### SEC GYMNASTICS WEEKLY HONORS PRESENTED BY ALLSTATE

**SEC Gymnast of the Week** – Alabama’s Azaraya Ra-Akbar, a freshman from Baltimore, Md., recorded the top all-around score of the week in the SEC and tied the second-best mark in the nation this season with a 39.600 at No. Florida this past weekend. In addition to finishing first in the all-around, Azaraya Ra-Akbar claimed a share of the titles for vault (9.925) and floor (9.90) and was runner-up on the bars (9.95). As the anchor on Alabama’s opening two rotations, she became the only SEC gymnast to post back-to-back scores of at least 9.925 in anchor positions.

**SEC Co-Specialists of the Week** – Arkansas’ Lauren Williams, a redshirt junior from Rogers, Ark., registered a 9.975 in the Razorbacks’ opening rotation on vault in the win over No. 6 Auburn. Williams captured the vault title by matching the individual program record set by four other Gymbacks and currently leads the nation with her average of 9.938. She also made her first appearance of the season on floor and recorded a 9.850, good for a share of fourth place.

Florida’s Selena Harris-Miranda, a senior from Las Vegas, Nev., won two event titles in her three events in the win over No. 4 Alabama on Friday. Harris-Miranda earned the beam title outright with a 9.95 and a share of the vault title with a 9.925. She also recorded a 9.90 on bars to be the only non-all-rounder in the SEC to post three marks of 9.90 or better for the week.

**SEC Freshman of the Week** – Oklahoma’s Ella Murphy, a freshman from Frisco, Texas, won her first collegiate event title with a 9.85 on bars in the win at No. 7 Missouri. Murphy also came in second on beam with her second consecutive 9.925, which currently has her ranked eighth in the nation in the event. She made her floor debut with a 9.875 in the No. 2 spot, helping the Sooners to a 49.275 on the event. All three of Murphy’s scores counted to help the Sooners to victory over the Tigers.

Despite leading the top-ranked Florida Gators through the opening two rotations, the No. 4 Alabama gymnastics team came up short on January 16 in Gainesville, falling 197.425 – 197.275.

The Crimson Tide's uneven bars rotation highlighted the night, as the bars squad recorded a 49.550 rotation score – tied for the second-highest score on the event in the nation, at the time of the meet.

Standout freshman Azaraya Ra-Akbar made her all-around debut for Alabama, registering a 39.600 score to claim the all-around title. Teammate Chloe LaCoursiere added an event title, on the uneven bars, behind a career-high 9.975 performance on the apparatus.

Alabama will open its home slate of competition Friday, January 23, against the Missouri Tigers. The meet will begin at 6:30 p.m. CT and will stream live on SEC Network+.

The No. 10 Gymbacks opened their 2026 home slate on January 18 and came out on top over No. 6 Auburn, 197-250-196.075.

Arkansas won at least a share of all the event titles, save for floor. The day began on a very high note as redshirt junior Lauren Williams scored a 9.975 on vault, which tied for the program individual record. Freshman Allison Cucci continued her solid start to her collegiate career and tied for the bars title with a score of 9.900. Sophomore Joscelyn Roberson delivered her standard excellence on beam with a 9.950 for the event crown.

In her second Arkansas all-around performance, Morgan Price tallied a 39.475, good for first place and just .025 off her career high (39.500). Hailey Klein also competed all-around and scored 39.225, her career high and good for third place.

Redshirt senior Frankie Price returned to the floor lineup for the first time since sustaining an ankle injury in the regional finals last spring, and she earned a 9.875, Arkansas' highest floor score of the day.

The Gymbacks stay at home for a non-conference meet against SE Missouri on Friday, January 23 at 7:15 p.m. at Bud Walton Arena. The contest will be broadcast live on SEC Network+.

Highlighting the evening were the performances from sophomore Sophia Bell and junior Alex Irvine. The pair scored a 9.9 or better in each of their respective events as Bell won floor and Irvine earned a share of the bars title.

In addition, sophomore Marissa Neal made her debut in the all-around for the Tigers, finishing second with a 39.250.

Juniors Julianne Huff and Olivia Greaves also competed in the all-around for the Tigers as Huff put together a 39.150 and Greaves combined for a 38.875.

Auburn will host Florida on Friday, January 23. The meet is set for 7:45 p.m. CT in Neville Arena and will be televised on SEC Network.

Florida won or shared three event titles. Senior All-American Selena Harris-Miranda captured her second consecutive balance beam title with a 9.95 and shared the vault win with Alabama’s Azaraya Ra-Akbar at 9.925. Florida’s Taylor Clark and Amelia Disidore shared the floor exercise title at 9.90 with Ra-Akbar and Jamison Sears of Alabama.

Ra-Akbar won the all-around at 39.60, while Alabama’s Chloe LaCoursiere posted the meet’s highest score, a 9.975, to win the uneven bars.

Florida starts SEC road action on Friday, January 23 at Auburn. The Tigers are among the eight league teams among the January 12 Road to Nationals top 10. The meet airs on the SEC Network.

The No. 8 Georgia GymDogs defeated No. 2 LSU, 197.200-196.850, to win their home opener in front of a sold-out crowd on January 16 in Stegeman Coliseum.

This marks the first win over LSU since February 13, 2016, and the first top-five-ranked win at home since March 11, 2017 (Utah).

Junior Lily Smith notched a 9.950 on bars to tie for first on the event. Senior Ja’Free Scott came close behind, tying for second on bars with a 9.900. Smith and Scott both secured season highs with their performances.

Smith also executed a 9.950 on floor to take second in the event, followed closely by freshman CaMarah Williams and sophomore Nyla Aquino, who each recorded a 9.925. Williams and Aquino tied for second.

Junior Holly Snyder led the Bulldogs on the beam, tying for first with a score of 9.925. This was only Snyder’s second career routine on the event and her second consecutive 9.925.

Freshman Avery Mall and junior Nyla Aquino each posted a 9.900 on vault to tie for second in the event, marking a season high for both athletes.

Georgia heads to Norman, Okla., on Friday, January 23, for a dual meet against Oklahoma. The meet will begin at 7 p.m. ET and will air on SEC Network live from the Lloyd Noble Center.

In front of a sold-out crowd of 5,926 members of Big Blue Nation, Kentucky dropped a 195.750-194.325 decision to Arizona State on January 16.

Anna Flynn Cashion and Delaynee Rodriguez combined for three of four individual event titles, as well as the all-around title, at Excite Night, presented by White, Greer & Maggard.

Cashion claimed the vault title for the second time in as many weeks to open the season, matching her career high with a 9.950. Rodriguez took home crowns on the balance beam, floor exercise and all-around. She finished the night with a 39.400 across all events for the second week in a row, taking home the overall win for the second time in 2026 and fourth time in her career. Rodriguez also added scores of 9.850 on beam and 9.875 on floor to take home two more wins, claiming the first event victories of her career on both apparatuses.

Kentucky will return to the road next week, traveling to Baton Rouge to face LSU at 7:30 p.m. ET on Friday, January 23, airing on ESPN2. The Cats will then return to Lexington to host defending national champion Oklahoma at 6 p.m. ET on Friday, January 30, live on SEC Network.

The No. 2 LSU Gymnastics team fell on the road against No. 8 Georgia by a score of 197.200-196.850 on January 16 inside Stegeman Coliseum. It was Georgia's first win over LSU since 2016.

The team took home four individual event titles on the night. Sophomore Kailin Chio put together a standout performance, outright winning the vault and beam titles. Junior Konnor McClain also finished the meet tied for first on bars with her 9.950. Junior Madison Ulrich's 39.275 on the night earned her the first all-around title of her LSU career.

Chio added two more titles to her resume following her performance in the Tigers' season opener, where she also claimed two titles on beam and the all-around last weekend. The sophomore is now at 27 in her career, with seven of those coming on vault and five on beam. McClain claimed her 15th title win and eighth on bars.

LSU is back in action on Friday, January 23 to host Kentucky for its 2026 home opener in the PMAC at 6:30 p.m. CT, live on ESPN2.

The No. 2 Oklahoma women's gymnastics team opened SEC action with a 197.425-196.925 win over No. 7 Missouri on January 16 inside Mizzou Arena in Columbia, Mo.

The Sooners returned to Missouri for the first time since 2012 and improved to 29-0 against the Tigers since 2004 with the win.

A trio of Sooners shared the vault title with Elizabeth Blessey, Keira Wells and Mackenzie Estep earning matching 9.925s. Ella Murphy won the bars title with a 9.850, while Faith Torrez won the beam title with her second straight score of 9.950.

The Sooners will return to the friendly confines of Lloyd Noble Center for the first time since 2025 on Friday, January 23. Oklahoma will welcome Georgia for a meet with a 5:45 p.m. start on SEC Network. Prior to the meet, OU will raise its championship banner to honor the 2025 national championship team.
