THE TIPOFF

- Gonzaga welcomes No. 4/4 Kentucky for a Top-5 clash Sunday in the Spokane Arena at 4:30 p.m. It's the second all-time meeting between the programs, with the Wildcats winning the only other meeting in 2002.
- The Zags are 11-6 all-time inside the Spokane Arena since it opened in 1995. In their last game inside the arena in 2014, the Bulldogs beat Washington State, 81-66. GU has played only three games in the arena since 2010.
- This is Gonzaga's second-ever Top-5 matchup in Spokane after defeating No. 5 Texas last season in the McCarthy Athletic Center, 86-74.
- The Bulldogs are in the midst of a stretch of games against potentially six currently ranked teams over a seven-game span; No. 25 Michigan State, won 64-63; at No. 11 Texas, lost 74-93; No. 4 Kentucky; No. 24 Purdue; No. 7 Duke; No. 5 Baylor. Kentucky, Texas and Baylor are currently one, two and five in the KenPom rankings.
- Gonzaga is coming off a 93-74 loss at No. 11 Texas Wednesday. Drew Timme led the Zags with 18 points on 7-of-10 shooting from the field. He grabbed a game-high nine rebounds as well. Julian Strawther added 13 points with three three-pointers, and Rasir Bolton scored 11 points. GU shot 49 percent from the field with nine threes.
- The Zags are No. 2 in the Associated Press poll. The Bulldogs' 116 straight AP Poll appearances top the nation. Gonzaga has been in the Top 10 for a national-best 83 straight polls, and in the Top 5 for 52 consecutive polls. The Bulldogs' 52 straight appearances in the Top 5 ranks as the third-longest in AP poll history.
- Timme was named the CBS Sports Preseason National Player of the Year and to the NABC and Naismith Player of the Year Preseason Watch Lists. He was also tabbed Preseason AP All-American First Team.
- Timme and Strawther were named to the Naismith and Wooden Award Top-50 preseason watch lists.
- The Zags own the country's longest home win streak with 68 consecutive victories inside the McCarthy Athletic Center, breaking the previous program record last season which was 50.
- Last season, the Zags advanced to their seventh straight Sweet 16 and finished at 28-4. Gonzaga won the league regular season title for a national-best 10th straight season.
- Gonzaga returns three starters and nine letterwinners from last season's squad that claimed the Zags' 25th West Coast Conference regular season title and 20th WCC Tournament title. The Bulldogs advanced to their 23rd straight NCAA Tournament, and won their opening round game for the 13th straight season.
- Gonzaga has won at least 25 games in each of the last 15 consecutive seasons and reached the 25-win plateau in 18 of the last 19 seasons, and 22 of the last 24. The Zags are the only program to have reached 25 wins in each of the last 15 seasons. In 2021-22, GU captured its 25th straight 20-win season. The Zags' 25-straight 20-win seasons ranks second behind for the longest active run in the country. (Kansas 32)
- Over the last three seasons, Gonzaga is a national-best 92-8 (92 percent).
- GU has led the nation in points per game and scoring margin in each of the last four seasons.

HEAD COACH - MARK FEW



NOTES

Gonzaga University head coach Mark Few has established himself as one of the most successful coaches in NCAA Division I basketball annals in his 23 seasons at the helm, and in the process has made Bulldog basketball a household name across the country. He served as an assistant coach at GU for 10 seasons prior to take the reins of the program. Few has put together one of the most dominating runs in NCAA history, especially in the West Coast Conference. The Zags have won or shared 21 regular season league titles in his 23 seasons (all but the 1999-2000 and 2011-12 season) and taken home the conference tournament championship 18 times. The Bulldogs won or shared 11 straight West Coast Conference regular-season titles from 2000-11, which was the longest current active streak in the nation at the time and the second-best streak all-time in the NCAA Division I ranks behind UCLA's 13 Pac-10 Conference titles from 1967-79. Few led Gonzaga to the national championship game in the program's first-ever Final Four in 2017, and again in the second Final Four in 2021. Under Few, GU has appeared in four Elite Eight appearances (2015, 2017, 2019 and 2021) and 11 Sweet 16 appearances (2000, '01, '06, '09, '15, '16, '17, '18, '19, '21, '22). He has coached 20 All-Americans, nine Academic All-Americans, 95 all-conference selections, 16 WCC Players of the Year, 10 league newcomers of the year and nine league defenders of the year. Few has also cultivated NBA talent, including current NBA players in Domantas Sabonis, Kelly Olynyk, Zach Collins, Rui Hachimura, Brandon Clarke, Jalen Suggs, Corey Kispert and Filip Petrushev. He also helped recruit and develop Dan Dickau, Richie Frahm, Adam Morrison, Jeremy Pargo, Elias Harris, Austin Daye, Rob Sacre, Ronny Turiaf, Kevin Pangos and Joel Ayayi, all NBA players. Morrison became the highest-drafted player in GU history when he was taken No. 3 overall by the Charlotte Bobcats in 2006.

Entering the 2022-23 Season, Few:

- Is the winningest active coach by percentage at .836 (657-129)
- Tied for 18th for fastest to 100 wins in Division I, accomplishing the feat in 126 games
- Third fastest to 200 wins, reaching the milestone in 247 games
- Tied for sixth fastest to 300 wins, achieving his 300th win in his 378th game
- Fifth fastest to 400 wins, achieving the milestone in 499 games
- Third fastest to 500 wins, reaching the milestone in 612 games
- Fourth fastest to 600 wins, reaching the milestone in 754 games
- Ranks ninth in winning percentage after five seasons at .806 (133-32) and six seasons .811 (159-37); sixth after seven seasons at .821 (188-41); seventh after eight seasons .802 (211-52); seventh after 10 seasons .800 (264-66); fifth for 11 seasons .799 (291-73); eighth after 12 seasons .792 (316-83); eighth after 13 seasons .792 (342-90), fourth after 14 seasons at .801 (374-93), sixth after 15 seasons at .801 (403-100), third after 16 seasons at .810 (438-103), fourth after 17 seasons at .808 (466-111), third after 18 seasons at .817 (503-113), fourth after 19 seasons at .819 (535-118), fourth after 20 seasons at .823 (568-122), second after 21 seasons at .828 (599-124), second after 22 seasons at .834 (630-125) and second after 23 seasons at .836 (657-129).
- Ranks sixth for most wins after two seasons (52-16); fourth for three seasons (81-20); sixth after four seasons (105-29); fourth after five seasons (133-32); fifth for six seasons (159-37); first for seven seasons (188-41); fourth for eight seasons (211-52) and nine seasons (236-60); third for 10 seasons (266-64), 11 seasons (291-73) and 12 seasons (316-83); third for 13 seasons (342-90) and 14 seasons (374-93); second for 15 seasons (403-100), first for 16 seasons (438-103), second for 17 seasons (466-111), first after 18 seasons (503-113), 19 seasons (535-118), 20 seasons (568-122), 21 seasons (599-124), 22 seasons (630-125) and 23 seasons (658-129).
- Is in the Top 15 among active Division I coaches for most 20-win seasons with 23, never having won less than 20 games in a season
- Is first for most consecutive 20-win seasons for active coaches with 23

For all that Few has accomplished on the court, his achievements off of it are equally impressive. In 2002, Mark and his wife Marcy initiated the Spokane branch of Coaches vs Cancer. The Few's annual event would become the largest Coaches vs Cancer fundraiser across the country. Quietly and without fanfare, Few has created a culture of giving at Gonzaga. In 2007, Gonzaga began hosting the Ronald McDonald House Charities Classic. For six seasons, these annual games helped raise over \$750,000 for Spokane's Ronald McDonald House. Building on their success with Coaches vs Cancer, the Fews and others in the Spokane region launched the Community Cancer Fund in 2014 to keep more money in the local market while devoting more resources to cancer patients, their families and the local organizations that serve them. In the last six years, the Community Cancer Fund has raised over 17 million dollars bringing the total raised over 18 years between the organizations to well over 25 million dollars. Among the highlights, the charity established a 3-million-dollar endowment to fund Camp Good Times, a week-long summer camp for kids with cancer.

SCOUTING THE WILDCATS

- Kentucky is coming off a 106-63 victory over South Carolina State Thursday night in Lexington. The Wildcats shot 57 percent from the field, including 10-of-24 from three-point range. Five UK players finished in double-digit scoring led by CJ Fredrick's 17 points. Sahvir Wheeler dished out 10 assists.

- The Wildcats' lone loss was to Michigan State in double-overtime in the Champions Classic Tuesday, 86-77.

- Six Wildcats are averaging double-digit scoring led by Fredrick, Oscar Tshiebwe and Antonio Reeves, who all average 14 points per game.

- Tshiebwe is also grabbing 12.5 rebounds per outing, and Wheeler averages 9.67 assists.

- The Wildcats were picked by the league's media to win the SEC regular-season title. UK has won 49 all-time regular-season SEC crowns and six under John Calipari.

- UK began the year ranked in the top 10 of the AP Top 25 for the 13th time in 14 seasons under Calipari.

SERIES INFO

- The programs have previously only met once when the Wildcats beat Gonzaga 80-72 in the 2002 Maui Invitational. Kentucky was ranked 15th and the Zags were No. 20. Blake Stepp scored a game-high 24 points with five three-pointers to lead GU.

- The Bulldogs are 16-11 all-time versus current members from the Southeastern Conference, including a 74-68 loss to Arkansas in its latest matchup with the league last season's NCAA West Regional Semifinal in San Francisco.

- Gonzaga has won seven of its last 10 games against current SEC opponents.

- It will mark the second time the Zags have played an SEC team in Spokane, after beating Texas A&M at GU, 94-71, on Nov. 15, 2018.

- GU is 28-2 when Drew Timme scores 20 or more.
- Timme's record in his appearances is 92-8 (.920).
- The Zags have been ranked No. 1 in 30 of the 58 AP polls during Timme's career.

GONZAGA WINS ARMED FORCES CLASSIC

- Drew Timme had 22 points and 13 rebounds, and led No. 2 Gonzaga in a spirited comeback from a 12-point deficit that carried the Bulldogs to a 64-63 victory over Michigan State on the flight deck of the USS Abraham Lincoln at North Island Naval Air Station.
- Strawther had 13 points and nine rebounds, and Nolan Hickman scored 10.
- Michigan State led 38-31 at halftime and 45-33 with 16:12 left in regulation.

SEASON-OPENING SUCCESS

- The Zags have won 17 straight regular season-openers dating back to a 73-66 loss to Saint Joseph's in the 2003 Coaches vs. Cancer Classic in New York City.
- In last year's season-opener, No. 1 Gonzaga beat No. 6 Kansas in the Fort Myers Tipoff in Florida, 102-90.
- GU has won 32 consecutive regular season home-openers since a 73-65 loss to Boise State on Dec. 7, 1988.
- Gonzaga has won all 17 regular season home-openers in the McCarthy Athletic Center.
- The Bulldogs have won all 22 regular season home-openers under Mark Few.

GONZAGA CRUISES IN EXHIBITION OVER WPU

- GU eased to a 101-70 exhibition win over Warner Pacific (Dre.) in its final tune-up before the regular season.
- Five Zags finished in double-digit scoring led by Drew Timme's game-high 21 points on 9-for-11 shooting from the field. He added eight rebounds and three assists in 21 minutes. Malachi Smith added 16 points, going 7-of-11 from the field with six rebounds. Julian Strawther made three three-pointers and finished with 13 points, while Nolan Hickman and Efton Reid chipped in 11 and 10 points.
- Gonzaga led for the entirety of the game, shooting 52.7 percent from the field, while holding the Knights to 38.2 percent. The Bulldogs outrebounded WPU 53-30, with 20 offensive boards. GU dished out 24 assists and forced 18 turnovers.

VOLS PULL AWAY FROM GU IN EXHIBITION

- Gonzaga fell in its season-opening exhibition, the Legends of Basketball Charity Classic, to No. 11/11 Tennessee, 99-80, in Frisco, Texas on Oct. 28.
- Four Zags finished scoring in double-digits led by Drew Timme's 17 points. Julian Strawther and Rasir Bolton both added 12 points, while Anton Watson had 10 points, 10 rebounds and a team-high four assists.
- The Bulldogs led at the half, 54-50, after shooting 59 percent from the field in the first 20 minutes.

NUMBER TWO IN COACHES POLL

- Gonzaga was ranked No. 2 in the preseason USA TODAY Sports/Coaches poll
- In the preseason balloting, GU received 759 poll points and five first-place votes, while UNC had 778 points and 23 first-place votes.
- Houston was close behind in third with 713 points and one first-place vote.
- Kentucky collected the other three first-place votes in fourth and Kansas rounded out the top five.

ZAGS OPEN SEASON RANKED NO. 2

- Gonzaga was ranked No. 2 in the preseason Associated Press poll. North Carolina beat out the Zags for the top spot.
- It marked the 22nd straight season GU has been ranked in the AP poll. It's the 13th consecutive year the Zags have appeared in the preseason poll, starting in the top-20 for the 10th straight season. It's the ninth time GU has been ranked in the Top-10 in the preseason AP ranking.
- The Zags opened the last two seasons at No. 1 in the AP poll. Gonzaga had 1,479 points in this year's preseason poll, with 12 first-place votes. Last year, the Zags had 1,562 points in the preseason poll, with 55 first-place votes.
- Houston and Kentucky were third and fourth in this season's preseason poll, and both received first-place votes. Gonzaga and Kentucky square off in the Spokane Arena on Nov. 20. Baylor and Kansas both revied 1,200 points rounding out the top-five. The Zags face Baylor in Sioux Falls, S.D., on Dec. 2.
- The Bulldogs travel to Texas on Nov. 16. The Longhorns were No. 12 in the rankings. GU and Alabama meet in Birmingham, Ala., on Dec. 17. The Crimson Tide start the season at No. 20. Michigan State, who is just outside of the Top 25 receiving 35 votes, plays GU in San Diego on Nov. 11. Gonzaga faces Tennessee, No. 11 in the preseason poll, in an exhibition, the Legends of Basketball Charity Classic, Oct. 28 in Frisco, Texas.

STEADY IN THE POLLS

- The Bulldogs' 116 straight AP Poll appearances top the nation, with Baylor second at 58. Gonzaga has been in the Top 10 for a national-best 83 straight polls, with Baylor second at 52, and in the Top 5 for 52 consecutive polls, Arizona is next closest at six.
- The Bulldogs' 52 straight appearances in the Top 5 ranks as the third-longest in AP poll history, while its 83 straight polls in the Top 10 is fourth. The 116 consecutive appearances in the Top 25 is 13th all-time in the poll's history.
- GU is the only program in the country to appear in every AP poll since 2017, with a No. 4 average ranking.
- Since 2017, the Bulldogs have been in the Top 5 for a national-best 80 polls (67 percent of the 116 rankings). Kansas is second appearing in the Top 5 in 64 polls.
- Since 2017, GU has been in the Top 10 in 99 of the 116 polls (84 percent), which leads the country. Kansas is second at 93 polls in the Top-10 since 2017.

GONZAGA AT NO. 1

- In total, the Bulldogs have spent 42 weeks at No. 1 in the AP Poll in program history, which ranks eighth all-time.
- Since 2017, Gonzaga has been No. 1 in 39 of the 116 AP polls (33 percent). That stat leads the country, with Duke second at 18 weeks.
- GU boasts a 68-8 record all-time as No. 1.
- Gonzaga has been ranked No. 1 in the AP poll in six of the last 10 years.
- The Nov. 22 poll last season was the 20th straight ranking that the Zags were No. 1. That streak matched the fourth-longest in AP poll history with San Francisco in 1955-56. UCLA topped the ranking for 46 consecutive polls from 1971 to 1974.

TIMME NAMED PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN

- Gonzaga's Drew Timme was named Preseason First Team All-American by the Associated Press. The Zag senior landed on the team for second straight season.
- Timme was joined by Kentucky big man Oscar Tshiebwe, North Carolina forward Armando Bacot, Houston guard

Marcus Sasser and Indiana forward Trayce Jackson-Davis. Timme and Tshiebwe were unanimous selections.

- Timme and Indiana's Trayce Jackson-Davis are the first players named Preseason First Team All-American by the Associated Press in consecutive seasons since Creighton's Doug McDermott in 2012-13 and 2013-14. McDermott went on to be named AP Player of the Year in 2013-14.

TIMME PRESEASON NATIONAL PLAYER OF YEAR

- For the second straight season, Gonzaga's Drew Timme was named the CBS Sports Preseason National Player of the Year the outlet.

- Timme was joined on CBS Sports' Preseason All-American First Team by Kentucky big man Oscar Tshiebwe, North Carolina's Armando Bacot, UCLA's Jaime Jaquez Jr., and Houston guard Marcus Sasser.

ZAGS ENJOY PACKED KRAZINESS

- Gonzaga put on a show in front of a standing-room only crowd at the 2022 Numerica Kraziness in the Kennel. Fans were treated to introductions, a three-point shootout, and a skills challenge, before an intersquad scrimmage.

- Julian Strawther edged out Hunter Sallis and Braden Huff for the skills challenge title. Rasir Bolton won a shootout in the three-point contest over Malachi Smith.

- After last season's scrimmage ended in a 38-38 tie, the White team used a late basket from Ben Gregg to defeat the Navy team, 38-36, this year. For the second straight season, Strawther led all scorers in the 15-minute scrimmage with 12 points. Like last year, he made five of his nine shots from the field for the Navy team. He grabbed a game-high five rebounds. Nolan Hickman added 11 points. Drew Timme led the White team with nine points. Colby Brooks and Gregg both chipped eight points. Bolton dished out a game-high five assists.

PRESEASON WCC FAVORITES ... AGAIN

- For the 21st time in the last 22 seasons, Gonzaga was selected as favorites in the West Coast Conference preseason coaches' poll. GU received nine of the league's 10 first place votes in this year's poll. Coaches are not allowed to vote for their own program.

- Except for 2017-18, the Zags have been first place in every West Coast Conference preseason poll since 2001.

- Saint Mary's collected the other first place vote in this year's poll. The Zags had 81 points in the poll, while Saint Mary's was second with 73, and BYU and San Francisco tied for third with 57. Portland rounded out the top-half of the league with 48 points.

TRIO TABBED PRESEASON ALL-WCC

- Rasir Bolton, Julian Strawther and Drew Timme were all named to the conference's preseason team. Timme earns the recognition for the second straight season.

- Bolton started all 32 games last season, leading the team with 64 made three-pointers on 139 attempts. He led the WCC shooting 46 percent from behind-the-arc. He was named Honorable Mention All-WCC.

- Strawther averaged 11.8 points per game, reaching double-digits 21 times. He started 31 of the Zags' 32 games in 2021-22. Following the regular season, he was tabbed All-WCC Honorable Mention.

- Timme was named a John R. Wooden Award Player of the Year Finalist, Wooden All-American, and Second Team All-American by Sporting News, the Associated Press, NABC and USBWA. Timme, a Preseason All-American and the 2022 West Coast Conference Player of the Year was named First

Team All-Conference the last two seasons.

DOGS AND CATS FOR SIX YEARS

- Gonzaga and Kentucky announced a six-game series over the next six seasons.

- The series begins this season at the Spokane Arena on Nov. 20. Kentucky hosts GU next season in Lexington. The programs meet in Seattle during the 2024-25 season, before facing each other in Nashville in 2025-26.

- Gonzaga and Kentucky meet on their home courts beginning in 2026-27 in Rupp Arena, and in the McCarthy Athletic Center in 2027-28.

- The programs have previously only met once when the Wildcats beat Gonzaga 80-72 in the 2002 Maui Invitational.

QUICK NOTES

- Over the last three seasons, Gonzaga is a national-best 92-8 (92 percent).

- Coach Few currently boasts the best winning percentage among active head coaches at 83.6 percent, which also is the best in NCAA Div. 1 all-time with a minimum of 10 seasons.

- In Gonzaga's 16 home games last season (640 minutes), the Zags trailed for 23 minutes and 29 seconds. In 2020-21, in the 480 minutes of home games, GU trailed for 24 minutes and one second.

- The Bulldogs largest deficit at home last season was 15-4, at the 13:00 mark of the first half versus USF.

- Since March 2016, Gonzaga is 27-12 vs. ranked opponents. The Zags had a 10 game win streak versus ranked teams (2019-21) before the loss to Baylor, and won 15 of last 21 games against ranked foes.

- Gonzaga has won 137 straight games when leading by 10 or more points at halftime.

- GU's 37-game home win streak versus West Coast Conference foes is the longest in program history.

- Gonzaga has won 32 straight games in January, dating back to a 74-71 home loss to Saint Mary's in 2018.

ZAGS REACH 25 WINS ... AGAIN

- Gonzaga has won at least 25 games in each of the last 14 consecutive seasons, the lone program in the nation to achieve that feat.

- The Zags have reached the 25-win plateau in 17 of the last 18 seasons, and 21 of the last 23.

24/20 VISION:

- Gonzaga has 24 straight 20-win seasons.

- The Zags' 24-straight 20-win seasons ranks second for the longest active run in the nation. (Kansas 30)

- Prior to the previous 24 seasons, the Bulldogs reached 20 wins in a season eight times since 1907-08.

PERFECTION AT HOME

- The Zags finished an undefeated record at home last season with the win over Santa Clara.

- The 16-0 record was the seventh unbeaten home record in program history, and the fourth straight season.

- Gonzaga has finished perfect at home in conference action 12 times.

- GU's 68 straight home wins is the longest streak in program history, breaking the record from 2003-07.

- During the Zags' 68-game home win streak, GU has won 35 times by 30-plus points, 45 times by 20 or more points, and 37 of the wins were versus WCC foes.

- Since the 2007-08 season, the Zags are 122-28 in true road games. GU's 81.9-win pct. in true road games is best in the nation over that span.
- Since the 2005-06 season, Gonzaga is 243-71 in road or neutral games. The Zags' 77.6-win percentage in road or neutral games tops the nation over that span.

LETS TAKE A LOOK BACK

- Last season, GU was first in the nation in scoring offense (87.2), scoring margin (21.0), FG percentage (52.1) and defensive rebounds (32.19), second in FG percentage defense (38.0) and rebounds per game (41.84), third in assists per game (18.1), fourth in rebound margin (8.5), sixth in blocked shots per game (5.8) and seventh in assist-turnover ratio (1.56).
- Last season, the Zags won their WCC games by an average margin of 23.5 points, which ranks forth in league history. During the 520 minutes of WCC play, GU trailed for only 60 minutes and 43 seconds. In 2020-21, in the 600 minutes of WCC play, the Bulldogs trailed for 69 minutes and nine seconds.
- In 2021-22, Gonzaga averaged 90.8 points per conference game at 52.6 percent shooting from the field.

SAME OL' STORY

- Gonzaga has led the nation in scoring and scoring margin in each of the past four seasons.
- The Bulldogs finished first in the KenPom rankings the last two seasons, after finishing second in the previous two.
- Additionally, the Zags have had the most efficient offense according to KenPom in 2018-19, 2019-20 and 2020-21. (2020-21: 126.4, 2019-20: 121.3, 2018-19: 124.5) They were third in offense last season at 120.7.
- GU has had the best field goal percentage in three of the last four seasons and was second in 2019-20 (51.5). (2021-22: 52.1, 2020-21: 53.5, 2018-19: 52.6)
- Gonzaga led WCC in scoring in each of the past five seasons, scoring margin in every season since 2013, and field goal percentage in the past four seasons.

PERFECT TEN

- The Zags have either shared or owned the WCC regu-

- lar season title outright in each of the last 10 seasons.
- Gonzaga has 25 WCC regular season titles, Coach Few has led the Bulldogs to 21 of them.
- Gonzaga currently owns the nationally-best active streak of regular season titles, owned or shared at 10.
- Since 1997-98, the Bulldogs have either won or shared 23 of the 25 regular season titles, sharing only three (2015-16 with Saint Mary's, 2010-11 with Saint Mary's, 2001-02 with Pepperdine). SMC won the 2011-12 title and Pepperdine took the 1999-2000 title, both by one game over Gonzaga.
- The Zags shared the title with Santa Clara in 1995-96, and won it outright in 1993-94.

NCAA TOURNAMENT NOTES

- Gonzaga made its 23rd consecutive NCAA Tournament Appearance and 24th overall in 2021-22.
- The 23 straight berths to the field are the third-longest current streak in the nation (Kansas and Michigan State).
- The Zags are 41-24 all-time in their 24 NCAA Tournament appearances with 12 trips to the Sweet 16, five trips to the Elite Eight, two Final Fours and two appearances in the national championship game.
- GU is 38-22 in the NCAA Tournament under Mark Few with a berth in all 23 seasons of Few's head coaching career.
- The Bulldogs have the most wins in the NCAA Tournament since 2017, going 17-5, Kansas is next at 15-4. GU's 22 wins in the tournament since 2015 is also the most, with Villanova and North Carolina second at 21.
- Gonzaga is one of only two teams to win its opening-round NCAA Tournament game each of the last 13 tournaments, Kansas is the other at 15.
- The Bulldogs are 32-18 all-time as a single-digit seed, with a 15-2 record in first round games as a single-digit seed.
- Last year, the Bulldogs received a one-seed for the fifth time in program history, the third straight season, and the fourth time in the last five NCAA Tournaments. GU was projected as a top seed in the 2020 tournament that was canceled as well.
- Last season, the Zags were the top-overall seed for the second straight season, and the second time ever in program history.
- The Zags have appeared in the Elite Eight four times in the last seven years.

MADE FOR MARCH

- Drew Timme has 204 total points in the NCAA tournament, making him the all-time GU leading scorer in the

- tourney. He has 80 made field goals in the tournament, which also leads GU in tourney all-time.
- Timme's 43 made free-throws during the tournament tops the program, while his 61 attempted free throws are second. He is fourth with 73 rebounds.
- Anton Watson is tied for third in program history with 12 steals in the NCAA Tournament in his career.

SWEET 16 ALL OVER AGAIN

- Gonzaga is the only program in the country to appear in each of the last seven Sweet 16s.
- Per ESPN stats, the Zags are the fourth program ever to reach seven straight Sweet 16s. They join UCLA, Duke, and North Carolina.

AMONG ELITE COMPANY

- In 2020-21, Gonzaga became the fourth team in the last 40 years to stay at No. 1 in the Associated Press poll for the entirety of the season.
- Kentucky in 2014-15, Duke in 1991-92 and UNLV in 1990-91 were the only teams to accomplish the feat.
- The final AP poll was released on March 15. The Zags received every first-place vote in that AP poll and the coaches' poll for the first time in program history.
