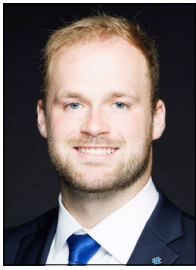

Career

- Saw action in 58 career games with 25 starting assignments in his six seasons at UK
• A five-year letter winner
• Totaled 26 receptions for 272 yards and two scores with a long reception of 33 yards vs. Alabama in 2023

2023 - %Senior

- Elected to return for a sixth year, taking advantage of the NCAA's ruling to grant an extra year of eligibility due to the COVID-19 pandemic
• Started in 12 of 13 games played
• Caught four passes for 89 yards
• Had a 33-yard reception, the longest of his career, vs. Alabama
• Selected to play in the All-Star Hula Bowl Classic on Jan. 13, 2024

2022 - Senior

- Played in 11 games with seven starts in 2022, missing the last two games of the season with a shoulder injury
• Finished the season with 10 receptions (sixth-highest on the team) for 99 yards and one score

#### Career

- Came to Kentucky in 2023 after two seasons at Vanderbilt (2021-22) and two at Temple (2019-20)
- Played in 44 career games, 16 games at Temple, 15 at Vanderbilt and 13 at Kentucky, with 37 career starts
- Ended his collegiate career with 746 rushing attempts for 3,626 rushing yards and 29 rushing touchdowns ... Added 94 receptions for 762 receiving yards and 12 receiving touchdowns ... Totaled 4,388 all-purpose yards with 41 total touchdowns and 246 career points
- Fourth on the NCAA's active career total rushes list (733) and rushing yards list (3,563) ... Fourth on the career total TDs list with 41 ... 12th on the career all-purpose yards list with 4,388 ... 18th on the career rushing TDs list with 29
- Became the first active player in Division I to chart 1,000 rushing yards at three different schools - Temple, Vanderbilt and Kentucky ... Also became the first player in SEC history to gain 1,000 or more rushing yards at two different programs - Vanderbilt and Kentucky
- Had at least one reception in 25 straight games played
- Totaled 12 career 100-yard rushing games (3 at UK, 5 at Vandy and 4 at Temple)
- Ran a 4.52 40-yard dash at the NFL Combine
- Had a vertical jump of 35" and a 9'11 broad jump

#### 2023 - Senior

- Second Team All-America (Sports Illustrated)
- Honorable Mention All-American (CFN)
- First Team All-SEC (AP, Phil Steele, USA Today)
- Second Team All-SEC (Coaches)
- Selected to play in the Reese's Senior Bowl and the East-West Shrine Bowl
- Earned an invitation to the 2024 NFL Combine
- In his lone season at Kentucky, had 199 carries for 1,129 yards (11th on UK's single-season list) and 14 rushing TDs ... Caught 33 passes for 323 yards and seven scores, totaling 21 touchdowns, a single-season school record
- Became the 11th player in school history to reach 1,000 rushing yards in a single season ... To this date, the feat has been accomplished a total of 15 times by 11 players
- His seven receiving touchdowns are the most touchdown catches in a season by a running back in school history
- His 126 points also were a single-season school record
- Ranked third nationally in total touchdowns (21) ... fourth nationally in scoring (9.7) ... sixth nationally

- in total points scored (126) ... 15th nationally in rushing TDs (14)
- Led the SEC in scoring (126) and scoring (TDs) (9.69) ... Ranked tied for second in scoring TDs and rushing TDs (14) ... Ranked fourth in rushing yards per game (86.85) and total rushing yards (1,129) ... Ranked fourth in all-purpose yards per game (111.69)
- Carried the ball 13 times for 63 yards and one touchdown rushing vs. Clemson in the Gator Bowl
- At No. 9 Louisville, carried the ball 14 times for 76 yards, including the game-winning 37-yard touchdown jaunt with 1:31 remaining in the game ... Also caught four passes for 51 yards, including two TD catches of 20 yards each
- Scored a touchdown in the first eight games of the season, setting a school record as the first Wildcat to score a TD in the first eight games of a season in school history, based on single-game statistics available since the 1940s
- First Wildcat to score a TD in eight straight games since Randall Cobb in 2009.
- Earned the following honors after an incredible performance against No. 22/23 Florida ... Maxwell National Player of the Week ... Doak Walker National Running Back of the Week ... Walter Camp National FBS Offensive Player of the Week ... Co-SEC Offensive Player of the Week ... East-West Shrine Bowl Breakout Offensive Player of the Week ... CFPA Honorable Mention Performer of the Week
- Had 26 carries for a career-high 280 yards rushing and a career-best three touchdowns rushing in UK's win over the Gators ... Added a nine-yard touchdown reception
- His 280 yards rushing are the third-most in a game in program history, and were just 19 short of the school record
- Became the ninth player in UK history to eclipse 200 yards rushing in a game, while it marked the 13th instance in program history
- His four touchdowns tied the school record for the most total touchdowns in a game
- Became the 13th player in UK history to have four touchdowns in a game, while it marked the 15th instance in program history
- Twice recorded a rushing and receiving TD in the same game (vs. Akron and vs. Florida)
- His performance against Akron marked the fifth game of his career that he has had both a touchdown rushing and a touchdown receiving in the same game ... First Wildcat with two touchdowns of at least 50 yards in the same game since Garrett Johnson at Louisville in 2016 ... With single-game records dating back to the 1940s, became the first player in Kentucky history to have a rushing and receiving touchdown of at least 50 yards in the same game

#### 2022 - Junior (Vanderbilt)

- Named fourth-team All-SEC Team by Phil Steele
- Semifinalist for Comeback Player of the Year after missing all but three games in 2021 with a knee injury
- Returned to rush 232 times for 1,042 yards and five touchdowns in 12 games
- Became the 10th Commodore all-time to rush for 1,000 yards in a single season
- Had five 100-yard rushing games, with a career-high 167 yards vs. South Carolina

- Ranked fourth in the SEC and 33rd nationally in rushing yards per game (86.8)
- Also showed his receiving ability during the season with 29 catches for 169 yards and three TDs
- Finished sixth in the SEC at 100.92 all-purpose yards per game

#### 2021 - r-Sophomore (Vanderbilt)

- Rushed for 211 yards and a touchdown in three games before suffering a season-ending injury week three
- Went for 93 yards in win at Colorado State
- Posted a touchdown against Stanford

#### 2020 - Sophomore (Temple)

- Played in the first four games of the season, ending with rushing for 323 yards and a touchdown (Navy, USF, Memphis and Tulane)
- Caught 12 passes for 62 yards (5.2 yards/reception)

#### 2019 - Freshman (Temple)

- Played in 12 games with five starting assignments
- Earned a varsity letter
- Named First-Team Freshman All-America by Pro Football Focus, rushing for 936 yards on 193 carries for eight touchdowns
- Averaged 78.0 rushing yards/game
- Caught 15 passes for 181 yards and two scores
- Had three 100-yard rushing games, including 157 yards against East Carolina and a 135-yard, 2 TD performance against Georgia Tech that earned American Athletic Conference Player of the Week honors
- In Temple debut, rushed for 60 yards and a touchdown and caught two passes for 78 yards and a score vs. Bucknell
- Reset the single-game rushing high against East Carolina with 157 yards

#### High School

- Played running back and defensive back for coach Jim Saylor at Blair Academy in Blairstown, N.J.
- Played in 33 career games and rushed for 4,815 yards and 59 touchdowns on 375 carries
- Also tallied 80 tackles and six interceptions over his four years as a defensive back
- Helped the Buccaneers to a 5-3 mark as a senior
- An all-around athlete who also participated in basketball, baseball and track for the Lions
