CATS HEAD TO UT MARTIN FOR FIRST ROAD TEST

Following a 3-0 victory over Ball State in the season opener, Kentucky women's soccer gets ready for its first road match of the season as the Wildcats make the trip to UT Martin for a Sunday matinee showdown.

The only previous meeting between the two programs came during the opening round of the 2012 NCAA Tournament, when the Wildcats earned a 1-0 victory in overtime for what was UK's first ever NCAA Tournament win. Sunday's matchup will be the first time for the 'Cats in Martin, Tenn. and is one of just two non-conference road games on the schedule this year.

Kentucky enters having executed a dominating performance to start the season. Hadley Williams and Madison Jones each scored their first career collegiate goals, while veteran attacker, Jordyn Rhodes also found the scoresheet. Defensively, the UK backline allowed just two shots and did not give up a single shot on target. Tallulah Miller earned the shutout in net in what was her first career start.

The contest will mark the first of the 2022 campaign for the Skyhawks, who claimed the Ohio Valley Conference regular season title a year ago with a record of 11-6-1, 6-2 (OVC).

ROSTER RUNDOWN

- Kentucky's 2022 roster features 32 players including 17 newcomers and 15 returners for a total of four fifth-years, five seniors, four juniors, nine sophomores, and 10 freshmen.
- Nine of the 10 freshmen are true first-years and include three defenders, four midfielders, two forwards. Goalkeeper Tallulah Miller is set for her redshirt freshman campaign after logging 24 minutes in net a year ago.
- Three countries are represented on the roster, including Denmark (3), Iceland (1) and the United States (28).
- In the United States, 15 states are represented on the team, including Wisconsin (4), Ohio (4), Kentucky (3), North Carolina (3), Illinois (2), Florida (2), Texas (2), Maryland (1), Georgia (1), Michigan (1), Minnesota (1), Virginia (1), Indiana (1), Tennessee (1), Oklahoma (1).
- The 16 returning players are responsible for 69.7 percent (23 of 33) of goals scored, 58.3 percent (162 of 278) of shots taken, 59.3 percent (73 of 123) of shots on goal, and 52 percent (13 of 25) of assists during the 2020 season.

SERIES HISTORY

Series History: Kentucky leads, 1-0-0 1-00 Home, 0-00 Away, 0-00 Neutral Last Meeting: Nov. 9, 2021 Kentucky 1 | UT Martin 0 (OT)

OUTSTANDING OPENER

The season began on a strong note for Kentucky as the 'Cats posted a decisive 3-0 victory over Ball State in their opening match of the 2022 season. The result was the first opening match win for UK since 2018 and the largest margin of victory in a season-opener since 2011 (W, 3-0 at Oakland). UK did not surrender a single shot on goal in the contest.

WE MEET AGAIN

Kentucky is set to take on UT Martin for just the second time in program history. The teams' lone previous meeting came in the opening round of the 2012 NCAA Tournament when the Wildcats earned the program's first ever NCAA Tournament victory, winning 1-0 in overtime at the UK Soccer Complex.

FABIANO'S FOURTH

Troy Fabiano was named Head Coach of Kentucky Women's Soccer on Nov. 30, 2021 becoming the fourth head coach since the program's establishment in 1992. Fabiano follows past Wildcat leaders Warren Lipka, Jon Lipsitz and Ian Carry.

Fabiano brings 24 years of experience coaching collegiate women's soccer, having previously served as head coach at both UW-Parkside and Milwaukee. Between the two schools, Fabiano owns an overall record of 323-90-42 and has led his team to the NCAA Tournament on 12 occasions.

During his first season at Milwaukee in 2015, the Wisconsin native helped the Panthers improve from a 6-10-2 mark in 2014 to a record of 11-3-4. Fabiano will look to make similar strides in Lexington this season after the Wildcats finished 7-10-2 a year ago.

NEW FRIENDS

12 of the 20 players who appeared in Kentucky's season opening match vs. Ball State (Aug. 18) were making their UK debut. Of those 12 student-athletes, seven were transfers and five were freshman. The newcomers comprised six of the 11 starters for the Wildcats and combined to play 608 minutes. Hadley Williams and Madison Jones each found the back of the net while Lesley Kiesling contributed an assist.

SEC PRESEASON WATCH LIST

Rhodes and Richardson represent the Wildcats on the 2022 SEC Preseason Watch List. For Rhodes, the selection marks her third straight bid while Richardson earns a spot on the list for the second-time in her collegiate career, having also appeared in 2020. In all, a total of 67 student-athletes were named to the watch list.

THE MILWAUKEE BUNCH

Fabiano brings with him five student-athletes from Milwaukee including Hailey Farrington-Bentil, Maggy Henschler, Taylor Hattori, Rafferty Kugler and Lesley Kiesling. The group spent a combined 14 seasons with the Panthers, four each for both Hattori and Henschler and three apiece for Kugler and Kiesling. Farrington-Bentil, who transfered to Milwaukee from Mississippi St. following the 2021 season, did not appear in a match with the Panthers prior to coming to Lexington.

Four of the five Milwaukee transfers appeared in Kentucky's opening night lineup vs. Ball State, with all five seeing game action.

HOME COOKING

Kentucky is slated to play a total of 11 home games on the 2022 season, including six of its eight non-conference matchups. A slew of opponents will make their way to the Wendell and VIckie Bell Soccer Complex this season inlcuding preseason SEC favorites, Tennessee. Last year, the Wildcats finished with a record of 6-4-1 on their home pitch.

FRESH FACES

More than half of the 2022 UK roster was not on the team last season with 17 newcomers arriving at Kentucky this fall. The group includes nine freshman and eight transfers. Five of the eight transfers come by way of Milwaukee where they were coached by Fabiano. The remaing three - Taya Hjorth, Dana Dahm and Hadley Williams - arrive from Florida St., Xavier and North Texas, respectively.

KENTUCKY'S COACHING STAFF

Joining Troy Fabiano on an all new coaching staff are assistants Steve Golas and Michele Dalton.

Golas spent six seasons alongside Fabiano in Milwaukee serving as Assistant Coach from 2015-18 and then again from 2020-2021. During this time the Panthers won five confernece titles and won three conference tournament championships. In 2019, Golas held the head coaching position at Dixie State, leading the Trailblazers to a 12-4-6 record and their second NCAA DII Tournament appearance in program history. Golas hails originally from Sandwich, Mass. and played collegiately at Coe College.

Dalton arrives in Lexington fresh off a twoyear stint as an assistant coach at Western Kentucky. The team won its first C-USA East Division title with Dalton on staff during the 2020 season going 4-0-2 in conference play. Prior to Western Kentucky, Dalton was an assistant coach at DePaul during the 2019 campaign. She played collegiate soccer at Wisconsin from 2007-11 and was named Big Ten Goalkeeper of the Year in 2011 before embarking on her professional career.

SCOUTING UT MARTIN

The Skyhawks enter the 2022 season as the defending regular season champions of the Ohio Valley Conference. The team compiled a 11-6-1 record in 2021 including a 6-2 mark in league play. All-OVC Second-Team honorees Makayla Robinson and Izzy Patterson are both back for UT Martin, along with a pair of accomplished seniors in Maria Castaldo and Catey Hunt.

The team is coached by Phil McNamara, who is in his 13th season with the program and owns an overall record of 115-91-22.

TOP OF HER GLASS

Freshman midfielder Mallory Glass comes to Lexington ready to make an impact. The Louisville, Ky. native had a distinguished high school career. She was named the 2020-21 Gatorade Kentucky Player of the Year as well as a 2021 High School All-American. Glass is one of two, Top Drawer Soccer three-star recruits for UK in this year's freshman class alongside Madison Jones.

VOLUME SHOOTERS

The Wildcats racked up 23 total shots vs. Ball State, including 12 on target. It was the most shots on net for UK since Aug. 26, 2021 when the 'Cats put 13 shots on goal in a 5-0 win vs. University of Louisiana at Lafayette, and the most total shots for Kentucky since 25 against Marshall on Aug. 22, 2021.

Heading up this group of veterens are senior forwards Jordyn Rhodes and Hannah Richardson. The potent offensive duo combined to score 19 of the team's 33 goals a year ago while also pacing the squad with 29 and 21 shots on goal, respectively. The pair ranked fourth in the NCAA for top scoring duos.

Last season, Rhodes was one of the most productive offensive players in the SEC, finishing inside the top-10 in shots, points and goals. She was recognized for her play by being named to the 2021 All-SEC Second Team as well as the United Soccer Coaches All-Southeast Region Second Team.
