Alabama gymnastics is No. 8 in the 2026 Women's Collegiate Gymnastics Association (WCGA) Preseason Poll.

All 11 regular-season opponents for the Tide reached postseason competition in 2025, with four of those advancing to the NCAA Championships. Alabama will open its season on January 9 in Clemson, S.C. against the Clemson Tigers, who advanced to the Tuscaloosa Regional a season ago. The Tide will then open SEC competition with the Florida Gators on January 16 in Gainesville, Fla.

After two consecutive weeks of competition in Coleman Coliseum (Missouri on January 23 and Oregon State on January 30), Alabama will travel to Norman, Okla. to face the Oklahoma Sooners, the defending National Champion, for a dual meet on February 6. The Tide will close the month of February with back-to-back road meets against Auburn (February 20) and LSU (February 27) before closing its road slate at Illinois (March 8).

Alabama adds seven newcomers to its 2026 roster. The incoming freshmen class includes Kennedy Cochran, Leigh Anne Elliott, Ella Sloane Griffin, Kate LaCoursiere, Ella Kate Parker, Avery Schlichting and Addison Sarisky.

The Gymbacks will start the season ranked as a top-10 team for the second consecutive year, as Arkansas checked in at No. 10 in the WCGA preseason coaches' poll.

The ranking is the second-highest preseason outlook under head coach Jordyn Wieber, second in the top 10, and sixth in the top 15.

The Gymbacks are coming off another impressive season, in which they finished No. 12 in the country in 2025. Arkansas posted four top-10 victories, including knocking off the No. 2 team twice – LSU on January 24 and Florida on February 7. Their upset over LSU was the highest ranked for the program since 2011.

Arkansas returns several standouts this season, including sophomore Joscelyn Roberson. Roberson ended the season at NCAA Championships, where she competed as an all-around individual and scored a 39.425, the best-ever mark by an Arkansas freshman at nationals.

The Gymbacks also see redshirt junior Lauren Williams and fifth-year trio Frankie Price, Leah Smith and Cami Weaver back in action for 2026. Williams was sidelined due to injury in 2025 but had a great rookie campaign in 2024 that included All-SEC vault honors. Smith earned all-conference on floor and Weaver on beam in 2024, and both shared All-American honors at nationals. Price has been one of the nation's best vault and floor performers throughout her collegiate career. She sustained an injury in Arkansas' regional semifinal in April but looks to come back with a bang for her final season. Price was a WCGA Second Team All-American and All-SEC on floor in 2024.

Along with Arkansas' key returners, the team also adds eight outstanding newcomers to the team. Two transfers – sophomore Madison Gustitus and senior Morgan Price – and six freshmen – Addison Bare, Bradley Burton, Avalon Campbell, Avery King and Riley Jandorf round out the roster.

The Auburn gymnastics team is set to kick off the 2026 season ranked No. 11 as voted on by members of the Women's Collegiate Gymnastics Association.

Five of Auburn's six non-conference opponents are ranked among the Top 36. That includes No. 6 Michigan State, No. 19 Clemson, No. 23 NC State, No. 24 North Carolina and No. 32 Boise State.

In the squad's preview meet in December, leading the way were juniors Julianne Huff, Olivia Greaves and Emma Wehry as the three competed in all four events. Wehry, a transfer from West Virginia, and Greaves shined on beam and floor, while Huff put together three strong routines on vault, bars and floor.

Senior Hannah Hagle and junior Alex Irvine did three events for the squad, while sophomores Olivia Ahern, Bryn Bartman, Sophia Bell and Marissa Neal did two. Bell debuted her double on vault and closed out the night as anchor on floor, while Ahern and Neal were rock solid once again on beam. Irvine made her first appearance on floor as an Auburn Tiger and she and Bartman showcased solid bars routines.

The home crowd got to see four freshmen make their debut in Neville Arena in Charlotte Booth, Adriana Consoli, Mia Leverton and Rebekah Smith. Booth competed on bars, beam and floor, while Leverton did vault and floor. Consoli shined on beam and Smith anchored vault in the first rotation.

The Tigers open up the season hosting No. 23 NC State on January 9. The two teams will go head-to-head at 7 p.m. CT in Neville Arena.

Florida opens the 2026 season ranked No. 3 in the Women's Collegiate Gymnastics Association (WCGA) preseason poll.

The nation's preseason top five has included the Gators every season since 2007.

Each of Florida's five home meets include at least one preseason top-25 opponents. The 2026 season starts January 9 with a quad meet that includes No. 24 North Carolina, West Virginia and Temple.

The Exactech Arena is the site for four top-10 duals, and Florida's road schedule includes four dates at preseason top-12 teams.

The 18-member 2026 Gator team includes eight All-Americans with 41 All-America honors. The senior class includes Lori Brubach and a trio of All-Americans with eMjae Frazier, Selena Harris-Miranda and Riley McCusker.

The Gators' biggest class are the six juniors: Skylar Draser, and All-Americans Alyssa Arana, Gabby Disidore, Danie Ferris and Anya Pilgrim. Returning to competition this season after taking a gap year in 2024 to pursue an Olympic berth and last season to recover from injury is All-American and 2023 SEC Freshman of the Year Kayla DiCello.

Four sophomores return this season: Skye Blakely, Lily Bruce, Ly Bui and Taylor Clark. Four freshmen join the Gators this season – Jayla Booker, Amelia Disidore, Maddy Dorbin and Jocelyn Sasson.

The GymDogs will make seven national television appearances during the 2026 regular season. The slate includes six contests on SEC Network, three of which will broadcast from Stegeman Coliseum. These meets include the home opener against LSU on Friday, January 16 at 7 p.m., their matchup against Auburn on Sunday, February 1 at 7 p.m. and their competition against Florida on Friday, February 20 at 7 p.m.

All other Georgia gymnastics home meets will be streamed on the SEC Network +.

On the road, Georgia will appear on Friday night linear television against Oklahoma on January 23 at 7 p.m., Arkansas on February 6 at 7 p.m. and Kentucky on February 27 at 7 p.m.

The GymDogs will then head to Huntsville, Ala. on March 8 for the Elevate the Stage quad meet, facing Clemson, Pittsburgh and Auburn at 4 p.m. ET in the Von Braun Center. The contest will broadcast live on ACC Network.

Kentucky has earned a top ten ranking in the Women's Collegiate Gymnastics Association (WCGA) preseason poll for the third consecutive season, slotting at No. 9 for the 2026 season.

This marks the fifth time in program history that the Wildcats have garnered preseason top 10 status, joining 2018, 2019, 2024, and 2025. Since 2018, Kentucky has not been ranked lower than No. 13 in the preseason poll.

The Wildcats return 11 gymnasts from a 2025 squad that advanced to the program's sixth consecutive regional final, including All-American Creslyn Brose, all-arounder Delaynee Rodriguez, and contributors Chesney Bennett, Anna Flynn Cashion, Sharon Lee, Ryan Noonan, Isabella Rivelli, and Cecily Rizo.

New to the 2026 team are seven freshmen and one transfer. National Champion Gabby Van Frayen leads a freshman squad that features six USA Gymnastics Development Program National Championship qualifiers. All-EAGL vaulter Callie Gardner transferred into the program after one season at Towson.

The Wildcats will begin the 2026 campaign at the Sprouts Farmers Market Collegiate Quad in West Valley City, Utah on Saturday, January 10. Kentucky will compete in Session II at 8 p.m. ET on ESPN2, facing Michigan State, Michigan, and California. Oklahoma, LSU, UCLA, and Utah will compete in Session I at 4 p.m. ET.

The Wildcats will open their home campaign a week later, taking on Arizona State for Excite Night, presented by White, Greer, & Maggard, at Historic Memorial Coliseum on Friday, January 16 at 7 p.m. ET.

LSU Gymnastics is set to open the 2026 season ranked No. 2 by the Women's Collegiate Gymnastics Association.

LSU tallied 1,859 points and five first-place votes in the pre-season coaches poll, marking the second consecutive year that the Tigers will begin the season ranked No. 2 nationally and third consecutive season at No. 3 or higher.

The Tigers have not placed lower than No. 6 in the pre-season coaches poll over the last 14 years, as they have been amongst the top five teams in the nation in 13 of their last 14 seasons, dating back to 2014.

LSU is coming off back-to-back SEC Championships and a SEC regular-season title in 2025 under head coach Jay Clark, who enters his sixth season at the helm. The Tigers will face one of the toughest schedules in the country, highlighted by multiple matchups against preseason top-15 opponents.

The 2026 season opens with a marquee quad meet on Saturday, January 10, as LSU competes in the third-annual Sprouts Farmers Market Collegiate Quad in West Valley City, Utah, alongside No. 1 Oklahoma, No. 4 UCLA and No. 5 Utah. The meet will air live on ABC.

LSU's first SEC meet on television will come on Friday, January 16, when the squad travels to face No. 12 Georgia as part of an SEC Network Friday Night Heights doubleheader.

The Tigers will return home the following week for their home opener inside the Pete Maravich Assembly Center. LSU will host No. 9 Kentucky on Friday, January 23 at 7:30 p.m. CT on ESPN2.

Mizzou gymnastics is the No. 7 team in the country according to the 2026 Women's Collegiate Gymnastics Association (WCGA) preseason poll.

This marks the highest preseason ranking in program history for the Tigers, who were also one of five teams to earn multiple first-place votes. After a 2025 campaign that saw Mizzou finish third in the nation, the Black & Gold has now slotted in the WCGA preseason top 10 in three of the last four seasons. Missouri's previous high was No. 9 in 2023 and 2025.

In the Tigers' first year competing primarily in Mizzou Arena, Missouri opens the season by hosting Iowa State on January 4. The home schedule also features top-three opponents Oklahoma, LSU and Florida, along with No. 31 Illinois, Ball State (receiving votes) and Air Force (receiving votes) in the Mizzou Quad and capped off with No. 10 Arkansas in Hearnes Center on Senior Day.

In Welker's 13th season leading the program, the Tigers welcome four highly touted freshmen and a trio of accomplished transfers. Seven gymnasts from the historic 2025 season also return, highlighted by four WCGA All-Americans in Hannah Horton, Olivia Kelly, Addison Lawrence and Elise Tisler, along with WCGA Regular Season All-American Kennedy Griffin.

The seven-time and reigning national champion Oklahoma women's gymnastics team was tabbed as the No. 1 team in the WCGA Preseason Poll.

This is the eighth time in program history that Oklahoma was voted as the No. 1 team in the preseason poll and fourth straight season. The Sooners have been ranked in the top five by the WCGA for 16 consecutive seasons. Since head coach K.J. Kindler's first season in 2007, the Sooners have been ranked in the preseason top 10 every year.

Coming off a season that saw the Sooners bring home their seventh national championship, the 2026 squad returns the No. 1 all-arounder in the nation in Faith Torrez, alongside All-Americans Addison Fatta, Elle Mueller and Lily Pederson. The Sooners brought in the No. 1 signing class in the nation in Nicole Desmond, Mackenzie Estep, Ella Murphy, Kamila Pawlak and Blakely Roten.

OU welcomes four top 25 teams to Lloyd Noble Center in 2026, with one of the most anticipated dual meets of the season slated for February 20 against No. 2 LSU. Also traveling to Norman are No. 8 Alabama, No. 11 Auburn and No. 12 Georgia.

On the road, the Sooners face six ranked teams, including four preseason top-10 SEC foes. OU travels to No. 3 Florida, No. 7 Missouri, No. 9 Kentucky, No. 10 Arkansas and No. 14 Michigan and faces No. 18 Arizona at the Metroplex Challenge in Fort Worth Texas.
