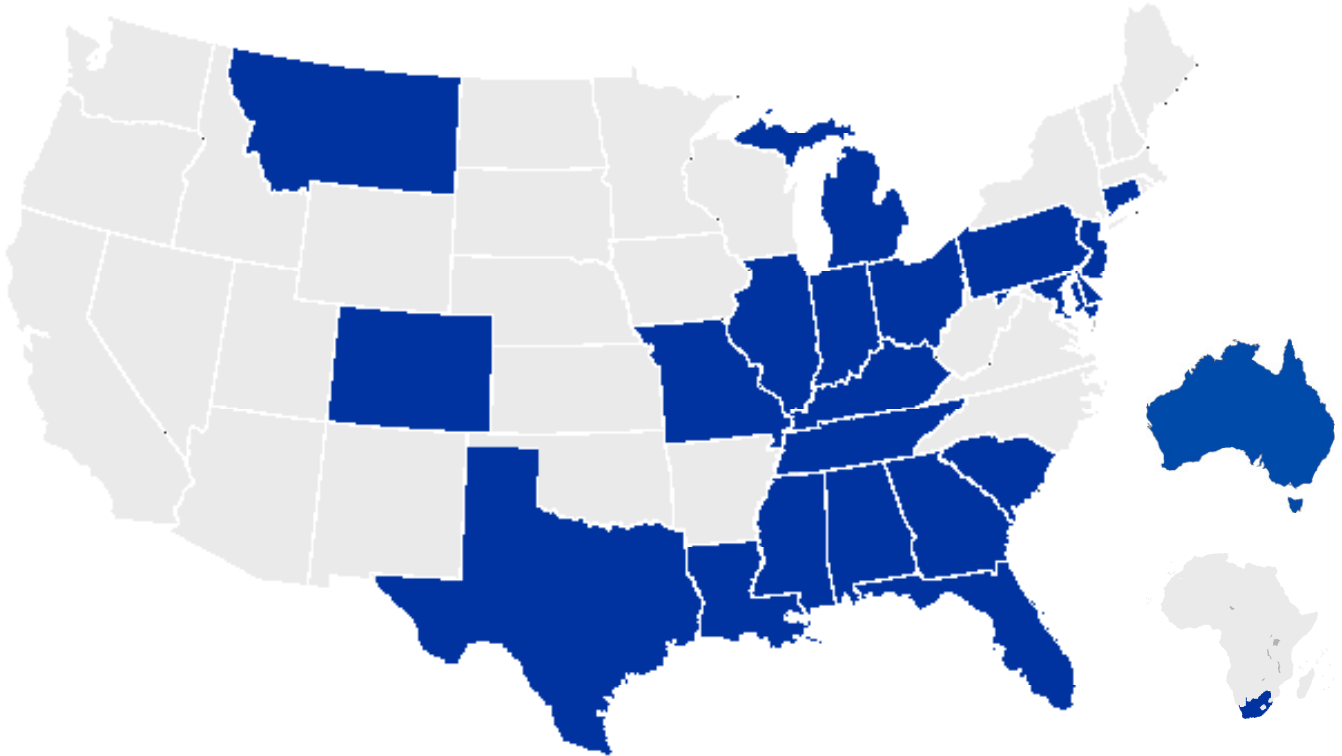

### 2024 - Junior

- Dean's List (Spring 2024)
- Has played in 28 career games with 16 starting assignments
- Earned a starting spot vs. South Carolina
- Currently ranks fourth in the SEC in tackles for loss (2.0 per game)
- Had two tackles, including a career-high 2.0 tackles for loss with one pass breakup in the win over Southern Miss
- Also had a career-high tying 2.0 TFL vs. South Carolina
- Moved to inside linebacker after seeing action as a defensive back his first two seasons

### 2023 - Sophomore

- Started in 12 of 13 games played in 2023



- Totaled 49 tackles, 5.5 for loss, 1.0 sack, one quarterback hurry, one pass breakup, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery this season
- Had a career-high nine tackles, including five solo tackles and one tackle for loss (-1 yard) in the win over Florida ... Had two tackles on third down that forced punts, plus a fourth-down stop that turned over the ball on downs
- Had eight tackles and a career-high tying 1.5 tackles for loss in the season opener vs. Ball State ... Forced a fumble on the UK 34 in the second quarter, helping Kentucky record its first scoop-and-score since 2019
- Got a fumble recovery vs. EKU
- Totaled four tackles, a sack and his first career pass breakup vs. Mississippi State
- Had five tackles in the win over No. 9 Louisville and vs. Clemson in the Gator Bowl

2022 - Freshman

- Played in all 13 games with three starts
- Totaled 21 tackles, 3.0 tackles for loss, 1.0 sack and one quarterback hurry
- Charted his first collegiate sack in the season opener vs. Miami Ohio ... Totaled six tackles in his debut and also shared a tackle for loss in addition to the sack
- Led UK with five tackles in the win over Youngstown State ... Also had a tackle for loss
- Earned his first collegiate start and recorded three tackles in the win over Northern Illinois
- Named to First-Year SEC Academic Honor Roll

- 247sports ranked him as the No. 214 overall player in the nation and No. 9 athlete

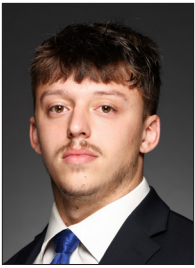

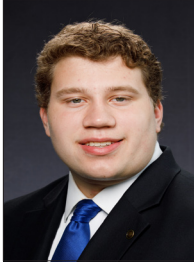
