HEAD COACH NICK MINGIONE



Nick Mingione – who was named Kentucky's head coach on June 13, 2016 – has already made his mark after just nine seasons in Lexington, becoming a respected piece of the UK Baseball program and local community, while guiding the Wildcats to three Super Regionals and a first-ever College World Series appearance in school history.

In his rookie season as a head coach, Mingione proved a quick study as the 2017 Wildcats etched their name all over the school's record books. The program made a trip to the NCAA Tournament Super Regionals for the first time and finished ranked in the Top 10 of every

per Regionals for the first time and finished ranked in the Top 10 of every major college baseball poll. In year seven, Mingione repeated the feat by returning to the Super Regional and climbing into the Top 10 during the season. A year later, Big Blue Nation took over Omaha.

UK has hosted a regional four times in history, all of which Mingione was on staff for, including twice as head coach.

Additionally, the Cats' 43 wins in 2017 were just two shy of the school record at the time and the most for a first-year coach in the program's history. The 19 wins in Southeastern Conference play were the second-most in school history, just one shy of the 2006 championship team's 20, which Mingione also was a part of as an assistant coach. The 2024 SEC championship team set a new mark with 22 wins. In 2018, the Cats spent the majority of the season in the Top 25, including ten weeks in the Top 10. The 77 victories in Mingione's first two seasons are the most in a two-year period at UK since John Cohen won 78 games in 2007-08.

Many of those accolades were again rewritten in a record-breaking 2024 season that earned Mingione his second SEC and National Coach of the awards.UK set a new school record with 46 victories and won the SEC regular season crown for just the second time.

The success has carried over to the Major League Baseball Draft, where Mingione and his staff's ability to groom players for a professional career has led to 43 players being selected. The 21 players selected in the 2017 and 2018 drafts were the most of any program in the country and Mingione has helped mentor two top 20 overall picks in first baseman Evan White (17th, 2017) and left-handed pitcher Zack Thompson (19th, 2019). He added a third first rounder in 2024 (Ryan Waldschmidt) and coupled that with Emilien Pitre (58) to have two UK players selected in the top 60 overall picks in its history.

In 2018, 13 Cats were selected in the draft, the highest total of any program in the country. The total set a new program record for most draftees in a single year, shattering the previous mark of nine. Additionally, UK has had 23 players drafted in the first 10 rounds over the past eight seasons. The 27 underclassmen who have been drafted through 2024 and signed during Mingione's tenure have garnered a total of \$18.4 million in signing bonus money, more than \$681,400 per draftee.

Already, six players from the 2017 team – RHP Sean Hjelle, LHP Zach Logue, RHP Zach Pop, OF Zach Reks, LHP Zack Thompson and 1B Evan White – have made it to the big leagues. In all, 28 players coached by Mingione during his career have reached The Show.

Mingione – who spent eight seasons as an assistant to Cohen at Mississippi State – was an immediate hit with fans and community leaders. He made it a point to have his team involved in the community, part of his "Student. Person. Player." guiding principle of the program, participating in numerous philanthropic events in Lexington while also taking time for more than 100 local speaking engagements.

In his first season at UK his ethos for the program was on full display as UK players earned SEC Pitcher of the Year, SEC Scholar Athlete of the Year and SEC Community Service Team honors.

"Nick Mingione is exactly the kind of coach we hoped to hire when we began our search," UK Director of Athletics Mitch Barnhart said. "His passion, tactical mind and tireless recruiting efforts made him an important part of Mississippi State's staff during some great years for the program. More than that, he is a man of substance who is committed not only to developing young men as baseball players, but as students and people."

His impact on the Commonwealth culminated in being named a Kentucky Colonel on Oct. 23, 2017. The designation is the highest honor a civilian can receive in Kentucky. He also was named the 2022 winner of the Fellowship of Christian Athlete's Jerry Kindall Character in Coaching Award for his work on and off the field.

Mingione took over the Kentucky program after serving as assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Cohen at Mississippi State starting before the 2009 season. Working with the team's outfielders, first basemen and hitters, Mingione helped lead MSU to an incredible run of success, including the program's first Southeastern Conference regular-season championship since 1989 in 2016, a runner-up finish in the College World Series in 2013 and an SEC Tournament championship in 2012.

"This is an opportunity I've dreamed about for more than a decade," Mingione said. "From the moment I first stepped foot on campus I knew it would be a place I could call home. What an incredible feeling to be back. Kentucky is a special place and this baseball program has had great moments over the years, including some that I have been a part of."

Prior to his time at Mississippi State, Mingione spent two seasons at UK as an assistant under Cohen in 2006-07. UK won 33 SEC games in those two seasons, including in 2006 when UK claimed its first SEC championship. After the historic regular season, the Wildcats hosted an NCAA Regional for the first time. Mingione worked extensively at UK with the likes of All-American Collin Cowgill and John Shelby III.

Mingione has a sterling reputation as a recruiter. He also has an unmatched track record of player development, coaching 90 players selected in the MLB Draft, as well as 47 All-Americans and six conference players of the year. His first recruiting class at Kentucky was ranked in the Top 10 of all the major industry outlets.

The Cats also have been dominant in the classroom, having 31 players receive SEC Academic Honor Roll and First-Year Honor Roll in 2018, eight more than any other school in the conference. Zach Logue was named the SEC Scholar Athlete of the Year in 2017, Troy Squires won the prestigious Senior CLASS Award in 2018, the first Kentucky player to do so, and Marshall Gei was First-Team Academic All-America in 2019. T.J. Collett then became the second Wildcat in four years to win the Senior CLASS Award when he was honored in 2021. UK also has had an Academic All-American in five of the past six years and Evan Byers was named the NCAA Elite 90 Award winner for top student-athlete at the 2024 College World Series.

Entering 2026, the Cats have had a conference-best 314 players earn All-SEC academic honors, including a league-high 34 in 2020 and 39 in 2021. The program has earned the ABCA's prestigious Team Academic Excellence Award, which requires a cumulative team grade point average of at least 3.00, each of the 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022, 2023, 2024 and 2025 seasons, the only school in the SEC to accomplish that feat

"Nick Mingione has been preparing for this opportunity for the last 13 years and I absolutely know that he will make the most of it," Cohen said. "He is one of the nation's elite recruiters. He is a brilliant tactician of the game. His ability to prepare kids for success in the SEC is of the highest level.

"He will make himself an irreplaceable part of the Kentucky baseball community and his wife is one of the finest people I've ever met. You try and surround yourself with people who make you a better coach and a better person. Nick Mingione has been that kind of person for me and like a member of my family."

"He's a special coach," LSU coach Jay Johnson said. "They know how to play. They know how to win. Their pitchers know exactly who they are, how to execute it. They know exactly the style of offense that they are, and they play it great. He's a special dude. He's a special competitor. He's a great coach and a great human being."

Before rejoining Cohen at MSU, Mingione spent a season at Western Carolina as assistant coach and recruiting coordinator. There, Mingione helped lead the Catamounts to top-40 national ranking in 11 different offensive categories.

Prior to his first stint at Kentucky, Mingione spent three years as an assistant coach at Embry-Riddle University, his alma mater. The Eagles appeared in the NAIA College World Series in each of those seasons, culminating in a runner-up finish in 2005. Mingione also coached at Florida Gulf Coast in 2002, helping lay the foundation for the program before its inaugural season in 2003. He began his coaching career in 2001 at Mariner High School, his alma mater.

Mingione graduated from Embry-Riddle in 2000 with a degree in aerospace studies, as well as a triple minor in business, psychology and humanities. He was also a four-year letterman on the school's baseball team.

Away from coaching, Mingione travels often for both speaking engagements and mission trips. In 2013, he and six current and former members of the MSU program helped build houses and run baseball clinics for youth on the Bahamian island of Eleuthera. When he returned stateside, he was inducted into the "Be The Best You Are" Baseball Clinic Speaker Hall of Fame. Other past inductees include Ted Williams (2002), Ron Polk (2003), Leo Mazzone (2006) and Cohen (2008).

Mingione and his wife, Christen, have one son, Reeves.

THE MINGIONE EFFECT

In 23 full seasons as a collegiate coach Mingione has produced a sparkling track record. Those teams have averaged 38 victories a year and advanced to the postseason 12 times with two national runner-up finishes.

SEVENTH SEASON AT UK



Dan Roszel came to Lexington after nearly two decades of high-level success at four programs, including nine seasons at East Carolina where the Pirates finished in the nation's top 50 in earned run average seven times. East Carolina advanced to six NCAA Regionals during his nine years on staff and Kentucky advanced to its second-ever Super Regional in 2023, in large part due to the strength of his pitching staff. The Wildcats then followed up with a College World Series appearance in 2024 and another NCAA Regional in 2025.

"Dan has a track record of winning, he's committed to helping student-athletes win all areas of their lives, and he's a proven developer of Major League Baseball pitchers," Mingione said. "He's an involve for our program" invaluable resource for our program.

In 2025, despite having an undermanned pitching staff, Roszel helped guide UK to the NCAA Tournament despite 30 new players on the roster. A year before, his staff dominated as the Cat's went undefeated in the regional and super regional rounds for their first-ever College World Series appearance.

In 2023, Kentucky's staff provided stability and became a strength as the Wildcats roared to 40 victories and the No. 12 overall national seed in the NCAA Tournament. Later that summer, he added three draft picks and two free agent signings to his body of work, bringing his UK totals to eight pitchers drafted and three signed by big league organizations.

In 2022, Roszel's staff set the single-season school record at Kentucky for strikeouts and helped mentor All-American Tyler Guilfoil.

Upon joining ECU in 2010, Roszel has mentored 15 Major League Baseball draft picks, nine All-Americans and 19 all-conference selections while the program piled up 342 victories, six NCAA Regional appearances and two Super Regional runs. Since 2013, seven of Roszel's pupils have made their MLB debuts, including Seth Maness and Heath Hembree (2013), Mike Wright and Shawn Armstrong (2015), Jeff Hoffman, Richard Bleirer and Jharel Cotton (2016).

In 2019, Roszel disciple Jake Agnos was named to six All-America squads and set the American Athletic Conference's single-season strikeout record with 145 in 102.0 innings on his way to being named the 2019 AAC Pitcher of the Year. He was selected by the New York Yankees in the fourth round of this summer's draft.

In his 21 seasons as a coach, Roszel has seen 43 of his pitchers sign professional contracts, headlined by MLB all-star Chris Sale, who he coached while at Florida Gulf Coast. Sale, who has finished in the top five of the American Cy Young Award vote six times, was selected 13th overall by the Chicago White Sox in the 2010 draft. In 2014, Hoffman became Roszel's highest draft pick when taken ninth overall by the Toronto Blue Jays.

After completing his playing career at the University of North Florida, Roszel broke into the coaching ranks and within three seasons had joined Gardner-Webb University, where he saw two first-day draftees in four years. From there, Roszel went to Florida Gulf Coast for two seasons, helping the Eagles win an Atlantic Sun Conference title in its first season at the Division I-A level, the only team in NCAA history to accomplish that feat Refore settling at East Carolina, he spent two seasons. accomplish that feat. Before settling at East Carolina, he spent two seasons at College of Charleston, where three of his pitchers were selected in the 2010 MLB Draft as the Cougars came within one win of a Super Regional appearance.

"Nick Mingione's vision for the program of developing young men as students, people and players, his leadership style and the Lexington community were all important factors in (coming to Kentucky)," Roszel said. "This is a dream come true."

Roszel, a 2000 graduate of North Florida, and his wife Melissa have three children, Madyson, Makenna and Clayton. Roszel received his degree in criminal justice with a minor in political science.

THIRD SEASON AT UK



Austin Cousino is home.

The former Kentucky All-American and USA Baseball alum was named assistant coach/recruiting coordinator in summer 2023.

"We are excited to welcome Austin home to Lexington," Kentucky head coach Nick Mingione said. "Austin is one of the most accomplished players in this program's history in addition to having experience in both the collegiate and

professional ranks as a player, coach and talent evaluator. His baseball acumen and wealth of knowledge about all aspects of the game, coupled with his ability to connect with student-athletes, will be an invaluable tool for current and future Wildcats."

Cousino returned to UK after a successful scouting career for Major League Baseball's Detroit Tigers and Tampa Bay Rays organizations. He also has collegiate coaching experience at both Mississippi State and Xavier. He has coached 25 players from the Bulldogs and Musketeers to the professional ranks to go along with 11 in his first two seasons at Kentucky.

"I want to thank Coach Mingione and the entire University of Kentucky administration for entrusting me with this opportunity," Cousino said. "Coach Minge has created and fostered an environment that allows everyone in and around the program to be the best version of themselves and that's exciting. Returning to Lexington is a dream come true and I can't wait to help the program take the next step."

Cousino, who was a Freshman All-American and Southeastern Conference Freshman of the Year in 2012, starred at UK from 2012-2014 before being selected in the third round of the 2014 draft by the Seattle Mariners. He reached Triple-A in just two seasons before injury short-circuited his career.

He joined the coaching ranks shortly thereafter as a graduate assistant at Mississippi State. In 2018, he began a two-year stint at Xavier University as its hitting and outfield instructor. Cousino then made the jump to professional baseball as a scout for the Detroit Tigers. In four years he was the main scout for six drafted players and two free agent signees. Responsible for parts of Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, Michigan, Ohio, Pennsylvania and Wisconsin, prospects from his territory received nearly \$3 million in signing bonus money. He signed half the highest-drafted players in the organization in the last 15 years from his territory, showcasing his evaluation skill.

Overall, he's coached 45 players who have played in MiLB, including 1015 Top 10 rounders and four big leaguers. Cousino's first season on the UK staff coincided with the program's first appearance in the College World Series, just its second SEC regular season championship and a school record 46 victories. Position players Ryan Waldschmidt (1st round) and Emilien Pitre (2nd round)) each were selected in the first 70 picks of the 2024 MLB Draft as part of a group that saw Kentucky have

the third-most players in the country drafted/signed. The Wildcats led or were ranked near the top of the SEC in every major statistical category.

He has hit the ground running on the recruiting trail as well, both in the transfer portal and high school ranks. Kentucky has signed a Top 10 portal class each of the past three cycles and Top 25 recruiting classes over the same time period.

During his three seasons in Lexington, he was one of the best players in the country. He batted .295 in 859 at-bats with 216 hits, 47 doubles, seven triples, 19 home runs and 106 RBI. He stole 48 bases and was hit by 47 pitches. He was named to the SEC All-Defensive Team in each of his three seasons, twice awarded the prestigious Gold Glove Award and was a three-time alum of USA Baseball.

In 2012, Kentucky set the school record for victories in a season with 45 and advanced to the first of two NCAA Regionals during his three years in Lexington. In total, UK won 112 games during his time as a player and set a school record with a 22-game win streak in 2012. He is 10th on the school's all-time hit list with 216 career knocks and remains UK's only SEC Freshman of the Year. He also was an Academic All-American in 2014.

SECOND SEASON AT UK



Kentucky hired Wright State Associate Head Coach and Hitting Coach Chase Slone as assistant coach after he played a pivotal role in the Raiders breaking four school records during his short tenure there.

He will now be tasked with helping continue Kentucky's impressive offensive versatility that either led or ranked near the top of the Southeastern Conference in most major statistical categories in 2024.

His debut season with the Wildcats in 2025 saw Tyler Bell earn Freshman All-SEC and Freshman All-America honors. As a team, UK ranked fourth nationally in hit by pitch with a school-record 151 and 30th in stolen bases with 132. Seven players had at least 11 steals.

"Chase is a perfect fit for Kentucky Baseball," UK coach Nick Mingione said. "He's extremely intelligent, innovative and has played a pivotal role in one of the nation's most effective and opportunistic offensive attacks. We are thrilled to welcome him to the UK baseball family and the Big Blue Nation."

In Slone, UK is hiring a rising star in the coaching community who presided over a Raiders offense that was 10th in scoring in Division I in 2024 at nine runs per game. It also ranked eighth in slugging percentage and home runs per game, 16th in batting average and 17th in total runs scored as Wright State won yet another Horizon League championship.

The balanced attack broke the school record for home runs with 112, RBI (473) and runs scored (505). Ben Vore also set a new single-season school record for RBI with 75.

In 223 games under Slone's guidance, Wright State's offense has batted .300 overall, smacked 349 home runs, scored 8.5 runs per game and stolen 357 bases, all while setting multiple records along the way. In four full seasons since being promoted to full-time hitting coach, Wright State has won four Horizon League regular season titles, three Horizon League Tournament crowns and been to three NCAA Regionals. It also has seen a pair of Slone proteges with Horizon League Player of the Year.

During the past three seasons, Wright State ranks 11th in Division I in combined home runs and stolen bases, 17th in doubles, 21st in runs scored, 23rd in stolen bases and 24th in triples.

Wright State also has developed six Major League Baseball draft picks in three years while Slone has been on staff, including Tyler Black, who made his big league debut this spring.

In 2023, Andrew Patrick broken the Wright State single-season record for home runs and shortstop Justin Riemer was drafted in

the fourth round. A year prior in 2022, the Raiders set a then-school record for home runs that was shattered last season and saw Alec Sayre win Horizon League Player of the Year.

In 2021, Slone's first as a full-time assistant, Wright State's offense led Division I in average, slugging, on-base percentage and scoring. It also saw Quincy Hamilton win Horizon Player of the Year and four position players either drafted or sign free agent contracts.

Slone began his collegiate playing career at Southern Illinois, transferred to Dyersburg State Community College where he hit over .400 and eventually completed his final two seasons at Wright State. With the Raiders, he was a First-Team Horizon League shortstop his first season and Second Team his final season. He played a year of professional baseball before entering the coaching ranks.
