SEC GYMNASTICS WEEKLY HONORS PRESENTED BY ALLSTATE

SEC Gymnast of the Week – LSU's Kailin Chio, a sophomore from Henderson, Nev., was the top all-arounder in session one of the Sprouts Farmers Market Collegiate Quad with her final score of 39.600. Chio also took home a share of the beam title at the meet after matching her career high of 9.950 on the event. She was one of only two Tigers to compete on all four events in LSU's season opener, helping lead her team to their highest road opening score in program history (197.500).

SEC Specialist of the Week – Florida's Selena Harris-Miranda, a senior from Las Vegas, Nev., won two individual titles in the season-opening quad meet win over No. 24 North Carolina, Temple and West Virginia. Harris-Miranda recorded a 9.975 on beam, matching the second-highest beam score in a season opener in program history. She also earned a 9.95 on bars, also matching the program's second-highest bars mark in a season opener. Harris-Miranda closed out the meet with a third-place finish on vault with a score of 9.90.

SEC Freshman of the Week – Oklahoma's Mackenzie Estep, a freshman from Auburn, Wash., was one of three Sooners to go 9.9-plus on every event they competed during session one of the Sprouts Farmers Market Collegiate Quad. Estep recorded a 9.90 on vault and on beam. She then earned her highest score of the day with a 9.925 on floor to share the event title with UCLA's Jordan Chiles. Estep is the first OU freshman since Maggie Nichols in 2019 to earn all scores of 9.90 or higher in their debut meet (minimum two events competed).

The Alabama gymnastics team opened its 2026 season with authority, defeating the Clemson Tigers 197.475-196.550 in Littlejohn Coliseum.

The Crimson Tide's score broke the program's highest season-opening total in UA history by .350 of a point.

Alabama delivered a complete performance across all four events, highlighted by standout efforts from its freshman class. Azaraya Ra-Akbar made her collegiate debut with a sensational 9.975 on the uneven bars, earning the event title as she anchored the Tide's opening rotation. Fellow freshman Jasmine Cawley won the all-around title with a 39.475 and the vault title with her 9.900, one of two 9.900s she recorded during the meet.

Juniors Chloe LaCoursiere and Gabby Ladanyi shared the beam title as they each recorded a 9.925.

Alabama is back on the road for its first SEC dual meet of the season, taking on Florida on Friday, January 16 in Gainesville, Fla. Start time is slated for 6 p.m. CT, live on ESPN2.

Freshman Allison Cucci took home the all-around title, posting a top score of 39.350 in her collegiate debut. Cucci also shared the vault title with teammate and redshirt junior Lauren Williams, who each recorded a 9.900.

Graduate student Leah Smith captured first place on the uneven bars with a 9.875, and sophomore Joscelyn Roberson posted a 9.950 to claim the beam title. Senior Morgan Price earned a share of the floor title with a score of 9.875 along with Minnesota's Arianna Ostrum and Sophie Swartzmiller.

The Gymbacks return to Fayetteville to host the Auburn Tigers on Sunday, January 18 at Bud Walton Arena. The meet is slated to begin at 5 p.m. CT and will air live on SEC Network.

Recording the second-highest opening score in program history, No. 11 Auburn defeated No. 23 NC State 197.150-196.075 on January 9 at Neville Arena in the First Meet on the Plains.

Julianne Huff won the all-around, scoring 9.875 on vault, 9.775 in her collegiate bars debut, and two more career highs, 9.825 on beam and 9.9 on floor to total 39.375.

Beginning on vault, freshman Mia Leverton debuted with a 9.850, a score Marissa Neal equaled in her collegiate vault debut. Sophia Bell made program history with Auburn's first Yurchenko double, scoring a 9.925. Paige Zancan anchored and scored a 9.975 with her unique vault, helping Auburn open with a 49.475 in the first rotation.

Moving to bars for the second rotation, Neal led off with a career-best 9.875. Freshman Charlotte Booth made her much-anticipated Auburn debut and scored a 9.8, a score Greaves duplicated in the next spot. Alex Irvine anchored with a 9.75 to give the Tigers a 49.0 in the event.

On beam in the third rotation, Ahern and Neal bookended with 9.85s. Greaves, Huff and Hannah Hagle each scored 9.825s to give Auburn a 49.175 for the event.

In the floor finale, Bartman led off with a career-high 9.85, a score Ahern matched in the third spot. The Tigers finished with a flourish, getting Huff's 9.9 and career-high 9.95s from Greaves and Bell to score a meet-high 49.5 in the rotation.

Auburn begins SEC competition next Sunday, January 18, when the Tigers travel to Fayetteville, Arkansas, to compete against the Razorbacks at 5 p.m. CT on SEC Network in Bud Walton Arena.

Florida opened its season on January 9 with a big performance, rolling to a quad-meet victory behind the second-highest season-opening score in program history and the current national leader at the Exactech Arena at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

The preseason No. 3 Gators posted a 197.725 to win Kids Night presented by GFL Environmental, finishing just shy of the program's opening-meet record of 197.75 set in 2023. North Carolina, ranked No. 24 in the preseason, finished second with a 196.675, followed by Temple (193.875) and West Virginia (193.45) in front of a crowd of 7,237.

Florida gymnasts equaled 2026 national highs to win three meet event titles. Sophomore Ly Bui equaled her collegiate best of 9.925 to win her first vault title. Senior All-American Selena Harris-Miranda set the season's high of 9.95 for uneven bars and matched the high of 9.975 for beam.

Florida starts SEC action with a home meet on Friday, January 16 versus Alabama. The Tide are the first of four teams that advanced to the 2025 NCAA Championships site on the Gators' schedule. It is also the first of seven regular-season televised meets as Friday's meet airs live on ESPN2.

The No. 12 Georgia GymDogs recorded a 197.000 to defeat No. 21 Ohio State in Columbus, Ohio on January 10 at the Covelli Center, 197.000-196.250. This score marks the Bulldogs' first 197.000 season opener since 2007 against Stanford (197.375).

Junior Lily Smith led the way with first-place finishes on bars (9.875), beam (9.925), and floor (9.950), earning co-champion honors on bars and beam alongside freshman Kelise Woolford. Smith was a 2025 floor All-American.

Junior Ady Wahl claimed the vault title with a 9.900, marking her 10th career finish of 9.900 or higher on the event. The Zanesville, Ohio native added a 9.775 on bars (tied-7th) and 9.850 on floor (tied-6th). Wahl was a 2025 vault All-American.

Junior Ja' Free Scott and sophomore Nyla Aquino each notched a 9.850 on the vault apparatus to tie for second in the event.

All five of Georgia's freshmen made their NCAA debuts against the Buckeyes. Woolford earned co-champion honors on bars (9.875) and beam (9.925), tying Smith in each event. CaMarah Williams scored a 9.900 on floor to place fifth, while Autumn Reingold finished fourth on bars with a 9.850. Brooke Pierson and Avery Moll both made their collegiate debuts on vault.

Sophomore Harley Tomlin posted a career-high 9.875 on beam to finish fourth in the event. Tomlin also made her NCAA debut on the floor, opening the rotation for Georgia with a 9.825.

Georgia Gymnastics will compete in Stegeman Coliseum for the first time of 2026, hosting No. 2 LSU at 7 p.m. on Friday, January 16 in Athens, Ga.

No. 9 Kentucky opened its 2026 season with a fourth-place finish at the Sprouts Farmers Market Collegiate Quad in West Valley City, Utah. No. 14 Michigan took home the team title with a 197.225, with No. 20 Cal placing second with a 196.350, No. 6 Michigan State in third with a 196.225 and the Wildcats posting a 194.925.

Two Wildcats took home individual event titles, with sophomore Anna Flynn Cashion returning to competition with a win on vault and junior Delaynee Rodriguez claiming the all-around victory.

Cashion's event win marks the second victory of her collegiate career, with both coming on vault at the Sprouts Farmers Market Collegiate Quad. After missing the second half of the 2025 season, Cashion vaulted in competition for the first time in over 11 months, scoring a 9.875 to defend her title.

Rodriguez won her fifth career event title and third in the all-around with a 39.400 in her season debut. She posted the highest score for Kentucky on three of four rotations, including a 9.900 on the uneven bars and a 9.875 on the balance beam.

The Wildcats will open their home campaign on Friday, January 16 taking on Arizona State for Excite Night, presented by White, Greer, & Maggard, at Historic Memorial Coliseum at 7 p.m. ET.

The LSU Gymnastics team opened the 2026 season with a solid 197.500 performance on January 10 in the first session of the third annual Sprouts Farmers Market Collegiate Quad.

The Tigers finished the meet tied in first with Oklahoma, who won the session after a tiebreaker was conducted that counted all six scores from each event and resulted in an Oklahoma win.

LSU's 197.500 on the day was their second-highest score for an away opener in program history, only trailing last year's 197.650 score at the Sprouts Quad in Tulsa.

In the first meet of her sophomore season, Kailin Chio wasted no time and took home the all-around title with her total of 39.600 on the day. She took home a share of the beam title with her 9.950 and finished third on floor with her 9.900. Fifth-year senior transfer Courtney Blackson also finished the meet tied for first on bars with her score of 9.950, claiming her first individual title as a Tiger.

Five gymnasts made their LSU debuts in the Maverik Center. Freshman Nina Ballou and sophomore Victoria Roberts made their collegiate debuts while transfers Blackson, senior Emily Innes and junior transfer Madison Ulrich made their first appearances as Tigers.

The Tigers will continue their road action on Friday, January 16, as they take on Georgia at 6 p.m. CT on SEC Network inside Stegman Coliseum.

Against the Cyclones, Hannah Horton earned event titles on bars (9.925), floor (9.925) and vault (9.875) to open her junior season. Addison Lawrence notched the event title on beam with 9.950, her third time reaching or exceeding the score in her career. Kimarra Echols earned the all-around title in her collegiate debut, scoring 38.650, highlighted by a 9.900 on bars. The Tigers saw three of their four leadoff positions score 9.900 and hit the threshold nine times.

Mizzou then placed first at the Ameritas Master's Classic with a score of 197.275, beating out No. 27 Nebraska (194.600), Wisconsin-La Crosse (192.075) and Wisconsin-Stout (184.675) at Bob Devaney Sports Center in Lincoln, Nebraska, on January 10.

Horton earned event titles on vault and floor, posting a 9.975 on vault and a 9.925 on floor. Lawrence earned the top score on balance beam with her second-straight 9.950 on the apparatus. Echols posted a 9.925 to earn the uneven bars title, topping her best score from the season opener.

The Tigers return to Mizzou Arena for their upcoming home meet against preseason No. 1 Oklahoma on Friday, January 16 at 7:45 p.m. The meet will be nationally televised on SEC Network.

In a meet that came down to a tiebreaker and counting all six scores on every event, the Oklahoma women's gymnastics team took home the title in the afternoon session of the Sprouts Farmers Market Collegiate Quad.

Oklahoma and LSU tied for first with a 197.500. With the sixth counting score on all four events, the Sooners came out on top by over a point with a 236.700-235.575 advantage. UCLA finished in third with a 197.000 and Utah finished fourth with a 195.900.

Junior Hannah Scheible and senior Faith Torrez earned matching 9.95s on beam to share the title with LSU's Kailin Chio. Freshman Mackenzie Estep shared the floor title with UCLA's Jordan Chiles with a 9.925.

Conference action gets underway on Friday, January 16, as the Sooners head to Columbia, Mo., for a national championship rematch with Missouri. This will be the Sooners' first trip to Mizzou since 2012, when the squads were members of the Big 12 Conference.
