### THE OPENING TIP (TEAM CHART ON THE LAST PAGE)

- The Purdue women's basketball team closes out a three-game homestand against No. 16 Kentucky at Mackey Arena on Saturday afternoon on the Big Ten Network.
- The Boilermakers will welcome home Kentucky associate head coach Lindsey Hicks on Saturday. Hicks played in 126 games for Purdue from 2001-04 and helped Purdue win three Big Ten titles and reach four NCAA Tournaments, including the 2001 NCAA National Championship Game.
- Destini Lombard has been a pest on the defensive end, recording 21 steals on the year for 2.33 per game. She ranks fifth and fourth in the Big Ten, respectively. Lombard has just under a third of Purdue's 65 steals.
- Lombard has led Purdue against ranked opposition (No. 6 Notre Dame, No. 4 South Carolina, No. 7 Maryland) with 17.3 points per game, while going 8-of-16 from behind the arc. She dropped a career-high 23 points against South Carolina.
- Lana McCarthy is one of five freshmen to record two double-doubles against Division I opposition this year and is one of two from the Big Ten alongside Kiyomi McMiller from Rutgers.
- McCarthy is one of six freshmen nationally with over 7.0 points and 6.0 rebounds per game, while shooting 50% or better.
- Reagan Bass averaged 18 points and 5.0 rebounds per game, while shooting 60% (15-25) from the field and 3-of-6 from behind the arc in games against Maine and No. 7 Maryland.
- While hitting 12 3-pointers on the year, second most on the team, Sophie Swanson has eclipsed her assist total from last season (11) with 21 helpers, good for third on the team.
- Rashunda Jones tallied 17 points off the bench against Maryland to lead the Boilermakers. The sophomore has reached double figures twice this season off the bench.
- Three Boilermakers have connected on 12 or more 3-pointers with Destini Lombard leading the way with 15, while Sophie Swanson and Ella Collier have hit 12 times. The trio are tied for second most on a team in the Big Ten behind Nebraska's four.
- The Boilermakers enter the weekend 25th in the nation in blocks per game with 5.1. Reagan Bass is 11th in the Big Ten with 12 rejections on the year.
- Associate head coach Kelly Komara received two honors this week. The former Purdue standout guard was named to the 2025 Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame Induction Class and earned a spot in the WBCA Next Generation Institute.
- The seven active newcomers have powered the Boilermakers' production this year with 76% of the points, 87% of rebounds, 63% of assists. All six of Purdue's double-doubles have been recorded by a player in their first year on the court at Purdue.
- Purdue will play nine games scheduled against teams in the preseason AP Top-25 rankings and is the only team in the nation that will face four teams in the top six of the preseason Top-25.

Purdue had four players in double figures, led by a season-high 17 points from Rashunda Jones off the bench. Jones was 7-of-11 from the field and added three assists and one block. Reagan Bass tallied 16 points with a pair of 3-pointers.

The Boilermakers went 7-of-17 from behind the arc. Destini Lombard hit three times from distance to finish with 15 points, while Ella Collier made a pair to finish with eight points.

**NUMBERS TO KNOW IN THE KG ERA**

- Purdue is 47-11 when leading after the first quarter and 53-8 when taking a lead into the fourth quarter.
- Purdue has made seven or more 3-pointers in 56 games.
- Purdue is 48-20 when shooting 40% or better overall, including 17-2 with a field goal clip above 50%.
- The Boilermakers are 41-9 when outrebounding opponents.
- The Boilermakers hold a 40-8 record when scoring 70 or more points, while also posting a 49-17 mark when holding opponents below that mark.

**MILESTONE WATCH**

- Ella Collier needs 181 points to reach 2,500 for her career.
- Reagan Bass is six starts shy of 100 for her career. She needs 79 points to reach 1,500.
- Mahri Petree is 227 points away from reaching the 1,000-point club.
- Lana McCarthy is three double-doubles shy of third most by a freshman in single-season history at Purdue.

**BOILER NOTES**

**DEFENSE FOR THE WIN**

- Purdue is 30-4 when keeping a team to 60 points since 2021-22.
- The Boilermakers are 2-1 this season when holding a team to 60 points.
- Purdue is holding opponents 62.8 points, 36% shooting from the field and 27% from distance in its wins this season.
- The Boilermakers are 3-0 on the year when forcing 15 or more turnovers.
- Purdue has three games with 10 or more steals and is scoring 15.4 points off 13.1 opponent turnovers per game.
- Purdue kept Northwestern to just 48 points, the lowest since 47 points against Drake in 2019-20, and the fewest by a Big Ten team since 42 against Ohio State in 2018-19.

**THE BIG FROM BEDFORD**

- Standing a solid 6-foot-4, Lana McCarthy is a presence in the post Purdue has not had in the last decade.
- She sits fourth on the team with 7.3 points per game behind a 50% field goal percentage.
- She is one of four Big Ten freshmen averaging over 7.0 points and 6.0 rebounds, while shooting 50% or better from the field.
- She is one of five freshmen nationally to have multiple double-doubles against Division I opposition this season.
- She earned her first Big Ten Freshman of the Week honor after averaging 15 points and 7.5 rebounds per game in wins over Bellarmine and UT Arlington.
- With 18 points and 10 rebounds against Purdue Fort Wayne in the season opener, she became the 15th freshman to start a season opener since 1982-83 and the second to record a double-double on her debut (Sue Fackler - 23 points, 21 rebounds, 1977-78).
- After her second double-double against Bellarmine, McCarthy matched Lindsay Wisdom-Hylton for more double-doubles by a freshman since 2004-05.
- McCarthy capped an impressive prep career as New Hampshire Miss Basketball following her second state title as a senior.
- She finished her Bedford High School basketball career with a 71-8 record. She also went 80-0 in volleyball with four state titles.

**DOWNTOWN DEZ**

- Destini Lombard introduced herself to the Purdue faithful with a career-high 20-point performance against Purdue Fort Wayne.
- She leads the team in scoring (14.1 PPG), assists (2.8 APG) and steals (2.3 SPG).
- Lombard was named to the All-Fort Myers Tip-Off Team after averaging 17.5 points while shooting 56% from the field with five 3-pointers over Thanksgiving, including a career-high 24 points against No. 4 South Carolina.
- She posted the seventh game by a Boilermaker with at least 20 points, five rebounds, five assists and four steals in a game since 2002-03.
- She recorded her first career double-double with a 13-point, 13-rebound outing against UT Arlington. She notched her second with a 12-point, 13-board performance against Maine.
- Lombard was one of six players to average over 15 points, five rebounds, four steals and three assists over the opening week of the season (Lombard - 16.5 PPG, 5.5 RPG, 4.0 SPG, 3.5 APG).
- Lombard joined Purdue after playing three seasons at Stephen F. Austin, earning WAC Defensive Player of the Year and WAC All-Defensive Team honors in 2023-24 with a league-high 2.6 steals per game.

**REAGAN RAISING THE BAR**

- Regan Bass has been an impact for Purdue on and off the court, helping the two freshmen posts adjust to the college game.
- Bass posted back-to-back 20-point outings against Bellarmine (21) and IU Indy (22). Her third came against Maine (20).
- She posted back-to-back double-doubles against Bellarmine and UT Arlington, the first by a Boilermaker since 2021-22.
- She has posted 23 double-doubles in her career.
- Bass is second on the team with 13.3 points per game while shooting 46.8% from the field. She is second on the team in rebounding with 6.5 boards per game. She has blocked a team-high 12 shots.
- The senior joined Purdue after three All-MAC seasons at Akron, quickly cementing herself as one of the team's leaders.
- Last season, she was one of 15 players in the nation to average over 16 points and 9.5 rebounds per game, narrowly missing out on a double-double average.
- She finished third in the MAC in scoring, first in rebounding, first in made free throws and eighth in blocks (22)
- One of the determining factors for Bass when picking her school was the notoriety of the College of Engineering.

**DOUBLE-DOUBLE TROUBLE**

- The Boilermakers have recorded six double-doubles this year.
- Lana McCarthy is the first freshman at Purdue to record multiple double-doubles since Lindsay Wisdom-Hylton in 2004-05. Cathey Tyree is third in Purdue freshman history with five double-doubles in 1983-84. Leslie Johnson owns the record with 12 during the 1993-94 campaign.
- Reagan Bass and McCarthy both notched a double-double against Bellarmine. It was the first time two Boilermakers recorded a double-double in the same game since the 2020 Big Ten Tournament against Michigan State with career record holder Ae'Rianna Harris and Fatou Diagne teamed up.
- Bass and Destini Lombard recorded a pair of double-doubles against UT Arlington. It marked the first time in over 25 years Purdue had two double-doubles in back-to-back games.

**FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK**

- Lana McCarthy was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Week for the first time after wins over Bellarmine and UT Arlington.
- The Bedford, N.H., native averaged 15 points and 7.5 rebounds per game, while shooting 61% from the field.
- McCarthy opened the week with a 12-point, 10-rebound double-double against Bellarmine, her second of the year.
- She then matched her career high in scoring with 18 points in the win over UT Arlington.
- The honor marked the second straight year Purdue had a freshman of the week honoree early in the season after Rashunda Jones garnered the award last year during the same week.

**INSTANT IMPACT**

- Purdue's seven newcomers, six active have made quick impacts for the Boilermakers, accounting for 76% of scoring, 87% of the rebounding and 63% of the assists.
- Destini Lombard leads the team in scoring, assists and steals. Reagan Bass tops the team charts in rebounding.
- All six double-doubles have been recorded by a newcomer.
- Freshman Jordyn Poole is close to returning after injury sidelined her at the start of the year.

**BOILER NOTES**

**SOPHOMORE SOPHIE SWANSON**

- "If you need a bucket, number 31 is going to get it for you." - Katie Gearlds at Big Ten Women's Basketball Media Day
- Swanson is third on the team with 7.8 points per game and is second with 12 3-pointers. She has 53 career 3-pointers and hit multiple triples in 12 career games.
- This season, she has hit three or more triples three times.
- In her first full season at Purdue after missing the start of last year, Sophie Swanson has stepped up to be one of the top players for the Boilermakers.
- She knocked down 41 3-pointers last year at a 39.4% clip to rank fourth among Big Ten freshman and eighth on Purdue's freshman record list.
- Her 22.6 points per 40 minutes led Big Ten rookies last year, finished eighth among all freshman and were the sixth most by a Big Ten rookie in the last 10 years.
- Swanson tore her ACL during her senior year of high school and nearly played a full collegiate season less than a year later.
- Swanson drained seven 3-pointers in the Big Ten Tournament against Nebraska, a program record by a freshman at Purdue and tying the tournament freshman record. She finished with a career-high 25 points.

**SPIDER JONES**

- Rashunda Jones worked this offseason on the transition back to her natural shooting guard, after serving as the backup point guard last year.
- Jones sits second on the team with 23 assists.
- Coming off the bench, Jones has reached double figures twice
- Jones averaged 7.4 points in 18.7 minutes per game to earn a spot on the All-Big Ten Freshman Team in 2023-24.
- Jones finished second to Swanson in scoring per 40 minutes by a Big Ten freshman with 16.8 points.
- She has hit 20 points three times this season, the first Boilermaker rookie to do it since Dominique Oden in 2016-17.
- Jones was Purdue's first Big Ten Freshman of the Week since 2017-18 after her 20-piece against Texas A&M last year.
- Her versatility earned her the nickname "Spider" from her high school head coach and Amiyah & Mila's father - Steven.

**NON-CONFERENCE DOMINANCE**

- Purdue has an 30-10 non-conference mark under Gearlds, including a 24-2 mark at Mackey Arena.
- The Boilermakers posted a 7-4 mark in the non-conference last year, which included losses to No. 4 UCLA and No. 14 Notre Dame.
- In Gearlds' second season, the Boilermakers went 9-1 for the third-best clip in team history and the best since 2003-04.
- Purdue went 9-2 in regular season non-conference action during Gearlds' first campaign, which tied for the second best mark by a first-year head coach at Purdue.
- With a win over Duquesne in the WNIT last season, the Boilermakers set a new program record with 19 straight home non-conference wins, including postseason.

**UNDER OUR (UMBR)ELLA**

- Ella Collier has provided veteran guidance to Purdue's young stable of guards this season, specifically mentoring Sophie Swanson.
- Collier is second on the team with 12 3-pointers.
- Collier was a two-time NAIA National Player of the Year, four-time All-American at Marian University.
- Gearlds recruited and coached Collier at Marian during 2020-21, the start of a career that rewrote the Knights' record book.
- Collier is a career 54% shooter from the field, 46% from distance and 94% at the line. She can flat out shoot.
- She set the Marian career record for points (2,260) scoring average, field goals, 3-pointers, 3-point percentage, free throws, free throw percentage and games started.
- She reached four NAIA National Tournaments and was crowned the Crossroads League Player of the Year twice and earned four First Team All-Crossroads League honors.

**THE BLACK BELT BALLER**

- Kendall Puryear has a self-declared "mean streak" when it comes to basketball. Her physicality is impressive for a freshman.
- Puryear's intensity on the court has turned the tide in several games this season.
- Her first major impact came against Bellarmine with a momentum-swinging and-one to end a 25-0 run by the Knights and kick start the Boilermakers' comeback.
- Puryear was a finalist for Miss Show-Me Basketball following a 1,249 points and a school record 897 rebounds, including 317 on the offensive end, for her career.
- Puryear also finished second at the Missouri high school state track meet in the shot put.
- Her older brother was a four-year starter at Mizzou under Purdue alumnus Cuonzo Martin.
- Puryear is also a Black Belt in Taekwondo.

**AMIYAH RETURNS**

- "I've been dreaming about her being our starting point guard since the first time I watched her play in high school" - Katie Gearlds
- Amiyah Reynolds made her Purdue debut against Purdue Fort Wayne and made her first career start versus Maine.
- Reynolds is the younger of the two Reynolds sisters on the team (Mila), Amiyah missed all of last season due to surgery from a for a Linsfranc injury.
- Reynolds spent all of last year studying under Gearlds to prepare to run the offense this season. Once cleared for contact in late January, she led the scout team in practice.
- The competitive layoff between her final high school game and the season opener of the 2023-24 season against Purdue Fort Wayne is 648 days.
- Reynolds as a top-50 recruit in the class of 2023, the second highest signee in the Big Ten.
- She won a state championship alongside her sister Mila and teammate Rashunda Jones.
- She finished third for Indiana Miss Basketball and joined Skylar Diggins-Smith as the only Panthers to total 1,000 points and 500 assists in a career.

**OUR JORDYN POOLE, NOT THE OTHER ONE**

- A speedy shooter, Purdue kept one of the state's top talents home when it signed Jordyn Poole.
- She missed the start of the year with a lower leg injury but was cleared to play in December.
- She was tabbed the a two-time Indiana All-Star, the Indiana Miss Basketball runner-up, the No. 54 player in the nation by ESPN and the No. 1 player in the state by Prep Girls Hoops.
- She earned an invite to the Chris Paul Elite Guard Camp.
- Poole won three sectional titles and one regional championship at Fort Wayne Snider, capping her career with 1,368 points, 364 assists and 221 steals.
- Poole comes from a Purdue family. Her great uncle Roosevelt Barnes played basketball and football for the Boilermakers before a career with the Detroit Lions.
- Her cousin was the late-Caleb Swanigan, the 2017 Big Ten Men's Basketball Player of the Year, the Lute Olson Award and Pete Newell Big Man Award winner and a consensus First Team All-American.

**LETTING IT FLY**

- Shoot before you turn it over - the goal for Purdue's offense.
- The Boilermakers have made seven or more triples 56 times since 2021-22.
- Purdue has made 10 or more 3-pointers in 15 games in the Katie Gearlds era. Prior to her return, the Boilermakers tallied just 22 double-digit triple games in the preceding 12 seasons.
- The Boilermakers have not been shy about shooting the three during Katie Gearlds' time on the sideline, setting the Purdue season record for 3-pointers made and attempted in 2021-22.
- Purdue has made 200 or more 3-pointers in each of Gearlds' first three seasons.

**SEASON 50 FOR PURDUE WOMEN'S BASKETBALL**



2024-25 marks the 50th season of Purdue Women's Basketball after its winning its first game 78-74 over Illinois in overtime on Dec. 2, 1975.

Purdue's on-court success has netted 27 NCAA Tournament appearances, three Final Fours and the only national championship in Big Ten women's basketball history.

Two Boilermakers have been named the National Player of the Year (MaChelle Joseph - 1992, Stephanie White - 1999), seven have been consensus All-Americans and eight have earned Big Ten Player of the Year.

In addition to the elite pedigree on the floor, Boilermakers have graduated to become head coaches, surgeons, lawyers, general managers, engineers and other world-changing careers.

- Purdue's 2024-25 schedule has nine teams that were ranked in the preseason AP Top-25, plus three more receiving votes.
- Purdue is the only team in the country to face four teams in the top six of the preseason AP Top-25 - No. 1 South Carolina, No. 3 USC, No. 5 UCLA and No. 6 Notre Dame.
- The Boilermakers' schedule was tabbed the 21st hardest in the country before the season by Massey Ratings.
- Looking ahead with the possibility of playing at least a third of the schedule against a ranked opponent, the last time Purdue faced 10 ranked opponents in a season was back in 2006-07, when Katie Gearlds was a senior.

- Associate head coach Kelly Komara was named to the 2025 Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame Induction Class.
- Komara was an Indiana Miss Basketball from Lake Central who was a consensus All-American as a senior.
- During her career at Purdue (1999-02), Komara helped Purdue win the 1999 National Championship and three Big Ten titles.
- Her graduating class in 2002 went 112-22 (83.6%) for the best winning percentage in Purdue history.
- Komara was tabbed to join the 2025 WBCA Next Generation Institute for assistants aspiring to become head coaches.
- Melina Griffin (1993-96) was also named to the IBHOF 2025 Class after playing at Purdue and a record-setting career at Anderson.
- After an Indiana All-Star prep career, Griffin helped the Boilermakers reach the 1994 Final Four and qualify for the NCAA Tournament three times.

**THE NEXT GENERATION**

- Katie Gearlds welcomed a trio of four-star recruits to the Boilermaker family on national Signing Day in Avery Gordon from Brownsburg, Ind., Kira Reynolds from South Bend, Ind., and Keona Douwstra from The Netherlands.
- Gordon is a 6-6 forward ranked as the No. 1 post in the nation and No. 56 player by Prospects Nation, while sitting No. 56 by ESPN.
- Gordon was an Indiana Junior All-Star and posted the highest scoring efficiency on the 3SSB Circuit last summer.
- Kira Reynolds (yes, there's another one) is a 6-4 forward and the younger sister of Mila and Amiyah. The younger-younger Reynolds was an Indiana Junior All-Star and was ranked as high as No. 15 in the nation by ESPN.
- Keona Douwstra is a 5-9 guard from The Netherlands. A three-time national champion, Douwstra has represented her native country on the international level at the U16, U18 and U20 European Championships over the last few years.

**DISHING OUT DIMES**

- The Boilermakers were 19-1 under Katie Gearlds when dishing out 20 or more assists.
- The single-game mark under Gearlds for assists is 26 against North Alabama during the 2021-22 season.

**EURO TOUR**

- For the first time during the Katie Gearlds Era, the Boilermakers went on an international tour with a 10-day trip to Spain and Portugal in early August.
- The Boilermakers visited Barcelona, Spain, as well as Lisbon and Porto in Portugal.
- Purdue played a trio of exhibition games against professional competition, going 3-0 and averaging over 90 points per contest.
- Purdue dominated on the glass with +76 margin on the glass with 19.3 second chance points per game and outscored opponents 144-60 in the paint during the trip to Europe.
- The Boilermakers scored 75 points off turnovers, while surrendering 24 points off miscues.
- Posts Lana McCarthy (13 PPG, 9.3 RPG, 72% FG) and Alaina Harper (13 PPG, 6.0 RPG, 70% FG) powered Purdue over all three games.
- Seven of Purdue's 12 available players finished in double figures at least once.
- Unique to Purdue's trip, the itinerary allowed for more free time for the players to explore the cities, creating a more natural opportunity for bonding.

- Current radio analyst Jane Schott (née Calhoun) holds the only honor of starting the season opener as a freshman twice, as she played against Eastern Illinois in 1987-88 as a true freshman and the 1988-89 game against BYU as a redshirt freshman.

**BOILER NOTES**

**THIS IS PURDUE WOMEN'S BASKETBALL**

- Purdue Women's Basketball is in its 50th season in 2023-24.
- Purdue was the 40th program in NCAA Division I history to hit 900 wins.
- The Boilermakers are the only team from the Big Ten to win a national championship, hoisting the title in 1999.
- The program has reached the NCAA Tournament 27 times with 12 Sweet 16s, eight Elite 8s, three final fours and a trio of national championship game appearances.
- In addition to its NCAA success, Purdue owns the Big Ten record for most tournament titles with nine.

**WHAT WE ADDED**

- Despite the departure of dependable firepower, Purdue added four talented transfers from the portal in Ella Collier (Marian, NAIA), Destini Lombard (Stephen F. Austin), Reagan Bass (Akron) and Mahri Petree (UTEP).
- All in their final year of eligibility, the four arrived to Mackey Arena with 289 combined career starts.
- Collier was a two-time NAIA National Player of the Year and a 2,000-point scorer from Marian
- Lombard won the WAC Defensive Player award during her final season at Stephen F. Austin.
- Bass was a three-time All-MAC honoree and one of 10 players in the nation to make 135 free throws each of the last two seasons.
- Petree, the younger sister of Lasha who led Purdue to the NCAA Tournament in 2022-23, joins Purdue as the lone sixth-year player after time at UTEP and Bradley.

**HALL OF FAMER**

- In October, Katie Gearlds became the 13th member of the Purdue women's basketball team to be enshrined in the Leroy Keyes Purdue Athletics Hall of Fame.
- The fourth highest scorer in program history, Gearlds guided Purdue to two Big Ten Tournament titles, four NCAA Tournament appearances, two Sweet 16s and an Elite Eight.
- Gearlds was a four-time All-Big Ten honoree and was tabbed Third Team All-America as a senior.
- She was selected seventh overall in the 2007 WNBA Draft by the Seattle Storm, the highest pick in Purdue history.
- Gearlds was enshrined alongside Devynne Charlton (Track), Annie Drews (Volleyball) Chukwuebuka Enekwechi (Track & Field), Bob Ford (Men's Basketball), Laura Gonzalez-Escalon (Women's Golf), Kevin Plawewcki (Baseball) and Tim Stratton (Football).

**THE VOICE OF THE BOILERMAKERS**

- In his 35th season calling Purdue women's basketball, play-by-play man Tim Newton has called over 1,000 games with Purdue women's basketball.
  - He joined the 1,000-game club against Indiana State on Dec. 20, 2023.
  - Newton has provided the call for all seven Big Ten regular season titles, all nine Big Ten Tournament Championships, three Final Fours and 25 of 27 NCAA Tournament appearances.
  - Perhaps Newton's best call came in the final seconds of the 1999 National Championship as Purdue became the only Big Ten team to capture the national title.
- "Ladies and gentlemen, the national champion team resides in West Lafayette, Indiana, as Katie Douglas throws the ball skyward. It's over. Purdue wins 62-45, capturing the national championship."
- His first game was on WBAA (920 AM) on Jan. 3, 1991 when No. 3 Purdue downed Ohio State at Mackey Arena 105-45.

**YEAR 4 OF THE KG ERA**

- Head coach Katie Gearlds is in her fourth season back at her alma mater after guiding the Boilermakers to the postseason in each of her first three seasons back home.
- During the offseason, Gearlds inked an extension that will keep her on the sidelines in West Lafayette through the 2028-29 season.
- Prior to her arrival, the Boilermakers had endured a three-year postseason drought. After reaching the WNIT in her first campaign, the Boilermakers went back to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2017 with their 2023 bid.
- Gearlds guided Purdue to the WNIT Great 8 in 2024, the program's deepest run in the postseason in 15 years.
- Gearlds took over the program 47 days before her first campaign in 2021-22 when Purdue was coming off a seven-win season and guided Purdue to a 17-15 mark.
- She became the fourth Purdue head coach to reach the postseason in each of her first three seasons, joining Lin Dunn, Kristy Curry and Sharon Versyp.
- Gearlds joined Boilermaker legends Carolyn Peck and Lin Dunn as the only Purdue head coaches to post win improvements in each of their first two seasons.
- Gearlds has racked up three ranked wins, including the program's first true road AP top-5 victory against No. 2 Ohio State in 2022-23.

**THE BIG TEN'S ONLY NATIONAL CHAMPIONS**

- Led by National Coach of the Year Carolyn Peck, the Boilermakers finished the year with a program-best 34-1 record, a perfect 16-0 mark in Big Ten play, a Big Ten Tournament title and a 62-45 win in the National Championship Game over Duke.
- The 1998-99 season opened when Purdue knocked off three-time defending national champion and No. 1-ranked Tennessee at Mackey Arena 78-68.
- Stephanie White was named an All-American, the Honda Award winner and the Wade Trophy honoree, as well as the Big Ten Player and Athlete of the Year. Ukari Figgs earned an honorable mention All-America nod and was named the 1999 Most Outstanding Player of the NCAA Tournament.
- The victory was bittersweet as guard Tiffany Young tragically died when she was killed by a drunk driver just over four months after winning the national championship. The 1998-99 team have continued to bring back their memories and love for Young over the last 25 years to ensure her impact on their lives will never be forgotten.

**PACKING MACKEY**

- Head coach Katie Gearlds continues to bring the magic back to Mackey Arena, as more fans come through the turnstiles.
- Purdue has topped 5,000 fans in nine home games last season and ranked 17th nationally.
- Purdue has sold out Mackey Arena four times in program history and twice under head coach Katie Gearlds.
- Following renovations of Mackey Arena, the new attendance number grew to 14,876.
- Purdue set a new attendance record in 2022-23 with a capacity crowd when it hosted Indiana for its first sellout since 2000.

**MACKEY IS ONE OF A KIND**

- Mackey is one of the best basketball arenas in the nation.
- The Boilermakers set a program record with 19 straight non-conference home wins under Gearlds that ended late last year.
- The Gold and Black Sound (G.A.B.S.) is overwhelmingly the best pep band in the Big Ten with constant, never-ending energy.
- In the final minute of halftime, Purdue plays "Sandstorm" by Darude. Fans join G.A.B.S. in a special dance. If you want to partake the steps are - two right punches across your body high, two high with your left, two right punches across your body low, two low with your left, repeat with one punch, clap, shimmy, "Woo!".
- New this season and prior to every home game, Purdue displays a video call "ALL-IN". The video features several Boilermaker legends detailing the heights of the program.

- Throughout the summer, the team competed in an intrasquad competition - The Boilermaker Challenge.
- The players were split into teams of three or four connecting newcomers and returners for the summerlong series that focused on teamwork.
- It was a mixed bag of competition that featured a campus scavenger hunt, on-campus bowling, axe throwing, Pictionary and teammate trivia.
- The winning team walked away with the best award of all - bragging rights for the whole season.

**INSPIRED BY GREATNESS**

- Katie Gearlds has a deep bench of basketball legends who have touched and continue to influence her career.
- One of the few people who can say they've worked with two G.O.A.T.s, Gearlds was the MVP of the 2003 McDonald's All-America Game with LeBron James.
- Sue Bird, her teammate with the Storm and a mentor over the last 15 years, inspired Gearlds to go into coaching.
- She also shared the court in Seattle with Swin Cash (V.P. New Orleans Pelicans), Adia Barnes (Arizona head coach) and Lauren Jackson (owner Melbourne Boomers).
- She competed against Chris Paul in the skills challenge ahead of the 2003 McDonald's All-America Game.

- Purdue's coaching staff features a trio of alumnae who left their marks on the program during their playing days.
- Head coach Katie Gearlds was one of the best pure scorers in Purdue history, reaching four NCAA Tournaments, three Sweet 16s and an Elite Eight. She continues to rank in the top-10 of numerous career stat categories and was named an All-American in 2007 as a senior.
- 1999 National Champion and new associate head coach Kelly Komara returned to West Lafayette for her second stint on the sidelines. Komara was the 2002 Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year and helped the Boilermakers reach two national title games, winning the lone championship in Big Ten women's basketball.
- Alex Guyton is in her fifth season on staff and third as an assistant coach. Guyton reached three NCAA Tournaments and one Big Ten championship her four-year career for the Boilermakers
- Another new addition to the coaching ranks at Purdue is dynamic recruiting assistant coach Mark Stephens. After spending the last five seasons on staff at Toledo and Xavier, Stephens returns to the state to lead the Boilermakers' posts and recruiting operations. Stephens' in-state ties run deep after serving as a coach at several high schools and AAU programs.
- While they didn't play for Purdue, director of video and recruiting Lakan Hasser-Smith and graduate assistant Abby Downard are in-state products with deep ties to Katie Gearlds. After playing their entire careers for her at Marian.
- Director of operations Amie Anthrop is well-accustomed to the bright lights of Purdue. After an award-winning career as a guard at Southern Indiana, she married Jade Anthrop, brother to Dru (basketball), Danny (football) and Jackson (football).

**THE MENTALIST**

- Head coach Katie Gearlds connected with mindset performance coach Derick Grant to help develop the program's mental approach to the game.
- Grant, a world-renowned performance specialist, met with the team several times through the summer to help the players focus on embracing the process to become great.
- The Boilermakers also did a group-read through "Chop Wood, Carry Water: How to Fall in Love with the Process of Becoming Great" by Joshua Medcalf.

**RECOVERY INVESTMENT**

- Purdue partnered with Hyperice this offseason to provide its student-athletes with additional recovery products to use away from Mackey Arena.
- Prior to the team's departure for Europe, every Boilermaker on the team this year received a Normatec dynamic air compression boots, Hypervolt percussion massage gun, and Hypersphere vibrating massage tool for personal use.
- The investment will allow Boilermakers have access to cutting-edge technology from an on-demand basis to meet the needs of their schedules.

## GEARLDS BIO

Purdue Athletics Hall of Fame inductee Katie Gearlds enters her fourth season as the head coach of the Purdue women's basketball team. Returning to her alma mater, the 2007 All-American was elevated to the head job on Sept. 17, 2021, becoming the ninth coach in program history.

Three seasons back home at Purdue, Gearlds has begun the process to return Purdue Women's Basketball back to the national stage with three straight postseason appearances. She inked a contract extension in the summer of 2024 that will keep her home in West Lafayette through the 2028-29 season. Establishing a new culture, revamping recruiting and reconnecting with the alumnae and fan bases, Gearlds has the Boilermakers headed in the right direction.

Gearlds was inducted into the Leroy Keyes Purdue Athletics Hall of Fame in the fall of 2024.

## PURDUE POSTSEASON BOUND

The Boilermakers have reached the postseason in each of Katie Gearlds' first three seasons back in West Lafayette. Purdue returned to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2017 and the 27th time in program history during the 2022-23 campaign. Gearlds took the Boilermakers back to the postseason for the first time since 2018 in her first year, reaching the second round of the WNIT. The Boilermakers added their second WNIT appearance under Gearlds in 2023-24, as Purdue reached the Great 8 for its deepest postseason run in more than a decade.

## ON THE RECRUITING TRAIL

Gearlds' first true signing class in November of 2022 was ranked No. 21 by ESPNW. The class of five added to its firepower when top-50 signee Amiyah Reynolds signed for Purdue in May of 2023, alongside her sister and former top-60 recruit Mila, a transfer from Maryland.

## PRIOR TO PURDUE

Gearlds spent eight seasons taking Marian University to unparalleled success as its head coach, winning back-to-back NAIA National Championships in 2016 and 2017. She is the winningest coach in Marian history with a 228-50 record, an 82% clip.

A three-time NAIA National Coach of the Year, Gearlds guided the Knights to six straight Crossroads League regular-season titles, four league tournament championships and seven appearances in the NAIA Tournament.

With only five All-Americans in program history before her arrival, Gearlds mentored 12 All-America honorees, including 2021 WBCA NAIA National Player of the Year Imani Guy, as well as 28 All-Crossroads League selections.

Her teams averaged more than 70 points per game in all eight campaigns at Marian and over 75 points in four seasons. Defensively, the Knights kept opponents to 60 points per game or less in six of her eight years.

## PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE

Prior to her jump into coaching, Gearlds spent three seasons in the WNBA with the Seattle Storm. She was taken with the seventh overall pick in the 2007 WNBA Draft, the highest selection ever from Purdue and the 10th top-10 pick in Big Ten history.

Over three campaigns with the Storm, Gearlds shot just under 40% from the field and 37.9% from distance. She also spent time playing professionally in Spain, Greece, Portugal and Slovakia. Two of her closest teammates and friends over the years are WNBA legend Sue Bird and fellow WNBA great and New Orleans Pelicans Vice President of Basketball Operations Swin Cash.

## ALL-AMERICA AND HALL OF FAME COLLEGE CAREER

One of the most prolific players at Purdue, Gearlds was a three-year starter for the Boilermakers during her career from 2004-07, appearing in 133 games with 100 starts. She ranks fourth in program history with 1,974 points and was the ninth fastest to join the 1,000-point club, reaching the plateau in just 80 games. For her efforts, Gearlds was named a Legend of Mackey Arena during its 50th anniversary season. She was inducted into the Purdue Athletics Hall of Fame in 2024.

The Boilermakers won two Big Ten Tournament titles and never missed the NCAA Tournament with Gearlds in the squad, reaching three Sweet 16s and one Elite Eight. Her senior class ranks seventh with 103 wins, eighth in winning percentage at 77.4% and seventh in Big Ten winning percentage at 78.1%.

Gearlds' senior season awards haul featured Third Team All-America by the Associated Press, All-America Honorable Mention by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association and a spot NCAA Regional All-Tournament Team. She was a four-time All-Big Ten selection, a three-time All-Big Ten Tournament Team honoree and was the 2004 Big Ten Freshman of the Year.

Gearlds earned a bachelor's degree in sociology with minors in psychology and communications from Purdue in 2007.

## AN IN-STATE TALENT

A native of Beech Grove, Indiana, Gearlds was named the Indiana Miss Basketball in 2003. She amassed 2,521 career points, good for sixth in IHSAA history. She averaged 30.1 points, 9.4 rebounds, 5.4 assists and 5.1 steals per game to lead Beach Grove High School to the 2003 Class 3A State Championship. Her high school accolades included Nike/WBCA All-America, First Team All-State and the Gatorade Indiana Player of the Year. A McDonald's All-American, Gearlds was named the MVP of the McDonald's All-America Game the same season as a young talent from Akron, Ohio - LeBron James.
