UK AIMS FOR FIRST CONFERENCE WIN AT LSU

Kentucky women's soccer returns to the pitch this Sunday when the Wildcats will face the LSU Tigers in Baton Rouge, La. The match will be the first for UK since the team suffered a 4-1 defeat vs. Tennessee last Sunday, with senior Hannah Richardson scoring the Cats' only goal in the contest.

Richardson has been a dynamic threat up front for Kentucky, scoring four goals and dishing out a career-best eight assists already this year. The senior leads the team with 16 points, a total which ranks her top-five in the SEC, and has at least one point in nine of the squad's 11 games.

LSU opened conference play with a pair of victories, but lost its most recent contest on the road at Mississippi State. The Tigers are tied for fourth in the SEC with 28 goals as a team, the same total as UK.

Freshman midfielder Ida Hermannsdottir has been outstanding in her debut season and is currently tied for the team lead in goals alongside fifth-year senior Alesia Garcia.

The Wildcats are 14-7-2 against LSU all-time, with the Tigers prevailing a season ago in the last meeting between the programs, 1-0.

ROSTER RUNDOWN

- Kentucky's 2022 roster features 31 players — including 17 newcomers and 14 returners — for a total of four fifth-years, five seniors, four juniors, eight sophomores, and 10 freshmen.
- Nine of the 10 freshmen are true first-years and include three defenders, four midfielders, two forwards. Goalkeeper Tallulah Miller is set for her redshirt freshman campaign after logging 24 minutes in net a year ago.
- Three countries are represented on the roster, including Denmark (3), Iceland (1) and the United States (28).
- In the United States, 15 states are represented on the team, including Wisconsin (4), Ohio (4), Kentucky (3), North Carolina (3), Florida (2), Texas (2), Illinois (1), Maryland (1), Georgia (1), Michigan (1), Minnesota (1), Virginia (1), Indiana (1), Tennessee (1), Oklahoma (1).
- The 14 returning players are responsible for 69.7 percent (23 of 33) of goals scored, 58.3 percent (162 of 278) of shots taken, 59.3 percent (73 of 123) of shots on goal, and 52 percent (13 of 25) of assists during the 2021 season.

RHODE TO HISTORY

With her two goals during UK's 5-1 win vs. EMU, sophomore Emilie Rhode became the first Wildcat to post a brace off the bench since Alicia Browning in 2007. Browning notched a pair of goals vs. Bowling Green, Sept. 7, 2007 during a 4-0 win for the Cats.

NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

Kentucky has enjoyed success in non-conference play this season going 7-1-0 outside of the SEC. The seven wins mark the most non-conference victories for the program since 2015 and also equal the team's win total from the 2021 season.

SPREAD THE WEALTH

12 different Wildcats have registered a goal this season. It is the most goal scorers Kentucky has had since 2015 and is three shy of the program record of 15.

OFFENSIVE OUTPUT

UK has produced 28 goals this season, the third most in the SEC. UK has scored three or more goals in six matches. It's five goals vs. EMU were in most in a contest this year, as were the team's 28 shots.

POWER PLAY

The Wildcats have picked up two wins in non-conference play against power-five opponents for the first time since 2015, beating Purdue and Iowa St. Kentucky's 2-1 win over Purdue marked the first non-conference victory over a power-five school for the Cats since 2016 when UK knocked off Louisville, 3-1.

ULFA'S CAREER YEAR

Úlfa Úlfarsdóttir has been among the most impressive Wildcats this season, with a career-best 12 points in 2022. The junior has also set career highs in goals (four), game-winning goals (two) and assists (four), while notching two multi-goal games.

HAPPY TO HELP

Hannah Richardson enters Sunday's contest with a team-high eight assists on the year, tying her for the third most in the SEC. Prior to this season, Richardson's previous career-high in assists was three in 2021. The senior has an assist in six of 11 games, including two matches with a pair of helpers.

FRESH FACES

More than half of the 2022 UK roster was not on the team last season with 17 newcomers arriving at Kentucky this fall. The group includes nine freshman and eight transfers. Four of the eight transfers come by way of Milwaukee where they were coached by Fabiano. The remaining four - Taya Hjorth, Dana Dahm, Hailey Farrington Bentil and Hadley

Williams - arrive from Florida St., Xavier, Mississippi St. and North Texas, respectively. Eight of the newcomers have already recorded a goal for Kentucky, while ten of the new arrivals have at least one point. 13 players have made their UK debut thus far.

THE MILWAUKEE BUNCH

Fabiano brings with him four student-athletes from Milwaukee including Maggy Henschler, Taylor Hattori, Rafferty Kugler and Lesley Kiesling. The group spent a combined 14 seasons with the Panthers, four each for both Hattori and Henschler and three apiece for Kugler and Kiesling. All four of the transfers have played minutes for the Wildcats in the early season with Kugler, Hattori and Henschler starting in all 11 matches to this point. In UK's match vs. Eastern Kentucky, Henschler, Hattori and Kiesling all scored their first goals at Kentucky.

SENIOR CONTRIBUTIONS

The Wildcats' 10 seniors have made a huge impact this season, accounting for 15 of the team's 28 goals and 45 of 78 points. Hannah Richardson (4G, 8A) and Jordyn Rhodes (5G, 2A) lead the way with 28 points between them.

PENALTIES

Kentucky is 1/1 on penalty kicks this season with Úlfa Úlfarsdóttir converting the Cats' lone attempt. UK opponents are 2/3 on PK's for the year. Two of the three penalties conceded came vs. Ole Miss as the Rebels went 1/2 from the mark.

SEC PRESEASON WATCH LIST

Rhodes and Richardson represent the Wildcats on the 2022 SEC Preseason Watch List. For Rhodes, the selection marks her third straight bid while Richardson earns a spot on the list for the second-time in her collegiate career, having also appeared in 2020. In all, a total of 67 student-athletes were named to the watch list.

NEW FRIENDS

12 of the 20 players who appeared in Kentucky's season opening match vs. Ball State (Aug. 18) were making their UK debut. Of those 12 student-athletes, seven were transfers and five were freshman. The newcomers comprised six of the 11 starters for the Wildcats on opening night.

FABIANO'S FOURTH

Troy Fabiano was named Head Coach of Kentucky Women's Soccer on Nov. 30, 2021 becoming the fourth head coach since the program's establishment in 1992. Fabiano follows past Wildcat leaders Warren Lipka, Jon Lipsitz and Ian Carry.

Fabiano brings 24 years of experience coaching collegiate women's soccer, having previously served as head coach at both UW-Parkside and Milwaukee. Between the two schools, Fabiano owns an overall record of 323-90-42 and has led his team to the NCAA Tournament on 12 occasions. During his first season at Milwaukee in 2015, the Wisconsin native helped the Panthers improve from a 6-10-2 mark in 2014 to a record of 11-3-4. Fabiano will look to make similar strides in Lexington this season after the Wildcats finished 7-10-2 a year ago.

KENTUCKY'S COACHING STAFF

Joining Troy Fabiano on an all new coaching staff are assistants Steve Golas and Michele Dalton.

Golas spent six seasons alongside Fabiano in Milwaukee serving as Assistant Coach from 2015-18 and then again from 2020-2021. During this time the Panthers won five conference titles and won three conference tournament championships. In 2019, Golas held the head coaching position at Dixie State, leading the Trailblazers to a 12-4-6 record and their second NCAA DII Tournament appearance in program history. Golas hails originally from Sandwich, Mass. and played collegiately at Coe College.

Dalton arrives in Lexington fresh off a two-year stint as an assistant coach at Western Kentucky. The team won its first C-USA East Division title with Dalton on staff during the 2020 season going 4-0-2 in conference play. Prior to Western Kentucky, Dalton was an assistant coach at DePaul during the 2019 campaign. She played collegiate soccer at Wisconsin from 2007-11 and was named Big Ten Goalkeeper of the Year in 2011 before embarking on her professional career.

dent-athletes to record their first career goals this season.

CAPTAINS

Prior to the start of the 2022 season, head coach Troy Fabiano named seniors Hannah Richardson, Jordyn Rhodes, Hailey Farrington-Bentil and Maggy Henschler as captains. Rhodes and Richardson have each spent three years in Lexington while Farrington-Bentil and Henschler are in their first years at Kentucky.

SCOUTING LSU

Ranked 29th in the NCAA's latest RPI, LSU has had a strong start to the 2022 season. Notable results for the Tigers include a 2-2 draw at No. 14 Pepperdine, a 2-0 win on the road at Princeton, and a tightly played, 2-3, defeat at No. 6 Rutgers.
