STARTING FIVE

■ The Cardinals start a season-long four game road trip on Sunday in the Battle for the Bluegrass against Kentucky in Lexington. It will be the 57th time the two teams meet all-time and the 15th time head coach Jeff Walz will go up against the Wildcats. Kentucky holds a 34-22 advantage all-time but the Cardinals have enjoyed more of the success since Walz has been at the helm. Louisville is 8-6 against Kentucky and they have won the previous five matchups dating back to the 2015-16 season. Of the 14 matchups under Walz, one of the two teams have been ranked in the polls in 12 of the previous matchups.

■ Junior guard Hailey Van Lith surpassed the 1,000-point mark in the win over SIUE on Dec. She scored a team-high 21 points and tied a career high with six assists. Van Lith is the 32nd Cardinal all-time to score 1,000 points or more in their collegiate career.

■ Graduate guard Morgan Jones was all over the passing lanes as she set a career high with eight steals in the win over SIUE. Five of the steals came in the first quarter and she finished with eight in just 17 minutes of game action. The eight steals are tied for the most by an ACC player so far this season and that is tied for sixth nationally for most in a game this year. It is the first time a Louisville player has had eight steals in a game since Jude Schimmel had eight against Wagner on Dec. 21, 2012.

■ The Cardinals have been one of the best road teams in the country over the past six seasons. Since the start of the 2017-18 season, Louisville is 53-8 on the road, good for a .869 winning percentage in those games. The wins rank third and the winning percentage is fourth in the NCAA over that span. So far this season, Louisville is 1-1 in road games after a 75-70 win over Belmont on Nov. 13 and a defeat at Middle Tennessee on Dec. 4.

■ The Cardinals have had several preseason recognitions prior to the 2022-23 season. They are just one of three schools to have a player on all five positional watch lists (Chrislyn Carr, Lieberman Award; Van Lith, Drysdale Award; Morgan Jones, Miller Award; Olivia Cochran, McClain Award; Josie Williams, Leslie Award). Van Lith and Jones were both named to the Preseason All-ACC team as the Cardinals were selected as league favorites. Jones and Van Lith were both selected to the Naismith Award Women's Watch List and the Wooden Award Preseason Top 50 Watch List. Van Lith was named a second team Preseason All-American by The Athletic. Van Lith was also selected to the Wade Watch List, the third national player of the year watch list she has been named to this season.

ABOUT THE WILDCATS

Kentucky will be the seventh of eight NCAA Tournament teams from a season ago that the Cardinals are facing in the non-conference portion of the schedule. The Wildcats went 19-12 last season and won the SEC Tournament to earn a No. 6 seed in the NCAA Tournament. The Cats season ended in Bloomington as they were upset by the 11-seed Princeton in the first round. In 2022-23, the Wildcats have begun the year 7-1 with their only loss to Virginia Tech at the Baha Mar Hoops Pink Flamingo Championship. Jada Walker leads the Cats with 15.4 points per game and she is one of three players to average double-digit points. Ajae Petty leads the team with 6.3 rebounds per game and Maddie Scherr has a team-best 6.2 assists per game, a mark that ranks 16th in the NCAA.

■ **Series History** - This will be the 57th meeting for the Battle for the Bluegrass and the Wildcats have a 34-22 series advantage. This will be the 15th matchup between the two teams since Jeff Walz took over at Louisville and the Cardinals have an 8-6 advantage over that time. Louisville has won the last five games against the Wildcats dating back to the 2015-16 season (The teams did not meet in the 2020-21 season). The Cardinals are 6-20 all-time in games played in Lexington but are 3-4 in those games during Walz's tenure.

■ **Last Meeting (Dec. 12, 2021)** - Ahlana Smith and Hailey Van Lith each made two late baskets and No. 5 Louisville held off No. 14 Kentucky 64-58 on Sunday to beat their in-state archrivals for the fifth straight time. A moment of silence was held before the game to remember victims from Friday night's storms in Mayfield. Louisville's athletic department also teamed with the KFC Yum! Center and the Kroger grocery store chain for a bottled water drive. Smith hit a go-ahead jumper with 2:47 remaining. Chelsie Hall added three free throws in the final 17 seconds as the Cardinals (8-1) won their eighth consecutive game. Kentucky (6-3) had rallied from a 49-42 deficit to lead 54-53 on a jumper by Dre'Una Edwards with 3:37 left. Smith gave Louisville the lead and Van Lith added a layup off Emily Engstler's block. Smith's layup and Van Lith's jumper provided a 61-56 cushion before Hall sealed it at the foul line. Hall finished with 15 points, while Smith and Van Lith had 13 each. Louisville shot just 40% but made 8 of 13 in the final quarter while its defense stopped Kentucky down the stretch.

QUICK HITTERS

■ **Program Record for Points in a Half** - The Cardinals made history in the 105-32 win over SIUE on Dec. 6. Louisville scored 62 points in the first half, the most points in any half in program history. The previous record was 61 which happened twice, in 2020 against DePaul and 2000 against Canisius.

■ **On Fire from the Floor** - Louisville put together one of the best shooting performances in Walz's tenure with the Cardinals. The Cards shot .662 from the field, which marks the second-highest shooting percentage in a game in Walz's 16 seasons. Louisville was 8-for-12 (.667%) from behind the arc, their best three-point shooting game since March 8, 2008, when the Cards shot .714 (10-14) from three against Rutgers.

■ **Century Mark x2** - Louisville scored 100 points or more for the second time this season and the 30th time in program history. It is the seventh time in program history they have scored 100 points or more twice in the same season and all of those instances occurred during Walz's tenure.

■ **Dixon approaches 1,000 career points** - Liz Dixon has tallied 918 career points and is 82 points shy of 1,000.

HVL 3.0

Hailey Van Lith has already made a big impact for the Cardinals in the beginning of the 2022-23 season.

■ So far this season, she leads the Cardinals with 20.0 points per game. That mark ranks second in the ACC and 24th nationally. She has scored 180 total points, a figure that is second in the conference and 18th nationally. Van Lith also does not leave the court as she is averaging 36.8 minutes per game, that ranks second in the ACC and 31st nationally. She leads the team with three double-doubles, a figure that is third in the conference among guards and 38th nationally.

■ Van Lith entered the Cardinal record book as she was the 32nd player in school history to eclipse the 1,000-point mark in the win over SIUE on Dec. 6. She led the team on the night with 21 points and tied a career high with six assists. It was her fifth 20-point performance in her nine games this season. She has scored 20 points or more or recorded a double-double in seven of her nine games this year.

■ On the road against Middle Tennessee, Van Lith got her second-straight double-double with 12 points and 10 rebounds. It is the first time in her career she has had a double-double in back-to-back games and the first time she has had 10 or more rebounds in consecutive games. She is the first Cardinal to have double-doubles in back-to-back games since Emily Engstler last season in the NCAA Tournament against Gonzaga and Tennessee.

■ Against #4/5 Ohio State, Van Lith recorded her second double-double of the season as she recorded a team-high 20 points and 10 rebounds.

■ In the two games against Top-5 opponents this season (#3 Texas, #4 Ohio State), Van Lith has averaged 19.0 points per game and 8.0 rebounds, both team-high marks. She has scored 18 points or more in each of the two games.

■ In the three games down in the Battle 4 Atlantis, she averaged 20.7 points, 4.3 rebounds and scored at least 18 points in each of the three games. Against Gonzaga she led the Cardinals with a team-high 18 points. She also led the team with four assists, the second time this season she has had four or more assists. Against Texas, Van Lith had 18 points once again and led the team with six rebounds. In the final game against South Dakota State, she had a team-high 26 points on 10-of-20 shooting from the floor.

■ In the road win over Belmont, Van Lith had a game-high 25 points and hit crucial free throws down the stretch to seal the win for the Cardinals.

■ She followed up her 28-point performance in the opener with her second career double-double against IUPUI. She tallied 12 points and 10 rebounds and added four assists in the win over the Jaguars.

■ In the season-opening win over Cincinnati, Van Lith led the Cardinals with 28 points on 12-of-20 shooting. It was the fourth-most points scored in a season opener in Louisville history and the second-most points scored by an ACC player in their season-opening games this season.

■ Van Lith had several preseason recognitions as she was named to the Preseason All-ACC team, Meyers Drysdale Award Watch List and a second team Preseason All-American by The Athletic. She was also listed at No. 9 in ESPN's Top 25 Players List and it was the second-straight season she has made the Top 25. It was also the second-straight season she was named to the Wooden Award Preseason Watch List. She was also selected to the Naismith Award Women's Watch List for the third-straight season. She was named to the Wade Watch List on Nov. 30, the third national player of the year award watch list she has been named to this season.

CC FROM THREE

Syracuse grad transfer Chrislyn Carr has been lethal from three-point range this season, leading the Cardinals from behind the arc as a scoring threat.

■ Through the first 10 games, Carr leads the team with 26 three-pointers. She is shooting .481 percent from three and the next closest player has 10 made threes on the season. Her 26 threes are second in the ACC and 16th nationally. The .481 shooting percentage is also second in the ACC and 34th nationally.

■ In the win over SIUE, she scored 14 points, shot 4-for-5 from three and tied a season high with five assists. It was the fifth time in the last six games she has scored in double figures and the sixth game she has made three or more three-pointers.

■ On the road against Middle Tennessee, Carr was one of three Cardinals to score in double figures with 10 points.

■ Going up against the second Top-5 opponent of the season in #4/5 Ohio State, Carr scored 14 points, including four three-pointers. It was her second game in a row with four or more made threes.

■ She led the Cardinals in scoring with 17 points in the win over Longwood on Nov. 25. She hit a season-high five three-pointers and it is the most made by a Cardinal in a single game this season. She hauled in a season-high seven rebounds and tied a season high with five assists. Carr has led the Cardinals in scoring three times this season and they are 3-0 in those games.

■ In the win over #3/5 Texas, Carr paced the Cards with a season-high 19 points and was 3-for-

HEAD COACH JEFF WALZ

Head coach **Jeff Walz**, in his 16th season as a head coach, has compiled a 420-117 record as the Cardinals' leader. Walz and the Cardinals boast quite an astounding resumé that includes 11 trips to the NCAA Sweet 16, seven trips to the Elite Eight, four trips to the final four and two trips to the national title game. Overall, he has compiled a 37-13 record in NCAA Tournament games and ranks eighth all-time and fifth among active coaches with a 74.0 NCAA Tournament winning percentage.



All of this for a program that had just four NCAA Tournament wins and had never reached a Sweet 16 prior to Walz being named head coach.

Walz is the all-time winningest coach in program history and averages 27.6 victories per season. He directed Louisville to a program-record 36 victories in 2017-18 en route to being named ACC Coach of the Year, 34 victories in 2008-09, 33 wins in 2013-14, 32 wins in 2018-19 and 29 wins in 2021-22.

The Cardinals have reached 20 wins 12 consecutive times and they have won at least 20 games in 14 of Walz's 15 seasons. The longest run previously was three, achieved twice, and UofL had just 10 20-win seasons in its 32 previous years.

Walz led Louisville to four consecutive Atlantic Coast Conference regular season titles in 2018, 2019, 2020 and 2021, and over that four-year span, the Cardinals went a combined 122-15, which marked the fewest losses and best winning percentage over a four-year period in program history.

From 2016-2021, he coached the ACC Player of the Year in five of six seasons as Myisha Hines-Allen won the award in 2016, Asia Durr in 2018 and 2019, and Dana Evans in 2020 and 2021. He also coached Angel McCoughtry to Big East Player of the Year honors in 2007.

After being hired as the Cardinals' head coach on March 27, 2007, the Bluegrass State native used little time to make a splash. His first year featured the program's first NCAA Sweet 16 and it culminated with Louisville earning the No. 12 ranking in the final ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. For his efforts, Walz was named the WBCA Maggie Dixon Rookie Coach of the Year.

Prior to taking the reins at Louisville, Walz spent five seasons at Maryland, including his final season as the associate head coach in 2006-07. The season prior, he helped lead the Terrapins to a school-record 34 wins and the program's first national title.

Walz has four children: daughter Kaeley, son Jacob, and daughters Lola and Lucy. He married the former Lauren Lueders in September of 2012, and the couple resides in Louisville.

5 from beyond the arc. She also hit a season high eight free throws and was 8-for-10 from the charity stripe.

ALL AROUND MJ

Florida State grad transfer Morgan Jones has made her mark on the Cardinals this season, impacting the game in multiple categories.

■ Jones had one of her best games in a Louisville uniform in the win over SIUE. She scored 17 points, tied a season-high with four assists and set a career high with eight steals in just 17 minutes of action. Her eight steals are tied for the most by an ACC player in a single game and it is tied for sixth nationally. She is the first Louisville player to have eight steals in a game since Jude Schimmel had eight against Wagner on December 21, 2012.

■ Against #4/5 Ohio State, Jones scored 15 points for the second-straight game to go with six rebounds and two steals. It was the sixth game with four or more rebounds.

■ In the two games against Top-5 opponents this season (#3 Texas, #4 Ohio State), Jones has averaged 16.5 points per game, which is tied for the second most on the team in those games. She has shot 15-for-27 from the floor and her .556 field goal percentage is the best on the team against ranked opponents.

■ In the win over Longwood, Jones tallied 15 points and added four rebounds and a season-high four assists.

■ In the win over #3/5 Texas, Jones was one of three players with 18 or more points (18 pts.) and she added four rebounds, two blocks and two steals. It was the second game this season with multiple steals and blocks in the same game.

■ She scored in double figures with 12 points with four rebounds, one steal and one block against Gonzaga on Nov. 19.

■ Jones just played 19 minutes against IUPUI but made her presence felt with nine points, seven rebounds, two assists, two blocks and one steal. She had at least eight points, four rebounds and two blocks in each of her first two games with the Cardinals.

■ In the opener against Cincinnati, Jones tallied 14 points, four rebounds, three steals, three blocks and two assists. It was the first time in her career that she had at least three steals and three blocks in the same game.

OPPORTUNITY FOR OLIVIA

Olivia Cochran is set for a big role with the Cardinals in her third year at Louisville. She joins Van Lith as one of two starters returning from last season's Final Four team.

■ Cochran scored in double figures for the second-straight game and third time in the last four against SIUE. She had 12 points on 6-of-8 shooting with five rebounds.

■ She led the Cardinals with a team-high and season-high 14 points against Middle Tennessee. It is the first time she has led the team in scoring this season and she added seven rebounds, her sixth game this season with seven or more boards.

■ Cochran picked up her second double-double of the season in the win over Longwood on Nov. 25. She tallied 10 points and 10 rebounds for her seventh career double-double. She was one of six Cardinal players to score in double figures in the win.

■ She had a party on her birthday in the road win over Belmont. Cochran was a force on the boards and tallied a season-high 13 rebounds to go with 13 points for her sixth career double-double. It was the second-straight game a Cardinal recorded a double-double and the 10th time in her career she had 10 or more rebounds in a game. Cochran also led the team with a season-high three assists, including the assist on Mykasa Robinson's go-ahead layup with 1:45 left in the game.

■ In the win over IUPUI on Nov. 10, Cochran was one of four Cardinals to score in double figures (11 pts.).

■ Cochran was named to the Katrina McClain Watch List for the second-straight season prior to the 2022-23 season.

■ Cochran is coming off a sophomore season where she started 32 games and averaged 8.6 points and is the team's leading rebounder returning with 5.1 per game. In ACC play, ranked fourth on the team with 9.7 points per game, while pulling down 5.8 rebounds per game.

■ She scored in double-figures 11 times in 2021-22 and had 10 or more rebounds twice, including a career-high 13 in the road win over Georgia Tech.

ROBINSON KNOWS DEFENSE

A familiar face is back to take advantage of her fifth year of eligibility as graduate student Mykasa Robinson returns for the Cardinals this season. She leads the Cardinals with 137 games played in her career, which is three games away from entering the Top-10 in games played in program history.

■ Through her nine games this year, Robinson leads the Cardinals with 21 total steals. She ranks sixth in the ACC and 54th nationally with the 21 steals. She averages 2.3 steals per game, a mark that is seventh in the ACC.

■ On Nov. 30 against #4/5 Ohio State, Robinson stuffed the stat sheet with eight points, five rebounds, a team-high four assists, career-high two blocks and one steal.

■ In the final game in Atlantis against South Dakota State, Robinson had three steals and led the team with five rebounds and four assists. It is the fourth game this season Robinson had three or more steals.

11TH-LONGEST TOP-10 STREAK IN AP HISTORY

The Cardinals were ranked in the Top-10 of the AP poll for 98-consecutive weeks dating back to the 2017-18 season. It is the 11th-longest Top-10 appearance streak in AP poll history.

STAYING IN THE TOP 25

Louisville has remained in the USA Today Top 25 for 129 weeks, dating back to Jan. 11, 2016. That is a program record for consecutive time spent in the USA Today poll.

VS. AP TOP 25

UofL went 10-4 against AP Top 25 teams last season, which is the most AP Top 25 wins in program history. Over the past six seasons, the Cards are 34-16 against AP Top 25 teams. So far this season, the Cardinals are 1-1 after the 71-63 win over #3/5 Texas on Nov. 20 and a 77-96 defeat to #4/5 Ohio State on Nov. 30.

PRESEASON AP AND USA TODAY RANKINGS

Following the program's fourth trip to the Final Four last season, Louisville was ranked seventh in the 2021-22 Associated Press and fifth in the USA Today Coaches preseason polls. It marks the eighth consecutive season that Louisville has been ranked in the top 10 of the AP preseason poll and the 11th time in the past 12 years and the 12th time in Walz's 16-year tenure. Prior to his arrival, the Cardinals had never been ranked in the AP preseason Top 10.

■ Robinson had one of the best games of her career against Gonzaga in the Bahamas. She tied a career high with five steals, all of which came in the first half of the game. She tied a career high with 10 points and added five rebounds and three assists.

■ It was her play on the offensive side of the ball that helped the Cardinals win on the road against Belmont. She scored nine points, one shy of her career high, including the go-ahead layup with 1:45 left in regulation. She drew six fouls in the win, including the moving screen with 7.0 seconds left to give the Cardinals the ball back with a one-point lead.

■ Robinson had another active game in the passing lanes in the win over IUPUI on Thursday. She had a team-high three steals to go along with four rebounds, three points and two assists. She has had three steals or more in each of the first two games this season and it was the first time in her career she has had three or more steals in back-to-back games.

■ In the season opener against Cincinnati, Robinson had an all-around game with five points, six rebounds, three assists and tied a career high with five steals.

■ Last season, Robinson played in 33 games and made her impact on the defensive end as she was named to the All-ACC Defensive Team for the second straight season. She was just one of two players in the league to be named to the Defensive Team in each of the last two seasons.

■ Widely regarded as one of the toughest defenders in the country, she averaged 1.3 steals per game in just over 20 minutes per game last season. She has recorded at least one steal in 26 of 33 games played last year.

CHALLENGING NON-CONFERENCE SCHEDULE

Louisville will be going up against a number of tough opponents in their non-conference slate to begin the season.

■ **NCAA Foes** - Eight of their non-conference opponents reached the 2022 NCAA Tournament and they are also facing a team that made the WNIT semifinals (Middle Tennessee). In the Bahamas, the Cardinals went against South Dakota State, the WNIT Champions from a season ago. Of the 13 non-conference games, 10 will be against either NCAA Tournament teams or teams that made the WNIT semifinals or farther.

■ **Second Round or Further** - Of the eight potential NCAA tournament teams from a season ago, four made it to the second round or further. Gonzaga made it to the second round before falling to the Cardinals in Louisville. Belmont reached the second round after upsetting #5-seed Oregon. Ohio State reached the Sweet Sixteen before falling to Texas. Texas made the Elite Eight before falling to NCAA Semifinalist Stanford.

■ **Away From Home** - The Cardinals will also be away from home for a majority of the non-conference slate. They will play five true road games and had three games in the Bahamas for the Battle 4 Atlantis Tournament. The Cardinals are just one of two teams (South Carolina) in the Top-10 of the Preseason AP Poll that will play five true road games during non-conference play.

ROAD WARRIORS

UofL went 10-2 in true road games last season and is 53-8 since the start of the 2017-18 season. The Cardinals rank third in wins and fourth in winning percentage in the NCAA in true road games during that span (.869).

SUCCESS AGAINST UNRANKED TEAMS

Louisville is 168-7 in their last 175 games against unranked opponents. From 2015 to 2019, Louisville won 102 consecutive games against teams not ranked in the AP Top 25.

NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

All-time, Walz is 171-33 (.838) against nonconference foes in regular season play. They are 61-8 in non-conference play over the past six years.

DECEMBER IS WINNING TIME

The Cardinals have had a lot of success in the season's second month during Walz's tenure in Louisville. During his 16 seasons, the Cardinals are 88-15 in the month of December. In six of those seasons, Louisville went undefeated in December. Over the past five seasons, the Cardinals are 28-2 in the month of December.

ONE OF THE BEST IN THE COUNTRY

Louisville has been one of the best teams in the country since the start of the 2017-18 season. The Cardinals have totaled 157 wins and an .867 winning percentage. The 157 wins ranks third and the winning percentage ranks fourth in the NCAA during that span.

70-PLUS POINTS

The Cardinals have won 67 of their last 68 games when they have scored 70 points or more, dating back to the 2018-19 season. UofL is 296-24 when surpassing the 70-point plateau under Walz.

After going 10-0 in 2021-22 in games when they shot 50 percent or better, Louisville is 3-0 this season after shooting 66.2 percent from the floor against SIUE on Dec. 6. Overall, they boast a 137-1 record when shooting 50 percent or better from the field under Walz. They are undefeated in the previous 14 seasons when they have shot 50 percent or better from the floor.

EXPERIENCE AND SCORING NOT A PROBLEM FOR THE CARDS

The Cardinals have seven new faces on the squad heading into the 2022-23 season but the team does not have an issue with experience or scoring. Of the 14 players on the roster, five are graduate students and four are juniors or older.

■ **Games on games on games** - Louisville has eight players on the roster that have played in 60 or more collegiate games. Five of those players have tallied over 100 career games with Mykasa Robinson leading the way with 137 games played. Liz Dixon (136), Morgan Jones (124), Josie Williams (116) and Chrislyn Carr (104) are the four other players with over 100 games played.

■ **Scoring Touch** - A number of Cardinals player have the ability to light it up from the floor. Five different players have tallied at least one 20-point game in their careers and three players have had 10 or more 20-point games. In total, there have been 57 20-point games by Cardinals players in their careers. Chrislyn Carr leads the way with 17, Hailey Van Lith has 16, Josie Williams has 11, Morgan Jones has nine and Liz Dixon has had four.

ROSTER BREAKDOWN

Louisville returns seven players from last year's team, brings in seven newcomers and had six departures, including honorable mention All-American Emily Engstler.

■ **Returnees** - In addition to the four players that have career starts, the Cardinals return Norika Konno, Merissah Russell and Alexia Mobley. Van Lith was named the 2022 Wichita Region Most Outstanding Player after having four 20+ point games to start the 2022 NCAA Tournament and was also named to the First Team All-ACC. Olivia Cochran started 32 of 33 games played last season and is the leading rebounder returning for the Cardinals. Robinson was one of just two players to be named to the All-ACC Defensive Team in each of the last two seasons. Dixon led the Cardinals for the second-straight season after shooting 57.3 percent from the floor while averaging 5.3 points and 3.1 rebounds per game.

■ **Newcomers** - Louisville brings in Florida State transfer Morgan Jones, Syracuse transfer Chrislyn Carr and Utah Valley transfer Josie Williams, along with four freshmen Zyanna Walker, Nyla Harris, Jalyn Brown and Imani Lester. Jones was a 1,000-point scorer during her career at Florida State and is a two-time WBCA Honorable Mention All-American and was named to the First Team All-ACC last season. Carr began her career at Texas Tech before playing last season at Syracuse. She led the Orange in field goal percentage last season (.440) and was second on the team in points per game (14.2). Josie Williams was First Team All-WAC in each of the last two seasons. In 2021-22, she was fourth in the NCAA and set a school record with 24 double-doubles after averaging 17.3 points and 12.4 rebounds per game. Williams scored in double figures in all 30 games played in 2021-22.

IMPACT TRANSFERS

The Cardinals were active in the transfer portal once again as they added three players to the squad that bring a wealth of Division I experience. The Cardinals are set to replace Emily Engstler, Chelsie Hall and Kianna Smith, who were all transfers into the program and had immediate success with the Cardinals. This year's transfer class includes Chrislyn Carr, Morgan Jones and Josie Williams.

■ Heading into the 2022-23 season, the trio totaled a combined 258 starts and all three players have over 1,000 points for their careers. Between the three, they have 3,658 points, 1,663 rebounds and 590 assists in their careers before coming to Louisville.

■ Morgan Jones was ranked No. 7 and Chrislyn Carr was No. 15 in ESPN's Transfer Rankings for 2022-23. The Cardinals were one of three schools to have two transfers ranked in the Top-15.

LOUISVILLE PICKED AS LEAGUE FAVORITE IN ACC PRESEASON POLL

Louisville was selected as the ACC favorite for the third time in the previous four seasons. The Cardinals received 31 of the total 60 first place votes as four different teams earned first place votes in the Blue-Ribbon Poll. The Cardinals have won the ACC regular season title in four of the last five seasons.

■ **Van Lith** - Van Lith started all 34 games last season for the Cardinals and led the team in scoring with 14.4 points per game. In ACC Play, she ranked sixth in the league with 15.4 points per game, while shooting 45.7 percent from the floor, which ranked eighth. She reached double figures in 14 of 17 ACC games, including four 20-plus point performances and a 34-point game at Clemson. Van Lith was named a preseason All-American by The Athletic prior to this season.

■ **Jones** - She eclipsed the 1,000-point plateau in her last season at Florida State. She led the Seminoles with 13.8 points per game and she was named to the First Team All-ACC for the second-straight season. Jones was also named a second team Senior CLASS Award All-American and earned honorable mention All-American status from the WBCA for the second-straight year.

FIVE PLAYERS NAMED TO POSITION AWARD WATCH LISTS

Chrislyn Carr, Hailey Van Lith, Morgan Jones, Olivia Cochran and Josie Williams were all named to their position award watch list. Louisville is only one of three schools (Texas and Tennessee) that had a player named on each of the five positional watch lists.

■ **Carr named to Nancy Lieberman Award Watch List** - Carr comes to Louisville after spending the 2021-22 season at Syracuse. With the Orange, she started in all 29 games and led the team in field goal percentage (.440) and was second on the team in points per game (14.2). Prior to Syracuse, she began her college career at Texas Tech. While with the Red Raiders, she was named the 2019 Big 12 Freshman of the Year and was a two-time All-Big 12 Honorable Mention (2019, 2020). The Lieberman Award recognizes the top point guards.

■ **Van Lith named to Ann Meyers Drysdale Award Watch List** - Van Lith started all 34 games last season and led the team in scoring with 14.4 points per game. She earned First Team All-ACC honors and broke out during the 2022 NCAA Tournament. She tallied 20-plus points in each of the first four games of the tournament and was named the Wichita Region Most Outstanding Player. She was the only player in the NCAA Tournament to have four 20-plus point games and the next closest player only had two. She was named to the preseason All-ACC team and a preseason All-American by The Athletic. The Meyers Drysdale Award recognizes the top shooting guards.

■ **Jones named to Cheryl Miller Award Watch List** - Jones comes to the Cardinals after beginning her collegiate career at Florida State. While with the Seminoles, Jones was a two-time WBCA Honorable Mention All-American in her last two seasons and was also named to the All-ACC First Team in her previous two seasons. In her senior season with Florida State, Jones led the Seminoles in scoring (13.8) and was also named a second team All-American by the Senior CLASS Award. The Miller Award recognizes the top small forwards.

■ **Cochran named to Katrina McClain Award Watch List** - Cochran is one of two players returning that started over 30 games last season and is the team's leading rebounder returning. She averaged 8.6 points and 5.1 rebounds last season and it is the second-straight season she was named to the McClain Award Watch List. In the Elite Eight win over Michigan, Cochran scored six-straight points to extend the Cardinals lead to eight with just 33 seconds remaining. The McClain Award recognizes the top power forwards.

■ **Williams named to Lisa Leslie Award Watch List** - Williams comes to the Cardinals after beginning her collegiate career at Utah Valley. In her final two seasons with the Wolverines, she was selected to the All-WAC First Team both seasons. In her senior season, she set a program single season record with 24 double-doubles, which was tied for fourth in the country that season. She averaged 17.3 points per game and 12.4 rebounds per game in her senior season. The 12.4 rebounds per game were the second highest in program history for a single season and it ranked fifth overall in the NCAA last season. The Leslie Award recognizes the top centers.

MOST UOFL VICTORIES

UofL's 29 wins last year rank fifth all-time. The top eight and 12 of the 13 top win totals have come under Walz.

ANOTHER 20-WIN SEASON

UofL went 29-5 and reached 20 wins for the 12th straight season to extend the program record. The longest run previously was three, achieved twice. The Cards have won at least 20 games in 14 of Walz's 15 seasons. Prior to Walz's arrival, Louisville had just 10 20-win seasons in its history.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

NCAA TOURNAMENT SUCCESS

Louisville has been one of the most consistent teams in the NCAA Tournament over the past four seasons. Louisville is the only program in the country to be a No. 1 seed in three of the last four full season. The Cardinals are just one of two teams (UConn) to make the Elite Eight in each of the past four tournaments. Louisville is just one of five programs (UConn, Stanford, South Carolina, Notre Dame) to make four or more Final Fours in the last 15 seasons.

WALZ IN THE BIG DANCE

Walz boasts a 37-13 record in NCAA Tournament games. He is eighth all-time in winning percentage and 5th among active coaches. He has directed UofL to a pair of national runner-up finishes (2009, 2013), four Final Fours (2009, 2013, 2018, 2022), seven Elite Eights (2009, 2013, 2014, 2018, 2019, 2021, 2022), 11 trips to the Sweet 16 and 13 NCAA Tournaments. Walz is one of five active head coaches to make four or more Final Fours.

This past fall, she was with Japan at the FIBA 3x3 U23 World Cup in Bucharest. Japan advanced out of pool play and fell in the quarterfinals to eventual champion France. She competed against Team USA and former Cardinal Emily Engstler.

■ **Canada** - Last spring, Merissah Russell competed for the Canadian National Team at the FIBA Women's Basketball World Cup 2022 Qualifying Tournament in Osaka, Japan.
