NEED TO KNOW

Mark Pope was named the 23rd head coach in UK history on April 12, 2024. He is a nine-year coaching veteran with stops at Utah Valley and BYU. Pope was the captain of the 1996 UK National Championship team. He averaged 7.9 points and 5.7 rebounds in 69 career games for the Cats in two seasons.

UK's roster consists of the most experienced roster in program history with players amassing 586 career collegiate starts, but not a single Cat has played in the Blue and White.

Jaxson Robinson was tabbed the Big 12 Sixth Man of the Year in 2023-24 for BYU. He became the first Cougar in program history to lead the team in scoring off the bench at 14.2 points per game. He is the lone player on the roster to suit up for Pope entering 2024-25. He was named to the All-SEC Preseason Third Team.

Koby Brea was the A-10's Sixth Man of

the Year and led the country in 3-point field-goal percentage at 49.8% with 100 makes.

Lamont Butler is a two-time Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year. He hit the game-win-ning shot in the 2023 Final Four to lift San Diego State to the title game.

Amari Williams is the only player in CAA history to earn defensive player of the year accolades in three straight seasons. He finished his career at Drexel ranking fifth all time with 186 career blocks.

Ansley Almonor (69 starts, 1,097 career points), Andrew Carr (112 starts, 1,286 points) and Kerr Kriisa (93 starts, 965 points) add to the team's veteran experience as seniors or fifth-year players.

UK is slated to play 13 teams who reached the 2024 NCAA Tournament a total of 15 times, as well as five Sweet 16 teams from a year ago in 2024-25.



CREDENTIAL REQUESTS

Requests for single-game credentials are now open and the window to apply will close **three** days prior to game day online at sportssystems.com/Kentucky.

CREDENTIAL CRITERIA

The University of Kentucky's decision to issue credentials to a media outlet for the purposes of covering a UK basketball home or away event is determined by a variety of factors. They include the following:

- Priority is given to outlets based on circulation size/household reach/unique site visitors
- Additional consideration is based on amount of Additional consideration is based on amount or original content generated, number of full-time employees of the outlet, length of existence of the outlet and the journalist experience of the reporter(s) Attendance at Kentucky media sessions, including Olympic sport opportunities and the intention/ability
- to cover all sports at Kentucky both at home and on the road, also is considered Professionalism, which includes is not limited to conduct at games, press conferences, practices, on social media, etc.

Being granted credentials at another institution/event does not equate to meeting the criteria for the University of Kentucky. Being granted credentials for one UK event does not guarantee approval for other UK events. The University of Kentucky has the right to deny or revoke credentials under its own discretion. Credentials under its own discretion. Credentials under its own discretion. dentialing also is dependent on space availability.

INTERVIEW POLICIES-GENERAL

All interviews with University of Kentucky basketball players or staff members must be arranged through the Communications and Public Relations office. Media should never contact a player or coach directly.

The Wildcat Coal Lodge, dormitories, team locker rooms and other team quarters are private team areas. Media members are not permitted in these areas unless accompanied by appropriate university personnel.

PRACTICE/PRESS CONFERENCES

Other than announced exceptions, UK basketball practices are closed to the media.

Player interviews are conducted pregame weekly and will be available to all UK media. UK will accept requests for player interviews, but they must be submitted 24 hours prior to the scheduled availability.

Coach Mark Pope will meet with members of the media at least once a week in the Memorial Coliseum Media Roon

Game-day shoot-arounds are closed to the media

TELEPHONE PLAYER INTERVIEWS

Telephone interviews are available to the media on a call-back basis. Individual player and coach telephone numbers will not be given to members of the media.

Players are instructed not to conduct interviews when contacted directly by telephone. The Communications and Public Relations office will arrange for telephone interviews at a time most convenient for the student-athlete

Other special requests are handled on a case-by-case basis.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

FOSTGAME INTERVIEWS
Following each game, there is a cooling-off period, during which time the players shower and dress. Approximately 10 minutes after the game ends, Coach Pope conducts his postgame press conference while a player speaks to the UK Sports Network.

Following Coach Pope's press conference in the Rupp Arena interview room and the cooling-off period, selected UK players are available in the interview room.

Now in its 123rd season of college basketball, Kentucky is 100-21 all-time in season openers entering the 2024-25 season (the Wildcats did not have a schedule in 1952-53 due to NCAA suspension). Included in Kentucky's 100-21 all-time season-opening record was a 34-game winning streak from the 1927-28 season to the 1961-62 season.

- Kentucky is 105-16 all-time in home openers
- UK is 44-4 in the first game played in Rupp Arena
- The Wildcats are 7-0 in a head coach's debut dating back to Adolph Rupp's opener in 1930. Those wins include coaches Joe B. Hall, Eddie Sutton, Rick Pitino, Tubby Smith, Billy Gillisipie and John Calipari
- Mark Pope was on the opposing sideline as head coach of Utah Valley on Nov. 10, 2017 in the season opener and home opener for the Wildcats during the 2017-18 season. UK captured a 73-63 win, despite Pope's squad owning a 34-22 lead at the break
- UK also played Wright State in the season opener to start the 1992-93 season. Kentucky earned an 81-65 victory in that con-

Takeaways from the Tune-Ups

Kentucky won both of its exhibition games leading up to regular-season play, defeating Kentucky Wesleyan, 123-52, before downing Minnesota State, 98-67.

- UK improved to 154-12 all-time in exhibition games
- Kentucky has won its last 33 exhibition games dating back to Nov. 2, 2014, vs. Pikeville. The last loss was Aug. 17, 2014, vs. the Dominican Republic in the final game of the 2014 Big Blue Bahamas exhibition tour
- Kentucky's margin of victory in the two exhibition games was an average of 51 points. That's the most since an average margin of 75 points in the exhibition wins prior to the 2016-17 season
- Against Kentucky Wesleyan, UK made 21 of 42 on 3-point shots. Had that been a regular-season game, UK would have tied the school single-game record. The Wildcats made 21 of 48 against North Carolina on Dec. 27, 1989
- As a team, the Wildcats sank 34 of 79 (43.0%) from long range in the two games and averaged 17 made 3s per game. Jaxson Robinson was 13 of 21 (61.9%) from deep to lead the way
- The Blue and White amassed an average of 30 assists on 42.5 made field goals in the two outings compared to just 6.5 turnovers per game
- Lamont Butler induced nine total steals and also added a teamhigh 11 assists in the two games
- The Wildcats shot 58.6% from the field and 43.0% from deep, while limiting their opponents to 35.9% from the floor and 27.3% from 3
- Five players averaged double-figures in the points' column paced by Robinson (21.5 ppg) and followed by Otega Oweh (16.5), Andrew Carr (12.0), Ansley Almonor (11.0) and Koby Brea (10.0)

Know Your Opponent: Wright State

Wright State is under the direction of first-year head coach Clint Sargent. He has been a member of the Raiders' program since the 2016-17 season and spent the last three seasons as the associate head coach

- Since Sargent's arrival at Wright State ahead of the 2016-17 season, the Raiders have won a combined five Horizon League championships between regular season and tournament titles, including trips to the NCAA Tournament in 2018 and 2022
- Wright State captured its first win in its NCAA Division I history in the 2022 tournament with a First Four victory over Bryant
- The Raiders were picked to finish fifth in the Horizon League preseason poll, but received four first-place votes
- Returning bigman Brandon Noel was the top choice for the league's player of the year award. Noel averaged 14.5 points and a team-high 8.0 rebounds per game as a sophomore. He reached double-digit scoring in 26 of his 31 starts

UK Ranked to Begin the Season

Led by first-year head coach Mark Pope, Kentucky will begin the season ranked at No. 23 in both the Associated Press Top 25 and the USA Today Coaches Poll.

- This is the 57th time in program history that the Wildcats are among the top-rated teams to open the season in 64 preseason AP polls.
- It marks the 59th time in 75 seasons that UK is ranked in the preseason coaches poll
- Kentucky leads all programs with 970 appearances in the weekly AP poll, which is in its 76th season.
- Ten Kentucky opponents enter the 2024-25 season ranked in both the AP Top 25 and coaches poll for 12 total matchups with preseason ranked foes
- A nation-leading nine Southeastern Conference squads begin the season ranked.

Associated Press Poll All-Time Leader

Not only is Kentucky the nation's all-time wins leader and the team with the best all-time winning percentage, it has been ranked in the Associated Press more than any other program.

Kentucky has been ranked in the AP poll during 970 weeks in the poll's 76-year history. North Carolina (957), Duke (893), Kansas (860) and UCLA (738) round out the top five.

The Wildcats were ranked No. 1 for the first time in the second month of the poll in Feb. 1949. UK has played a total of 252 games as the nation's top-ranked team.

S-E-C! S-E-C! S-E-C!

Kentucky is the Southeastern Conference's gold standard. Since the SEC's inception in 1932-33, the Wildcats are the most dominant team in the league, recording a 1,059-308 mark (77.5%) in regular-season conference play. Only Alabama has won more than 800 regular-season SEC games and no other team owns a better winning percentage.

- UK has averaged 11.8 wins and only 3.4 losses per season in 91 seasons in the SEC
- Kentucky has won 49 SEC regular-season titles and 31 SEC Tournament championships
- UK won its 1,000th game in SEC regular-season action vs. Alabama on Jan. 11, 2020. Kansas has won 1,000 conference games when combining its records in the Big 6, Big 7, Big 8 and Big 12, but no other team in the country had won 1,000 or more regular-season league games in one conference alone
- Eight teams made the 2024 NCAA Tournament field, tied for the most among any conference
- The SEC has had 51 NCAA Tournament selections over the last seven tournaments
- The league has advanced at least one team to the Elite Eight in 11 of the last 14 tournaments
- The preseason Associated Press Top 25, has a nation-leading nine SEC teams ranked

Here's to You, Mr. Robinson

Kentucky guard Jaxson Robinson has been named to several preseason watch lists and teams.

Robinson is a selection on the All-Southeastern Conference Third Team by both the league's coaches and media, he is also among 20 early season candidates for the Julius Erving award honoring the nation's best small foward, and he is also among the Naismith Trophy's preseason list for the national player of the year honor.

- The grad transfer from Brigham Young University comes to Kentucky as the 2023-24 Big 12 Sixth Man of the Year after leading Mark Pope's Cougars in scoring at 14.2 points per game
- · Robinson was the first bench player in BYU program history to pace the team in scoring and did so while shooting 42.6% from the field and 35.4% from beyond the 3-point arc, all ca-
- Robinson reached double-digit scoring in 25 of 33 games played last season, connecting on 81 3-pointers and burying at least one triple in each of the team's final 21 games.

<u>From Robin Hood Country to the Big Blue</u> **Nation**

Kentucky center Amari Williams, who hails from Nottingham, England, was named to the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame's preseason watch list for the 2025 Kareem Abdul-Jabbar. Named after the Naismith Hall of Famer and NBA all-time scoring leader, the award is in its 11th year.

- Williams became the first player in Coastal Athletic Association league history to earn defensive player of the year honors in three consecutive seasons. A transfer from Drexel, he finished his career ranking fifth all-time with 186 blocked shots. Williams, a two-time All-CAA First-Team selection, also scored 1,081 career points and hauled in 732 career boards
- For his career, Williams has averaged 10.3 points, 7.0 rebounds and 1.8 blocks per game in 105 career outings. He has connected on 51.9% of his field-goal attempts and has recorded 24 career double-doubles. Williams has topped double-figure scoring in 63 games, while leading his team in blocked shots in 76 games

The Mark Pope Era Begins

When his alma mater came calling, Mark Pope knew there was no place like home.

Pope, a captain of the University of Kentucky's 1996 National Championship team, returned to Lexington as the 23rd head coach of Kentucky's storied men's basketball program on April

- He's advanced teams to six postseason appearances. Another squad, his 2020 BYU team, would have been in the NCAA Tournament had the COVID pandemic not canceled postseason play
- Pope was 110-52 (67.9%) at BYU where three of his five teams ranked among the top 20 of the Ken Pomeroy efficiency rankings
- Pope is coming off a 23-11 season in 2023-24. It was BYU's first season in the Big 12 Conference and the Cougars' 10-8 league record featured victories over No. 7 Kansas, No. 11 Baylor and No. 24 lowa State
- The Cougars ranked third in the country with 11.1 made 3-pointers per game in 2023-24, and also ranked in the top 10 in assists per game (3rd) and assist-to-turnover ratio (6th)
- BYU led the Big 12 in scoring at 81.4 points per game
- BYU was ranked as high as No. 12 in the AP Poll after going 12-1 in nonconference action
- Pope began his collegiate playing career at the University of Washington, where he was tabbed the 1992 Pac-10 Freshman of the Year.
- Transferred to Kentucky after his sophomore season, where he appeared in every game of his two-year career with the Wildcats
- UK won the 1995 and '96 regular-season Southeastern Conference championships, the '95 SEC Tournament title and the 1996 NCAA Tournament

- He played professional basketball from 1997-2005, including stints with Indiana, Milwaukee Bucks, New York Knicks and Denver Nuggets
- In 2000-01, he started 45 games and helped the Bucks reach the Eastern Conference Finals

Old But New

Mark Pope's inaugural roster features a bevy of experience led by six players in their fifth year of collegiate basketball. The roster also has a senior, a junior and sophomore, and three freshmen.

The roster is one of the most experienced in the country, but not a single player enters the season having appeared in a game for Kentucky.

UK's veteran lineup has played in 845 career games, played 20,741 minutes, made 586 starts, scored 7,900 points and sunk 1,033 3-pointers at a 37.0% rate.

That is all more than any team in the history of Kentucky basketball entering a season (minutes statistics available through the 1964-65 season).

Kentucky's other most-veteran squads were the 2021-22 squad which played 13,385 total minutes and scored 5,203 career points. Pope's 1996 team -- hailed as one of the greatest college basketball teams of all time -- had career point totals of 5,232. The 2002-03 squad had 559 games to its roster.

Conversely, Kentucky is returning 0.0% of its scoring, rebounding, assists, steals or blocks production from a season ago. It is the first time in the history of the program there has not been a single returning contributor. The fewest returning points scored from one season to another in program history occurred in the midst of World War II where the 1943-44 roster had a squad with team members who had combined to score just 19 points the season before.

- In a recent survey of other men's basketball programs, Kentucky's six fifth-year players are tied for the third-most in college basketball among the power conferences. Only Oklahoma State (8) and Louisville (7) have more
- In a different survey of men's basketball programs throughout the country, Kentucky's 12 newcomers are tied for the fifth-most among power conferences trailing only Cal (16), Louisville (16), Oklahoma State (13) and Vanderbilt (13)
- The Wildcats join only Louisville as a major-conference team that is not returing any production from last year's roster

Kentucky's Team

Mark Pope and his staff pieced together an experienced, talented, honored and winning group of players to represent Big Blue Nation's 2024-25 team.

Ansley Almonor, Lamont Butler, Andrew Carr and Amari Williams are all 1,000-point scorers. Butler and Williams were named their league's defensive player of the year, while Koby Brea and Jaxson Robinson have been tabbed a conference's sixth man of the year in their career and Almonor was a most improved selection. Brandon Garrison is a former McDonald's All-American. Kerr Kriisa has played in 99 career games and has made 238 3-pointers, while Otega Oweh has seen action in 60 games and was Oklahoma's second-leading scorer a season ago.



Kentucky's freshmen group includes Travis Perry and Trent Noah from the state of Kentucky and Collin Chandler, a former top-35 signee in the class of 2022. Perry is the state's all-time leading scorer, while Noah broke the Sweet 16 state record for most 3-pointers drained in a single run with 19 this season.

Assistants Snapshot

In addition to putting together a roster from scratch, Mark Pope also had to assemble a staff upon his hiring as head coach of the Wildcats. Pope constructed what he considers to be the best in the country.

- Alvin Brooks III (associated head coach): Brooks coached eight seasons at Baylor, serving as both an assistant and associate head coach. The Bears went 194-72 during Brooks' tenure, including a 94-46 record in Big 12 action, won the 2021 NCAA Tournament, went 12-5 in NCAA Tournament games and 22-15 against Associated Press top-10 ranked foes. A Houston native, Brooks began his coaching career at the junior college level. He spent two seasons at Arkansas-Forth Smith, helping the Lions to the 2006 NJCAA Division I championship. He then joined the staff at Midland, where he again was on staff for an NJCAA title team in 2007.
- Mark Fox (associate coach): Has been a head coach at the NCAA Division I level for 18 years and has a career record of 324-263. Fox has directed teams to four regular-season conference titles, five NCAA Tournament appearances and 10 total postseason appearances during his collegiate coaching tenure. Fox and Pope reunite in Lexington, after Fox hired Pope for his first collegiate basketball position. Pope served as the Director of Basketball Operations at Georgia in 2009-10, coincidentally Fox's first season with the Bulldogs.
- Cody Fueger (assistant coach): Fueger has been a nine-year member of Mark Pope's staffs, first serving as an assistant coach at Utah Valley and then transitioning to BYU. The connection began when they were on the BYU staff together when Pope was an assistant coach and

Fueger served as the director of basketball operations. Fueger began his career as a student assistant coach and video coordinator at Utah under Rick Majerus. Named one of the most impactful mid-major assistant coaches in Division I men's basketball by Silver Waves Media in 2022 and 2023, Fueger has been instrumental for Pope's squads.

• Jason Hart (assistant coach): Hart is a nine-year NBA veteran with extensive coaching experience at the high school, collegiate and professional levels. Hart most recently served as the head coach of the NBA's G-League Ignite squad, coaching the likes of Jaden Hardy, Scoot Henderson, Matas Buzelis and Ron Holland. He is a member of Syracuse's All-Century Team, which honored the top 25 players in the program's history. He was picked in the second round of the 2000 NBA Draft by the Milwaukee Bucks, where he was teammates with Pope for one season.

• Mikhail McLean (assistant coach): McLean spent the last three seasons on staff with Lamar as an assistant coach where the Cardinals have steadily improved year-to-year, culminating in a record-breaking 19-14 season in 2023-24. The Cardinals' 19 wins were their most in NCAA Division I since the 2011-12 season and the second most since the 1987-88 campaign. In addition to his collegiate coaching career, McLean is a native of The Bahamas and serves as the associate head coach on the Bahamian National Team staff. He has been a part of the program since 2021 and is the squad's defensive coordinator. A former standout player for Houston, he joined the Cougars' staff for six seasons

The Long Ball

A staple Mark Pope team is known for shooting the long ball. Pope has discussed throughout the offseason the desire to average 35 3-point attempts per game for the 2024-25 season. Entering the season, Pope's veterans have combined to make 1,033 3-pointers at a 37.0% rate.

Kentucky Boasts Nation-Leading 29 Players on NBA Opening-Day Rosters

The Kentucky men's basketball program finds itself in familiar territory with a nation-leading 29 players on NBA opening-day rosters. It marks the 13th consecutive season in which the Wildcats have paced the nation in terms of their alumni contingent in the league. The total of 29 players is based off the NBA's official opening-day roster list and includes all two-way and inactive players.

Duke (24 players) is the only other school with at least 20 representatives on a roster heading into the 2024-25 season. The Southeastern Conference leads all collegiate conferences with 100 players on opening day rosters. The Big Ten is second with 89.

Of the 30 NBA franchises, 20 feature at least one player out of Kentucky, while eight have multiple Wildcats. The Sacramento Kings lead the league with three UK products on their roster, while the 76ers, Heat, Knicks, Lakers, Pelicans, Suns and Thunder each have two. A group of four Cats from last year's Kentucky team join the NBA ranks this season, led by top-10 draft picks Reed Sheppard and Rob Dillingham.

Kentucky's NBA contingent enters the 2024-25 season with significant momentum. Last year, a record-breaking seven UK players earned NBA All-Star nods, while three were selected to All-NBA teams. Shai Gilgeous-Alexander finished as the runner up for the league's Most Valuable Player award, while Tyrese Maxey was named the KIA Most Improved Player. Maxey also received the NBA's Sportsmanship Award and Karl-Anthony Towns was chosen as the recipient of the Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Social Justice Champion Award.

600 Wins at Rupp in Record Time

With a victory over Fairleigh Dickinson on Dec. 7, 2019, Kentucky reached the 600-win mark at Rupp Arena faster than any other program in NCAA Division I level history. UK needed just 670 games to reach win No. 600 in Rupp Arena.

It took UCLA, which previously owned the fastest pace to 600 wins, 689 games in Pauley Pavilion. Only one other team, Kansas, achieved win No. 600 in fewer than 700 games at its home venue. The Jayhawks reached the significant win in their 699th game.

New Court Design in 2024-25

A new basketball court is slated to come to Rupp Arena at Central Bank Center in 2024-25. It features the UK logo at midcourt and a contrasting wood stain outline of the State of Kentucky earlier this season. The updated court design also features perimeter borders painted Kentucky Blue with the Kentucky Wordmark on each baseline, the Rupp Arena at Central Bank Center logos on the wings and the Southeastern Conference logos in the lanes.

The Cawood's Court marker memorializing legendary radio play-byplay announcer Cawood Ledford remains at midcourt in front of the broadcast table on the opposite side from the team benches, and the UK logo with "Mr. Wildcat" honoring longtime manager Bill Keightley is still in front of the UK bench.

The Top-Ranked Team at Home

Kentucky has lost just four times at home as the Associated Press top-ranked team in the history of the program and just three times in Rupp Arena. Prior to the losses to Evansville (Nov. 12, 2019) and UCLA (Dec. 3, 2016), the other two losses came by just one point.

The Wildcats are 54-3 all-time as the AP No. 1 team in Rupp Arena since its opening in 1976. The first loss was to Auburn, 53-52, on Jan. 9. 1988.

Mark Pope in Rupp Arena

Mark Pope, the 23rd head coach in prgram history will make his debut on Nov. 4, 2024 in a matchup with Wright State.

He coached one time against the Cats inside of Rupp on the opposing sidelines as a head coach. His Utah Valley squad held a 34-22 lead at halftime on Nov. 10, 2017, but ultimately UK would win 73-63 behind 13 points, four assists and four steals from future NBA All-Star Shai Gilgeous-Alexander.

As a UK player, Pope's teams went 25-1 (96.2%) inside of Rupp Arena. In those 26 appearances, Pope's playing days produced:

- · Kentucky averaged 89.8 points per game
- UK's average margin of victory was 25.3 points per game
- The Cats defeated four ranked squads, including one top 10
- Pope scored in every game in which he appeared, and averaged 8.2 points and 6.6 rebounds per game

HEAD COACH MARK POPE



Mark Pope, a captain of the University of Kentucky's 1996 National Championship team, has returned to Lexington as the 23rd head coach of Kentucky's storied men's basketball program.

Pope is a nine-year head coaching veteran with stops at BYU and Utah Valley, amassing a 187-108 career record. His squads won 20 or more games in six of the last seven seasons and he has made six postseason appearances.

"Mark Pope not only brings an impressive record in nine years as a head coach, but also a love of the University of Kentucky and a complete understanding of what our program means to the people of our state," UK AD Mitch Barnhart said at the time of Pope's hiring. "As a captain on the '96 championship team, Mark was a beloved and respected teammate. As a head coach, he is highly regarded nationally as an innovator. His teams run a unique and dynamic up-tempo offense and they get after it on defense. He is a strong recruiter with international ties and a person of integrity.

"He fully embraces our high expectations and standards and I know that as our fans get reacquainted with Mark, they will be eager to join him on what promises to be an

exciting ride."

Pope returns to UK from Provo, Utah, where he compiled a 110-52 record (.679) during five campaigns at the helm of BYU. He took the Cougars to three postseason appearances, including two trips to the NCAA Tournament, and missed another bid when the 2020 event was cancelled because of the Covid pandemic. Three of his five BYU teams finished the season ranked in the top 20 of the KenPom efficiency ratings.

"The University of Kentucky is the pinnacle of coaching in college basketball. It's the definition of blueblood program where hanging a banner is the expectation ever year," Pope said. "Equally as important, UK changed my life forever as a human being. The love and passion I have for this program, this University and the people of the Commonwealth goes to the depth of my soul.

"I'm thankful to Dr. (Eli) Capilouto and Mitch Barnhart for this opportunity. I'm proud to be your next head coach and I can't wait to do this together!"

Pope is coming off a 23-11 season in 2023-24. It was BYU's first season in the Big 12 Conference and the Cougars' 10-8 league record featured victories over No. 7 Kansas, No. 11 Baylor and No. 24 lowa State. BYU's first win in the Big 12, on January 13 at Central Florida, also marked Pope's 100th victory as head coach of the Cougars.

The Cougars ranked third in the country with 11.1 made 3-pointers per game in 2023-24, and also ranked in the top 10 in assists per game (3rd) and assist-to-turnover ratio (6th). BYU led the Big 12 in scoring at 81.4 points per game. They were ranked as high as No. 12 in the AP Poll after going 12-1 in nonconference action, winning the Vegas Showdown, BYU's first multi-team event title since 2011. Pope was named to the 2024 Naismith College Coach of the Year Late Season Watch List for his efforts.

Pope's teams also hit the postseason in 2020-21, finishing with a 20-7 mark and making BYU's first appearance in the NCAA Tournament since 2015. The Cougars were 24-11 in 2021-22 and advanced to the quarterfinals of the National Invitation Tournament. The Cougars captured win No. 60 under Pope in January of '22, making him the fastest BYU coach to achieve the mark

Pope began his head coaching stint at BYU in the 2019-20 season, tallying a 24-8 record, the most wins for a first-year coach in program history. He finished the season ranked No. 18 in the Associated Press poll and No. 16 in the USA Today/Coaches poll, becoming the first head coach at BYU to conclude the season with a national ranking in his first season. The Cougars finished second in the West Coast Conference with a 13-3 record. The Cougars also toppled No. 2-ranked Gonzaga, earning their best win over a ranked opponent inside their home venue in program history. The Covid pandemic prevented an almost-certain bid to the NCAA Tournament.

Pope's Cougars were statistically among the top offenses in the nation in '19-20. The Cougars finished the season ranked first in 3-point field goal percentage, second in assist-to-turnover ratio, third in field-goal percentage, fourth in 3-point field goals per game and fifth in assists per game.

Following his first season with the Cougars, Matt Norlander of CBS tabbed Pope as the best hire of the year. He was also awarded with the United States Basketball Writers Association District VIII Coach of the Year honor. He was a semifinalist for the Warner Ladder Naismith Coach of the Year

Pope's first head coaching stint was a four-year term at Utah Valley. Beginning in 2015-16, the Wolverines increased their win total during every season of Pope's tenure, culminating in a 25-10 overall mark and a runner-up finish in the Western Athletic Conference in 2018-19. Utah Valley was 30-2 at home from 2017-19, and the 25 wins in 2019 were a single-season school record.

He began his collegiate playing career at the University of Washington, where he was tabbed the 1992 Pac-10 Freshman of the Year. After his sophomore season, he transferred to Kentucky, where he appeared in every game of his two-year career with the Wildcats. UK won the 1995 and '96 regular-season Southeastern Conference championships, the '95 SEC Tournament title and the 1996 NCAA Tournament. He averaged 7.9 points and 5.7 rebounds per game in 69 career games. Pope was named to the All-SEC Tournament Team in 1995, behind a pair of double-doubles in three games, including one in the title game that went to overtime

Pope was selected in the second round of the 1996 NBA Draft by the Indiana Pacers. He played professional basketball from 1997-2005, including terms with Indiana, Milwaukee Bucks, New York Knicks and Denver Nuggets. In 2000-01, he started 45 games and helped the Bucks reach the Eastern Conference Finals.

Following his playing days, Pope enrolled in medical school at Columbia University and completed two years before returning to basketball. He joined Mark Fox's staff at Georgia in 2009. He then spent one season as an assistant coach for Jeff Bzdelik at Wake Forest and four seasons at BYU under Dave Rose. The Cougars posted four straight 20-win seasons and advanced to postseason play in each of those four years, including three bids to the NCAA Tournament. His success as an assistant at BYU was the springboard to become head coach at Utah Vallev.

Pope and his wife, Lee Anne, have four daughters, Ella, Avery, Layla and Shay. He is a 1996 graduate of Kentucky with a degree in English.


