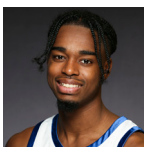

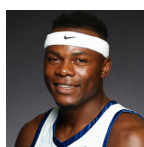

#### NEED TO KNOW

Antonio Reeves was named the SEC Co-Sixth Man of the Year by the coaches. Oscar Tshiebwe was a first-team pick by both the coaches and media. Chris Livingston and Cason Wallace were both tabbed to the All-SEC Freshman Team.

Tshiebwe ranks eighth all-time in program history with 909 total rebounds. Tshiebwe is 49th all-time in program history with 1,084 points. He is third with 47 double-doubles.

Tshiebwe became the first UK player to be tabbed an All-American in back-to-back years since Tayshaun Prince in 2001 and 2002. He is one of just nine UK players ever to be a consensus All-American at least twice.

Reeves scored a career-high 37 points in a win at Arkansas. He became just the eighth player in school history to score at least 37 points in a true road game.

Kentucky is making its nation-leading 60th NCAA Tournament appearance, totaling a 129-53 all-time record.

### Media Information

#### CREDENTIAL REQUESTS

Requests for single-game credentials will open **14** days prior to the deadline date and close **five** days prior to game day online at [sportssystem.com/Kentucky](http://sportssystem.com/Kentucky).

#### CREDENTIAL CRITERIA

The University of Kentucky's decision to issue credentials to a media outlet for the purposes of covering a UK basketball home or away event is determined by a variety of factors. They include the following:

- Priority is given to outlets based on circulation size/household reach/unique site visitors
- Additional consideration is based on amount of original content generated, number of full-time employees of the outlet, length of existence of the outlet and the journalist experience of the reporter(s)
- Attendance at Kentucky media sessions, including Olympic sport opportunities and the intention/ability to cover all 22 sports at Kentucky both at home and on the road, also is considered
- Professionalism, which includes is not limited to conduct at games, press conferences, practices, on social media, etc.

Being granted credentials at another institution/event does not equate to meeting the criteria for the University of Kentucky. Being granted credentials for one UK event does not guarantee approval for other UK events. The University of Kentucky has the right to deny or revoke credentials under its own discretion. Credentialing also is dependent on space availability.

#### INTERVIEW POLICIES-GENERAL

All interviews with University of Kentucky basketball players or staff members must be arranged through the Communications and Public Relations office. Media should never contact a player or coach directly.

The Wildcat Coal Lodge, dormitories, team locker rooms and other team quarters are private team areas. Media members are not permitted in these areas unless accompanied by appropriate university personnel.

#### PRACTICE/PRESS CONFERENCES

Other than announced exceptions, UK basketball practices are closed to the media.

Player interviews are conducted pregame weekly and will be available to all UK media. UK will accept requests for player interviews, but they must be submitted 24 hours prior to the scheduled availability.

Coach John Calipari will meet with members of the media at least once a week in the Memorial Coliseum Media Room.

Game-day shoot-arounds are closed to the media.

#### TELEPHONE PLAYER INTERVIEWS

Telephone interviews are available to the media on a call-back basis. Individual player and coach telephone numbers will not be given to members of the media.

Players are instructed not to conduct interviews when contacted directly by telephone. The Communications and Public Relations office will arrange for telephone interviews at a time most convenient for the student-athlete.

Other special requests are handled on a case-by-case basis.

#### POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Following each game, there is a cooling-off period, during which time the players shower and dress. Approximately 10 minutes after the game ends, Coach Calipari conducts his postgame press conference while a player speaks to the UK Sports Network.

Following Coach Calipari's press conference in the Rupp Arena interview room and the cooling-off period, selected UK players are available in the interview room.

## NCAA Tournament Success under Calipari

UK ranks second in the nation in all-time NCAA Tournament victories with 129, but no team has more wins in the tournament than the Wildcats since 2010, when John Calipari first led the Wildcats into the Big Dance, entering the 2023 tournament:

- 31 - Kentucky, Kansas
- 30 - Duke
- 29 - North Carolina
- 27 - Gonzaga
- 24 - Michigan
- 23 - Villanova
- 22 - Michigan State
- 20 - Syracuse, Wisconsin
- 19 - Florida
- 18 - Baylor
- 16 - Butler, Louisville
- 15 - Ohio State
- 14 - Oregon
- 13 - Connecticut, Virginia

Since Calipari took over the reins at UK, no team has more:

- NCAA Tournament wins (31)
- Final Four appearances (four)
- Elite Eight appearances (seven)
- Sweet 16 appearances (eight)

Kentucky is 31-9 (77.5%) in NCAA Tournament games under the direction of Calipari, surpassing Adolph Rupp (30-18) for most wins by a Kentucky coach. Overall, Calipari is 56-20 (73.7%) as a head coach in NCAA Tournament games.

Calipari, with 56 career NCAA Tournament wins, leads all active head coaches. Bill Self (55) and Tom Izzo (53) are the only other two coaches with at least 50 wins in NCAA Tournament action.

## Tshiebwe Named Consensus Second-Team All-American

Kentucky senior forward Oscar Tshiebwe continues to rewrite Kentucky's history books. The Lubumbashi, Democratic Republic of the Congo native became just the ninth consensus two-time All-American in program history.

He is a consensus second-team selection after earning second-team honors by the Associated Press, the United States Basketball Writers Association and the National Basketball Coaches Association. He was a third-team pick by The Sporting News. Tshiebwe is the first two-time consensus All-American at Kentucky since Kenny Walker.

Tshiebwe joins Forest Sale (1932, 33), Ralph Beard (1947, 48, 49), Alex Groza (1947, 48, 49), Cliff Hagan (1952, 54), Cotton Nash (1962, 63, 64), Louie Dampier (1966, 67), Dani Issel (1969, 70) and Walker (1985, 86) as the only Wildcats to earn the distinguished honor in at least two seasons.

A total of 24 Wildcats have been a two-time All-American in program history, but only nine were consensus selections in at least two seasons.

Tshiebwe leads the Wildcats in scoring (16.5) and rebounds (13.1) for the second-consecutive season. He is the only player in the country averaging at least 15.0 points, 10.0 rebound, 1.5 steals and 1.0 blocks per game in another banner season for the Wildcats.

## Reeves Leads Wildcat SEC Honorees

Headlined by senior guard Antonio Reeves being tabbed the Southeastern Conference Co-Sixth Man of the Year, four members of the Kentucky men's basketball team were honored with post-season honors by the conference's coaches and media. In addition to Reeves' honor, Oscar Tshiebwe was a first-team selection by both the coaches and media, while newcomers Chris Livingston and Cason Wallace were named to the All-Freshman Team by the coaches.

- With Tshiebwe's most-recent honor, head coach John Calipari has now coached 32 players (34 total honors) who have earned All-SEC first- or second-team accolades
- At least one player has been named to the All-SEC Freshman Team in each of Calipari's 14 seasons, including 31 total honors
- Tshiebwe becomes the first Wildcat to earn All-SEC First Team honors in consecutive seasons since Patrick Patterson in 2009 and 2010

## What's Trending over the Last Five Games

A snapshot of what has been trending with the Cats over their

last five games played:

- UK is 3-2 with wins on the road at Florida and at Arkansas, as well as a dominating win at home against Auburn. Both losses are to Vanderbilt who had won 10 of its last 11 games
- Four Wildcats are averaging double-figure points: Antonio Reeves (22.0), Oscar Tshiebwe (19.8), Jacob Toppin (16.2) and Cason Wallace (10.0)
- Kentucky is plus-14.6 on the boards
- Tshiebwe is averaging 13.8 rebounds per game, while Toppin is hauling in 9.6 and Chris Livingston is accounting for 8.0 per game
- Kentucky is shooting 47.3% from the field and averaging 79.0 points per game
- UK's opponents are shooting 35.7% from 3-point range, while Kentucky has connected on 29.8% from 3

## Cats Won 11 of Last 14 in SEC Play

Since the losses at No. 7 Alabama and against South Carolina, Kentucky won 11 of its last 14 conference games:

- UK played shorthanded in the last eight games, with Sahvir Wheeler missing all eight and CJ Fredrick being out for four
- UK achieved a plus-10.8 rebounding margin, including a total of 184-109 on the offensive boards
- Antonio Reeves led the Cats with 17.1 points per game, while Oscar Tshiebwe had 13.3 rebounds and 21 steals
- Jacob Toppin averaged 13.6 points and 7.6 rebounds per game, shot 50.7% (72-142) from the field and 47.8% (11-23) from deep
- Cason Wallace averaged 11.7 points and 4.8 assists per game and shot 90.6% (29-32) from the free-throw line
- As a team, the Cats have shot 75.9% (224-295) from the charity stripe, more than five percent better than their season average

## Battle-Tested Cats Approach Postseason

Kentucky once again has taken on a schedule that will prepare it well for postseason competition. The Wildcats have played a total of 13 games against 10 teams either ranked or receiving votes in the March 5 Associated Press Top 25 poll.

- In conference play, the Cats squared off with No. 4 Alabama, No. 17 Tennessee (2x), No. 18 Texas A&M and No. 25 Missouri, while facing Vanderbilt and Arkansas, two teams receiving votes, twice apiece. In nonconference action, Kentucky played No. 2 UCLA, No. 3 Kansas, No. 9 Gonzaga and Michigan State, which has received votes in the March 5 poll
- In addition, Kentucky has played 11 games against nine opponents currently ranked in the top 30 of the KenPom rankings
- Of the top 25 of the most recent NET rankings, UK has faced seven opponents a total of nine times
- Kentucky has played the most top 10 teams nationally
- Kentucky is one of two teams nationally to play five games against the top eight teams in the NET

## #OscarWorthy Part II

After sweeping every major National Player of the Year honor a season ago, senior Oscar Tshiebwe has continued to add to his collection of hardware in 2022-23. Tshiebwe was named to the All-SEC First Team by both the league's coaches and media before garnering All-America distinction by all four NCAA "recognized" outlets.

Tshiebwe currently leads the Cats in points per game (16.5), rebounds per game (13.1), field-goal percentage (.563) and blocks per game (1.0). He's second in steals per game (1.6).

Additional info about Tshiebwe:

- For the second straight year, he's the nation's leading rebounder
- He is the only player in the country averaging at least 15 points, at least 10 rebounds, at least 1.5 steals per game and at least 1.0 blocks per game
- With 1,517 points and 1,274 boards, Tshiebwe is one of two players nationally to total at least 1,500 points and 1,200 rebounds over the last four seasons, joining North Carolina's Armando Bacot. Tshiebwe has played 26 fewer games than Bacot
- In just 64 games for Kentucky, Tshiebwe ranks eighth all-time in program history with 909 rebounds. He is the fastest player in program history to reach that plateau
- Tshiebwe passed Dan Issel (369) for the most rebounds in a single season by a UK senior in program history. He's pulled down 394 this season
- He has registered a double-double in 47 of 64 career games for the Wildcats, ranking third all-time in program history. Dan

Issel owns the record with 64 over three seasons. Cotton Nash is second (48)

- Tshiebwe has 909 career rebounds as a Wildcat, ranking eighth on the all-time list. Had he played the entirety of his career with the Wildcats, his 1,274 career rebounds would be the most all-time. Issel (1,078) is the UK record holder

- Since the 1985-86 season in NCAA history, Tshiebwe's 1,274 rebounds rank as the 24th-most ever. Kenneth Faried (1,673) has the most all-time

- Since the 1996-97 season, Tshiebwe joins Paul Millsap and Kenneth Faried as the only players to average at least 12 rebounds per contest for their career. Millsap averaged 12.7 per game from 2004-06 at Louisiana Tech, Faried averaged 12.3 from 2008-11 at Morehead State and Tshiebwe has averaged 12.1 from 2020-23 at West Virginia and Kentucky

- Tshiebwe made his season debut at the Champions Classic and played 34 minutes in his first action of the season. Tshiebwe had a team-high 22 points and a game-high 18 rebounds

- In two games in the event (including last year vs. Duke), Tshiebwe averaged 19.5 points and 19.0 rebounds per game

- At Florida, Tshiebwe connected on 12 of 13 (92.3%) of his shots from the floor. That's the best single-game field-goal percentage with at least eight attempts in the last 25 years for the Cats. It's also the best field-goal clip with the most attempts in program history

- Tshiebwe's 37-point, 24-rebound game against Georgia was the fifth such contest of his UK career (at least 22 points and at least 18 rebounds). He now has five of the eight games of 22 or more points and at least 18 rebounds by an SEC player in the last 10 seasons. No other player has more than one and the feat had not been accomplished since South Carolina's Sindarius Thornwell did so against Alabama on Feb. 7, 2017

- Tshiebwe also has tallied six 20-point, 15-rebound games so far this season after seven a season ago. He has 13 of the 55 20-point, 15-rebound contests by SEC players in the last 10 seasons

- Tshiebwe has amassed seven games of at least 20 rebounds in two seasons with the Cats. All UK players combined have totaled seven other 20-rebound games since the 1970-71 season

- He has two 20-20 games this season and three as a Wildcat

- With 10 offensive boards and 10 defensive boards, along with 21 points against Vanderbilt, he registered an "Oscar triple-double" with double-figure points, offensive rebounds and defensive rebounds. He also accomplished the feat Jan. 23 of this season with 37 points, 11 offensive rebounds and 13 defensive boards against Georgia and Dec. 12, 2021 against Robert Morris, when he went for 14 points, 10 offensive boards and 10 defensive rebounds. Tshiebwe has three of the 25 such games in college basketball since the 1996-97 season. Utah Valley's Fardaws Aimaq is the only other Division I player with more than one

- With 1,084 points scored as a UK player, he ranks 49th all-time in the program's record books

Tshiebwe put together a performance for the ages in a come-from-behind win over Georgia on Jan. 17. He poured in a career-high 37 points and added 24 rebounds. More about that historic performance:

- The last Wildcat with a 35-point, 20-rebound game was Mike Phillips, who had 35-20 vs. LSU on Feb. 2, 1976

- It was the the fifth 35-20 game in UK history, also Phillips (listed above), Dan Issel (36-29 vs. LSU on Feb. 22, 1969), Cotton Nash (34-20 vs. Tulane on Jan. 11, 1964) and Bill Spivey (40-34 vs. Xavier on Feb. 13, 1951)

- Per ESPN, Tshiebwe's 24 rebounds were the most for a Division I player with a 35-point game in the last 25 seasons

- Per ESPN, Tshiebwe's 24 rebounds were the most in a 35-point performance in the last 25 seasons. UNC's Brice Johnson had 23 in 2016, Oklahoma's Blake Griffin had 23 in 2009 and Texas' Kevin Durant had 23 in 2007

- Tshiebwe (24) and teammate Jacob Toppin (11) combined for more rebounds (35) than Georgia's entire team (31)

- He became just the third player in program history to have multiple games of at least 24 rebounds, joining Dan Issel and Cotton Nash as the only others to do so

- It was the fourth 30-point game of his career

- The 37-point game tied Malik Monk vs. Georgia (1/31/17) for most points in an SEC game and the third-most point in any contest in the Calipari era

### Wallace Another UK Freshman Sensation

With a maturity well beyond his years and a calm and cool approach to the game, Cason Wallace has solidified himself as one of the best first-year players in the country.

- Wallace ranks fourth in the SEC and 42nd nationally with 1.97 steals per game
- Wallace ranks fourth (2.03) in assist-to-turnover ratio in the league and second (4.2) in assists per game
- He's induced at least one steal in all but three games (one being against South Carolina where he exited with a back injury eight minutes into the game and a second against Vanderbilt when he was limited to just one minute in the second half), and has multiple steals in 16 games thus far
- Wallace tied the UK single-game record with eight steals against Michigan State. Ashton Hagans (vs. North Carolina on Dec. 22, 2018), Rajon Rondo (vs. Mississippi State on Feb. 19, 2005) and Wayne Turner (vs. George Washington on Nov. 24, 1997) are the others to turn the trick
- Wallace recorded the second-most assists (9) in a UK freshman debut against Howard, while becoming the first UK freshman in school history to have at least 15 points, eight rebounds, and nine assists in a collegiate debut
- Wallace was one of only two freshmen to accomplish the season-opening feat since the 2010-11 season, joining Lonzo Ball, who went for 19 points, 11 assists, eight rebounds and two steals in a 119-80 win over Pacific on Nov. 11, 2016
- With 11 assists at Mississippi State, he recorded the second most by a UK freshman in a true road game. Dirk Minniefield (13) at Mississippi State on Jan. 23, 1980 owns the record
- He ranks ninth all-time in UK single-season history for a freshman with 127 assists.
- With 59 steals on the season, only Ashton Hagans (61), Shai Gilgeous-Alexander (61), John Wall (66) and Rajon Rondo (87) have generated more steals as a freshman in UK history
- He's a three-time SEC Freshman of the Week honoree

## Wallace is Evolving into Mr. Clutch

Cason Wallace has proved to be a player the Wildcats can rely on in the clutch. In games within five or fewer points with less than five minutes to play, Wallace has been a go-to type for the Cats. Consider:

- vs. Michigan State: 5 points (2-2 FG, 1-1 3PT, 2-4 FT); 2 rebounds, 1 steal
- vs. Michigan: 3 points (1-1 FG, 1-1 3PT, 0-2 FT)
- vs. LSU: 2 points (1-1 FG); 1 assist
- vs. Tennessee: 1 rebound, 2 assists
- vs. Texas A&M: 2 points (1-1 FG)
- vs. Florida: 7 points (2-2 FG, 1-1 3PT, 2-2 FT); 1 rebound, 1 assist

## Super Sixth Man: Antonio Reeves

Senior Antonio Reeves came to Kentucky after ranking among the nation's top 20 in points per game (20.1) a season ago. He showed flashes of his ability to put the ball in the basket after leading the team in scoring during its foreign tour this summer and knocking down six 3-pointers in his debut against Howard. However, Reeves has become a clutch player for the Cats and made an immediate impact off the bench.

- Reeves has reached double-figure scoring in 16 of the last 18 games. Over the final 17-games of the regular season, he led the team with 16.6 points per game. He drained 40 3-pointers and is shot 45.2% from the floor, 41.7% from behind the arc and 83.3% from the foul line
- He poured in a career-high 37 points, connecting on 11 of 11 free throws, also marking career bests in a win at Arkansas. The 37-point game tied for the third-most points scored by a Wildcat in the Calipari era and the most in a true road game under Calipari
- He scored 27 points and made a season-high-tying six 3-pointers at Ole Miss. He was 8 of 12 from the field, 5 of 6 from 3-point range and a perfect 5 for 5 at the line

- His clutch play down the stretch has paid dividends for the Cats. Reeves scored 10 points over the final eight minutes against Tennessee and seven against Texas A&M. At Ole Miss with UK clinging to a 35-34 lead and 16:58 to play, Reeves scored 11 of UK's next 13 points over a 3:34 span to give the Wildcats a cushion they would not surrender at seven points with 13:24 to go. He scored the team's first 11 points of the second half to help pull away from the Razorbacks
- Reeves' 12.9 points per game in 20 contests off the bench rank second nationally among players who have made at least 20 appearances as a reserve
- He has four 20-plus-point performances off the bench. That's the most for any player in John Calipari's tenure
- With 74 made 3s on the year, Reeves is tied for 16th in single-season program history

## JT Having the Top(pin) Season of His Career

Jacob Toppin has steadily improved in each of his four seasons as a collegiate basketball player, but in his third year under John Calipari he has taken a major leap.

- Through just 19 games, he had already set career highs in points scored, rebounds, assists, minutes played, field-goals and free-throws made for a season
- Toppin had never recorded a double-double during his first three seasons in college - he has eight this season thus far. UK is 7-1 when he registers a double-double
- The senior has set single-game highs in points (24 vs. Louisville) and rebounds (12 vs. Auburn)
- Toppin has scored in double-figures in 16 of the last 19 games played. He's also registered 13 games of at least five rebounds over his last 19 played
- Over a 12-game stretch where he reached double-figure scoring in every game Jan. 17-Feb. 25, Toppin averaged 14.3 points, 7.4 rebounds and 2.8 assists per game. He shot 53.0% from the floor and 50.0% from distance
- Toppin shot 50.0% (13-26) from 3-point range in SEC action

## Floor General Wheeler

Sahvir Wheeler has paced the Southeastern Conference in assists per game in each of his last two seasons. Prior to a right ankle injury suffered prior to UK's first meeting with Arkansas and a medical procedure that is expected to keep him out at least an additional 1-2 weeks, Wheeler was leading the league with 5.6 dimes per game this season. A Bob Cousy Award finalist a season ago, Wheeler was serving the Wildcats as one of the best floor generals in the country.

- Wheeler generated two games with 10 or more, seven with eight or more and 13 with five or more thus far
- With 656 total assists in his career at Georgia and Kentucky, Wheeler is fifth all-time in SEC history in the category. He trails only Terry Coner (664), Johnny Darden (715), Kareem Reid (749) and Sean Tuohy (830)
- A season after becoming just the fourth player in program history to amass at least 200 assists in a season, Wheeler is moving up the career charts as well. In just 51 games with the Wildcats, Wheeler ranks 14th in program history with 324 dimes

## Injury Bug a Story with the Cats

A season after playing just 17 games at full strength, the Wildcats are once again dealing with a multitude of injuries. Kentucky has played 13 of 32 games at full strength.

- **Daimion Collins:** Missed the Tennessee game with a left foot injury
- **CJ Fredrick:** Exited the Missouri game with a right-hand injury after playing four minutes.

## The Winner is ... Kentucky!

After helping Kentucky to wins at Florida and at home against Auburn, senior forward Oscar Tshiebwe took home Southeastern Conference Player of the Week laurels, the conference office announced Feb. 27. In addition, Tshiebwe garnered Oscar Robertson National Player of the Week honors Feb. 28, marking his second time earning the award in his career. Tshiebwe averaged 23.5 points per game and shot 87% (20-23) from the field in the two victories.

Tshiebwe went for a game-high 25 points, four boards and three assists against Florida. He then totaled 22 points and 17 rebounds to go along with a pair of steals in the dominating win over Auburn. Tshiebwe's 92.3% field-goal percentage against Florida was the best field-goal clip with at least 13 attempts in program history, and the fourth-best with a minimum of eight attempts. The 25-point performance at Florida was his third game this season with at least 25 points in a game and the 10th of his career. Tshiebwe also became the 61st player in program history to amass 1,000 points in a career as a Wildcat. He then generated his 16th double-double of the season with 22 points and 17 rebounds against Auburn.

The award is the sixth weekly SEC honor for a Wildcat this season. Tshiebwe previously earned SEC Player of the Week honors on Jan. 23, while Cason Wallace has garnered SEC Freshman of the Week honors three times this season and Chris Livingston was the Freshman of the Week just a week ago.

Kentucky has dominated the weekly SEC awards with John Calipari at the helm. UK has won more weekly SEC honors (125) than any other school during the Calipari era, including 94 SEC Freshman of the Week awards and 31 SEC Player of the Week honors.

## Always Efficient

## CJ Fredrick Named to SEC Community Service Team

Kentucky men's basketball senior CJ Fredrick was named to the Southeastern Conference's Men's Basketball Community Service team. Fredrick is UK's representative on the 14-man team that honors players' exemplary service to their communities.

This marks the 25th year for the SEC Community Service Team for men's basketball. All 21 league-sponsored sports have had a Community Service Team since 2004. The team honors student-athletes beyond the court for their on-going efforts in the community.

- Fredrick was instrumental in the development of the telethon and open practice that raised more than \$3 million in funding for those affected by devastating flooding in eastern Kentucky this summer. Furthermore, he was a participant in the telethon in 2021 that raised money for victims of tornadoes that hit the western part of the state
- In addition to those major projects, Fredrick has worked with God's Pantry in packing food and delivering lunches to local schools, visited Kentucky Children's hospitals and Fayette County schools alongside his teammates. Fredrick has twice served meals at Thanksgiving at the Salvation Army and participated with the team in serving dinner and singing Christmas carols for families
- Fredrick and the Wildcats have twice worked with Samaritan's Feet which entails washing the feet of our youth and then distributing new shoes. He has also visited a Fort Knox school and St. Elizabeth Healthcare in northern Kentucky

## S-E-C! S-E-C! S-E-C!

Kentucky is the Southeastern Conference's gold standard. Since the SEC's inception in 1932-33, the Wildcats are the most dominant team in the league, recording a 1,046-303 mark (77.5%) in regular-season conference play. Only Alabama has won more than 800 regular-season SEC games and no other team owns a better winning percentage.

- UK has averaged 11.6 wins and only 3.3 losses per season in 90 seasons in the SEC
- Kentucky has won 49 SEC regular-season titles and 31 SEC Tournament championships
- Kentucky is 11-3 in the opening game of the SEC season under John Calipari and 13-1 in the first home league opener. UK is 69-20 all-time in SEC openers
- The Wildcats have won 16 of the last 29 SEC Tournaments (the 2020 one was not played because of the COVID-19 pandemic)
- UK has captured at least a share of six of the last 14 SEC regular-season championships under John Calipari
- Kentucky has played in the championship game of the SEC Tournament in eight of Calipari's 12 tourneys, winning six times (2020 tour-

- UK won its 1,000th game in SEC regular-season action vs. Alabama on Jan. 11, 2020. Kansas has won 1,000 conference games when combining its records in the Big 6, Big 7, Big 8 and Big 12, but no other team in the country had won 1,000 or more regular-season league games in one conference alone
- Six teams made the 2022 NCAA Tournament field with Arkansas reaching the Elite Eight
- The SEC has had 27 NCAA Tournament selections over the last four tournaments, the third most. Only the Big 10 (30) and Atlantic Coast Conference (28) have had more
- The SEC went 5-6 in NCAA Tournament games in 2022. SEC teams are 78-49 (61.4%) in the NCAA tourney since 2012
- The league has advanced at least one team to the Elite Eight in 10 of the last 12 tournaments and nine different SEC teams have advanced to the Sweet Sixteen in the last five NCAA Tournaments
- Four SEC teams (No. 1 Alabama, No. 17 Texas A&M, No. 20 Tennessee and No. 23 Missouri) are ranked in the Mach 13 Associated Press Top 25, with Kentucky receiving votes

## Calipari Leading the Way in SEC Play

John Calipari leads the way among all current SEC head coaches in 2022-23 in career wins, league victories and titles. He is also ascending the all-time charts in league history:

- Calipari owns 386 victories as UK's head coach, ranking as the fourth-most wins by a coach leading an SEC program in the conference's history. Adolph Rupp (875), Billy Donovan (467) and Dale Brown (448) are the only others who have more
- Calipari is fifth all-time in SEC regular-season wins with 185. Rupp (397) has the most. C.M. Newton is fourth with 195. Donovan (200) and Brown (238) are the others head of Calipari
- Calipari is 24-7 in the SEC Tournament. His 24 victories are tied with Tubby Smith for the third-most in tournament history. Only Donovan (27) and Wimp Sanderson (25) have more
- Calipari has won six SEC Tournament titles. Only Alabama (8) has more in program history than Calipari has won in total
- From his time at UMass, Calipari ranks ninth in total wins (193) and eighth in wins in Atlantic 10 regular-season play (91). In his time at Memphis, Calipari accumulated the second-most total victories (252) and the most regular-season wins (133) in Conference USA history

## Cats Don't Count on the 3

Kentucky has never been reliant on the 3 under John Calipari. Kentucky is averaging 25.5% of its points from distance while 30.1% of its field-goal attempts are from 3-point range.

The highest percentage of 3-point shots taken under Calipari was the 2010-11 Final Four team that lofted 32.4% of its shots from beyond the arc. That team is also Calipari's top 3-point shooting team at Kentucky. The most attempts per game in the Calipari era was the 2016-17 squad that took 19.89 3-point shots per game. This team is averaging 18.03 attempts per game thus far.

Not relying on the 3 certainly hasn't hurt the Wildcats. UK is 10-3 all-time under Calipari when making one or fewer from long range.

## Five Wildcats on Pace to Graduate in Spring

John Calipari has graduated 100% of the players (25 of 25) who have been eligible to receive their diploma by the end of their senior years and exhausted their athletic eligibility.

That number will add by four with five graduating in the spring of 2023. CJ Fredrick (community and leadership development), Jacob Toppin (communication), Oscar Tshiebwe (communication) and Sahvir Wheeler (communication) are all on pace to earn their undergraduate degrees in May of 2023. Brennan Canada, who graduated in three years, is slated to earn a graduate certificate this spring.

## Similar Stories ...

In 14 years as head coach of the Wildcats, John Calipari has won a national title, claimed six Southeastern Conference regular-season crowns, six league tournament titles and won more NCAA tournament games than any other coach during this span. He's also led teams plagued by slow starts to memorable late-season runs:

- The 2020 squad suffered a home loss to Evansville in November, lost back-to-back games in Las Vegas prior to Christmas and fell to 16-5 on Feb. 1 with a loss at Auburn. The Wildcats would then rattle off eight straight wins and nine of their last 10 to win the SEC regular-season by a comfortable margin of three games. COVID-19's rise in the United States canceled the SEC and NCAA Tournaments
- In 2018, the Wildcats lost four in a row from Feb. 3-14, marking the first four-game losing streak during Calipari's UK tenure. That team went on to win nine of its next 10 games and captured the SEC Tournament title
- The 2017 squad lost three of four games from Jan. 24-Feb. 4 before rattling off 14 straight victories. Within that run, the Wildcats won the SEC Tournament title and marched all the way to the Elite Eight before a buzzer-beater by eventual champion North Carolina ended

• In 2014, the freshman class was heralded as the best ever and preseason expectations had fans dreaming of a 40-0 season. However, that team dropped nine regular-season games before putting together one of the most magical NCAA Tournament runs in program history. The Cats overcame double-digit deficits in all but one game and were led by late-game heroics from Aaron Harrison all the way to the NCAA Championship game

## Cats Deliver the Knockout Punch

Kentucky is 328-14 (95.6%) in the John Calipari era when leading by at least 10 points at any time in the contest. Eleven of the 14 losses in the Calipari era are to conference opponents, including a loss to Vanderbilt in the SEC Tournament.

Perhaps most impressive of all is that 68.7% of games Calipari has coached in at Kentucky have produced 10-point leads at some point during the game for UK. The Wildcats have led by 10 points or more in a whopping 85.0% of Calipari's 386 career wins at Kentucky.

## Hold Them to 55 Points, 40%

Defense has always been a recipe for success for the Wildcats under John Calipari. The special ingredient: 55 points. Kentucky is a perfect 88-0 under Calipari when holding the opponent to 55 points or fewer, including 5-0 this season after limiting Duquesne to 52 points, Bellarmine to 41, Vanderbilt on the road to 53 points, Tennessee at home to 54 points and Auburn to 54 points.

The Wildcats are 213-10 (95.5%) under Calipari when limiting the opponent to 63 points or less, including 11-1 this season. Kentucky also fares well when it keeps the competition to 40% or less from the floor. UK is 232-24 (90.6%) vs. opponents under Calipari when their field-goal percentage is 40% or less.

## Cleaning the Glass

Kentucky was one of the top teams in the country on the boards a season ago. With the nation's best rebounder in Oscar Tshiebwe back again, UK is again one of the nation's best on the boards. Tshiebwe leads in the country in rebounds per game (13.1) in 2022-23. Entering the NCAA Tournament, UK was logging 38.97 boards per game which ranked as the 16th-best mark in the nation. UK was plus-8.8 in rebound margin to rank third nationally and tops in the SEC.

- UK is averaging 13.59 offensive boards per outing, ranking fourth in the country
- Tshiebwe is first in the nation with 5.47 offensive rebounds per game and ranks seventh with 7.67 defensive boards per contest
- Over UK's last 14 regular-season SEC games (since South Carolina), UK is outrebounding opponents by a plus-10.8 margin

## Ulis Returns to Kentucky

Tyler Ulis was one of the most accomplished players in UK program history from 2015-16. He was an All-American and Bob Cousy Award winner in 2016. He was also a part of a team

## Wildcats Ink Five for 2023

Kentucky men's basketball head coach John Calipari announced the signing of five standout student-athletes to the program's 2023 signing class on Nov. 14. Aaron Bradshaw, Robert Dillingham, Justin Edwards, Reed Sheppard and D.J. Wagner each inked national letters of intent with UK during the fall signing period.

Bradshaw, Edwards, Sheppard and Wagner were all tabbed to the 2023 McDonald's All American Game on Jan. 24. UK has now had 44 "burger boys" sign out of high school with John Calipari. All-time UK has amassed 76 McDonald's All Americans.

In every season but two of the Calipari era, the Wildcats have signed a top-three recruiting class according to the Recruiting Services Consensus Index, which tallies major recruiting rankings and plugs them into a formula to calculate a consensus ranking. With the additions, Kentucky has signed 71 top-50 recruits, 56 top-25 players and 31 top-10 players (according to Rivals) in what will now be Calipari's 15 recruiting classes at Kentucky.

Wildcats continue to give back to those in need.

- Dating back to his time at Memphis, John Calipari has worked with local businesses to partner and help families (usually around 10-12 families) in need for the holidays. Families are identified by local leaders and are uplifted with gifts, gift cards, food for the holidays and even rent checks. UK players helped host a reception with a holiday meal and Christmas carols sung on Dec. 18 to continue Calipari's tradition
- Kentucky spent Thanksgiving serving lunch to people in need alongside the Salvation Army
- All ticket revenue from the Cats' annual Blue-White Game, more than \$160,000, went to Team Eastern Kentucky Flood Relief for those impacted by the devastating floods this summer. The team also participated in multiple community service activities in the area prior to the exhibition held in Pikeville, Kentucky
- Kentucky's men's and women's basketball team partnered with the Mamba and Mambacita Foundation to host a youth skills academy for underprivileged local boys and girls
- In partnership with Samaritan's Feet, coach John Calipari and several other Kentucky coaches handed out 10,000 pairs of shoes in eastern Kentucky in August. The Cats also spent a morning with the organization on their trip to the Bahamas, washing feet and delivering shoes to those in need
- In August, Kentucky's open practice in conjunction with a telethon hosted by Joe and Kelly Craft, LEX 18, the American Red Cross and Rupp Arena for Kentucky Flood Relief, raised more than \$2 million for flood relief
- Calipari and the Wildcats traveled to five cities throughout the state this summer in conjunction with Kroger to raise funds for Kentuckians affected by the tornadoes that ravaged the state in December of 2021

## Big-Game Cal, Cats

Some notes about Cal's teams against the best of the best:

- Not only does Kentucky own a 69-48 record (58.9%) vs. Associated Press Top 25 teams under John Calipari, UK is 7-5 when both teams are ranked in the AP top five
- All-time, Calipari is 13-9 when both teams are ranked in the AP top five
- When both teams are ranked in the AP Top 25, Calipari's all-time record is 89-66, including a 58-38 mark at Kentucky
- When both are ranked in the top 10 he has a 27-22 record, including 16-15 at UK
- By defeating top-ranked Michigan State to start the 2019-20 season, UK knocked off the No. 1 team in consecutive seasons for the first time in school history. Kentucky downed Tennessee on Feb. 19, 2019
- With the win over MSU to begin 2019-20, the Wildcats have nine victories over the No. 1 team in 25 tries in program history
- Calipari improved to 6-4 vs. the No. 1 team in his career with the win vs. Michigan State, including 3-2 at Kentucky. According to ESPN, Calipari is the only coach with a winning (.600) percentage against No. 1 ranked teams with a minimum of 10 games faced against the No. 1

## Taking Care of Business

Kentucky's 69-48 record vs. opponents ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 in John Calipari's tenure is impressive, but the Wildcats' ability to beat all-comers can't be overlooked. Under Calipari, UK is 317-64 vs. unranked competition, 83.2%.

## Big Blue Wins on the Road

Kentucky's 63-56 win on the road at No. 5 Tennessee on Jan. 14 was not only much needed for this team, but historic as well.

- Was the first in program history over an Associated Press Top 5 team on the road, while a UK team was unranked
- Kentucky outrebounded the Volunteers by 20 and limited the Vols to just four offensive rebounds. Tennessee entered the matchup as the nation's best offensive rebounding team
- UK's 88.1% free-throw percentage (22-25) was the third-best in a true road game under Calipari with a minimum of 25 attempts
- Kentucky moved to 5-1 against Tennessee on the road when the Wildcats are unranked and the Volunteers are ranked
- The 56 points scored by UT marked the second-fewest ever allowed by an unranked Kentucky team against a top-five team in the AP poll (UK allowed 45 points to No. 2 Michigan State on Dec. 16, 2000)

Kentucky then earned a 69-53 win at Vanderbilt on Jan. 24 in its next game away from home.

- It was Kentucky's 78th game played at Memorial Gymnasium (69

- Kentucky has now won 14 straight in the series
- UK limited the Commodores to just 53 points, 20 points below its season scoring average
- When Vanderbilt missed a free throw with 3:10 remaining, it marked the first time in two games that an opponent missed a foul shot after Texas A&M and VU had combined to make 25 in a row
- Kentucky made only one trip to the foul line, making 1 of 2 attempts, both of which are the lowest numbers of the Calipari era – actually by significant margins, as the previous lows were three made on two occasions and six attempts on two occasions

## **Historic Opener**

With a 95-63 win over Howard to open the 2022-23 campaign, a few Wildcats set records along the way.

- Cason Wallace recorded the second-most assists in a UK freshman debut, while becoming the first UK freshman in school history to have at least 15 points, eight rebounds, and nine assists in a collegiate debut
- Wallace was one of only two freshmen to accomplish the season-opening feat since the 2010-11 season, joining Lonzo Ball, who went for 19 points, 11 assists, eight rebounds and two steals in a 119-80 win over Pacific on Nov. 11, 2016
- Antonio Reeves sunk a game-high six 3-pointers, which is a record for any UK player in his debut with the Cats
- Lance Ware totaled four steals, the most in a Kentucky season-opener since Kevin Knox and Shai Gilgeous-Alexander each had four in a 73-63 win over Utah Valley Nov. 10, 2017

## **Road Warriors**

Kentucky has once again played one of the toughest schedules in the country on the court, but it has also been perhaps the most grueling travel schedule in John Calipari's tenure. Kentucky played four nonconference games away from home in the first five weeks of the season totaling more than 14,138 miles traveled.

- Kentucky took on Michigan State in Indianapolis, traveling 376 miles round trip
- The Cats then played a road contest at Gonzaga. That trip consisted of a five-hour flight each direction and 4,328 total miles traveled
- UK played in the inaugural Hall of Fame Classic in London, England to end November. That round trip consisted of 8,016 miles
- Kentucky finished its nonconference travel with a date in Madison Square Garden for the CBS Sports Classic and a game vs. UCLA. The roundtrip mileage was 1,418 for that contest
- Things didn't get easier for the Cats, as UK opened its SEC slate on the road at Missouri, spanning 921 miles
- This particular group of Cats also spent time at Baha Mar Resort in The Bahamas this summer (1,976 miles) and played its Blue-White Game in Pikeville, Kentucky (287 miles) before the season ever began

## **#OscarWorthy: National Player of the Year Returns for Encore**

Oscar Tshiebwe achieved something no player in Kentucky basketball history had ever done before. He was voted as the unanimous National Player of the Year in 2021-22, winning all six major honors: The Sporting News, The Associated Press, USBWA Oscar Robertson Award, NABC, Wooden Award and the Naismith Award. More on Tshiebwe's record-setting 2021-22 campaign:

- Unanimous First-Team All-America selection
- Southeastern Conference Player of the Year
- First-team All-SEC (coaches and media)
- SEC All-Defensive Team (coaches)
- UK single-season record 28 double-doubles
- Team-high 17.4 points and nation-leading 15.1 rebounds per game
- Five games with 20 or more rebounds
- Had 515 boards, the third-most in UK single-season history
- Became the first major-conference player since Bill Walton in 1973 to average at least 15 points and at least 15 rebounds
- Set a Rupp Arena record with 28 rebounds against Western Kentucky
- Became a 1,000-point collegiate scorer

## **Four Wildcats Participate in NBA All-Star Game**

Four Kentucky men's basketball alumni in Bam Adebayo, De'Aaron Fox, Shai Gilgeous-Alexander and Julius Randle were named to the 2023 NBA All-Star Game on Feb. 19 in Salt Lake City. Adebayo and Randle made their second-career appearances, while Fox and Gilgeous-Alexander were selected for the first time.

Adebayo and Gilgeous-Alexander were a part Team Giannis which defeated Team LeBron with Randle and Fox by a 184-175 score. Gilgeous-Alexander had nine points and seven assists. Adebayo logged four points in the win. Randle scored 11, while Fox added a pair of assists.

- Among all active collegiate coaches, John Calipari has more total players (10) and more total All-Star selections (32) than any other coach
- Adebayo made his second-career appearance in the NBA All-Star Game in 2023. In one season with the Wildcats, Adebayo was the only player to start all 38 games for a squad that won the SEC Tournament and advanced to the Elite Eight. He was an All-SEC Second Team and All-SEC Freshman Team honoree. Adebayo averaged 13.0 points, 8.0 rebounds and 1.5 blocks per game before being selected 14th overall by the Heat in 2017
- Fox made his first All-Star Game appearance. Part of the Wildcats' march to the Elite Eight and a 2017 Southeastern Conference Tournament title, Fox was an All-SEC First Team selection and was the SEC Tournament MVP. He also is one of just three players in program

history to record a triple-double. Fox averaged 16.7 points and 4.6 assists per game for the Wildcats before being selected fifth overall by the Kings in 2017.

- Gilgeous-Alexander made his first-career appearance in the annual game featuring the league's best players. He averaged 14.4 points per game and 5.1 assists for the Wildcats during the 2017-18 season. Gilgeous-Alexander helped the Wildcats to an SEC Tournament crown and was MVP. Additionally, he was an All-SEC Second Team and All-SEC Freshman Team honoree. He was then drafted 11th overall by the Hornets before his draft rights were traded to the Clippers
- Randle made his second appearance in the NBA All-Star Game. One of just three players under Calipari to average a double-double, Randle was the leader of the UK squad that made its memorable NCAA Tournament run to the championship game in 2014. He averaged 15.0 points and 10.4 rebounds per game. He was a Final Four All-Tournament Team honoree, a Midwest Region All-Tournament Team selection, a third-team All-American, an All-SEC First Team pick and the SEC Freshman of the Year. Randle was drafted seventh overall by the Lakers following his one season in Kentucky in 2014

## **UK Leads with 27 on NBA Opening-Day Rosters**

Kentucky men's basketball's ability to develop and prepare players for the next step continues to manifest itself as 27 former Wildcat student-athletes appeared on NBA opening-day rosters. Kentucky led the nation for the 11th consecutive season with the most alumni on opening-day rosters.

- The total of 27 players on NBA opening-day rosters (including two-way and inactive players) that played and finished their college basketball careers at Kentucky is more than any other college program in the country. Duke, with 24, is the only other school with more than 20 players in the NBA.
- Of the 17 NBA franchises featuring a Wildcat, eight have multiple Kentucky players. Detroit and Sacramento each have a trio of Wildcats on their roster while the Clippers, Lakers, Heat, Knicks, Hornets and Trail Blazers each have two.
- In 13 seasons under head coach John Calipari, 45 players have been selected in the NBA Draft, including 34 first-round selections and three No. 1 overall picks (Anthony Davis, Karl-Anthony Towns and John Wall)
- Calipari has a streak of 15 consecutive drafts with a first-round pick dating back to his time at Memphis
- Calipari is one of only two coaches in the history of the sport to have four players drafted No. 1 overall (Derrick Rose – 2008, Wall – 2010, Davis – 2012, Towns – 2015)
- Using figures compiled by basketball-reference.com and spotrac.com, Calipari-coached players have amassed more than \$3.5 billion in career NBA contracts
- In the 13 seasons Calipari has been the head coach at Kentucky, his players have totaled nearly \$3 billion in NBA contracts. In the 2022-23 season alone, former UK players are slated to make nearly \$330 million

## Vanderbilt 80, Kentucky 73

When asked earlier this season if he saw a correlation between his best games and his Kentucky team playing well, Jacob Toppin deflected the question and said it was a team game. However, the numbers tell a bit of a different story.

Seven times during the regular season, Toppin recorded a double-double in points and rebounds. And UK won all seven of those games.

On Friday night, in the quarterfinals of the Southeastern Conference Tournament, Toppin did it again. However, the Cats were not able to win on this occasion, falling to Vanderbilt 80-73 at Bridgestone Arena in Nashville.

Toppin had 21 points and 11 rebounds and he had plenty of support. Antonio Reeves had 22 points before fouling out and Oscar Tshiebwe had 19 points and 15 rebounds.

Vanderbilt's shooting, both from long-range and from the free throw line, was the difference in this game. The 'Dores made 10 of 25 from three-point land, and made 18 of 20 at the free throw line. Kentucky made 6 of 25 from deep and just 11 of 20 at the charity stripe.

Kentucky appeared ready to pull away in this game early. After trailing 4-2, the Cats went on a 12-0 run, capped by a pair of threes from Reeves, to lead 14-4. But, in what would be a half of runs by each team, Vandy responded by scoring eight straight. UK then scored five in a row before the 'Dores answered with an 8-2 stretch.

Later in the first, Kentucky scored six in a row to lead 34-27 with 3:04 to play in the half. But the Cats would fail to score for the rest of the half, while Vandy scored 12 straight to take a 39-34 advantage into the half.

That run continued into the second half, with Vanderbilt eventually taking an 11-point lead, 49-38. That was the end of a 22-4 run.

Later in the second half, Vandy would hold a 63-52 lead with 9:09 to play. With the game in the balance, the Cats answered with an 8-0 run to get within three, 63-60. Kentucky would never get back within three again.

### Game Notes

- Kentucky is now 135-29 all-time in the SEC Tournament.
- UK won the rebounding 43-26, leading to a 20-4 advantage in second-chance points.
- UK is 21-6 this season when winning the rebounding.
- Kentucky led by as many as 10 points. UK is 328-14 (95.9%) under John Calipari when leading by at least 10 points at some time during the game.
- UK had two 20-point scorers for the seventh time this season. UK is 5-2 in those games.
- UK had two players with double-doubles. It is the fifth time this season, UK is 4-1 in those games.
- Antonio Reeves had 22 points, his ninth 20-point game of the season.
- Jacob Toppin had 21 points and 11 rebounds, his eighth double-double of the season. This was UK's first loss of the season when he had a double-double.
- He has scored double figures in 14 of the last 15 games.
- Oscar Tshiebwe collected 19 points and 15 rebounds.
- This is his 19th double-double of the season and 47th in 64 games at Kentucky.
- Cason Wallace returned from injury and played 37 minutes, totaling seven points, four rebounds and five assists.

## Cats Rock at Rupp

The Wildcats are 647-81 (88.9%) in Rupp Arena. Among the most notable marks of dominance as the nation's toughest venue to play include:

- School record 54-game winning streak to begin the John Calipari era
- Kentucky is 351-49 (87.8%) in regular-season SEC games in Rupp
- The Wildcats set a program home record of 19 wins in 2014-15
- UK has gone undefeated at home in six of Calipari's 14 seasons
- Kentucky has a perfect mark in 14 of Rupp Arena's 46 seasons

## 600 Wins at Rupp in Record Time

With a victory over Fairleigh Dickinson on Dec. 7, 2019, Kentucky reached the 600-win mark at Rupp Arena faster than any other program in NCAA Division I level history. UK needed just 670 games to reach win No. 600 in Rupp Arena.

It took UCLA, which previously owned the fastest pace to 600 wins, 689 games in Pauley Pavilion. Only one other team, Kansas, achieved win No. 600 in fewer than 700 games at its home venue. The Jayhawks reached the significant win in their 699th game.

## Cal Owns Longest Win Streaks in Rupp

With UK's 2011-12 season-opening victory over Marist, UK head coach John Calipari recorded his 34th consecutive win in Rupp Arena as UK's head coach. It broke former UK head coach Rick Pitino's longest streak of 33 games in the venue.

The winning streak reached as long as 54 games. Calipari didn't suffer his first loss in Rupp Arena until losing to Baylor in his fourth season, in 2012-13. The 54-game run, however, was his longest career home winning streak. He also had the second-longest streak in the arena as the Cats won 42 straight from March 4, 2014 to Nov. 25, 2016.

## New Chairbacks, Fewer Seats

After receiving a \$16 million upgrade over the 2014-15 and 2015-16 seasons that enhanced the fan experience with the likes of a new Daktronics center-hung scoreboard, ribbons boards, new corner video boards and a new audio system, Rupp Arena is undergoing an additional transformation as a part of UK's new leasing agreement with the Lexington Center.

Chair-back seating in the upper-level sideline was installed in sections 211-217 and 228-234 for the 2019-20 season. Club areas are available to season ticket holders.

The new seating reduced Rupp Arena's capacity to 20,500.

## Pack the House

Until reducing capacity for the 2019-20 season, Kentucky had led the nation in average home attendance in 20 of 24 seasons. That number included a Rupp Arena record of 24,110 in John Calipari's first season (2009-10) as head coach and averaging more than 23,000 in seven of Calipari's first 10 seasons.

Kentucky averaged 19,873 in 18 home games in 2022-23.

## The Top-Ranked Team at Home

Kentucky has lost just four times at home as the Associated Press top-ranked team in the history of the program and just three times in Rupp Arena. Prior to the losses to Evansville (Nov. 12, 2019) and UCLA (Dec. 3, 2016), the other two losses came by just one point.

The Wildcats are 54-3 all-time as the AP No. 1 team in Rupp Arena since its opening in 1976. The first loss was to Auburn, 53-52, on Jan. 9, 1988.

## Coach Cal in Rupp Arena

It's been downright difficult to beat Kentucky in Rupp Arena during the John Calipari era. UK is 220-21 (91.3%) in Rupp Arena under Calipari.

- Kentucky is 25-7 (78.1%) vs. Associated Press Top 25 opponents in Rupp in the Calipari era
- UK is 195-14 (93.3%) vs. AP unranked teams in Rupp under Calipari
- The Wildcats are 111-7 (94.1%) at home vs. nonconference foes under Calipari
- Calipari notched his 100th career win in Rupp Arena as Kentucky's coach with the Wildcats' 110-75 rout of Auburn on Feb. 21, 2014. It took Calipari 104 games to reach the century mark, the fastest of any UK coach

## Cal Passes Hall for Rupp Record

With a 101-70 victory over Cleveland State on Nov. 23, 2016, John Calipari passed former UK head coach Joe B. Hall for most wins in Rupp Arena. Calipari currently has 220 wins inside the historic venue. Hall won 122.

# COACH CALIPARI

## Calipari Reaches 800 Career Victories in 2021-22

With Kentucky's overtime win over Mississippi State on Jan. 25, 2022, John Calipari reached 800 on-court wins. At the time he was one of just 22 coaches, regardless of NCAA level of classification, to reach that barrier. Only 14 coaches have done it with at least 10 seasons at the Division I level.

Calipari became the fourth-fastest coach to 800 on-court wins ever at 1,037 games. Only Adolph Rupp (972 games), Roy Williams (1,012 games) and Dean Smith (1,029 games) did it faster. At Kentucky, Calipari owns the second-most wins in program history, trailing only the legendary Adolph Rupp, who led the Wildcats for 41 seasons and spanned 1,066 games.

Although Calipari is still climbing the charts, he is doing it nearly as fast as anyone else in NCAA history. When he and Kentucky defeated Ole Miss on March 5, 2019, Calipari became the fourth-fastest coach to 300 wins (369 games) at one program in NCAA history. Only Bill Self (358 games at Kansas), Claire Bee (359 games at Long Island) and Rupp (366 at UK) got there faster.

## Calipari Ahead of the Pack at Kentucky

Through 13 seasons at Kentucky, John Calipari's time in Lexington has been every bit as successful -- and more -- as fans hoped it would when he agreed to become the head coach at Kentucky in the spring of 2009.

By just about every measure, he is the most successful coach in college basketball during the last decade-plus. Among schools who have been to at least two Elite Eights and a Final Four since 2009-10, Calipari ranks:

- First in NCAA Tournament wins (31)
- First in Final Four appearances (four)
- First in Elite Eight appearances (seven)
- First in Sweet Sixteen appearances (eight)
- Second in league tournament titles (six)
- Third in regular-season conference titles (six)
- Third in NCAA titles (one)

## First-Ballot Hall of Famer

Kentucky men's basketball coach John Calipari joined basketball's fraternity of legends in September 2015 after being elected to the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame on the first ballot.

Calipari joined an elite group of basketball players and coaches in the Naismith Hall of Fame, considered to be one of the ultimate honors in the sport. The Class of 2015 included Calipari, Dick Bevetta, Wildcat Louie Dampier, Lindsay Gaze, Tom Heinsohn, John Isaacs, Spencer Haywood, Lisa Leslie, Dikembe Mutombo, George Raveling and JoJo White.

Calipari was inducted in Springfield, Massachusetts. Nearly 70 former players joined him on stage during his acceptance speech.

## Calipari Receives Jefferson Award

Kentucky men's basketball head coach John Calipari received the Jefferson Award for Outstanding Public Service in Sports by Multiplying Good on Nov. 2. For more than 50 years, Multiplying Good has honored those who put others first. Those receiving the Jefferson Award are empowered to do more, while their stories of extraordinary public service inspire others to action. It is an award that underscores impact.

- Calipari is the first men's college basketball coach to receive the honor

## Coach Cal Immortalized at UMass, Clarion, Conference USA

John Calipari's Hall of Fame rise began at UMass, and the school honored his program's breakthrough in the 1990s by unveiling a statue of Calipari on the Amherst campus in September 2021. Calipari was one of four icons synonymous with UMass basketball to earn the honor. Calipari's statue was unveiled next to Marcus Camby, Julius Erving and the late Jack Leaman outside the Mullins Center.

At UMass, Calipari led the Minutemen to a 193-71 on-court record in his eight seasons as head coach from 1989-96. His .731 career winning percentage remains the best in school history, and he ranks second all-time at UMass in victories with 193. Calipari led UMass to five straight NCAA Tournament appearances from 1992 to 1996 after UMass had gone to the NAAs only once in the first 81 years of the program. His Minutemen made the Atlantic 10's first and only Final Four appearance during the 1996 season, during which they went 35-2

overall and spent 10 weeks ranked No. 1 in the nation. Following the 1996 season, Calipari was named National Coach of the Year by the National Association of Basketball Coaches, The Sporting News and Naismith.

Not only did John Calipari have a statue erected in his honor, the court at Clarion -- Calipari's alma mater -- is now named after the Hall of Famer. The court in Tiffin Gymnasium was officially renamed the John V. Calipari Court in September 2021 and will be known as Coach Cal Court.

Like many coaches, Calipari began his career in basketball on the court as a player. He he was a star high school basketball player at Moon High School in Western Pennsylvania under another Clarion graduate Joe Sacco. Calipari started his college playing career at UNC Wilmington before transferring to Clarion in 1981, helping the Golden Eagles reach their first NCAA Division II Tournament in program history that year.

In the summer of 2022, Calipari was enshrined into the Conference USA Hall of Fame. Calipari is being honored by the league for his impressive tenure as head men's basketball coach at the University of Memphis, where he coached from the 2000-01 season through 2008-09. Calipari led the Tigers to the 2008 NCAA title game, including 38 wins that season, making him the winningest coach for a single season in NCAA history. As a result, he earned his second Naismith National Coach of the Year honor, becoming only the second coach to earn the honor multiple times since its inception in 1987. He was also C-USA Coach of the Year that season.

Calipari, the 2009 Sports Illustrated National Coach of the Year, led the Tigers to nine straight 20-win campaigns and nine consecutive postseason appearances, the only Memphis coach to do that. He posted 252 on-court wins -- 28.0 wins per season -- as the Tigers' head coach, making him the winningest coach in school history. From 2006-08, the Tigers won 104 games, making Calipari the winningest head coach in NCAA Division I history in a three-year span.

## Calipari Named Coach of the Decade

Underscored by more victories than any other coach or program in his first 10 seasons at the helm at Kentucky, more Final Four appearances, a record number of NBA Draft picks, and the 2012 national championship, John Calipari was named the College Basketball Coach of the Decade by Sporting News in January 2020.

In a piece penned by national writer Mike DeCourcy, Sporting News credited Calipari for changing the college basketball landscape. Detailing Calipari's success -- what DeCourcy described as a "college basketball revolution" -- DeCourcy wrote that "no one defined the 2010s in the same way as Calipari ... nor achieved the same degree of consistent success."

In an era where kids can enter the NBA Draft at 19 years old, Calipari masterfully balances the priority of players' long-term professional dreams with individual and team development, leading to on-court success that no other team has matched.

## Calipari Unrivaled in Conference

John Calipari has won 16 league regular-season championships (including six Southeastern Conference titles) seven more than the next-closest coach in the SEC (Bruce Pearl has nine). Calipari has won six SEC Tournament championships at Kentucky and owns 15 conference tournament titles in his career, 10 more than his closest competitor (Nate Oats).

Calipari has tallied a 393-126 (75.7%) all-time record within conference play as a head coach and owns a 185-60 (75.4%) record since joining the SEC.

Although he's been publicly outspoken against conference tournaments -- only because he doesn't favor playing three or more games on consecutive days to win the tournament -- his teams have gotten up for them. Calipari's teams at UMass, Memphis and Kentucky have been to 19 conference championship games in his career, winning a remarkable 15 of them. Calipari is 58-15 (79.5%) all-time in conference tournaments, including 24-7 (77.4%) at UK. Calipari ranks third in SEC Tournament wins.

## There's No Place Like Home

John Calipari-coached teams have posted an all-time record of 459-53 (89.6%) record at home in his stops at UMass, Memphis and Kentucky. At UK, Coach Cal is 220-21 (91.3%) in Rupp Arena.

In six of Calipari's seasons at Kentucky, the Wildcats have posted an undefeated record at home, including a school-record 19-0 mark during the 2014-15 season.

Calipari owns both of UK's longest winning streaks in the arena. He began his career at UK with a 54-game winning streak at Rupp Arena. It was the longest winning streak since the arena opened in 1976. With a win over Georgia on Feb. 9, 2016, he secured the second-longest streak in the storied building at 34 games (which ended at 42).

Bernard King had 16 in 1983-84 and 1984-85. Randle is averaging a career-high 25.3 points per game and a career-best 10.3 boards per outing. He's the leading scorer for a team that ranks sixth in the Eastern Conference standings and in the pursuit of another playoff appearance.

Randle was the SEC Freshman of the Year in 2014 and helped guide the Cats to a memorable run to the NCAA championship game. He averaged 15.0 points and 10.4 rebounds per game, while leading the country with 24 double-doubles.

# COACH CALIPARI

A “players-first” coach with a penchant for helping people reach their dreams, John Calipari, a Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Famer, has guided six teams to the Final Four, led one to a national championship and helped 54 players earn selection in the NBA Draft during his 30-year college coaching career.

Calipari guided Kentucky to its eighth national championship and his first national title in 2012. In becoming only the second coach in NCAA history to lead three different schools to the Final Four, he has racked up more than 800 on-court victories, 21 NCAA Tournament on-court appearances, six Final Fours and numerous national coach of the year honors.

From UMass to Memphis and now Kentucky, Calipari’s career has been successful throughout, but his most recent run in Lexington has been the best stretch of his career. During Calipari’s first 13 seasons at UK, he has led all coaches in NCAA Tournament wins (31), Final Fours (four), Elite Eights (seven) and Sweet 16s (eight).

In 2015, Coach Cal led college basketball’s first ever 38-0 team, and became one of just three coaches to make four Final Fours in a five-year span. At the end of the season, Calipari became the 96th coach to join the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.

While building a program out of obscurity at UMass, laying the foundation at Memphis and restoring luster at the sport’s greatest program at Kentucky, he totaled the second-most wins in NCAA history in the first 20 years of a college coaching career.

Quite honestly, though, Calipari’s on-court success overshadows a much more significant picture.

In his goal to lead a players-first program, he has helped more than 50 young men realize their dreams and reach the NBA level with 56 players earning NBA Draft selections, including a record five first-round draft picks in 2010. Two years later, six Wildcats heard their names called at the 2012 draft, the most in the two-round draft era. UK, with Calipari’s help, would tie those six picks again in 2015, including a record-tying four lottery selections. His four No. 1 overall picks are more than any other coach, and he has had 45 players drafted during his first 13 years at Kentucky, including 34 first-round picks.

Calipari’s players have entered the league NBA-ready. His players have garnered 32 All-Star selections -- all since 2010 -- with Anthony Davis winning the game’s MVP honor in 2017. Derrick Rose was named NBA MVP in 2011. Six of his players have been tabbed All-NBA (11 times), three have been named NBA Rookie of the Year and 15 players from Calipari’s first 12 teams at Kentucky have made the NBA All-Rookie teams. He is the only coach in history to have a player win each of the NBA’s major honors: MVP, Rookie of the Year, Most Improved Player and Sixth Man of the Year.

Much like he did at UMass, where his players graduated at nearly 80%, Calipari has stressed academics. Seventeen of his last 20 seniors at Memphis earned their bachelor’s degrees, and all 23 players at UK who were eligible to graduate by the end of their senior years walked away with a diploma in hand, including five players who earned their degree in just three years. Calipari’s teams routinely have posted a combined team grade-point average of 3.0 or better.

Calipari has raised millions of dollars to help the lives of those in need in the Commonwealth and beyond. He has had a particular passion to assist those impacted by natural disasters. For instance, in 2010, he used a telethon to raise more than \$1 million for victims of the devastating earthquake in Haiti. He followed that up with telethons in 2012, raising \$1 million for victims of Superstorm Sandy, in 2017 for victims of Hurricane Harvey, played a leading role in the “Kentucky United” efforts that generated more than \$5 million for victims of devastating tornadoes in Western Kentucky in 2021, and raised nearly \$4 million with the Kentucky Flood Relief Telethon and open practice at Rupp Arena in 2022.

Calipari launched his foundation in 2012, and since then the foundation has worked with several key partners and donated more than \$1.5 million, a figure that does not include matching funds that have been contributed from individuals and corporations. In 2013, Calipari initiated hosting an annual alumni weekend around his basketball fantasy experience with the intent to raise money for charity. After generating \$350,000 for selected organizations and charities during the inaugural game, the weekend has generated millions of dollars for charity since its inception.

In 2019, when federal workers were without pay due to a government shutdown, he, his wife and his foundation assisted workers with financial help and grocery gift cards. He and his wife, Ellen, teamed up with Fayette County Public Schools to help families in need during the COVID-19 pandemic.

His latest efforts include spearheading the creation of the John McLendon Minority Leadership Initiative, a nationwide coach-driven initiative to provide minorities a jump-start to their careers through practical experiences, opportunities to build their network and instilling the values of John McLendon: integrity, education, leadership and mentorship. Participants in the initiative will be known as MLI Future Leaders.

In 2017, Coach Cal was named the head coach of the 2017 USA Basketball Men’s U19 World Cup Team, which finished third at the 2017 FIBA U19 World Cup in Cairo.

Author of five books, including the New York Times Best Seller “Players First: Coaching from the Inside Out,” Calipari is a master of communication and maximizing talent. He lives by the motto that “it’s never a matter of how far you have fallen, but instead it’s about how high you bounce back.”
