KENTUCKY WINS SECOND REGIONAL TITLE IN SEVEN SEASONS

- UK HAS ADVANCED TO A SUPER REGIONAL FOR THE SECOND TIME IN THE LAST SIX NCAA TOURNAMENTS.
- UK COACH NICK MINGIONE HAS BEEN THE COACH FOR BOTH.
- . MINGIONE NOW HAS 216 CAREER WINS, THIRD ON UK'S ALL-TIME LIST. HE HAS THE SECOND-HIGHEST WINNING PERCENTAGE OF ANY COACH WHO HAS SKIPPERED AT LEAST 100 GAMES FOR THE WILDCATS.

REGIONAL RECAP

Kentucky advanced to its second Super Regional in the past six NCAA Tournaments the hard way...again. After Devin Burkes homered and the pitching staff blanked Ball State in the opener, Zack Lee's gem was spoiled by a late Indiana home run to send the Wildcats to the loser's bracket where they'd have to win three games in 36 hours.

Which is exactly what they did. Nolan McCarthy homered and Austin Strickland pitched six scorless innings to lead UK past West Virginia before the Cats thundered past the Hoosiers in the nightcap.

In the winner-take-all Monday night game, both teams scored in the first and it was a tie game in the sixth when Burkes, Hunter Gilliam and Ryan Waldschmidt each doubled to give UK a 4-2 lead that Mason Moore iced.

Burkes was named the Lexington Regional's Most Outstanding Player, While Gilliam, Jase Felker, Waldschmidt, McCarthy, Strickland and Moore each made the tournament team.

DEREK BRYANT: HALL OF FAMER

Last November, Kentucky inducted **Derek Bryant** into the UK Athletics Hall of Fame for his standout career in the Blue and White. Bryant, a Henry Clay (Lexington) High School product, played at UK from 1970-73.

Two-time All-SEC First Team honoree during his days at UK ... Exceptional hitter with career batting average of .369 (stats available for his last three seasons), with a career-high mark of .408 in 1971 ... First African-American baseball player at UK ... Drafted by the San Francisco Giants out of Henry Clay High School before deciding to enroll at Kentucky ... Drafted by the Oakland A's out of UK in 1973 and spent his entire professional career with the A's (1973-1981) ... Played in 39 MLB games for the Athletics during the 1979 season ... Had a successful playing and managerial career in the Mexican Professional League after his playing days, including two league titles (1995 and '96) as manager of Monterrey ... Member of the Mexican Baseball League Hall of Fame .. Continues to be an executive with Hermosillo of the Mexican Pacific League (winter league).

The UK Athletics Hall of Fame will recognize and honor persons whose participation and contributions enriched and strengthened the University's athletic program. Criteria that will be considered includes athletic and academic accomplishments of the individual while at UK, as well as post-UK accomplishments and character.

Others inducted with baseball connections include: Sawyer Carroll and AJ Reed (2020), Collin Cowgill (2017), Andy Green (2015), Terry Shumpert (2014), Jeff Keener (2012), Jeff Abbott (2011), Jim Host (2009), Brandon Webb (2009), Dom Fucci (2007), Ellis Johnson (2006) and Keith Madison (2005).



BIGGIE BOX

One of the pillars of UK's offense is working its game goals in search of the big inning - "Biggie Box" - which is defined as any inning where the Cats put four or more runs on the scoreboard. The approach has been so effective the lineup has opened its "Biggie Box" 177 times since Mingione took over (37 in 2017, 31 in 2018, 20 in 2019, 19 in 2021, 28 in 2022, 30 in 2023) and recorded 11 such innings in just 17 games during the pandemic-shortened 2020 season. The Cats also are 162-34 under Mingione when scoring six or more runs, including 30-7 this season. (See box on page nine for Biggie Box innings)



YOU GET A ROS(ZEL)



In the Lexington Regional the Wildcats tossed a pair of shutouts, the first time they've blanked an opponent in the NCAA Tournament in the modern era and overall since 1949. Also, Roszel's unit allowed just 13 total runs in five games and sophomore Mason Moore threw 10 shutout innings (14 total scoreless in NCAA Tournament).

Roszel has a lengthy track record of producing big leaguers and saw three of his former players at Florida Gulf Coast, including Sale and MLBers Richard Bleier and Casey Coleman, inducted into the school's athletics Hall of Fame in the past two years.

ON THE HUNT

Grad transfer Hunter Gilliam wasjust what Kentucky needed both on and off the diamond. He claimed national and conference honors for his play while blistering the baseball and delivering defense that has invoked memories of Gold Glover Evan White. Gilliam has earned the nickname "Captain" and immediately became a locker room leader with his affable personality and unselfish nature. He also has etched his name in the school record books with a 22-game hit streak that ranks as the second-longest since 2005 behind Gunnar McNeill's 23-game streak in 2016. He recently was named to the SEC's All-Defensive Team and set the UK record for SAC flies in a season at eight.

OUI, OUI

Sophomore infielder Emilien Pitre has been a revelation for the Cats, batting .318 with more walks than strikeouts and 20 stolen bases. Credit the coaching staff for discovering the Canadien and earning his commitment to UK as a 130-pound high schooler who barely spoke English outside of his native French. He has quickly assimilated to the culture and language of college baseball. He was named Second Team All-SEC and SEC All-Defensive Team.

ACTION JACKSON

Senior outfielder Jackson Gray has quietly been one of the best players in the country this season, particularly since the calendar flipped to April. He ranked in the top three players in a talent-laden Southeastern Conference in four offensive categories during the regiular season, is amongst the national leaders in hit by pitch, reached base nearly 50 percent of the time, all while playing a Gold Glove-caliber centerfield.

ON ROCKY TOP

Although Kentucky couldn't overcome a pair of difficult starts and win the series, the Wildcats proved their offensive identity works yet again, scoring 23 runs against Tennessee's vaunted pitching staff. The 23 runs tie Missouri (2023) for the most scored against the Volunteers in a weekend series since 2019. UK's pitchers also shut out the Vols, the first time that has happened to the orange and white since 2021.

#EVERYTHINGSCHOOL

Under the direction of athletics director Mitch Barnhart, UK has greatly enhanced its athletic profile across the entire department since his arrival. In recent years, volleyball and rifle each have won a national championship, football has had a pair of 10-win seasons ans Citrus Bowl championships, men's tennis finished national runner-up (tennis won the 2023 SEC Tournament as well), men's soccer completed an undefeated regular season and No. 1 overall seed in NCAA Tournament, baseball reached first-ever Super Regional and repeated this season, softball advanced to the WCWS, women's swimming won the Southeastern Conference title, track and field and gymnastics (2023 NCAA Final Four) each cemeted their status as elite programs on the national scene, and women's basketball won the SEC Tournament for the first time. That's not to mention the continued excellence of men's basketball and cheerleading, all of which culminated in a school-record ninth place finish in the Director's Cup standings for 2021-22.

THIEVES OF THE INDUSTRY

- In seven years under coach Nick Mingione the Wildcats have swiped 483 bases in 632 attempts, a success rate of 76.4 percent.
- In 2023, for the first time in school history (for which stats are available, 1969) the Cats have four players with at least 15 stolen bases.
- UK's 94 stolen bases in 2023 rank as the 5th-most in a single season in school history.
- In 2022, UK stole more than 80 bases for the second time in Mingione's tenure.
- In 2021, the Cats stole 78 bases in 86 attempts. It was the highest success rate (90.7) of any Division I-A team with 50+ stolen bases.
- The Cats were successful on their first 33 stolen base attempts last season, the most consecutive steals to open a season in school history and longest streak in D-I in 2021.

Kentucky has stolen at least 53 bases in each of the six full seasons Mingione has been head coach and twice had more than 80.

DARK MODE

Kentucky remained on the cutting edge of fashion this season, unveiling a new black uniform to replace the previous, aging version. The new look has a script "Kentucky" in blue across the chest and was designed by equipment coordinator Jeff Poole.

During the summer of 2022, fans were tasked with creating All-Kentucky Baseball dream team from the Nick Mingione era, which spannned 2017 through the 2021 campaign. Their votes on social media created a squad with eight all-americans, six major leaguers and a Southeastern Conference Pitcher of the Year, as well as a pair of Rawlings Gold Glove winners.

BLANTON NAMED SEC LEGEND

Joe Blanton, who is one of the most accomplished pitchers in Kentucky baseball history, has been named to the 2023 class on the Southeastern Conference Baseball Legends presented by T-Mobile.

Blanton pitched in 55 games during his Kentucky career from 2000-02. During his junior season, Blanton tallied five wins with 133 strikeouts in 100 innings. After his 2002 season, Blanton became the second Wildcat player all-time to be selected in the first round of the MLB Draft, as the Oakland Athletics nabbed him with the 24th overall pick.





SUPER LOGUES

In winning the Lexington Regional, Kentucky reached its second-ever Super Regional. One of the Logue brothers - Zach and Seth - has been on each of those clubs. Zach, who reached the big leagues last season and currently is in Triple-A, was a weekend starter on the 2017 squad. Seth, a relief pitcher, is on this season's tea. but was in attendance as a high schooler when the Cats clinched in 2017.

IN THE MIDDLE

There are teams that start fast and those that close with a flourish but this Kentucky team has made its hay in the middle. UK has outscored its opponents by more than 100 runs (199-89) in the "fifth, sixth and seventh innings.

ALL GAS. NO BREAKS

Kentucky's success this season was not smoke and mirrors, as it has played the nation's most difficult schedule (according to the NCAA RPI) and a Top 10 non-conference slate. In addition to the typical ferocity of the Southeastern Conference, Kentucky swept Indiana State, the runaway best team in the Missouri Valley Conference, regional host and Super Regional squad, swept a road series at Southern Illinois and won a series vs. NCAA club Wright State. UK also run-ruled an Indiana club and won 20 games against teams that received an NCAA bid.

MINGIONE IS SUPER-B

Kentucky coach Nick Mingione is writing his name all over the school's record books. In addition to being on the coaching staff of all three teams that have hosted a regional (assistant in 2006, head coach in 2017 and 2023), he is the only head coach to guide UK to a Super Regional, now having done in twice in the last six NCAA Tournaments.

KENTUCKY HEAD COACH NICK MINGIONE HAS WON 216 CAREER GAMES AT THE SCHOOL. HE CURRENTLY RANKS THIRD ON THE ALL-TIME WINS LIST AND HAS THE SECOND-HIGHEST WINNING PERCENTAGE OF ANY COACH WHO SPENT AT LEAST 100 GAMES AT THE SCHOOL.



The Cats have walked it off 18 times since Nick Mingione took over as head coach before the 2017 season, including five run rule games.



MLB TRAINING GROUND

Kentucky has made its presence felt in the Major League Baseball Draft in recent years with 33 players selected during the Nick Mingione era, including 21 in 2017 and 2018, which was the most of any college program in the country over that span. In Evan White (2017) and Zack Thompson (2019) the Cats have had two first-round selections under Mingione. In the last six drafts:

- 19 Wildcats were selected in the first 10 rounds.
- Eight were selected in the first five rounds, including first-rounders Evan White (2017) and Zack Thompson (2019).
- The 13 picks in 2018 are the second-most for any school in a single draft since 2006 and tied for an SEC record with Texas A&M (2016) and national champion Vanderbilt (2019).
- The 20 underclassmen drafted during that span earned \$12.663 million in signing bonus money, an average of \$633,125 per player.
 - All but one draftee was selected higher than previously selected.
 - 23 of the draftees had not previously been drafted.
- White was named a 2020 AL Gold Glove winner, the first rookie first baseman in either league to win the award since is inception in 1957.
- Along with White having already made his MLB debut, Zach Pop made the Miami Marlins 2021 opening day roster, while three more Zachs Logue, Reks and Thompson each have reached The Show. Pitcher Sean Hjelle (SF Giants) was called up and debuted in May 2022.
- Only Florida (10) has had more alumni reach the big leagues since beginning of 2020 season than UK (8).





2022 MLB DRAFT

Kentucky saw six players selected in the 2022 Major League Baseball Draft and one other player sign a free agent contract with a professional organization. It was the most Wildcats drafted since 2018 when a record 13 were selected.

Alonzo Rubalcaba signed a deal with Detroit, Danny Harris IV recently signed with Colorado and two high school signees also were drafted and signed.



"THE HOOK"

One of the personal touches to the Wildcats' home, Kentucky Proud Park, is "The Hook," which is the name of the visting bullpen just beyond the right field wall. The name is a tribute to former UK pitcher Jonathan Hooker, who pitched for the Cats from 1998-2001, and died in the plane crash of Comair Flight 5191 on Aug. 27, 2006 in Lexington.

Hooker and his wife, Scarlett Parsley, were married the night before and were on the early-morning flight headed to their honeymoon when the pilots attempted to take off from the wrong runway and crashed into a neighboring field. Forty-nine of the 50 people on board were killed, including both Hooker and Parsley.

The London, Ky. native was a beloved teammate and member of UK Baseball and his family were honored on Mar. 29, 2019 during an in-game ceremony to officially unveil "The Hook," which features a sign and memorial to the former Wildcat.

HEAD COACH NICK MINGIONE

Kentucky fans have quickly created a bond with **Nick Mingione**, whose infectious and unrelenting enthusiasm and down-to-earth personality has earned legions of new fans. Although it is certainly an ingredient in Mingione's on-field success, getting the best out of his players has been the biggest factor in the success he's achieved everywhere he's been...In 19 full seasons of coaching the teams he's been involved with have averaged 38 victories a year and advanced to the postseason 10 times with two national runner-up finishes. He already is the third-winningest coach in Kentucky history.

Mingione had a brilliant playing career at Embry-Riddle - he ranks 10th on its career hits list - where he helped lead the program to 154 victories and three NAIA World Series appearances in three seasons as an assistant. When he arrived at Kentucky in 2006 he was immediately part of what is still the Cats' only SEC championship club, then smelled success at Mississippi State before returning to the one place he had always wanted to be a head coach - UK. First season, first Super Regional appearance for the Cats.

He made it a point to have his team involved in the community, part of his "Student. Person. Player." guiding principle of the program, participating in numerous philanthropic events in Lexington while also taking time for more than 100 local speaking engagements. In his first season his ethos for the program was on full display as UK players earned SEC Pitcher of the Year, SEC Scholar Athlete of the Year and SEC Community Service Team honors. He recently was named the winner of 2022 Fellowship of Christian Athletes Jerry Kindall Character in Coaching Award.

Mingione became the winngest UK coach during the first three seasons of his tenure with 103 total wins and 39 in SEC play. The success has carried over to the Major League Baseball Draft, where Mingione and his staff's ability to groom players for a professional career has led to 33 players being selected in the past six MLB Drafts. The 21 players selected in the 2017 and 2018 drafts were the most of any program in the country and Mignione has helped mentor two top 20 overall picks in first baseman Evan White (17th, 2017) and left-handed pitcher Zack Thompson (19th, 2019).

Mingione has a sterling reputation as a recruiter. Over the 15 seasons at Kentucky and Mississippi State for which recruiting rankings are final, he has helped land classes with an average ranking of 15th, including top-three classes in 2013-15. He also has an unmatched track record of player development, coaching 86 players selected in the MLB Draft, as well as 46 All-Americans and six conference players of the year. His first recruiting class at Kentucky was ranked in the Top 10 of all the major industry outlets.



KENTUCKY PROUD PARK

Kentucky baseball moved into a new home for the 2019 season, opening the \$49 million Kentucky Proud Park, a state-of-the-art facility immediately considered one of the top facilities in all of college baseball. The Wildcats won their first game in their new home, defeating Eastern Kentucky, 7-3, on Feb. 26, 2019.

The stadium features permanent seating for nearly 2,500 fans with additional space on grass berms to accommodate 5,000 fans for regular season games. Beyond the out-field wall, temporary bleachers can be installed for NCAA Tournament games to bring the seating capacity to more than 7,000.


The team areas were a priority and give our players and coaches everything they need to compete at a high level in a single location. The facility features a team lounge, locker room, training area, indoor hitting and pitching areas, and coaching offices, as well as a recruiting room. All spaces are either new to UK baseball or significantly larger than previous ones.

The name is a tribute to farmers and businesses of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and the Big Blue Nation. Kentucky Farm Bureau secured the rights to name the stadium from JMI Sports, UK Athletics' multimedia rights partner. In turn, Kentucky Farm Bureau elected to name the stadium for Kentucky Proud, the state's official agricultural marketing program housed at the Kentucky Department of Agriculture. No state taxpayer dollars were used in funding the agreement. The Kentucky Proud program is funded through the generosity of the Kentucky Agricultural Development Fund. The fund is directed by the Kentucky Agricultural Development Board and administered by the Governor's Office of Agricultural Policy.

New black padding will replace the existing blue look for the 2023 season, including on the outfield fence, dugout railings and behind home plate.
