Chanda Bell, Softball, 2009-12

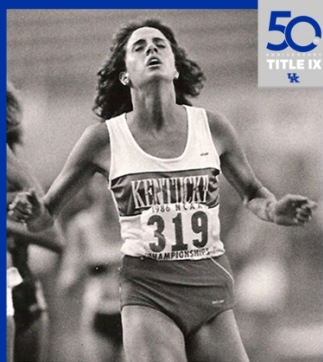
Her arrival in 2009 coincided with the emergence of UK softball as a national power ... Led UK to its first four NCAA Tournament appearances in school history, including UK's first Super Regional ... Won 68 games with a career ERA of 2.55 ... Still holds five school records, including strikeouts in a game (16), season (288) and career (910) along with lowest opponent batting average in a season (.175) and career (.200) ... Threw five no-hitters, including the first no-hitter (2009) and first perfect game (2012) in UK history ... National Pitcher of the Week in 2012 ... Two-time SEC Pitcher of the Week and SEC Freshman of the Week ... 2009 SEC All-Freshman Team ... UK student assistant coach in 2013 ... Assistant coach at Marshall (2014-17) and Indiana (2018-present).



Marsha Bond
VOLLEYBALL

Marsha Bond, Volleyball, 1980-83

Earned All-America honors in 1982 and 1983, the only two-time volleyball All-American in UK history. She led UK to its first NCAA Tournament appearance (1983) and helped the Cats win two SEC Tournament championships during her tenure. A three-year All-SEC and All-SEC Tournament selection, she continues to hold the UK career record for attack percentage (.380), a mark that rates fifth in SEC history.



Lisa Brieding Duerr
TRACK AND FIELD

Lisa Brieding Duerr, Cross Country and Track and Field, 1986-89

Winner of seven SEC titles and one NCAA championship ... Earned six All-America accolades as a Wildcat ... Won SEC indoor titles in the mile and 3,000-meter run during her career ... Outdoor SEC titles include the 3,000-meter run and 5,000-meter run (twice) ... Also part of two league champion relay teams ... National champion in the 3,000 meters as a freshman ... Key member of UK's only national champion cross country team (1988).

Pam Browning

BASKETBALL

Pam Browning, Basketball, 1974-78

One of only two players in UK women's basketball history to be named All-America by *Street & Smith's* annual publication (1977). She ranks fifth on UK's career scoring list with 1,598 points and she continues to hold the school record for highest scoring average in a season, averaging 25.5 points in 1976-77. As a member of the first women's basketball team at UK in the modern era, she led UK to its first two wins over ranked opponents in program history with victories over No. 2 Tennessee Tech and No. 18 Indiana during the 1976-77 campaign. Browning averaged 14.9 points during her four-year career.

Dezerea Bryant-Moore, Track and Field, 2013-2015

was a two-time NCAA champion in the 200-meter dash, winning the indoor event as a junior and outdoor event as a senior. She set an NCAA record with a time of 22.18 seconds. She was a five-time NCAA medalist and a nine-time All-American in her two seasons at UK. Bryant won the 4-by-100-meter relay at the 2019 World Relays as well as the 200 meters in the 2019 United States Championships.

First-team All-America as a junior and third-team All-America as a senior ... Two-time SEC Player of the Year ... SEC Defensive Player of the Year ... Two-year WBCA All-Region ... First-team All-SEC as a junior and senior, second team as a sophomore ... Led team to NCAA Elite Eight as a junior ... Ranks top 10 on numerous UK career lists, including second in games started (133), rebounding (1,099), blocks (178), free throws made (445) and free throws attempted (714), third in scoring (1,846), steals (307) and double-doubles (31), and sixth in games played ... First UK player with more than 100 assists, 100 blocks and 300 steals in her career and just the second player with more than 1,000 points and 1,000 rebounds in a career ... Played two seasons in the WNBA.



Leah Edmond, Volleyball, 2016-19

Four-time AVCA All-American ... Kentucky's leading all-time kills player in both the rally-scoring era and the non-rally scoring era ... 2018 SEC Player of the Year ... 2016 SEC Freshman of the Year ... Four-time All-SEC member ... 2019 AVCA All-Southeast Region Player of the Year ... 19-time winner of SEC Offensive Player of the Week award ... 2019 Senior CLASS Award finalist ... Was a first-team All-SEC selection in 2017, 2018 and 2019.



Mary Elsass Weeks, Rifle, 1996-99

Named a four-time All-American in both the smallbore and air rifle ... Finished third at the NCAA Championships in smallbore (1999) and fourth in the air rifle (1997, 1998 and 1999) ... Led UK to a second-place finish at the NCAA Championships in 1997 ... Helped guide UK to third-place finishes at the NCAA Championships in 1996 and 1998 ... Earned Shooter of the Year, ScholarAthlete and Outstanding Senior awards from the Great American Rifle Conference in 1999.



Makayla Epps, Basketball, 2013-2017

Had an All-America senior season, leading Kentucky with 17.7 points per game SEC Academic Honor Roll (2014, 2015, 2017) ... First-Team All-SEC by league coaches/AP (2015, 2016, 2017) ... First-Team All-American by CollegeSportsMadness (2016) ... SEC All-Tournament Team (2015, 2016, 2017) ... SEC Co-Player of the Week (Feb. 16, 2015) ... espnW National Player of the Week (Dec. 14, 2015) ... SEC Player of the Week (Dec. 15, 2015) ... NCAA Starting Five (Dec. 16, 2015) ... 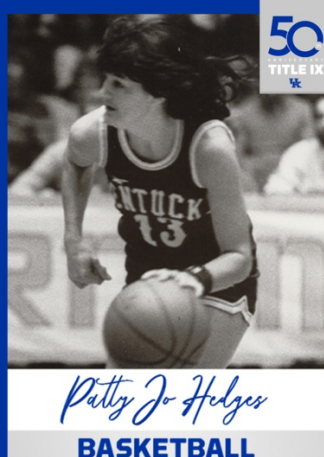
Jenny Hansen, Gymnastics, 1993-1996

One of the most distinguished gymnasts in NCAA history, holding NCAA records with eight individual titles at the national meet; four titles in one year (1995, floor exercise, balance beam, vault, all-around); and three all-around championships (1993-95). The 1995 SEC Female Athlete of the Year, Hansen was recently named the NCAA's most outstanding gymnast of the past 25 years.



Keni Harrison, Track and Field, 2014-15

Set the then-world record in the 100-meter hurdles at 12.20 seconds in 2016 as a professional 2020 Olympic Silver Medalist in the 100H as a pro ... National Track Athlete of the Year by the USTFCCA as a senior, as she was the NCAA champion in the indoor 60m hurdles and outdoor 100m hurdles ... NCAA silver medalist in the 400m hurdles as a junior and senior ... Led UK to an NCAA second-place outdoor team finish in 2015, the best showing in school history ... All totaled, a 15-time All-American ... Five-time SEC gold medalist – 60m indoor hurdles as a junior and senior; 100m outdoor hurdles as a junior and senior, and 400m outdoor hurdles as a junior ... Still holds the school record in the 60m hurdles ... Exemplary student who earned Academic All-America and received the NCAA Top 10 Award as a senior.



Patty Jo Hedges, Basketball, 1980-1983

Member of 1982 SEC Championship team ... Averaged double-figures scoring on that legendary team ... Team USA member while at UK, leading the team to Pan-Am Games Gold and Silver at 1983 World Championship ... Finished her career Hedges is the 16th highest scorer in team history and with the record for most assists additionally she is third in steals in program history



Sherry Hoover Bordner

**CROSS COUNTRY
& TRACK AND FIELD**

Sherry Hoover Bordner, Cross Country/Track and Field, 1986-1989

A seven-time All-America honoree, she won SEC (Southeastern Conference) championships in the mile and on a pair of relay teams during her career. Hoover Bordner set 10 school records during her career, including outdoor records in the 800- and 1,500-meter runs, 4×800 meter relay and the distance medley relay, and indoor records in the 1,500 meter run and 4×800 meter relay. She broke the outdoor freshman record in the 800 meters and indoor freshman records in the 1000-yard run, 1,500-meter run and the mile. Hoover Bordner was a member of the 1988 national champion cross country squad, which remains the only women's national championship team at UK



Rhyné Howard

BASKETBALL

Rhyné Howard, Basketball, 2019-2022

The most decorated player in Kentucky women's basketball history ... Selected first overall at the 2022 WNBA Draft by the Atlanta Dream ... the only player in program history to receive multiple first-team All-America honors from multiple organizations along with being the only UK WBB player to earn four first-team All-SEC honors. This season alone, Howard earned first-team All-America honors from the Senior CLASS Award, Women's Basketball Coaches Association, The Associated Press, Wooden Award and United States Basketball Writers Association. Howard joined Oregon's Sabrina Ionescu, South Carolina's Wilson, Baylor's Brittney Griner, Tennessee's Holdsclaw, Duke's Alana Beard, Oklahoma's Courtney Paris and UConn's Breanna Stewart and Maya Moore as the only three-time first-team AP All-America honorees. Howard was also tabbed Wooden Award, AP and USBWA First-Team All-America in 2020 and 2021 after historic seasons for the Wildcats. She was WBCA First-Team All-America in 2021 and honorable mention from the organization in 2020.

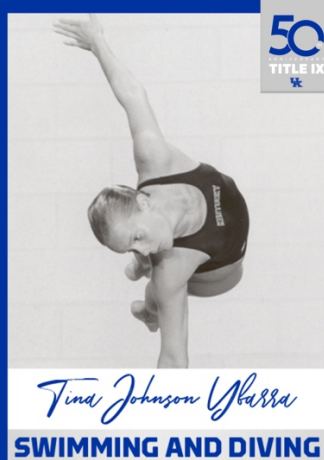


Taryn Ignacio Patrick

SWIMMING AND DIVING

Taryn Ignacio Patrick, Swimming and Diving, 2004-2007

Became Kentucky's first-ever national diving champion, winning the platform event at the 2006 NCAA Championships with an NCAA, SEC and UK record score of 335.20 in the finals ... Also owns the school record with a 333.90 on 1-meter ... Is a five-time All-American in three seasons at UK ... Was named SEC Diver of the Year in all three seasons with the Wildcats ... Won a total of five SEC titles, including two each in 2005 and 2007, the most of any male or female in UK history ... Became the second diver in SEC history to win three consecutive conference titles on platform ... Currently the diving coach at Fresno State.



Tina Johnson Ybarra, Diving, 1993-1996

An eight-time All-America diver, winning the honor in one-meter, three-meter and platform diving. She was the 1996 SEC one-meter diving champion and NCAA runner-up in the platform event, she was named SEC Swimmer and Diver of the Year by league coaches three times (1995-97). She was also an Academic All-American and a three-time member of the SEC All-Academic Team, leaving school as UK's record-holder in three categories.



Molly Johnson-Belcher, Softball, 2007-10

Program's first All-American ... UK's first four-time All-SEC honoree ... NFCA Scholar-Athlete ... Led UK to its first NCAA Tournament berth ... Ended her career owning career records in batting average (.389), doubles (56), runs (161), home runs (35), slugging percentage (.656), total bases (445); was second in assists (510) and RBI (135); third in hits (264) and stolen bases (66); fourth in triples (10) ... Also set single-season records in hits (81), doubles (20), runs scored (53), on-base percentage (.498), as well as single-game records for runs (4), doubles (3), home runs (2) ... Member of U.S. National team in 2009 and 2010 helping lead the Americans to gold at the 2012 ISF World Championship and the 2011 Pan Am Games ... Current UK assistant coach.



Griffin Joiner, Softball, 2012-15

Ended her career ranked top-10 all-time on UK's career record list for games played, hits, RBI, batting average, walks, at-bats, home runs, slugging percentage, total bases, fielding percentage and putouts ... SEC All-Defensive Team in 2013 and 2014 ... All-SEC in 2013.



Stephanie Klefot Vonderheide, Volleyball, 2009-12

First player in UK and SEC history to win SEC Libero of the Year in three consecutive seasons ... AVCA All-America Second Team in 2011 and was also an honorable-mention selection in 2012 ... Four-time All-SEC selection ... Four-time NCAA Tournament participant and a part of three teams that advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 ... Finished career with 1,924 career digs, which ranked second in UK history and fourth in league history ... Appeared in a 489 career sets, two shy of the school record ... Her 608 digs in 2011 were the most ever in a single season in UK history and the sixth most in the SEC ... During the 25-point rally scoring era, ranked first in sets played (489), digs (1,924), matches with 10 or more digs (98), and matches with 20 or more digs (28).



Rachel Komisarz

SWIMMING AND DIVING

Rachel Komisarz, Swimming, 1996-1999

A record-breaking swimmer, Southeastern Conference champion and All-American, going on to earn two Olympic medals. She set records in five individual events and four relays for the Wildcats. She won SEC titles in the 200-yard butterfly and the 500- and 1,650-yard freestyle and earned the Commissioner's Trophy for scoring the most points at the 1999 SEC Championships. She earned six All-America honors over five events and also was an Academic All-American by the College Sports Information Directors of America.



Mollie Korth

GYMNASTICS

Mollie Korth, Gymnastics, 2017-2020

Named first-team WCGA Regular Season All-American on vault and second-team WCGA Regular Season All-American on bars and all-around ... Named All-SEC in 2020... 2020 AAI Award Finalist ... Named SEC Gymnast of the Week on Jan. 7, 2020 ... Won SEC Specialist of the Week on Feb. 25 (first athlete in program history to earn each SEC weekly award over career) ... Named WCGA Scholastic All-American ... Second-team WCGA Regular Season All-American on vault and all-around in 2019 ... 2019 All-SEC in vault ... Named first-team All-American on vault and second-team All-American on all-around in 2018 ... 2018 NACGC/W Regular Season All-American on vault and all-around ... 2018 All-SEC with 9.9 on vault ... 2017 First Team All-American on bars and Second Team All-America in the all-around after her performance as an individual at the NCAA National Championships

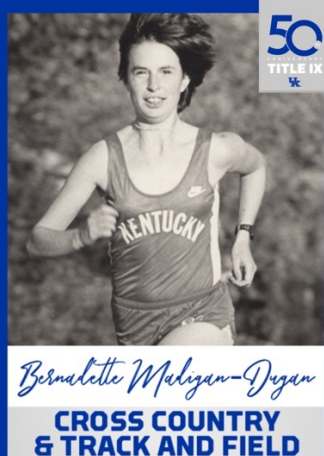
Kayla Kowalik, Softball, 2019-Pres.

Madison Lilley, Volleyball, 2017-2020/21

2020 NCAA National Champion ... 2020 AVCA National Player of the Year, the first in the history of Kentucky Volleyball ... 2018 and 2020 SEC Player of the Year ... 2020 AVCA All-Southeast Region and Southeast Region Player of the Year ... Member of the 2020 NCAA Championship All-Tournament Team ... Named the Most Outstanding Player of the 2020 NCAA Final Four ... 2017 SEC Freshman of the Year ... ESPY Finalist for Most Outstanding College Athlete (Female) ... HONDA Award Winner for Volleyball, the second all-time for any sport at Kentucky ... Member of USA Volleyball and now has signed a professional contract with a European Team.



Bernadette Madigan-Dugan, Cross Country/Track and Field, 1981-85

One of the greatest distance runners in Kentucky history ... First UK female to win a national track championship when she won the NCAA two-mile run in 1982 ... Won two Southeastern Conference titles, the 1982 3,000-meter run and the 1983 three-mile run ... Earned All-America honors in five separate events – cross country, indoor two-mile, outdoor 3,000 meters, indoor 3,200-meter relay and the outdoor 10,000 meters ... Competed for Great Britain in the 1985 World Student Games ... Has coached collegiately at Marshall, Furman, UK and Transylvania ... Currently coaching at Lexington Catholic High School ... Also has been a mentor for numerous athletes in the running community.



Alex Martens, Softball, 2017-2020

In 2020-shortened season, was the NCAA leader with 47 RBI at the point of interruption of the season, while also leading the NCAA in runs batted in per game ... In the top-10 all-time at Kentucky in runs scored, home runs, runs batted in and slugging ... 2019 NFCA Second Team All-Region ... 2017 CATSPY finalist for Performance of the Year with her performance in the 2017 NCAA Lexington Regional, hitting .417, logging four hits, four runs scored, a home run and three RBI on the weekend in her first-career postseason.



A'dia Mathies, Basketball, 2010-13

At UK, Mathies was AP All-American second team (2013) and third team (2012). A two-time finalist for the John R. Wooden Award and the Naismith Trophy, she was the SEC Player of the Year as a junior and senior. Mathies is UK's all-time leader in steals (320), games played (140) and started (139), while ranking second in scoring (2,014) and 3FG made (177), third in FG made (712), FT made (413) and ninth in assists (349). She was the first player in UK history (men or women) to accumulate over 2,000 points, 600 rebounds, 300 assists and 300 steals in a career. Part of UK's all-time winningest class with an overall 111-30 (.787) record, Mathies helped UK claim an SEC regular-season title for the first time in 30 years in 2012 and advanced to four NCAA Tournament Sweet 16s and three Elite Eights.



Valerie McGovern Young

**CROSS COUNTRY
& TRACK AND FIELD**

Valerie McGovern Young, Cross Country/Track and Field, 1988-91 won three individual national championships in the 5,000-meter run and was a key contributor on the 1988 cross country team that won the NCAA national championship. McGovern Young was UK's top performer at the 1989 national meet, finishing second individually. An eight-time All-American in cross country and track, McGovern Young won eight individual SEC championships, including cross country, 3,000-meter indoor, 5,000-meter indoor (twice), 3,000-meter outdoor (twice) and 5,000-meter outdoor (twice). She still holds five UK track records: 3,000-, 5,000- and 10,000-meter outdoor and the 3,000- and 5,000-meter indoor.

Sydney McLaughlin-Levrone, Track and Field, 2017-18

World-Record Holder, Two-Time 2020 Olympic Gold Medalist and 2022 Double World Champion as a professional ... The Bowerman Finalist NCAA Champion – 2018 400H ... Three-time SEC Champion – 2018 400m (indoor), 400H and 4x400m relay ... Five-time All-America (2018 indoor 200m, 400m, 4x400m | outdoor 400H, 4x400m) ... Collegiate record: 400H – 52.75 ... UK record – Indoor 400m (50.36), Outdoor 400m (50.07) ... 2016 Olympian – Team USA (400H) ... World U20 Record – 400H (52.75), 400m (50.07) ... National HS Record – 300H (38.90) ... All-America First Team in the discus and shot put, for both indoor and outdoor seasons, including NCAA runner-up in the indoor shot ... Two-time SEC champion, 2007 in the indoor shot put and 2009 in the discus ... Won the 2007 and 2009 SEC Commissioner's Cup for scoring the most points at the SEC outdoor championship meet ... 2009 SEC Outdoor Co-Field Athlete of the Year ... Three-time All-SEC ... Competed in the 2008 U.S. Olympic Trials in the shot put ... Finished UK career holding school records for discus and indoor/outdoor shot put ... Set UK freshman records for indoor/outdoor shot put, weight throw and hammer throw ... 2009 ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District ... SEC Academic Honor Roll.

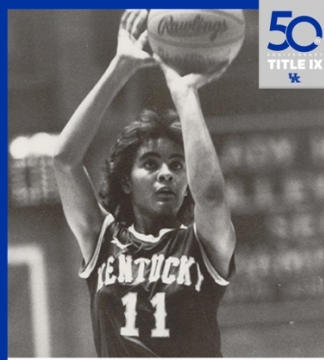


Nancy Napolski Johnson

RIFLE

Nancy Napolski Johnson, Rifle, 1993-96

A UK Rifle All-American and Olympic gold-medal winner for the United States. She captured the individual national championship in air rifle in 1994 and was a three-time first-team All-American (1994, 1995 and 1996). Napolski Johnson led the team to three consecutive third-place finishes at the NCAA Championships from 1994-96. She continued competitive shooting after her collegiate career and won the gold medal in women's 10-meter air rifle in the 2000 Olympics. She also went on to win gold medals at several other international events.



Leslie Nichols

BASKETBALL

Leslie Nichols, Basketball, 1983-86

Remains one of UK's greatest performers on the hardwood. She was a three-time All-SEC honoree by the league's coaches en route to a career record of 72-41 and a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances during her tenure. She still ranks fourth all-time in UK's career scoring chart with 1,797 career points good for an average of 18.2 per game. A four-year starter at forward, Nichols remains the only player in program history to log a triple-double. She totaled 18 points, 13 rebounds and 11 steals against Louisville in 1986. Furthermore, she ranks second all-time at UK in double-doubles (35), fourth in steals (278), fourth in career rebounds (877) and fifth in blocks (102).



Kelsey Nunley-Moore

SOFTBALL

Kelsey Nunley-Moore, Softball, 2013-2016

Pitched Kentucky to the 2014 Women's College World Series, its only appearance in the WCWS ... 2016 NFCA First-Team All-American ... 2016 SEC Pitcher of the Year ... Holds UK career records for appearances (171), innings pitched (943.1), ERA (1.96), wins (92) and saves (9) ... 2016 First-Team All-SEC ... 2016 Senior CLASS Award All-American ... 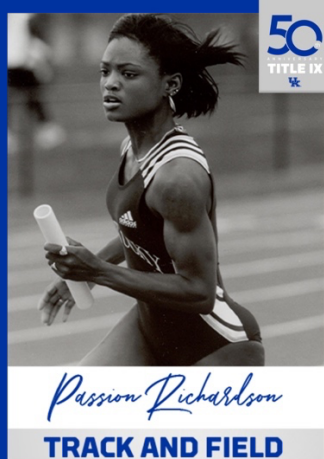
Chelsea Oswald Hall, Track and Field, 2009-13

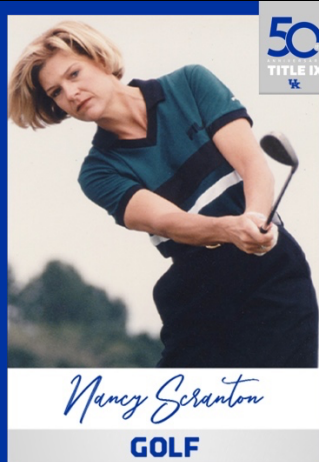
Sarah Rumely Noble, Volleyball, 2006-09

Only player in program history to be named SEC Freshman of the Year (2006) and SEC Player of the Year (2008) ... Two-time AVCA All-American ... Four-time All-SEC ... Academic All-American third team ... Led team to NCAA Tournament four times, including the Sweet 16 in 2009 ... Finished career owning UK records in career assists (5,703) and aces (165) ... 5,703 career assists also ranked fifth all-time in SEC history ... Capped career ranking in the top 10 in sets played (3rd), block assists (9th), digs and attack percentage (10th) ... Only player to record a triple-double in a match in program history (10 kills, 56 assists, 18 digs vs. Ole Miss) ... Led team to No. 7 national ranking in '09 ... Played professionally overseas ... Currently an assistant coach at LSU.



Sha'Keela Saunders, Track and Field, 2012-2017

NCAA Champion - 2017 Indoor Long Jump ... Two-Time SEC Champion – 2015 and 2017 Indoor Long Jump ... Fourth place at 2016 U.S. Olympic Trials while a junior at UK, missing the U.S. Olympic team by one spot, and 1.75 inches... Three-time NCAA Silver Medalist – Long Jump (2014 outdoor, 2015 indoor, 2016 indoor) ... NCAA Bronze Medalist – 2015 Outdoor Long Jump ... 12-time All-America (six in long jump, four in triple jump, twoin 4x400m relay) ... Key contributor on two NCAA Championships podium teams (national runner-up in 2015 and fourth place in 2017).



Nancy Scranton, Golf, 1983-84

Kentucky's first All-SEC performer in women's golf and also is UK's most successful player in the LPGA ranks. The 1983 All-SEC performer won two tournaments as a senior, the Western Kentucky Invitational and Southern Illinois Invitational. She graduated in 1984 and began playing on the LPGA Tour in 1985 where she has won three LPGA events, including one major, the 1991 du Maurier Classic. Overall, Scranton has garnered more than \$3.3 million in career earnings. She won the LPGA's Heather Farr Award for the player who "best exemplifies outstanding dedication and perseverance," and received the 2003 Daytona Beach (Fla.) Kiwanis Foundation Humanitarian of the Year Award.



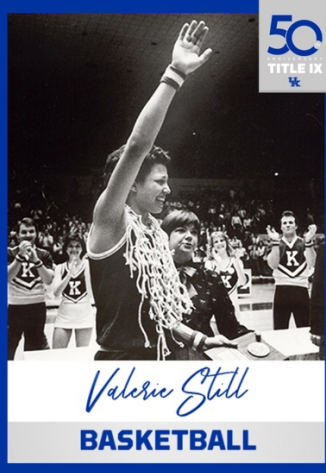

Led the Cats to their highest national ranking (4th) in 1983 and helped UK roll up a 30-game home court win streak from 1980-82 ... In 1983, led the sixth-ranked Cats to an 80-66 upset over powerhouse Old Dominion before a record crowd of 10,622 in UK's Memorial Coliseum
