FIRST SERVES

- The Wildcats are moved to 13-0 in season openers under Head Coach Cedric Kauffman after a 7-0 win against NKU on Wednesday.
- Kentucky completed its opening day doubleheader sweep with a 7-0 win over Xavier. The Cats won every set and every match across the doubleheader.
- Two Wildcats enter the spring season ranked in singles--No. 39 Jaden Weekes and No. 79 Charlelie Cosnet.
- Kentucky was picked fifth in the SEC Preseason Coaches Poll. The Wildcats completed the SEC Double last season, going undefeated in conference play to win the Regular Season and also winning the Tournament.

- Charlelie Cosnet was the 2024 SEC Tournament MVP after winning all three of his singles matches.
- Cosnet and Weekes earned All-SEC honors in 2024.
- Jack Loutit and Eli Stephenson were named to the SEC All-Freshman Team in 2024.
- Kentucky is currently slated to play nine teams inside the ITA Preseason Coaches Poll Top 25.
- The Wildcats added three players in 2025: ITA No. 1 Newcomer Antoine Ghibaud, Baylor transfer Martin Breysach, and Canadian Junior National Runner-Up Eric Crivei.
- Next weekend, the Wildcats will serve as hosts for ITA Kickoff Weekend for the third straight season.

SCOUTING THE SPARTANS

Friday's match will be the season opener for No. 23 Michigan State, who is coming off a historic 2024 season in which they earned their first-ever national ranking, advanced to their second NCAA tournament, and set a program record with 23 wins. The Spartans are led by Ozan Baris, who is currently ranked No. 8 in the ITA Singles Rankings. Baris advanced to the NCAA Singles Championship match this fall and was the preseason No. 1 singles player in the country after advancing to the NCAA Singles semifinals last spring. Other ranked Spartans include No. 27 Aristotelis Thanos No. 40 Matthew Forbes--the highest ranked true freshman in the nation--and No. 83 Max Sheldon. Danial Rakhmatullayev and Taym Alazmeh lead the Spartans in the doubles rankings at No. 66, with Baris/Thanos at No. 94, Forbes/Baris at No. 99, and Sheldon and Forbes at No. 107.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

Since the 2021 season, the Wildcats have amassed an impressive record of **59-5 (.922)** in matches played at the Hilary J. Boone Tennis Complex. In addition to defending home court in the regular season, the Wildcats have earned the right to host the NCAA Tournament in each of the past four seasons, including Super Regionals in each of the last three. The Wildcats have also hosted three consecutive ITA Kickoff Weekends at the Boone.

DUAL WARRIOR

Eli Stephenson began his season in dominating form, winning a pair of singles matches against NKU and Xavier. Not only did the Louisville native win both matches in straight sets, he only dropped one game throughout the entire doubleheader, winning his first match 6-0, 6-1 and his second match 6-0, 6-0. Stephenson is on the heels of a stellar freshman campaign where he went 17-1 in the dual season to earn All-SEC Freshman honors and be named the ITA Ohio Valley Region Rookie of the Year.

THE PERFECT START

The Wildcats kicked off the 2025 season on January 15, defeating NKU and Xavier in a doubleheader at the Boone Tennis Complex in Lexington. Kentucky swept both teams via perfect 7-0 scorelines, with no Wildcat player or team dropping a set on the entire day. Charlie Cosnet, Matt Rankin, and Martin Breysach all recorded four wins on the day, taking two victories in singles and two in doubles.

2025 ITA KICKOFF WEEKEND

The Wildcats will close out January by hosting the ITA Kickoff Weekend for the third consecutive season. The Cats will welcome No. 18 Arizona State, Nebraska, and Santa Clara to the Boone for two days of matches and a trip to the 2025 ITA Indoor Nationals on the line.

OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

Junior **Charlie Cosnet** and sophomore **Eli Stephenson** have been named team captains for the 2024-25 season, displaying their constant commitment to the standards of the Kentucky Men's Tennis program.

DOWN UNDER DEBUT

Kentucky Men's Tennis alum **Gabriel Diallo** made his Australian Open debut this week, defeating Luca Nardi of Italy in the First Round, 6-7 (1), 7-6 (3), 5-7, 6-1, 6-2. The victory was the first five set win of his career. After qualifying into Roland Garros and the US Open last season, Diallo has earned his first career direct acceptance into a Grand Slam this week. He currently holds an ATP ranking of No. 86, a career high.

NCAA SINGLES

Sophomore **Jack Loutit** earned his first bid to the NCAA Singles Championships this fall, marking the fifth straight edition of the tournament in which a Wildcat has appeared. New to 2024, the Singles and Doubles Championships were moved to the fall season to split up the collegiate tennis calendar. Loutit qualified via a top six finish at the inaugural ITA South Sectional in Tallahassee, Florida in November.

KIWI CALLUP

Jack Loutit earned his first career call-up to the New Zealand Davis Cup team in September, as his nation battled Luxembourg in the World Group II playoffs. Playing against former Virginia All-American Chris Rodesch, Loutit won his first Davis Cup match in his debut, winning 7-5, 6-4.

ALL-AMERICAN WEEK

Jaden Weekes has quite the week at the ITA All-American Championships in September, winning six matches in five days to advance from the pre-qualifying draw to the main draw round of 32. Picking up two ranked wins in the process, Weekes eventually brought his fall record to 9-0 before taking his first and only loss of the fall.

BIG BLUE DEBUT

Junior **Martin Breysach**, a transfer from Baylor, began his time in blue in a big way, winning all four matches at his first fall tournament. Playing at the Louisville Invite in September, Breysach defeated opponents from Notre Dame, Louisville, and Illinois to take the championship in the top flight of singles.

IT JUST MEANS MORE

With the addition of Texas and Oklahoma to the SEC, the depth of Men's Tennis in the league has grown exponentially. Texas is the preseason No. 1 team in the country and leads nine SEC schools in the preseason top 25. Kentucky was the second-highest ranked school in the league in that poll.

NUMERO UN

Freshman **Antoine Ghibaud** was ranked the No. 1 newcomer to college tennis by the ITA in August. Ghibaud, a 19-year-old from Paris, France, comes to Kentucky with a career-high ATP ranking of No. 667, making him the highest-ranked incoming freshman on the tour's ranking. He also boasts a career-high ITF junior ranking of No. 14 and an impressive World Tennis Number (WTN) of 3.5. Ghibaud has played in the Junior Championships at the Australian Open, Roland Garros, and Wimbledon. The Frenchman has also represented his country at the Junior Davis Cup Finals.

DOUBLE TROUBLE ON THE WAY

The top two junior players in Canada are headed to Lexington next season, and they happen to be twins. **Nicolas and Mikael Arseneault** signed agreements to play their collegiate tennis at Kentucky on National Signing Day in November and bring a number of accolades to the Bluegrass. Both twins have won the Canadian Junior National Championship and have represented Canada in the Junior Davis Cup Finals. They bring a combined 10 ITF junior titles as well as experience in ATP Tour Masters and Challenger events.

ON THE COME UP

Former Wildcat - enjoyed a breakout year on the ATP tour, highlighted by an autumn that included his first two Grand Slam wins and a maiden ATP tour final. Diallo qualified for the US Open and picked up his first--and second --wins at a major on his way to the Round of 32. His run was highlighted by a win over [24] Arthur Fils. One month later, Diallo advanced to the final of the ATP 250 Almaty Open--his first on the tour level--while defeating [2] Alejandro Tabilo and [4] Francisco Cerundolo in the process.

OH CANADA

Former Wildcat teammates and All-Americans **Gab Diallo and Liam Draxl** will team up once again this February, as they were both selected as members of the Canadian Davis Cup Team. Canada will play Hungary in a qualifier for the Davis Cup Finals from February 1-2 in Montreal.

HEAD COACH CEDRIC KAUFFMAN



Cedric Kauffmann completed his 12th season as men's tennis head coach at the University of Kentucky in 2023-24. As head coach, Kauffmann has led his alma mater to 10 of 12 potential NCAA Tournament berths, including the program's first ever NCAA Championship match in 2021-22. The Wildcats have finished in the top 30 of the season's final Intercollegiate Tennis Association rankings nine times, including a No. 5 finish in both 2023, 2024. He was named the SEC Coach of the Year for the 2024 season.

Kauffmann, the 2016, 2023 and 2024 ITA Ohio Valley Regional Coach of the Year, has produced 15 ITA All-America selections as UK head coach and 24 overall as a member of the UK coaching staff.

In what many believed would be a rebuilding year, Kauffmann and the Cats continued their excellence in 2023-24. The head coach led his team to a 27-3 overall record, its third-straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament quarterfinals, an undefeated SEC regular season title and the program's second-straight SEC Tournament championship. The three losses were the fewest for the Wildcats since 1970. It marked just the second time in program history that the team won both the SEC regular season and tournament titles, the other coming in 1992. Kauffmann coached Joshua Lapadat and JJ Mercer to ITA All-America recognition in doubles, while a remarkable seven Wildcats were named All-SEC, with three landing on the first team.

Under Kauffmann, Kentucky continued its momentum during the 2022-23 season. Most notably, the Wildcats won the SEC Tournament for just the second time in program history, coming from behind to defeat top-seeded Georgia in the Championship match. The team reached the NCAA quarterfinals as the No. 4 overall seed, finished with an overall record of 27-5 and played its way to the semifinals at ITA Indoor Nationals. Two Cats were named ITA All-Americans (Liam Draxl + Alafia Ayeni), while four were honored with All-SEC accolades, including three on the first team.

The 2021-22 season was the best ever for the Wildcats, as the program reached the NCAA Championship match for the first time. Kauffmann's Cats finished with an overall record of 26-8, earned the No. 8 seed in the NCAA Tournament and defeated DePaul, Northwestern, Wake Forest, No. 1 TCU and Ohio State on their way to the NCAA final.

Two Wildcats (Gabriel Diallo and Liam Draxl) were named ITA All-Americans and finished the season in the top-10 of the ITA singles rankings, marking the first time in UK history such had occurred.

A breakthrough 2020-21 campaign for the Wildcats was highlighted by a wire-to-wire finish in the top 25 of the ITA rankings, as well as by a slew of individual accomplishments. Kentucky hosted the first two rounds of the NCAA Championship and finished with a 16-1 record at Hilary J. Boone Tennis Complex.

Sophomore Liam Draxl earned the first ITA National Player of the Year honor in school history after five consecutive appearances atop the ITA singles rankings and a postseason singles run that ended in the NCAA Championship semifinals.

Kentucky was one of seven schools to put three participants in the 64-player singles field at the NCAA Championships, where two Wildcats reached the round of 16 in the same season for only the second time ever.

Draxl earned ITA All-America status in singles competition, while fellow sophomore Gabriel Diallo became the seventh player in UK history to earn ITA All-America distinction for both singles and doubles in the same year.

Including Diallo's doubles partner César Bourgois, Kentucky produced the program's 22nd, 23rd and 24th all-time ITA All-Americans this year. Draxl and Diallo were selected to the All-Southeastern Conference first team, while senior Millen Hurrien was chosen for the second team. Draxl was also named the SEC Newcomer of the Year.

Kentucky ended the season as one of four schools with five players placed among the final ITA singles rankings and the only SEC institution with multiple players on the SEC All-Newcomer Team.

Kentucky was awarded the UTR ITA Team of the Month in April for producing the largest increase in Universal Tennis Rating Power 6 Rating over the course of the month.

When the 2019-20 season was cut short due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Kentucky had a 12-5 (3-1 SEC) record. The Wildcats were in the midst of a three-match winning streak, beginning with two wins over ranked opponents and ending with two victories on the road. Kentucky's best win came in a 4-3 thriller at No. 17 Alabama on March 6.

In 2018-19, Kentucky earned a 4-1 first-round NCAA Tournament win over VCU, whose head coach Anthony Rossi spent three years on Kauffmann's coaching staff and was a two-time ITA All-American while playing for Kauffmann at UK. Senior Ryo Matsumura earned a fourth consecutive All-SEC honor, while fellow senior Enzo Wallart earned his first.

In 2017-18, Kentucky's season was highlighted by a 4-1 signature win at three-time reigning national champion Virginia on Feb. 4 and a 4-3 victory over No. 7 Illinois on Feb. 25. UK

reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament and placed three players on All-SEC teams, with Matsumura and Will Bushamuka receiving first-team honors and Trey Yates making the second team. Matsumura was also named an ITA All-American.

Kentucky also reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament in 2017, led by the ITA All-American and first-team All-SEC honoree Bushamuka, as well as second-team All-SEC selections Matsumura and Beck Pennington.

The Wildcats finished 19-10 (7-5 SEC) in 2015-16, tying for fourth in the conference and earning another NCAA Tournament berth. Kentucky ranked 23rd in the country at the end of the season behind first-team All-SEC selection Bushamuka and SEC Co-Freshman of the Year Matsumura.

The Wildcats achieved their highest finish in the SEC under Kauffman in 2013-14, going 9-3 and placing third behind Georgia and Texas A&M. Kentucky was one of two teams in the conference to finish with 20 or more wins after compiling a 23-10 overall record. UK was led by ITA All-American Tom Jomby, who was also a first-team All-SEC selection, and second-team all-conference member Pennington. UK ultimately reached the Sweet 16, hosting a Lexington Regional.

In his first season as head coach, the Wildcats had two ITA All-Americans in Jomby and Rossi, who helped guide UK to the Sweet 16 and host a Lexington Regional. UK also reached the ITA National Indoor Quarterfinals. Jomby and Rossi were also named first-team All-SEC. The team achieved its highest final ranking under Kauffman – ninth – and finished the season 22-12 and 6-6 in the SEC.

Kauffmann was named the 12th men's tennis head coach in program history on July 25, 2012, after the retirement of 30-year head coach Dennis Emery.

Kauffmann served as a UK assistant coach from 2005-06 to 2011-12, being promoted to associate head coach in the fall of 2009. He was named the 2009 ITA Southeast Regional Assistant Coach of the Year after helping to guide Kentucky to an 18-11 record and a berth in the NCAA Tournament. Kauffmann helped lead Kentucky to the best four-year stint in school history from 2008-09 to 2011-12, posting 100 wins.

During his seven years as an assistant coach, the Wildcats held a 141-76 record and six NCAA Tournament appearances, including three trips to the Sweet 16 and one to the Elite Eight. In 2010, he helped lead UK to back-to-back appearances in the ITA Men's National Indoor Championships. UK's appearance in the 2010 National Indoor round of 16 was Kentucky's first in the indoor or outdoor championships since 2005.

In 2011, Kauffmann helped guide a talented team to a school-record 29 wins, while the 2012 squad went undefeated in SEC action to claim the school's second SEC Championship.

UK was ranked in the final 15 of the national team standings under Kauffmann's guidance in each of the four seasons from 2008-09 to 2011-12, including a No. 6 final ranking in 2012. During his seven-year span as an assistant, Kauffmann led five players to a total of 10 ITA All-America honors, including Eric Quigley, who ended his career as a five-time All-American. Kauffmann also helped UK players earn 15 All-SEC honors.

A native of Montsoul, France, Kauffmann was a three-time ITA All-American and three-time All-SEC performer during his four years as a UK player under Emery. He advanced deep into some of the best tournaments in the nation in college as a 1997 Clay Court Singles Championship finalist and a 1996 National Indoor Singles Championship semifinalist. Kauffmann's career-best ranking was second, and he finished his career at Kentucky as the fourth-winningest player in school history. He currently ranks sixth all-time with a career record of 121-61.

Kauffmann was the first tennis player inducted into the UK Athletics Hall of Fame.

After his college career ended, Kauffmann began a professional career, playing in two Grand Slam events in the 2000 U.S. Open and the 2001 French Open. During his 2001 French Open appearance, Kauffmann battled legendary tennis star Pete Sampras in a first-round five-set thriller. Kauffmann reached No. 170 in the ATP before leaving the professional ranks.

Kauffmann and his wife Caroline, who is a Kentucky native, are the proud parents of four children.

ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH MATTHEW GORDON



The 2023-24 season was Gordon's seventh with the Kentucky men's tennis program. During Gordon's time at UK, the Wildcats have amassed a 142-56 record, reached the NCAA Tournament in every year it was held (2020 cancelled due to COVID-19) and won one SEC Regular Season title in addition to two SEC Tournament championships.

Gordon helped coach the Wildcats to another outstanding season in 2023-24 as the team went 27-3 overall, won both the SEC regular season and tournament championships, and reached the quarterfinals at the NCAA Tournament for the third-straight season.

In 2023, Gordon was named the national ITA Assistant Coach of the Year after helping Kentucky to another stellar campaign which saw the Wildcats win the SEC Tournament, reach the quarterfinals of the NCAA Tournament as the No. 4 overall seed, make the semi-final round at ITA Indoor Nationals and total a cumulative team record of 27-5. Prior to receiving the national award, Gordon was also named the ITA Ohio Valley Regional Assistant Coach of the Year for the third straight season.

In 2022, Gordon was named the ITA Ohio Valley Regional Assistant Coach of the Year for the second consecutive year, becoming the first UK assistant coach to win the award multiple times. Gordon helped lead the Wildcats to the program's best ever year in 2021-22 as Kentucky reached the NCAA Championship match as a team for the first time. The Cats finished the year with an overall record of 26-8, earned the No. 8 seed in the NCAA Tournament and defeated DePaul, Northwestern, Wake Forest, No. 1 TCU and Ohio State on their way to the NCAA final. In Gordon's first season in 2018-19, Kentucky earned a 4-1 first-round NCAA Tournament win over VCU. Senior Ryo Matsumura garnered a first-team All-SEC honor, while fellow senior Enzo Wallart earned a second-team selection.

Gordon joined the collegiate coaching ranks from the Saddlebrook International Sports Academy in Florida, where he spent six years and coached multiple top-ranked USTA and ITF junior players. At Saddlebrook, Gordon spent time on court with some of the best players in the world, including John Isner and Jack Sock. Gordon also worked as a Touring Program Coach on the Association of Tennis Professionals. He was the private coach of Alex Kuznetsov, who reached No. 120. Other players he has worked with include Denis Kudla, who reached No. 80 under Gordon, and Roberto Cid, who reached a career high of No. 226. Prior to working with the Saddlebrook Touring Pro Program, he ran the Saddlebrook ITF Junior Boys group.

A top amateur in Great Britain before college, Gordon spent two years at Fairleigh Dickinson and two years at Coastal Carolina. Gordon won the Northeast Rookie of the Year in 2007-08 and also won the conference whilst earning first-team honors. At Coastal Carolina, he reached a ranking of No. 82 in the nation and was a member of the All-Big South first team. After graduating from Coastal Carolina, Gordon spent sixth months as a volunteer assistant for his alma mater.

ASSISTANT COACH CAREY RUBIN



Carey Rubin completed his first season as an assistant coach in 2023-24.

Rubin's first season in staff was a wildly successful one for the program, as Kentucky played to a 27-3 overall record, it's fewest losses in a season since 1970. Rubin helped guide the Cats to both the regular season and tournament titles in the SEC, just the second-time Kentucky has won both conference crowns in the same year, with the first coming in 1992. As the No. 5 overall seed, Kentucky won three matches in the NCAA Tournament to advance to the quarterfinals before falling to the eventual National Champion, TCU.

A native of Dayton, Ohio, Rubin previously served as a volunteer coach at UK in 2011 when the Wildcats reached the NCAA quarterfinals before falling to eventual national champion, USC. Rubin returned as a volunteer coach once again last fall. He is a former player at Kentucky, a member of the team from 2005-06.

Following his collegiate playing career, Rubin spent two years playing professionally. He then began working as a hitting partner and traveling coach with some of the top players on the WTA Tour including Grand Slam winners, Venus Williams and Bethanie Mattek-Sands, Olympic Gold Medalist, Monica Puig and NCAA Singles Champion, Peyton Sterns.
