Openers and Storylines

- ◆ After three-straight home games and back-to-back non-conference contests, the South Carolina Gamecocks (3-2, 0-2 SEC) are back on the road this week as they return to Southeastern Conference play against the No. 13/13 Kentucky Wildcats (4-1, 1-1 SEC). Game time from Kroger Field (61,000) in Lexington, Ky. is set for 7:30 pm ET with the SEC Network handling the broadcast.
- ◆ The SEC Network has the television coverage for this week's game with Dave Hart handling the playby-play. Jordan Rodgers provides the analysis while Cole Cubelic works the sidelines for the network.
- ◆ This is the Gamecocks' third SEC game of the season and all three have come against ranked opponents, with two coming on the road. They previously dropped a 44-30 decision at No. 16 Arkansas on Sept. 10, then fell by a 48-7 score to top-ranked Georgia on Sept. 17.
- ◆ This is the first game of a six-game stretch in which the Gamecocks will play only conference games. After this week's contest at Kentucky, the Gamecocks will enjoy an off week next weekend before beginning a five-game stretch in which they host Texas A&M and Missouri, travel to Vanderbilt and Florida before closing out that stretch of SEC opponents at home versus Tennessee.
- ◆ The Gamecocks are looking for their third-straight victory after posting back-to-back wins over Charlotte and South Carolina State. The last time South Carolina won three-consecutive games was in the middle of the 2017 season when they defeated Arkansas, Tennessee and Vanderbilt in consecutive games.
- ◆ Kentucky comes into this week's contest ranked 13th in both the Associated Press and AFCA Coaches' polls. South Carolina's last win over a ranked opponent came in 2020 when the Gamecocks knocked off 15th-ranked Auburn, 30-22 at Williams-Brice Stadium. South Carolina's last road win over a ranked opponent came on Oct. 12, 2019, when the Gamecocks outlasted third-ranked Georgia in Athens in doubleovertime by a 20-17 score.
- ◆ "Beamer Ball" is alive and well in Columbia. The Gamecocks are among the FBS Top-10 in several special teams categories:

CAROLINA VS. KENTUCKY: This is the 34th meeting between the Gamecocks and Wildcats in a series that dates back to 1937. Carolina leads the all-time series 18-14-1, including a 9-8 advantage in Lexington. The teams played just three times (1937, 1978 and 1981) before Carolina joined the SEC in 1992. Since then they have met every year. Since joining the SEC, the Gamecocks own a 17-13 record against Kentucky, including wins in 14 of the 22 meetings in this century.

A SERIES OF RUNS: South Carolina won 10-straight games over Kentucky from 2000-2009, and 13-of-14 from 2000-2013. Since then, the Wildcats posted five-straight wins from 2014-18 and have won seven of the last eight overall.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET: Chris Rodriguez ran for 144 yards on 26 carries and Matt Ruffolo connected on three field goals to lift Kentucky to a 16-10 win over South Carolina in Columbia on Sept. 25, 2021. The Wildcats took a 10-0 lead into the intermission before South Carolina cut the margin to three early in the third period. Ruffolo countered with a pair of field goals, the last one with under five minutes remaining to put Kentucky ahead by nine. The Carolina defense forced three turnovers, but the offense could generate just 216 total yards in the loss. Luke Doty was 17-for-25 for 158 yards. THE LAST TIME THEY IN LEXINGTON: Due to CO-VID altering the schedule, the Gamecocks and Wildcats did not meet until the final regular season game of the 2020 season, a Dec. 5 contest in Lexington. Kentucky posted a 41-18 win over Carolina that night, the largest margin of victory for the Cats in the series history. Both teams moved the ball effectively on the ground, with South Carolina rushing for 297 yards, behind **Kevin Harris**'s 210 yards on 21 carries. Kentucky countered with 291 rushing yards as Chris Rodriguez Jr. and A.J. Rose each went over the century mark. Luke Doty, making just his second career start at quarterback, completed 11-of-25 passes for 85 yards with a touchdown and an interception. THE LAST GAMECOCK WIN: Tavien Feaster (107) and Rico Dowdle (102) combined for 209 rushing yards, nearly matching Kentucky's entire offensive output of 212 yards, as the Gamecocks rolled to an easy 24-7 win in Columbia on Sept. 28, 2019. Feaster scored twice and Dowdle once as the Gamecocks rolled up 387 yards in the win. The Carolina defense pitched a shutout until Kentucky finally got on the board with just 2:32 left in the contest. The seven points was the fewest the Wildcats had scored against the Gamecocks since being held to three points in the 2011 contest. The Carolina win snapped a five-game losing streak in the all-time series.

HAVE TO SCORE TO WIN: When the Gamecocks won 13 of 14 games from 2000-2013, they scored 430 points, an average of 30.7 points per game, including a stretch in which they scored no fewer than 24 points from 2005-13. In the last eight games in which South Carolina has only won once, the Gamecocks have scored a total of 145 points, averaging just 18.1 points per game and have scored more than 24 points just once (the lone win in that stretch). They have been held under 20 points in five of the last six meetings.

A South Carolina win over Kentucky would...

- ◆ Give the Gamecocks' their first conference win of the season and their fourth win overall.
- ◆ Extend the Gamecocks' winning streak to three games, which would match their longest since winning three in a row in 2017 when they topped Arkansas, Tennessee and Vanderbilt in consecutive games.
- ◆ Give the Gamecocks' their first win over a ranked opponent since defeating 15th-ranked Auburn in Columbia on Oct. 17, 2020.
- ◆ Give the Gamecocks' their first road win over a ranked opponent since defeating third-ranked Georgia in double-overtime on Oct. 12, 2019.

ABOUT LAST WEEK: South Carolina posted its second-straight win over a non-conference opponent when they ran past South Carolina State by a 50-10 count on Thursday, Sept. 29. The game against its FCS in-state rivals from Orangeburg was originally scheduled for Saturday, Oct. 1, but the threat of Hurricane lan forced school officials to move the game up two days.

BULLYING THE DOGS: South Carolina got a solid performance from **Spencer Rattler**, who completed 21-of-27 passes for 212 yards with two touchdowns and ran for another score in the win over South Carolina State. **MarShawn Lloyd** rushed for 80 yards and a TD on just 11 carries. The Gamecock defense held the Bulldogs to 220 total yards and just 1-of-11 on third downs while intercepting three passes. S.C. State had just 13 first downs while committing 12 penalties for 117 yards.

HANGIN' HALF A HUNDRED: For the second-straight week, South Carolina put 50 or more points on the scoreboard. After tallying 56 in a 56-20 win over Charlotte, the Gamecocks had an even 50 in a 50-10 win over South Carolina State. They were the first 50-point games since the Gamecocks scored 72 against Charleston Southern on Sept. 7, 2019. It was the first time the Gamecocks have scored 50 or more points twice in a season since 2013 when they had 52 at Arkansas and 70 against Coastal Carolina. The last time South Carolina posted back-to-back 50-point games came in the 1995 season when they scored 77 against Kent State, 65 at Mississippi State and 52 against Vanderbilt in consecutive games.

BETTER OFFENSE: The Gamecock offense has been efficient and productive over the last two games. In the win over Charlotte, the Gamecocks scored on each of their first eight possessions and nine of 11 overall. Against South Carolina State, the Gamecocks scored touchdowns on seven of 12 possessions. Going back to the final possession against Georgia, South Carolina has scored 17 times (15 touchdowns and two field goals) in its last 24 offensive possessions.

30 SOMETHING: The Gamecocks have tallied 30 or more points in four of five games this season. They scored 30 or more just three times in 13 games in 2021 and haven't scored 30 or more points more than four times in a season since 2018 when they accomplished the feat seven times.

BLOCK THAT KICK: The Gamecocks blocked two punts against South Carolina State, with **Debo Williams** and **King-Demenian Ford** each getting credit for one. It's the second time this season that South Carolina has blocked two punts in a game, as they also did so in the opener against Georgia State. The Gamecocks have blocked four punts this season and have eight blocked kicks in 18 games in the Shane Beamer and Pete Lembo Era.

DEFENSE TAKES A STAND: Since Charlotte scored on touchdown drives in its first two possessions, the Gamecock defense has tightened up. The 49ers final eight possessions resulted in four punts, three interceptions, and a touchdown. After allowing 171 yards on Charlotte's first two drives, Carolina surrendered just 121 the rest of the way. The Carolina defense then held South Carolina State to 220 yards on 58 plays, 3.8 yards per play, including just 75 yards through the air on 7-of-18 passing with three interceptions.

GOOD THINGS COME IN THREES: The Gamecocks picked off three passes against Charlotte with Brad Johnson, DQ Smith and Cam Smith all recording picks. The trio of Sherrod Greene, Marcellas Dial and Bam Martin-Scott logged interceptions against South Carolina State. It marked the first time since 2013 that the Gamecocks have recorded three INTs in back-to-back games. Carolina had recorded just one interception in its first three games before notching six in the last two contests.

PLAYING SHORT-HANDED: The Gamecocks have been hit hard by the injury bug, especially on the defensive side of the ball. A pair of starters in edge rusher Jordan Strachan and linebacker Mohamed Kaba suffered season-ending ACL injuries in the loss at Arkansas. Safety R.J. Roderick was injured on the first series of the season and missed both conference games before returning against Charlotte. Starting defensive tackle Alex Huntley and starting defensive back Cam Smith were injured at Arkansas and missed the Georgia game. Key reserve nickel David Spaulding has been out since the season opener with a leg injury. Cornerback Darius Rush suffered a hamstring injury against Georgia and has missed the last two games. Edge rusher Terrell Dawkins underwent knee surgery after the Georgia game and will be out for an extended period of time. On offense, tight end Chad Terrell was lost for season after suffering an ACL injury in preseason camp. Left tackle Jaylen Nichols missed the Georgia game while right tackle Dylan Wonnum has sat out the last two contests with injuries. Wide receiver Corey Rucker missed the first three games with a foot injury.

FEELS LIKE THE FIRST TIME: Six players made their first start in the season opener versus Georgia State, but only MarShawn Lloyd and Alex Huntley, were making their first collegiate start overall. Spencer Rattler, Devonni Reed, Austin Stogner and Jordan Strachan made their first starts for Carolina, but had made starts at their previous stops. Nick Emmanwori became the first true freshman to earn a start when he was in on the first snap at safety at Arkansas. East Tennessee State transfer tight end Nate Adkins made his first start for the Gamecocks against Georgia, as did defensive end Gilber Edmond and true freshman walk-on defensive back DQ Smith. Cornerback O'Donnell Fortune made his first career start against Charlotte.

A LITTLE HISTORY: 2022 marks the 129th season of intercollegiate football at the University of South Carolina, dating back to 1892. It is the 116th-consecutive year in which Carolina has competed on the gridiron. The University did not field a team in either 1893 or 1906. Carolina owns an all-time record of 624-603-44, a .508 winning percentage.

UTILIZING THE PORTAL: The Gamecocks' roster features nine scholarship transfers, six of whom enrolled at Carolina in January. The spring enrollees included RB Christian Beal-Smith (Wake Forest), RB Lovasea Carroll (Georgia), EDGE Terrell Dawkins (NC State), QB Spencer Rattler (Oklahoma), DB Devonni Reed (Central Michigan), and WR Antwane Wells Jr. (James Madison). TE Nate Adkins (East Tennessee State), WR Corey Rucker (Arkansas State) and TE Austin Stogner (Oklahoma) were added to the roster in the summer.

SUPER SENIORS: The Gamecocks list 10 players (not including transfers) whose eligibility would have expired had not the NCAA allowed the 2020 season to be a "free" year. Those "super seniors" are WR Jalen Brooks, OL Eric Douglas, LB Sherrod Greene, LB Brad Johnson, DB R.J. Roderick, EDGE Jordan Strachan, WR Chad Terrell, WR Josh Vann, DL M.J. Webb and OL Dylan Wonnum.

ONE FOR THE THUMB: With the NCAA COVID rule allowing for an extra year, five Gamecocks - OL **Eric Douglas**, LB **Brad Johnson**, DB **R.J. Roderick**, WR **Josh Vann** and OL **Dylan Wonnum** - can become five-year letterwinners.

TOTING THE SHEEPSKIN: The Gamecocks have 21 players who have their college degrees in hand. Twelve players who wore the SEC Graduate patch in the Duke's Mayo Bowl return for the 2022 season, including Wyatt Campbell, Eric Douglas, Sherrod Greene, Brad Johnson, Tyreek Johnson, Dakereon Joyner, Hank Manos, Darius Rush, Jordan Strachan, Chad Terrell, M.J. Webb and Dylan Wonnum. Jovaughn Gwyn and Jaylen Nichols graduated in May. Traevon Kenion and R.J. Roderick graduated in August. In addition, Nate Adkins (East Tennessee State), Christian Beal-Smith (Wake Forest), Dante Miller (Columbia), Devonni Reed (Central Michigan) and Austin Stogner (Oklahoma) have degrees from other institutions.

YOU'RE MONEY'S NO GOOD HERE: Wide receiver **Payton Mangrum** was awarded the Jake Panus scholarship prior to the start of the fall semester. Mangrum has been a regular on special teams and has also been on the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

LOOKING AHEAD: The Gamecocks will enjoy an off week next week before returning to SEC action on Oct. 22 when they host Texas A&M. Carolina is winless in eight all-time meetings with the Aggies.

CLEMSON

Offense

SATT ATTACK: The Gamecock offense is in its second year under the direction of **Marcus Satterfield**. In his first season, Satt was able to cobble seven wins together with four different starting quarterbacks winning games. Prior to his arrival in Columbia, Satterfield most recently was part of Matt Rhule's staff with the Carolina Panthers. He and Coach Beamer first met each other as graduate assistants at Tennessee.

FAVORABLE RETURNS: The Gamecocks are averaging 35.6 points per game this season. They are gaining 395.6 yards per game, 138.2 on the ground and 257.4 through the air. Last season, South Carolina averaged just 22.6 points and 336.8 yards per game, 135.6 on the ground and 201.2 through the air.

QB BOWL WINS: South Carolina is one of only two schools in the country, along with Utah State, that has two players on its 2022 roster that have won a bowl game as a starting quarterback. South Carolina features **Spencer Rattler** (2020 Cotton Bowl) and **Dakereon Joyner** (2021 Duke's Mayo Bowl).

QB1: Oklahoma transfer **Spencer Rattler** is the Gamecocks' number one signal-caller. Rattler, who joined the team in the spring and was the Joe Morrison Player of the Spring for the offense, is 98-for-151 (64.9 percent) for 1,121 yards with four touchdowns and seven interceptions this season. He has been better of late, completing 38-of-50 passes (76.0 pct.) for 399 yards over the last two games. His 377 yards passing at Arkansas ranks as the 12th-best single game performance in school history. He has appeared in 28 games during his career, posting an 18-4 record as a starter. He has completed 68.9 percent of his career passes (459-for-666) for 5,716 yards with 44 touchdowns and 19 INTs.

THE DANDY DOZEN: Spencer Rattler's 377 yards passing at Arkansas was the 12th-best single-game mark in school history and the most since Jake Bentley lit up Clemson for a school record 510 yards during the 2018 season. Here are the top-12 passing games in school history:

DOTY IN THE BULLPEN: Junior Luke Doty was the projected starter at quarterback during preseason camp a year ago, but foot injuries derailed his season. The Myrtle Beach, S.C. product is fully healthy and has improved his game since that time. He is without question the No. 2 QB. He has appeared in four games this season, completing 10-of-14 passes for 146 yards with two touchdowns and two interceptions. He also has a rushing TD. Doty has completed 61.0 percent of his passes (139-for-228) with nine touchdowns and eight interceptions in 17 career games. He is 2-4 as a starting QB.

MARSHAWN HAS BEEN MARVELOUS: MarShawn Lloyd has regained the trust in his surgically-repaired knee that cost him the 2020 season. Through five games he has logged a team-high 53 carries for 324 yards, 6.1 per carry (second on the league), and is tied for third on the squad in receptions with 13 for 118 yards. Over the last two games, he has rushed 26 times for 249 yards, 9.6 per carry, with four rushing TDs. He leads the SEC with eight TDs, six on the ground, which also leads the league, and two receiving.

JUJU ON THE FIELD: Juju McDowell was a Freshman All-SEC performer a year ago as an all-purpose back and return specialist and, despite his diminutive size, is tough as nails and elusive in space. He is second on the squad with 34 carries for 118 yards and has added 13 catches (tied for third) for 97 yards. In addition, he has three kickoff returns for 56 yards and is fourth on the team in all-purpose yards with 271, 54.2 per game.

TUNE IN TO CBS: Christian Beal-Smith joined the running back corps as a grad transfer from Wake Forest. He rushed for 1,871 yards over four seasons with the Demon Deacons. CBS was hobbled in preseason camp, did not dress for the opener against Georgia State and saw limited action at Arkansas. He recorded his first carries as a Gamecock against Georgia and had his best game as a Gamecock against Charlotte with nine carries for 55 yards and two touchdowns. For the season he has 20 carries for 76 yards with three scores.

THE JUICE IS LOOSE: Wide receiver **Antwane** "Juice" Wells Jr. got off to a great start as a Gamecock. The junior transfer from James Madison quickly become a favorite target for quarterback Spencer Rattler. He has been targeted 31 times in and has 24 receptions for 309 yards, a 12.9-yard average. He caught eight passes for 189 yards and a touchdown at Arkansas, including receptions of 64- and 62-yards.

WELLS RUNS DEEP: Antwane Wells Jr.'s 189-yard receiving performance at Arkansas tied for the 10th-best single-game performance in school history and the most receiving yards in a game since Deebo Samuel went for 210 at Clemson in 2018. The 189 yards receiving remains the sixth-highest single-game mark in Division I football so far in 2022. He was recognized by the East-West Shrine Bowl as the Breakout Offensive Player of the Week.

BROOKS IS NOT DONE: Wide receiver **Jalen Brooks** has returned to the lineup this season after missing the final half of the 2021 season. The "Super Senior" has been targeted 21 times so far and has responded with 17 catches for 298 yards, an average of 17.5-yards per reception. He has led the team in receiving yards in four of the first five games despite leading the team in receptions in just one game.

VANN IN NEUTRAL: Josh Vann was Carolina's' top receiver in 2021. He had a breakout season catching 43 passes and ranks tied for 22nd in school history with 93 career receptions. He's been quiet so far this season with just three catches for 13 yards. However, he has contributed on punt return with seven returns for 92 yards, a 13.2-yard average, with a long of 30.

IT TOLLS FOR THEE: Jaheim Bell is a do-it-all player who exploded in the Duke's Mayo Bowl. Bell owns the top-two receiving games by a tight end in school history, a 136-yard effort against Vanderbilt and a 159-yard performance against North Carolina in the aforementioned bowl game. He can line up anywhere on the field, as he has nine catches for 121 yards, including a 46-yard reception against Georgia, and 13 carries for 48 yards with two touchdowns in 2022.

NO LIMITS FOR AUSTIN: Transfer **Austin Stogner** joined the squad this summer after graduating from Oklahoma, where he caught 47 passes over the past three seasons, most of them from Spencer Rattler. He recorded five catches for 43 yards at Arkansas and caught his first TD pass of the year against South Carolina State. For the season, he has 10 receptions for 94 yards with one TD.

SON OF A COACH: Nate Adkins, the son of offensive line coach Greg Adkins, joined the team after graduating from East Tennessee State. Regarded as a tough, hard-nosed blocker, Adkins has also shown good hands and has a great understanding of the game. He has earned a start in each of the last three games.

ADKINS STEPS AWAY: Citing minor health issues, offensive line coach **Greg Adkins** temporarily stepped away from the team. **Lonnie Teasley**, who has been serving as an offensive analyst, assumed the offensive line coaching duties on an interim basis in Adkins' absence.

THE O-LINE IS O-KAY: The Gamecocks feature one of the most experienced offensive lines in the country with a combined 154 career starts.

- ◆ LT Jaylen Nichols started seven games a year ago and has 13 career starts under his belt. He was the co-Most Improved Player of the Spring on the offensive side of the ball. He missed the Georgia game with an injury. He has played in, but has not started, the last two contests.
- ◆ LT **Jakai Moore** has started the last two games at left tackle and has 13 career starts.
- ◆ LG **Vershon Lee** has started 15 games in his career, nine last season and all five in 2022.
- ♦ OC Eric Douglas makes the calls for the O-line. Douglas, a sixth-year player, has made 29 starts, including the last 28 in a row. He has appeared in 49 games in his career, tied for eighth all-time
- ◆ RG **Jovaughn Gwyn** is considered the top offensive lineman on the squad. He has made 39-consecutive starts. A leader on and off the field, Gwyn was named a permanent team captain in 2021.
- ◆ RT **Dylan Wonnum** missed the second half of the season a year ago with a back injury. He started the first three games of 2022, two at right tackle and one at left tackle, but has missed the last two games with an injury. He has made 33 career starts. Brother, D.J., was a standout defensive end for Carolina and plays for the Minnesota Vikings.
- ◆ RT **Tyshawn Wannamaker** made seven starts in 2021. He has started at right tackle each of the last three weeks and had 10 career starts.



Defense

CLAYTON'S CREW: Defensive coordinator **Clayton White** brought a 4-2-5 scheme to Columbia and the results were impressive in his first season. A four-time nominee for the Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach, White's first foray in the SEC had Carolina allowing 24.0 points per game in 2021, down from 36.0 in 2020. The Gamecocks were especially strong in the secondary, ranking seventh in the country in pass defense while forcing 24 turnovers overall, including 15 picks. After getting just one turnover through the first three games, Carolina has come up with six interceptions over the last two contests.

THE RUN STOPS HERE: The interior of the defensive line is led by All-SEC candidate **Zacch Pickens**. Pickens was the 2022 Rex Enright co-Player of the Spring for the defense. The senior has appeared in all 40 games over the past four seasons, making 25 starts. He was on the SEC All-Freshman team in 2019. Pickens logged a career-high 12 stops at Arkansas and is second on the team with 23 tackles.

EDGE JORDAN: EDGE rusher **Jordan Burch**, who was a high school teammate of Gamecock defensive tackle **Alex Huntley**, was the second-highest rated player to sign with Gamecocks, behind only Jadeveon Clowney. He notched a career-high 10 tackles at Arkansas and is Carolina's fourth-leading

EDMOND WRECKS 'EM: Gilber Edmond has been forced into more action with the injuries to **Jordan Strachan** and **Terrell Dawkins**. Edmond has responded with 18 tackles, including a team-high 6.0 tackles for loss, one sack and five QB hurries.

SACK ATTACK: Carolina has four sacks this season, and have added 23 quarterback hurries.

GREENE IS GOOD: Senior **Sherrod Greene** is back to bolster the Carolina linebacking corps. Greene started 22 games for the Gamecocks in 2018 and 2019, and was the starter entering the 2020 season, but suffered a fracture in his hip in the opener against Tennessee and missed the remainder of the season. He was the starter again in 2021, but suffered a right ankle injury in game three at Georgia and missed the remainder of the season. He has logged 158 career tackles including 11.5 tackles for loss and owns 31 career starts, but had just eight tackles in four games in the 2020 and '21 seasons combined. He was held out of the opener but has played extensively since, registering 20 tackles. He picked off his second career pass against South Carolina State.

BRAD'S BACK: Brad Johnson is in his sixth year and his second at linebacker after transitioning from defensive end. Johnson was named a permanent team captain after the 2020 season. He has appeared in 52 contests, tied for eighth all-time, with 21 starts. He was the Gamecocks' defensive player of the game against Georgia State after recording five solo tackles and a quarterback hurry. His interception against Charlotte was one of the key plays in the contest. He has 19 tackles.

ALL-EVERYTHING: Redshirt junior Cam Smith saw his name appear on nearly every All-America and All-SEC preseason team and several watch lists. Smith has played both the nickel and corner positions. He came out of the Arkansas game and did not play against Georgia due to injury. He picked off his first pass of the season against Charlotte and now has six in his career.

RUSH TO JUDGMENT: It's taken a little time, but **Darius Rush** has become the cornerback the coaches hoped he would be when he transitioned from wide receiver earlier in his career. At 6-2 and 200 pounds, Rush possesses the size and length that make him an intriguing prospect. He has a pair of pass breakups this season. He came out of the Georgia game with a hamstring injury and has not played in the last two contests.

DIAL THEM UP: Marcellas Dial leads the team with two interceptions, getting picks against both Georgia State and South Carolina State. He has a team-high five pass breakups and is second in the SEC with 1.4 passes defended per game.

NICK AT NIGHT: True freshman Nick Emmanwori has shined in 2022. The local product from Irmo, S.C., was inserted into the safety position in the first series of the game following an injury to R.J. Roderick, and has played regularly since. He earned his first career start at Arkansas, becoming the first member of the freshman class of 2022 to earn a starting assignment. He has been in doublefigures in tackles twice, logging 11 stops at Arkansas and a game- and career-high 14 tackles versus Georgia, all solo stops. It was the most tackles by a Gamecock since Ernest Jones collected 18 tackles at Ole Miss in 2020. He leads the team with 34 tackles, an average of 6.8 per game, which ranks 13th in the SEC. His 5.8 solo tackles per game leads the SEC and ranks 13th in the country. The last freshman to lead the Gamecocks in tackles was Skai Moore in 2013.

SMITH IS QUALIFIED: True freshman **DQ Smith**, another Columbia area product who played at Spring Valley HS, has started each of the last three contests. A quarterback in high school, Smith has quickly adapted to the secondary and has responded with 11 tackles, an interception and two pass breakups.

NEW KID ON THE BLOCK: The Gamecocks added safety **Devonni Reed** from Central Michigan via the transfer portal. Reed fills the role vacated by the graduation of All-American Jaylan Foster. Reed was a second-team All-MAC performer a year ago after interception two passes with six breakup while recording 74 tackles for the Chippewas. He is third on the team with 22 stops.

PICK THIS: The Gamecocks intercepted three passes against both Charlotte and South Carolina State and have seven on the season.

EVERYBODY LEMBO: Special teams coordinator **Pete Lembo** slept well after the season opening win over Georgia State, as his units produced two blocked punts for touchdowns, was successful on a pair of field goals beyond 50 yards, had seven punts that averaged over 49 yards with a long of 79 and no return yardage, a successful fake field goal that led to a touchdown, no kickoff return yardage allowed and 69 punt return yards gained.

BEAMER BALL 2.0: The Gamecocks blocked two kicks against both Georgia State and South Carolina State. Since Shane Beamer and Pete Lembo took over at South Carolina, the Gamecocks have blocked eight kicks in 18 games. The Gamecocks had six blocked kicks over the previous four years (2017-20) combined.

GO FOR TWO: The Gamecocks have attempted six two-point conversions this season and have converted five.

RESPECT FOR JETER: Mitch Jeter came into the season following in the huge footsteps left by Parker White, the school's all-time leading scorer. Jeter responded with 53- and 51-yard field goals on his first two career attempts. He became the first player in school history to boom a pair of 50-yard field goals in the same game. His first attempt, the 53-yarder, tied for the seventh-longest made field goal in school history. He is a perfect 5-for-5 in field goal attempts his career.

PRACTICE IS OVERRATED: Junior Kai Kroger missed most of preseason camp with a foot injury and was questionable heading into the opener against Georgia State, but responded with an impressive performance. He punted seven times for 344 yards, a 49.1-yard average with four inside the 20 and three of 50 or more yards, including a career-long 79-yarder. The effort earned him the Ray Guy Award National Punter of the Week honors for the second time in his career.

COBRA KAI: Gamecock punter Kai Kroeger had another excellent day against Georgia. The junior punter who was the Ray Guy National Punter of the Week in Week 1, punted five times for a 44.4yard average against the Bulldogs, with a long of 54 yards. All five of his punts pinned Georgia inside its own 20-yard line. That performance earned him a spot on "Ray's 8" as selected by the Ray Guy Award. Kroeger also completed a 20-yard pass out of punt formation for a first down. He is now 3-for-3 passing in his career, with all three resulting in first downs, including one touchdown.

KAI KROEGER CAN KICK: Junior Kai Kroeger returns to handle the punting chores for the Gamecocks this season. The third-year punter was named to the SEC Coaches' all-Freshman team in 2020. He is averaging 43.8 yards per punt this season, and 43.2 yards per punt in his career. Of his 115 career punts, 25 have traveled 50 or more vards with 41 inside the 20 and just five touchbacks. Kroeger also handles the holder duties on placements. He ranks second on the school's alltime punting average list

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — Matt Ruffolo made three field goals to help Kentucky beat South Carolina 16-10 on Saturday night.

Despite its three turnovers, Kentucky (4-0, 2-0 Southeastern Conference) beat South Carolina (2-2, 1-1) for the seventh time in eight years, and set up a collision course toward next week's matchup at home against No. 11 Florida.

"We just have to worry about ourselves. We got to prove to each other and the team that we can go out there and compete with anybody who steps on the field," said Kentucky linebacker DeAndre Square, who led the Wildcats with eight tackles. "It's not about anybody else, it's about us."

Chris Rodriguez Jr. ran for 144 yards on 26 carries for the Wildcats. Will Levis was 15-of-22 passing for 102 yards and threw an interception.

Kavosiey Smoke scored on 15-yard touchdown run on the first series of the game, capping a 12-play, 75-yard drive for Kentucky. Ruffolo's 41-yard field goal to end the second quarter gave the Wildcats a 10-0 lead.

Luke Doty threw a threw a 5-yard touchdown pass to Jalen Brooks early in the third quarter for South Carolina. Ruffalo made field goals from 21 and 27 yards before Parker White's 54-yard field goal capped the scoring with 2:31 remaining.

Doty was 17-of-25 passing for 158 yards. Kevin Harris was held to just 38 yards rushing on 12 carries.

South Carolina recovered fumbles on back-to-back Kentucky possessions but couldn't get any points despite going for it twice on fourth down. Each time, a dropped pass ended the drive.

"If you just look at some things, our turning the ball over, there's no excuse for it. The ball bouncing to the other team sometimes, there's no controlling that," Kentucky coach Bob Stoops said. "When I first got here, we couldn't play a lick of defense, but we led the country in fumbles. With some of those fumbles (this year), we just can't do it."

The Gamecocks' defense has recovered multiple takeaways in every game but the offense hasn't been able to take advantage. After scoring 46 points over hapless Eastern Illinois in its opener, South Carolina has a mere 43 points since.

"I don't know. There's a lot. We ran the ball 26 times for 58 yards. Not good enough," South Carolina coach Shane Beamer said. "Each week's different, and right now, it ain't good enough."

GAME CHANGER

Kentucky had three field goals on the night, the final one with 4:26 left in the game that gave the Wildcats a 16-7 lead. Carolina answered with a field goal of its own, a career-high 54-yard field goal from Parker White, but the Wildcats were able to salt the clock and earn the six-point win.

KEY STAT

144 – Kentucky's Chris Rodriguez had 26 carries for 144 yards on the night as the Wildcat offense accounted for 230 rushing yards in the win. Rodriguez averaged 5.5 yards per carry.

LEXINGTON, KY. (AP) — Chris Rodriguez Jr. rushed for three touchdowns, Terry Wilson and A.J. Rose each rushed for one, and Kentucky rolled South Carolina 41-18 Saturday night in the regular season finale for both schools.

Looking to halt a two-game slide and remain in consideration for the postseason, the Wildcats (4-6, 4-6 Southeastern Conference) scored on five of their first seven possessions to lead 27-3 at halftime. Their highest first-half output this season was aided by 10 points off two of their three takeaways, including two fumble recoveries by Jordan Wright.

Rodriguez returned from a two-game absence to rush for first-half TDs of 1 and 2 yards around Rose's 8-yard score before sealing the rout with a 79-yard burst down the left side with 4:56 remaining. Wilson added a 1-yard TD run early in the third quarter as the Wildcats outgained the Gamecocks (2-8, 2-8) 492-404.

Wilson, the senior quarterback, finished 17 of 26 passing for 201 yards and rushed for 46 to break 1,000 career. Rodriguez had 139 yards on 14 carries and Rose 101 on 14 carries as Kentucky dealt South Carolina its sixth consecutive loss.

Kevin Harris rushed for 210 yards and a touchdown on 21 carries to become the 11th Gamecock with 1,000 in a season. Luke Doty's 30-yard TD pass to Dakereon Joyner and two-point conversion to Nick Muse with 5:12 left made it 34-18 before Rodriguez's big TD run.

GAME CHANGER

South Carolina looked to get on the board on its first possession, but a holding call negated the score and led to a missed field goal. Kentucky had a field goal on its first possession, scored 10 points in the first frame and had 27 in the first half on its way to victory.

KEY STAT

1,138 – Kevin Harris became the ninth Gamecock to reach 1,000 yards in a season as the Hinesville, Ga., native rushed for 210 yards on 21 carries in the Kentucky game. 

Shane Beamer, one of the rising stars among coaches in college football, begins his second season as the University of South Carolina's head coach in 2022. He was named the Gamecocks' 36th head football coach on Dec. 6, 2020.

Beamer had a successful first season in Columbia, improving the Gamecocks by 3.5 games, from a 2-8 mark in 2020 to a 7-6 campaign in 2021, including a convincing win over North Carolina in the Duke's Mayo Bowl. He tied the school record for wins by a first-year head coach, doubled the preseason's expected win total and surpassed the win total of the two previous seasons combined, earning him a share of the Steve Spurrier First-Year Coach of the Year Award, presented by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA). Safety Jaylan Foster earned All-America honors and

three players were selected in the NFL Draft following his inaugural season.

Prior to his first head coaching stint, Beamer had been an assistant coach at seven Football Bowl Subdivision schools for 21 seasons. During his career as an assistant, he coached in 17 bowl games, including a College Football Playoff National Championship Game, posted 18 non-losing seasons, six of those with double-digit victories, and his teams won 63 percent of its games. He has coached all three phases of the game - offense, defense and special teams.

Beamer is not new to South Carolina. The Charleston, S.C. native, served as an assistant coach with the Gamecocks for four seasons from 2007-10 under head coach Steve Spurrier. In 2007, he served as the outside linebackers coach and co-special teams coordinator. He mentored the cornerbacks in 2008, then coached the Spurs and strong safeties and was both the special teams coordinator and recruiting coordinator in 2009 and 2010, setting the foundation for the most successful run in Gamecock Football history.

In 2009 at South Carolina, Beamer was nominated for the Frank Broyles Award, which goes annually to the nation's top assistant coach. His special teams' units recorded five blocked kicks that season, tying for the SEC lead and tying for the eighth-highest total in the nation. He also helped coach a defensive unit that ranked third in the SEC and 15th in the country in total defense, and second in the league and eighth in the country in passing defense.

As the Gamecocks' recruiting coordinator, his 2009 class was ranked 12thbest in the country, and the 2010 and 2011 classes were ranked in the Top 25.

During his tenure as recruiting coordinator, nine Gamecocks were selected in the NFL Draft, including first round selection Stephen Gilmore (Buffalo) and second round picks Alshon Jeffery (Chicago) and D.J. Swearinger (Houston).

The Gamecocks all-time winningest quarterback, Connor Shaw, and rushing touchdown leader, Marcus Lattimore, were also in the 2010 class.

Beamer has been a part of building programs throughout his career. He has been on three coaching staffs where the head coach was in his first or second season at the school. He joined Sylvester Croom's staff at Mississippi State in his first season, Kirby Smart's program at Georgia in his first season, and Lincoln Riley's unit at Oklahoma in his second season.

Beamer came to Carolina from Oklahoma, where he served as the assistant head coach for offense and mentored the tight ends and H-backs for three highly-successful seasons. In 2020, Oklahoma ranked sixth in the country in scoring (43.0), 11th in total offense (494.7) and 14th in passing offense (315.0). In 2019, the Sooners led the nation in yards per play (8.0) and ranked third in total offense (537.6) and fourth in passing efficiency rating (187.0). Oklahoma led the nation in total offense (570.3), scoring offense (48.4) and yards per play (FBS-record 8.6), and ranked second in passing efficiency rating (194.9) in 2018.

Prior to his arrival in Norman, Beamer spent two seasons on the staff at Georgia as tight ends coach and special teams coordinator under Kirby Smart. The Bulldogs posted a 21-7 combined record with Beamer on staff. In 2017, the Bulldogs won the SEC Championship and finished second in the nation, falling in the CFP title game to Alabama in overtime. His special teams ranked eighth nationally in net punting (41.7), and 20th in kickoff returns (23.5) while blocking four kicks.

The son of Hall of Fame coach, Frank Beamer, he worked with his father as the associate head coach and running backs coach at Virginia Tech from 2011-15. In his first year, he coached David Wilson, who broke the Tech single-season rushing record and was named All-American and ACC Player of the Year and went on to become a first-round NFL draft selection by the New York Giants. Shane served as the Hokies' acting head coach in the 2014 Military Bowl win while his father watched from the press box following throat surgery.

Beamer's first full-time coaching position was at Mississippi State, joining the Bulldogs in 2004 as cornerbacks coach and recruiting coordinator. In his first two seasons at State, he guided three defensive backs to SEC All-Freshman Team accolades. He maintained the recruiting coordinator title but made the move to running backs coach in the spring of 2006 where he tutored running back Anthony Dixon to SEC All-Freshman honors.

Beamer spent three seasons (2001-03) as a graduate assistant at Tennessee, helping with the cornerbacks, coaching the placekickers, punters, and long snappers, and assisting in all special teams areas. He also oversaw game opponent scouting while earning a master's degree in sport management in December 2003.

Before joining the staff at Tennessee, he worked one season (2000) as a graduate assistant at Georgia Tech, helping with the Yellow Jacket quarter-backs and wide receivers.

A December 1999 graduate of Virginia Tech, Beamer was a member of five bowl teams (1995-99 seasons) and three Big East Conference championship squads on the Hokie football team as a long snapper and wide receiver. He was a long snapper on the 1999 Virginia Tech team that played for the BCS National Championship.

Beamer and his wife, Emily, are the parents of three children - two daughters, Sutton and Olivia, both born in Columbia, and a son, Hunter, born in Blacksburg, Va.

South Carolina 35 Georgia State 14





COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — South Carolina's special teams led the way toward a season-opening 35-14 victory over Georgia State on Saturday night.

Special teams have always been an emphasis for Gamecocks coach Shane Beamer, who watched his father, Frank, win game after game with "Beamer Ball," and its big special teams play.

The approach worked as the Gamecocks pulled away from Georgia State with 23 unanswered points in the second half.

The Gamecocks returned two blocked punts for touchdowns, new placekicker Mitch Jeter debuted by knocking two field goals of 50-plus yards and long snapper Hunter Rogers carried a fake field goal 5 yards for a first down that led to the Gamecocks' only first-half touchdown.

New quarterback Spencer Rattler took in a key two-point conversion in the third quarter to restore South Carolina's lead and it was just enough to squeak past a determined Panthers' squad that held a brief third-quarter advantage, 14-12.

The back-breaker also came in the third, when Rashad Amos blocked a Georgia State punt and DQ Smith retrieved the carom and ran it in for a touchdown.

Rattler showed off his dynamic playmaking ability. He finished 23 of 37 passing for 226 yards, a touchdown and two interceptions.

Following a scoreless first quarter, South Carolina sent out Jeter to attempt a 25-yard field goal. But special teams coordinator Pete Lembo's gang took over.

Long snapper Rogers took the snap and ran for just enough room for the first down. The Gamecocks lined up versatile tight end Jaheim Bell as a fullback at the goal line, then pitched to MarShawn Lloyd on the endaround for a touchdown.

A Rattler interception on the second play of the third quarter set up the Panthers' second score, a Grainger 4-yard rush to take a 14-12 lead. The Gamecocks immediately responded as Rattler hit Marshawn Lloyd for a 16-yard scoring pass to take the lead for good, 20-14.

Just over two minutes later, Rashad Amos blocked the punt and DQ Smith ran it back 26 yards for a 28-14 lead.

Later, Gamecocks' Traevon Kenion blocked a fourth-quarter punt and Ahmarean Brown took it 10 yards for the final score.

THE TAKEAWAY

Georgia State: The Panthers will cause a lot of trouble in the Sun Belt with their rushing attack. The Gamecocks' defense mostly held them in check, but GSU won't be playing the SEC anymore.

South Carolina: The Gamecocks' offense had some creative play-calls and greatly benefited from having a talent like Rattler behind center. He escaped trouble with his legs to keep numerous plays alive. Yet its offensive line struggled to protect Rattler and the Gamecocks' runners finished with 79 yards.

THE RETURN

Lloyd was the Gamecocks' most hyped running back recruit in a decade but tore an ACL in the first week of preseason camp two years ago and missed the season. He played in 2021 but was still very much not back to full strength.

On Saturday, he rushed for 30 yards, caught two passes for 31 yards and scored two touchdowns.

CLOWNEY COMES HOME

South Carolina held a halftime ceremony to honor former All-American and No. 1 overall NFL Draft pick Jadeveon Clowney. Clowney's jersey No. 7 was added alongside the Gamecocks' four retired numbers, although his number will continue to be worn as per a 2007 university policy.

#16/17 Arkansas 44 South Carolina 30



FAYETTEVILLE, ARK. (AP) — Darren McFadden and Felix Jones make for some serious company. Rocket Sanders can now say he's there with those all-time Arkansas running backs.

The Razorbacks' sophomore running back ran for a career-high 156 yards and two touchdowns in helping the No. 16 Razorbacks beat South Carolina 44-30 on Saturday.

Sanders joined McFadden, twice a Heisman Trophy finalist, and Jones, the player with the sixth-most yards rushing in school history, as the only three Arkansas players to run for 150 yards and two scores against the Gamecocks.

Sanders ran for 578 yards and five touchdowns in his first season last year. With returning starter Dominique Johnson still sidelined recovering from a knee injury suffered in the Outback Bowl, Sanders has taken nearly all of the first-team reps. The result has been a 2-0 start for his team and him becoming the first Razorbacks player since 2019 with back-to-back 100-yard games.

Sanders scored the first two touchdowns of the game as Arkansas (2-0, 1-0 Southeastern Conference) found the end zone on each of its first three possessions against South Carolina and opened a 21-3 lead. The Gamecocks (1-1, 0-1) responded with two straight scores at the end of the first half and the beginning of the second to pull within 21-16.

Sanders wouldn't score again as KJ Jefferson was the keystone for a bulk of the Razorbacks' second-half touchdowns, but he ran for 95 of his 156 yards in the final 30 minutes.

Arkansas ran for 295 yards, and AJ Green and Rashod Dubinion also chipped in touchdowns.

"I was really proud of our offensive line. We asked them to kind of control the game and I felt like they did. I think the offensive line wore them down," Pittman said.

Jefferson led a 14-play, 59-yard drive capped with his own 2-yard rushing touchdown at the start of the fourth quarter to move Arkansas back ahead by two scores. South Carolina lost a fumble on its next possession and Jefferson added a touchdown pass to Warren Thompson in response, ultimately putting the Gamecocks too far behind to rally.

Spencer Rattler tried. The Oklahoma transfer threw for 377 yards and a touchdown on 24 of 39 passing with a touchdown for South Carolina, but was intercepted in the end zone midway through the fourth quarter by Dwight McGlothern. The Gamecocks had three turnovers.

Jefferson was 18 of 21 passing for 162 yards and a touchdown. He ran for another 67 yards and the score on 19 carries.

"I thought he played better today than he did last week. I thought he was more accurate," Pittman said. "I thought he was in total control. ... He pretty much can take over the game when he wants to."

Johnson is expected to return in Week 3 against Missouri State. He might find himself short on carries as Sanders' development has put the sophomore in high company.

"I think he's becoming an all-around back a little bit more," Pittman said. "I thought he played really, really well. Two 100-yard days back-to-back is pretty good. He's a better back than he was a year ago."

THE TAKEAWAY

South Carolina: The Gamecocks had moments, but consistency was lacking in coach Shane Beamer's second year.

Arkansas: The Razorbacks' defense held up well without two starters in the secondary, including former freshman All-American Jalen Catalon.

IT'S BEEN AWHILE

Arkansas' win over South Carolina was the Razorbacks' first since 2011. The teams had met only three times since before Saturday with the Gamecocks winning each.

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — Stetson Bennett went 16 for 23 for 284 yards and two touchdowns and ran for another score as No. 1 Georgia beat South Carolina 48-7 on Saturday.

The Bulldogs (3-0) nearly had a second shutout of the season in their Southeastern Conference opener, but the backups allowed a touchdown pass with 53 seconds to go.

Georgia has allowed just 10 points this season and the garbage-time score was the first offensive touchdown it gave up in its past five regular-season games.

South Carolina (1-2) started 0-2 in the SEC for the fourth straight year. The Georgia offense scored on eight of its first nine drives, gaining 551 yards and averaging nearly 10 yards a play before putting in the backups in the fourth quarter.

Tight end Brock Bowers had five catches for 121 yards and two touchdowns and also ran for a score. Georgia let 10 players carry the ball, rushing for 212 yards. Bennett didn't play the final 23 minutes of the game.

The Bulldogs' defensive line overwhelmed by South Carolina's front. A defender was in quarterback Spencer Rattler's face almost every time he dropped back more than three steps. The Oklahoma transfer got off just three deep balls, with two of them intercepted. He didn't play in the fourth quarter and was 13 of 25 for 118 yards.

The 41-point victory was Georgia's biggest against the Gamecocks in their 75 meetings. It was South Carolina's worst loss since a 56-6 defeat to Florida in 2008.

THE TAKEAWAY

Georgia: Struggles against teams like South Carolina used to define the Bulldogs. At one point when Steve Spurrier was Gamecocks coach in the early 2010s, South Carolina won four of five in the series. But after Saturday's win, Georgia has won 15 of its last 16 over SEC East teams and hasn't lost to an unranked team since the Gamecocks beat them 20-17 in double overtime in 2019.

South Carolina: Gamecocks coach Shane Beamer appears to be breathing life into a program that had lost 13 of its last 16 when he took over in 2021, but there is still a big gap to the best. In his second season, Beamer is 0-4 against Top 25 teams, losing by an average of nearly 24 points.

South Carolina 56 Charlotte 20

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — Marshawn Lloyd ran for a career-high 169 yards and three touchdowns as South Carolina scored on its first eight possessions to put away Charlotte 56-20 on Saturday night.

The win ended a two-game losing streak for the Gamecocks (2-2) — and was a welcome performance for an offense stuck near the bottom of the Southeastern Conference this season.

Lloyd had scoring runs of 25, 14 and 7 yards, the first two that left fans' jaws dropped and Charlotte defenders in disbelief.

On the first, Lloyd cleanly hurdled safety Wayne Jones in the open field on the way to the end zone. On his second, Lloyd was stood up for what looked like a short gain before breaking free to put South Carolina ahead 28-14.

Lloyd had some help on the last, converting after Gamecocks linebacker Brad Johnson intercepted Charlotte's Chris Reynolds deep in 49ers territory. Lloyd calmly found the end zone a final time and finished with South Carolina's most rushing yards since Kevin Harris gained 182 against North Carolina in its 38-21 Duke's Mayo Bowl victory last New Year's Eve.

Charlotte (1-4) of Conference USA entered with the country's 30th best passing attack at 289 yards a game and the one of the worst rushing defenses (129 out of 131) in the NCAA at 243 yards allowed per game. Both were evident at South Carolina.

The Gamecocks picked up 161 yards on the ground to score on all four of their first-half possessions. But the 49ers were largely on target behind sixth-year quarterback Chris Reynolds, converting their first seven third downs and throwing for 132 yards to keep things close at the half, 20-14. South Carolina finished with a season-best 545 yards of offense.

The Gamecocks' run of points each series ended when backup quarterback Luke Doty was intercepted by Jones — yes, the one who was hurdled by Lloyd — with 8:22 left in the game.

THE TAKEAWAY

Charlotte: The 49ers lost both Power Five games they've played this season, falling at Maryland, 56-21, before the South Carolina blowout. Charlotte has a face-paced attack behind Reynolds that had the Gamecocks defense on its heels in the first half. The school does leave with \$1.4 million in guarantees for playing at Williams-Brice Stadium.

South Carolina: There are still plenty of things to fix for the Gamecocks. This is certainly a start to gaining confidence and momentum once they return to SEC play in two weeks. The offense was efficient and powerful and the defense, after a sluggish first half, got three second-half interceptions that South Carolina turned into points.



COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — Spencer Rattler threw two touchdown passes and ran for a score in South Carolina's 50-10 victory over South Carolina State in a game moved from Saturday to Thursday night because of Hurricane lan.

Rattler finished with 212 yards, completing 21 of 27 passes including a 5-yard scoring strike to tailback MarShawn Lloyd and an 11-yarder to tight end Austin Stogner, his teammate at Oklahoma, to help South Carolina (3-2) rout the FCS Bulldogs (1-3).

Administrators at both schools agreed to the change because of the hurricane's approach. Ian moved through Florida into the Atlantic and was expected to re-enter land in the Palmetto State as a Category 1 storm Friday.

Many parking areas were half-filled at best and the normal, Southeastern Conference-style tailgating setups were absent for this one. South Carolina said 61,551 were at Williams-Brice Stadium, which lists a capacity of 77,559. But the upper decks were largely empty and it wasn't a stretch to think only about the announced crowd came out.

The Gamecocks overcame a sluggish start, including two interceptions off Rattler's receivers' hands, to take control in the opening half.

The Gamecocks broke through on Rattler's first-quarter TD toss to Lloyd, which was followed by a funky, "swinging gate" formation on a successful two-point conversion by defensive lineman Tonka Heming-

South Carolina pulled out the wishbone on its next touchdown, a 1-yard handoff to versatile tight end Jaheim Bell. Rattler ran his way to a score from 6 yards out with 37 seconds left in the half to put Gamecocks up 22-0.

South Carolina State of the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference had more penalty yards than offensive yards, 112 to 83, in the first 30 minutes. The Bulldogs got their only touchdown on Tyrece Nick's 1-yard touchdown run right after halftime, ending a drought where they had gone three straight quarters without points.

Nick accounted for 158 of the Bulldogs' 220 yards of offense.

THE TAKEAWAY

South Carolina State: The Bulldogs had lost their earlier FBS game, 56-10 at UCF to open the season. They certainly put up a better showing in their home state — the campuses are located about 40 miles apart – and leave with \$500,000 for playing at Williams-Brice.

South Carolina: The Gamecocks got their run game going a week ago in a 56-20 win over Charlotte when they rushed for 295 yards. This time, they got Rattler and the passing game on track. Both will be needed when they return to SEC play at No. 7 Kentucky next week.
