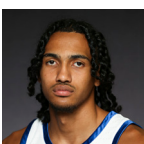

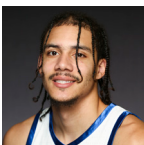

#### NEED TO KNOW

The Wildcats were picked by the league's media to win the SEC regular-season title. UK has won 49 all-time regular-season SEC crowns and six under John Calipari.

Kentucky began the year ranked in the top 10 of the AP Top 25 for the 13th time in 14 seasons under Calipari.

Cason Wallace tied a UK single-game record eight steals against Michigan State.

Oscar Tshiebwe tallied 22 points and 18 rebounds in his season debut vs. Michigan State. His streak of 17-consecutive double-doubles was snapped vs. SCSU.

Sahvir Wheeler's 11 assists vs. Duquesne were the most by any player nationally coming off the bench this season and tied for the fourth-most by any player off the bench since the start of the 2020-21 season.

Wheeler's 9.7 assists per game lead the SEC and rank fourth nationally.

### Media Information

#### CREDENTIAL REQUESTS

Requests for single-game credentials will open **14** days prior to the deadline date and close **five** days prior to game day online at sportssystem.com/Kentucky.

#### CREDENTIAL CRITERIA

The University of Kentucky's decision to issue credentials to a media outlet for the purposes of covering a UK basketball home or away event is determined by a variety of factors. They include the following:

- Priority is given to outlets based on circulation size/household reach/unique site visitors
- Additional consideration is based on amount of original content generated, number of full-time employees of the outlet, length of existence of the outlet and the journalist experience of the reporter(s)
- Attendance at Kentucky media sessions, including Olympic sport opportunities and the intention/ability to cover all 22 sports at Kentucky both at home and on the road, also is considered
- Professionalism, which includes is not limited to conduct at games, press conferences, practices, on social media, etc.

Being granted credentials at another institution/event does not equate to meeting the criteria for the University of Kentucky. Being granted credentials for one UK event does not guarantee approval for other UK events. The University of Kentucky has the right to deny or revoke credentials under its own discretion. Credentialing also is dependent on space availability.

#### INTERVIEW POLICIES-GENERAL

All interviews with University of Kentucky basketball players or staff members must be arranged through the Communications and Public Relations office. Media should never contact a player or coach directly.

The Wildcat Coal Lodge, dormitories, team locker rooms and other team quarters are private team areas. Media members are not permitted in these areas unless accompanied by appropriate university personnel.

#### PRACTICE/PRESS CONFERENCES

Other than announced exceptions, UK basketball practices are closed to the media.

Player interviews are conducted pregame weekly and will be available to all UK media. UK will accept requests for player interviews, but they must be submitted 24 hours prior to the scheduled availability.

Coach John Calipari will meet with members of the media at least once a week in the Memorial Coliseum Media Room.

Game-day shoot-arounds are closed to the media.

#### TELEPHONE PLAYER INTERVIEWS

Telephone interviews are available to the media on a call-back basis. Individual player and coach telephone numbers will not be given to members of the media.

Players are instructed not to conduct interviews when contacted directly by telephone. The Communications and Public Relations office will arrange for telephone interviews at a time most convenient for the student-athlete.

Other special requests are handled on a case-by-case basis.

#### POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Following each game, there is a cooling-off period, during which time the players shower and dress. Approximately 10 minutes after the game ends, Coach Calipari conducts his postgame press conference while a player speaks to the UK Sports Network.

Following Coach Calipari's press conference in the Rupp Arena interview room and the cooling-off period, selected UK players are available in the interview room.

## Kentucky in AP Top-Five Matchups

Since the inception of the Associated Press Top 25, Sunday will mark Kentucky's 61st appearance in a top-five matchup in program history. The Cats are a combined 38-22 in those meetings.

- UK is 24-12 in regular-season matchups, with the last coming on Nov. 5, 2019 when the No. 2 Wildcats downed top-ranked Michigan State in the Champions Classic by a 69-62 score
- The Cats are 7-3 all-time in road games in top-five meetings. UK last played in a top-five road matchup on Dec. 27, 2014 at Louisville. The Cats were the top-ranked team in the country with the Cards sitting at No. 4. UK won 58-50
- Kentucky is 7-4 under John Calipari in such matchups

## Need to Know ...

Need to know facts about the Cats:

- While Sahvir Wheeler sits fifth in the conference and 28th nationally with a 5.8-to-1 assist-to-turnover ratio, the senior is tied for the most assists nationally among players with five or fewer turnovers. Wheeler, along with Cleveland State's Deshon Parker, has 29 assists and only five turnovers, but Wheeler has accomplished this in just three games, one fewer than Parker
- Wheeler's 9.7 assists per game are the most in the SEC and rank fourth nationally
- Cason Wallace has totaled 21 assists and 13 steals through the first four games of his college career. The freshman is the only player in the country with at least 20 assists and 12 steals
- Wallace is sixth nationally in field-goal percentage (58.8%) among players averaging at least five assists per game
- Oscar Tshiebwe's 22-point, 18-rebound game against Michigan State was the third such contest of his UK Career. He now has three of the six 20 or more and at least 18 rebounds in a game by an SEC player in the last 10 seasons. No other player has more than one and the feat had not been accomplished since South Carolina's Sindarius Thornwell did so against Alabama on Feb. 7, 2017

## Champions Classic Notes

Kentucky dropped an 86-77 double-overtime game to Michigan State on Tuesday in the annual Champions Classic, but there were two notable performances for the Cats.

- Cason Wallace tied the UK single-game record with eight steals in the contest. Ashton Hagans (vs. North Carolina on Dec. 22, 2018), Rajon Rondo (vs. Mississippi State on Feb. 19, 2005) and Wayne Turner (vs. George Washington on Nov. 24, 1997) are the others to turn the trick
- Oscar Tshiebwe made his season debut and played 34 minutes in his first action of the season. Tshiebwe had a team-high 22 points and a game-high 18 rebounds
- In two games in the event (including last year vs. Duke), Tshiebwe averaged 19.5 points and 19.0 rebounds per game
- The loss marked the first double-overtime loss for the Wildcats since losing to Michigan State in the 2005 NCAA Tournament

## Big-Game Cal. Cats

John Calipari's teams aren't just good against the best teams in the country, they're great. Some notes about Cal's teams against the best:

- Not only does Kentucky own a 67-44 record (60.4%) vs. Associated Press Top 25 teams under John Calipari, UK is 7-4 when both teams are ranked in the AP top five
- All-time, Calipari is 13-8 when both teams are ranked in the AP top five
- When both teams are ranked in the AP Top 25, Calipari's all-time record is 89-64, including a 58-36 mark at Kentucky
- When both are ranked in the top 10 he has a 27-21 record, including 16-14 at UK
- By defeating top-ranked Michigan State to start the 2019-20 season, UK knocked off the No. 1 team in consecutive seasons for the first time in school history. Kentucky downed Tennessee on Feb. 19, 2019
- With the win over MSU to begin 2019-20, the Wildcats have nine victories over the No. 1 team in 25 tries in program history
- Calipari improved to 6-4 vs. the No. 1 team in his career with the win vs. Michigan State, including 3-2 at Kentucky. According to ESPN, Calipari is the only coach with a winning (.600) percentage against No. 1 ranked teams with a minimum of 10 games faced against the No. 1

## Historic Opener

With a 95-63 win over Howard to open the 2022-23 campaign, a few Wildcats set records along the way.

- Cason Wallace recorded the second-most assists in a UK freshman debut, while becoming the first UK freshman in school history to have at least 15 points, eight rebounds, and nine assists in a collegiate debut
- Wallace was one of only two freshmen to accomplish the season-opening feat since the 2010-11 season, joining Lonzo Ball, who went for 19 points, 11 assists, eight rebounds and two steals in a 119-80 win over Pacific on Nov. 11, 2016
- Antonio Reeves sunk a game-high six 3-pointers, which is a record for any UK player in his debut with the Cats
- Lance Ware totaled four steals, the most in a Kentucky season-opener since Knox and Gilgeous-Alexander each had four in a 73-63 win over Utah Valley Nov. 10, 2017

## Streaking at Home

With a victory over Ole Miss in the home finale, Kentucky notched a perfect 18-0 record in Rupp Arena for 2021-22. With its win over South Carolina State on Thursday, Kentucky extended its home winning streak to 22 games. That mark is the longest current home winning streak in the Southeastern Conference.

- 2021-22 was the 14th perfect season in the 46-year history of Rupp Arena
- It marked the sixth time under Calipari the Cats were perfect at home. Calipari's teams were also spotless in 2009-10, 2010-11, 2011-12, 2014-15 and 2015-16
- UK is 636-77 (89.2%) in Rupp Arena in program history
- The Cats are 209-17 (92.5%) under Calipari
- Calipari owns the venue's longest winning streak at 54 games

## Wildcats Picked to Win SEC

The Kentucky men's basketball team, under the direction of 14th-year head coach John Calipari, was picked by the league's media to win the 2023 Southeastern Conference title. In addition to the preseason poll, senior Oscar Tshiebwe was tabbed the preseason SEC Player of the Year. Tshiebwe was joined on the preseason All-SEC First Team by fellow senior Sahvir Wheeler for both the media's selections as well as the league's coaches.

- UK has won the regular-season title 49 times in the history of the program
- Kentucky has captured the SEC Tournament crown 31 times
- It's the 17th time since the 1998-99 season the Wildcats are the SEC preseason favorite
- Calipari has directed his teams to regular-season SEC crowns in 2010, 2012, 2015, 2016, 2017 and 2020
- Kentucky has claimed the SEC Tournament title six times under his direction in 2010, 2011, 2015, 2016, 2017 and 2018

## Cats Deliver the Knockout Punch

Kentucky is 313-13 (96.0%) in the John Calipari era when leading by at least 10 points at any time in the contest. Ten of the 13 losses in the Calipari era are to conference opponents.

Perhaps most impressive of all is that 69.4% of games Calipari has coached in at Kentucky have produced 10-point leads at some point during the game for UK. The Wildcats have led by 10 points or more in a whopping 85.1% of Calipari's 368 career wins at Kentucky.

## Cats Began Season Ranked No. 4

For the 13th time in 14 seasons under head coach John Calipari, the Kentucky men's basketball team began the season among the preseason top 10 in the Associated Press Top 25. The Wildcats were tabbed No. 4.

- Including this season, Calipari's teams have been ranked inside the top five 11 times
- Eight Kentucky opponents enter the 2022-23 season ranked in the AP Top 25, including four nonconference opponents
- UK will have 10 total matchups in 2022-23 against top-25 opponents

## Hold Them to 55 Points, 40%

Defense has always been a recipe for success for the Wildcats under John Calipari. The special ingredient: 55 points. Kentucky is a perfect 84-0 under Calipari when holding the opponent to 55 points or fewer, including 1-0 this season after limiting Duquesne to 52 points.

The Wildcats are 205-9 (95.8%) under Calipari when lim-

iting the opponent to 63 points or less, including 3-0 this season. Kentucky also fares well when it keeps the competition to 40% or less from the floor. UK is 225-24 (90.4%) vs. opponents under Calipari when its field-goal percentage is 40% or less. Kentucky has held three of its first four opponents below 40%.

### Wildcats Ink Five for 2023

Kentucky men's basketball head coach John Calipari announced the signing of five standout student-athletes to the program's 2023 signing class on Nov. 14. Aaron Bradshaw, Robert Dillingham, Justin Edwards, Reed Sheppard and D.J. Wagner each inked national letters of intent with UK during the fall signing period.

In every season but one of the Calipari era, the Wildcats have signed a top-three recruiting class according to the Recruiting Services Consensus Index, which tallies major recruiting rankings and plugs them into a formula to calculate a consensus ranking. With the additions, Kentucky has signed 72 top-50 recruits, 57 top-25 players and 33 top-10 players (according to Rivals) in what will now be Calipari's 15 recruiting classes at Kentucky.

- Other recipients of the Jefferson Award include Arthur Ashe, Tom Brokaw, Larry Fitzgerald, Betty Ford, John Glenn, Bob Hope, Steve Jobs, Shaquille O'Neal, General Colin Powell, John D. Rockefeller and Oprah Winfrey
- Calipari is the first men's college basketball coach to receive the honor

Five Wildcats -- Chris Livingston, Antonio Reeves, Oscar Tshiebwe, Cason Wallace and Sahvir Wheeler -- are on major national watch lists to begin the season.

- Tshiebwe has been a unanimous selection to preseason All-America teams

- Tshiebwe, Wallace and Wheeler each were named to the Wooden Award watch list
- In its history, Kentucky's Malik Monk (2017) won the West Award, Tyler Ulis (2016) captured the Cousy Award and Tshiebwe (2022) was tabbed the Abdul-Jabbar winner
- Wheeler was a finalist for the Cousy Award in 2021-22

## Cats Give Back

As part of the University of Kentucky's commitment to the people of the Commonwealth and Big Blue Nation around the globe, the Wildcats continue to give back to those in need.

- All ticket revenue from the Cats' annual Blue-White Game, more than \$160,000, went to Team Eastern Kentucky Flood Relief for those impacted by the devastating floods this summer. The team also participated in multiple community service activities in the area prior to the exhibition held in Pikeville, Kentucky
- Kentucky's men's and women's basketball team partnered with the Mamba and Mambacita Foundation to host a youth skills academy for underprivileged local boys and girls
- In partnership with Samaritan's Feet, coach John Calipari and several other Kentucky coaches handed out 10,000 pairs of shoes in eastern Kentucky in August. The Cats also spent a morning with the organization on their trip to the Bahamas, washing feet and delivering shoes to those in need
- In August, Kentucky's open practice in conjunction with a telethon hosted by Joe and Kelly Craft, LEX 18, the American Red Cross and Rupp Arena for Kentucky Flood Relief, raised more than \$2 million for flood relief
- Calipari and the Wildcats traveled to five cities throughout the state this summer in conjunction with Kroger to raise funds for Kentuckians affected by the tornadoes that ravaged the state in December of 2021

## Calipari Leading the Way in SEC Play

John Calipari leads the way among all current SEC head coaches in 2022-23 in career wins, league victories and titles. He is also ascending the all-time charts in league history:

- Calipari owns 368 victories as UK's head coach, ranking as the fourth-most wins by a coach leading an SEC program in the conference's history. Adolph Rupp (875), Billy Donovan (467) and Dale Brown (448) are the only others who have more
- Calipari ranks seventh all-time in SEC regular-season wins with 173. Rupp (397) has the most. Calipari needs just six more to pass Harry Rabenhorst (178) for sixth place
- Calipari is 24-5 in the SEC Tournament. His 24 victories are tied with Tubby Smith for the third-most in tournament history. Only Donovan (27) and Wimp Anderson (25) have more
- Calipari has won six SEC Tournament titles. Only Alabama (7) has more in program history than Calipari has won in total

## S-E-C! S-E-C! S-E-C!

Kentucky is the Southeastern Conference's gold standard. Since the SEC's inception in 1932-33, the Wildcats are the most dominant team in the league, recording a 1,034-297 mark

(77.7%) in regular-season conference play. Only Alabama has won more than 800 regular-season SEC games and no other team owns a better winning percentage.

- UK has averaged 11.6 wins and only 3.3 losses per season in 89 seasons in the SEC (including the current season)
- Kentucky has won 49 SEC regular-season titles and 31 SEC Tournament championships
- The Wildcats have won 16 of the last 29 SEC Tournaments (the 2020 one was not played because of the COVID-19 pandemic)
- UK has captured at least a share of six of the last 13 SEC regular-season championships under John Calipari
- Kentucky has played in the championship game of the SEC Tournament in eight of Calipari's 11 tournaments, winning six times (2020 tournament not played because of COVID)
- UK won its 1,000th game in SEC regular-season action vs. Alabama on Jan. 11, 2020. Kansas has won 1,000 conference games when combining its records in the Big 6, Big 7, Big 8 and Big 12, but no other team in the country had won 1,000 or more regular-season league games in one conference alone
- Six teams made the 2022 NCAA Tournament field with Arkansas reaching the Elite Eight
- The SEC has had 27 NCAA Tournament selections over the last four tournaments, the third most. Only the Big 10 (30) and Atlantic Coast Conference (28) have had more
- The SEC went 5-6 in NCAA Tournament games in 2022. SEC teams are 78-49 (61.4%) in the NCAA tourney since 2012
- The league has advanced at least one team to the Elite Eight in 10 of the last 12 tournaments and nine different SEC teams have advanced to the Sweet Sixteen in the last five NCAA Tournaments
- The SEC has held its own in the annual Big 12/SEC Challenge. The SEC leads 31-28 over the last six seasons in the yearly January showdown and won outright in 2021 and '22
- Six SEC teams are ranked in the Nov. 14 Associated Press Top 25, with Florida receiving votes

## Key to Success

John Calipari uncovered one major difference in his early seasons as Kentucky's head coach vs. the last -- the number of blocked shots per game. Calipari has put an added emphasis on the 2022-23 roster to contest shots.

The Cats blocked 11 shots in the win over Duquesne. Freshman Ugonna Onyenso totaled seven through the first two games, the third most by any UK player in his first two career games. Anthony Davis paces the pack after having 12 in his first two outings in 2011-12.

Thus far, Kentucky is the only team in the country with at least eight blocks in three games. UK had 11 against Duquesne, eight vs. Michigan State and nine against South Carolina State. Consider:

## Cats Don't (Historically) Count on the 3

Kentucky has never been reliant on the 3 under John Calipari. Even with more shooters at their disposal, the 2021-22 season was not an exception for the Wildcats. However, the 2022-23 squad looks poised to be one of Calipari's best from long range. Kentucky is averaging 33.0% of its points from distance while 35.2% of its field-goal attempts are from 3-point range.

Not only are the Cats shooting from distance, they're converting their attempts as well. Sharpshooter Antonio Reeves has drained 14, while CJ Fredrick has knocked down 10 thus far. Combined, the duo is 24-53 (45.3%) from 3-point range.

The highest percentage of 3-point shots taken under Calipari was the 2010-11 Final Four team that lofted 32.4% of its shots from beyond the arc. That team is also Calipari's top 3-point shooting team at Kentucky. The most attempts per game in the Calipari era was the 2016-17 squad that took 19.89 3-point shots per game. This team is averaging 23.0 attempts per game thus far.

Not relying on the 3 certainly hasn't hurt the Wildcats. UK is 10-3 all-time under Calipari when making one or fewer from long range.

## Taking Care of Business

Kentucky's 68-44 record vs. opponents ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 in John Calipari's tenure is impressive, but the Wildcats' ability to beat all-comers can't be overlooked. Under Calipari, UK is 301-58 vs. unranked competition, 83.8%.

## Cleaning the Glass

With Oscar Tshiebwe leading the nation in rebounding, Kentucky was one of the top teams in the country on the boards a season ago. Kentucky led the country in rebounding margin (plus-9.7 per game) and set a record under Calipari. In his first action of 2022-23, Tshiebwe picked up right where he left off, pulling down a game-high 18 boards against Michigan State. As a team, UK is plus-7.3 and is also averaging 11.8 offensive rebounds per game.

- UK was also 14th in total rebounds per game (40.1) and 12th in offensive boards per game (12.9) a year ago
- Kentucky was fourth in the country in offensive rebounding percentage (37.7%) according to KenPom.com

## #OscarWorthy: National Player of the Year Returns for Encore

Oscar Tshiebwe achieved something no player in Kentucky basketball history had ever done before. He was voted as the unanimous National Player of the Year in 2021-22, winning all six major honors: The Sporting News, The Associated Press, USBWA Oscar Robertson Award, NABC, Wooden Award and the Naismith Award. More on Tshiebwe's record-setting 2021-22 campaign:

## Veterans and Depth and Talent - Oh, My!

For the second straight season, John Calipari has constructed his roster with key veterans, an impact transfer and talented newcomers.

- UK is returning seven players from its 26-8 squad that earned a No. 2 overall seed in the NCAA Tournament
- Kentucky returns 58.4% of its rebounding, 51.8% of its assists, 44.3% of its scoring and 42.9% of its minutes
- The Cats welcomed in senior transfer guard Antonio Reeves from Illinois State. Reeves ranked in the top 20 nationally in points per game as a junior, scoring 20.1
- Calipari inked top-10 prospects Cason Wallace and Chris Livingston who were both Gatorade State Players of the Year and McDonald's All Americans
- Adou Thiero and Ugonna Onyenso signed in the late period. Thiero is a fast-rising prospect who led his team to a state runner-up, while Onyenso was a top-25 prospect in the 2023 class and reclassified after helping Putnam Science Academy win the national title

## UK Leads with 27 on NBA Opening-Day Rosters

Kentucky men's basketball's ability to develop and prepare players for the next step continues to manifest itself as 27 former Wildcat student-athletes appear on NBA opening-day rosters. Kentucky led the nation for the 11th consecutive season with the most alumni on opening-day rosters.

- The total of 27 players on NBA opening-day rosters (including two-way and inactive players) that played and finished their college basketball careers at Kentucky is more than any other college program in the country. Duke, with 24, is the only other school with more than 20 players in the NBA.
- Of the 17 NBA franchises featuring a Wildcat, eight have multiple Kentucky players. Detroit and Sacramento each have a trio of Wildcats on their roster while the Clippers, Lakers, Heat, Knicks, Hornets and Trail Blazers each have two.
- In 13 seasons under head coach John Calipari, 45 players have been selected in the NBA Draft, including 34 first-round selections and three No. 1 overall picks (Anthony Davis, Karl-Anthony Towns and John Wall)
- Calipari has a streak of 15 consecutive drafts with a first-round pick dating back to his time at Memphis
- Calipari is one of only two coaches in the history of the sport to have four players drafted No. 1 overall (Derrick Rose – 2008, Wall – 2010, Davis – 2012, Towns – 2015)
- Using figures compiled by basketball-reference.com and spotrac.com, Calipari-coached players have amassed more than \$3.5 billion in career NBA contracts
- In the 13 seasons Calipari has been the head coach at Kentucky, his players have totaled nearly \$3 billion in NBA contracts. In the 2022-23 season alone, former UK players are slated to make nearly \$330 million

## Best in the Bluegrass

Kentucky is 21-3 against in-state foes with John Calipari at the helm, including an 11-3 mark vs. Louisville.

Two of the victories over the Cardinals were during postseason play. The Wildcats have won all six meetings played inside Rupp Arena, including a 29-point win in 2017-18, the third-largest margin of victory in the history of the series. UofL's three wins are by a combined nine points.

## Turner Joins Cats' Staff

K.T. Turner, who has been a mainstay in the college basketball coaching profession for nearly 20 years, joined the Kentucky staff in June as its newest assistant coach.

- Turner comes to Lexington after spending one season with Oklahoma as an associate head coach under Porter Moser in his first year as head coach. The Sooners went 19-16 and advanced to the second round of the National Invitation Tournament
- Prior to his stop in Norman, Oklahoma, Turner was the associate head coach at Texas in 2020-21. The Longhorns amassed a 19-8 overall mark, won the Big 12 Championship and earned a No. 3 seed in the NCAA Tournament
- Among Turner's other stops are a seven-year stint at SMU in which the Mustangs claimed a pair of American Athletic Conference regular-season and tournament titles and a year at Wichita State that saw the Shockers post a 30-9 record while advancing to the Final Four

# COACH CALIPARI

## Calipari Reaches 800 Career Victories in 2021-22

With Kentucky's overtime win over Mississippi State on Jan. 25, 2022, John Calipari reached 800 on-court wins. At the time he was one of just 22 coaches, regardless of NCAA level of classification, to reach that barrier. Only 14 coaches have done it with at least 10 seasons at the Division I level.

Calipari became the fourth-fastest coach to 800 on-court wins ever at 1,037 games. Only Adolph Rupp (972 games), Roy Williams (1,012 games) and Dean Smith (1,029 games) did it faster. At Kentucky, Calipari owns the second-most wins in program history, trailing only the legendary Adolph Rupp, who led the Wildcats for 41 seasons and spanned 1,066 games.

Although Calipari is still climbing the charts, he is doing it nearly as fast as anyone else in NCAA history. When he and Kentucky defeated Ole Miss on March 5, 2019, Calipari became the fourth-fastest coach to 300 wins (369 games) at one program in NCAA history. Only Bill Self (358 games at Kansas), Claire Bee (359 games at Long Island) and Rupp (366 at UK) got there faster.

## Calipari Ahead of the Pack at Kentucky

Through 13 seasons at Kentucky, John Calipari's time in Lexington has been every bit as successful -- and more -- as fans hoped it would when he agreed to become the head coach at Kentucky in the spring of 2009.

By just about every measure, he is the most successful coach in college basketball during the last decade-plus. Among schools who have been to at least two Elite Eights and a Final Four since 2009-10, Calipari ranks:

- First in NCAA Tournament wins (31)
- First in Final Four appearances (four)
- First in Elite Eight appearances (seven)
- First in Sweet Sixteen appearances (eight)
- Second in league tournament titles (six)
- Third in regular-season conference titles (six)
- Third in NCAA titles (one)

## First-Ballot Hall of Famer

Kentucky men's basketball coach John Calipari joined basketball's fraternity of legends in September 2015 after being elected to the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame on the first ballot.

Calipari joined an elite group of basketball players and coaches in the Naismith Hall of Fame, considered to be one of the ultimate honors in the sport. The Class of 2015 included Calipari, Dick Bevetta, Wildcat Louie Dampier, Lindsay Gaze, Tom Heinsohn, John Isaacs, Spencer Haywood, Lisa Leslie, Dikembe Mutombo, George Raveling and Jojo White.

Calipari was inducted in Springfield, Massachusetts. Nearly 70 former players joined him on stage during his acceptance speech.

## Calipari Receives Jefferson Award

Kentucky men's basketball head coach John Calipari received the Jefferson Award for Outstanding Public Service in Sports by Multiplying Good on Nov. 2. For more than 50 years, Multiplying Good has honored those who put others first. Those receiving the Jefferson Award are empowered to do more, while their stories of extraordinary public service inspire others to action. It is an award that underscores impact.

- Founded over 50 years ago by Jackie Kennedy Onassis, Sen. Bob Taft Jr., and Sam Beard, Multiplying Good is the world's most foremost and highly celebrated organization focused on and honoring public service

- Calipari is the first men's college basketball coach to receive the honor

## Coach Cal Immortalized at UMass, Clarion, Conference USA

John Calipari's Hall of Fame rise began at UMass, and the school honored his program's breakthrough in the 1990s by unveiling a statue of Calipari on the Amherst campus in September 2021. Calipari was one of four icons synonymous with UMass basketball to earn the honor. Calipari's statue was unveiled next to Marcus Camby, Julius Erving and the late Jack Leaman outside the Mullins Center.

At UMass, Calipari led the Minutemen to a 193-71 on-court record in his eight seasons as head coach from 1989-96. His .731 career winning percentage remains the best in school history, and he ranks second all-time at UMass in victories with 193. Calipari led UMass to five straight NCAA Tournament appearances from 1992 to 1996 after UMass had gone to the NCAAs only once in the first 81 years of the program. His Minutemen made the Atlantic 10's first and only Final Four appearance during the 1996 season, during which they went 35-2

overall and spent 10 weeks ranked No. 1 in the nation. Following the 1996 season, Calipari was named National Coach of the Year by the National Association of Basketball Coaches, The Sporting News and Naismith.

Not only did John Calipari have a statue erected in his honor, the court at Clarion -- Calipari's alma mater -- is now named after the Hall of Famer. The court in Tiffin Gymnasium was officially renamed the John V. Calipari Court in September 2021 and will be known as Coach Cal Court.

Like many coaches, Calipari began his career in basketball on the court as a player. He he was a star high school basketball player at Moon High School in Western Pennsylvania under another Clarion graduate Joe Sacco. Calipari started his college playing career at UNC Wilmington before transferring to Clarion in 1981, helping the Golden Eagles reach their first NCAA Division II Tournament in program history that year.

In the summer of 2022, Calipari was enshrined into the Conference USA Hall of Fame. Calipari is being honored by the league for his impressive tenure as head men's basketball coach at the University of Memphis, where he coached from the 2000-01 season through 2008-09. Calipari led the Tigers to the 2008 NCAA title game, including 38 wins that season, making him the winningest coach for a single season in NCAA history. As a result, he earned his second Naismith National Coach of the Year honor, becoming only the second coach to earn the honor multiple times since its inception in 1987. He was also C-USA Coach of the Year that season.

Calipari, the 2009 Sports Illustrated National Coach of the Year, led the Tigers to nine straight 20-win campaigns and nine consecutive postseason appearances, the only Memphis coach to do that. He posted 252 on-court wins -- 28.0 wins per season -- as the Tigers' head coach, making him the winningest coach in school history. From 2006-08, the Tigers won 104 games, making Calipari the winningest head coach in NCAA Division I history in a three-year span.

## Calipari Named Coach of the Decade

Underscored by more victories than any other coach or program in his first 10 seasons at the helm at Kentucky, more Final Four appearances, a record number of NBA Draft picks, and the 2012 national championship, John Calipari was named the College Basketball Coach of the Decade by Sporting News in January 2020.

In a piece penned by national writer Mike DeCourcy, Sporting News credited Calipari for changing the college basketball landscape. Detailing Calipari's success -- what DeCourcy described as a "college basketball revolution" -- DeCourcy wrote that "no one defined the 2010s in the same way as Calipari ... nor achieved the same degree of consistent success."

In an era where kids can enter the NBA Draft at 19 years old, Calipari masterfully balances the priority of players' long-term professional dreams with individual and team development, leading to on-court success that no other team has matched.

## Calipari Unrivaled in Conference

John Calipari has won 16 league regular-season championships (including six Southeastern Conference titles) seven more than the next-closest coach in the SEC (Bruce Pearl has nine). Calipari has won six SEC Tournament championships at Kentucky and owns 15 conference tournament titles in his career, 11 more than his closest competitors (Kermit Davis and Nate Oats).

Calipari has tallied a 381-120 (76.0%) all-time record within conference play as a head coach and owns a 173-54 (76.2%) record since joining the SEC.

Although he's been publicly outspoken against conference tournaments -- only because he doesn't favor playing three or more games on consecutive days to win the tournament -- his teams have gotten up for them. Calipari's teams at UMass, Memphis and Kentucky have been to 19 conference championship games in his career, winning a remarkable 15 of them. Calipari is 58-14 (80.6%) all-time in conference tournaments, including 24-6 (80.0%) at UK. Calipari ranks third in SEC Tournament wins.

## There's No Place Like Home

John Calipari-coached teams have posted an all-time record of 448-49 (90.1%) record at home in his stops at UMass, Memphis and Kentucky. At UK, Coach Cal is 209-17 (92.5%) in Rupp Arena.

In six of Calipari's 13 complete seasons at Kentucky, the Wildcats have posted an undefeated record at home, including a school-record 19-0 mark during the 2014-15 season.

Calipari owns both of UK's longest winning streaks in the arena. He began his career at UK with a 54-game winning streak at Rupp Arena. It was the longest winning streak since the arena opened in 1976. With a win over Georgia on Feb. 9, 2016, he secured the second-longest streak in the storied building at 34 games (which ended at 42).

## Calipari in Elite Company with Conference Championships

When Kentucky clinched a share of the 2017 Southeastern Conference championship, John Calipari became the first NCAA Division I coach to lead three different programs (UMass, Memphis, Kentucky) to five on-court regular-season league titles five different times. He won the Atlantic 10 at the helm of UMass in 1992, '93, '94, '95 and '96, Memphis claimed the Conference USA crown in 2004, '06, '07, '08 and '09, and Kentucky has captured the SEC six times in 2010, '12, '15, '16, '17 and '20.

Perhaps more impressive is that Calipari has 31 combined regular-season and tournament championships after clinching the SEC regular-season crown in 2020. That trails only Mark Few of Gonzaga (39 titles), among all active coaches. All-time, Calipari trails only the great Adolph Rupp (41) and Few.

## Calipari at No. 1

John Calipari is one of just two coaches (Frank McGuire) to lead three programs to a No. 1 ranking in the Associated Press Top 25.

Calipari has led seven of his 14 UK teams to the No. 1 ranking and eight of his last 16 teams to the top (he's done it 10 times overall). When Coach Cal's teams are at the top, they're difficult to knock off:

- Calipari is 110-13 (89.4%) as the top-ranked Associated Press Top 25 coach in the country
- He's 69-8 (89.6%) when his team is atop the AP Top 25 as UK's head coach
- Calipari tallied a 32-4 mark at UMass at No. 1 and he was 9-1 at Memphis
- His (110) victories are the most among active coaches with victories at No. 1
- Calipari has coached 123 career games as a No. 1 team, fourth most in NCAA history, trailing Krzyzewski (255), John Wooden (228) and Adolph Rupp (127)
- Among coaches who have owned a No. 1 ranking in at least 119 games, Calipari's winning percentage of 89.4% trails only

# COACH CALIPARI

A “players-first” coach with a penchant for helping people reach their dreams, John Calipari, a Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Famer, has guided six teams to the Final Four, led one to a national championship and helped 54 players earn selection in the NBA Draft during his 30-year college coaching career.

Calipari guided Kentucky to its eighth national championship and his first national title in 2012. In becoming only the second coach in NCAA history to lead three different schools to the Final Four, he has racked up more than 800 on-court victories, 21 NCAA Tournament on-court appearances, six Final Fours and numerous national coach of the year honors.

From UMass to Memphis and now Kentucky, Calipari’s career has been successful throughout, but his most recent run in Lexington has been the best stretch of his career. During Calipari’s first 13 seasons at UK, he has led all coaches in NCAA Tournament wins (31), Final Fours (four), Elite Eights (seven) and Sweet 16s (eight).

In 2015, Coach Cal led college basketball’s first ever 38-0 team, and became one of just three coaches to make four Final Fours in a five-year span. At the end of the season, Calipari became the 96th coach to join the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.

While building a program out of obscurity at UMass, laying the foundation at Memphis and restoring luster at the sport’s greatest program at Kentucky, he totaled the second-most wins in NCAA history in the first 20 years of a college coaching career.

Quite honestly, though, Calipari’s on-court success overshadows a much more significant picture.

In his goal to lead a players-first program, he has helped more than 50 young men realize their dreams and reach the NBA level with 56 players earning NBA Draft selections, including a record five first-round draft picks in 2010. Two years later, six Wildcats heard their names called at the 2012 draft, the most in the two-round draft era. UK, with Calipari’s help, would tie those six picks again in 2015, including a record-tying four lottery selections. His four No. 1 overall picks are more than any other coach, and he has had 45 players drafted during his first 13 years at Kentucky, including 34 first-round picks.

Calipari’s players have entered the league NBA-ready. His players have garnered 28 All-Star selections -- all since 2010 -- with Anthony Davis winning the game’s MVP honor in 2017. Derrick Rose was named NBA MVP in 2011. Six of his players have been tabbed All-NBA (11 times), three have been named NBA Rookie of the Year and 15 players from Calipari’s first 12 teams at Kentucky have made the NBA All-Rookie teams. He is the only coach in history to have a player win each of the NBA’s major honors: MVP, Rookie of the Year, Most Improved Player and Sixth Man of the Year.

Much like he did at UMass, where his players graduated at nearly 80%, Calipari has stressed academics. Seventeen of his last 20 seniors at Memphis earned their bachelor’s degrees, and all 23 players at UK who were eligible to graduate by the end of their senior years walked away with a diploma in hand, including five players who earned their degree in just three years. Calipari’s teams routinely have posted a combined team grade-point average of 3.0 or better.

Calipari has raised millions of dollars to help the lives of those in need in the Commonwealth and beyond. He has had a particular passion to assist those impacted by natural disasters. For instance, in 2010, he used a telethon to raise more than \$1 million for victims of the devastating earthquake in Haiti. He followed that up with telethons in 2012, raising \$1 million for victims of Superstorm Sandy, in 2017 for victims of Hurricane Harvey, played a leading role in the “Kentucky United” efforts that generated more than \$5 million for victims of devastating tornadoes in Western Kentucky in 2021, and raised nearly \$4 million with the Kentucky Flood Relief Telethon and open practice at Rupp Arena in 2022.

Calipari launched his foundation in 2012, and since then the foundation has worked with several key partners and donated more than \$1.5 million, a figure that does not include matching funds that have been contributed from individuals and corporations. In 2013, Calipari initiated hosting an annual alumni weekend around his basketball fantasy experience with the intent to raise money for charity. After generating \$350,000 for selected organizations and charities during the inaugural game, the weekend has generated millions of dollars for charity since its inception.

In 2019, when federal workers were without pay due to a government shutdown, he, his wife and his foundation assisted workers with financial help and grocery gift cards. He and his wife, Ellen, teamed up with Fayette County Public Schools to help families in need during the COVID-19 pandemic.

His latest efforts include spearheading the creation of the John McLendon Minority Leadership Initiative, a nationwide coach-driven initiative to provide minorities a jump-start to their careers through practical experiences, opportunities to build their network and instilling the values of John McLendon: integrity, education, leadership and mentorship. Participants in the initiative will be known as MLI Future Leaders.

In 2017, Coach Cal was named the head coach of the 2017 USA Basketball Men’s U19 World Cup Team, which finished third at the 2017 FIBA U19 World Cup in Cairo.

Author of five books, including the New York Times Best Seller “Players First: Coaching from the Inside Out,” Calipari is a master of communication and maximizing talent. He lives by the motto that “it’s never a matter of how far you have fallen, but instead it’s about how high you bounce back.”
