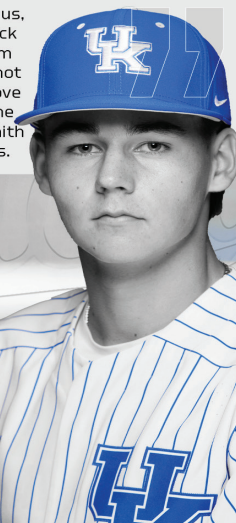

RECORD BREAKING 2024

In 2024, Kentucky set a new program record for most wins in a single season. The previous high was set at 45 by the 2012 NCAA Tournament squad. In addition to single season wins, the 2024 squad set program records for SEC wins, road wins, and SEC road wins on its way to the program's second SEC title and first MCWS appearance.

Last season, Kentucky won its first-ever game at the Men's College World Series in the most dramatic way possible, as Mitchell Daly hit a walk-off home run to left field. After missing the biggest stage in college baseball for the first 76 editions of the tournament, the Wildcats defeated NC State, 5-4, in 10 innings to open its first MCWS campaign. The Cats did not trail until the top of the ninth inning, when NC State score the go-ahead run on a wild pitch. Ryan Nicholson tied the game with a lead-off home run in the bottom of the ninth to force extras, allowing Daly to clinch the historic win for his team.

THE SKIP

Kentucky Head Coach Nick Mingione was named the 2024 National Coach of the Year for the second time in his eight-year tenure with the Wildcats, picking up the laurel from Perfect Game and the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association's Dick Howser Trophy. Mingione, the 2024 SEC Coach of the Year, guided the Cats to the program's first-ever Men's College World Series berth, the program's second-ever SEC Regular Season Championship, a program record 46 wins, and a program best 22 SEC victories. Kentucky also reached a school-record ranking of No. 2 in all five major polls, as well as the program's highest national seed (2). In the NCAA Tournament, the Wildcats swept a regional for the first time, hosted the first-ever Lexington Super Regional, and claimed the first two Super Regional wins in Kentucky history on the way to Omaha. Mingione was also named the National Coach of the Year, as well as SEC Coach of the Year, in 2017 after taking the program to its first Super Regional during his first year at the helm.

YOU GET A ROS(ZEL)

Kentucky's pitching staff has benefitted greatly from the work of Dan Roszel, who has spent the majority of his coaching career at East Carolina and Kentucky. He also helped develop Atlanta star lefty Chris Sale. Since arriving at UK prior to the 2020 season his pitching staff has struck out 10 batters per nine innings. In 2022, the unit set the school record for strikeouts in a season with 593 and staff's under his guidance own three of the top four seasons in program history in that department. Roszel's groups also have the top two seasons in school history in shutouts. UK's combined ERA through his first five seasons is 4.78.

Roszel has a lengthy track record of producing big leaguers and saw three of his former players at Florida Gulf Coast, including Sale and MLBers Richard Bleier and Casey Coleman, inducted into the school's athletics Hall of Fame in the past two years.

AUSTIN, POWERED!

Former All-American, professional ballplayer, two-time Gold Glove winner and USA Baseball alum Austin Cousino returned to his alma mater last season as an assistant coach/recruiting coordinator on Nick Mingione's staff and provided immediate dividends. Cousino already has tapped into his immense professional scouting experience with a pair of organizations to get the Wildcats' recruiting off to a strong start with Cousino as its lead recruiter. The former Wildcat starred at UK from 2012-14 and is considered one of the top all-around players to have suited up for the Blue and White. He also played in both the Angels and Mariners' farm systems and reached Triple-A before a shoulder injury derailed his career.

BLUE BLOODED

Austin Cousino wasn't the only former Kentucky great to return to Lexington in the recent years, as former All-American and first team All-SEC pitcher Logan Salow came back to his Bluegrass roots as a graduate manager in 2023 and then was promoted to Director of Scouting and Analytics after last season. Salow was a critical component of the 2017 squad that became the first to reach a Super Regional in school history before being drafted by the Athletics in the sixth round and spending five seasons in professional baseball, where he struck out 11.9 batters per nine innings and reached Triple-A. He appeared 95 times in a UK uniform, pitching to a 3.40 earned run average and leaving as the program's single-season saves leader (12 in 2017,

tied with Trevor Gott) and No. 2 on the school's career saves list with 16.

Joining them this season is former righty Ryder Giles, who was a member of the 2023 Super Regional team. He joins the support staff after a year teaching baseball in his home state of North Carolina.

LOW RYDER

Like Austin Cousino and Logan Salow before him, former UK player Ryder Giles has returned to Lexington as a member of the staff. Giles played the 2023 season for the Cats and had a significant role in advancing to the Super Regional round after he transferred from East Carolina. He pitched in 26 games, going 1-1 with a save and 3.93 ERA.

PRESEASON ACCOLADES

Devin Burkes and Robert Hogan each received 2025 Preseason All-Southeastern Conference honors. Burkes earned First-Team honors and Hogan was voted to the second team by the league's coaches. Both were integral parts to Kentucky's first-ever trip to the College World Series last season.

ELITE 90

LHP Evan Byers was named the 2024 Elite 90 Recipient for Baseball, given to the top student-athlete at each of the NCAA's championship final sites. By having the top GPA among MCWS participants, Byers received the prestigious honor at the MCWS Opening Ceremonies. The Nicholasville, Kentucky native recently graduated with a Bachelor's of Science in Animal Science, carrying a 4.0 GPA.

BIGGIE BOX

One of the pillars of UK's offense is working its game goals in search of the big inning - "Biggie Box" - which is defined as any inning where the Cats put three or more runs on the scoreboard. The approach has been incredibly effective during the Mingione era and the Cats also are 202-39 under Mingione when scoring six or more runs. (See box on page 14 for Biggie Box innings)

BACK 2 BACK

Kentucky has qualified for back-to-back NCAA Regionals for the first time in program history, with both being hosted in Lexington. It is only the second time the Wildcats have made consecutive postseason appearances, with the Cats making the 1949 and 1950 NCAA District III Tournaments, but falling short of the Regional round in both tries.

LINE OF DEFENSE

Kentucky has featured one of the top defenses in the country for two straight years, backing up 2023's nation-leading .984 fielding percentage in a major way with a .980 clip and last season were featured on SportsCenter multiple times and boasted a league-high three members on the SEC All-Defensive Team. Before 2023, no Wildcat club had fielded at .980 or higher, and now, the Cats have reached that mark for in consecutive seasons.

#PACKKPP

The Big Blue Nation has shown up in support of their Wildcats in a major way, shattering single-game and three-game series attendance records in recent seasons. In 2024, UK broke the previous Kentucky Baseball attendance record of 6,796 set in Game 7 of the 2023 NCAA Lexington Regional. Game Two of the Tennessee series mark of 7,304 attendance stands as the new attendance record for the program, marking the first time 7,000+ people have attended a Kentucky baseball game. Overall, 21,023 people attended the series, smashing the previous record of 12,815 that was set in the final series at Cliff Hagan Stadium in 2018. UK then re-established a new record with its two Super Regional games versus Oregon State, including 7,558 fans at 9 p.m. local time on a Sunday night that saw the Cats advance to their first College World Series.



PORTAL POWER - THE TRILOGY

Having hit the jackpot in the NCAA transfer portal the past two seasons, Kentucky has mined gems from that fertile resource yet again.

On the position player side, the versatile group includes OF Carson Hansen (Milwaukee), OF Cole Hage (Columbia), IF Dylan Koontz (Campbell), IF Luke Lawrence (Illinois State), OF Will Marcy (NC State/Memphis), OF Shaun Montoya (San Diego State) and C Raphael Pelletier (Kansas State). Their total career numbers entering the season: 773 games played with 677 starts, 2,600 at bats, .300 average, 259 extra base hits, 439 RBI and 108 stolen bases.

Conversely, the group of RHP Chase Alderman (Eastern Kentucky), RHP Oliver Boone (California), RHP Simon Gregersen (Indiana State), LHP Adam Hachman (Arkansas), LHP Cole Hentschel (Richmond), RHP Nic McCay (South Dakota State), RHP Scott Rouse (Radford) and LHP Ethan Walker (Longwood) each have either massive experience, undeniable talent or both. In 202 games pitched (79 starts) entering the season it had pitched 566.1 innings with a 34-27 record, 21 saves, 645 strikeouts and 514 hits allowed.

OUI, OUI

Kentucky has a rich history with Canadian baseball players, including most recently with All-American infielder Emilien Pitre. Now senior C Raphael Pelletier, also from Ontario, is the latest French-Canadian to matriculate to Lexington. Pelletier is a two-time Honorable Mention All-Big XII honoree who began his career at Kansas State and is known for his power and defense. Like Pitre, he wears No. 4 and joins alumni James Paxton, Tristan Pompey, Zach Pop, Chris Bisson and other Canadians who have starred at UK.

CHICAGO CATS

Kentucky has tapped into the fertile Chicagoland recruiting soil in recent seasons, expanding ever-deeper into the Midwest for acquisition of talent. Zach Reks (MLB), Ryan Ritter (2022 Gold Glove), Jackson Gray (2023) and now Tyler Bell, Luke Lawrence and Nate Harris (2025). Bell, a second round selection in the 2024 MLB Draft, attended the same high school as Ritter.

#EVERYTHINGSCHOOL

Under the direction of athletics director Mitch Barnhart, UK has greatly enhanced its athletic profile across the entire department since his arrival. In recent years, volleyball and rifle each have national championships, football has had a 10-win season and Citrus Bowl championship, men's tennis finished national runners-up (2022), SEC Tournament Champions (2023, 2024), and SEC Regular Season Champions (2024), men's soccer completed an undefeated regular season and No. 1 overall seed in NCAA Tournament (2022), baseball reached a trio of Super Regionals (2017, 2023, 2024), reached its first CWS (2024) and won an SEC Championship (2024), softball advanced to the WCWS (2014), women's swimming won the SEC title (2021), track and field and gymnastics (2023 6th Place Finish) each cemented their status as elite programs on the national scene, and women's basketball won the SEC Tournament for the second time in 2022. That's not to mention the continued excellence of men's basketball and cheerleading, all of which culminated in a school-record ninth place finish in the Director's Cup standings for 2021-22.

THE NEW SEC

Beginning with the 2025 season, Oklahoma and Texas will deepen an already incredibly challenging league and the SEC has announced a new scheduling format that features a pair of permanent opponents for each school, including South Carolina and Vanderbilt for Kentucky. As previously announced, teams will play a three-game series against two permanent opponents and eight rotating opponents for a total of 30 conference games. Standings will be kept in a single-division format, eliminating divisional standings.

MINGIONE IS SUPER-B

Kentucky coach Nick Mingione is writing his name all over the school's record books. In addition to being on the coaching staff of all three teams that have hosted a regional (assistant in 2006, head coach in 2017 and 2023), he is the only head coach to guide UK to a Super Regional, now having done so three in the last seven NCAA Tournaments, and the Men's College World Series. Kentucky captured the heart of the Big Blue Nation in 2023, playing an exciting brand of baseball that led to large crowds, a top RPI rating and one of the 16 NCAA Regional host locations. When the Cats battled back and advanced to face eventual national champion LSU it marked the program's second-ever Super Regional appearance, both of which have been orchestrated during Coach Mingione's tenure.

It only set the stage for 2024, when the Cats shattered school attendance records, went 5-0 at home in the NCAA Tournament and won only their second SEC regular season title in history. For the effort, Mingione was named the SSEC and National Coach of the Year, both for the second time in his eight seasons as a head coach.

FIELD GENERALS

Kentucky may have the most experienced catching situation in the country with Devin Burkes and Raphael Pelletier behind the dish. Both are considered excellent defensive catchers and receivers and should be even better in 2025 as they provide depth at the position that allows each to stay fresh. In their careers, the two have played in 292 total games with 254 starts. They have collected 882 at bats heading into 2025 with three Super Regional and a College World Series appearance, all as starters.

TWO WAY JAMES

Redshirt-junior UTL James McCoy returns as one of UK's most experienced players from the 2024 College World Series roster, having started 45 games a year ago, batting .218 with 11 extra base hits, 25 RBI, a .369 on-base percentage and eight stolen bases. McCoy is also a valuable asset to the Kentucky bullpen, often entering in late game situations. In his career, he has made eight appearances and not allowed an earned run while notching one save.

LEAVE IT TO CLEAVER

Highly touted lefty Ben Cleaver was limited last season due to injuries, but came up clutch in a major way to clinch Kentucky's series win at Florida in 2024. Now healthy, The Slim Reaper™ is expected to take off in year two and if his appearance versus Morehead State in last fall's exhibition is any indication, he appears ready. In that outing he struck out six and did not allow a hit in 3.0 innings. In 2024 he struck out 11 of the 19 outs recorded.

THE SPINS

RHP Robert Hogan was a key piece of the Kentucky bullpen last season, becoming one of its most trusted late-inning arms down the stretch. He earned a save in Kentucky's 2024 NCAA Tournament opener and then got seven critical outs over the final innings of the Super Regional clincher. In that appearance he had a crucial strikeout of eventual top overall MLB Draft pick Travis Bazzana and recorded the first two outs of the ninth inning with a one-run edge. He finished the season 1-0 with a 3.10 ERA in 40.2 innings over 24 appearances.

BISCUIT

One thing Kentucky fans have proven over the years is they love their nicknames and being unique in a conference full of tradition-rich programs. One of the latest examples is Dylan Koontz, a transfer from Campbell University (the same school that produced steady reliever Cameron O'Brien in 2024) who has a flavorful nickname. A nod to his penchant for making biscuits and gravy on Sundays, Koontz goes by "Big Biscuit" and embraces the name.

LONGWOOD --> LEXINGTON

In 2023, Kentucky mined the transfer portal for a relatively unknown first baseman who would go on to lead the Cats in home runs and endear himself to the Big Blue Nation with his leadership and raw emotion. In 2025, UK seeks to duplicate the success Hunter Gilliam had in Lexington with LHP Ethan Walker. Featuring a firm fastball and developing repertoire, Walker has a chance to follow in Gilliam's footsteps.

GARGETT GAINS

Sophomore IF Kyuss Gargett made the most of his opportunities during the two NCAA-allowed fall exhibition games, turning in two of Kentucky's most impressive single-game performances. Gargett batted a combined 6-of-9 with four runs scored, four doubles, two stolen bases and 10 RBI. The Indiana native drove in five runs in each of the two games.

ROUSE-ING PRESENCE

Senior RHP Scott Rouse is in his first season after previous stops at Ohio Dominican and, most recently, Radford. In two seasons there he started 17 games on the mound and posted a 5.72 ERA with strong strikeout rates. Interestingly, Rouse wears a reinforced hard shell cap for protection when he pitches after he was hit in the head with a line drive in 2023 that ended his season prematurely.

THIEVES OF THE INDUSTRY

- In eight years under coach Nick Mingione the Wildcats have swiped 611 bases in 793 attempts, a success rate of 77.0 percent.
- In 2023, for the first time in school history (for which stats are available, 1969) the Cats had four players with at least 15 stolen bases.
- In 2024, UK stole more than 80 bases for the fourth time in Mingione's tenure.
- In 2021, the Cats stole 78 bases in 86 attempts. It was the highest success rate (90.7) of any Division I-A team with 50+ stolen bases.
- Catcher Devin Burkes is 30-of-37 in stolen base attempts for his career, including 19-of-22 in 2024.
- In total, incoming transfers have stolen 108 bases in their careers, including five players (Cole Hage, Carson Hansen, Luke Lawrence, Will Marcy and Shaun Montoya) who have at least 13.
- Sophomore Griffin Cameron has 77 stolen bases in summer baseball the past two years, including 43 in 46 attempts in 2024 to finish second in the Northwoods League and set a Lakeshore Chinooks franchise record. He is 2-of-2 at Kentucky.

Kentucky has stolen at least 53 bases in each of the seven full seasons Mingione has been head coach and had more than 75 four times.

IN THE NIC OF TIME

In 2023, UK baseball thrived, in part, behind seventh-year pitcher Darren Williams, whose experience and toughness provided invaluable. The Cats are banking on history repeating itself in the form of Nic McCay, who has had an impressive but injury-plague career that began in 2019 at South Dakota State. Although he has missed all or parts of the 2020, 2021 and 2023 seasons he still leads all active SEC players in innings pitched and strikeouts.

MR. IVY LEAGUE

Senior Cole Hage may be, literally, the smartest person in the room at all times. After graduating from Columbia University, the three-time All-Ivy League performer opted to take his shot at the vaunted SEC for his final season of college baseball. With unique size and speed he clearly possesses special physical gifts but his mind may be even more impressive. He has routinely wowed coaches with the way he processes information, his recall skills and analytical prowess.

RINGING THE BELL

Freshman IF Tyler Bell is betting big on himself. The Chicago-area youngster was picked 66th overall in last summer's MLB Draft but did not agree to contract terms with the Tampa Bay Rays and instead enrolled at UK, making him the highest-ranked draft pick to make it to campus for the 2025 season. He will be draft eligible again after two seasons in Lexington.

HAVE MARCY!

Senior OF Will Marcy has made several pitstops (NC State/Memphis) in his career but has found a home that fits his vast skill set at UK. An elite defender in centerfield, he shined in the fall exhibitions (four doubles, four HBP) and owns a career batting average hovering around .300 with an OPS well over .800.

PATTY SWISS ARMY

Senior Patrick Herrera is the ultimate Swiss Army knife for the Cats, a versatile infielder by trade who also played meaningful innings in the outfield in 2024. Although an illness delayed his development in 2023, Herrera provides coverage at multiple positions and is a career .300 hitter with a career on-base percentage over .450.

LAWRENCE OF LEXINGTON

Junior IF Luke Lawrence has assumed the role of tablesetter for the Cats after a stellar two seasons at Illinois State where he amassed 120 hits and 15 steals in just 95 games. He is well above average at

three infield positions and is reminiscent of former UK star Emilien Pitre. In 2024 with the Redbirds he constructed a 33-game reached base streak. The Chicago native also is an accomplished hockey player.

POWER OF POSITIVITY

Redshirt junior catcher Devin Burkes has become beloved amongst teammates and fans because of his relentless positivity, pursuit of greatness and willingness to wait his turn and earn his opportunities in an increasingly impatient world. His infectious smile and edgy flair has made him one of college baseball’s most likeable student-athletes, even earning him the nickname The Happiest Man in College Baseball™, but where does it come from? He gets it from his momma, Denise.

“It comes from my mom,” Burkes said. “My brother and I didn’t always have the easiest upbringing. My mom and dad raised us to go around positive every day. Every day you’ve got something to live for, play for, love on somebody for because we don’t know who is going to be there when we wake up the next day. Got it from Momma Burkes.”

WHAT’S IN A (NICK)NAME?

Koontz isn’t the only Wildcat to garner a nickname. Several players have colorful monikers: Dylan Koontz – Big Biscuit

2024 MLB DRAFT

Kentucky saw seven of its mainstays selected in the Major League Baseball Draft just weeks after the Wildcats' run to Omaha, including the first time in school history two Cats were taken in the first 60 picks. UK also had two players signed as free agents. The seven draftees were tied for third-most in the country.

In total, Kentucky saw its entire starting infield, left fielder and weekend rotation gobbled up by professional baseball.



"THE HOOK"

One of the personal touches to the Wildcats' home, Kentucky Proud Park, is "The Hook," which is the name of the visiting bullpen just beyond the right field wall. The name is a tribute to former UK pitcher Jonathan Hooker, who pitched for the Cats from 1998-2001, and died in the plane crash of Comair Flight 5191 on Aug. 27, 2006 in Lexington.

Hooker and his wife, Scarlett Parsley, were married the night before and were on the early-morning flight headed to their honeymoon when the pilots attempted to take off from the wrong runway and crashed into a neighboring field. Forty-nine of the 50 people on board were killed, including both Hooker and Parsley.

The London, Ky. native was a beloved teammate and member of UK Baseball and his family were honored on Mar. 29, 2019 during an in-game ceremony to officially unveil "The Hook," which features a sign and memorial to the former Wildcat.

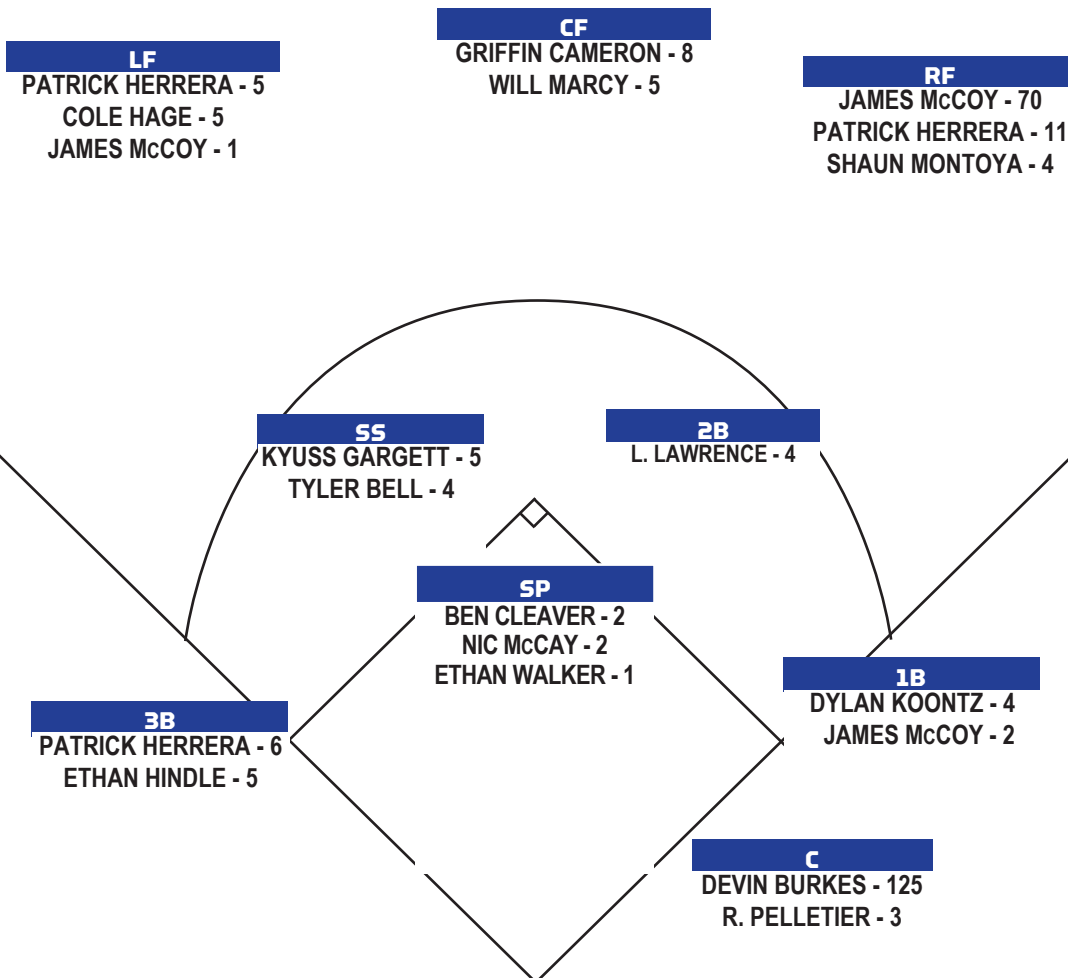

MLB TRAINING GROUND

Kentucky has made its presence felt in the Major League Baseball Draft in recent years with 43 players selected during the Nick Mingione era, including 21 in 2017 and 2018, which was the most of any college program in the country over that span. In Evan White (2017), Zack Thompson (2019) and Ryan Waldschmidt (2024) the Cats have had three first-round selections under Mingione. In the last eight drafts:

- 23 Wildcats were selected in the first 10 rounds.
- 10 were selected in the first five rounds, including first-rounders Evan White (2017), Zack Thompson (2019) and Ryan Waldschmidt (2024).
- The 13 picks in 2018 are the second-most for any school in a single draft since 2006 and tied for an SEC record with Texas A&M (2016) and national champion Vanderbilt (2019).
- The 27 underclassmen drafted during that span earned \$18.4 million in signing bonus money, an average of \$681,400 per player.
- 33 of the 43 draftees had not previously been drafted.
- White was named a 2020 AL Gold Glove winner, the first rookie first baseman in either league to win the award since its inception in 1957.

BASEBALL MINDS IN THE PROS

Former Wildcat Vince Harrison is the manager of the Dayton Dragons, the class High-A affiliate for the Cincinnati Reds, for the 2025 season. A former football and baseball player at Kentucky, Harrison has remained in the game of baseball and is one of three former players in non-playing roles with a Major League Baseball organization. Collin Cowgill remains an assistant coach with the Reds and former MLB manager and UK all-time hits leader Andy Green has joined the New York Mets' front office.



HEAD COACH NICK MINGIONE

Nick Mingione – who was named Kentucky’s head coach on June 13, 2016 – has already made his mark after just eight seasons in Lexington, becoming a respected piece of the UK Baseball program and local community, while guiding the Wildcats to their only Super Regional and first-ever College World Series appearance in school history.

In his rookie season as a head coach, Mingione proved a quick study as the 2017 Wildcats etched their name all over the school’s record books. The program made a trip to the NCAA Tournament Super Regionals for the first time and finished ranked in the Top 10 of every major college baseball poll. In year seven, Mingione repeated the feat by returning to the Super Regional and climbing into the Top 10 during the season.

UK has hosted a regional four times in history, all of which Mingione was on staff for, including twice as head coach.

Additionally, the Cats’ 43 wins in 2017 were just two shy of the school record and the most for a first-year coach in the program’s history. The 19 wins in Southeastern Conference play were the second-most in school history, just one shy of the 2006 championship team’s 20, which Mingione also was a part of as an assistant coach. In 2018, the Cats spent the majority of the season in the Top 25, including ten weeks in the Top 10. The 77 victories in Mingione’s first two seasons are the most in a two-year period at UK since John Cohen won 78 games in 2007-08.

Many of those accolades were again rewritten in a record-breaking 2024 season that earned Mingione his second SEC and National Coach of the awards. UK set a new school record with 46 victories and won the SEC regular season crown for just the second time.

The success has carried over to the Major League Baseball Draft, where Mingione and his staff’s ability to groom players for a professional career has led to 42 players being selected. The 21 players selected in the 2017 and 2018 drafts were the most of any program in the country and Mingione has helped mentor two top 20 overall picks in first baseman Evan White (17th, 2017) and left-handed pitcher Zack Thompson (19th, 2019). He added a third first rounder in 2024 (Ryan Waldschmidt) and coupled that with Emilien Pitre (58) to have two UK players selected in the top 60 overall picks in its history.

His impact on the Commonwealth culminated in being named a Kentucky Colonel on Oct. 23, 2017. The designation is the highest honor a civilian can receive in Kentucky. He also was named the 2022 winner of the Fellowship of Christian Athlete’s Jerry Kindall Character in Coaching Award for his work on and off the field.

The Cats also have been dominant in the classroom. Zach Logue was named the SEC Scholar Athlete of the Year in 2017, Troy Squires won the prestigious Senior CLASS Award in 2018, the first Kentucky player to do so, and Marshall Gei was First-Team Academic All-America in 2019. T.J. Collett then became the second Wildcat in four years to win the Senior CLASS Award when he was honored in 2021. UK also has had an Academic All-American in five of the past six years and Evan Byers was named the NCAA Elite 90 Award winner for top student-athlete at the 2024 College World Series.

Entering 2025, the Cats have had a conference-best 274 players earn All-SEC academic honors, including a league-high 34 in 2020 and 39 in 2021. The program has earned the ABCA’s prestigious Team Academic Excellence Award, which requires a cumulative team grade point average of at least 3.00, each of the 2018, 2019, 2020, 2022, 2023 and 2024 seasons, the only school in the SEC to accomplish that feat.

KENTUCKY PROUD PARK

Kentucky baseball moved into a new home for the 2019 season, opening the \$49 million Kentucky Proud Park, a state-of-the-art facility immediately considered one of the top facilities in all of college baseball. The Wildcats won their first game in their new home, defeating Eastern Kentucky, 7-3, on Feb. 26, 2019.

The stadium features permanent seating for nearly 2,500 fans with additional space on grass berms to accommodate 5,000 fans for regular season games. Beyond the outfield wall, temporary bleachers can be installed for NCAA Tournament games to bring the seating capacity to more than 7,000.

The team areas were a priority and give our players and coaches everything they need to compete at a high level in a single location. The facility features a team lounge, locker room, training area, indoor hitting and pitching areas, and coaching offices, as well as a recruiting room. All spaces are either new to UK baseball or significantly larger than previous ones.

The name is a tribute to farmers and businesses of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and the Big Blue Nation. Kentucky Farm Bureau secured the rights to name the stadium from JMI Sports, UK Athletics' multimedia rights partner. In turn, Kentucky Farm Bureau elected to name the stadium for Kentucky Proud, the state's official agricultural marketing program housed at the Kentucky Department of Agriculture. No state taxpayer dollars were used in funding the agreement. The Kentucky Proud program is funded through the generosity of the Kentucky Agricultural Development Fund. The fund is directed by the Kentucky Agricultural Development Board and administered by the Governor's Office of Agricultural Policy.

New black padding replaced the existing blue look for the 2023 season, including on the outfield fence, dugout railings and behind home plate.
