NEED-TO-KNOWS

SUCCESS VS. AP TOP 25: Since March of 2022, the Aggies have posted a 14-10 record against ranked teams, which is the seventh-most wins among all D1 teams in that span. The 58.3 win% ranks No. 7 among D1 teams with 20 or more games vs. ranked foes.

ROAD WARRIORS: Since the beginning of the 2021-22 season, Texas A&M has compiled a 37-30 record away from Reed Arena (road + neutral). The Aggies' 37 wins rank No. 10 among P5 teams and just behind SEC foes Tennessee (41), Alabama (40) and Auburn (39).

TIGHT GAMES ARE NORM: Similar to 2023-24, Texas A&M has already been involved in multiple games that were one-possession contests after the under-4:00 media timeout in the second half. The Aggies are 5-3 in those games. Dating back to last season, the Aggies have been involved in 24 one-score affairs after the final media timeout (13-11 record).

JUST WEIRD: For the first time since the start of the 2022-23 season, someone not named Wade Taylor IV is the Aggies' leading scorer. With two more games under his belt, Zhuric Phelps has taken over the scoring lead from WT4, 231-204.

LIMITING FGM: Texas A&M and Tennessee are the only SEC schools that haven't allowed more than 28 FGM in a game this season. The two teams are No. 1 and No. 2 among SEC schools in FGM defense at 20.6 (UT) and 21.6 (TAMU).

SWEET 17: Texas A&M pounds the offensive glass for a NCAA-best 17:1 offensive rebounds/G in 2024-25.

IN THEIR DNA: Eleven SEC players have reeled in 40+ offensive rebounds - the Aggies have three of them (Coleman III, Washington, Payne). No other school has more than one.

EARNING TRIPS: Texas A&M has earned at least 20 trips to the FT line 12 times (10-2 record). The Aggies have earned 40+ FTA in three games, including 48 on Saturday vs. Alabama (3rd-most in school history).

BOARDS ADVANTAGE: A&M has been out-rebounded just twice this season and own a 9.9/G rebound margin for the season (No. 9 nationally).

PAYNE GAIN: Pharrel Payne is the Aggies' top bench scorer at 10.8 points/G. Since the start of December, Payne is shooting an NCAA-best 82.5% (33-40) from the field (among players with at least 25 FGA).

Payne's line vs. ALA was: 24 points (6-8 FGA, 11-15 FTA), 9 rebounds (6 offensive) and 4 blocks in 23 minutes.

AGGIES & WILDCATS

The Texas A&M men's basketball team faces the top-10-ranked Kentucky Wildcats in a 6 p.m. matchup at Rupp Arena on Tuesday.

- Texas A&M beat the Wildcats twice last season and will be seeking its third straight victory in the series on Tuesday.
- Kentucky holds a 13-6 advantage in the alltime series that began in the 1941-42 season.
- Five of the Aggies' six wins over the Wildcats have come as SEC brethren. In SEC play, the Wildcats hold an 11-5 advantage.
- Under Buzz Williams, the Aggies are 2-3 vs. the Wildcats.
- CONNECTIONS: UK graduate guard Jaxson
 Robinson originally signed with Texas A&M out
 of high school in 2020 and was in the same
 signing class that included Hayden Hefner ...
 UK Associate Head Coach Alvin Brooks II is
 the son of Alvin Brooks, who served on Billy

NOTING THE TRENDS

- Senior transfer Zhuric Phelps averaged a SEC-best 29.0 points and 7.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 2.0 steals in two games last week against ranked opponents. Phelps' career-high 34-point explosion on the road against No. 17 Oklahoma fueled a rally from a second-half 18-point deficit in a 80-78 win. In the second half against the Sooners, Phelps torched the Sooners for 28 points and hit the clutch 3-pointer to clinch the win with 19 seconds remaining. Against the No. 5 Crimson Tide, Phelps paced the Aggies with 24 points as they rallied from 15 points down to make it a one-possession game in the waning minutes.
- Phelps has reached double-digit points in seven straight games and 12 of 15 as an Aggie. He has 5+ rebounds in five straight games, including a season-high 10 vs. ACU (12/28).
- Henry Coleman III tallied his first double-double of the season and 16th of his A&M career with 12 points-11 rebounds vs. Alabama.
- Hayden Hefner has averaged 11.8 points, 3.6 rebounds and 1.2 assists over his last five games, including 16 points and five rebounds vs. UA.
- Texas A&M has earned 40+ rebounds in 11 games, while just allowing 40+ opponent rebounds just twice.
- In SEC play, the Aggies average 8.0 turnovers while forcing 15.0./G.
- Wade Taylor IV is averaging a 2.33 assist/turnover ratio, which is far ahead of his career best of 1.49 as a sophomore in 2022-23.
- In three starts in place of Taylor, Manny
 Obaseki has averaged 6.3 points and 2.7 assists while suffering just three turnovers.
- In his last 10 games, Minnesota transfer Pharrel Payne has hit 78.7% of his FGA while averaging 10.8 points, 4.5 rebounds and 1.5 blocks
- The Aggies have demonstrated uncommon depth this season: 11 players average at least 10 minutes of action, including five players with at least 20:00/G. Also, 10 players average at least 4.0 points/G and eight Aggies average 3.0+ rebounds/G.

TAYLOR MISSES OU, BAMA

- Leading scorer Wade Taylor IV has missed the past two games vs. Oklahoma and Alabama due to an undisclosed injury. He also missed the HCU game on 12/20.
- These are the only games Taylor has missed in his four-year career in Aggieland (124 total games played).

ON THE DEFENSE

Despite absorbing a 54.3% shooting night from OU and a 94-point night from UA last week, the Aggies rank No. 13 nationally in KenPom's adjusted defensive efficiency ranking.

- The Aggies haven't allowed an opponent to reach 30 FGs this season. The season-high FGs for an opponent is 28 by Rutgers (11/30).
- The Aggies limited high-powered Alabama to just its second sub-40% shooting game (.397).
- Only four opponents have managed higher that 45% shooting vs. the Aggies.
- Texas A&M is limiting opponents to 38.7% shooting, which is lowest since Billy Gillispie's final Aggies' squad held opponents to 37.5% from the field in 2006-07.

RIM PROTECTION = DEFENSE

The addition of 6-foot-9 shot-swatter Pharrell Payne and the continued development active 6-foot-7 defenders Solomon Washington and Andersson Garcia have led to the best rim protection of the Buzz Williams era.

OFFENSIVE GLASS EATERS

For the second straight year, Texas A&M leads D1 with an average of 17.1 offensive rebounds/G.

- Texas A&M has pulled down 11 or more offensive caroms in every game and earned an offensive rebound advantage in 13 of 16 games.
- The M&W averages 6.0 more offensive rebounds per game than its opponents.
- The Aggies have hit the 20-offensive rebound plateau five times, including a season-high 29 vs. Southern (11/20).
- Models of consistency, the Aggie glass eaters have pulled down double-digit offensive rebounds in 53 of their last 54 games dating back to the regular season finale vs. Alabama in 2023.

SMU transfer Zhuric Phelps is one of 12 D1 players averaging 15.0+ points, 4.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 2.0 steals per game.

- Phelps has been particularly effective in generating steals. He's had two or more thefts 11 times, including a season-high seven vs. ACU (12/28).
- His 34 points and six 3-pointers at OU were career highs. His 34 points vs. the No. 17 Sooners were the third-most vs. a ranked team on the road this season.
- Phelps has scored a point/minute twice this season - 18 points in 18 minutes in A&M debut vs. ETAMU and 34 in 33 vs. OU.

- He flirted with a triple-double vs. ACU when he posted 12 points, 10 rebounds and seven steals.
- His 2.5 steals/G rank No. 18 nationally and No. 2 among SEC players.

- Wade Taylor IV has reached double digits in points in 21 straight games dating back to last March. He has 10+ points in 89 of 124 career games.
- He has been perfect from the FT line in 47 career games.
- He is averaging a 2.33 assist/turnover ratio, which is far ahead of his career best of 1.49 as a sophomore in 2022-23.
- Taylor is taking about four fewer shots per game as compared to 2023-24 and his FG% has climbed from .366 to .387.
- He is the lone DI player to log 500+ points, 100+ assists and 60+ steals the past two seasons.
- Taylor owns the single season school record for free throw percentage (.878 in 2022-23) and is the current leader for career percentage at .851.
- Taylor become the third player in school history to post consecutive seasons of 500-plus points with 572 in 2022-23 and 687 in 2023-24.
- Taylor and Bernard King are the only players in school history to post consecutive seasons with 500-plus points and 100-plus assists.
- With 687 points, 145 assists, 125 rebounds and 66 steals in 2023-24, Taylor became the second player in school history to reach 600/100/100/50 plateaus in a season.

COLLEGE STATION CONTINUITY

Texas A&M Basketball is an outlier in collegiate landscape where roster movement among players and coaches is common.

- Among the 12 players that saw action for the Aggies in 2023-24, only one player that didn't finish his eligibility isn't back in 2024-25.
- Texas A&M's coaching staff has remained unchanged except for internal promotions for the past three seasons.
- Buzz Williams' staff has a combined 107
 years together, led by associate head coach
 Devin Johnson's 14 seasons on Team Bus
 #1. Others with double-digit years of service
 with Williams are: Lyle Wolf (13), Dale Layer
 (12) and Josh Chambers (10).

ABOUT THE NON-CON

- Texas A&M played eight non-conference opponents from power conferences, which is the most in school history.
- The Aggies played four teams from the Big Ten (3-1), two from the Big 12 (1-1) and one from the Big East (1-0) and Atlantic Coast (1-0) conferences.
- The Aggies were 3-0 against AP Top 25 opponents during the non-conference portion of their 2024-25 schedule.
- KenPom ranks the Aggies' non-con schedule as the No. 47-toughest among all D1 teams and No. 12 among power conference schools.

"BIG D" GUARD TRIO

The addition of Zhuric Phelps has given the Aggies a trio of senior guards hailing from the Dallas area - Phelps (Duncanville HS), Manny Obaseki (John Paul II HS in Plano) and Wade Taylor IV (Lancaster HS).

- Phelps joined the Aggies after three seasons at SMU, where scored 1,000+ points.
- Obaseki and Taylor were members of Texas
 A&M's early signing class in November of 2020.

TURKEY TALK

In Aggie Hoops vernacular, three defensive stops in a row is termed a "turkey." When the Aggies have tallied at least five turkeys this season, they have posted an 12-1 record.



TRANSFER IMPACT

The Aggies added a trio of transfers in the offseason and all three have impacted the lineup.

- Minnesota tranfer Pharrel Payne has started six games, while SMU transfer Zhuric Phelps has started every game after missing the season opener due to a preseason injury.
- Payne is the team's top shot blocker (1.4), while Phelps leads in points and steals.
- Nebraska transfer C.J. Wilcher is one of first reserves off the bench and leads the team in 3-point accuracy (38.0%).

STRAW STIRS DRINK

<u>Wade Taylor IV</u> is one of five P5 players averaging 15.0+ points while dishing out 60+ assists and suffering 30 or fewer turnovers.

Texas A&M was ranked No. 13 in the preseason edition of the Associated Press Top 25 poll. It matches the highest preseason AP Top 25 ranking for the Aggies in program history. The 2006-07 Aggies, who advanced to the Sweet 16, were also ranked No. 13 in the preseason poll.

NOTABLE ABOUT GARCIA

- The gregarious Garcia often celebrates a home victory by joining the trumpet section in the Hullabaloo Band for a faux-playing of the Aggie War Hymn (his lips don't actually touch the trumpet).
- Perhaps enhanced by English being his second language, Garcia owns the team's most spot-on impression of Buzz Williams.
- Nicknamed "Andy" by Buzz Williams, Texas
 A&M's student section makes "Andy's Coming"
 posters in honor of the Dominican Republic
 native. Garcia has embraced the famous phrase
 from the Disney/Pixar movie Toy Story by
 dropping to the ground like a lifeless toy when
 he draws a charge in the lane.
- According to a feature in HoopsHQ by Chris
 Dortch, Garcia shot a minimum of 500 3-pointers and up to 2,000 per day last summer. Over one particularily prolific month, Garcia hoisted 22,000 shots from beyond the arc.
- Since Aggie women's hoops coach Joni Taylor orchestrates an annual "Bike Build" campaign for local youths, there are often youth-sized bikes around Reed Arena. Occasionally, the lanky Garcia makes his entrance to practice or shootaround on a ridiculously tiny bike.

MANNY IN MARCH

Manny Obaseki's addition to the starting lineup on March 2, 2024 proved to be a boon to the Aggies' fortunes as they rolled five straight wins, including four away from Reed Arena, to solidify their place in the NCAA Tournament field.

- In fact, Obaseki's addition may have saved the Aggies' season since the team was mired in a five-game losing streak before he re-joined the starting lineup.
- His start on 3/2 marked his first return to the starting lineup since the NIT Championship game in 2022 -- a span of 63 games.
- Prior to 3/2, Obaseki had seen 20 or more minutes of action just three times and only once during SEC player (20 minutes vs. Tennessee).
- Averaged 16.5 points and hit 54.5% of his 3-point tries while starting the final eight games of the season

AGGIES NEVER QUIT

Under Buzz Williams, Texas A&M hoops has rallied from a 15-point or more deficit to at least a tie six times in the past two seasons, including twice already in 2024-25.

- The Aggies rallied from an 18-point hole on the road against No. 17 Oklahoma for an 80-78 win on 1/8 and from a 16-point deficit vs. Southern for a 71-54 win.
- The Aggies orchestrated the largest comeback for a win in school history last season when the Aggies rallied from 21 points down to beat Iowa State, 73-69, in the ESPN Event Invitational.
- The Aggies rallied from a 21-point deficit against then No. 4 Houston on 12/16/23 to tie the game at 63-63 at the 1:30 mark, but the Cougars prevailed 70-66 at the Toyota Center in the Halal Guys Showcase.
- On the road against Arkansas on 1/16/2024, the Aggies found themselves in a 20-point hole with just over 6:00 remaining in the first half. Behind Wade Taylor IV's career-high 41 points, the Aggies rallied to take a one-point lead with :07 remaining but UA's Tramon Mark responded with a game-winner at the buzzer.
- Against No. 18 South Carolina, the Aggies used a 17-2 run to erase a 13-point deficit and take the lead with less than nine minutes remaining.
- The Aggies trailed Houston by as many as 13 points, and by 10 with 1:24 remaining, in their second round matchup in the 2024 NCAA Tournament, but rallied to force overtime on Andersson Garcia's buzzer-beating 3-pointer.

RECENT NEWS

ONE-OF-A KIND NON-CON

- Texas A&M have played eight non-conference opponents from power conferences, which is the most in school history. .
- The Aggies were 3-0 against AP Top 25 opponents this fall. The three-game win streak is tied for the second-longest in program history behind the four-game string by Buzz Williams' 2022-23 squad.

AGGIES DOWN BOILERS

Texas A&M's 70-66 win over No. 11 Purdue in Indianapolis was the program's highestranked non-conference victory since beating No. 10 North Carolina in the 2018 NCAA Tournament. It was the highest ranked regular season non-conference win since the M&W took down the No. 10 USC Trojans in 2017. Texas A&M improved to 3-0 vs. AP Top 25 teams this season. Buzz Williams was named the National COTW by Dick Vitale after the victory.

RENEWED RIVALRY

Texas A&M and Texas Tech met for the first time in over a decade (since 2012) with the Aggies emerging victorious in a neutral-site matchup in Fort Worth (12/8) in a renewal of one of A&M's most-played rivalries (127 meetings). Wade Taylor IV was named the US LBM Coast-to-Coast Player of the Game.

DEFENSIVE VS. DEACONS

Texas A&M limited Wake Forest to just 44 points in the SEC/ACC Challenge on 12/3.

 It was the first time Texas A&M had held a power conference opponent to fewer than 50 points since Buzz Williams' first season when the Aggies beat Ole Miss, 57-47, on Jan. 7, 2020 ... It was the fewest points allowed to a power conference team since the 2016-17 Aggies beat Missouri, 60-43, on Feb. 28. 2017.

PLAYERS ERA REVIEW

Texas A&M went 2-1 in the inaugural Players Era Festival in Las Vegas, falling to eventual champion Oregon (80-70) in the first game before battling to hard-fought victories over No. 21 Creighton (77-73) and Rutgers (81-77).

Wade Taylor IV was named to the All-Tournament team after averaging 19.0 points/G with 13 assists and 11 rebounds.

100 W's X THREE

With the Aggies' 77-73 win over Creighton, Buzz Williams earned his 100th win at Texas A&M.

 He joins Tennessee's Rick Barnes as the only head coaches to win 100+ games at three power conference schools. Williams won 139 games at Marquette/Big East (2008-14) and 100 exactly at Virginia Tech/ ACC (2014-19).

- The "Voice of the Aggies," Andrew Monaco is in his seventh season as the play-by-play voice for the Aggie basketball, football and baseball teams, as well as the host of the coach's radio show for those teams. Prior to A&M, Monaco spent 16 seasons with the San Antonio Spurs and was a part of the broadcast crew covering two NBA titles. Monaco is a finalist for the 2024 Texas Sportcaster of the Year by the National Sports Media Association (NSMA).
- A team captain on the Aggies' SWC Championship team in 1974-75, Dr. John Thornton has served as the color analyst for the men's basketball team for many years. The Southwest Conference Newcomer of the Year in 1973-74. Thornton was an assistant coach from 1981-90 and served as interim head coach in 1990 before embarking on a long career as an athletics administrator.

WILLIAMS VS. AP TOP 25

Head coach Buzz Williams has compiled a 15-19 record against AP Top 25 opponents in his six seasons at Texas A&M. Since March of 2022, Williams' Aggies are 14-10 vs. ranked opponents, which is tied for sixth-most among all D1 teams in wins.

- The win over No. 17 Oklahoma (1/8) was the Aggies' fourth road win over a ranked opponent in the Buzz Williams era, which matches Texas A&M's number of ranked road wins in the 37 seasons before his arrival.
- Williams' 15 wins vs. AP Top 25 are already a school record, supplanting the 11 ranked victorires by Shelby Metcalf from 1963-90.
- With four AP top 6 wins, Williams is the only head coach in program history with more than two. Joining Williams with multiple top 6 wins is Billy Gillispie, who hired Williams on his initial Aggie coaching staff in 2004-05.
- Williams' teams have tallied the two highest-ranked wins in school history with victories over No. 2 Alabama in the 2022-23 regular season finale and No. 4 Auburn in the 2022 SEC Tournament quarterfinals.
- The Aggies' win over No. 11 Purdue (Indianapolis) was the program's highest ranked regular season non-conference win since 2017.

WHAT'S UNIQUE ABOUT AGGIE HOOPS?

GAMEDAY VIBES

 During gameday shoot-arounds, the Aggies traditionally vibe to The Commodores
 Pandora station on the team Turtlebox (founded by an Aggie) bluetooth speaker.

BIRTHDAY SHENANIGANS

 On player or staff member's birthdays, Williams honors the occasion with an emoji-filled tweet that always includes a wrong number of birthdays for the celebrator.

GETTING 'THE JUICE'

 Prior to practices, the team draws into a huddle at midcourt and Buzz Williams distributes "The Juice" to the team, which is actually simply hand sanitizer. Williams has been distributing "The Juice" prior to practices since his days at Marquette to ward off the spread of germs in the winter months.

TURKEYS AND SOCKS

- In Aggie Basketball vernacular, a "turkey" is when an opponent is held scoreless on three straight possessions. When the team has posted consecutive stops, the Aggie bench calls out "turkey, turkey" to implore the five on the floor to get another stop.
- Taking charges on defense is valued by Aggie Basketball, and the team rewards a charge taken by presenting a pair of socks to the charge taker from the special socks treasure chest.

CULTURE WALL

 After road game shoot-arounds, everyone on the trip gets on the court for a fun photo. If the Aggies win, the photo is posted on Williams' X and Instagram (@ teamcoachbuzz) and added to the "Culture Wall" in the locker room.

PROFESSOR BUZZ

 Always seeking to connect to young people, Williams is co-teaching a sport management class at Texas A&M this fall, after guest lecturing for a leadership education class the past two fall semesters. Williams also taught similar classes at Virginia Tech.

#GETBETTER EXPLAINED

 #getBETTER is the mantra for Buzz Williams and his teams. It refers to "the continual improvement in all facets of life. Always finding something to work on, to make progress on. Never being satisfied. Always looking for ways to grow."



READING IS FUN

Buzz Williams is a voracious reader, generally completing 4-5 books every month. On Oct. 1, 2024, he tweeted from @TeamCoachBuzz his "3rd Quarter 2024 Reads" with a list of the 40 books he consumed in the first nine months of 2024. For the last 11 years, Williams has selected and gifted a book to every player, staff member and their family on the initial road trip of the season. Describing his commitment to reading, Williams said, "Who you are today and who you will be five years from today are the people you meet and the books that you read, Regardless of the genre of book that you read, they say it's worth five years of experience." QUOTE SHIRTS

During the course of a season, Williams distributes 12 "Quote Shirts" to his players and staff that carry a life lesson or story behind its design for which the people within the men's basketball family can relate.

BEING THANKFUL

A staple of every road trip are the Aggies'
 Thank You letters. Each coach/player/staff member on the trip writes a Thank You letter to someone in their life at the first team meal of the roadie.

BUZZ'S BUNCH

"Buzz's Bunch" connects young people with special needs to the game of basketball with an invitation to a game in the fall and a summer clinic. Originally founded during William's time in Milwaukee, Wisconsin at Marquette, Buzz's Bunch continued during his time in Blacksburg, Virginia at Virginia Tech and now at Texas A&M. Every player, coach and staff member has been lucky to develop a relationship, learn and grown from these children as Buzz's Bunch has grown to more than 500 members spanning all three cities.

SHOOTING WITH BUZZ

"Shooting with Buzz" is a staple of the Aggies' practice regimen. As described by the Bryan-College Station Eagle: "Each player must move their way through 18 shooting spots - some straight catch and shoot and some off of movement - and make 7 of 10 shots. The clock starts after the player's first make and stops once the whole circuit is done. Managers rebound the shots and pass a ball to Williams, who stands near the player, handing the ball off for each shot. On the sideline, a manager stands in front of a giant white board, keeping tallies of the players score at each position. On the other side, a record book of times it took to complete the course are logged.

"I wanted to try to figure out a way, coming off of COVID and all the protocols and having, in essence, a completely revamped roster — how could I find some time working, while at the same time not screaming, while, in an unspoken way, they know I'm trying to invest in their life and in their game."

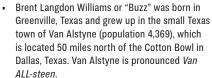

BUZZ WILLIAMS AT A GLANCE

- Buzz Williams is in his sixth season as the head coach at Texas A&M and his 18th year as a collegiate head coach.
- Prior to being named head coach of the Aggies on April 3, 2019, Williams served as head coach at Virginia Tech (5 years, 2014-19), Marquette (6 years, 2008-14) and New Orleans (1 year, 2006-07).
- In addition to his head coaching stints, Williams served on staffs at Marquette (2007-08), Texas A&M (2004-06),
 Colorado State (2000-04), Northwestern State (1999-2000), Texas A&M-Kingsville (1998-99) and UTA (1994-98).
- Williams is one of a handful of Div. I head coaches to take three different programs to the "Big Dance." He's
 coached in 21 NCAA Tournament games and produced 11 victories, which rank No. 22 in both categories among
 active Div. I head coaches. For his age (52) and his number of years as a head coach (17), Williams is the active
 leader in total victories and ranks No. 2 in NCAA Tournament games and NCAA Tournament victories.

He received the nickname "Buzz" while working as an energetic student assistant for longtime Navarro Junior College coach and mentor Lewis Orr. Williams was inducted into the Navarro College Bulldog Hall of Fame in 2021 as the school honored Williams' climb from "floor maintenance manager" to head coach.

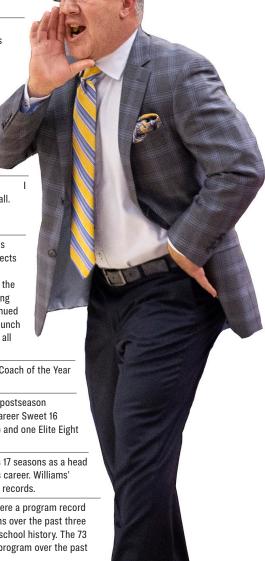
 Williams was named the Associated Press SEC Coach of the Year in 2019-20 and again in 2022-23.

 He has 10 NCAA Tournament appearances in 17 postseason opportunities as a head coach, including four career Sweet 16 appearances (3 at Marquette, 1 at Virginia Tech) and one Elite Eight appearance (2013 Marquette)

 Williams has won 20-or-more games in 12 of his 17 seasons as a head coach and averages 20+ wins per season for his career. Williams' teams have suffered just two losing conference records.

 His 52 combined wins in 2021-22 and 2022-23 were a program record for consecutive season victories, and the 73 wins over the past three seasons were the third-best three-year total in school history. The 73 wins were the fourth-most victories by an SEC program over the past three seasons.

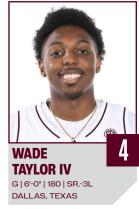













