QUICK NOTES

- Kentucky will go back on the road to face No. 7/7 Tennessee on Saturday, Nov. 2 at 7:45 p.m. ET at Neyland Stadium in Knoxville, Tennessee, while UK's second bye week of the season follows
- UK has faced two teams ranked in the top 10 already this season, just narrowly falling to No. 1/1 Georgia, 13-12, at home on Sept. 14 and winning at No. 6/5 Ole Miss, 20-17, on the road on Sept. 28.
- UK is looking to chart its first victory over Tennessee since 2020, a 34-7 win in Knoxville.
- The Wildcats will also look to snap a three-game losing streak on the season, suffering losses to Vanderbilt at home, 20-13, on Oct. 12, to Florida on the road, 48-20, on Oct. 19 and Auburn at home, 24-10.
 - Prior to that, Kentucky defeated No. 6/5 Ole Miss, 20-17, on the road on Sept. 28, which marked its highest-ranked triumph at an opponent's SEC campus stadium in program history. It also marked UK's highest-ranked triumph in the Mark Stoops era.
- In UK's recent loss at UF on Oct. 19, return specialist, Barion Brown, recorded his fifth-career kickoff return touchdown, running the ball back 99 yards.
 - His five career kickoff return touchdowns broke the Southeastern Conference record, while he also remains the NCAA active career leader.
 - He also recorded a 45-yard touchdown reception in that game, too, becoming the first player in program history to have two games featuring a kickoff return TD and a touchdown catch of at least 45 yards.
- Dane Key, a junior wide receiver, leads the team with 39 receptions for 587 yards in 2024.
 - Of his 39 receptions, 12 have been 20 yards or more.
 - For his career he has 118 receptions - 14th in program history - for 1,742 yards - seventh in program history.
- The Wildcat defense ranks in the nation's top 25 in four categories - fewest first downs allowed (14th), red zone defense (18th), total defense (21st) and kickoff return defense (23rd).
- J.J. Weaver, a graduate outside linebacker, has 37.5 career tackles for loss which ranks third in school history. He needs 3.5 more to tie Josh Allen at No. 2 (41). His 21.5 career sacks rank fourth in school history and he needs 2.0 more to tie Alvin "Bud" Dupree at No. 3 (23.5)
- Weaver was recently named a semifinalist for the Jason Witten Collegiate Man of the Year and he is a semifinalist for the Wuerffel Trophy as well as a member of the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team for his work with children's grieving.
- Jordan Lovett, a junior defensive back, has led or tied UK in total tackles the past three games, averaging 8.6 during that span.
 - Following his eight tackles against Auburn, he now leads the team with 44 stops, four more than Jamon Dumas-Johnson and five more than D'Eryk Jackson, who has led the team the past two seasons.
- Kentucky football head coach Mark Stoops is the longest-tenured active head coach in the SEC and the sixth longest-tenured active head coach in FBS.
 - Now in his 12th season at Kentucky, Stoops is one of only 19 head coaches who have coached at least 12 seasons at an SEC school since the league's first season in 1933.

KENTUCKY VS. TENNESSEE

THE SERIES

- Saturday marks the 120th meeting between the border rivals.
- The two teams have met annually since 1919, except when Kentucky did not field a team in 1943.
 - The 120 all-time meetings are the most for UK against any one opponent.
- Kentucky trails in the all-time series against Tennessee, 84-26-9.
 - The Wildcats also trail the series in Knoxville, 44-11-6.
- UT has won the last three straight meetings, and five of the last seven meetings.
 - The last time UK defeated UT was in 2020, 34-7, in Knoxville.
 - Biggest UK win: 56 (56-0) in 1893 in Knoxville (first-ever meeting)
 - Biggest Tennessee win: 52 (52-0) in 1994 in Knoxville

THE TIES

- Kentucky has three players from the state of Tennessee on its roster, including wide receiver Barion Brown (Nashville), defensive lineman Tre’vonn Rybka (Dickson) and outside linebacker Steven Soles Jr. (Powell).
 - UK also has one transfer on its roster from UT in offensive lineman Gerald Mincey (2022, 2023).
- Tennessee has one player from the state of Kentucky on its roster in linebacker Kalib Perry (Georgetown).
- Eddie Gran, special assistant to head coach Mark Stoops, served as a running backs coach at Tennessee in 2009.
- Mitch Barnhart, who is in his 22nd year as UK’s Director of Athletics, held several positions at Tennessee Athletics from 1986-98.

WHAT A WIN WOULD MEAN...

- It would be UK’s second win on the road over a top-10 ranked opponent this season, the first time in school history that would be accomplished.
- It would end a three-game losing streak against UT.
- It would give UK its first win over UT in Knoxville since 2020.
- Mark Stoops would extend his school records for total victories (67), SEC victories (32) and ranked wins (13).

HOME SWEET HOME

- In 2024, UK is in its 52nd season playing at Kroger Field, which was formerly named Commonwealth Stadium (1973-2016).
 - The Cats are 182-148-4 (.551) all-time in the stadium, including 46-32 (.589) under Mark Stoops.

KENTUCKY IN THE SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE

- The Wildcats have a 189-411-12 (.319) all-time record in Southeastern Conference games.
 - UK head coach Mark Stoops has a 31-60 (.341) all-time record in SEC games.

WILDCATS AGAINST RANKED TEAMS

- Kentucky has played 273 ranked teams in the Associated Press poll in its history, while the Wildcats are 53-215-5 in those games.
 - In ranked games this season, Kentucky defeated No. 6 Ole Miss, 20-17, on Sept. 28, and suffered a narrow defeat to top-ranked Georgia, 13-12, on Sept. 14.
- UK is 4-36-1 in all-time games against a ranked-UT team.
 - The last time Kentucky defeated a ranked-Tennessee team was in 2020, when the Cats defeated the then-No. 18 Vols, 34-7, in Knoxville.
 - That also was the last time an unranked Kentucky defeated a ranked Tennessee.
- Two of UK’s biggest wins in the Mark Stoops era have come on the road in 2023 and 2024, including taking down No. 6 Ole Miss on, 20-17, on Sept. 28, 2024 and No. 9 Louisville, 38-31, on Nov. 25, 2023.

- The UofL triumph was the highest AP-ranked win of the Stoops era, until the UM triumph took that spot on Sept. 28, 2024.
- The Wildcats are 8-9 against their last 17 ranked AP-ranked teams, dating back to a win over NC State in the 2020 TaxSlayer Gator Bowl.
 - Since 2018, the Cats are 12-16 against AP-ranked teams.

WINNIN' IN THE SIP

- Kentucky defeated No. 6/5 Ole Miss in Oxford, Mississippi, on Sept. 28, 20-17, which marked its highest-ranked road win at a Southeastern Conference campus stadium in school history.
 - It also marked its highest Associated Press ranked road win since a victory at No. 4 Penn State in 1977.
 - It also marked its first win over an Associated Press ranked, top-six team since a victory over No. 1 LSU in 2007.
 - It also marked UK's highest-ranked win in the Mark Stoops era.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

1K FOR BARION BROWN, DANE KEY & JA'MORI MACLIN

- Barion Brown and Dane Key eclipsed 1,000 career yards receiving - in the same game - as sophomores last season at South Carolina on Nov. 18, 2023.
 - Brown concluded last season with 1,167 career yards receiving after he became the 33rd player in program history to eclipse 1K.
 - Key concluded last season with 1,155 career yards receiving after he became the 34th player in program history to eclipse 1K.
- Ja'Mori Maclin, who played the last two seasons at North Texas (2022-23) after transferring from Missouri (2020-21), led the wide receiver room ahead of the season with 1,389 career yards receiving. In fact, he recorded 1,004 of those yards just last season, logging 57 catches and 11 scores at North Texas in 2023.
 - **Fun Fact:** While Maclin committed to Kentucky prior to the hiring of offensive coordinator Bush Hamdan, Hamdan was actually Maclin's wide receivers coach at Missouri in 2020 and 2021.

GREAT DANE

- Going into Week 10, Dane Key leads the team with 39 receptions for 587 yards in 2024.
 - Of his 39 receptions, 12 have been 20 yards or more.
 - For his career he has 118 receptions - 14th in program history - for 1,742 yards - seventh in program history.
 - He has made at least one catch in 16 straight games, dating back to his sophomore season in 2023.
- Key recently had back-to-back games of 100 yards receiving, just the second and third of his college career, against Ohio and at No. 6/5 Ole Miss.
- In Kentucky's win at No. 6/5 Ole Miss on Sept. 28, Key had a career-high eight catches for 105 yards and one touchdown during the game.
 - His 100th career catch came on his five-yard touchdown reception in the game, the 21st player in program history to eclipse 100 career catches.
 - In the first half alone, he caught six passes for 69 yards and a touchdown, while also drawing three defensive penalties in the first half.
- In Kentucky's win over Ohio on Sept. 22, Key made a career-high-tying seven catches for a career-high 145 yards, including making a season-best 42-yard reception in the game.
 - He set up the Wildcats' first three scores against the Bobcats with "Key" plays - a 16-yard catch on a drive that ended with a field goal; a 15-yard grab to the one-yard line that set up a touchdown; then, catches of 42 and 36 yards that carried to the two-yard line to set up another TD.



KEEP CALM AND BARION

- While Barion Brown is most honored and known for his success returning kicks, he also led Kentucky with 43 catches for 539 yards and four touchdowns as a sophomore in 2023.
 - He added 12 rushes for 147 yards and one rushing TD last season.
- This season, Brown...
 - Had three catches for a team-high 34 yards in a close game against No. 1/1 Georgia on Sept. 14, which boosted him to 100 career catches.
 - Brown became the 20th player in school history with at least 100 receptions.
 - Brown tied for the fourth-fastest player in school history to reach 100 catches (29 games).
 - Had five catches for 88 yards, including a 63-yarder on 4th-and-7 from the UK 20-yard line to set up Kentucky's game-winning touchdown at No. 6/5 Ole Miss on Sept. 28.
- Going into Week 10, for his career he has 116 receptions - 15th in program history - for 1,445 yards - 14th in program history.
 - Brown has recorded a catch in 33 of his 34 career games.
 - He did not record a catch in the loss to South Carolina on Sept. 7.

OFFENSE AGAINST THE RANKED IN 2024

VS. NO. 1/1 GEORGIA

- The Wildcats' 170 yards rushing against the No. 1/1 Bulldogs at home on Sept. 14 are the most ever for the Cats against a No. 1-ranked team and the most against the Dawgs since 2016 (186 yards).

VS. NO. 6/5 OLE MISS

- Against an Ole Miss defense that ranked first in the nation in scoring defense (5.5 points per game) and rushing defense (34.5 yards per game) and also 12th in the nation in total defense (239 yards per game) going into the matchup in Oxford, Mississippi, on Sept. 28, Kentucky put up 20 points, 336 yards of total offense, 93 rushing yards and 243 passing yards.

BIG BLUE WALL

BETTER WITH AGE

- Prior to the start of 2024, Kentucky's offensive linemen combined for 207 career games played and 143 career games started in the FBS.
 - UK's 143 career games started was ranked second in the Southeastern Conference and ninth in the FBS.
- UK's offensive line includes five returners that appeared in at least 12 games in 2023. Those core returners started in 76.9 percent of possible starts - equaling 50 total starts - in 2023.
 - Eli Cox** and **Marques Cox** started all 13 games, while **Jager Burton** started in all 12 games that he appeared.
 - Dylan Ray** started in 10 of 13 games played, while **Courtland Ford** started in two of 13 games played.

THE COX BROTHERS

- Eli Cox and Marques Cox - not actually brothers by the way - returned for their sixth and seventh seasons, respectively, in 2024.
 - Going into Game 9 in 2024, between the two of them, they combine for 109 career games played and 98 career games started.
 - Marques Cox is actually tied-for-fourth in most career starts in the country right now (55).

- **Fun Fact:** Eli Cox has played center for three different quarterbacks at Kentucky, including Will Levis, Devin Leary and now Brock Vandagriff. Levis (Titans) and Leary (Ravens) are currently in the NFL.

ALL THAT AND A BAG OF CHIPS

- Chip Trayanum, a graduate student, running back transfer from Ohio State, sat out the first six games of this season because of a preseason injury in 2024.
 - He made his debut in Blue and White at Florida on Oct. 19, carrying seven times for 26 yards, which featured an eight-yard jaunt on his first rush.
- Prior to his transfer to the Bluegrass, he played in 36 total games, including 23 at Ohio State and 13 at Arizona State.
 - During his combined four seasons at OSU and ASU, he recorded 1,157 career yards rushing and 13 touchdowns rushing, while he also caught 15 passes for 91 yards.
 - When he transferred to Ohio State in 2022, and he briefly switched positions to linebacker and totaled 14 tackles before returning back to running back due to depth issues.

THE QUARTERBACK ROOM

Prior to the start of the season, none of Kentucky's four quarterbacks had started a game in Blue and White, but three of the four players had collegiate experience:

- Gavin Wimsatt played in 25 games at Rutgers over the previous three seasons. He started 19 games, including all 13 in 2023. He totaled 2,537 passing yards and 14 touchdowns and also had 628 net rushing yards and 11 TDs.
- Brock Vandagriff played in 13 games at Georgia over the last three seasons (no starts) from 2021-23. He completed 12-of-21 passes for 165 yards and two touchdowns and had 46 net rushing yards during that stretch.
- Beau Allen played five games as a reserve at UK in 2020-21 before transferring to Tarleton State, where he passed for 2,836 yards and 23 touchdowns in 2022.

QB1 NAMED TO "GREAT 8"

- Brock Vandagriff, junior quarterback, was named to the Davey O'Brien Award "Great 8" list after helping lead Kentucky past No. 6/5 Ole Miss on Sept. 28. He completed a career-high 18 of his 28 pass attempts for a career-high 243 yards.
 - Trailing 17-13 with four minutes left, on 4th-and-7 from his own 20-yard line, his 63-yard bomb to junior wide receiver Barion Brown set up UK's game-winning touchdown.
 - On non-sack rushing plays, Vandagriff ran or scrambled 12 times for 48 yards, including five first downs.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

VETERAN WILDCATS

- This season, Kentucky retained nine starters on defense from 2023, including:
 - **Defensive linemen:** Octavious Oxendine, Keeshawn Silver and Deone Walker
 - **Linebackers:** Alex Afari Jr., J.J. Weaver and D'Eryk Jackson
 - **Defensive backs:** Maxwell Hairston, Jordan Lovett and Zion Childress
- Altogether, 16 defenders on the roster have seen significant action for at least two seasons, either at Kentucky or another school in the FBS, including six defensive linemen, five defensive backs and five linebackers.
 - Another nine defenders have seen significant action for one season either at Kentucky or elsewhere.

A DEFENSE THAT RANKS...

Heading into Week 10 in 2024, defensive coordinator Brad White's defense ranks among the top



25 in the nation in four categories.

DEFENSE AGAINST THE RANKED IN 2024

VS. NO. 1/1 GEORGIA

- Kentucky held No. 1/1 Georgia to 13 points on Sept. 14, the fewest UK has held UGA to since allowing just 12 points in 1995.
 - It also was the fewest points UK allowed against a No. 1-ranked team since 1959, a 9-0 loss against LSU.
- The Wildcat defense also held the Bulldogs to 262 yards of total offense, the Dawgs' fewest since putting up 260 against Texas A&M in November 2019.
 - It marked the first time the Cats have held the Dawgs to as little yards since 1996 (212).
 - It marked the first time the Cats have held a No. 1-ranked team to as little yards since 1964 (187, vs. Ole Miss).
- UK's defense also held UGA to its fewest passing yards – 160 – since Georgia Tech held Georgia to 146 yards in November 2022.

VS. NO. 6/5 OLE MISS

- Kentucky held No. 6/5 Ole Miss to 17 points, 353 yards of total offense, 261 passing yards and 92 rushing yards on the Rebels' home field.
 - The Rebels entered the game leading the nation in scoring (55 points per game), total offense (670.8 yards per game) and passing offense (422.8 yards per game), while ranking 12th in rushing offense (248 yards per game).
- Ole Miss had punted four times total in its first four games but were forced to kick it away five times in the game.

STOPPING THE RUN

- Kentucky has held 11 of its last 22 opponents - 50.0 percent - to less than 100 yards rushing, dating back to the final game of 2022. While not reflected, it is also worth mentioning, UK held No. 1/1 UGA to just 102 yards rushing on Sept. 14.
 - The above stat includes the five yards rushing Kentucky held Southern Miss to in the abbreviated season opener on Aug. 31. That marked the fewest since 2019, when UT Martin had minus-12 yards rushing.
- Going into Week 10 in 2024, the Wildcats are holding opponents to 132.4 yards rushing.
 - The Cats held each of their first five opponents of last season to under 100 yards rushing for the first time in program history, based on game-by-game stats available since the 1940s.
- The Wildcats concluded last season ranked second in the SEC and 17th in the nation in rushing defense, allowing opponents just 113.1 yards per game in 2023.

STOPPING THE PASS

- UK allowed less than 200 yards passing in each of the first four games this season in 2024, for the first time since 1989.

TURNOVERS GAINED

- Kentucky has earned at least one turnover in all eight games this season, combining for nine turnovers in 2024.
- The Wildcats concluded last season ranked third in the Southeastern Conference in turnovers gained, forcing 18 - for an average of 1.4 per game - in 2023.

MADDD MAXXX

IN 2023...

- Maxwell Hairston made five interceptions, including four against Southeastern Conference opponents, as a sophomore and first-year starter in 2023, running two of those back for touchdowns.
 - He totaled 131 return yards, which marked the most in program history since Greg Long had 176 return yards in 1981.
 - He led the SEC in interceptions (5), interception return average (26.2 yards per return), interception return yards (131) and interception return TDs (2) in 2023.
- His two interceptions returned for touchdowns came in the same game, the conference opener at Vanderbilt on Sept. 24, 2024.
 - He tied the SEC record for interception touchdowns in a game, becoming just the sixth player in league history - and the first at UK - to have two pick-sixes in one game.
- The Wildcat also recorded the third-most total tackles of anyone on the team in 2023 (68).

IN 2024...

- Well, he did it again.
 - The Wildcat earned his third career pick-six - and his sixth career interception - running the ball back 25 yards for a touchdown against Ohio on Sept. 21.



MILESTONES BY THE WILDCATS

- **Coach Mark Stoops** has the most on-field victories (76) in Kentucky history, most SEC victories (36), most home victories (52) and most victories against ranked opponents (14).
- Junior **WR Dane Key** has 1,742 career receiving yards, ranking seventh on UK's career receiving yardage chart ... Needs just two yards to move into sixth place, which is currently occupied by Quentin McCord (1,743) and would need 10 yards to jump two spots and tie Dicky Lyons Jr. at No. 5 (1,752).
- **Key** has 118 career receptions which ranks No. 14 on UK's career list ... Needs two more to tie James Whalen at No. 13 (120).
- Junior **WR Barion Brown** has 1,445 receiving yards which ranks No. 14 on UK's career list ... Needs two more to tie Josh Ali at No. 13 (1,447) and 38 more to jump two spots to No. 12 with Tom Hutchinson (1,483).
 - Has 116 career receptions and ranks No. 15 on UK's career list ... Needs two more to tie Dane Key at No. 14 (118).
 - Has the most kickoff return TDs by an active FBS player with five.
 - Currently owns the school record for kickoff return average (min. 30 returns) at 30.50 yards per return.
- Junior transfer **WR Ja'Mori Maclin** has 1,478 receiving yards in his career ... Needs 522 to reach 2,000 for his collegiate career.
- Senior **ILB D'Eryk Jackson** has 217 career tackles and led the Cats in both 2022 and 2023.
- Senior **OLB J.J. Weaver** has 37.5 career tackles for loss which ranks third in school history ... He needs 3.5 more to tie Josh Allen at No. 2 (41) ... His 21.5 career sacks rank fourth in school history ... He needs 2.0 more to tie Alvin "Bud" Dupree at No. 3 (23.5)
- Senior **K Alex Raynor** now has made 15 consecutive field goals dating to the 2023 season, setting the school record of 11 previously owned by Austin MacGinnis.
- **Raynor** also has a school-record .957 career field goal percentage (22/23).
- Hairston hasn't seen action in the last five games - Ole Miss, Vanderbilt, Florida, Auburn - because of injury.

DEONE WALKER ANCHORING THE LINE

- Named to nearly every preseason watch list he was eligible for, Deone Walker, a 6-foot-6, 348-pound defensive lineman, is primed to have a big junior season in 2024.
 - As a sophomore last season in 2023, despite battling frequent double teams, he led the Blue and White in tackles for loss (12.5), quarterback sacks (7.5) and quarterback hurries (8). He also added two pass breakups, including one in Kentucky's win over Florida on Sept. 30, which was intercepted by UK and returned to the UF 15-yard line that led to an eventual touchdown. He set or tied single-game career highs in every category last season in 2023, including recording nine tackles at South Carolina, 4.0 tackles for loss (-7 yards) at Missouri, 1.0 sacks (-6 yards) last at South Carolina, one pass breakup last at Georgia and two quarterback hurries against ECU.
- Going into Week 10, he has started in 28 straight games, a stretch dating back to his freshman season in 2022.
 - This season, he leads the UK defensive line with 29 tackles, including four for loss (-16 yards), as UK ranks in the nation's top 25 in first down defense and total defense.
- The Wildcat is a two-time permanent team captain in 2023 and 2024.
 - He was named one of seven permanent team captains as a sophomore last season in 2023 and one of two permanent team captains as a junior this season in 2024.

ACTION JACKSON

- Inside linebacker D'Eryk Jackson has led the Blue and White in tackles in each of the last two seasons, while he is currently third on the team with 39 stops so far this season in 2024.
 - He tallied 89 stops a year ago, earning All-SEC First Team honors from Pro Football Focus and All-SEC Third Team honors from Phil Steele.
 - He also led the Cats with 67 tackles in 2022.
- Jackson also has been active in pass defense, totaling five interceptions (one for touchdown) and nine pass breakups during his career. He also leads the team in pass breakups this season with three in 2024.

- He got this season off to a good start on pass defense, deflecting a Southern Miss pass that was intercepted by JQ Hardaway in the season opener on Aug. 31.
- He is recently coming off an interception against Vanderbilt on Oct. 12.

A DEFENSIVE GUY...

- The Wildcats held their first three opponents - Southern Miss, South Carolina and Georgia - to 645 yards of total offense. That is their fewest through the first three games in all 12 years of Mark Stoops' tenure in the Bluegrass.
 - The Cats' next best defensive performance through the first three games came in 2022, holding their opponents - Miami (OH), Florida, Youngstown - to 761 yards of total offense.
 - The Cats' last four years (2021-pres.) rank at the top of that 12-year list.

BRAD'S BENCHMARKS

- Brad White is in his sixth season as the defensive coordinator, and his seventh season overall at Kentucky, since Mark Stoops plucked him from the NFL in 2018. He became defensive coordinator in 2019, and UK has steadily become more stout on that side of the ball.
 - Other programs have taken notice, too, as White has turned down several other coaching opportunities in that time.
- Kentucky's defense has remained constant under White, and that is evident by the benchmarks he continues to reach year-in and year-out.
 - The UK defense has held opponents to 30 points or fewer in 55-of-69 games - 79.7 percent - with White as the defensive coordinator (2019-present).
 - The UK defense has held opponents to 24 points or fewer in 27 of the last 36 games - 75.0 percent - since November 2021.
 - UK has allowed 26 points or fewer per game in six straight seasons (2018-23) for the first time since 1983-89.
 - UK has yielded fewer than 160 rushing yards per game for six straight seasons (2018-23) for the first time since 1946-53.

J.J. WEAVER NAMED TO THE 2024 AFCA GOODWORKS TEAM / WUERFFEL TROPHY AND WITTEN COLLEGE MAN OF THE YEAR SEMIFINALIST

- J.J. Weaver, outside linebacker, is one of only 11 members from the NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision to be named to the 2024 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team. He also becomes an eligible semifinalist for the 2024 Allstate Wuerffel Trophy.
- He also was named a semifinalist for the Jason Witten College Man of the Year.
- Weaver, who was born with polydactyly, a condition in which a person has more than five fingers or toes on one, or on each, hand or foot, has had to face many obstacles in his lifetime. With six fingers on his right hand, he was bullied and ridiculed in grade school for being different. But that obstacle was nothing compared to what he was about to face during his collegiate years.
 - From July 2020 to August 2021, Weaver lost his father to homicide, sustained a season-ending knee injury and then lost his beloved high school football coach to cancer.
- Inspired by the help he received, Weaver has become an outspoken advocate for mental health and counseling. In the fall of 2023, with help from the Kentucky Center for Grieving Children and Families, he launched an eight-week peer-led grief counseling group on UK's campus, the first of its kind at UK called "The Perfect Fit Support Group."
 - With Weaver's help, "The Perfect Fit Support Group" received a \$40,000 grant by Women in Philanthropy and now will be available to all students on UK's campus beginning in the fall of 2024.
- In Spring 2024, Weaver attended the "Supporting Children and Teens Through Loss" event at the Kentucky Center for Grieving Children and Families, where he spoke to the group about going through grief and participated in a drum circle with the children.
 - In June, he attended the 2024 Annual Symposium on Children's Grief in Denver, Colorado, hosted by the National Alliance for Children's Grief. He shared his story and the work he's doing on UK's campus.



- He’s also done many other community service events, including hosting free football camps and two bike drives, providing more than 200 bicycles to children in Lexington and his hometown of Louisville.
- Because of his resilience and work in the community, Weaver recently earned the Kentucky Pro Football Hall of Fame’s 2024 Ron Butler Character in Adversity Award.

WEAVER ON THE CAREER LISTS

- J.J. Weaver has been a big-play performer during his career in Lexington and is on the career lists with some notable Wildcats in school history.
- He has 37.5 tackles for loss, which is third all-time at UK and is seventh in the nation on the active career list.
- Notching a team-high five quarterback sacks this season, he now has 21.5 career sacks, which is fourth all-time at UK and is ninth in the nation on the active career list.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

RAYNOR’S RETURN

- Going into Week 10 in 2024, Alex Raynor is 22-of-23 at field goals and 63-of-65 at extra points in his career at Kentucky.
 - He remains perfect - 19-of-19 - on kicks from 0 to 49 yards at Kentucky, while he is 3-of-4 from 50+ for the Wildcats.
 - He holds a current school-record, field-goal streak of 15 straight, including going 12-of-12 this season.
- For his career, he...
 - Ranks second on the NCAA’s active career scoring list with 373 points
 - Ranks second on the NCAA’s active career PATs list with 172
 - Ranks second on the NCAA’s active career field goals list with 67
 - Ranks 23rd on the NCAA’s active career points per game list with 6.5
- The Wildcat knocked down four field goals in their close loss to the No. 1/1 Bulldogs on Sept. 14, being named a Lou Groza Star of the Week.
 - Two of his four field goals were more than 50 yards, including his school-record, 55-yard field goal.
 - He becomes the second player in school history with two 50-yarders in one game, with Joe Bryant doing so, also against Georgia, in 1977.
 - The previous school record was 54 yards, made by Austin MacGinnis against Tennessee in Knoxville on Nov. 15, 2014.
 - Raynor’s 12 points marked the most against a No. 1-ranked team since Patrick Towles scored two touchdowns against Mississippi State in 2014.

KICKOFF RETURN KING

- In just three seasons, now junior Barion Brown has recorded five kickoff returns for touchdowns, including one this season in 2024.
 - Of those five kickoff returns for touchdowns, three were of 100 yards.

- His five career kickoff returns for touchdowns breaks the Southeastern Conference record, while he also remains the NCAA active career leader.
- Going into Week 10, this season he leads the conference in kickoff return total yards (332) and kickoff return average (27.2), ranking in the top 15 in the nation in both categories.
 - At Florida on Oct. 19, he recorded his fifth-career kickoff return for a touchdown, a 99-yard runback in the second quarter. He became the first player in Kentucky history to have two games featuring a kickoff return TD and a touchdown catch of at least 45 yards. Since 1976, he is one of two FBS players with at least 11 career receiving touchdowns and five kickoff return touchdowns prior to his senior season (also Tyron Carrier of Houston from 2008-10).

Hamdan, 38, came to the Bluegrass with 15 years of collegiate and NFL coaching experience combined, most recently serving as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at his alma mater, Boise State.
- **Daikiel Shorts Jr.** was hired as the wide receivers coach. Shorts, 29, came to the Bluegrass after three seasons (2021-23) as the wide receivers coach under Dana Holgorsen at Houston. He also spent two years as the Director of Player Development (2019-20) for the Cougars.
- **Eric Wolford** returned to Lexington as the offensive line coach in 2024. Wolford, who was Kentucky's offensive line coach in 2021, spent the last two seasons in the same position at Alabama. He has over 25 years of coaching experience, including two in the NFL.

WILDCATS IN THE NFL DRAFT

- Four players were drafted in 2024, giving head coach Mark Stoops a total of 28 drafted players since his arrival in 2013.
 - Twenty-four of those 28 selections have come in the last six drafts (2019-24).
 - Sixteen of those 28 selections were defensive players.
- The 2024 NFL Draft marked the sixth straight year UK had at least one player drafted in the first three rounds.

KROGER FIELD

On game day, Kroger Field often becomes the third-largest city in Kentucky.



- Since its opening in 1973, Kentucky has played 332 games within the friendly confines of newly-named Kroger Field. **UK has a 182-148-4 record (.551), 46-32 (.590) under Mark Stoops.**
- 2024 marks the 52nd season at the facility.
- UK set a new Kroger Field attendance record when 63,543 fans packed the stadium for the Nov. 3, 2018 game vs. No. 6 Georgia.
- Two of the top five crowds in Kroger Field history came in 2018.
- UK announced its first sellout since 2015 when 62,945 fans attended the Florida game on Sept. 23, 2017.
- Since the 1999 expansion, UK has averaged 60,261 fans per game and ranked in the nation's top 30 teams in attendance in 17 of the last 19 seasons. Both the single game and season attendance record has been broken in recent years. *Note: Kroger Field capacity was limited to 12,000 fans per game in 2020 due to COVID-19 restrictions
- The stadium footprint is named C.M. Newton Grounds at Kroger Field in honor of the former UK Director of Athletics.

KROGER FIELD

Commonwealth Stadium was renamed to Kroger Field in May of 2017. The agreement--which is between Kroger and JMI Sports, UK's multimedia rights partner-- begins at approximately \$1.85 million annually with a term of up to 12 years. With the partnership, Kroger becomes the Official Fuel Partner of the University of Kentucky and the Official Grocery Partner of Move-In at UK while also providing additional engagement opportunities with UK students. Per the agreement, Kroger is also the Official Nutrition and Pharmacy Partner of UK Athletics.

Kroger Field was transformed into a state-of-the-art facility after a \$126-million reinvention which was completed prior to the 2015 season. The project was handled by HNTB. The outside of the stadium underwent a dramatic external facelift, receiving a modern look, but one that remained uniquely Kentucky. Inside, the capacity of Kroger Field was reduced over the course of the two-year project to approximately 61,000, but the value of all remaining seats were increased, from the top of the upper deck to front-row seats at midfield. Concourses were revamped and widened throughout the stadium with improved concessions, restrooms and security. Players and coaches reaped the benefits of the new Kroger Field as well, as home-team facilities were built, and a multi-purpose recruiting room hosts future Wildcats on their on-campus visits.

NEW LIGHTING, RIBBON BOARDS

In 2024, Kroger Field will feature brand new lighting and ribbon boards. The LED lighting system will include the ability to do light shows during timeouts and breaks in play similar to those at games in Rupp Arena and Kentucky Proud Park. The new ribbon boards have greater functionality, featuring sharper visual resolution than the previous set and expanded capability for display of video and graphics.

FACTS AND FIGURES

Seating Capacity: 61,000, including the Commonwealth Suites

Playing Field: UK switched from natural grass to synthetic turf for the 2015 season. Other SEC schools with a turf surface are: Arkansas, Ole Miss, Mississippi State and Missouri. The end zones and team sideline areas feature a checkerboard pattern in alternating shades of blue. It was designed to mimic the pattern of Secretariat's silks, which has been part of the football uniforms for five seasons. The school's

new interlocking "UK" logo is positioned in the center of the field.

Video Boards: Video boards by Daktronics measuring at 39 by 79 feet, each, bring a total of 6,162 square feet of video capability. The video boards put UK among the nation's leaders in video square footage.

Sound System: Sportsound system delivers pounding bass energy, smooth mid- and high-range frequencies, and high-impact entertainment. Components of the sound system include a main speaker cluster behind the end zone, under-balcony speakers and concourse speakers.

GAME DAY EXPERIENCES

The "Cat Walk" on Talbott Todd Way: With the unveiling of the new \$45 million Kentucky Football Training Facility in August of 2016, the headquarters of the program moved next door to Kroger Field. Therefore, the Cat Walk was moved to Talbott Todd Way. The Cat Walk typically begins outside Gate 1 two hours and 15 minutes prior to kickoff, and the team proceeds past Gate 1 and between Kroger Field and Nutter Field House. It was dedicated to former Wildcat Talbott Todd (1963-65) who passed away from ALS in August of 2017 and was an avid supporter of the program. From Talbott Todd Way the team walks to the locker room in the Joe Craft Kentucky Football Training Facility.

Lift Them Up: A unique partnership with Toyota Motor Manufacturing Kentucky (TMMK), the Kentucky College of Engineering and the Kentucky Children's Hospital was launched in 2019 that brings special guests to the Cat Walk as the Kentucky football team arrives at Kroger Field. A specially built push cart vehicle provides a Kentucky Children's Hospital patient the chance to both accompany the Wildcats on the Cat Walk and attend a game at Kroger Field. A new patient is chosen by the Kentucky Children's Hospital each week to participate.

- A school-record, 16-game win streak against nonconference competition (2018-22), which was the nation's longest active streak at the time.
- First top-10 ranking in each the Associated Press poll and the coaches' poll since 2007 (Sept. 11, 2022)
- First consecutive top-10 rankings in each poll since 1977 (Sept. 18, 2022)
- First home win over Florida since 1986, also marking the first win over an Associated Press top 10-ranked opponent since 2010 (2021)
- First win at Tennessee since 1984 (2020)
- First New Year's Day Bowl win since 1951 (2018 season)
- First 10-win season since 1977 (2018)
- First SEC Coach of the Year since 1983 (2018)
- First final poll ranking since 1984 (2018)
- First bowl win since 2008 (2018 season)
- First win vs. Florida since 1986 (2018)
- First bowl appearance since 2010 (2016)
- Off the field, Stoops is a staunch supporter of the Kentucky Children's Hospital, helping raise more than \$500,000 **annually** for the kids. He was named the Honorary Coach of the 2022 AFCA Good Works Team.
- Kentucky's football team has fared well academically under Stoops, as each year UK's football score in the NCAA Academic Progress Rate has been well above the benchmark of 930.

The 2023 season marked yet another year of achievement for Coach Mark Stoops and the Kentucky football program.

Kentucky finished the regular season 7-5 and UK's bid to the TaxSlayer Gator Bowl extended Stoops' school record to seven official postseason appearances.

Now in his 12th season at Kentucky, Stoops has the longest term of any coach in school history and the longest term of any active coach in the Southeastern Conference.

Stoops also holds school record for wins (66), home wins (46), SEC wins (31) and wins over ranked opponents (12).

Called "the best program builder in all of college football" in 2021 by ESPN analyst Tom Luginbill, Stoops' success hasn't come easily.

Inheriting a program that was 2-10 the year before he arrived, Stoops' rebuilding efforts took time, but after reaching his first bowl bid in 2016, the coach and the Wildcats haven't looked back.

A partial accounting of Stoops' exploits features:

Several of Stoops' players have also won All-America accolades, along with honors such as the Bronko Nagurski Award, Chuck Bednarik Award, Paul Hornung Award, Ronnie Lott Trophy, Ray Guy Award, Danny Wuerffel Trophy, Jason Witten Man of the Year, Pop Warner Award, Academic All-America and National Good Works Team.

Off the field, Stoops has been active in fundraising and events for the UK Children's Hospital and he was named Honorary Coach of the 2022 National Good Works Team.

The bountiful crop of victories and honors are the fruit of the last eight seasons, but the harvest didn't come easily. Arriving in 2013, taking over a team that had gone 2-10 the season before, it took three years of plowing, planting and growing before the results came.

Stoops earned his first bowl game as head coach in 2016, when the Wildcats overcame an 0-2 start to go 7-3 down the stretch and advance to the TaxSlayer Gator Bowl. UK duplicated seven wins in 2017, playing in the Franklin-American Mortgage Music City Bowl.

Led by linebacker Josh Allen, the National Defensive Player of the Year, and Benny Snell Jr., the school's all-time leading rusher, the 2018 squad went 10-3. It was UK's best season in 41 years, topped by a win over Penn State in the VRBO Citrus Bowl. It was only the third 10-win season in school history.

In addition, the 2018 campaign featured a win at Florida -- the Wildcats' first victory over the Gators in 32 years -- resulting in UK being named the National Team of the Week by the Football Writers Association of America. The regular season concluded with a 56-10 win at in-state rival Louisville, the largest margin of victory in the history of the Governor's Cup series.

UK was No. 11 in the final *USA Today* coaches' poll and No. 12 in the final Associated Press tabulation, the school's first appearance in the final rankings since 1984. The 2018 season also continued a remarkable trend -- since Stoops took over as coach of the Cats in 2013, UK was the only school in the nation that tied or improved its win total in six straight seasons.

CollegeFootballNews.com listed Stoops as the best coaching performance of the season and he was named Southeastern Conference Coach of the Year by The Associated Press, Athlon Sports and the league coaches.

The 2019 season was one of the most unusual in school history. A succession of injuries decimated the quarterbacks and Stoops turned to wide receiver Lynn Bowden Jr. to man the QB position. Running the ball almost exclusively, UK went 6-2 down the stretch and closed the season with four straight wins, topped by a dramatic come-from-behind Belk Bowl win over Virginia Tech when



Bowden threw the game-winning touchdown pass with only 15 seconds remaining.

Stoops followed with the Covid-shortened 2020 season that was capped by a Gator Bowl win over No. 23 North Carolina State.

More winning seasons and bowl appearances have followed, giving Stoops the school records in both categories.

How has Stoops accomplished all of this? The coach would tell you that there's been nothing magical about the process.

True to his blue-collar roots in Youngstown, Ohio, the methodical advancement made by Stoops' teams is a reflection of the coach's rock-steady work ethic, tireless recruiting, and ability to adapt.

Stoops came to Kentucky from Florida State, where he was defensive coordinator from 2010-12. He inherited a unit ranked 108th in the nation in total defense and turned it into one of the nation's best. In the 2012 season, the Seminoles were second in the nation in total defense, allowing 254.1 yards per game, and sixth nationally in scoring defense at 14.7 points per game. Playing well against the run and the pass, FSU was third in the country in rushing defense and led the nation in pass defense. FSU led the ACC in seven defensive categories. Stoops also coached the defensive backs under head coach Jimbo Fisher.

Eight Seminoles on defense earned 2012 All-ACC honors, including four first-team selections, highlighted by one of the nation's top defensive end duos in Bjoern Werner and Cornellius Carradine, who combined for 24 sacks and 31 tackles for loss. Werner was a finalist for the 2012 Bronko Nagurski Award as the National Defensive Player of the Year and was among the national leaders in sacks with 13. Stoops also coached cornerback Ronald Darby to ACC Defensive Rookie of the Year. The Seminoles' prowess was a continuation of the 2011

season, when Stoops' defenders led the nation in fewest yards allowed per carry (2.3), ranked fourth in the nation in total defense (275 yards per game), second in rushing defense (82.7 ypg), fourth in scoring defense (15.1 points per game), and eighth in tackles for loss (8.6 per game) and quarterback sacks (3.1 per game). FSU led the ACC in eight defensive categories.

Stoops overhauled the Florida State defense in 2010, his first season as defensive coordinator. The Seminoles gave up 19.6 points per game, third-best in the ACC and 20th nationally. FSU ranked 42nd nationally in total defense that season; in contrast, the team was 108th nationally in total defense and 94th in scoring defense in 2009, the year before Stoops' arrival. FSU improved its overall defense by more than 80 yards per game, primarily by limiting opponents to 75 fewer rushing yards per game. The Seminoles ranked third in the nation in quarterback sacks and were 21st in tackles for loss. In the secondary, Stoops coached Xavier Rhodes to ACC Defensive Rookie of the Year honors and National Defensive Freshman of the Year accolades. During Stoops' three seasons, FSU went 10-4, 9-4 and 12-2, including wins over South Carolina in the 2010 Chick-fil-A Bowl, Notre Dame in the 2011 Champs Sports Bowl and Northern Illinois in the 2013 Orange Bowl.

Stoops was defensive coordinator and DBs coach at Arizona from 2004-09, working for his brother, Mike, who was head coach of the Wildcats. During Mark's time there, Arizona's records improved steadily, going 3-8, 3-8, 6-6, 5-7, 8-5 and 8-5. The Wildcats advanced to the Las Vegas Bowl and Holiday Bowl during the last two years.

Stoops inherited an Arizona unit that was 109th in the nation in total defense and 107th in scoring defense in 2003, the year before he arrived. By the end of his term at Arizona, the Wildcats ranked in the nation's top 25 in total

defense his final two seasons and ranked as high as 33rd in scoring defense.

Mark and Mike are also brothers of Bob Stoops, who spent 18 years as the Oklahoma head coach and has been elected to the College Football Hall of Fame. The eldest Stoops brother, Ron Jr., is retired after coaching at Youngstown State. Mark and Mike have reunited in Lexington, as Mike joined the UK staff in 2022 as inside linebackers coach.

Prior to Arizona, Mark Stoops coached the defensive backs three years at Miami (Fla.). The 2001 national champion Hurricanes led the nation in pass efficiency defense, scoring defense and turnover margin. That team also established a school record with 27 interceptions and 45 total takeaways.

Stoops' 2002 secondary led the nation in pass defense and pass efficiency defense. Despite having to replace all four starters in the defensive backfield, the 2003 team led the nation in pass defense. In his three seasons, Miami went 35-3, including the 12-0 Rose Bowl title campaign, plus appearances in the Fiesta and Orange bowls. Ten Miami defensive backs who played at least one season under Stoops were eventually selected in the National Football League draft – seven in the first round.

Stoops got his first experience in leading a defense as co-defensive coordinator at Houston in the 2000 season. He coached the secondary at Wyoming from 1997-99 and the Cowboys notched three straight winning seasons. A highlight of his time there was a school-record 24 interceptions in the '97 season. His first full-time coaching job was in 1996 at South Florida, helping USF in the start-up of its program before the Bulls had their first kickoff in '97.

Stoops has recruited and developed numerous outstanding defensive backs, many of whom went on to National Football League careers. Among the notables are Antoine Cason

and Michael Johnson at Arizona, Miami’s Philip Buchanon, Kelly Jennings, Brandon Meriweather, Ed Reed, Antrel Rolle, Mike Rumph and Sean Taylor and Wyoming’s Brian Lee.

Stoops was raised in Youngstown, Ohio. As did brothers Bob and Mike, Mark played in the secondary at the University of Iowa for Hall of Fame coach Hayden Fry. He participated in four bowl games as a player. Fry hired Stoops as a graduate assistant coach at Iowa in the 1990 and '91 seasons. The Hawkeyes won the 1990 Big Ten title and played in the Rose Bowl, duplicating feats Stoops also achieved as a player. Stoops went on to coach four years in high school before entering the collegiate ranks.

Stoops has two sons, Will and Zack.

Vince Marrow, aka the "Big Dawg," enters his 12th season at Kentucky, currently handling the duties of associate head coach/tight ends coach/recruiting coordinator/NFL liaison.

Marrow's tight ends have been a big factor in UK producing six seasons of 2,000 or more rushing yards with at least one 1,000-yard rusher in all six of those (Stanley "Boom" Williams -2016; Benny Snell Jr., - 2017, 2018; Lynn Bowden - 2019; Chris Rodriguez Jr. - 2021, Ray Davis - 2023). Marrow also has been instrumental in UK signing 11 straight top-50 recruiting classes, including the highest-rated class in UK history in 2021.

Marrow had a professional playing career as a member of NFL rosters on five teams, including Buffalo, Carolina, New York Jets, Chicago and San Francisco. After his NFL days ended, Marrow played for the Frankfurt Galaxy of NFL Europe in 1998, earning all-league honors with 32 receptions for 345 yards. He also played for the Orlando Rage in the XFL in 2001.

He began his collegiate playing career at Youngstown State before transferring to Toledo. Marrow played two seasons at Toledo, earning second-team All-MAC honors in 1991 before being drafted by the Bills in 1992.

KENTUCKY 31, SOUTHERN MISS 0

Brock Vandagriff passed for three touchdowns and the Kentucky defense was stout all night as the Cats beat Southern Miss 31-0 in a weather-shortened season opener at Kroger Field.

Vandagriff, making his first career start, connected on 12 of 18 passing for 169 yards and those three scores. Demie Sumo-Karngbaye rushed eight times for 59 yards and a score. The UK defense held Southern Miss to just 131 yards and no points.

Kentucky took the opening kickoff and, after a good return by freshman Willie Rodriguez, the Cats started at their own 48 yard line. The Cats would drive deep into Southern Miss territory before Vandagriff's pass intended for Ja'Mori Maclin was tipped and intercepted by the Golden Eagles' Dylan Lawrence at the USM 15.

On the second play of the Southern Miss drive, UK linebacker Jamon Dumas-Johnson intercepted a Tate Rodemaker pass and the Cats took over at their own 41.

Kentucky would get on the board on the ensuing drive. Big plays by Maclin, Sumo-Karngbaye and Vandagriff propelled the offense down the field. UK covered 59 yards in 10 plays, ending with a 12-yard touchdown pass from Vandagriff to Barion Brown. Alex Raynor added the point after and the Cats led 7-0 with 6:03 remaining in the first quarter.

On the next possession, it appeared that the Cats were going to force a Southern Miss punt but a Rodemaker pass to Kyirin Heath went for a 34-yard gain and the Golden Eagles were near midfield with a new set of downs. The USM drive would continue into the red zone as the first quarter came to a close with the Cats leading 7-0.

As the second quarter started, the Golden Eagles appeared ready to tie the game. But Rodemaker's pass was tipped by D'Eryk Jackson and intercepted by J.Q. Hardaway in the end zone, ending the threat.

The Cats would go to Sumo-Karngbaye on the next drive, and he would deliver. Rushes of 10, 22 and three yards got the Cats into Southern Miss territory. However, the drive would stall and the Cats would be forced to punt.

A Wilson Berry punt pinned Southern Miss inside their own 10, and the UK defense forced a three-and-out on the following possession. The Cats would get excellent field possession after a 23-yard USM punt.

Kentucky started its drive from the USM 36 yard line, but the Cats were not able to get a first down. UK would add to its lead when Raynor converted a 41-yard field goal, giving Kentucky a 10-0 advantage with 7:45 left in the first half.

The Kentucky defense would force another three-and-out on the next Southern Miss possession, with a Tre'vonn Rybka sack on third down forcing another change in possession.

UK took over at its own 25 yard line and Vandagriff connected with Dane Key for a 35-yard strike across the middle, getting the Cats into Southern Miss territory. The Cats then got three solid runs from Jamarion Wilcox (10 yards) and Jason Patterson (12 and 11 yards). The Cats would finish the drive with a one-yard touchdown rush from Sumo-Karngbaye. The Raynor PAT made it 17-0 with 3:07 to play in the half.

The Cats' defense forced another three-and-out on the next USM possession. On fourth down, the Golden Eagles attempted a fake punt, but UK's Cam Dooley sniffed it out, made the tackle and the Cats took over at the Southern Miss 29 with 1:52 left in the half.

UK would take advantage of the good field possession, covering 29 yards in just three plays, ending with a 12-yard touchdown pass from Vandagriff to Brown. Raynor made another PAT and the Cats led 24-0 with 31 seconds left in the half. That would be the halftime score.

Southern Miss got the first possession of the third quarter and the Golden Eagles promptly marched into UK territory. However, the UK defense again stopped the drive and forced another USM punt.

Kentucky would mount another scoring drive on its next possession. A Vandagriff to Maclin pass for 46 yards set the Cats up at the Southern Miss eight yard line. Two plays later, Vandagriff connected with tight end Jordan Dingle for a five-yard scoring pass. When Raynor added the point after, Kentucky led 31-0 with 9:56 left in the third quarter.

At that point, the game was delayed, and ultimately stopped, due to lightning in the area.

Demie Sumo-Karngbaye rushed for 70 yards but Kentucky lost its Southeastern Conference opener to South Carolina 31-6 at Kroger Field.

Neither team was able to get much going offensively. South Carolina had 252 yards of total offense while the Cats were held to 183 for the game, including just 44 yards passing.

The UK defense did its best to keep the Cats in the game, registering 12 tackles for loss, including three sacks.

Kentucky (1-1, 0-1 SEC) got the ball first and the Cats were able to generate one first down before being forced to punt. In fact, the game's first three possessions would end with punts.

On its second possession, South Carolina got a 19-yard completion from LaNorris Sellers to Jared Brown to get the Gamecocks into UK territory. Three plays later, Sellers found Mazeo Bennett wide open for a 24-yard touchdown. Alex Herrera added the point after and South Carolina led 7-0 with 7:39 left in the first quarter.

Kentucky made it into South Carolina territory for the first time on the ensuing possession when Vandagriff connected with Dane Key down the left sideline for a 32-yard gain. However, the Cats were unable to convert and were forced to punt once again.

The Gamecocks started their next drive from their own nine yard line and, after a holding penalty negated a first down, South Carolina was forced to punt again. Kentucky took over at its own 43 yard line, its best field position of the game at that point. However, the Cats went three-and-out and was forced to punt again. South Carolina took possession and, shortly thereafter, the first quarter ended.

South Carolina (2-0, 1-0) punted early in the second quarter and the Cats took over at its own 10 yard line. The Cats were able to get one first down but, on fourth and one from its own 31, the Cats were stuffed and the Gamecocks took over in excellent field position. South Carolina would get inside the UK red zone, but would settle for a 29-yard field goal from Herrera, which was good, and the Gamecocks led 10-0 with 8:06 left in the half.

Kentucky went to the ground on its next drive. Demie Sumo-Karngbaye rushed for 11, six and eight yards before Jason Patterson carried for eight, three and six yards. Using exclusively running plays, Kentucky got inside the South Carolina 20 before the drive stalled. On fourth and two, the Cats got a 32-yard field goal from Alex Raynor, cutting the deficit to 10-3, with 1:55 left in the half.

On South Carolina's next possession, UK safety Ty Bryant intercepted Sellers and returned it to the South Carolina 27 yard line with 1:39 still to play in the half. The Cats got to the Gamecocks' 20 and from there, Raynor made another field goal, this one from 37 yards, to make it 10-6 Gamecocks. That would be the halftime score.

South Carolina got the ball to start the second half and, after getting one first down, the Gamecocks went backwards thanks to consecutive sacks by Maxwell Hairston and Zion Childress. The Gamecocks would eventually punt and Kentucky took over on its own 23 yard line.

The Cats went three-and-out and were forced to punt, with South Carolina taking over at the UK 46. The Gamecocks would get one first down before converting on a third and 14, getting inside the Kentucky red zone. On the next play, Sellers hit Joshua Simon for a 16-yard touchdown. Herrera added the point after and South Carolina led 17-6 with 6:49 left in the third quarter.

The Cats were pinned back on the next possession and eventually punted, with South Carolina taking over at the UK 43. The Gamecocks would take advantage of the prime field position, covering 43 yards in nine plays, ending with a Raheim Sanders touchdown rush from one yard out. Herrera added the point after and the Gamecocks led 24-6 with 28 seconds left in the third quarter.

South Carolina would add a pick six from Nick Emmanwori to lead 31-6.

#1 GEORGIA 13, KENTUCKY 12

Kentucky led No. 1 Georgia for the first three quarters and into the fourth before the top-ranked Bulldogs rallied for a 13-12 win at Kroger Field.

Kentucky (1-2, 0-2 Southeastern Conference) got a career-high 98 rushing yards from Demie Sumo-Karngbaye, who carried the ball 22 times, also a career high.

The Kentucky defense did its job against Georgia, holding the Bulldogs to 262 yards of total offense. The Cats got big efforts from Zion Childress (six tackles, one tackle for loss, one pass breakup), Ty Bryant (six tackles, one tackle

for loss) and D'Eryk Jackson (six tackles).

Georgia got the ball first and the Bulldogs made one first down before being forced to punt. After a penalty on the punt, the Cats took over at their own one yard line.

Kentucky got out of the shadow of its own goal posts on two runs by Vandagriff, covering a total of 21 yards. UK would get three first downs on the drive, crossing the 50 in the process, but the drive stalled and the Cats were forced to punt.

Georgia went three-and-out on its next drive and Kentucky took over near midfield with 5:17 to play in the first quarter. The Cats would get into Georgia territory before penalties moved the Cats back to near midfield. The UK drive would stall, but the Cats got on the board when Alex Raynor hit a 55-yard field goal, a Kentucky record, giving the Cats a 3-0 lead with 2:45 left in the first quarter.

Early in the second quarter, on a fourth-and-one near midfield, Georgia tried to draw the UK defense offside, but was unable to do so, and the Bulldogs punted it back to the Cats, who took over at their own 20. UK would make a first down before punting the ball back to the Bulldogs with 11:29 remaining in the first half.

Georgia started at its own 22 yard line. The Bulldogs would get to the 48-yard line before UK's Zion Childress intercepted Carson Beck and returned it 55 yards for a touchdown. However, after video review, it was determined that the pass hit the ground prior to Childress taking possession and it was ruled to be an incompletion. Georgia did punt on the next play and the Cats took over at their own eight yard line with 8:10 left in the half.

Kentucky would move the ball into Georgia territory on the next drive before Vandagriff fumbled and Georgia's Damon Wilson recovered at the UK 23 yard line. The Kentucky defense would hold, and Georgia would settle for a 34-yard field goal from Peyton Woodring, tying the game at 3-3 with 3:48 left in the half.

The Cats would get the final drive of the half and would march down the field and deep into Georgia territory largely due to Sumo-Karngbaye. The senior rushed for 51 yards on the drive, as the Cats got to the Georgia 14 yard line with nine seconds left in the half. Raynor would connect on a 32-yard field goal with five seconds left in the half, giving the Cats a 6-3 lead. That would be the halftime score.

Kentucky got the ball to start the third quarter and the Cats again went to the ground, using both Sumo-Karngbaye and Jamarion Wilcox to move the ball into Georgia territory. The Cats would get to the Georgia 28 yard line but faced a third-and-eight from there. Sumo-Karngbaye gained six yards but UK faced a fourth-and-two from the 22. Raynor came on for a 40-yard field goal, which he converted, and Kentucky took a 9-3 lead with 9:03 to play in the third quarter.

Georgia answered by assembling its best drive of the game, to that point. Beck got hot, passing for 65 yards on the drive and getting the Bulldogs inside the UK 10. However, a big defensive play by Ty Bryant and a third-down stop led to another Woodring field goal. This one was from 30 yards, it was good, and Georgia cut the UK lead to 9-6 with 3:52 left in the third quarter.

Kentucky went three-and-out on its next drive and was forced to punt. Georgia took over at its own 32 yard line with 2:17 left in the third quarter.

Georgia drove the ball into Kentucky territory as the third quarter came to an end, with the Cats clinging to a 9-6 advantage. As the fourth quarter began, that drive continued, eventually ending with the game's first touchdown, a three-yard touchdown rush from Branson Robinson. Woodring added the PAT and Georgia led for the first time, 13-9, with 12:20 left in the game.

The Cats would answer with a sustained drive, combining a nice mix of run and pass. Vandagriff connected with Sumo-Karngbaye for 11 yards and Barion Brown for 14 yards. But Sumo-Karngbaye and Wilcox again provided solid ground gains. However, the UK drive would stall at the Georgia 32 and the Cats brought on Raynor once again. And again, the senior delivered, this time from 51 yards, to cut the Georgia lead to 13-12 with 8:01 remaining.

The Kentucky defense got the stop it needed on the following possession, forcing Georgia into another three-and-out. The Bulldogs punted and Kentucky took over at its own 16 yard line with 6:25 remaining in the game.

The Cats would drive into Georgia territory on the ensuing drive. However, near midfield, the drive stalled and Kentucky punted with 2:58 remaining. Georgia took over at its own 15 yard line. The Dawgs put the ball in the hands of Beck, the Heisman Trophy candidate, and he delivered with a pair of completions that allowed Georgia to run out the clock, holding on for a one-point win.

Demie Sumo-Karngbaye scored a pair of touchdowns and Brock Vandagriff had 237 yards passing as Kentucky topped Ohio University 41-6 at Kroger Field.

Freshman Jamarion Wilcox had a career-high 82 yards rushing in the game. Sumo-Karngbaye had just 47 yards but did score twice. Dane Key tied a career high with seven receptions and set a career high with 145 yards receiving in the game.

Kentucky (2-2) got the ball first and the Cats were able to get a first down on a pass from Vandagriff to Sumo-Karngbaye for 18 yards. However, the drive would stall and UK was forced to punt.

The UK defense would force Ohio into a three-and-out on the Bobcats' first possession. Ohio would punt and the Cats took over at their own 36 with 10:35 left in the first quarter.

On Kentucky's next drive, Jamarion Wilcox had a 19-yard carry and Gavin Wimsatt had an eight-yard carry to get the Cats into Ohio territory. A 16-yard completion from Vandagriff to Dane Key got the Cats into the red zone. However, the drive would stall and the Cats would have to settle for a 30-yard field goal from Alex Raynor, which was good, and UK took a 3-0 lead with 5:48 left in the first quarter.

Ohio (2-2) would make its initial first down of the game on its next drive, but the Cats defense would force another punt, and the Cats took over at their own 20 with 3:07 left in the first quarter.

Kentucky's next drive started with three big plays. Vandagriff connected with Barion Brown for 19 yards, followed by a 21-yard rush from Wilcox. The freshman followed that with a run of 23 yards, getting the Cats into the red zone again. The first quarter would end with UK threatening to add to a 3-0 lead.

On the first play of the second quarter, Vandagriff connected with Key for a 15-yard gain, getting the Cats to the doorstep. On the next play, Sumo-Karngbaye scored a one-yard touchdown. Raynor added the PAT and Kentucky led 10-0 with 14:39 left in the half.

Ohio had its first significant drive of the game on its next possession. The Bobcats would get inside the UK red zone but the Bobcats fumbled and UK's J.J. Weaver recovered at the UK 15 yard line, ending the threat.

Kentucky's next drive looked to be going nowhere before Vandagriff found Dane Key for a 42-yard completion. From there, the Cats appeared to be stopped. However, Vandagriff and Key hooked up again, this time for a 36-yard completion on fourth down, getting the Cats to the two. On the next play, Sumo-Karngbaye scored his second touchdown of the game, and UK extended the lead. Raynor added the PAT and the Cats held a 17-0 advantage with 4:07 left in the half. That would be the halftime score.

Ohio got the first possession of the third quarter and the Bobcats were able to get one first down before the UK defense forced yet another punt. The Cats took over at their own 17 yard line.

The Cats put together a scoring drive, riding the hot passing of Vandagriff. He completed passing to Key (33 yards), Jordan Dingle (19 and 7) and Brown (two) to get the Cats into scoring position. However, the drive stalled and Raynor came on again, nailing a 34-yard field goal and giving the Cats a 20-0 lead. Raynor set a school record in the process with his 12th consecutive made field goal.

On Ohio's next possession, quarterback Nick Poulos threw a pass into the right flat that UK's Maxwell Hairston intercepted and returned 25 yards for a touchdown. It was Hairston's third career pick six, which tied the UK all-time record. The Raynor extra point made it 27-0 Kentucky with 5:12 to play in the third quarter.

As the third quarter came to a close, Ohio was inside the UK five yard line. On the first play of the fourth quarter, Ohio got on the board when Ricky Hunt rushed for a one-yard touchdown. The Bobcats went for two, but Poulos' pass was batted down by UK's Tre'Vonn Rybka.

Kentucky would answer with a scoring drive of its own. The Cats covered 56 yards in just six plays, ending with a 23-yard touchdown run by Brown. Raynor made another PAT and the Cats led 34-6 with 11:38 remaining.

The Cats would add another score when Gavin Wimsatt scored on a two-yard touchdown run. It was Wimsatt's first touchdown as a Wildcat. Raynor added the PAT and the Cats led 41-6. That would be the final score.

KENTUCKY 20, OLE MISS 17

SEPT. 28, 2024 • OXFORD, MISS
VAUGHT-HEMINGWAY (67,616)



Kentucky got a huge defensive effort on Sunday, holding sixth-ranked Ole Miss to a season low in points and yards, as the Cats pulled off a huge upset, topping the Rebels 20-17 at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium in Oxford, Mississippi. It was just the fifth time in program history that the Cats have beaten a team ranked in the nation's top six.

The Cats scored with 2:25 to play with quarterback Gavin Wimsatt rushed toward the goal line, but fumbled directly into the arms of UK's Josh Kattus, who fell forward into the end zone for the touchdown.

Quarterback Brock Vandagriff had his best game of the season, connecting on 18 of 28 through the air for 243 yards and a touchdown. Wide receiver Dane Key had another big game, catching a career-high eight passes for 105 yards and a score.

However, the day belonged to the Kentucky defense. Ole Miss came into the game averaging 55 points and 670 yards per game and the Cats held them to 17 points and just 353 yards off offense.

Kentucky kicked off to start the game and appeared to recover a fumble after a huge hit by freshman Willie Rodriguez. However, after video review, the call was overturned and Ole Miss took over at its own 17 yard line.

The Rebels would take advantage of the possession, covering 83 yards in six plays, ending with a one-yard touchdown run by Henry Parrish. Caden Davis added the point after and Ole Miss grabbed a 7-0 lead with 12:51 left in the first quarter.

Kentucky rode the ground game on its first possession of the game. The Cats used both Vandagriff and Wimsatt on quarterback runs that proved to be very effective. Vandagriff carried four times for 22 yards on the drive and Wimsatt rushed four times for 20 yards. The Cats would get into the Ole Miss red zone but were forced to settle for a 27-yard field goal from Alex Raynor, cutting the deficit to 7-3 with 5:13 left in the first quarter.

The UK defense stepped up on the next drive, forcing Ole Miss into just their second three-and-out of the season. The big play was an Octavious Oxendine sack of Jaxson Dart on third down. The Rebels punted and the Cats took over at their own 34 with 3:36 to play in the first quarter.

Ole Miss (4-1, 0-1) returned the favor, forcing UK into a three-and-out on its next series. After a 49-yard punt by Aidan Laros, the Rebels took over at their own 21 with 1:45 left in the first quarter.

As the second quarter began, Dart was sacked by Deone Walker and Jamon Dumas-Johnson. The Rebels would punt and the Cats took over at their own nine yard line with 14:19 left in the half.

Kentucky would work itself out of bad field position, getting four first downs, getting to midfield in the process. However, the Cats would be forced to punt and the Rebels took over at their own 17 with 7:52 left in the half.

Ole Miss would get one first down on the ensuing drive, but the Kentucky defense forced another punt and the Cats took over at their own 19 with 6:09 left in the half.

The Cats would mount a drive on their next possession, this time going to the air. Vandagriff hit Dane Key for completions of 16 and 24 yards, getting UK into Ole Miss territory as the two-minute warning hit. On third down, the Cats got a pass interference call against the Rebels and a fresh set of downs. UK would get inside the Ole Miss 10 yard line and, on third and goal, Ole Miss was called for another pass interference penalty. On the next play, Vandagriff connected with Key for a five-yard touchdown. Raynor added the PAT and the Cats led 10-7. That would be the halftime score.

Kentucky outgained the nation's top-ranked offense 161-129 in the first half. The Cats recorded three sacks and held Dart to just 97 yards passing.

The Cats got the ball to start the third quarter, but the Ole Miss defense forced a three-and-out and a Kentucky punt. The Rebels took over at their own 39 with 12:52 to play in the third quarter.

Ole Miss would drive into Kentucky territory with relative ease on its next drive. However, the UK defense stepped up in the red zone and forced the Rebels into a field goal attempt. Davis was good from 31 yards and the game was tied 10-10 with 9:44 left in the third quarter.

On Kentucky's next drive, Vandagriff found Key again for a 21-yard gain on first down. On the next play, freshman Jamarion Wilcox drug tacklers for a 17-yard gain and another first down. However, a sack of Vandagriff stalled the drive and the Cats called on Raynor again, this time from 48 yards out. The kick was good and UK grabbed a 13-10 lead with 6:31 left in the third quarter.

The Rebels appeared to be ready to tie or take lead, getting into the UK red zone. However, Ole Miss receiver Tre Harris was hit by JQ Hardaway and fumbled, with UK's Noah Matthews recovering at the UK 18. It was the first turnover of the game.

On the first play of the ensuing drive, Vandagriff connected with Barion Brown for 18 yards and a first down. However, the drive would stall and the Cats would punt again. Ole Miss took over at their own 39 with 2:11 to play in the third quarter.

The Kentucky defense appeared to stop Ole Miss near midfield on the next drive. However, on fourth down, Dart connected with Harris for a 48-yard touchdown Davis added the PAT and the Rebels led 17-13 with just 10 seconds left in the third quarter.

As the fourth quarter began, Kentucky was unable to do anything with its possession and was forced to punt. The Rebels would take over at their own 38 with 12:46 left in the game.

The Kentucky defense did its job again on the ensuing drive, forcing the Rebels into a three-and-out. Ole Miss punted and the Cats took over at their own 12 with 11:14 left in the game.

UK would make a couple of first downs on its next drive, but the Cats would eventually punt. Ole Miss would take over on its own 33 yard line with 6:41 remaining.

Again, the UK defense did its job, forcing the Rebels into a three-and-out and a punt. Kentucky took over at its own 17 with 4:48 to play.

Kentucky appeared to be going nowhere, but the Cats went for it on fourth down and Vandagriff connected with Brown for a 63-yard completion, getting UK to the Ole Miss 17 yard line. On the next play, Sumo-Karngbaye went around left end for 11 yards to the Ole Miss six. On the next play, Wimsatt went left and got near the goal line, but fumbled. The ball popped into the arms of Kattus, who fell forward into the end zone for the touchdown. Raynor added the PAT and Kentucky led 20-17 with 2:25 remaining.

The Cats defense appeared ready to clinch the game but Dart connected with Caden Prieskorn for 42 yards on fourth and 11. Ole Miss was at the UK 34 yard line and had an incomplection and a sack by J.J. Weaver to set up third down. On that third down play, Dart fumbled and UK recovered, but the Cats were offside and the turnover was negated. On fourth down, the Rebels' Davis attempted a 48-yard field goal, but he hooked it left and the Cats held on for the win.

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VANDERBILT 20, KENTUCKY 13

OCT. 12, 2024 • LEXINGTON, KY.
KROGER FIELD (62,120)



Brock Vandagriff passed for 158 yards and a touchdown, but Kentucky lost to Vanderbilt 20-13 at Kroger Field.

The UK defense did its part, holding the Commodores to just 288 yards of total offense in the game. However, the Cats hurt themselves with 12 penalties for 106 yards in the game.

Jamon Dumas-Johnson and Jordan Lovett led the Cats with nine tackles. Dumas-Johnson had a sack and two tackles for loss.

Kentucky got the ball first and, after earning a first down, the Cats were beneficiaries of a pass interference call against the Commodores, moving the ball across midfield. However, a pair of costly penalties stalled the drive and Kentucky punted it away, with Vanderbilt taking over at its own three yard line with 9:42 left in the first quarter.

Vanderbilt was able to work its way out of the less-than-ideal field position via a first down and a roughing the passer penalty on the Cats. Later in the drive, Vandy quarterback Diego Pavia rushed left for 31 yards, getting the 'Dores deep into UK territory. Two plays later, Pavia connected with AJ Newberry for a 20-yard touchdown pass. Brock Taylor added the point after and Vanderbilt led 7-0 with 4:50 remaining in the first quarter.

The Cats would respond with a good drive of their own. UK rode the legs of Sumo-Karngbaye and Gavin Wimsatt to get into Vandy territory. A Vandagriff completion to Jordan Dingle got the Cats into the red zone as the first quarter ended.

As the second quarter began, the Cats got a pair of five-yard rushes from Vandagriff to get to the one yard line. From there, Sumo-Karngbaye took it in for the touchdown. Alex Raynor added the extra point and the game was tied 7-7 with 13:42 left in the first half.

Vandy wasted little time on its next possession, getting into UK territory on just four plays. However, on the fifth play of the drive, Pavia was intercepted by UK linebacker D'Eryk Jackson on an acrobatic play that gave the Cats the ball at their own 36 with 10:33 left in the half.

After a pair of penalties set the Cats back, UK would eventually get going on the drive. A third-down completion from Vandagriff to Dane Key covered 20 yards and put Kentucky at the VU 34 yard line. However, after Vandagriff connected with Key again, the Commodores forced a fumble and Vandy recovered, taking over at their own 34 yard line with 6:46 left in the half.

Vandy was unable to do much with the ensuing possession, largely due to a sack by Dumas-Johnson. The 'Dores would punt and the Cats took over at their own six with 2:24 left in the half.

Kentucky got one first down on its next possession before punting. The Commodores would take over at their own 40 with 1:35 left in the half.

Pavia would lead the Commodores to a scoring drive just before the end of the half. With just 13 seconds remaining in the half, Pavia hit Richie Hoskins for an 18-yard touchdown. Taylor added the PAT and Vandy led 14-7. That would be the halftime score.

In the third quarter, Vanderbilt got the ball first and the 'Dores went on an 11-play drive. However, they only gained 44 yards on the drive, which stalled in UK territory. Taylor came on and made a 49-yard field goal, giving Vandy a 17-7 lead with 7:51 left in the period.

Kentucky would attempt to answer, turning to the ground game again. Jamarion Wilcox ripped off a 16-yard run to start the drive, and a few plays later, Barion Brown went for 10 yards on a jet sweep. Sumo-Karngbaye went for seven yards to get the Cats into the red zone. After Wimstatt got the Cats to the one yard line. Kentucky would attempt a field goal, but a problem on the hold prevented the kick and Vandy took over at its own 10 with 1:50 left in the third quarter. Vandy would lead 17-7 after three quarters.

In the fourth quarter, Vanderbilt put together a methodical drive, using lots of game clock (8:03) along the way. However, a sack by JJ Weaver forced Vandy into a field goal. Taylor would connect from 50 yards out and the 'Dores led 20-7 with 8:47 to play.

Kentucky would respond quickly, going with a no-huddle, hurry up offense. Vandagriff got hot, connecting on three consecutive passes, including a 22-yard touchdown pass to Key. The PAT failed after a bad snap, but the Cats were within 20-13 with 7:02 remaining.

Vanderbilt was able to get one first down on its first drive, but the possession stalled when Jackson sacked Pavia. The Commodores punted and Kentucky took over at its own 20 with 2:26 to play.

Kentucky, needing a touchdown and extra point to tie, went to work. Vandagriff rushed for nine yards, then connected with Brown for 23 yards to get UK to the Vanderbilt 48 yard line. However, penalties would hamper the Cats and the drive would end on a Vandagriff incompletion.

FLORIDA 48, KENTUCKY 20

OCT. 19, 2024 • GAINESVILLE, FLA.
BEN HILL GRIFFIN STADIUM (89,906)



Barion Brown set a Southeastern Conference record with his fifth career kickoff return for a touchdown, but Kentucky lost to Florida 48-20 at Ben Hill Griffin Stadium in Gainesville.

Brown also caught two passes for 56 yards, including a 45-yard touchdown, and he rushed three times for seven yards.

Kentucky (3-4, 1-4 SEC) got nine tackles from Jordan Lovett and seven from Alex Afari and Zion Childress. Afari had 2.5 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks.

Florida (4-3, 2-2) got the game's first possession and the Gators got a big play when DJ Lagway connected with Eugene Wilson for a 40-yard pass play, getting Florida into the red zone. The Gators got inside the five, but a sack by UK linebacker Alex Afari and a pass breakup by Deone Walker forced Florida into a field goal attempt. Trey Smack would connect on a 29-yard field goal and Florida led 3-0 with 10:27 left in the first quarter.

Kentucky went to the ground on its first drive. Demie Sumo-Karngbaye ripped off a 15-yard run to get the Cats near midfield. However, the Cats would get no further and would punt. Florida took over at its own nine yard line with 8:36 to play in the first quarter.

Florida would make one first down on its next possession before the UK defense got the stop and forced a Gators' punt. The Cats took over at their own 25 with 6:03 left in the first period.

Kentucky went back to Sumo-Karngbaye on the next drive and the senior helped the Cats get one first down. However, the drive stalled and UK punted again. Florida took over at its own 20 with 3:17 left in the period.

The Gators would get a couple of solid rushes from Lagway as the first quarter came to an end with Florida leading 3-0 and threatening. As the second quarter began, the UK defense stuffed the Gators and forced another field goal. Smack would make a 33-yard field goal and Florida led 6-0 with 14:13 left in the half.

Kentucky started its next drive at its own 16, but an 11-yard Vandagriff run got the Cats a quick first down. On the next play, Jamarion Wilcox busted through the line for a 25-yard gain, getting the Cats into Florida territory. Two plays later, Vandagriff handed to Sumo-Karngbaye, who flipped it back to his quarterback. Vandagriff connected with Barion Brown for a 45-yard touchdown. The extra point was no good and the game was tied 6-6 with 12:05 left in the half.

The teams would trade three-and-out possessions before Florida got its offense going again. The Gators needed just three plays to cover 65 yards, ending with a seven-yard touchdown run by Jadan Baugh. Smack added the PAT and Florida led 13-6 with 8:15 remaining in the half.

Kentucky got a first down on the first play of its next drive when Vandagriff hit Dane Key for an 11-yard gain. However, three plays later, Vandagriff was intercepted by Florida's Trikweze Bridges at the Florida 46.

On the second play of the Florida drive, UK's Kristian Story picked off Lagway and returned the ball 63 yards to the Florida 11 yard line. A pair of quarterback runs, one by Vandagriff and one by Gavin Wimsatt, got the Cats to the Florida three. Sumo-Karngbaye was stopped on third down and the Cats went for it on fourth down. Sumo-Karngbaye was stopped short of a first down, and Florida took over at its own two with 4:24 left in the half.

Florida got out of the shadow of its own goal post on a 27-yard run by Baugh on first down. On the next play, Lagway connected with Elijah Badger for a 58-yard gain to the UK 13 yard line. Two plays later, Baugh scored around on a 10-yard run around left end. Smack added the point after and Florida led 20-6 with 2:10 left in the half.

The Gators added another touchdown to go up 27-6 before Brown returned the ensuing kickoff 99 yards for a touchdown. Alex Raynor added the point after and UK cut the Florida lead to 27-13 with 1:30 left in the half. That would be the halftime score.

Kentucky got the ball to start the second half, and it started with three consecutive Vandagriff runs (11, 0 and nine yards). However, on third and two, the Cats were stopped again. UK would go for it on fourth down and Vandagriff hit tight end Josh Kattus for a 21-yard gain and a first down. Kentucky would get into the red zone on a 19-yard completion from Vandagriff to Fred Farrier. The Cats got to the Florida three on a four-yard carry from Brown. Two plays later, Wimsatt rushed up the middle for the one-yard touchdown. Raynor made the point after and UK cut the deficit to 27-20 with 8:34 left in the third quarter.

Florida answered with a drive of its own. The biggest play was a Lagway completion to Chimere Dike, covering 44 yards to the UK three yard line. Three plays later, Baugh scored from one yard out. Smack added the PAT and Florida extended its lead to 34-20 with 3:27 left in the third quarter.

The Cats' next drive started in the third quarter and continued early in the fourth. The Cats would run 15 plays and would gain 53 yards on the drive. But needing a touchdown, Kentucky went for it on fourth down in Florida territory and came up short. Florida took over with 10:35 to play holding a 14-point lead.

The Gators would add two touchdowns late to provide the final margin of victory.

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AUBURN 24, KENTUCKY 10

KROGER FIELD (60,605)



Dane Key caught four passes for 87 yards but Kentucky lost to Auburn 24-10 in Southeastern Conference football action at Kroger Field.

The Cats’ defense did its best to keep UK in the game. Kentucky had six tackles for loss, including four sacks. Jordan Lovett led the Cats with nine tackles, while Jamon Dumas-Johnson had eight tackles, including a sack.

Kentucky got the game’s first possession and the Cats looked good early. Vandagriff connected with Jason Patterson for a 15-yard completion, followed by a 21-yard completion to Dane Key, getting UK to the Auburn 32. However, the drive would stall and the Cats would get a 46-yard field goal from Alex Raynor, giving Kentucky a 3-0 lead with 11:28 to play in the first quarter.

After a penalty on the kickoff, the Auburn drive started at its own eight yard line. The UK defense completely shut down the drive, forcing a three-and-out and an Auburn punt. UK took over at its own 47 yard line with 10:13 left in the first period.

Kentucky’s offense would get the explosive plays going on the next drive. Jamarion Wilcox carried for 12 yards, followed by a spectacular 34-yard completion from Vandagriff to Key. Patterson then went 23 yards around the left end, getting the Cats to the Auburn three. A couple of plays later, the Cats would punch it in on a two-yard touchdown run by Wilcox. Raynor added the PAT and UK led 10-0 with 8:24 left in the period.

On the second play of the next Auburn drive, J.Q. Hardaway intercepted Auburn’s Payton Thorne and UK took over at the Auburn 40 yard line. However, the Cats were not able to do anything with the possession and were forced to punt. Auburn took over at its own 10 with 5:59 left in the first quarter.

Auburn would cross midfield on its next possession, but the UK defense again held and forced another Tigers’ punt. Kentucky took over at its own nine yard line with 2:10 left in the quarter. UK would lead 10-0 after the first period.

Early in the second quarter, Kentucky was forced to punt and Auburn took over at its own 47 with 13:28 left in the half. The Tigers would march 53 yards on just five plays, ending with a six-yard touchdown pass from Thorne to KeAndre Lambert-Smith. Alex McPherson added the point after and Kentucky’s lead was cut to 10-7 with 10:56 left in the half.

On the ensuing drive, Vandagriff connected with true freshman Hardley Gilmore for 22 yards. It was Gilmore’s first career reception and it got the Cats near midfield. However, three plays later, Vandagriff was intercepted by Auburn’s Jay Crawford. The Tigers took over at their own 37 yard line with 9:06 left in the half.

Auburn would drive into the UK red zone, but the Kentucky defense stopped the Tigers and force a field goal attempt. McPherson was good from 27 yards out and the game was tied 10-10 with 3:57 left in the half.

Kentucky would start its next drive at the 25 and the Cats would get a first down on a Vandagriff to Key connection for 12 yards. A defensive holding penalty got UK to midfield, but the drive stalled and UK punted, with Auburn taking over at its own 13 yard line. The Tigers got a 16-yard rush, followed by a 24-yard rush, both from Jarquez Hunter, getting Auburn to the UK 47. The AU drive continued inside the UK red zone. But UK’s J.J. Weaver came up with a huge sack of Thorne and, with Auburn having no timeouts remaining, the Tigers were unable to get a field goal attempt off before the clock expired. The teams went to the locker room tied at 10-10.

Auburn got the first possession of the third quarter and the Tigers went to the ground game. Four straight rushes got the ball past midfield. AU converted on a third-and-one from the UK 39. A pair of pass plays got the Tigers deep into UK territory and Hunter would score on a one-yard touchdown rush. McPherson added the extra point and Auburn led 17-10 with 7:53 left in the third quarter.

Kentucky would go three-and-out on its first possession after the break. The Cats punted and Auburn took over at its own 10 with 6:52 left in the third quarter.

The Tigers would get out of that hole on a 50-yard rush by Hunter, taking the ball to the UK 35 yard line. After one more first down, the UK defense stopped the Auburn and McPherson missed a 47-yard field goal, giving the Cats possession with 3:38 left in the third quarter.

Kentucky got a first down on its next possession and got the ball near midfield before having to punt. Auburn would take over at its own 20 with 1:56 left in the third period. Auburn would lead 17-10 through three quarters.

Early in the fourth quarter, Hunter broke loose again, scampering 45 yards for a touchdown to extend the Auburn lead. McPherson added the PAT and Auburn led 24-10 with 12:11 to play.

Kentucky would respond with a long, methodical drive. The biggest play on the drive came when Gavin Wimsatt connected with Key for 20 yards to the Auburn 40. UK would get the ball to the Auburn two yard line but on fourth and goal, Wimsatt was intercepted by Auburn’s Kayin Lee and Auburn took over at their own nine with just 4:39 remaining.
