## STARTING FIVE

- Through the first nine games this season, the Cardinals have been one of the best free throw shooting teams in the country. They are shooting 78.7 percent (174-for-221) from the line and have shot 80 percent or better in six of the first nine games. They are 21st in the NCAA in free throw shooting percentage and are fifth in the country as they average 19.3 free throws made per game. They average 24.6 trips to the line per game, a mark that is 12 th in the country.
- The Cardinals are preparing for the annual Battle for the Bluegrass when rival Kentucky comes to town on Sunday, Dec. 10. The Cardinals currently hold a six-game winning streak over the Wildcats, their longest winning streak in the rivalry's history. Since head coach Jeff Walz took over in the 200708 season, the Cardinals are 9-6 against the Wildcats. Before he took over, Louisville was just 14-28 against Kentucky.
- Louisville has been causing havoc on defense throughout the nine games this season. The Cardinals have been one of the best teams in the country in turning opponents over as they rank 16th in the NCAA with 22.8 turnovers forced per game. The Cardinals set a season-high with 31 turnovers forced against NC A\&T, the highest in a game since the 2021-22 season. Louisville has forced 20 or more turnovers in each of the last seven games and in eight of nine games this season. Louisville tallied 16 steals against the Aggies, one shy of the season high of 17 against Bellarmine.
- The Cardinals signed four players to the Class of 2024 during the Early Signing Period. The Cardinals have received commitments from 5 -foot-10 guard Tajianna Avant-Roberts (La Jolla, Calif.), 5 -foot-9 guard Izela Arenas (Porter Ranch, Calif.), 6 -foot-4 forward Anaya Hardy (Detroit, Mich.) and 6-foot-4 forward Isla Juffermans (Coffs Harbour, Australia). The class is ranked No. 16 by ESPN during the Early Signing Period.

■ The 2023-24 Louisville Cardinals already hit the court together this season in the 2023 GLOBL JAM Tournament in Toronto this past July. Louisville won the gold medal after Sydney Taylor hit the game-winning three with under one minute left to take down the hosts, Team Canada. Taylor was named Tournament MVP after leading the Cardinals in scoring over the four games.

## ABOUT THE WILDCATS

Kentucky currently has a 4-6 overall record and are coming off a 57-76 loss at home to Minnesota this past Wednesday. Prior to the loss to Minnesota, Kentucky had a two-game winning streak after the home win over Tennessee Tech (73-67) on Dec. 3 and the Wildcats earned a win in their ACC/SEC Challenge game against Boston College (83-81) on Nov. 30. So far this season, the Wildcats have been able to get to the free throw line at a high rate.
They average 22.0 free throw attempts per game and that number is fourth best in the SEC and ranks 33rd nationally.
$\square$ Series History - This will be the 58th meeting in the Battle for the Bluegrass and Louisville trails the all-time series $23-34$. This will be the 16th matchup between the two teams since Jeff Walz took over at Louisville and the Cardinals have a 9-6 advantage over that time. Louisville has won the last six games against the Wildcats dating back to the 2015-16 season (The teams did not meet in the 2020-21 season). The six-game winning streak for the Cardinals is the longest in the series history for Louisville.

■ Last Meeting - The RV/\#24 Louisville Cardinals kept the state red as they defeated Kentucky, 86-72, Sunday afternoon at Rupp Arena in the Battle for the Bluegrass. It was the sixth-straight win for the Cardinals (7-4) over the Wildcats (7-2), the longest winning streak Louisville has had in the rivalry's history. Liz Dixon had one of her best games of the season with a season-high 16 points on 5-of-6 shooting. Morgan Jones had 12 points, a seasonhigh eight rebounds and tied a career high with four blocks. Olivia Cochran had a team-high nine rebounds to go with nine points. The Cardinals made 33-of-39 free throws in the win, setting a program record for most free throws in a single game. It broke the previous record of 32 , which was set in 2009 against Rutgers.

## APPROACHING MILESTONES

■ Jefferson approaches 2,000 career points - Kiki Jefferson currently has 1,948 career points and is 52 points shy of 2,000 .

■ Jefferson approaches 1,000 career rebounds - Kiki Jefferson currently has 845 career rebounds and is 155 shy of 1,000 .

■ Cochran approaches 1,000 career points - Olivia Cochran currently has 993 career points and is seven points shy of 1,000 .

■ Curry approaches 1,000 career points - Jayda Curry currently has 969 career points and is 31 points shy of 1,000 .

## QUICK HITTERS

■ Closing Time - The Cardinals have saved some of their best basketball for the final quarter this season. Louisville has scored 187 points in the fourth quarter, their highest scoring quarter this season and they are outscoring opponents 187-129 in the final quarter. They have outscored their opponents in the fourth quarter in seven of the nine games this season.

■ Getting Everyone Involved - In the Cardinals 80-40 win over NC A\&T, 10 different players scored against the Aggies. It was the fourth time this season the Cardinals had 10 or more players score in a game and Louisville is $4-0$ in those games this season.

■ Season-High Threes - The Cardinals set a season high with eight made threes in the home win over NC A\&T. Merissah Russell tied a career high with a team-best three threepointers made, Jayda Curry was 2-for-2 from deep while Sydney Taylor, Kiki Jefferson and Hennie van Schaik all added one three each.

## LOUISVILLE COLLECTS SECOND TOURNAMENT TITLE THIS SEASON AT BETTY CHANCELLOR CLASSIC

The 2023-24 Louisville women's basketball team won their second tournament this season when they defeated Gonzaga to clinch the Betty Chancellor Tournament Championship on Nov. 26 in Katy, Texas.

- The Cardinals needed to defeat Gonzaga by eight points or more to win the tiebreaker for the tournament championship.
- Louisville led by three heading into the final quarter and hit each of their first nine shots of the quarter to grow the lead to the largest of the game at 17 points.
■ The Cardinals closed the game out at the line and outscored Gonzaga 22-14 in the fourth to clinch the title with a 81-70 win.
- Louisville was 34 -for-58 (58.6 percent) from the floor in the win over Gonzaga and hit a season-best seven three-pointers.
■ Jefferson scored 20-plus points for the second-straight game with a season-best 21 and tied for the team lead with five assists. Nina Rickards scored in double figures for the thirdstraight game with a season-high 16 points and tied for the team lead with five assists. The pair were both named to the Betty Chancellor Classic All-Tournament Team.
- The Cardinals also defeated Liberty, 72-63, on Saturday en route to the tournament championship. The Cardinals outscored the Flames $26-11$ in the fourth quarter to get the win.
■ Olivia Cochran tallied a double-double ( 21 pts., 11 rebs.) and Kiki Jefferson scored 20 points and was 8 -for-8 from the line in the win over the Flames.
■ This is the second tournament championship for the Cardinals after they won the 2023 GLOBL JAM tournament in Toronto this past July.


## CARDINALS HIT PROGRAM-BEST MARKS IN WIN OVER BELLARMINE

The Cardinals put together one of the best games of the Jeff Walz era and made some history in their 111-33 win over Bellarmine on Nov. 16.

- The Cardinals set a program record with eight players scoring in double figures
(Taylor, 15; Harris, 14; Mobley, 12; Russell, 11; Jefferson, 11; Curry, 11; Cochran, 10 and Istanbulluoglu, 10).
■ The 78-point margin of victory was the largest in a game during the Jeff Walz era and the second largest in program history.
■ The 111 points scored were the third most in a game in program history.
- Louisville limited Bellarmine to nine points in the first half, the third-fewest points allowed in the first half in program history and the most in a game since 2020.
- The Cardinals tallied 62 points in the paint against Bellarmine. It is the most points in the paint since Dec. 4, 2020, when Louisville recorded 74 against DePaul.
■ Freshman Elif Istanbulluoglu recorded a double-double with 10 points and 12 rebounds. She is the first Louisville freshman to record a double-double since Olivia Cochran had 13 points and 15 rebounds against Northwestern in the second round of the 2021 NCAA Tournament.


## NO STOPPING NINA

Graduate transfer guard Nina Rickards has been on a tear for the Cardinals through the early part of the season, impacting the game in a number of categories.
■ Through the first nine games this season, Rickards leads the team in assists (2.9) and field goal percentage (.604), third in rebounds (4.7) and fourth in points (8.8) per game.

- She has tallied two or more assists and scored six or more points in eight of the nine games this season.
- She scored in double figures for the fourth-straight game with 15 points and team-best three assists and three steals in the road win over \#19/20 Ole Miss.
■ At the Betty Chancellor Classic in Texas, she scored in double-figures in all three games, including a season-high 16 against Gonzaga with a season-best five assists. She also tallied her first double-double of the season with 12 points and 10 rebounds against Alabama.
■ Rickards was one of two Cardinals (Kiki Jefferson) to be named to the Chancellor Classic All-Tournament team.


## YEAR 4 FOR OC

Olivia Cochran is set for a big role with the Cardinals in her fourth year with the team. She is the most experienced Cardinal returning from the 2022-23 squad.
■ Through the first nine games this season, Cochran leads the team in rebounds (5.4), steals (1.7) and blocks (0.4) per game and is second on the team in scoring (11.3).
■ Cochran tied her career high with 21 points and added 11 rebounds against Liberty for her 10th career double-double and the first of the season. She tied a career high when she made nine free throws against the Flames and tied a season high with three steals.
■ She was named to the Wooden Award Preseason Top 50 Watch List prior to the matchup with Bellarmine. The Cardinals have had at least one player on the Wooden Watch List in seven of the last eight seasons.

## HEAD COACH JEFF WALZ

Head coach Jeff Walz, in his 17th season as a head coach, has compiled a 449-126 record as the Cardinals' leader. Walz and the Cardinals boast quite an astounding resumé that includes 12 trips to the NCAA Sweet 16 , eight trips to the Elite Eight, four trips to the final four and two trips to the national title game. Overall, he has compiled a 40-13 record in NCAA Tournament games and ranks eighth all-time and fifth among active coaches with a
 75.5 NCAA Tournament winning percentage. All of this for a program that had just four NCAA Tournament wins and had never reached a Sweet 16 prior to Walz being named head coach.

Walz is the all-time winningest coach in program history and averages 27.6 victories per season. He directed Louisville to a programrecord 36 victories in 2017-18 en route to being named ACC Coach of the Year, 34 victories in 2008-09, 33 wins in 2013-14, 32 wins in 2018-19 and 29 wins in 2021-22.

The Cardinals have reached 20 wins 13 consecutive times and they have won at least 20 games in 15 of Walz's 16 seasons. The longest run previously was three, achieved twice, and UofL had just 10 20-win seasons in its 32 previous years.

Walz led Louisville to four consecutive Atlantic Coast Conference regular season titles in 2018, 2019, 2020 and 2021, and over that fouryear span, the Cardinals went a combined 122-15, which marked the fewest losses and best winning percentage over a four-year period in program history.

From 2016-2021, he coached the ACC Player of the Year in five of six seasons as Myisha Hines-Allen won the award in 2016, Asia Durr in 2018 and 2019, and Dana Evans in 2020 and 2021. He also coached Angel McCoughtry to Big East Player of the Year honors in 2007.

After being hired as the Cardinals' head coach on March 27, 2007, the Bluegrass State native used little time to make a splash. His first year featured the program's first NCAA Sweet 16 and it culminated with Louisville earning the No. 12 ranking in the final ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. For his efforts, Walz was named the WBCA Maggie Dixon Rookie Coach of the Year.

Prior to taking the reins at Louisville, Walz spent five seasons at Maryland, including his final season as the associate head coach in 2006-07. The season prior, he helped lead the Terrapins to a schoolrecord 34 wins and the program's first national title.

Walz has four children: daughter Kaeley, son Jacob, and daughters Lola and Lucy. He married the former Lauren Lueders in September of 2012, and the couple resides in Louisville.

■ Cochran tallied a career-high 21 points and led the team with three assists, three steals and added five rebounds in the win over DePaul.
■ In the season opener against Cincinnati, Cochran led the team with 10 rebounds and added seven points and tied the team high with three assists. It was her 16th career game with 10 rebounds or more.

- Cochran played in 100 games in her Louisville career and made 95 starts heading into her senior season.
■ Ahead of the 2023-24 season, Cochran was named to the Naismith Women's Player of the Year Watch List, Katrina McClain Award Watch List and Preseason All-ACC team.
■ She led the Cardinals with 6.5 rebounds per game last season and had one of her best career games in the Elite Eight against the national runners-up. Cochran had a career-high 20 points and added 14 points against lowa. The 14 rebounds were tied for fifth-most in an NCAA Tournament game in program history.
■ Cochran helped the Cardinals reach the ACC Tournament Championship Game for the fourth time in program history. She scored in double figures in all three games and was named to the ACC All-Tournament Second Team.
■ She was the only player to play and start all 38 games last season and led the team with four double-doubles.


## ALLOWING 59 POINTS OR LESS

The Cardinals have great success when allowing 59 points or less in a game over the past few seasons. Louisville has won 38-straight games when allowing 59 points or less in a game after the $80-40$ win over NC A\&T on Dec. 3. The 38 -straight wins dates back to the 2020-21 season. Over the past nine seasons, the Cardinals are 145-4 when allowing 59 points or less in a game.

## 70-PLUS POINTS

The Cardinals are 89-5 in their last 94 games when they have scored 70 points or more, dating back to the 2018-19 season. UofL is 318-28 when surpassing the 70-point plateau under Walz.

## 50/50

The Cardinals shot 58.6 percent (34-58) from the floor in the win over Gonzaga, their second game shooting over 50 percent this season and they are 2-0 in those games. Overall, they boast a 145-3 record when shooting 50 percent or better from the field under Walz.

## ONE OF THE BEST IN THE COUNTRY

Louisville has been one of the best teams in the country since the start of the 2017-18 season. The Cardinals have totaled 185 wins and an .849 winning percentage. The wins rank fourth and the winning percentage ranks fifth in the NCAA during that span.

## NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

All-time, Walz is 182-34 (.843) against nonconference foes in regular season play. They are 84-11 in nonconference play over the past eight years.

## SUCCESS AGAINST UNRANKED TEAMS

Louisville is 191-10 in their last 201 games against unranked opponents. From 2015 to 2019, Louisville won 102 consecutive games against teams not ranked in the AP Top 25.

## DECEMBER STREAKING

The Cardinals picked up their seventh-straight win in the month of December dating back to last season. Similar to the first month of the season, the Cardinals have been very successful under Walz during the month of December. In his 17 seasons, Louisville is $94-15$ all-time in December. Over the past six seasons, the Cards are 34-2 in December.

## ROAD WARRIORS

The Cardinals improved to 2-0 on the road after the $64-58$ win over \#19/20 Ole Miss on Nov. 29. Last season, the Cardinals were 10-5 in true road games. Since the start of the 2017-18 season, the Cardinals are 64-12 in true road games. Louisville is third in the NCAA in road wins and fourth in winning percentage (.842) since the start of the 2017-18 season. The 10 road wins last season were tied for the most in the ACC.

## ROSTER BREAKDOWN

Louisville returns four players that played for last year's team, brings in eight newcomers and had 11 departures.
$\square$ Returnees - The Cardinals return two starters from last year's team in senior forward Olivia Cochran and sophomore forward Nyla Harris. Both Harris and Cochran played in all 38 games last season. Joining the two starters are senior guard Merissah Russell and redshirt-sophomore forward Alexia Mobley. Russell played in 37 games last season off the bench and scored six or more points 11 times. She scored eight points on 3 -for-6 shooting in the Sweet 16 win over Ole Miss. Mobley made her collegiate debut on the road against Pitt last season. She scored her first collegiate points in the ACC Tournament against Wake Forest.

■ Newcomers - Louisville brings in a slew of transfers along with two international freshmen products for the 2023-24 squad.

■ Senior Eylia Love transferred to Louisville this past January and was with the Cardinals during their Elite Eight run but was not eligible to play. She comes to the Cardinals from Georgia Tech where she played 71 games and made 41 starts over two and a half seasons.

■ Junior guard Jayda Curry joins the Cards after transferring from Cal in April. She was the Pac-12 Freshman of the Year in 2021-22 and was selected to the All-Pac-12 team last season by the media. She has averaged 16.9 points per game over 53 games during her two seasons at Cal.

■ Junior forward Hennie van Schaik joins the Cardinals after transferring from CSUBakersfield this past April. van Schaik led Bakersfield in points per game (11.6) and rebounds (7.2) this past season. Over the summer, she competed with Netherlands at the FIBA U20 European Women's Championship.

■ Graduate guard Kiki Jefferson comes to the Cards after playing her first four collegiate seasons at James Madison. She was the 2023 Sun Belt Player of the Year and was the 2023 Sun Belt Tournament Most Outstanding player this past season. She has scored 1,838 points in her 116 career games played and hauled in 815 rebounds.

■ Graduate guard Sydney Taylor played her first four seasons at UMass before transferring to the Cards this past spring. She was an Atlantic 10 All-Conference First Team honoree last season and was one of the best three-point shooters in the country. She made 107 threes, which led the A-10 and ranked seventh nationally.

■ Graduate guard Nina Rickards came to the Cardinals in April after playing her first four years at Florida. She has played 120 collegiate games, the most of any player on the Cardinals roster, and eclipsed the 1,000-point plateau last season with the Gators. In her final year at Florida, she finished second on the team in scoring with a career-best 12.1 points per game and was third in rebounding (4.9) and steals (1.4) per game.

- Forward Elif Istanbulluoglu comes to the Cardinals from Turkey and signed with Louisville in August. She has played with the Turkish National Team at the U18 and U20 Championships this past summer. Her older sister, Sevval, played collegiately at Siena.

■ Center Eseosa Imafidon comes to the Cardinals after playing for Proctor Academy last season. She will redshirt this upcoming season but is originally from Nigeria. She came to the United States to play high school and prep basketball through the Access2Success Program.

## EXPERIENCE AND SCORING NOT A PROBLEM FOR THE CARDS

The Cardinals have an influx of new players to the 2023-24 squad as eight newcomers have joined the squad but the team does not have an issue with experience or scoring. Of the 12 players on the roster, three are graduate students and five are juniors or older.

■ Games on games on games - Louisville has eight players on the roster that have played in 50 or more collegiate games. Four of those players have tallied over 100 career games with Nina Rickards leading the way with 129, followed by Kiki Jefferson at 125, Sydney Taylor at 116 and Olivia Cochran at 109.

■ Scoring Touch - Several Cardinals players have the ability to light it up from the floor. Six different players have tallied at least one 20-point game in their careers and three players have had 10 or more 20-point games. In total, there have been 96 20-point games by Cardinals players in their careers. Kiki Jefferson leads the way with 43, Sydney Taylor is second with 28, Jayda Curry has 16, Nina Rickards has four, Olivia Cochran has three and Eylia Love has two.

## CARDS WIN GOLD AT 2023 GLOBL JAM

The 2023-24 Cardinals have already hit the floor together this year as they competed in the 2023 GLOBL JAM Tournament in Toronto back in July. The Cardinals were the representatives from the United States and were joined by national U23 teams from Canada, Puerto Rico and BAL Select.
$\square$ The Cardinals went 2-1 in the pool play games with wins over Puerto Rico (78-55) and BAL Select (72-39) and dropped a close game against Canada (71-74). The Cardinals still advanced to the gold medal game where they had a rematch against Team Canada.

- Trailing by one with under a minute left, Sydney Taylor knocked down the game-winning three to clinch the win for the Cardinals and claimed the Gold Medal over Canada. $\square$ Merissah Russell won the event for the second-straight year. She won gold back in 2022 with Team Canada and she competed with the Cards for this year's tournament.


## PRESEASON HONORS FOR COCHRAN, JEFFERSON AND CURRY

Olivia Cochran, Jayda Curry and Kiki Jefferson all earned preseason honors ahead of the 2023-24 season.

■ Cochran has been named to a few national Player of the Year Watch Lists as the season has gotten underway. Cochran was named to the Wooden Award Preseason Top 50 Watch List on Nov. 14. She was one of two Cardinals to be selected for the Naismith Women's Player of the Year Watch List. She was named to the Preseason All-ACC team for the first time in her career. The Cardinals have had at least one player named to the Preseason All-ACC team since they joined the league in the 2014-15 season. Cochran was also named to the Katrina McClain Award Watch List for the third-straight season. She was one of five players that has been on each of the last three McClain Award Watch Lists.

■ Curry joined Cochran on the Naismith Women's Player of the Year Watch List. She was one of two Cardinals (Kiki Jefferson) that were named to the ACC Newcomer Watch List. She joins the Cardinals from Cal where she was the Pac-12 Freshman of the Year in 2021-22 and was named to the First Team All Pac-12 last season by the media.

■ Jefferson was the second Cardinal with Curry to be named to the ACC Newcomer Watch List. It is the first time since the Cardinals joined the ACC that they had multiple players on the Newcomer Watch List. Jefferson was also named to the Cheryl Miller Award Watch List, that recognizes the best small forward in college basketball. It is the first time Jefferson has made the Miller Award Watch List in her career and the fourth-straight season the Cardinals have had a representative on the list.

## LOUISVILLE PICKED FOURTH IN ACC <br> PRESEASON POLL

Louisville was selected to finish fourth overall in the ACC Preseason Poll ahead of the 2023-24 season. Since the Cardinals joined the league in 2014-15, they have finished fourth or higher in the league in every season. The Cardinals are the only team in the ACC to finish fourth or higher in each of the last nine seasons.

## PRESEASON AP AND USA TODAY RANKINGS

The Cardinals were ranked 17th in the 2023-24 Associated Press preseason poll and were picked 15th in the USA Today poll. They were one of five ACC teams in the AP poll and were one of seven ACC teams in the USA Today Poll.
$■$ Preseason Top-20 - It marks the 13th-consecutive season that Louisville has been ranked in the Top-20 of the AP preseason poll and the 14th time in Walz's 17-year tenure. The 13-year streak in the preseason Top-20 is the longest active streak of any ACC team. The second-longest active streak among ACC teams is just two years.

## RETURNING STARTERS

The Cards return only two players that have made a start in a Louisville uniform but the pair have combined for 110 starts during their time at Louisville heading into the 2023-24 season. (Cochran-95, Harris - 15).

## MOST UOFL VICTORIES

The Cardinals won 26 games last season and it tied for 11th-most in a single season in program history. The top eight and 13 of the 14 top win totals have come under Walz.

## ANOTHER 20/25-WIN SEASON

UofL defeated Boston College 62-52 on Feb. 19 to reach 20 wins for the 13th-straight season last year and extend the program record. The longest run previously was three, achieved twice. The Cards have won at least 20 games in 15 of Walz's 16 seasons. Prior to Walz's arrival, Louisville had just 1020 -win seasons in its history.

## HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

Since the KFC Yum! Center opened its doors for the 2010-11 season, the Cardinals have had one of the best home court advantages in the country. Louisville is 196-31 all-time at the KFC Yum! Center over the past 14 seasons. During that span, the Cardinals have won at least 11 home games
every season. In six of those seasons, the Cardinals lost one home game or less. The Cardinals program record for consecutive home wins is 21 games, a streak that spanned over three seasons. Over the past seven seasons, Louisville is $91-7$ at home.

## BEST FANS IN THE COUNTRY

Last season, Louisville averaged 8,779 fans at the KFC Yum! Center, which topped the ACC and ranked fifth in the country. The 8,779 fans per game would have rank seventh in ACC men's basketball last season. For 13 straight-seasons, they have led the ACC and ranked in the top five in the country in attendance. They had a season-high 12,015 fans vs. Notre Dame last year.

## REPRESENTING THEIR COUNTRIES

The Cardinals had a number of players represent their countries at international competitions this past summer.

■ USA - Following her MVP performance at the 2023 GLOBL JAM Tournament in Toronto, Sydney Taylor was added to the USA 3x3 U23 Nations League Team for multiple stops throughout the summer. She made her debut with Team USA in Chile as the team won five of the six single-day tournaments during that stop. Later on, she played with Team USA in Quebec before being named to the USA Nations League Final team that competed in Mongolia back in September.

■ Netherlands - Hennie van Schaik competed with Team Netherlands in the 2023 FIBA U20 European Championships in late July and August. She played in four total games as the Netherlands finished third overall at the event.

■ Turkey - Elif Istanbulluoglu played with Turkey at the 2023 FIBA U18 and U20 Championships this past summer before ultimately committing to the Cards. At the U18 Championships, she averaged 11.0 points and 10.7 rebounds per game as Turkey reached the quarterfinals.

## NCAA TOURNAMENT SUCCESS

Louisville has been one of the most consistent teams in the NCAA Tournament during Jeff Walz's tenure.
■ They are the only team in the country that have been to each of the last five Elite Eights.
■ They are just one of three teams (UConn, South Carolina) with an active Sweet 16 streak of six years or longer.
■ Louisville is one of five programs (UConn, Stanford, South Carolina, Notre Dame) to make four or more Final Fours in the last 15 seasons.

## WALZ IN THE BIG DANCE

Walz boasts a 40-14 record in NCAA Tournament games. He is eighth all-time in winning percentage and fifth among active coaches. He has directed UofL to a pair of national runnerup finishes $(2009,2013)$, four Final Fours (2009, 2013, 2018, 2022), eight Elite Eights (2009, 2013, 2014, 2018, 2019, 2021,
