With fireworks exploding over a videoboard bearing a championship logo, Kentucky claimed its second South-eastern Conference regular season championship with a 22-8 mark.

The title came in wire-to-wire fashion. UK won eight of 10 league series and was the only team in the conference to record four sweeps. It also set a school record with 11 road SEC wins.

The victory etched the 2024 team in the record books with its 2006 brethren.

Coach Nick Mingione further stamped his mark on the program in his eighth season. He now has been a part of the coaching staff on both title teams and both squads that have advanced to a Super Regional.








Daly, Moore, Pitre Defensive Team

Nick Lopez was named First-Team All-Southeastern Conference on Monday, capping a sensational season that witnessed him flirt with .400 for much of the campaign. Ryan Waldschmidt earned second team honors, while Mitchell Daly, Mason Moore and Emilien Pitre were named to the All-SEC Defensive Team. The league coaches voted on the awards.

Nick Mingione also was named SEC Coach of the Year for the second time in eight seasons.

Lopez, a graduate transfer from Southern Cal, has been scorching all season before finishing with a .380 batting average and 1.053 OPS in 48 games as Kentucky's primary designated hitter. He also saw early-season time at third and first base.

The Santa Ana, California native scored 52 runs, had 70 hits, two triples, six home runs, 22 walks and drove in 47. His 20 doubles are tied for the third-most in a season in the Mingione era. In SEC play he hit .348 with 31 RBI. He has 23 multi-hit games this season.

Waldschmidt was even hotter in conference play, finishing as one of a handful of players with a batting average over .400 (.405). Overall, he hit .370 with a 1.153 OPS, 59 runs, 16 doubles, 11 home runs, 39 RBI, 31 walks, 16 hit by pitch and 23 stolen bases, which are the most in a season for a player in the Mingione era.

Maybe most impressive was the Bradenton, Florida native produced this season after recovering from a torn ACL in summer baseball in 2023. He did not return to the outfield until several weeks into the season.

Pitre, a junior from Quebec, Canada, earned defensive honors for the second consecutive season. He has been nearly flawless with just two errors in 210 chances this season, a fielding percentage of .990. He forms half the duo of one of the best defensive middle infields in the country and was part of 23 double plays turned this season.

Daly, who excelled at shortstop at his previous stop, moved to third base at UK and has been tremendous, ending several games with defensive gems. The Madison, Alabama native had just two errors in 104 chances this season for a .981 fielding percentage and gave the Cats an athletic, fearless presence at third.

Moore, from Morehead, Kentucky, showed off the range and athleticism at pitcher that made him a star basketball player in high school. He was flawless in 14 chances off the mound and helped make sure two of three would-be base stealers were caught stealing against him.





















### **2024 JUST MEANS MORE**

The 2024 SEC season has been a truly historic run for Kentucky, as they have rewritten the record book in terms of wins and success. For just the second time in school history, and the first since 2006, the Wildcats claimed the SEC Regular Season Championship, splitting the title with Tennessee, The Wildcats also set new program-best marks in several team categories including:

- Wins (22)
- Series Wins (8: Georgia, Missouri, Ole Miss, Alabama, Auburn, Arkansas, Florida, Vanderbilt)
- Most series sweeps in SEC (4)
- 11-1 record against SEC West Opponents
- Double-Digit runs in 12 SEC games
- Two-Year SEC Win Total (38)
- Best SEC Start (15-1)
- SEC Road Record (11-4)

### **BIGGIE BOX**

One of the pillars of UK's offense is working its game goals in search of the big inning - "Biggie Box" - which is defined as any inning where the Cats put three or more runs on the scoreboard. The approach has been incredibly effective during the Mingione era and the Cats have done it 69 times in 2024. The Cats also are 191-37 under Mingione when scoring six or more runs. (See box on page 18 for Biggie Box innings)

### S-E-C S-E-C S-E-C

Kentucky earned six honors in the conference's annual postseason awards, headlined by Nick Mingione's second SEC Coach of the Year honor. Mingione won the award for the first time since 2017, his first season at the program's helm. Nick Lopez was honored with first team honors at the UTL/DH position, while Ryan Waldschmidt was named a second team outfielder. A league leading three Wildcats earned all-defensive team honors. Émilien Pitre earned the honor at second base for the second-consecutive year, while Mitch Daly was honored at third base and Mason Moore collected the laurel at pitcher.

### **BEST OF THE BEST**

Kentucky's rise to the top of the SEC play can be attributed, in part, to the statistical surge in conference games by the Wildcats. Kentucky led the league in SEC-only batting average, was third in SEC-only fielding percentage, and fifth in SEC-only ERA. Only one other school (Texas A&M) was top-five in all three major categories in conference competition this season. The Cats also led the league in OBP, runs scored, hits, RBI, doubles, sac bunts, sac flies, and stolen bases. Ryan Waldschmidt led the league in doubles and stolen bases in SEC play, and was also top-five in batting average, on-base percentage, runs scored, and hits. Ryan Nicholson provided major power for the Cats in SEC play, finding himself in the top-five for slugging percentage, home runs, and runs batted in.

### **BEATING THE BEST**

Kentucky has put together one of the best resumes in the nation this season, highlighted by their sparkling 19-6 record against Q1 foes. The 19 wins against the best competition in the sport is the best in the nation by five games. Among teams who have played at least 18 Q1 games, Kentucky's six losses are the fewest in the country.

### **SLAYING THE DRAGON**

Kentucky picked up series wins against Arkansas, Florida, and Vanderbilt in the same season for the first time in program history. Entering the season, Coach Nick Mingione only owned one series win against any of those three schools (Vanderbilt, 2017) in his entire tenure at Kentucky.

### **POWER SOURCE**

Kentucky flourished in 2023 with a new take on "small" ball and rode the chaos, as Coach Mingione likes to call the approach, to a Super Regional berth. The Cats weren't devoid of power by any means but have married the two styles quite well in 2024 with the addition of a bit more thump in the lineup.

### YOU GET A ROS(ZEL)

Kentucky's pitching staff has benefitted greatly from the work of Dan Roszel, who has spent the majority of his coaching career at East Carolina and Kentucky. He also helped develop Atlanta star lefty Chris Sale. Since arriving at UK prior to the 2020 season his pitching staff has struck out 10 batters per nine innings. In 2022, the unit set the school record for strikeouts in a season with 593.

In the 2023 Lexington Regional the Wildcats tossed a pair of shutouts, the first time they've blanked an opponent in the NCAA Tournament in the modern era and overall since 1949. Also, Roszel's unit allowed just 13 total runs in five games and sophomore Mason Moore threw 10 shutout innings before adding four more versus eventual national champion LSU in the Baton Rouge Super Regional. This season, UK ranks among the nationally leaders in fewest hits allowed per nine innings, shutouts and WHIP.

Roszel has a lengthy track record of producing big leaguers and saw three of his former players at Florida Gulf Coast, including Sale and MLBers Richard Bleier and Casey Coleman, inducted into the school's athletics Hall of Fame in the past two years.

### **ROAD WARRIORS**

The Wildcats have hit the road this season, playing away from home for the first two weekends of the year, in addition to its five SEC road series. The Cats racked up an impressive 16-5 record in road games this season, and an 18-6 record in all games away from Kentucky Proud Park. The 24 non-home games is tied for most in the SEC (Alabama). Kentucky also owns the best winning percentage among SEC teams in true road games this season at .762. The next closest team in the league is Tennesse at .600. The Cats have also set program best marks with 16 road wins and 11 SEC road wins.

### **#PACKKPP**

Against Tennessee, the Big Blue Nation showed up in support of their Wildcats in a major way, shattering single-game and three-game series attendance records. All three games broke the previous Kentucky Baseball attendance record of 6,796 set in Game 7 of the 2023 NCAA Lexington Regional. Game Two of the Tennessee series mark of 7,304 attendance stands as the new attendance record for the program, marking the first time 7,000+ people have attended a Kentucky baseball game. Overall, 21,023 people attended the series, smashing the previous record of 12,815 that was set in the final series at Cliff Hagan Stadium in 2018.

### MIDDLE INNING POP

The Wildcats have done the majority of their damage in the middle of games this season, outscoring opponents 231-135 during innings three through six. The fourth inning has been the most productive inning for the Cats scoring a team high 63 runs and owning a score differential of +37, the best of any inning.

### **BREAK OUT THE BROOMS**

Kentucky swept four of its first five SEC series this season on its way to a program-best 15-1 start to conference play. With sweeps over Georgia, Ole Miss, Alabama, and Auburn, the Cats were the only school in the SEC to sweep four conference series this season. The Cats also avoided getting swept in all ten series, a feat only accomplished once since 2008 (2017).

### **PITCHING MASTERCLASS**

In Kentucky's series sweep over No. 11 Alabama, the Cats only needed to use five arms over the three games. On Friday night, Trey Pooser delivered an electric start of 7.0 innings of two-run baseball, before Travis Smith tossed the final two innings of the 6-2 win. However, Saturday's performance by Dominic Niman proved to be the weekend's showstopper, as the



graduate transfer from Central Connecticut State tossed a complete game shutout. Niman allowed three
hits, zero walks, seven strikeouts, and three exactly 100 pitches over the nine innings to earn SEC
Pitcher of the Week honors. Mason Moore followed his rotation mates on Sunday, throwing seven innings
while only allowing one run. Jackson Nove threw the final two innings of the series as Kentucky won all
three games.

### **FREE BASEBALL**

Kentucky is 3-1 in extra-inning games this season, with all four games coming on the road. Despite falling at South Carolina in 10 innings, the Wildcats picked up an 11-inning win at Missouri, and two 10-inning wins at Florida, all thanks to a "Biggie" inning. At Mizzou, Kentucky scored six runs in the 11th. At Florida, Kentucky took game one thanks to three runs in the tenth, before clinching the series in game three after a four run tenth. All three wins featured multi-RBI doubles to help seal the deal, as Emilien Pitre (Mizzou G1), Nick Lopez (Florida G1), and Patrick Herrera (Florida G3) each picked up clutch hits in the extra frames. Since 2020, Kentucky is 10-2 in extra-inning affairs.

### **SEC SLUGGERS**

Kentucky has hit 56 of its 75 home runs this season in SEC play, good for 74.7 percent. While the Cats are only ninth in the SEC in total home runs, that ranking jumps to fifth with only including SEC games. Additionally, at nearly 75 percent, Kentucky leads the league in percentage of home runs hit in conference play, displaying the firepower of the Kentucky offense against some of the best pitchers in the nation.

### **PORTAL POWER - THE SEQUEL**

Having hit the jackpot in the NCAA transfer portal a season ago, which was a key foundational piece in the team that reached the NCAA Super Regional for the second time in seven seasons, Kentucky is has mined gems from that fertile resource yet again.

On the position player side, the strong defensive group can also find a barrel. The group of IF Mitchell Daly, IF Ryan Nicholson, IF Nick Lopez, OF Ty Crittenberger and OF Ben Higdon all have Division I experience and posted the following career numbers at that level entering the season: 622 games played with 547 starts, .278 average in over 2,000 at bats, 362 runs, 123 doubles, eight triples, 68 home runs, 329 RBI, 260 base on balls, 66 stolen bases and 41 hit by pitch. It has received major contributions in 2024 from Daly, Lopez and Nicholson.

### THIEVES OF THE INDUSTRY

- In eight years under coach Nick Mingione the Wildcats have swiped 587 bases in 764 attempts, a success rate of 77 percent.
- In 2023, for the first time in school history (for which stats are available, 1969) the Cats had four players with at least 15 stolen bases.
- In 2023, UK stole more than 80 bases for the third time in Mingione's tenure.
- In 2021, the Cats stole 78 bases in 86 attempts. It was the highest success rate (90.7) of any Division I-A team with 50+ stolen bases.
- The Cats return two players in 2024 with at least 17 steals a season ago.
- In total, incoming transfers stole 27 bases last season and true freshman Griffin Cameron ranked third in his collegiate summer league (Prospect League) with 34 swipes.
- UK has five players on the 2024 roster with at least 15 career stolen bases, including three with at least 30.
- Emilien Pitre has 42 stolen bases in a Kentucky uniform, which ranks 9th on the school's career list. Ryan Waldschmidt has stolen 40 bags in a Kentucky uniform and 58 total.

Kentucky has stolen at least 53 bases in each of the six full seasons Mingione has been head coach and had more than 75 four times.

Conversely, the group of LHP Dominic Niman, RHP Trey Pooser, RHP Cooper Robinson, RHP Cameron O'Brien, RHP Robert Hogan and RHP Johnny Hummel have massive experience at the D-I and D-II levels. In 258 games pitched entering the season it had pitched 660.2 innings, 53-27 record, 26 saves, 667 strikeouts and 653 hits allowed. Niman is tied for the team lead in wins, Hummel leads the team in saves, Hogan and O'Brien are critical pieces of the bullpen and Pooser has solidified the Friday night starter role.

### **WALDY'S WORLD**

Kentucky's Ryan Waldschmidt has emerged as one of the best leadoff hitters in the country, leading the team with a blistering .405 batting average in SEC play. Recently named to the All-SEC Second Team, Waldschmidt leads the league in doubles and stolen bases in SEC play, and is also top-five in batting average, on-base percentage, runs scored, and hits. Recovering from a torn ACL suffered in the Cape Cod League in the Summer of 2023, Waldschmidt had to start the season on the bench as he awaited full clearance to return to competition. Since his return, first as a pinch hitter and a designated hitter, then to his normal position in left field, he has excelled at the top of Kentucky's lineup, setting the table with an overall batting average of .370, an overall OBP of .500, as well as 18 multi-hit, and 10 multi-RBI, games. His 27 extra base hits (16 doubles, 11 home runs) and 23 stolen bases are team highs.

### OUI, OUI

Infielder Emilien Pitre was a revelation for the Cats in 2023, batting .318 with more walks than strikeouts, 18 extra-base hits, 51 RBI and 20 stolen bases. Credit the coaching staff for discovering the Canadien and earning his commitment to UK as a 130-pound high schooler who barely spoke English outside of his native French. He has quickly assimilated to the culture and language of college baseball. He was named Second Team All-SEC and SEC All-Defensive Team in his first season as a regular after seeing just four at-bats as a freshman in 2022. In 2024, Pitre hit .310, with a career-high eight home runs, 49 RBI, and a team-leading 37 walks. He was also named to the 2024 SEC All-Defensive team at second base, the second consecutive year he has earned that honor.

### **POWER OF POSITIVITY**

Redshirt junior catcher Devin Burkes has become beloved amongst teammates and fans because of his relentless positivity, pursuit of greatness and willingness to wait his turn and earn his opportunities in an increasingly impatient world. His infectious smile and edgy flair has made him one of college baseball's most likeable student-athletes, but where does it come from? He gets it from his momma, Denise.

Every day you've got something to live for, play for, love on somebody for because we don't know who is going to be there when we wake up the next day. Got it from Momma Burkes."

### **MUSTACHE MAGIC**

Nick Lopez, an All-SEC First Team selection as a designated hitter, has emerged as a top bat for Kentucky in his final season of college baseball. Beginning his career at UIC, before making stops at the Junior College level and USC, Lopez arrived in Lexington and has made an immediate impact, leading the team in batting average at .380. He has excelled at an extremely high level all season, all while rocking the best mustache in college baseball. A switch hitter, Lopez has displayed power from both sides of the plate this season, even homering from each side of the box on April 13 at Auburn. He leads the team with 28 multi-hit games, and is tied with Ryan Nicholson for the team lead with 14 multi-RBI games, including two games with 5 RBI (Game 3 at Auburn and Game 1 at Florida).

### ON THE DALY

Mitchell Daly, a transfer infielder from Texas, brings a winning pedigree to UK, having played in a pair of College World Series and a Super Regional in his three seasons with the Longhorns. He was a Freshman All-American and All-Big 12 honoree as a freshman in 2021 and has started 209 career games. He can play second base, shortstop and third base and provides invaluable leadership and winning mentality to the Cats' lineup. This season, he has held down the third base position, hitting .293 with six home runs, 40 RBI, and 32 walks. Daly was named to the 2024 All-SEC Defensive Team and also hit the Cats' only grand slam this season in the middle game of the Karbach Round Rock Classic against Texas State.

### IN THE NICH (OLSON) OF TIME

Graduate INF Ryan Nicholson, a Cincinnati transfer and Louisville native, has excelled in his only year as a Wildcat, leading the team in home runs (17) and RBI (52). He has provided major power for the Cats in SEC play, finding himself in the top-five for slugging percentage, home runs, and runs batted in. Furthermore, 15 of his 17 home runs and 38 of his 52 RBI have come in conference play, where he was a .315 hitter. Nicholson also leads the team with 14 multi-RBI games, with 10 games of at least 3 runs driven in. Nicholson had five multi-homer games this season, all coming in SEC play (3/17-Georgia; 4/7-Alabama; 4/12-Auburn; 4/27-South Carolina; 5/10-Florida). From April 7 to April 16, Nicholson blasted seven home runs in six games, including at least one in all three games at Auburn.

### **BIG MAC**

Redshirt-sophomore UTL James McCoy has become the everyday starter in right field this season, while also seeing some time on the mound as a relief pitcher. In the field, he has picked up a pair of outfield assists while also making multiple impressive grabs but has made some serious noise at the plate. In the final two games of the series at Ole Miss, McCoy went 7-8 at the plate, with five RBI, four runs, and two home runs. He has five three-hit performances this season, all in SEC play. McCoy is also a valuable asset to the Kentucky bullpen, often entering in late game situations. He has four innings pitched this season across six appearances. He has not allowed an earned run and even picked up a save in Kentucky's series clinching win at Mizzou on March 24.

#### **GRANT-IN-AID**

Kentucky shortstop Grant Smith quietly made a massive impact on the program in 2023 and is despite nagging injuries has had an even better senior campaign. Beyond the raw statistics, Smith was one of three finalists nationally for the Rawlings Gold Glove, led the SEC with 11 sacrifice bunts and had eight bunt hits in 11 tries in 2023.

### P000000005

Senior RHP Trey Pooser, a transfer from College of Charleston, has emerged as Kentucky's Friday Night starter, and has dominated in his role since making his first start on March 22 at Missouri. Used out of the bullpen for the entire non-conference slate, an injury to Travis Smith pushed Pooser into the rotation, a spot he would never relinquish due to his outstanding performance. Pooser ended the season with a 4-1 record, with his only losing decision at the hands of Arkansas and Hagen Smith. He led all Wildcat starters with a 4.15 ERA in conference play and went at least five innings in all but one start this season.

### DOM(INANT) NIMAN

Kentucky LHP Dominic Niman has been everything the Cats could have hoped for and more through his first 10 starts, posting 7-3 record as the Saturday starter. Niman was named SEC Pitcher of the Week after tossing a

three-hit shutout vs. then-No. 11 Alabama, which entered the game with one the nation's prolific offenses. Niman held them to their lowest run and hit total on the season. He joins MLBers Sean Hjelle and Zack Thompson as the three Cats who have thrown shutouts in the Nick Mingione era.



### **IT JUST MEANS MOORE**

Junior pitcher Mason Moore burst onto the scene during a sensational 2023 season that included 14 shutout innings pitched in the NCAA Tournament.

He tossed the final 5.0 innings of UK's wins over both Ball State in its NCAA opener and in the regional championship victory over Indiana, then blanked the high-powered offense of eventual national champion LSU for four innings in the Super Regional. He is 8-2 in his role as Sunday starter in 2024, picking up four wins against ranked teems (Georgia, Ole Miss, Alabama, Arkansas), and was named to the 2024 SEC All-Defensive team.

### **NEXT MAN UP**

Patrick Herrera has been one of the most versatile players for Kentucky this season, filling in for multiple players in multiple positions. A natural infielder, he spent most of the non-conference season in the outfield while injured Wildcats like Ryan Waldschmidt and Nolan McCarthy recovered from injuries. At Florida, he moved over to third base while Grant Smith was battling injuries as well. He has excelled at the plate in his opportunities this season, including a three-RBI performance in the Round Rock Classic Finale against Kansas, a 6-11 weekend against Lipscomb, and an incredible game against Miami (Ohio) where he reached base in all six of his plate appearances, despite not registering an official at bat (4 BB, 2 HBP). However, Herrera's most impactful game came in the series finale at the Swamp, where he went 2-3, with a walk, HBP, 4 RBI, and the game-winning bases clearing double in the top of the tenth inning.

### **WELCOME BACK. HAGS**

After missing much of the first half of the season due to injury, senior RHP Ryan Hagenow returned to action on April 9 at Samford and has since solidified himself as one of the key members of the Kentucky bullpen. He has seen action in each of the last six SEC series of the season, not surrendering a run until the ninth inning of an 11-3 win over No. 2 Arkansas. He picked up his first save of the season in Kentucky's wild 15-13 win at South Carolina, and has picked up a pair of SEC victories late in the season, taking the win in Game 1 at Florida before becoming the pitcher of record in Kentucky's SEC Championship-clinching victory over Vanderbilt on May 17.

### **THE FIREMAN**

Senior RHP Cameron O'Brien, a transfer from Campbell, has carved out a unique role in Kentucky's pitching staff this season. Dubbed "The Fireman" by Coach Mingione, O'Brien's main role has been to enter the game with runners on base and finish out innings without any damage. As such, he leads the team with 28 appearances this season. With only one appearance of two innings or more this season, O'Brien has accepted and excelled in his role of putting out fires on the basepaths. He was exceptional in the middle of the season, going an entire month without allowing an earned run, starting on March 24 at Mizzou before ending on April 26 at South Carolina.

### **LEAVE IT TO CLEAVER**

Highly touted freshman Ben Cleaver has been limited this season due to injuries, but came up clutch in a major way to clinch Kentucky's series win at Florida on May 12. With two-outs in the bottom of the tenth, and the Cats nursing a two-run lead, Cleaver entered the game with the tying runs in scoring position. He proceeded to strike out the Gator batter in three pitches to pick up the first save of his career in his first appearance since March 19.

### **BOBBY SPINS**

RHP Robert Hogan, a transfer from Texas A&M, has emerged late in the season as a high-leverage member of the Kentucky bullpen. Hogan has pitched the majority of his innings in SEC action and has acted as a key middle inning reliever. His best performance of the season came in Kentucky's comeback victory in the series finale at Auburn, where he threw 3.0 shutout innings, only allowing one hit while also picking up his first career winning decision in SEC play.











### LIGHTNING STRIKE

Graduate RHP Johnny Hummel has stepped into the closer role for the Cats this season, leading the team with six saves while also picking up a winning decision in three games. After spending the first four years of his career at Division II Erskine College in Due West, South Carolina, Hummel has made the major jump to the Southeastern Conference with some outstanding performances, including earning his first SEC victory after 3.1 scoreless innings at Missouri. He also picked up saves in five SEC games (at Ole MIss, at Auburn x2, Tennessee, Arkansas). A big fan of the Cars franchise, Hummel, also known as Lightning, walks out to the mound to Sheryl Crow's Real Gone in homage to Lightning McQueen.

### **SMALL NAME, BIG GAME**

Freshman Eli Small has provided some big lifts for Kentucky as a pinch hitter. In the first at bat of his career at USC Upstate, Small launched his first career home run. Small was the first Wildcat to launch a home run in their first career-at bat since T.J. Collett in 2017. In the series opener at Florida, Small also delivered, hitting a game-tying RBI double with two outs in the eighth inning. Kentucky would eventually win that game 12-11 in ten innings.

### **AUSTIN, POWERED!**

Former All-American, professional ballplayer, two-time Gold Glove winner and USA Baseball alum Austin Cousino has returned to his alma mater as an assistant coach/recruiting coordinator on Nick Mingione's staff. Cousino already has tapped into his immense professional scouting experience with a pair of organizations to get the Wildcats' recruiting off to a strong start with Cousino as its lead recruiter. The former Wildcat starred at UK from 2012-14 and is considered one of the top all-around players to have suited up for the Blue and White. He also played in both the Angels and Mariners' farm systems and reached Triple-A before a shoulder injury derailed his career.

### THE LAW FIRM OF SALOW & FITTS

Austin Cousino wasn't the only former Kentucky great to return to Lexington in the offseason, as former All-American and first team All-SEC pitcher Logan Salow came back to his Bluegrass roots as a graduate manager. Salow was a critical component of the 2017 squad that became the first to reach a Super Regional in school history before being drafted by the Athletics in the sixth round and spending five seasons in professional baseball, where he struck out 11.9 batters per nine innings and reached Triple-A. He appeared 95 times in a UK uniform, pitching to a 3.40 earned run average and leaving as the program's single-season saves leader (12 in 2017, tied with Trevor Gott) and No. 2 on the school's career saves list with 16.

Joining him in providing invaluable experience around the program is former Mississippi State star pitcher Trevor Fitts, now UK's Director of Player Development. Fitts had a 2.63 ERA in 62 games with the Bulldogs.

### **#EVERYTHINGSCHOOL**

Under the direction of athletics director Mitch Barnhart, UK has greatly enhanced its athletic profile across the entire department since his arrival. In recent years, volleyball and rifle each have national championships, football has had a pair of 10-win seasons and Citrus Bowl championships, men's tennis finished national runners-up (2022), SEC Tournament Champions (2023, 2024), and SEC Regular Season Champions (2024), men's soccer completed an undefeated regular season and No. 1 overall seed in NCAA Tournament (2022), baseball reached a pair of Super Regionals (2017, 2023) and won

an SEC Championship (2024), softball advanced to the WCWS (2014), women's swimming won the Southeastern Conference title (2021), track and field and gymnastics (2023 6th Place Finish) each cemented their status as elite programs on the national scene, and women's basketball won the SEC Tournament for the second time in 2022. That's not to mention the continued excellence of men's basketball and cheerleading, all of which culminated in a school-record ninth place finish in the Director's Cup standings for 2021-22.

### THE NEW SEC

Beginning with the 2025 season, Oklahoma and Texas will deepen an already incredibly challenging league and the SEC has announced a new scheduling format that features a pair of permanent opponents for each school, including South Carolina and Vanderbilt for Kentucky. As previously announced, teams will play a three-game series against two permanent opponents and eight rotating opponents for a total of 30 conference games. Standings will be kept in a single-division format, eliminating divisional standings.

### **FUELED BY VETERANS**

In contrast to 2023, the 2024 version of UK baseball is much more of a known entity. The Cats will have returning starters at catcher, second base, shortstop, left field and right field, as well as a handful of arms who played large roles a season ago. Add senior Reuben Church and veteran transfer starters at first base, third base, centerfield and designated hitter and this is as experienced a team as there is in the Southeastern Conference.

### **MINGIONE IS SUPER-B**

Kentucky coach Nick Mingione is writing his name all over the school's record books. In addition to being on the coaching staff of all three teams that have hosted a regional (assistant in 2006, head coach in 2017 and 2023), he is the only head coach to guide UK to a Super Regional, now having done in twice in the last six NCAA Tournaments. Kentucky captured the heart of the Big Blue Nation in 2023, playing an exciting brand of baseball that led to large crowds, a top RPI rating and one of the 16 NCAA Regional host locations. When the Cats battled back and advanced to face eventual national champion LSU it marked the program's second-ever Super Regional appearance, both of which have been orchestrated during Coach Mingione's tenure.

### **DESTINATION: LEXINGTON**

Kentucky signed another strong recruiting class last November, this time focusing heavily on the high school ranks instead of mining the NCAA transfer portal for immediate, experienced help. UK also kept the Commonwealth's top talent at home, bringing in seven players from inside the state, including four of Prep Baseball Report's top nine prospects. UK also snagged recruits from Georgia, Illinois, Indiana and Missouri.

### **SERIOUSLY STAFFED**

Kentucky's baseball staff is full of proven winners with College World Series, USA Baseball experience and more. Head coach Nick Mingione was part of the coaching staff when UK won its first - and only - Southeastern Conference championship in 2006, has been to five College World Series at various levels and been mentored by some of the game's best minds.

Additionally, pitching coach Dan Roszel has coached multiple conference championship squads and been to three Super Regionals, hitting coach and recruiting coordinator Austin Cousino was part of the 2012 UK team that still owns the school-record for victories and a two-time member of the USA

### "THE HOOK"

One of the personal touches to the Wildcats' home, Kentucky Proud Park, is "The Hook," which is the name of the visting bullpen just beyond the right field wall. The name is a tribute to former UK pitcher Jonathan Hooker, who pitched for the Cats from 1998-2001, and died in the plane crash of Comair Flight 5191 on Aug. 27, 2006 in Lexington.

Hooker and his wife, Scarlett Parsley, were married the night before and were on the early-morning flight headed to their honeymoon when the pilots attempted to take off from the wrong runway and crashed into a neighboring field. Forty-nine of the 50 people on board were killed, including both Hooker and Parsley.

The London, Ky. native was a beloved teammate and member of UK Baseball and his family were honored on Mar. 29, 2019 during an in-game ceremony to officially unveil "The Hook," which features a sign and memorial to the former Wildcat.

## **HEAD COACH NICK MINGIONE**

Kentucky fans have quickly created a bond with **Nick Mingione**, whose infectious and unrelenting enthusiasm and down-to-earth personality has earned legions of new fans. Although it is certainly an ingredient in Mingione's on-field success, getting the best out of his players has been the biggest factor in the success he's achieved everywhere he's been. In 19 full seasons of coaching the teams he's been involved with have averaged 38 victories a year and advanced to the postseason 10 times with two national runner-up finishes. He already is the third-winningest coach in Kentucky history.

Mingione had a brilliant playing career at Embry-Riddle - he ranks 10th on its career hits list - where he helped lead the program to 154 victories and three NAIA World Series appearances in three seasons as an assistant. When he arrived at Kentucky in 2006 he was immediately part of what is still the Cats' only SEC championship club, then smelled success at Mississippi State before returning to the one place he had always wanted to be a head coach - UK. First season, first Super Regional appearance for the Cats.

He made it a point to have his team involved in the community, part of his "Student. Person. Player." guiding principle of the program, participating in numerous philanthropic events in Lexington while also taking time for more than 100 local speaking engagements. In his first season his ethos for the program was on full display as UK players earned SEC Pitcher of the Year, SEC Scholar Athlete of the Year and SEC Community Service Team honors. He recently was named the winner of 2022 Fellowship of Christian Athletes Jerry Kindall Character in Coaching Award.

Mingione became the winngest UK coach during the first three seasons of his tenure with 103 total wins and 39 in SEC play. The success has carried over to the Major League Baseball Draft, where Mingione and his staff's ability to groom players for a professional career has led to 33 players being selected in the past six MLB Drafts. The 21 players selected in the 2017 and 2018 drafts were the most of any program in the country and Mignione has helped mentor two top 20 overall picks in first baseman Evan White (17th, 2017) and left-handed pitcher Zack Thompson (19th, 2019).

Mingione has a sterling reputation as a recruiter. Over the 15 seasons at Kentucky and Mississippi State for which recruiting rankings are final, he has helped land classes with an average ranking of 15th, including top-three classes in 2013-15. He also has an unmatched track record of player development, coaching 86 players selected in the MLB Draft, as well as 46 All-Americans and six conference players of the year. His first recruiting class at Kentucky was ranked in the Top 10 of all the major industry outlets.



The Cats have walked it off 18 times since Nick Mingione took over as head coach before the 2017 season, including five run rule games.



### **MLB TRAINING GROUND**

Kentucky has made its presence felt in the Major League Baseball Draft in recent years with 36 players selected during the Nick Mingione era, including 21 in 2017 and 2018, which was the most of any college program in the country over that span. In Evan White (2017) and Zack Thompson (2019) the Cats have had two first-round selections under Mingione. In the last seven drafts:

- 19 Wildcats were selected in the first 10 rounds.
- Eight were selected in the first five rounds, including first-rounders Evan White (2017) and Zack Thompson (2019).
- The 13 picks in 2018 are the second-most for any school in a single draft since 2006 and tied for an SEC record with Texas A&M (2016) and national champion Vanderbilt (2019).
- The 23 underclassmen drafted during that span earned \$13.358 million in signing bonus money, an average of \$581,000 per player.
  - All but one draftee was selected higher than previously selected.
  - 26 of the draftees had not previously been drafted.
- White was named a 2020 ÅL Gold Glove winner, the first rookie first baseman in either league to win the award since is inception in 1957.



### **BASEBALL MINDS IN THE PROS**

Former Wildcat Vince Harrison has been named the manager of the Dayton Dragons, the class High-A affiliate for the Cincinnati Reds, for the 2024 season. A former football and baseball player at Kentucky, Harrison has remained in the game of baseball and is one of three former players in non-playing roles with a Major League Baseball organization. Collin Cowgill remains an assistant coach with the Reds and former MLB manager and UK all-time hits leader Andy Green has joined the New York Mets' front office.











### KENTUCKY PROUD PARK

Kentucky baseball moved into a new home for the 2019 season, opening the \$49 million Kentucky Proud Park, a state-of-the-art facility immediately considered one of the top facilities in all of college baseball. The Wildcats won their first game in their new home, defeating Eastern Kentucky, 7-3, on Feb. 26, 2019.

The stadium features permanent seating for nearly 2,500 fans with additional space on grass berms to accommodate 5,000 fans for regular season games. Beyond the outfield wall, temporary bleachers can be installed for NCAA Tournament games to bring the seating capacity to more than 7,000.

The team areas were a priority and give our players and coaches everything they need to compete at a high level in a single location. The facility features a team lounge, locker room, training area, indoor hitting and pitching areas, and coaching offices, as well as a recruiting room. All spaces are either new to UK baseball or significantly larger than previous ones.

The name is a tribute to farmers and businesses of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and the Big Blue Nation. Kentucky Farm Bureau secured the rights to name the stadium from JMI Sports, UK Athletics' multimedia rights partner. In turn, Kentucky Farm Bureau elected to name the stadium for Kentucky Proud, the state's official agricultural marketing program housed at the Kentucky Department of Agriculture. No state tax-payer dollars were used in funding the agreement. The Kentucky Proud program is funded through the generosity of the Kentucky Agricultural Development Fund. The fund is directed by the Kentucky Agricultural Development Board and administered by the Governor's Office of Agricultural Policy.

New black padding replaced the existing blue look for the 2023 season, including on the outfield fence, dugout railings and behind home plate.
