THE FAST BREAK

► **No. 10 Oklahoma (24-6, 11-5 SEC)** looks to secure a spot in the SEC semifinals on Friday, facing fourth-seeded **No. 12 Kentucky (22-6, 11-5 SEC)** in Greenville, S.C. The fifth-seeded Sooners advanced with a 70-52 win over Georgia in Thursday's second round, extending their win streak to eight. The top-15 showdown tips at 1:30 p.m. CT on ESPN, with Ryan Ruocco, Rebecca Lobo, and Holly Rowe on the call.

► Oklahoma had two players named to the All-SEC teams, as selected by the league's 16 coaches. Junior center **Raegan Beers** earned **All-SEC first-team honors**, while **Payton Verhulst** was named to the **All-SEC Second Team**. The Sooners' two selections tied for the second most in the conference, trailing only LSU's three honorees. Under head coach Jennie Baranczyk, Oklahoma has now produced 13 All-Conference honors in the past four seasons – the program's highest four-year total since earning 16 from 2006-09.

► The Sooners head into postseason play ranked **10th in both the AP poll and WBCA Coaches poll**, marking just the fifth time in program history that OU entered March inside the nation's top 10. Oklahoma has appeared in every AP poll this season, opening at No. 10 and climbing as high as No. 8. The team is currently on a 26-week streak appearing in the AP poll – the fourth longest in program history and the longest since a 40-week run from 2015 to 2017.

► Oklahoma is positioned to host first- and second-round NCAA Tournament games for the second time in four seasons, ranking as the **No. 13 overall seed in the NCAA selection committee's latest reveal** on Feb. 27. The Sooners sit at 13th in the NET rankings, boast six Quad 1 wins – the eighth most nationally – and own the highest-ranked Quad 2 win in the country, a 30-point road victory over UNLV (46th in the NET). **Entering the SEC Tournament, Oklahoma was projected as a No. 3 seed in the latest ESPN Bracketology**, as was Friday's opponent, Kentucky.

► Over the last four years, Oklahoma is 54-2 under Baranczyk when holding opponents under 70 points. On the flip side, the Sooners are 68-5 under Baranczyk **(16-3 in 24-25) when scoring 80 points or more**. OU is just .500 (29-28) since 2021 when scoring less than 80. **This season, the Sooners are undefeated (21-0) when holding their opponent under 80 points and just 3-6 when allowing 80**. Perhaps the most indicative recipe for success is that Oklahoma is **83-4 (.954) under Baranczyk when shooting a better percentage from the floor than the opponent**. OU is 78-9 when holding its opponent under 42% from the floor and 21-1 this season. When OU's opponent shoots 40% or worse, the Sooners are 66-4 in the JB era. Since 2021-22, Oklahoma is 76-15 when winning the rebounding battle.

NOTE OF THE NIGHT

► Oklahoma enters Friday afternoon on an **eight-game winning streak**, its longest of the season and best since a nine-game surge in Big 12 play last year. The Sooners' last loss came on Feb. 2 against Kentucky in Norman, 95-86, but since then, OU has **outscored opponents by 17.1 points per game**, with six wins by double digits and three by 20 or more. During the streak, OU's defense has held teams to 36.0% shooting with a +11.1 rebounding margin. **All-SEC selection Raegan Beers has led the charge, averaging 21.0 points and 9.0 rebounds per game**, with three other Sooners – Payton Verhulst (15.0 PPG), Skylar Vann (10.9) and Sahara Williams (10.3) – scoring in double figures.

TOURNAMENT QUICK HITTERS

► No. 10 Oklahoma is set for its first SEC Tournament, entering as the No. 5 seed in Greenville with a bye into the second round. The tournament, held at Bon Secours Wellness Arena for the third consecutive season and seventh time overall, is scheduled to remain there through 2028. In their inaugural SEC season, the Sooners posted an 11-5 conference record, securing marquee wins at Tennessee, at Ole Miss, vs. Alabama, and vs. Vanderbilt. They entered the tournament on a seven-game winning streak.

► A member of the Big 8 Conference from 1982–1996 and the Big 12 Conference from 1996–2024, Oklahoma has been a cornerstone of women's basketball success since the program's inception in 1975 and now brings that pedigree to the SEC. The Sooners have won 13 conference titles, including four postseason championships (2002, 2004, 2006, and 2007), and secured back-to-back Big 12 regular season crowns in 2023 and 2024. Since 2000, OU has appeared in 22 NCAA Tournaments, advancing to the Final Four three times and reaching the Sweet 16 nine times.

► Oklahoma's 11-5 conference record earned the Sooners a tie for fourth in the league standings, but it lost the tiebreaker to Kentucky based on head-to-head results. In January, OU navigated a challenging eight-game stretch against some of the nation's top teams, facing four ranked opponents (vs. Texas, at Tennessee, at South Carolina, at LSU) and a road test at Mississippi State, which was receiving votes in the AP poll at the time. The Sooners emerged from the gauntlet with a 4-4 record before catching fire, winning seven straight to close the regular season.

LAST TIME OUT: #10 OKLAHOMA 70, GEORGIA 52

► Raegan Beers had 22 points, eight rebounds and three blocks, and No. 10 Oklahoma extended its winning streak to eight games with a 70-52 victory over Georgia on Thursday in the second round of the Southeastern Conference Tournament.

► Oklahoma's win sets up a rematch Friday with No. 12 Kentucky, which handed the Sooners their most recent loss on Feb. 2, 95-86. That victory proved to be a key tiebreaker, allowing the Wildcats to earn the last remaining double bye in the tournament over the Sooners after the teams finished tied for fourth in conference play.

► Liz Scott added 11 points and eight rebounds for the Sooners (24-6).

► Georgia Amoore made seven 3-pointers and scored a career-high 43 points to lead No. 12 Kentucky to a 95-86 victory over No. 13 Oklahoma on Sunday. Sophomore Sahara Williams scored a career-high 27 for the Sooners (16-6, 4-5) on 8-for-19 shooting. Raegan Beers totaled 18 points and 10 rebounds, while Payton Verhulst had 11 points and 10 boards.

A WIN WOULD...

► Advance Oklahoma to the SEC semifinals where it would face either top-seeded South Carolina or eighth-seeded Vanderbilt on Saturday afternoon.

► Mark Oklahoma's ninth straight win, tying last year's nine-game surge for the longest winning streak of the Baranczyk era (2021-present).

► **Secure OU's seventh Quad 1 win of the season and fifth top-25 victory.** It would give Oklahoma its first win over a ranked opponent at a conference tournament since 2010 (lost five straight entering Friday).

PULSE OF THE POLLS

► Oklahoma is the No. 10 team in the AP Poll that was released on March 3. OU rose as high as No. 8 in the Nov. 25 poll. The Sooners checked in at 10th in the WBCA Coaches Poll on March 4. The Sooners have now entered postseason play inside the nation's top 10 for the fifth time and first since 2009.

► OU opened the 2024-25 season ranked 10th in both the AP and WBCA Coaches polls, marking the team's highest preseason ranking since 2010. It was also Oklahoma's first top-10 appearance in the AP poll since Nov. 18, 2013, when the team was similarly ranked at No. 10.



► Oklahoma currently boasts an active streak of 26 consecutive weeks in the AP poll, the fourth longest in program history. The active streak is the longest stretch since a 40-week period between 2015-17.

THE MARCH TO MADNESS

► In the latest ESPN bracketology by Charlie Creme on March 3, Oklahoma was tabbed as a **No. 3 seed**, which would provide hosting duties in the tournament for the second time of the Baranczyk era (2022).

► **The NCAA Selection Committee ranked Oklahoma No. 13 in its second NCAA Top 16 reveal on Feb. 27.** If the NCAA Tournament started today, the Sooners would be hosting first- and second-round games at Lloyd Noble Center for the first time since 2022. Oklahoma has faced six teams within the top 16, as the SEC leads all conferences with six teams above the cut.

- A staple of the NCAA postseason, Oklahoma has appeared in 24 NCAA Tournaments, including 22 since the turn of the century and three straight under Baranczyk.
- Of Oklahoma's 29 regular season opponents, 14 are in the latest bracket on ESPN, including five from its non-conference slate (Southern [W], UNLV [W], Duke [L], Louisville [W] and Michigan [W]).

THE RÉSUMÉ SPEAKS FOR ITSELF

- The Sooners are ranked 14th in the latest NET rankings and have maintained a spot in the top-20 since the first ranking was released in December.
- OU's non-conference slate featured five projected NCAA Tournament teams – Southern, Duke, Louisville, Michigan and UNLV (104-43 combined record) with three of the five counting as Quad 1 wins and UNLV on the fringe of Quad 1/2. **The Sooners won at Louisville, a feat matched only by No. 3 Notre Dame, No. 8 UNC and No. 9 NC State. They also routed UNLV by 30 in Vegas, snapping a 13-game home winning streak and beat then-No. 20 Michigan by double digits on a neutral floor.**

► OU has played the nation's 30-toughest schedule and **ranks eighth nationally in Quad 1 wins with six.** The Sooners are 13-6 vs. top-100 teams (16th most wins nationally) and unbeaten in Quad 2-4 games (18-0), one of just 13 teams with a perfect record in such matchups.

► OU has been battle-tested against elite competition, with five of its six losses coming against teams in the NCAA selection committee's Top 16, including three against top-10 teams. Outside of the game at South Carolina, every OU loss has come by 10 points or less.

EXPERIENCE PAYING DIVIDENDS

- **The Sooners returned a nation-leading 98% of their scoring from last season's Big 12 championship team, including all five starters and 11 letterwinners.** In terms of returners, leading the way are 2024 Big 12 Co-Player of the Year Skylar Vann and last year's Big 12 Newcomer of the Year Payton Verhulst, who earned All-SEC honors this season. They're joined by standout transfer and All-American 6'4" center Raegan Beers, along with 2024 All-Big 12 honorees Sahara Williams and Nevaeh Tot.
- Oklahoma doesn't just return talent - it returns experienced talent. The Sooners have combined to play over 1,275 games in their careers. **The 14-player roster has amassed 581 combined starts.**
- The Sooners' projected starting five, with Reyna Scott replacing Nevaeh Tot (124 career starts), combines for 270 career starts. Scott, who debuted as a starter against Georgia, joins a seasoned lineup led by Skylar Vann (69 starts), Raegan Beers (65), Sahara Williams (63), and Payton Verhulst (62).
- Off the bench, Oklahoma boasts two players with over 100 career starts in Tot (124) and Lexy Keys (104), as well as Liz Scott who has 64 (started in place of Beers at Ole Miss and vs. Auburn). **Five different Sooners have played in over 100 career games.**
- **Six Sooners have graduated with undergraduate degrees and are pursuing their graduate degrees.**

ROSTER LOADED WITH TALENT

- Oklahoma's experienced roster draws plenty of attention, but it's no secret that the Sooners are also one of the most talented teams in the nation. **The Sooners' starting five features three McDonald's All-Americans (Beers, Verhulst, Williams) while OU's remaining two starters include Skylar Vann, the 2024 Big 12 Player of the Year, and Reyna Scott.**
- Five Oklahoma players were five-star recruits in high school: Sahara Williams, Payton Verhulst, Aubrey Joens, Liz Scott, and Raegan Beers.
- Eight members of the 14-player roster were ranked as top-100 players in their class by ESPN: Raegan Beers (#10), Payton Verhulst (#12), Sahara Williams (#23), Zya Vann (#46), Aubrey Joens (#52), Caya Smith (#72), Liz Scott (#76), and Beatrice Culliton (#96).

Jennie Baranczyk was named the ninth head coach of the Oklahoma women's basketball program on April 10, 2021. She will enter her fourth season at the helm in 2024-25 and usher the program into a new chapter in the Southeastern Conference.

Baranczyk (pronounced buh-RON-check), a 13-year head coach, spent nine seasons at Drake before starting her Oklahoma tenure in 2021-22. In each of her first three seasons in Norman, Baranczyk was a National Coach of the Year semifinalist and was named the 2024 Big 12 Coach of the Year. Her 74-26 (.740) record through three seasons is the best three-year start in program history.

Her teams have reached 20 wins in nine of the last 10 seasons, including three consecutive 23-plus wins at Oklahoma. She's led her teams to six NCAA Tournaments and produced 34 all-conference honorees over the previous 12 seasons.

Baranczyk delivered the program's second-straight Big 12 Conference regular season championship during her third campaign as the Sooners' head coach. Her efforts earned her Big 12 Coach of the Year honors, and she was a semifinalist for the Naismith National Coach of the Year award. The conference title was OU's first outright conference title since 2009, as OU compiled a 15-3 league record and a 23-10 overall record. Oklahoma was tabbed as a fifth seed in the program's third consecutive NCAA Tournament, where Baranczyk led OU to the second round.

Baranczyk and her staff saw Skylar Vann claim OU's first Big 12 Player of the Year honor in 15 years, while Payton Verhulst was named the league's Newcomer of the Year. Four Oklahoma players received All-Big 12 honors, with Vann and Verhulst making the first team and Nevaeh Tot and Sahara Williams receiving honorable mentions. Vann and Verhulst both earned All-America honors, pushing Baranczyk's All-America total to five as the Oklahoma head coach.

In her second season, Baranczyk guided the Sooners to their first Big 12 championship since 2009, sharing the regular season title with a 14-4 record in league play and a 26-7 overall record. OU also made its second consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance under Baranczyk. The Sooners secured a program-record six sweeps in league play and secured the most conference wins in 13 seasons.

Baranczyk's coaching saw Madi Williams selected unanimously to the All-Big 12 First Team, while Taylor Robertson and Ana Llanusa received second-team honors, and Skylar Vann received an honorable mention. Vann also won the Sixth Player Award for the second year in a row, and freshman Beatrice Culliton was named to the All-Freshman team. Additionally, Williams became OU's first WNBA Draft Pick since 2013 and earned WBCA and AP All-America honors along with Robertson.

In her debut season, Baranczyk orchestrated one of the greatest turnarounds in the country, guiding the Sooners to a 25-9 record and into the second round of the NCAA Tournament. The 13-win improvement from the season before Baranczyk's arrival was the second-largest turnaround in program history. The Des Moines, Iowa, product was named a WBCA National Coach of the Year finalist for her efforts. In addition, the team reached 20 wins faster than all but two teams in program history, rising to No. 12 in the AP Poll midway through the season. Madi Williams and Taylor Robertson earned unanimous All-Big 12 first-team selections, while Skylar Vann was named the league's Sixth Player of the Year.

She coached two Sooners, Taylor Robertson and Madi Williams, to unanimous first-team All-Big 12 selections, the first Sooner pair to do so since 2012. Under Baranczyk's watch, Skylar Vann was named the 2022 Big 12 Sixth Player of the Year and a league honorable mention, and Kelbie Washington earned All-Big 12 Freshman Team honors. Robertson became OU's first All-America selection since Aaryn Ellenberg in 2014, earning an honorable mention.

Baranczyk came to OU after amassing a 192-96 (.667) record at Drake and leading the Bulldogs to six consecutive 20-win seasons (2014-15 through 2019-20) and three NCAA tournament berths (2017-19). A two-time Missouri Valley Conference Coach of the Year, Baranczyk's .667 winning percentage ranks fifth in the league's history.

Baranczyk won back-to-back MVC Coach of the Year awards after her team's historic 2016-17 and 2017-18 campaigns. She led the Bulldogs to an 18-0 regular-season conference record both years and won both MVC Tournaments. After the 2018-19 squad posted a 17-1 league record, the Bulldogs had amassed a near-perfect three-year MVC mark of 53-1 (.981).

Baranczyk began her coaching career in the Big 12 Conference, serving first as an assistant coach at Kansas State during the 2005-06 season (the Wildcats won the WNIT) and returning to the league as an assistant coach at Colorado from 2010-12. Between her Big 12 stints, Baranczyk was an assistant coach at Marquette from 2006-10, helping the Golden Eagles to an 81-53 record and four postseason appearances. The 2007-08 squad won the WNIT title.

Formerly Jennie Lillis, Baranczyk spent her collegiate career at the University of Iowa (2000-04) and is regarded as one of the best all-around players in Hawkeye women's basketball history.

Baranczyk, who obtained a master's degree in counseling and student development from Kansas State in 2006, is married. She and her husband, Scott, have a son, Eli, and two daughters, Jordi and Hope.
