arenas and Brooks missed the first half of the season as he overcame an injury to his leg.

As a junior, Brooks has started all 30 games in which he has played and produced the best statistical numbers of his career. He's averaging 10.6 points per game, 4.4 rebounds and shooting at a $49.1 \%$ rate.

He was tabbed the Southeastern Conference's Player of the Week after leading the Wildcats in scoring at 19.5 points per game in a pair of victories on Jan. 25 and 29.

Brooks was sensational for Kentucky in a career performance on the road at No. 5 Kansas. The Fort Wayne, Indiana, native scored a career-high 27 points and added eight rebounds as UK won 80-62 over the Jayhawks to help the SEC secure a 6-4 win in the Big 12/SEC Challenge.

Brooks scored 15 straight points for UK at one point in the second half as the Wildcats staved off a Kansas rally that got within 14 points, but no closer, in the second half. He made 9 of 10 at the free-throw line, both career highs.

He scored the most points for UK against a top-five Associated Press opponent since Tyrese Maxey had 27 points against No. 3 Louisville on Dec. 28, 2019, in a 78-70 home victory. It was also the most points on the road for a Wildcat against a top-five team since Derrick Miller had 32 on Dec. 9, 1989, at No. 2 Kansas in a 150-95 loss. Finally, the 27 points were the most on the road in a UK victory against a top-five team since Fred Cowan had 27 on Feb. 14, 1980, at No. 5 LSU. Kentucky won 76-74 in overtime.

Brooks and the Wildcats put together one of the most impressive performances of the season in their victory over Kansas. It marked UK's first win over a top-five AP ranked squad since defeating No. 1 Michigan State, 69-62, on Nov. 5, 2019. The last win over a top-five team in a true road game came on Dec. 27, 2014, when the Wildcats won at No. 4 Louisville, 58-50.

Kentucky's 18 -point victory marked the largest margin of victory in program history on the road against a top-five team and it was just the 16th loss in Allen Fieldhouse for the Jayhawks in 302 games under Bill Self.

## Grady is Mr. 2,000; Has Become UK's "Steady Eddie"

Kellan Grady entered his final season of college basketball having already achieved a lot. He was a 2,000-point scorer and a four-time All-Atlantic 10 recipient and averaged at least 17.0 points per game in every season while at Davidson.

He elected to use his final season of eligibility to challenge himself against the best of the best every day in practice at Kentucky. That challenge was evident early in preseason when

Grady was missing open shots and attributed it to the new speed and pace at which his new team was asking him to play.
"It took a couple of weeks to just settle in and be more efficient as a shot maker and as a decision maker," Grady said in the preseason. "In hindsight, I'm glad I went through two or three weeks of growing pains and having to overcome some adversity and just settling and trusting the process."

Throughout the opening month of the season, Grady was still finding his way. He had just two double-figure scoring efforts in the team's first nine games, including going scoreless against Ohio.

But, after the team's 2-for-19 outing from 3-point range in a loss at Notre Dame, Grady and John Calipari spent a little time together with the head coach demanding more from his most seasoned veteran.
"He and I went to the gym and I worked with him. I took him out at North Carolina," Calipari said. "He passed up on two shots, you're out."

Grady received the message loud and clear.
Calipari has begun calling Grady "Steady Eddie" and the reliability of performance on both ends of the court has him leading the team in minutes per game (32.9).
"I realized quickly in the first half against (North) Carolina that if I'm open, regardless of whether it's 26 on the shot clock or six on the shot clock, I'm supposed to shoot it," Grady said following UK's win over Western Kentucky. "So that was really all I needed to hear. I guess I kind of should have known that already, but it's great to have a coach that believes in you and wants you to shoot."

The coach's confidence was reinforced in Kentucky's overtime win vs. Mississippi State. Despite a difficult shooting night in regulation, Grady scored UK's first eight points of OT, highlighted by a pair of 3 -pointers that broke open the game.
"I told him after he missed four wide-open shots, 'You'd better keep shooting it,' because he passed one up," Calipari said. "I've got a lot of confidence in him. He has shown that he can miss some shots and come back and make shots."

For the season, Grady leads the Southeastern Conference and ranks seventh nationally with a 43.7\% 3-point clip.

With a season-high-tying 23 points against Western Kentucky, Grady reached 100 career games scoring in double figures. Grady now ranks No. 115 among collegiate scorers of all-time with 2,379 career points.

Grady's current rate of $43.7 \%$ from long range would rank eighth in UK single-season history. Travis Ford has the record with $52.9 \%$ (101 of 191) in 1992-93. His 87 made 3-pointers on the season ranks eighth in single-season history at UK.

## "Super Sixth Man" Mintz

Kentucky's wins last season often featured late-game heroics from Davion Mintz and the clutch gene has been on display this season in wins at Texas A\&M and at home vs. Vanderbilt. On Feb. 2, Mintz tied his career high with 21 points against Vanderbilt, including five of the most important of the game.

After a 16 -point first-half lead had melted to a precarious 44-43 advantage in the second half, Mintz stepped up with a crucial 3-pointer, beginning an 8-0 run that blunted the visitors' momentum. Mintz bookended the run with two free throws to make the count 52-43 and the Wildcats went on to victory.

Going into the Vanderbilt contest on Feb. 2, Mintz had been in a slump that saw him total just nine points over three games, making only 4 of 19 shots. Following the VU game, he said his 21-point night was fueled by an encounter with a young fan.
"It was right after the Kansas game," Mintz explained. "I was walking out of the locker room and there was this little girl, she was probably a young teenager and she's crying her eyes out as she's walking up to me. She was like, 'I'm so excited to meet you. This is my first time and you're my favorite player. I've been waiting a year.' And I had zero points.

Mintz also helped shepherd Kentucky to a key road win in a hostile environment at Texas A\&M on January 19.

Playing before the largest crowd in Reed Arena history, despite a season-high 17 turnovers and season-low 36.2 shooting percentage, the Wildcats gutted out a $64-58$ win with Mintz leading the way down the stretch.

With UK trailing 48-45 and less than 10 minutes to go, the fifth-year senior warmed to the task. Mintz made two free throws to bring UK closer, and a couple of minutes later, swished a

3-pointer to shove the Wildcats ahead 54-52. After A\&M knotted the count, Mintz drove the lane and made a nifty feed for a Jacob Toppin dunk, giving the Wildcats a lead they would not relinquish.

Mintz kept the home team at bay with three defensive rebounds in the waning minutes. With 10 seconds remaining, and UK clinging to a three-point lead, he went to the free throw line. Facing an ocean of white-shirt-clad fans and immersed in a sea of sound, he calmly rattled in the front end of a 1 -and- 1 to seal the verdict.
"Big rebounds, big rebounds, and that's why I put him back in the game," Coach John Calipari said of Mintz after the game. "I put him back in because I knew he'd do that. But that 3 in the corner out of the timeout, that was big. That kinda put everything on their heels. And I think it had our guys convinced 'oh we can win this.' I'm proud of him and how he's playing, he's doing all the little things."

A year ago in his first season at UK, Mintz made multiple clutch 3 s late in games, including a go-ahead 3 with 34 seconds left in a win vs. Auburn and the game-winning 3 with 47 seconds left in a home win vs. Vanderbilt.

As the first player in the John Calipari era at Kentucky to return to school after leading the team in scoring the year before, it was natural for some to heap big expectations on the back of Davion Mintz this season.

With an influx of talent and depth, Mintz was faced with a new role in 2021-22 off the bench. When he missed three games at the end of November with an illness and then struggled to make shots after, it would have been easy for Mintz to lose his confidence.

But not this five-year veteran.
Mintz remained steady in his approach, and it has really paid off during a hot stretch in January. Mintz averaged 12.3 during a six-game stretch from December 31 to January 19.
"It had to pay off," Mintz said recently of coming out of an early season funk. "I have been working my tail off every day, every night, getting extra shots. Just working tirelessly. It can't rain forever. The sun has to come out eventually."

Mintz's January spurt was highlighted by a then-season-high 19 points vs. Georgia, thanks to a season-best five 3 -pointers. The game before, at LSU, Mintz scored 16 points to reach the 1,000-point barrier for his career.

Now up to 8.8 points per game with 43 3-pointers this season, the veteran's consistent approach clearly paid dividends.

## Washington Among All-Time Great UK Freshmen

With all the star-studded freshmen who have walked through the doors at Kentucky under John Calipari's direction, TyTy Washington Jr. is having one of the best seasons of all of them.

Washington is averaging 12.6 points, 4.0 assists and 3.4 rebounds per game, while shooting $46.3 \%$ from the field and $36.2 \%$ from 3 -point range. The number of freshmen in the country averaging at least 12.0 points, at least 4.0 assists and at least 3.0 rebounds while shooting at $46 \%$ or better and $36 \%$ or better from the 3 : just one, Washington. The total nationally regardless of class: nine.
Even in that rare company and even after entering college as a consensus five-star prospect, Washington had slipped under the radar nationally for much of the season until recently. His quiet efficiency has earned a nickname with his head coach.
"He's like the silent assassin," John Calipari said. "Quietly, he tiptoes in and gets 15 points and nine assists."

Playing for a nationally ranked team, one can go unnoticed for only so long. The national attention is beginning to occur as Washington was named a finalist for the Jerry West Award that goes to the nation's best shooting guard. Washington was one of 10 finalists for the honor, the only SEC player and the only first-year player among the finalists.

Coaches around the league certainly appreciate his value, voting Washington second-team All-SEC and also to the SEC All-Freshman Team.
Washington has a savviness to his game that is veteran-like. He can score with the best of them and has five 20-point games. He has posted double-doubles this season in both points and rebounds and points and assists, first Wildcat to do so since Ashton Hagans in the 2019-20 season.

When called upon to take the lead role as point guard, he goes and breaks a school record held by UK's first-ever No. 1 overall pick in the NBA Draft.

With starting point guard Sahvir Wheeler out vs. Georgia with a neck injury, Washington made his first start at point guard and put on a show. He scored 17 points and broke John Wall's single-game school record with 17 assists. Wall had 16 against Hartford on Dec. 29, 2009.
"I mean, John Wall, I watched him play, I watched a bunch of his highlights at Kentucky, I watched him in the NBA a lot," Washington said. "For me to go out there and break the record is exciting because a lot of other great point guards came here as well. I could be the one who said, 'You know, I went to Kentucky, I set the record.' "

The next game, again without Wheeler, Washington posted 15 points and four assists in a dominating win at Vanderbilt.

Washington ranks first in the Southeastern Conference and 26th nationally with a 2.53
assist-to-turnover ratio, through games on March 6. He also is eighth in the league and 120th overall with 4.1 assists per game.

Washington has been able to provide a little bit of everything to the Wildcats this season. He has hit multiple 3-pointers in nine games and dished out at least three assists in 20 games.
"He is a play-making guard," Calipari said after the Georgia game. "Whether he is bringing it up or whether he is away from the ball, he is still a play-making guard who can shoot."

Washington's game has been recognized inside the league as he has reeled in five SEC Freshman of the Week honors. He is the first player in the SEC to win or share the honor in four straight weeks since former UK player Devin Booker won the freshman weekly award four straight times in the 2014-15 season. Coincidentally, that is also the last time a player in the league won SEC Freshman of the Week five times in one season, which Washington has now tied.

The Wildcats have been at their best when Washington is playing well. In the 23 wins in which he has played, he is averaging 14.3 points, 3.9 rebounds and 4.2 assists per game. Washington is shooting $49.4 \%$ from the field and $38.3 \%$ from behind the arc in victories. He has scored in double figures in 18 of those games.

In the six losses, Washington's averages dip down to 6.3 points and 1.5 rebounds per game, giving credence to the notion that as Washington goes, so does Kentucky.

The loss at Auburn proved the most significant for the Wildcats when they are without Washington. UK's dynamic freshman left the game having only played nine minutes with a left ankle injury. Kentucky was leading the game 25-16 and had led by as many as 10 in the opening half before Washington's departure. Auburn rallied to win, 80-71.
"TyTy is a playmaker for us, another scorer. He's our second-leading scorer. So in a big game like this, you take away 14 points per game, it's as simple as that," Fifth-year guard Kellan Grady said. "We've got other guys who are able to step up, but he made some nice plays in just those nine minutes that he was in there, and I think that could've helped us. But even with he mentioning that, that's not an excuse."

## Always Efficient

According to Ken Pomeroy's calculations on kenpom.com, Kentucky teams under John Calipari have consistently ranked among the most efficient teams in the country per possession.

## S-E-C! S-E-C! S-E-C!

Kentucky is the Southeastern Conference's gold standard. Since the SEC's inception in 1932-33, the Wildcats are the most dominant team in the league, recording a 1,034-297 mark (77.7\%) in regular-season conference play. Only Alabama has won more than 800 regular-season SEC games and no other team owns a better winning percentage.

- UK has averaged 11.6 wins and only 3.3 losses per season in 89 seasons in the SEC (including the current season)
- Kentucky has won 49 SEC regular-season titles and 31 SEC Tournament championships
- The Wildcats have won 16 of the last 29 SEC Tournaments (the 2020 one was not played because of the COVID-19 pandemic)
- UK has captured at least a share of six of the last 13 SEC regular-season championships under John Calipari
- Kentucky has played in the championship game of the SEC Tournament in eight of Calipari's 11 tourneys, winning six times ( 2020 tournament not played because of Covid)
- UK won its 1,000th game in SEC regular-season action vs. Alabama on Jan. 11, 2020. Kansas has won 1,000 conference games when combining its records in the Big 6, Big 7, Big 8 and Big 12, but no other team in the country had won 1,000 or more regular-season league games in one conference alone

- Sahvir Wheeler needs 49 assists to become the UK single-season leader. Tyler Ulis (246) in 2015-16 is in first place in the record books
- Wheeler needs to score 75 more points to achieve 1,000 in a career
- Oscar Tshiebwe needs 80 rebounds to become the UK single-season leader. Bill Spivey (567) holds the record
- Tshiebwe needs to score $\mathbf{2 0}$ points to reach $\mathbf{1 , 0 0 0}$ for a career


## Cleaning the Glass

With the aforementioned Oscar Tshiebwe leading the nation in rebounding, Kentucky is one of the top teams in the country on the boards.

Through games on March 10, Kentucky leads the country in rebounding margin (plus-10.1 per game), 14th in total rebounds per game (40.3) and 12th in offensive boards per game (12.9). For comparison, the best rebounding margin of the John Calipari era was plus-9.4 in 2013-14 and again in 2018-19.

The Wildcats are 23-3 this season when winning the rebounding. UK has been at least plus10 in 17 of the 26 victories.
Against Ohio, Kentucky outrebounded the Bobcats by 36, the top rebounding margin of the Calipari era and the school's best since the Wildcats outrebounded Vanderbilt by 39 (57-18) on Jan. 3, 1998, in a 71-62 win. Perhaps more impressive was the plus-18 advantage vs. a bigger, taller North Carolina team that entered its matchup with Kentucky on Dec. 18 ranked 13th in the country in rebounding margin.

With Tshiebwe's $19.8 \%$ offensive rebounding percentage, UK is first in the country in offensive rebounding percentage ( $37.9 \%$ ) through games on March 11, according to KenPom. The Wildcats have capitalized with the additional opportunities with 14.0 second-chance points per game.

## Cats Don't Count on the 3

Kentucky has never been reliant on the 3 under John Calipari. Even with more shooters at their disposal, this season is not an exception.

So far UK is generating $23.6 \%$ of its points from beyond the arc, which is ranked 342nd in the country (through games on March 11), and 27.9\% of its attempts are from long range.

Kentucky's perimeter shooting is led by Kellan Grady, who has sunk 87 of 199 for a 43.7\% clip thus far, the best mark in the Southeastern Conference and seventh nationally through
games on March 10. Davion Mintz and TyTy Washington Jr. have 43 and 34, respectively. As a team, the Wildcats are connecting at a $35.8 \%$ rate, tops in the SEC.

UK was expecting to add the nation's top 3-point shooter over the last two seasons (percentage with a minimum of 150 attempts) in lowa transfer CJ Fredrick, but he is likely to miss the 2021-22 season after undergoing surgery to repair a left hamstring injury.

Even without Fredrick, this team has been capable of sinking the 3-point shot and shown signs of being able to make them in a flurry. The Wildcats made 52.2\% against Robert Morris with 12 makes; canned 11 of 18, 61.1 percent, in the home game vs. Tennessee; and 64.3 percent -- fifth-highest of the Calipari era -- in the home win vs. Alabama (9 of 14).

If you have followed Calipari's teams over the years, Kentucky has never relied on the 3 -point shot. While teams nationally are taking more 3-point shots than ever before, UK has generally bucked the trend and played to the style that's best suited for that particular group.

The highest percentage of 3-point shots taken under Calipari was the 2010-11 Final Four team that lofted $32.4 \%$ of its shots from beyond the arc. No surprise, that team consisted of Brandon Knight and Doron Lamb on the perimeter. That team is also Calipari's top 3-point shooting team at Kentucky. The most attempts per game in the Calipari era was the 2016-17 squad that took 19.89 3-point shots per game.

Not relying on the 3 certainly hasn't hurt the Wildcats. UK is 10-3 all-time under Calipari when making one or fewer from long range.

## Wildcats Achieve Perfect Home Slate

With a victory over Ole Miss in the home finale, Kentucky notched a perfect 18-0 record in Rupp Arena for 2021-22.

It was the 14th perfect home season in the 46 -year history of Rupp Arena and the sixth under Coach John Calipari. Calipari's teams were spotless at home in their first three seasons, 2009-10, 2010-11 and 2011-12, plus the 2014-15 and 2015-16 campaigns.

UK now has an all-time Rupp Arena record of 633-77, a winning rate of $89.2 \%$. Under Calipari, the Wildcats are 206-17 (92.4\%) in their home lair.

Dating back to last season, UK has won 19 in a row. It's the longest current home winning streak in the Southeastern Conference.

## Cats Deliver the Knockout Punch

Kentucky is $310-13$ ( $96.0 \%$ ) in the John Calipari era when leading by at least 10 points at any time in the contest.

Ten of the 13 losses in the Calipari era are to conference opponents.
Perhaps most impressive of all is that $69.6 \%$ of games Calipari has coached in at Kentucky have produced 10 -point leads at some point during the game for UK. The Wildcats have led by 10 points or more in a whopping $84.9 \%$ of Calipari's 365 career wins at Kentucky.

## Hold Them to 55 Points, 40\%

Defense has always been a recipe for success for the Wildcats under John Calipari. The special ingredient: 55 points. Kentucky is a perfect 83-0 under Calipari when holding the opponent to 55 points or fewer, including 4-0 this season.

The Wildcats are 202-9 (95.7\%) under Calipari when limiting the opponent to 63 points or less, including 14-0 this season.

Kentucky also fares well when it keeps the competition to $40 \%$ or less from the floor. UK is 222-24 (90.2\%) vs. opponents under Calipari when its field-goal percentage is $40 \%$ or less. Kentucky is $13-0$ this season when limiting an opponent to $40 \%$ or less.

## Sharpe Joins the Team; Will Not Play This Season

Shaedon Sharpe, originally a part of the 2022 signing class and the consensus No. 1 player in the 2022 class, has enrolled early at the University of Kentucky and is on campus.

Sharpe arrived the first week of January and is practicing with the team. John Calipari announced on Feb. 7 that Sharpe would not play for the Wildcats this season.
"After talking with Shaedon and his parents, we want to end all of the speculation by again saying that he will not play for us this season," Calipari said. "He is committed to bettering himself and our team in practice this year and being better prepared to lead us next season.

The London, Ontario, native measured in at 6-foot-6, 200 pounds upon arrival on campus.
Sharpe averaged 22.6 points, 5.8 rebounds, and 2.7 assists in the 2021 Nike Elite Youth Basketball League this past summer. If the rankings hold and Sharpe remains in the 2022 class, he would be the first consensus No. 1 prospect to sign with Kentucky since Nerlens Noel in 2012.

## Taking Care of Business

Kentucky's 67-43 record vs. opponents ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 in John Calipari's tenure is impressive, but the Wildcats' ability to beat all-comers can't be overlooked. Under Calipari, UK is 298-56 vs. unranked competition, $84.2 \%$.

## Kentucky's Schedule Packs a Punch

Kentucky's schedule is always among the toughest in the country and this season has been no different.

During the nonconference schedule, UK played the likes of Duke in New York in the Champions Classic, at Notre Dame, a matchup vs. North Carolina in Las Vegas in the CBS Sports Classic and at Kansas in the Big 12/SEC Challenge.

Regular-season league play made the schedule even tougher. UK played its permanent home-and-away opponents of Florida, Tennessee and Vanderbilt twice, plus hosted and visited Alabama and LSU. The Wildcats faced the remaining eight SEC opponents once. The league has earned 21 berths in the last three NCAA Tournaments, tied for the second most in college basketball in that time period.

Seven Kentucky opponents are ranked in the March 7 Associated Press Top 25. Nonconference opponents Kansas (6th), Duke (7th) and North Carolina (25th) are among the ranked teams.

In addition to the Wildcats, the other SEC programs ranking among the top 25 include Auburn (4), Tennessee (9) and Arkansas (15). LSU and Alabama are receiving votes.

Kentucky already has played eight foes who were ranked at the time of the game -- Duke, LSU (away), Tennessee (twice), Auburn, Kansas, Alabama (home) and Arkansas.

## Best in the Bluegrass

Kentucky is 21-3 against in-state foes with John Calipari at the helm, including an 11-3 mark vs. Louisville.

Two of the victories over the Cardinals were during postseason play. The Wildcats have won all six meetings played inside Rupp Arena, including a 29-point win in 2017-18, the third-largest margin of victory in the history of the series. UofL's three wins are by a combined nine points.

## One of the Most Experienced Squads in School History

This Kentucky team isn't just experienced by the standards of the usually green John Calipari era, it's historically experienced.

This group, stocked with transfers who played major minutes at other schools, key returners and only three freshmen, started the season with 13,385 total minutes at the NCAA Division I level. That is more than any team in the history of Kentucky basketball entering a season (minutes statistics available through the 1964-65 season).

Other metrics back up the experience. This team also returned 5,203 career points at the NCAA Division I level, the second most in school history. Only the 1995-96 national title team -- hailed as one of the greatest college basketball teams of all-time -- returned more with 5,232 points (that team, like 2021-22, was aided by transfers with Derek Anderson and Mark Pope).

The 2021-22 squad had played in 541 Division I games entering the season, the most by a Kentucky team since the 2002-03 group returned 559 games to its roster.

This team is also rather long in the tooth. Using strictly years, the 2021-22 team averaged 20.7 years in age as of Nov. 1, 2021. The 2019-20 group had an average age of 19.5 years old. The 2021-22 mark is among the top 25 oldest teams in the country. If one factors in a player's down-to-the-day age (in other words, their age number plus days), this team's average age is actually 21.2 years old, as of Nov. 1, 2021.

It should be noted with all the experience boosts that college basketball is collectively older with the NCAA's COVID-19 additional season of eligibility. Davion Mintz and Kellan Grady are using an extra season for Kentucky. And Kentucky's experience does take a hit with the likely season-ending loss of redshirt junior CJ Fredrick (hamstring).

Factoring in the midseason addition of Shaedon Sharpe, UK's roster features a sixth-year graduate, a fifth-year graduate, two redshirt juniors, five juniors, a redshirt sophomore, two sophomores, and four highly touted four- and five-star freshmen. Nine of the 16 players are juniors or above.

It is true that not all experience is equal. Experience in college basketball is not the same as experience at Kentucky.

But even by those standards, this is one of Calipari's most veteran groups. From just a UK returners standpoint, Calipari's squad returned $42.1 \%$ of its minutes, $41.9 \%$ of its scoring, $39.0 \%$ of the rebounds, $42.4 \%$ of the assists and $60.6 \%$ of the 3 -pointers from a season ago. For comparison, the only two Calipari-coached Kentucky teams that returned more UK minutes and more points (in terms of percentages) than the 2021-22 team returns were the 2011-12 national championship squad and the 2014-15 Final Four team that started the season 38-0.

Mintz is the first Wildcat to return to school after leading the team in scoring average the previous season since Randolph Morris led the 2005-06 squad and came back to Kentucky for the 2006-07 season.

How big of a change is the returning experience for Calipari? All but one of his previous 12 teams at UK ranked in the bottom 20 nationally in Ken Pomeroy's experience rankings, including two teams that were dead last.

Despite that experience, the Wildcats only rank 187th in the country, according to KenPom. com, in terms of experience this season, through games March 11.
"When you have veterans, they're on time," Calipari said. "Without even saying anything, they lead. That's been fun. I haven't had many teams with veteran kind of players on it, so I kind of forget that it takes one thing off your plate."

## Booker and Towns Headline All-Star Weekend

Karl-Anthony Towns' record-setting performance in the 3-Point Shooting Contest highlighted another successful NBA All-Star Weekend for Kentucky.

Towns took home the hardware behind a 29-point performance in the finals, besting Luke Kennard and Trae Young. He made 18 of his first 22 shots in the final round and became the first non-guard to win the competition since Kevin Love in 2012. Towns broke the finals record of former UK teammate Devin Booker, who tallied 28 points to win in 2018.
"I didn't come here to participate. I came here to compete. I came here to win," Towns said in his post-victory press conference. "On the other hand, too, it's just I feel for me in my life, my motto has always been if I can't do something at $110 \%$ and give all of me, I don't want to do it, and I knew when I got the call, and I had been begging the NBA for years to let me do this contest, and I finally got that call this year to do it, so just wanted make the most of it. If I'm going show up, I'm going to try to show out as well."

This marks the second skills event Towns has won. He also captured the Skills Challenge in 2016.

Kentucky made its presence felt in all phases of All-Star Weekend. Tyrese Maxey got things started for the Wildcats with an appearance in the Rising Stars Game. He also partnered with Scottie Barnes in the Clutch Challenge shooting competition. The Rising Stars Game took on a new tournament format this season with games being played to a target score of 50. Maxey's team coached by James Worthy lost in the opening round.

For the All-Star game on Sunday, Booker and Towns teamed up with Team Durant and lost on a game-winning shot by LeBron James, 163-160. UK's tandem was all over the stats sheet, however. Booker poured in 20 points and added five rebounds and four steals. Towns scored nine points and had six rebounds and three assists.

Booker was making his third consecutive appearance in the All-Star Game, while Towns' selection is the third of his career and first since 2019.

Kentucky and Kansas were the only two programs to have multiple selections to the 2022 game.

In addition to UK's two All-Star selections, Tyrese Maxey played in the 2022 Rising Stars Game. Maxey is the 25th former UK player to make an appearance in the game as a part of All-Star Weekend festivities and he's the 18th member of the Philadelphia 76ers organization to appear in the game.

## UK Leads With 27 on NBA Opening-Day Rosters

The tipoff to the 2021-22 NBA season featured 27 players on NBA opening-day rosters (including two-way and inactive players) who played and finished their college basketball careers at Kentucky, more than any other college program in the country. Duke, with 21, was the only other school with more than 20 players in the NBA.

With call-ups throughout the season, the number has ballooned to 32 players who have appeared on an NBA roster in 2021-22.

Of the 30 NBA franchises featuring a Wildcat to start the season, 17 had multiple UK players to open the season.

Arguably the two most visible and storied NBA franchises, the New York Knicks and the Los Angeles Lakers, started the season with the most.
The Knicks - nicknamed the Kentucky Knicks by much of Big Blue Nation for UK's significant roster presence - began the season as the leader in NBA Wildcats with four. Former Kentucky stars Kevin Knox II (2018), Nerlens Noel (2013), Immanuel Quickley (2019-20) and Julius Randle (2014) called New York their professional home at the start of the season. A fifth player, Derrick Rose, also played for John Calipari but at Memphis (2008), and assistant coach Kenny Payne was a longtime UK assistant. All played prominent roles in the Knicks' run to the NBA Playoffs last season.

The Lakers were just behind the Knicks with three former Kentucky players in Anthony Davis (2012), Malik Monk (2017) and Rajon Rondo (2005-06) to start the season. Davis and Rondo won NBA titles with the Lakers in 2020. Adding to the UK ties, is head coach Frank Vogel who is a Kentucky graduate and former Wildcat student manager and video coordinator.

Five other franchises - the Charlotte Hornets (Nick Richards [2018-20], PJ Washington [2018-19]), the Detroit Pistons (Hamidou Diallo [2017-18], Trey Lyles [2015]), the Los Angeles Clippers (Eric Bledsoe [2010], Brandon Boston Jr. [2021], the Miami Heat (Bam Adebayo [2017], Tyler Herro [2019]) and the Minnesota Timberwolves (Karl-Anthony Towns [2015], Jarred Vanderbilt [2018]) - opened the season with at least two Wildcats apiece.

Rondo, now in his 16th season, remains the most experienced Kentucky player in the league. Boston Jr. and Isaiah Jackson (2021) are the youngest-tenured NBA Wildcats as rookies.

Of the 27 Wildcats on opening-day NBA rosters, John Calipari coached 26 of them. With Rose, a former Calipari player at Memphis, Calipari also coached 27 players on 2021-22 open-ing-day rosters.

More than 20 other Wildcats are slated to play in the NBA G League or play professionally overseas. Other notable alumni include, 1978 national champion Dwane Casey, who returns as head coach of the Detroit Pistons, and Pat Riley continues to serve as president of the Heat.

Kentucky has enjoyed unprecedented success at putting players in the NBA under Calipari. In the 12 previous seasons of the Calipari era, 43 players have been selected in the NBA Draft, more than any other school. Included in the recent run are 32 first-round picks, three No. 1 overall selections (Davis, Towns and John Wall [2010]) and 21 lottery selections.

Calipari's players have entered the league NBA-ready. His players have garnered 28 AllStar selections - all since 2010 - with Davis winning the game's MVP honor in 2017. Rose was named NBA MVP in 2011. Six of his players have been tabbed All-NBA (Rose, Wall, Davis, Towns, Randle and DeMarcus Cousins), three have been named NBA Rookie of the Year (Rose, Towns and Tyreke Evans), and 15 players from Calipari's first 11 teams at Kentucky have made the NBA All-Rookie teams. UK has produced more All-NBA players, more NBA All-Rookie and more NBA All-Defensive players than any other school in the Calipari era.

The 2020-21 season was another successful one for the former Kentucky stars. Randle was named the 2021 NBA Most Improved Player while Devin Booker (2015) achieved superstar status with a sensational run to the NBA Finals. Following the season, Adebayo, Booker and Keldon Johnson (2019) won gold medals with the U.S. Olympic Team at the Summer Games.

Using figures compiled by basketball-reference.com and spotrac.com, Calipari-coached players only (which includes Rose but not Rondo) have amassed nearly $\$ 3.4$ billion in career NBA contracts. In the 12 seasons Calipari has been the head coach at Kentucky, his players have totaled nearly $\$ 3$ billion in NBA contracts.

In the 2021-22 season alone, former UK players are slated to make nearly $\$ 340$ million. Calipari-coached players only (which includes Rose but not Rondo) will make about the same. Calipari produced a top-10 pick in 11 straight drafts prior to 2020, a feat no other coach has ever accomplished. He has a streak of 14 consecutive drafts with a first-round pick. Calipari is the only coach in the history of the sport to have four players drafted No. 1 overall (Rose 2008, Wall - 2010, Davis - 2012, Towns - 2015).

## "Kentucky United" Relief Efforts Raise Millions

In immediate response to the devastating tornadoes that tore through Western Kentucky on Dec. 10 and 11, the University of Kentucky athletic department, along with JMI Sports and WLEX-TV, produced a "Kentucky United for Tornado Relief" telethon that helped generate more than $\$ 3$ million (with matching funds) to assist victims of the storms.

With an online portal that remained open through the rest of December and with a $\$ 100,000$ donation from proceeds, the tabulation reached more than $\$ 5$ million.

One hundred percent of the proceeds will go to the American Red Cross to aid in the relief efforts in Kentucky and to benefit the victims of the catastrophic event.

Every head coach who was in Lexington during the broadcast of the telethon volunteered his or her time. The coaches teamed with UK student-athletes, who took time off during exam week to handle the multitude of telephone calls.

In addition to Calipari and his wife, Ellen, contributing to the cause, several former players also provided support, including Bam Adebayo (2017), Eric Bledsoe (2010), Devin Booker (2015), Willie Cauley-Stein (2013-15), DeMarcus Cousins (2010), Enes Freedom (2011), Tyrese Maxey (2020), Malik Monk (2017), Jamal Murray (2016), Julius Randle (2014), Karl-Anthony Towns (2015) and John Wall (2010).

Spearheaded by Calipari, UK has held three previous telethons to assist with natural disasters. In 2010, Kentucky and Calipari used a telethon to raise more than $\$ 1$ million for victims of the devastating earthquake in Haiti. UK followed that up with another telethon in 2012 that generated $\$ 1$ million for victims of Superstorm Sandy, and again in 2017 following Hurricane Harvey that devastated the city of Houston. Calipari also helped raise funds for West Liberty, Kentucky, after tornadoes ravaged the town in 2012.

In addition to the telethon, Calipari, UK Athletics Director Mitch Barnhart, and former players Jack "Goose" Givens and Darius Miller joined Kentucky Gov. Andy Beshear and Lt. Gov. Jacqueline Coleman in Western Kentucky on Dec. 19 to hand out shoes to Kentucky residents displaced by the devastating tornadoes. The shoes were provided by Samaritan's Feet, an organization that provides shoes in need. Samaritan's Feet CEO Manny Ohonme also made the trip to deliver the shoes.

Approximately 5,000 pairs of shoes were on site for the two stops at Lake Barkley and Pennyrile state parks with another 5,000 expected to arrive soon after.

Beshear said on Dec. 19 that 944 people were being house by the state after their homes were affected by the tornadoes. Nearly all seven state parks were at capacity as of that Friday.
"The damage in the area is obvious and devastating, but buildings can be rebuilt," Calipari said of the visit. "Our focus right now is on the people in that area and the enormous toll this
has take on them. How can we lift spirits and let people know we care for them and are there for them."

## Wildcats Sign Three During Fall Signing Period

Even by John Calipari era standards, Kentucky 2022 signing class is shaping up to be one of the best in school history.

Chris Livingston, Shaedon Sharpe and Cason Wallace - all consensus five-star prospects in the class of 2022 - signed national letters of intent with UK.

Sharpe enrolled at Kentucky for the 2022 spring semester and is now a part of the 2021-22 roster. Livingston and Wallace will join the program for the 2022-23 season.
"I am really excited about this group," John Calipari said. "When you watch these guys play, the talent and upside is obvious, but what stands out to me about all four of them is how much they want this and want to be here. Their mentality and their drive separate them from their peers. They all wanted to play with one another and wanted the challenge of competing against the best every day. Big Blue Nation, I can't wait for you to meet this group and watch them play."

With the spring signing period still to go, UK is going to be in the mix for one of the top classes in the nation yet again.

In every season but one of the Calipari era, the Wildcats have signed a top-three recruiting class according to the Recruiting Services Consensus Index, which tallies major recruiting rankings and plugs them into a formula to calculate a consensus ranking. With the fall additions, Kentucky has signed 65 top- 50 recruits, 51 top- 25 players and 28 top- 10 players (according to Rivals) in what will now be Calipari's 14 recruiting classes at Kentucky.

The spring signing period begins April 13 . UK can only comment on prospects who have signed official paperwork with the university.

## Antigua, Coleman Highlight New-Look Bench

The Kentucky coaching staff underwent an offseason transformation with a familiar face in Orlando Antigua returning to the UK bench and another top assistant from Illinois in Chin Coleman coming on board. Calipari also created a new position, hiring TJ Beisner as director of player development.

Antigua, a key assistant in the first five seasons of the Calipari era at Kentucky, rejoined the program as associate coach. Coleman joined the staff after four seasons with Illinois.

Antigua and Coleman occupy two of the three on-court assistant coaching positions on the 2021-22 staff. Jai Lucas remains in the other assistant coaching position and Bruiser Flint was elevated to associate to the head coach. Both Lucas and Flint are in their second seasons at Kentucky.

During Antigua's first stint at Kentucky, featuring the 2009-10 season through the 2013-14 national runner-up run, UK compiled a 152-37 record ( $80.4 \%$ ) with a national championship, three Final Four appearances, and two Southeastern Conference regular-season titles and two SEC Tournament crowns.

Known for his eye on the recruiting trail, Antigua helped UK pull in five straight top-ranked recruiting classes (Recruiting Services Consensus Index). In his initial season with the Wildcats, Antigua saw three of his signees drafted in the first round of the 2010 NBA Draft. He was a central figure in the 2010 and 2011 No. 1 classes, which led UK to its eighth national title in 2012 and its first since 1998.

Coleman spent the previous four seasons with Illinois. He was instrumental in the development of Ayo Dosunmu, one of the country's best point guards over the last three seasons. Under Coleman's guidance, Dosunmu raked in dozens of national and conference honors, including USA Today National Player of the Year, Bob Cousy Point Guard of the Year and NCAA Consensus All-America First Team honors. He averaged 20.1 points and 5.3 assists to lead Illinois to a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament.

With Coleman on the bench, Illinois posted back-to-back 20-win seasons the last two years for the first time since the 2012-13 and 2013-14 seasons and finished second in the Big Ten in 2021. With Coleman serving as a defensive coordinator in 2020-21, the Illini finished seventh
in the country in the Ken Pomeroy's adjusted defensive rankings and hovered around the top spot for much of the season.

Beisner, who has more than 15 years of experience in media, communications and digital marketing, oversees the execution of all elements of the student-athlete's off-court experience, including primary areas of player welfare and branding.

In concert with Kentucky's brand and content team and the Kentucky Road initiative Beisner leads and supports the Wildcats' brand-building strategy in the new Name, Image and Likeness era, monitors all changes in NCAA legislation and trends across college athletics to develop strategies and solutions to keep Kentucky at the forefront of college basketball, organizes and manages the program's community service involvement, provides support to players on non-basketball issues, and develops team-wide events focused on educating stu-dent-athletes on personal and career development.

Brad Calipari and Riley Welch also joined the staff as graduate assistants. They are involved in on-court activities with the Wildcats, including practices, individual workouts and film sessions.

Calipari played for the Wildcats from 2017-19 and was a part of a program that won 88 games, advanced to the Elite Eight twice, won an SEC regular-season championship and two SEC Tournament titles. He finished his collegiate career at Detroit Mercy where he saw action in 33 games over two seasons for the Titans. During the 2019-20 season, Calipari averaged 6.1 points per game and connected on 513 -pointers.

A 2019 graduate of Kentucky with a degree in communication, Calipari earned his undergraduate degree in three years. He was a two-time SEC Academic Honor Roll member. At Detroit Mercy he completed a master's degree in liberal studies in May of 2021.

Welch just concluded a two-year career with the Wildcats and graduated in May with an undergraduate degree in liberal studies. He appeared in 34 career games as a Division I player split between two years at Kentucky and one at UC Irvine. Welch also played one season at the College of the Desert where he averaged 8.2 points and 5.0 assists per game.

## Lucas Tabbed 'Rising Star' in The Athletics's '40 Under 40' List

Jai Lucas was ranked by the Athletic as one of the most influential people in college basketball younger than 40 years old.

The "40 Under 40" list is comprised of figures of all ranks, head coaches, assistants included and contributors to the game. The list is intended to "spotlight not only the most visible candidates (head coaches, broadcasters, players), but also a wide array of assistant coaches, writers, executives, administrators, bloggers, numbers crunchers and power brokers who give the sport its texture and flavor - and who themselves have a bright future."

Lucas, 32 years old, is in his second season as an assistant coach and the recruiting coordinator for UK.

Seth Davis, managing editor of the Athletic, headed up the list wrote that Lucas "brings an invaluable pedigree to the job. ... Lucas brings youthful energy to the gym and the recruiting trail, and his value to the program will only increase as he acquires more experience."

A former McDonald's High School All American and now a highly respected coach, Lucas joined the staff as a recruiting coordinator in August of 2020 and was quickly transitioned into a full-time assistant coaching role for the 2020-21 season.

As an assistant, Lucas has been tasked with taking a lead role in Kentucky's recruiting efforts while filling the traditional on-court roles of an assistant, including helping with game and practice preparation and playing a key role in player development through practice and individual workouts. Additionally, as recruiting coordinator, he manages official and unofficial visits and is responsible for the recruiting strategy for the program.

## Fredrick Likely to Miss 2021-22 Season

Redshirt junior guard CJ Fredrick underwent surgery on Nov. 16 to repair a left hamstring injury and is likely to miss the remainder of the 2021-22 season.
"This news hurts so much because I love this team and we have a great group of guys," Fredrick said. "I have the best teammates, coaches, medical staff, friends and family that will get me back where I need to be. We have a very special team this season and I will do whatever I can to support the team. I am looking forward to working hard and being the player I want to be for next season. I appreciate all the support of Big Blue Nation during this difficult time. My journey looks a little different, but I will be back."

Fredrick, who transferred from lowa following the 2020-21 year, entered this season as the nation's leading returner in career 3-point field-goal percentage (46.6\%) with a minimum of 150 attempts.
"I really hate this for CJ," John Calipari said. "He worked so hard for us this summer and made such a positive impact on our team and our culture. He has been an unbelievable teammate. CJ has a bright future ahead of him, and after being evaluated by our medial staff and specialists, it was clear the best thing for CJ was to get this surgery done now and get him back on a path to getting back on the court at $100 \%$. He's been great throughout this whole thing and is already itching to get this process going so he can get back to doing what he loves to do."

The Cincinnati native made 83 3-pointers in two seasons at lowa. Fredrick started all 27 games he appeared in as a redshirt sophomore in 2020-21 and averaged 7.5 points and 1.9 assists per game. He made three or more treys in six games, shot $47.4 \%$ from 3 - the second-best mark by a sophomore in program history - and posted a 5.2 assist-to-turnover ratio.

Fredrick made the All-Big Ten Freshman Team as a redshirt freshman in 2019-20 after averaging 10.2 points and 2.8 assists per game. He made 47 of 102 from long range and was one of three players nationally and the only player from a major conference dating back to 1993
with 65 or more assists, 32 or fewer turnovers, and $46 \%$ shooting or better from 3 .

## Wildcats Scoring Well in NCAA Academic Progress Rate

The Wildcats received an NCAA award in the spring of 2020 for placing in the top $10 \%$ of all men's basketball teams in the country in the NCAA's annual Academic Progress Rate. UK scored a 994 out of a possible 1,000

It marked the sixth straight year the men's basketball team has received the award and the seventh time since 2009.

The APR provides a real-time look at a team's academic success by the progress of each stu-dent-athlete on scholarship. The APR measures academic eligibility, retention and graduation. The scores are a four-year composite, covering the 2015-16 through 2018-19 school years.

Every Division I sports team across the nation calculates its APR each academic year, similar to a report card. Scholarship student-athletes each semester earn one point for remaining eligible and one point for staying in school or graduating.

UK has received a perfect 1,000 mark in six of the last seven single-year APR rates that have been released (numbers were not released in 2021 due to the COVID-19 pandemic). Teams scoring below 930 can face consequences intended to direct additional focus on academics. Those penalties can include practice restrictions and playing-season reductions.

The Wildcats routinely perform well in the classroom, including posting a 3.122 grade-point average in the 2020 fall semester.

## Cats Rock at Rupp

The Wildcats are 633-77 (89.2\%) in Rupp Arena. Among the most notable marks of dominance as the nation's toughest venue to play include:

- School record 54-game winning streak to begin the John Calipari era
- Kentucky is 345-46 (88.2\%) in regular-season SEC games in Rupp
- The Wildcats set a program home record of 19 wins in 2014-15
- UK has gone undefeated at home in six of Calipari's 13 seasons
- Kentucky has a perfect mark in 14 of Rupp Arena's 46 seasons


## 600 Wins at Rupp in Record Time

With a victory over Fairleigh Dickinson on Dec. 7, 2019, Kentucky reached the 600-win mark at Rupp Arena faster than any other program in NCAA Division I level history. UK needed just 670 games to reach win No. 600 in Rupp Arena.

It took UCLA, which previously owned the fastest pace to 600 wins, 689 games in Pauley Pavilion. Only one other team, Kansas, achieved win No. 600 in fewer than 700 games at its home venue. The Jayhawks reached the significant win in their 699th game.

## Cal Owns Longest Win Streaks in Rupp

With UK's 2011-12 season-opening victory over Marist, UK head coach John Calipari recorded his 34th consecutive win in Rupp Arena as UK's head coach. It broke former UK head coach Rick Pitino's longest streak of 33 games in the venue.

The winning streak reached as long as 54 games. Calipari didn't suffer his first loss in Rupp Arena until losing to Baylor in his fourth season, in 2012-13. The 54-game run, however, was his longest career home winning streak. He also had the second-longest streak in the arena as the Cats won 42 straight from March 4, 2014 to Nov. 25, 2016.

## New Chairbacks, Fewer Seats

After receiving a $\$ 16$ million upgrade over the 2014-15 and 2015-16 seasons that enhanced the fan experience with the likes of a new Daktronics center-hung scoreboard, ribbons boards, new corner video boards and a new audio system, Rupp Arena is undergoing an additional transformation as a part of UK's new leasing agreement with the Lexington Center.

Chair-back seating in the upper-level sideline was installed in sections 211-217 and 228-234 for the 2019-20 season. Club areas are available to season ticket holders.

The new seating reduced Rupp Arena's capacity to 20,500.

## Pack the House

Until reducing capacity for the 2019-20 season, Kentucky had led the nation in average home attendance in 20 of 24 seasons. That number included a Rupp Arena record of 24,110 in John Calipari's first season (2009-10) as head coach and averaging more than 23,000 in seven of Calipari's first 10 seasons.

Kentucky averaged 19,338 in 18 home games in 2021-22.

## The Top-Ranked Team at Home

Kentucky has lost just four times at home as the Associated Press topranked team in the history of the program and just three times in Rupp Arena. Prior to the losses to Evansville (Nov. 12) and UCLA (Dec. 3, 2016), the other two losses came by just one point.

The Wildcats are 54-3 all-time as the AP No. 1 team in Rupp Arena since its opening in 1976. The first loss was to Auburn, 53-52, on Jan. 9, 1988.

## Coach Cal in Rupp Arena

It's been downright difficult to beat Kentucky in Rupp Arena during the John Calipari era. UK is 206-17 (92.4\%) in Rupp Arena under Calipari.

- Kentucky is $24-6$ (80.0\%) vs. Associated Press Top 25 opponents in Rupp in the Calipari era
- UK is 182-11 (94.3\%) vs. AP unranked teams in Rupp under Calipari
- The Wildcats are $104-6$ ( $94.5 \%$ ) at home vs. nonconference foes under Calipari
- Calipari notched his 100th career win in Rupp Arena as Kentucky's coach with the Wildcats' 110-75 rout of Auburn on Feb. 21, 2014. It took Calipari 104 games to reach the century mark, the fastest of any UK coach


## Cal Passes Hall for Rupp Record

With a 101-70 victory over Cleveland State on Nov. 23, 2016, John Calipari passed former UK head coach Joe B. Hall for most wins in Rupp Arena. Calipari currently has 206 wins inside the historic venue. Hall won 122.

With Kentucky's overtime win over Mississippi State on Jan. 25, 2022, John Calipari reached 800 on-court wins. At the time he was one of just 22 coaches, regardless of NCAA level of classification, to reach that barrier. Only 14 coaches have done it with at least 10 seasons at the Division I level.

Calipari became the fourth-fastest coach to 800 on-court wins ever at 1,037 games. Only Adolph Rupp ( 972 games), Roy Williams (1,012 games) and Dean Smith (1,029 games) did it faster.

At Kentucky, Calipari owns the second-most wins in program history, trailing only the legendary Adolph Rupp, who led the Wildcats for 41 seasons and spanned 1,066 games.

Although Calipari is still climbing the charts, he is doing it nearly as fast as anyone else in NCAA history. When he and Kentucky defeated Ole Miss on March 5, 2019, Calipari became the fourth-fastest coach to 300 wins ( 369 games) at one program in NCAA history. Only Bill Self (358 games at Kansas), Claire Bee (359 games at Long Island) and Rupp (366 at UK) got there faster.

## Calipari Ahead of the Pack at Kentucky

Through 12 seasons at Kentucky, John Calipari's time in Lexington has been every bit as successful -- and more -- as fans hoped it would when he agreed to become the head coach at Kentucky in the spring of 2009.

By just about every measure, he is the most successful coach in college basketball during the last decade-plus. Among schools who have been to at least two Elite Eights and a Final Four since 2009-10, Calipari ranks:

- First in NCAA Tournament wins (31)
- First in Final Four appearances (four)
- First in Elite Eight appearances (seven)
- First in Sweet Sixteen appearances (eight)
- Second in league tournament titles (six)
- Third in wins (339)
- Third in regular-season conference titles (six)
- Third in NCAA titles (one)


## First-Ballot Hall of Famer

Kentucky men's basketball coach John Calipari joined basketball's fraternity of legends in September 2015 after being elected to the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame on the first ballot.

Calipari joined an elite group of basketball players and coaches in the Naismith Hall of Fame, considered to be one of the ultimate honors in the sport. The Class of 2015 included Calipari, Dick Bevetta, Wildcat Louie Dampier, Lindsay Gaze, Tom Heinsohn, John Isaacs, Spencer Haywood, Lisa Leslie, Dikembe Mutombo, George Raveling and JoJo White.

Calipari was inducted in Springfield, Massachusetts. Nearly 70 former players joined him on stage during his acceptance speech.

## Coach Cal Immortalized at UMass with Statue Unveiling

John Calipari's Hall of Fame rise began at UMass, and the school honored his program's breakthrough in the 1990 s by unveiling a statue of Calipari on the Amherst campus in September of 2021.

Calipari was one of four icons synonymous with UMass basketball to earn the honor. Calipari's statue was unveiled next to Marcus Camby, Julius Erving and the late Jack Leaman outside the Mullins Center.

At UMass, Calipari led the Minutemen to a 193-71 on-court record in his eight seasons as head coach from 1989-96. His .731 career winning percentage remains the best in school history, and he ranks second all-time at UMass in victories with 193.

Calipari led UMass to five straight NCAA Tournament appearances from 1992 to 1996 after UMass had gone to the NCAAs only once in the first 81 years of the program. His Minutemen made the Atlantic 10's first and only Final Four appearance during the 1996 season, during which they went $35-2$ overall and spent 10 weeks ranked No. 1 in the nation. Following the 1996 season, Calipari was named National Coach of the Year by the National Association of Basketball Coaches, The Sporting News and Naismith.

UMass won five straight Atlantic 10 Conference regular-season and tournament titles under Calipari from 1992 to 1996 , becoming only the second team in NCAA history to win its conference championships in the regular season and postseason for five consecutive years.

A three-time Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year selection in 1992, 1993 and 1996, Calipari coached a National Player of the Year (Marcus Camby, 1996), two First Team All-Americans (Lou Roe, 1995; Camby, 1996), three Atlantic 10 Players of the Year (Harper Williams, 1992; Roe, 1995; Camby, 1996) and a total of 24 All-Atlantic 10 selections during his eight seasons at UMass. Calipari's 1996 Final Four Team was also inducted into the UMass Athletics Hall of Fame.

## Coach Cal Court

Not only did John Calipari have a statue erected in his honor this past offseason, the court at Clarion -- Calipari's alma mater -- is now named after the Hall of Famer. The court in Tippin Gymnasium was officially renamed the John V. Calipari Court in September of 2021 and will be known as Coach Cal Court.

Like many coaches, Calipari began his career in basketball on the court as a player. He he was a star high school basketball player at Moon High School in Western Pennsylvania under another Clarion graduate Joe Sacco. Calipari started his college playing career at UNC Wilmington before transferring to Clarion in 1981, helping the Golden Eagles reach their first NCAA Division II Tournament in program history that year.

Under legendary head coach Joe DeGregorio, Clarion went 23-6 and reached the East Region championship game. Calipari was a key member of Clarion's 1981-82 team that started the season 7-0 and ranked third in Division II at one point.

Calipari has remained close with the program throughout his career.

## Calipari Named Coach of the Decade

Underscored by more victories than any other coach or program in his first 10 seasons at the helm at Kentucky, more Final Four appearances, a record number of NBA Draft picks, and the 2012 national championship, John Calipari was named the College Basketball Coach of the Decade by Sporting News in January 2020.

In a piece penned by national writer Mike DeCourcy, Sporting News credited Calipari for changing the college basketball landscape. Detailing Calipari's success - what DeCourcy described as a "college basketball revolution" - DeCourcy wrote that "no one defined the 2010s in the same way as Calipari ... nor achieved the same degree of consistent success."

In an era where kids can enter the NBA Draft at 19 years old, Calipari masterfully balances the priority of players' long-term professional dreams with individual and team development, leading to on-court success that no other team has matched.

I knew we were going to make the program - and I said it at the press conference - it was going to be a players-first program," Calipari told Sporting News. "We were going to make decisions based on them and their needs. And it's not just about the name on the front. It'll be about the name on the back. That's how we're going to do this."

## Calipari Receives Guardians of the Game Award

John Calipari was one of eight coaches to receive the National Association of Basketball Coaches' Guardians of the Game Pillar Awards in 2021 for his work with the John McLendon Minority Leadership Initiative.

The Guardians of the Game Pillar Awards represent the NABC's core values of advocacy, education, inclusion and leadership. Calipari was one of three coaches, alongside Harvard head coach Tommy Amaker and South Carolina head coach Frank Martin, who received the award for inclusion

Calipari, Amaker and Martin were honored for leading and launching the McLendon Minority Leadership Initiative, a coachdriven initiative to provide minorities a jump-start to their careers through practical experiences, opportunities to build their

network, and instilling the values of John McLendon: integrity, education, leadership and mentorship.
Calipari spearheaded the MLI after watching the nation confront issues of social injustice and racial inequality. He recruited Amaker and Martin, both members of the NABC Committee on Racial Reconciliation, to join him to make change on college campuses and present opportunities for minorities. His idea was to recruit minority candidates, known as MLI Future Leaders, and provide access and opportunity with real-world experience and networking platforms designed to elevate talented young women and men of color.

The initiative has drawn more than 80 coaches nationally from basketball, football and baseball across the country to serve as both MLI Ambassadors and be the primary source of funding.

In the first year of the initiative, more than 30 Future Leaders were hired at institutions and organizations and more than 20 landed full-time positions after a year in the program. In the early stages of year two, more than 40 Future Leaders are working at universities and college-driven sports organizations across the country. Nearly $\$ 4$ million has been raised in funding for the initiative.

## Calipari Unrivaled in Conference

John Calipari has won 16 league regular-season championships (including six Southeastern Conference titles) seven more than the next-closest coach in the SEC (Bruce Pearl has nine). Calipari has won six SEC Tournament championships at Kentucky and owns 15 conference tournament titles in his career, 11 more than his closest competitors (Ben Howland, Kermit Davis and Nate Oats).

Calipari has tallied a 381-120 (76.0\%) all-time record within conference play as a head coach and owns a 173-54 (76.2\%) record since joining the SEC.

Although he's been publicly outspoken against conference tournaments -- only because he doesn't favor playing three or more games on consecutive days to win the tournament -- his teams have gotten up for them. Calipari's teams at UMass, Memphis and Kentucky have been to 19 conference championship games in his career, winning a remarkable 15 of them. Calipari is 58-13 (81.7\%) all-time in conference tournaments, including 24-5 (82.8\%) at UK. Calipari ranks third in SEC Tournament wins.

## Calipari in Elite Company with Conference Championships

When Kentucky clinched a share of the 2017 Southeastern Conference championship, John Calipari became the first NCAA Division I coach to lead three different programs (UMass, Memphis, Kentucky) to five on-court regular-season league titles five different times. He won the Atlantic 10 at the helm of UMass in 1992, '93, '94, '95 and '96, Memphis claimed the Conference USA crown in 2004, '06, '07, '08 and '09, and Kentucky has captured the SEC six times in 2010, '12, '15, '16, '17 and '20.

Perhaps more impressive is that Calipari has 31 combined regular-season and tournament championships after clinching the SEC regular-season crown in 2020. That trails only Mark Few of Gonzaga (39 titles), who earned a West Coast Conference regular-season title in 2022, among all active coaches. All-time, Calipari trails only the great Adolph Rupp (41) and Few.

## There's No Place Like Home

John Calipari-coached teams have posted an all-time record of 445-49 (90.1\%) record at home in his stops at UMass, Memphis and Kentucky. At UK, Coach Cal is 206-17 (92.4\%) in Rupp Arena.

In five of Calipari's 12 complete seasons at Kentucky, the Wildcats have posted an undefeated record at home, including a school-record 19-0 mark during the 2014-15 season.

Calipari owns both of UK's longest winning streaks in the arena. He began his career at UK with a 54 -game winning streak at Rupp Arena. It was the longest winning streak since the arena opened in 1976. With a win over Georgia on Feb. 9, 2016, he secured the second-longest streak in the storied building at 34 games (which ended at 42).

## Life Away From Home Isn't So Bad Either

As good as John Calipari's team's have been at home, they're pretty good in hostile environments on the road. Dating back to the 2005-06 season, Calipari has recorded a 118-58 (67.0\%) record on the road. At neutral-site venues, Kentucky is 81-28 (74.3\%) under Calipari.

## Calipari at No. 1

John Calipari is one of just two coaches (Frank McGuire) to lead three programs to a No. 1 ranking in the Associated Press Top 25.

Calipari has led seven of his 13 UK teams to the No. 1 ranking and eight of his last 15 teams to the top (he's done it 10 times overall). When Coach Cal's teams are at the top, they're difficult to knock off:

- Calipari is 110-13 (89.4\%) as the top-ranked Associated Press Top 25 coach in the country
- He's 69-8 (89.6\%) when his team is atop the AP Top 25 as UK's head coach
- Calipari tallied a 32-4 mark at UMass at No. 1 and he was 9-1 at Memphis
- He (110) trails only Duke's Mike Krzyzewski (219) in active coaches with victories at No. 1
- Calipari has coached 123 career games as a No. 1 team, fourth most in NCAA history, trailing Krzyzewski (255), John Wooden (228) and Adolph Rupp (127)
- Among coaches who have owned a No. 1 ranking in at least 119 games, Calipari's winning percentage of $89.4 \%$ trails only Wooden ( $95.2 \%$ ) and is ahead of active coach Krzyzewski (85.8\%)
- Calipari is 6-4 vs. the AP top-ranked team in the land, including 3-2 at UK after defeating Michigan State in 2019-20
- According to ESPN, his $60.0 \%$ winning percentage against AP top-ranked teams is the best for any head coach

## COACH CALIPARI

## The Success Rate

John Calipari has graduated $100 \%$ of the players (23 of 23) who have been eligible to receive their diploma by the end of their senior years and exhausted their athletic eligibility. Of that group, Brad Calipari, current Wildcat Zan Payne, Patrick Patterson, Jarrod Polson and Alex Poythress completed their degrees in three years.

In the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate, which measures eligibility, retention and graduation, Kentucky has posted a single-year Academic Progress Rate of 977 or higher in every season under Calipari, including a perfect 1,000 in six of the last seven single-year reports (numbers were not released last year due to the COVID-19 pandemic).

UK's four-year composite score in the most recent report, which was released in May 2020, was a 994 out of 1,000, earning the team an NCAA academic award for the sixth year in a row for finishing in the top $10 \%$ of Division I men's basketball programs.

## Dream Maker

As someone who prides himself on helping young men reach their dreams, John Calipari has helped 54 players earn selection in the NBA Draft during his college coaching career, including 43 in his first 12 seasons at UK, more than any other coach.

- Four No. 1 overall selections (Derrick Rose, John Wall, Anthony Davis and Karl-Anthony Towns) during the nine drafts from 2008 to 2016. No other coach has more than three No. 1 picks
- In 2010, five of his UK players were selected in the first round for the first time in NBA history
- His six players in the 2012 and 2015 NBA drafts are the most in the two-round era
- Churned out 43 NBA Draft picks, 32 first-rounders (more than the entire Big Ten during the same time span), three No. 1 selections, seven top-five picks and 21 lottery picks at Kentucky
- Of the 61 full-time scholarship players who have finished their college careers at Kentucky under Calipari (did not transfer or leave the program early), 43 have been selected in the NBA Draft, a $70.5 \%$ success rate. Another seven of those made the NBA. This does not include the late Terrence Clarke
- Of the 30 players at UK who have declared for the NBA Draft at the conclusion of their freshman seasons, 27 have been first-round picks. All previous players have played game in the NBA. He is 31 for 34 when including his players from Memphis. This does not include the late Terrence Clarke
- Only coach to produce the top two picks in the same draft (2012, Davis and Michael Kidd-Gilchrist)
- Produced a top-10 pick in 12 straight drafts from 2008-19, the only school to do so during that time period
- Eight of his former players have been named NBA All-Stars (28 total and all since 2010), six have been tabbed All-NBA (11 times), three were named NBA Rookie of the Year, and 15 players from Calipari's first 11 teams at UK have made the NBA All-Rookie teams. Rose was named NBA MVP in 2011 and Davis won NBA All-Star MVP honors in 2017


## Developing Talent

John Calipari hasn't just signed the best talent in the country while he's been at Kentucky; he's been the best at developing that talent and getting it ready for the next level.
Of the 40 top- 25 Rivals.com players Kentucky has signed who did not transfer or leave the program early (and aren't still actively playing at UK), 34 were drafted and 26 were selected in the first round. But that's only half the story. Calipari's players don't just make it to the pros, they're better prepared than anyone else. The proof is in the numbers.

Entering the 2021-22 NBA season, Calipari's NBA pros had amassed nearly $\$ 3.5$ billion in career NBA contracts, which doesn't include endorsement deals and overseas contracts. Of his UK players in the NBA, they have nearly $\$ 3$ billion in career contracts.

There's more: Of UK's 21 lottery picks in the Calipari era, 18 have earned second contracts in the NBA with 11 of them cashing in on max contracts. Of the four who haven't earned second contracts, all have been drafted in the last four years and are still on their rookie deal. Since Calipari's first draft class, 33 lottery selections have earned max contracts in the NBA. Eleven of those players are Kentucky alums. Duke (three), Georgetown (two) and Kansas (two) are the only other programs to have multiple lottery selections earn a max contract.

## Double-Digit Win Streaks

John Calipari's teams have posted 19 streaks of 10 or more wins at Kentucky, Memphis and UMass, including six at UK. They have won 15 or more straight games nine times, 20 or more six times, 25 or more five times, and 30 or more once. Of course, the most famous streak was the 38-0 start during the 2014-15 season.

He suffered his first and only loss to a former assistant against former Memphis assistant Josh Pastner, now the head coach of Georgia Tech, on Dec. 6, 2020.

## COACH CALIPARI

A "players-first" coach with a penchant for helping people reach their dreams, John Calipari, a Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Famer, has guided six teams to the Final Four, led one to a national championship and helped 54 players earn selection in the NBA Draft during his 30-year college coaching career.

Calipari guided Kentucky to its eighth national championship and his first national title in 2012. In becoming only the second coach in NCAA history to lead three different schools to the Final Four, he has racked more than 800 on-court victories, 20 NCAA Tournament on-court appearances, six Final Fours and numerous national coach of the year honors.

From UMass to Memphis and now Kentucky, Calipari's career has been successful throughout, but his most recent run in Lexington has been the best stretch of his career. During Calipari's first 12 seasons at UK, he has led all coaches in NCAA Tournament wins (31), Final Fours (four), Elite Eights (seven) and Sweet 16 s (eight). He is in the top three in total wins (339) in that time span.

In 2015, Coach Cal led college basketball's first ever 38-0 team, and became one of just three coaches to make four Final Fours in a five-year span. At the end of the season, Calipari became the 96th coach to join the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.

While building a program out of obscurity at UMass, laying the foundation at Memphis and restoring luster at the sport's greatest program at Kentucky, he totaled the second-most wins in NCAA history in the first 20 years of a college coaching career.

Quite honestly, though, Calipari's on-court success overshadows a much more significant picture.
In his goal to lead a players-first program, he has helped more than 50 young men realize their dreams and reach the NBA level with 54 players earning NBA Draft selections, including a record five first-round draft picks in 2010. Two years later, six Wildcats heard their names called at the 2012 draft, the most in the two-round draft era. UK, with Calipari's help, would tie those six picks again in 2015, including a record-tying four lottery selections. His four No. 1 overall picks are more than any other coach, and he has had 43 players drafted during his first 12 years at Kentucky, including 32 first-round picks, more than the entire Big Ten combined in that time span.

Calipari's players have entered the league NBA-ready. His players have garnered 28 All-Star selections -- all since 2010 -- with Anthony Davis winning the game's MVP honor in 2017. Derrick Rose was named NBA MVP in 2011. Six of his players have been tabbed All-NBA ( 11 times), three have been named NBA Rookie of the Year and 15 players from Calipari's first 11 teams at Kentucky have made the NBA All-Rookie teams.

Much like he did at UMass, where his players graduated at nearly $80 \%$, Calipari has stressed academics. Seventeen of his last 20 seniors at Memphis earned their bachelor's degrees, and all 23 players at UK who were eligible to graduate by the end of their senior years walked away with a diploma in hand, including five players who earned their degree in just three years, including redshirt junior Zan Payne who completed his degree in August. Calipari's teams routinely have posted a combined team grade-point average of 3.0 or better.

Calipari has raised millions of dollars to help the lives of those in need in the Commonwealth and beyond. He has had a particular passion to assist those impacted by natural disasters. For instance, in 2010, he used a telethon to raise more than $\$ 1$ million for victims of the devastating earthquake in Haiti. He followed that up with telethons in 2012, raising $\$ 1$ million for victims of Superstorm Sandy, in 2017 for victims of Hurricane Harvey, and played a leading role in the "Kentucky United" efforts that generated more than \$5 million for victims of devastating tornadoes in Western Kentucky in 2021.

Calipari launched his foundation in 2012, and since then the foundation has worked with several key partners and donated more than $\$ 1.5$ million, a figure that does not include matching funds that have been contributed from individuals and corporations. In 2013, Calipari initiated hosting an annual alumni weekend around his basketball fantasy experience with the intent to raise money for charity. After generating $\$ 350,000$ for selected organizations and charities during the inaugural game, the weekend has generated millions of dollars for charity since its inception.
in 2019, when federal workers were without pay due to a government shutdown, he, his wife and his foundation assisted workers with financial help and grocery gift cards. He and his wife, Ellen, teamed up with Fayette County Public Schools to help families in need during the COVID-19 pandemic.

His latest efforts include spearheading the creation of the John McLendon Minority Leadership Initiative, a nationwide coach-driven initiative to provide minorities a jump-start to their careers through practical experiences, opportunities to build their network and instilling the values of John McLendon: integrity, education, leadership and mentorship. Participants in the initiative will be known as MLI Future Leaders.

In 2017, Coach Cal was named the head coach of the 2017 USA Basketball Men's U19 World Cup Team, which finished third at the 2017 FIBA U19 World Cup in Cairo.

Author of five books, including the New York Times Best Seller "Players First: Coaching from the Inside Out," Calipari is a master of communication and maximizing talent. He lives by the motto that "it's never a matter of how far you have fallen, but instead it's about how high you bounce back."
