KENTUCKY AIM FOR THIRD SERIES WIN OF SEASON

- THE CATS BROUGHT IN 12 TRANSFERS IN THE OFFSEASON, TAKING ADVANTAGE OF NEW NCAA RULES TO LAND THE No. 6 TRANSFER CLASS IN THE COUNTRY ACCORDING TO BASEBALL AMERICA. IT IS THE SECOND TOP 10 CLASS IN AS MANY YEARS OF TRANSFER RANKINGS.
- THE UK PITCHERS STRUCK OUT A SCHOOL-RECORD 593 BATTERS IN 2022. THEY HAVE 87 IN 2023.
- UK has scored in 305 of 311 games in Mingione's tenure.
- UK has scored 30 runs in its past two games, winning by a combined score of 30-1.
- MINGIONE NOW HAS 182 CAREER WINS, THIRD ON UK'S ALL-TIME LIST.
- IN SIX+ YEARS UNDER COACH NICK MINGIONE THE WILDCATS HAVE SWIPED 403 BASES IN 527 ATTEMPTS, A SUCCESS RATE OF 76.3 PERCENT. IN 2022, UK STOLE MORE THAN 80 BASES FOR THE SECOND TIME IN MINGIONE'S TENURE.

- UK IS 115-38 VS. NON-CONFERENCE FOES UNDER COACH NICK MINGIONE, INCLUDING 101-16 AGAINST NON-POWER FIVE OPPONENTS.
- UK PITCHERS RANK 12TH NATIONALLY IN STRIKEOUT-TO-WALK RATIO.
- CATCHER DEVIN BURKES HAD AN UNFORGETTABLE WEEKEND LAST WEEKENDWHERE HE POSTED AN OPS OVER 2.000. HE HAD EIGHT HITS VS. WRIGHT STATE, ALL OF WHICH WENT FOR EXTRA BASES (7 2B, HR), AND HAD 10 RBI.



CATS ENTER 2023 LOOKING TO BUILD UPON MOMENTUM

The Kentucky baseball program is entering a critical spring as it looks to continue building upon the momentum of its spirited Southeastern Conference Tournament run to end 2022, which capped a 9-6 finish over its final 15 SEC games. Only five teams were .500 or better in their final 15 games against SEC opponents. While UK fell just shy of a NCAA Regional berth, the eventual national champion (OleMiss) was 10-5 over the same period and the last team into the tournament. All of which is to say UK is on the doorstep and will seek to knock the door known in 2023.

Redshirt sophomore Devin Burkes provided glimpse of his unlimited potential with seven extra-base hits and nine RBI over the final month of 2023, while redshirt freshman James McCoy and a cast of experienced transfers will lead the way on offense while the returns of Tyler Bosma, Magdiel Cotto and Darren Williams should make the pitching staff intimidating again.

TRANSFER OF ENERGY

UK hit the NCAA transfer portal hard in the offseason, signing eight players from the D-I ranks to provide immediate help. The group was rated as the No. 6 transfer class in the country according to Baseball America, while D1Baseball had three players ranked in the top 100 of all transfers, including IF/OF Ryan Waldschmidt (No. 16).

Needing to replace starters at eight of nine positions and designated hitter, the Wildcats enticed an experienced group of transfers who are regarded as tremendous locker room fits, have their own impressive credentials and are thirsty for postseason success. Included are a Golden Spikes Award semifinalist, a conference pitcher of the year, five all-conference performers, two players who have been second-team all-conference and a freshman all-conference performer.

DEREK BRYANT: HALL OF FAMER

Last November, Kentucky inducted Derek Bryant into the UK Athletics Hall of Fame for his standout career in the Blue and White. Bryant, a Henry Clay (Lexington) High School product, played at UK from 1970-73.

Two-time All-SEC First Team honoree during his days at UK ... Exceptional hitter with career batting average of .369 (stats available for his last three seasons), with a career-high mark of .408 in 1971 ... First African-American baseball player at UK ... Drafted by the San Francisco Giants out of Henry Clay High School before deciding to enroll at Kentucky ... Drafted by the Oakland A's out of UK in 1973 and spent his entire professional career with the A's (1070 double career build on the Athletic and the Ath (1973-1981) ... Played in 39 MLB games for the Athletics during the 1979 season ... Had a successful playing and managerial career in the Mexican Professional League after his playing days, including two league titles (1995 and '96) as manager of Monterrey ... Member of the Mexican Baseball League Hall of Fame .. Continues to be an executive with Hermosillo of the Mexican Pacific League (winter league).

The UK Athletics Hall of Fame will recognize and honor persons whose participation and contributions enriched and strengthened the University's athletic program. Criteria that will be considered includes athletic and academic accomplishments of the individual while at UK, as well as post-UK accomplishments and character.

Others inducted with baseball connections include: Sawyer Carroll and AJ Reed (2020), Collin Cowgill (2017), Andy Green (2015), Terry Shumpert (2014), Jeff Keener (2012), Jeff Abbott (2011), Jim Host (2009), Brandon Webb (2009), Dom Fucci (2007), Ellis Johnson (2006) and Keith Madison (2005).

BIGGIE BOX

One of the pillars of UK's offense is working its game goals in search of the big inning - "Biggie Box" - which is defined as any inning where the Cats put four or more runs on the scoreboard. The approach has been so effective the lineup has opened its "Biggie Box" 151 times since Mingione took over (37 in 2017, 31 in 2018, 20 in 2019, 19 in 2021, 28 in 2022, 5 in 2023) and recorded 11 such innings in just 17 games during the pandemic-shortened 2020 season. The Cats also are 136-28 under Mingione when scoring six or more runs, including 2-1 this season. (See box on page eight for Biggie Box innings)

YOU GET A ROS(ZEL) 👎

Kentucky's pitching staff has benetitted greatly from the work of Dan Roszel, who has spent the majority of his coacing career at East Carolina and Kentucky. He also helped develop Boston star lefty Chris Sale. Since arriving at UK prior to the 2020 season his pitching staff has had a 4.84 earned run average ans struck out 10 batters per nine innings. In 2022, the unit set the school record for strikeouts in a season with 593.

Roszel has a lengthy track record of producing big leaguers and saw three of his former players at Florida Gulf Coast, including Sale and MLBers Richard Bleier and Casey Coleman, inducted into the school's athletics Hall of Fame in the past two years.

CATS LEAD THE SEC IN WEEKLY HONORS

Although the strength of our TEAM is our TEAM, the Cats have had standout individual performances that have caught the attention of observers across the country and in the SEC offices. Since the beginning of the 2017 season, UK players have been named SEC Player, Pitcher or Newcomer of the Week twenty times, the second-most for any school in the conference.

THE REAL McCOY

Redshirt freshman James McCoy made an immediate impression in the fall after a breakout summer in the Northwoods League where he tore the cover off the baseball before a minor injury slowed his production. Coach Nick Mingione has referred to McCoy as the Wildcats' "best player" in the fall on multiple occasions and the staff hs been blown away by his legitimate power from both sides of the plate. He is considered a potential second day MLB draft pick by nearly every scouting publication.

EWELL LOVE TO SEE IT

Outfielder Kendal Ewell is poised for a big season after performing as one of the nation's top players last season while at Eastern Kentucky, where he was a Golden Spikes Award semifinalist after batting .361 with 14 home runs, 51 RBI and 11 steals. He also was oustanding in the field, registering seven outfield assists and then was one of the best players in the MLB Draft League last summer. He should provide a little bit of everything for the Cats.

#EVERYTHINGSCHOOL

Under the direction of athletics director Mitch Barnhart, UK has greatly enhanced its athletic profile across the entire department since his arrival. In recent years, volleyball and rifle each have won a national championship, football has had a pair of 10-win seasons ans Citrus Bowl championships, men's tennis finished national runner-up, men's soccer completed an undefeated regular season and No. 1 overall seed in NCAA Tournament, baseball reached first-ever Super Regional, softball advanced to the WCWS, women's swimming won the Southeastern Conference title, track and field and gymnastics each cemeted their status as elite programs on the national scene, and women's basketball won the SEC Tournament for the first time. That's not to mention the continued excellence of men's basketball and cheerleading, all of which culminated in a school-record ninth place finish in the Director's Cup standings for 2021-22.

OPPORTUNITY KNOCKS

Playing in the Southeastern Conference is not for the feint of heart, as seemingly each weekend brings a challenge only the nation's top baseball league can present. 2023 should be no different as the Wildcats will face opponents ranked in the preseason top 12 in at least five of its 10 league weekend series: LSU (1), Tennessee (2), Florida (3), Vanderbilt (6) and Texas A&M (7). Three of those five series will be on the road. Also, UK will have a home-and-home with Louisville (5), who also is in the top 10. According to D1Baseball.com, the Cats face the most difficult non-conference schedule amongst SEC teams by average RPI from 2022.

THIEVES OF THE INDUSTRY

- In six years under coach Nick Mingione the Wildcats have swiped 403 bases in 528 attempts, a success rate of 76.3 percent.
- In 2022, UK stole more than 80 bases for the second time in Mingione's tenure.
- In 2021, the Cats stole 78 bases in 86 attempts. It was the highest success rate (90.7) of any Division I-A team with 50+ stolen bases.
- The Cats were successful on their first 33 stolen base attempts last season, the most consecutive steals to open a season in school history and longest streak in D-I in 2021.
- Transfer Ryan Waldschmidt (left) stole 18 bases in 2022 as a freshman. In total, incoming transfers stole 76 bases in 97 attempts last season (.789)
- In their careers, UK's eight incoming transfers are 90-of-116 (.784) on stolen bases.

TOMMY (JOHN) BOYS

Kentucky will be counting on the return of five pitchers from the infamous "Tommy John" elbow surgery, including two transfers and a pair of redshirt freshmen who were injured in high school.

The most closely watched return will be that of senior Darren Williams, who was injured midway through the 2022 season and whose loss had a direct impact on the Wildcats' on-field fortunes. Williams, who pitched to a 0.93 earned run average in 29.0 innings has posted back-to-back strong SEC performances against Georgia and eventual national champion Ole Miss.

Redshirt freshmen Reed Gannon and Travis Smith each will finally make their collegiate debuts after missing 2022.

During the summer of 2022, fans were tasked with creating All-Kentucky Baseball dream team from the Nick Mingione era, which spannned 2017 through the 2021 campaign. Their votes on social media created a squad with eight all-americans, six major leaguers and a Southeastern Conference Pitcher of the Year, as well as a pair of Rawlings Gold Glove winners.



The Cats have walked it off 13 times since Nick Mingione took over as head coach before the 2017 season, including two run rule games.



MLB TRAINING GROUND

Kentucky has made its presence felt in the Major League Baseball Draft in recent years with 33 players selected during the Nick Mingione era, including 21 in 2017 and 2018, which was the most of any college program in the country over that span. In Evan White (2017) and Zack Thompson (2019) the Cats have had two first-round selections under Mingione. In the last six drafts:

• 19 Wildcats were selected in the first 10 rounds.

• Eight were selected in the first five rounds, including first-rounders Evan White (2017) and Zack Thompson (2019).

• The 13 picks in 2018 are the second-most for any school in a single draft since 2006 and tied for an SEC record with Texas A&M (2016) and national champion Vanderbilt (2019).

• The 20 underclassmen drafted during that span earned \$12.663 million in signing bonus money, an average of \$633,125 per player.

- All but one draftee was selected higher than previously selected.
- 23 of the draftees had not previously been drafted.

• White was named a 2020 AL Gold Glove winner, the first rookie first baseman in either league to win the award since is inception in 1957.

• Along with White having already made his MLB debut, Zach Pop made the Miami Marlins 2021 opening day roster, while three more Zachs - Logue, Reks and Thompson each have reached The Show. Pitcher Sean Hjelle (SF Giants) was called up and debuted in May 2022.

"THE HOOK"

One of the personal touches to the Wildcats' home, Kentucky Proud Park, is "The Hook," which is the name of the visting bullpen just beyond the right field wall. The name is a tribute to former UK pitcher Jonathan Hooker, who pitched for the Cats from 1998-2001, and died in the plane crash of Comair Flight 5191 on Aug. 27, 2006 in Lexington.

Hooker and his wife, Scarlett Parsley, were married the night before and were on the early-morning flight headed to their honeymoon when the pilots attempted to take off from the wrong runway and crashed into a neighboring field. Forty-nine of the 50 people on board were killed, including both Hooker and Parsley.

The London, Ky. native was a beloved teammate and member of UK Baseball and his family were honored on Mar. 29, 2019 during an in-game ceremony to officially unveil "The Hook," which features a sign and memorial to the former Wildcat.

Kentucky fans have quickly created a bond with **Nick Mingione**, whose infectious and unrelenting enthusiasm and down-to-earth personality has earned legions of new fans. Although it is certainly an ingredient in Mingione's on-field success, getting the best out of his players has been the biggest factor in the success he's achieved everywhere he's been...In 19 full seasons of coaching the teams he's been involved with have averaged 38 victories a year and advanced to the postseason 10 times with two national runner-up finishes. He already is the third-winningest coach in Kentucky history.

Mingione had a brilliant playing career at Embry-Riddle - he ranks 10th on its career hits list - where he helped lead the program to 154 victories and three NAIA World Series appearances in three seasons as an assistant. When he arrived at Kentucky in 2006 he was immediately part of what is still the Cats' only SEC championship club, then smelled success at Mississippi State before returning to the one place he had always wanted to be a head coach - UK. First season, first Super Regional appearance for the Cats.

He made it a point to have his team involved in the community, part of his "Student. Person. Player." guiding principle of the program, participating in numerous philanthropic events in Lexington while also taking time for more than 100 local speaking engagements. In his first season his ethos for the program was on full display as UK players earned SEC Pitcher of the Year, SEC Scholar Athlete of the Year and SEC Community Service Team honors. He recently was named the winner of 2022 Fellowship of Christian Athletes Jerry Kindall Character in Coaching Award.

Mingione became the winngest UK coach during the first three seasons of his tenure with 103 total wins and 39 in SEC play. The success has carried over to the Major League Baseball Draft, where Mingione and his staff's ability to groom players for a professional career has led to 33 players being selected in the past six MLB Drafts. The 21 players selected in the 2017 and 2018 drafts were the most of any program in the country and Mignione has helped mentor two top 20 overall picks in first baseman Evan White (17th, 2017) and left-handed pitcher Zack Thompson (19th, 2019).

Mingione has a sterling reputation as a recruiter. Over the 15 seasons at Kentucky and Mississippi State for which recruiting rankings are final, he has helped land classes with an average ranking of 15th, including top-three classes in 2013-15. He also has an unmatched track record of player development, coaching 86 players selected in the MLB Draft, as well as 46 All-Americans and six conference players of the year. His first recruiting class at Kentucky was ranked in the Top 10 of all the major industry outlets.



KENTUCKY PROUD PARK

Kentucky baseball moved into a new home for the 2019 season, opening the \$49 million Kentucky Proud Park, a state-of-the-art facility immediately considered one of the top facilities in all of college baseball. The Wildcats won their first game in their new home, defeating Eastern Kentucky, 7-3, on Feb. 26, 2019.

The stadium features permanent seating for nearly 2,500 fans with additional space on grass berms to accommodate 5,000 fans for regular season games. Beyond the outfield wall, temporary bleachers can be installed for NCAA Tournament games to bring the seating capacity to more than 7,000. Fan amenities also include suites and a new club area.

The team areas were a priority and give our players and coaches everything they need to compete at a high level in a single location. The facility features a team lounge, locker room, training area, indoor hitting and pitching areas, and coaching offices, as well as a recruiting room. All spaces are either new to UK baseball or significantly larger than previous ones.

The playing surface is the AstroTurf® Rootzone Diamond Blend, which will allow the team to maximize usage in all weather conditions. The pitcher's mound will remain dirt.

The video board that looms large beyond the right-centerfield wall measures 48 feet wide by 30 feet tall. The ballpark playing dimensions are 335-375-400-365-320.

The name is a tribute to farmers and businesses of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and the Big Blue Nation. Kentucky Farm Bureau secured the rights to name the stadium from JMI Sports, UK Athletics' multimedia rights partner. In turn, Kentucky Farm Bureau elected to name the stadium for Kentucky Proud, the state's official agricultural marketing program housed at the Kentucky Department of Agriculture. No state taxpayer dollars were used in funding the agreement. The Kentucky Proud program is funded through the generosity of the Kentucky Agricultural Development Fund. The fund is directed by the Kentucky Agricultural Development Board and administered by the Governor's Office of Agricultural Policy.

New black padding will replace the existing blue look for the 2023 season, including on the outfield fence, dugout railings and behind home plate.




