TOUCH WARMUPS

- Friday's meet serve's as Kentucky's annual Excite Night. The Cats have claimed victory at every Excite Night since 2016.
- Delaynee Rodriguez and Anna Flynn Cashion won event titles at Sprouts Farmers Market Collegiate Quad, with Rodriguez claiming the AA and Cashion winning VT.
- Kentucky had the highest Vault score of Session II at the Quad, scoring a 49.100. The Cats have scored 49+ in every vault rotation since January 22, 2021.
- Nine of Kentucky's 24 Week 1 routines saw athletes compete on an event for the first time as a Wildcat. Including returns from long absences on an event and new vaults, that number rises to 13/24.
- Two freshman made their collegiate debut for the Cats on Saturday--Addie Hofseth and Gabby Van Frayen.
- The Wildcats have not counted a fall since February 25, 2022 at Auburn--1,421 days ago.
- The Wildcats finished the 2025 season ranked No. 10, securing a top ten final finish for the fourth consecutive season.
- Kentucky lost 52% (164/312) of its routines from a season ago, graduating six seniors--five of whom were All-Americans.
- The Wildcats will host an NCAA Regional this season for the first time since 2010, joining LSU, Arizona State, and Oregon State as host sites.
- Cecily Rizo competed her first career collegiate all-around in the opener, including matching a career-high during her first beam routine since Feb. 2024.
- Ryan Noonan and Delaynee Rodriguez are both competing upgraded vaults this season. Noonan matched her career high with a 9.850 in Week 1.
- All-American Cresslyn Brose leads 11 returning Wildcats.
- Since Regionals expanded to a two-day format in 2019, UK has advanced to the regional final in all six seasons.
- Kentucky has advanced to NCAA Regionals in all 14 seasons under Head Coach Tim Garrison.
- All 12 of Kentucky's regular season opponents rank inside the WCGA Preseason Top 25--including all nine SEC teams inside the top 12.
- Gabby Van Frayen enters her freshman season at Kentucky after claiming BB victories at USA Gymnastics DP Nationals and Nastia Liukin Cup.

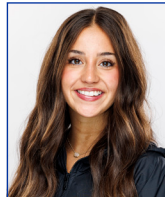
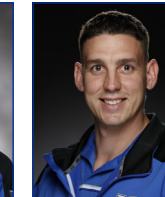

DO IT ALL D-ROD

Delaynee Rodriguez made a statement in her season debut, winning the all-around title at the Sprouts Farmers Market Collegiate Quad with a 39.400, scoring 9.8+ all four events, and leading the Cats in three of four rotations. Rodriguez is set to compete an upgraded vault (Yurchenko 1.5) and anchored the Cats on UB, BB, and FX. In her career, Rodriguez has scored 9.8+ in 88/104 routines. During her sophomore year, Rodriguez set or matched career highs on three events (VT, BB, FX) and the all-around--including a career-best 39.525 in the NCAA Pennsylvania Regional Final.

CONSISTENT CATS

Kentucky have not counted a fall in over three full years, last occurring for the Cats on February 25, 2022 at Auburn. Additionally, Kentucky has scored 49+ on Vault in every meet since January 22, 2021 at Mizzou.

EXCITE NIGHT

Friday's meet will serve as Kentucky Gymnastics' annual Excite Night meet. After moving to the second home meet in 2025 to facilitate the soft opening of the renovated Historic Memorial Coliseum, the event returns to its traditional spot in the calendar as the Wildcats' home opener. Kentucky has claimed victory on Excite Night in every season since 2016. In fact, the last time Kentucky lost on Excite Night, Arizona State was in town. The Cats hosted a tri-meet for Excite Night 2015, defeating the Sun Devils despite falling to LSU.

THE PERFECT (B)ROSE

Junior Creslyn Brose became the fourth Kentucky gymnast in program history to score a perfect 10.0, achieving the mark on March 7, 2025 against Arkansas. Her perfect mark was the program's 11th all-time on floor and 36th all-time across all events. The junior has displayed tremendous consistency on the event, with 22 of her 25 career floor routines scoring 9.9 or higher. Brose has earned All-America honors on the event in each of her first two seasons in Lexington and qualified to the 2025 NCAA National Championships as an Individual Event Specialist after claiming the 2025 NCAA Pennsylvania Regional floor title.

LOST PRODUCTION

Kentucky will be looking to replace over half of its lineup spots from 2025, with 164 or 312 competed routines graduating the program. In total, six seniors departed from the 2025 roster, with five of them earning at least one All-America honor during their career. (Hailey Davis, Skylar Killough-Wilhelm, Isabella Magnelli, Jillian Procasky, and Makenzie Wilson)

DEBUTS ON DEBUTS ON DEBUTS

Nine Kentucky routines in Week 1 saw athletes compete on an event for the first time as a Wildcat: Bennett (UB, FX), Gardner (VT, FX), Hofseth (VT), Rivelli (FX), Van Frayen (UB, BB, FX). The first four floor routines on Saturday were all competed by Wildcats making their collegiate debut on the event.

GVF = FUTURE BEAM QUEEN?

Gabby Van Frayen leads a freshman class of seven athletes, coming to Lexington as the 2025 USA DP Nationals and 2025 Nastia Liukin Cup Balance Beam Champion. In her collegiate debut, Van Frayen scored a 9.850 on beam--her first routine of the night--while also featuring on bars and floor. Van Frayen scored a 10.0 on beam during her club career and was named a Five Star Recruit by College Gym News. The Lewis Center, Ohio native also competed Elite gymnastics during her youth career, winning the 2022 Junior Winter Cup title on the balance beam.

RIZO'S RODEO

Competing in every single meet during her first two years on campus, Cecily Rizo has competed all four events at one time or another, despite never completing an all-around. However, Rizo competed her first career collegiate all-around at the Sprouts Farmers Market Collegiate Quad, even tying her career high on beam after not competing the event since February 2024.

At the 2025 NCAA Pennsylvania Regional Final, Rizo matched career high scores on both vault and floor while competing in three events in one meet for just the fourth time in her career.

AFC <3 SFM

Anna Flynn Cashion made her return from injury at the Sprouts Farmers Market Collegiate Quad, opening her season with a vault title at the meet for the second straight season. Cashion defended her title from last year, where she won the meet with a 9.950 in her collegiate debut. The two wins constitute the only event titles in her young career. In fact, Cashion only competed in three meets in her freshman year due to injury.

RETURN FROM INJURY

Junior Cadence Gormley made her return to competition for the first time since Week 3 of the 2024 season in Week 1 at the Sprouts Farmers Market Collegiate Quad. Competing three beam routines and two bars routines to begin her collegiate career, Gormley has not competed for nearly two years due to injury. In her first routine back, Gormley fought hard to stay on the beam and preserve the Cats' 'not counting a fall' streak. If she is in the lineup on Friday, Gormley will make her debut in front of BBN--never competing at a home meet in her time at UK. In addition to her work as an athlete, Gormley has choreographed some of her teammates' routines and also works in the UK Sports Video department.

NEW SKILLS, NO PROBLEM

Sophomore Ryan Noonan started her sophomore campaign with a solid performance at the Sprouts Farmers Market Collegiate Quad, scoring 9.8+ on both of her events. Competing an upgraded vault from last season, Noonan matched her career high--set at the same meet in 2025--with a 9.850. Also competing a completely different bars composition from a season ago, Noonan delivered another solid routine with a 9.800.

SEASON TICKETS

Kentucky has set a new program record for season tickets sold ahead of the 2026 season. After selling out two meets in 2025, Big Blue Nation is once again ready to pack Historic Memorial Coliseum for Friday Night Heights.

LONE SENIOR

Isabella Rivelli, Kentucky's only senior on roster, is set to enter her second year at Kentucky after competing at Bowling Gree for her first two seasons. Making the step up from the MAC to the SEC, Rivelli featured as Kentucky's bars leadoff for most of 2025. Making her NCAA Regional debut, Rivelli scored a season high 9.900 on the bars at the 2025 NCAA Pennsylvania Regional Semifinal and score 9.850 or better four times last season.

SHAR-ING THE LOVE

Sharon Lee blossomed into one of the nation's best kept secrets on the balance beam in 2025. After not competing once during her freshman season, Lee earned her spot in the beam lineup during Kentucky's second meet of the season last year--scoring a 9.900 in her collegiate debut. Lee would feature in the lineup for the rest of the season, scoring 9.850+ seven times and closing her campaign with a personal best 9.950 at the 2025

NCAA Pennsylvania Regional Final. That mark was the best score of the day at one of the most competitive regionals in the country and was Lee's first career event win.

PORTAL +1

Sophomore Callie Gardner is the only incoming transfer for the Wildcats in 2026. Gardner started her career at Towson, where she scored a career best 9.900 on vault and was named to the EAGL All-Tournament Team during her debut collegiate season. In her club career, Gardner won the bronze medal on vault at the 2024 USA Gymnastics DP Nationals and won South Carolina state titles on vault and floor.

DREAM BEAM TEAM

Kentucky returns four of its six beam competitors from 2025--the most of any event. In addition to the high return rate, the 2025 beam team matched the program record with a 49.575 at Florida on March 14. All four returners--Chesney Bennett, Creslyn Brose, Sharon Lee, and Delaynee Rodriguez--have all scored at least a 9.9 on the apparatus.

NEW FACES

Freshman compose the largest class on the Kentucky roster, with seven gymnasts entering their first year of collegiate gymnastics. Of the seven, six have qualified for DP Nationals and five have won state titles. Including transfer Callie Gardner, there are eight newcomers on the 2026 roster.

SUPER SOPHOMORES

Chesney Bennett, Anna Flynn Cashion, and Ryan Noonan all featured in Wildcat lineups during their freshman seasons in 2025 and are set to star for the Wildcats during their sophomore campaign. Cashion debuted in the most prominent way, scoring a 9.950 on vault to win the Sprouts Farmers Market Collegiate Quad event title before injuries halted her season. Bennett featured in the beam lineup for most of the season and scored a pair of 9.900s (including one at regionals) and Noonan competed on both vault and bars, scoring career bests of 9.850 on both.

PRESEASON TOP TEN

Slotting at No. 9 in the WCGA Preseason Coaches Poll, Kentucky earned the program's fifth preseason top ten ranking, joining 2018, 2019, 2024, and 2025. 2026 marks the third consecutive season in which the Cats have earned this distinction. Since 2018, Kentucky has not been ranked lower than No. 13 in the preseason poll.

FINAL RANKINGS

Kentucky wrapped up its fourth straight top ten finish in 2025, slotting at No. 10 in the final standings. The Cats have finished in the top 13 in every season since 2018 and own five top ten finishes in program history.

POSTSEASON PROWESS

Since the NCAA expanded regional competition to its current multi-day format, Kentucky has made the regional final in every iteration of the championship. Dating to 2017, Kentucky has only finished lower than third in a regional once (2019) and has qualified to both of its appearances at

the NCAA National Semifinals. The Wildcats have also earned a national seed in each of the last eight postseasons, dating to 2017.

HISTORIC MEMORIAL COLISEUM

After a season at Rupp Arena due to \$82 Million dollars of renovations at Historic Memorial Coliseum, the Cats returned to their traditonal home for the entirety of the 2025 season. Last season, over 6,000 fans sold out HMC for meets against Auburn and LSU. In addition to five regular season home meets, HMC will serve host to the 2026 NCAA Lexington Regional, bringing postseason gymnastics back to the venue for the first time since 2010.

TIM GARRISON ERA SUCCESS

Tim Garrison is entering his 15th season as Kentucky’s head coach and the Wildcats success under his guidance has been remarkable. Garrison has led Kentucky to a NCAA Regional every season he has been a head coach. UK has two NCAA Championship appearances in 2018 and 2023. When Garrison was hired, UK’s program-record team score was 196.375, which his teams have matched or surpassed an impressive 87 times under his guidance. Kentucky broke the 198 barrier for the first time in program history on March 3, 2024, scoring 198.100 inside Rupp Arena.

OLYMPIC ARENAS

The Maverik Center will be the third arena in which Kentucky Gymnastics has competed that has hosted Olympic competition. The Wildcats return to the Salt Lake area venue for the first time since placing third at the 2021 NCAA Utah Regional. Maverik Center hosted ice hockey at the Salt Lake 2002 Winter Olympic Games and is also slated to host figure skating during the 2034 games. Pauley Pavilion at UCLA welcomed the Wildcats in 1991 and also hosted gymnastics at the 1984 Los Angeles Games. Stegeman Coliseum at Georgia sees the Cats compete every other year and hosted rhythmic gymnastics and volleyball for the 1996 Atlanta Games.

RETURN TO THE QUAD

Kentucky opened its season at the Sprouts Farmers Market Collegiate Quad for the seconc consecutive season, debuting at the event in the 2025 season at Oklahoma City. In its third season, the quad returns to its original loca- tion at the Maverik Center in West Valley City, Utah. A season ago, the Cats placed second in Session II, defeating No. 8 Arkansas and No. 16 Ohio State while falling to No. 10 UCLA.

HEAD COACH TIM GARRISON



Tim Garrison enters his 15th season as gymnastics head coach at the University of Kentucky in 2026, following more than a decade of unprecedented success at the helm.

Prior to Garrison's tenure, the program's highest single-meet score stood at 196.375 for a full decade. That total has been matched or surpassed 87 times since, including a new program record 198.100 in March 2024.

In 2025, Garrison guided the Wildcats to another historic season. Kentucky finished the regular season ranked No. 9 before closing the season at No. 10 in the

final rankings—the fourth consecutive season with a top ten final ranking. The Wildcats earned a national seed in the 2025 NCAA Gymnastics Championships for the eighth consecutive season and did not count a fall for the third consecutive season. The Wildcats posted the third highest score in program history with a 197.925 performance against Arkansas on Senior Night.

Creslyn Brose earned a perfect 10.0 on floor, becoming the third Wildcat under Garrison—and fourth in program history—to achieve perfection. Isabella Magnelli and Hailey Davis were named to the All-SEC team and Magnelli, Davis, and Brose all garnered All-America honors. Magnelli and Brose also qualified for the 2025 NCAA Gymnastics Championships as Individual Event Specialists, marking the 11th consecutive championship in which a Wildcat has advanced to the national meet.

In the 2024 meet season, Kentucky finished the regular season ranked seventh before closing the season No. 9 overall. Against Florida to finish the homestand in Rupp Arena, Kentucky set a new all-time overall score record with a 198.100. In addition to the new program best, Kentucky also set a record for the best score on the road at the Kidney Care Gymnastics Championship hosted in Nashville, Tenn., 197.925. Kentucky entered the Southeastern Conference in a three-seed for the second consecutive year finishing the meet in third with a 197.600 for the best finish ever at the conference competition. The program celebrated 50 years of Kentucky gymnastics in the 2024 season.

For the first time since Jenny Hansen in the late 1990's, two members of Team 50 earned perfect 10.0's. Makenzie Wilson was awarded two perfect marks on vault while Raena Worley earned three 10.0's on floor and one on bars. In addition to record-setting perfect scores, Kentucky also saw five All-Americans in Arianna Patterson (Second Team Vault), Creslyn Brose (Second Team Floor), Isabella Magnelli (Second Team Beam), Wilson (First Team Vault), and Worley (First Team All-Around, Bars, Floor; Second Team Beam). Magnelli and Worley were named All-SEC while Brose was named SEC All-Freshman. Worley, a two-time AAI Award finalist represented the Cats at Nationals placing second overall on floor (9.9500) while Magnelli placed third overall on beam (9.9500).

2023 was the most accomplished season to date for the Wildcats as Team 49 qualified for nationals for the second time in program history. The program accomplished numerous firsts including the first undefeated homestand since 1984 and first of the Garrison Era. Kentucky made its SEC Championship appearance competing in the evening session for the first time since 2019 entering the meet in a record-setting three-seed and best-tying fourth place finish (197.675). UK did not count a fall all season while being one of three NCAA DI gymnastics program to score 49.000+ in every event in every meet of the season.

Finishing the 2023 season ranked sixth overall, the Cats found themselves repeatedly in the regular-season and postseason awards. Coach Garrison was named SEC Coach of the Year while Rachel Garrison and Chad Wiest were named WCGA Central Region Co-Assistant Coaches of the Year. Isabella Magnelli and Shealyn Luksik were named All-SEC while Magnelli was named Second Team All-American on beam and Worley was named First Team on floor and Second Team all-around. Four Wildcats earned All-America honors following the NCAA Championships (Makenzie Wilson, Jillian Procasky, Magnelli and Worley) with Worley seeing AAI Award finalist and Honda Award finalist honors. She was the first to be honored for both awards since Hansen.

In 2022, Kentucky finished No. 9 in the Road to Nationals All-Around Team National Standings. The Cats made program history with its highest score of 197.750 in the second round of the NCAA Auburn Regional. Worley and Hailey Davis represented the Wildcats at the NCAA National Championships with Worley earning All-American First and Second Team Honors.

In 2021, Kentucky finished No. 11 in the Road to Nationals All-Around Team National Standings after ranking inside the top 15 all season. In addition to tying the best single-meet team score in program history, the Wildcats recorded four total 197-point performances. Kentucky set a new school record for best beam rotation (49.525) and tied its best performance on bars (49.475).

In the postseason, Garrison's Wildcats recorded the program's only first-place finish in an NCAA Regional meet and matched a program-best fourth-place finish at the Southeastern Conference Championships. Worley was named a second-team Women's Collegiate Gymnastics Association Regular Season All-American and earned All-SEC status alongside Josie Angeny, Anna Haigis, Arianna Patterson and Bailey Bunn, who was also part of the SEC All-Freshman Team.

Worley and Bunn continued a program-best streak of seven straight NCAA Championships with at least one individual competitor.

Garrison, the 2018 National Association of Collegiate Gymnastics Coaches/ Women National Coach of the Year, surpassed the 100-win mark as UK head coach on Jan. 17, 2020.

Kentucky began the 2020 season with a ninth consecutive appearance in the WCGA's annual preseason poll at No. 12. The Wildcats were ranked as high No. 10 in the Road to Nationals All-Around Team National Standings, never falling outside the top 13 throughout a season cut short due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Garrison guided 2020 AAI Award Finalist Mollie Korth to a WCGA Regular Season All-America first-team appearance on vault and second-team appearances on bars and all-around in her senior campaign, making her an 11-time All-American in total. Korth became the third athlete in program history designated All-SEC in four straight seasons, while Angeny earned her first All-SEC selection and Worley became the program's seventh all-time SEC All-Freshman honoree.

In 2019, Garrison was named WCGA Region 1 Coach of the Year for the second consecutive season after guiding the Wildcats to a school-record six 197-point performances and a No. 9 ranking with a 394.685 Final National Qualifying Score. Kentucky advanced to a top-16 NCAA Regional Final in the first year of the new NCAA Championship format and participated in the second session of the SEC Championship for the second year in a row. The Cats broke the school record single-meet team score twice with a 197.525 finish versus Central Michigan on March 3 and a 197.600 in the NCAA Athens Regional Final on April 6.

Under Garrison's guidance, seniors Alex Hyland and Sidney Dukes, as well as freshman Cally Nixon, continued Kentucky's program-best streak of six straight seasons with at least one NCAA Championship participant. Hyland was named a second-team WCGA All-American on beam and all-around. a second-team WCGA Regular Season All-American as an all-around competitor, All-SEC on beam, and SEC Co-Scholar Athlete of the Year. Korth was named a second-team WCGA Regular Season All-American on vault and all-around, as well as All-SEC on vault. Angeny was named SEC All-Freshman on beam.

2018 was a breakthrough year for Garrison and his staff, leading Kentucky to both an NCAA Championship appearance and the second session of the SEC Championship for the first time in program history. Garrison and his staff were named the NACGC/W National and Assistant Coaches of the Year.

In 2017, Garrison led Kentucky to an NCAA Regional and secured a No. 2 seed for the first time in program history after a historic Regional Qualifying Score of 196.845 to finish No. 12 in the nation. Garrison coached Korth to SEC Freshman of the Year and NACGC/W All-American honors. Along with Hyland, Korth earned Regular Season All-America honors, while Hyland earned an individual SEC beam title. Kentucky's impressive regular season saw wins over multiple SEC opponents, including over Alabama for the first time in school history by way of a 197.475 then-record score.

In 2016, Garrison took Kentucky to the NCAA Tuscaloosa Regional, where the Wildcats finished fourth as a team with a score of 195.725. Garrison saw two freshmen move onto the NCAA Championships in Hyland and Dukes. Hyland was the all-around champion of the regional after posting a meet-best 39.175 for the title, while Dukes scored a 39.125, earning the final all-around spot. At the NCAA Championship, Garrison coached his first All-America honoree. Dukes executed a nearly flawless beam routine en route to a 9.8875, the fourth-highest mark in the session and the third-highest on the event in program history at the time. The Wildcats posted what were two top-five scores in school history, including a 196.65 at Memorial Coliseum versus Florida.

In 2015, Garrison led the Wildcats a 5-3 home record while posting some of

the best UK scores to that point. On March 6, Garrison led the team to a 196.575 team score, then good for second all-time at Kentucky. The Wildcats flourished during in both bars and beam, with Garrison guiding the team to the second- and fifth-best results in school history, respectively. Sydney Waltz and Cori Rechenmacher became Kentucky's first two SEC All-Freshmen selections. Additionally, Waltz became the first Wildcat to compete in the NCAA Championships as an all-arounder since Aronda Primault in 2002. Waltz finished 15th overall, while taking 11th place on floor. Garrison also added two All-SEC selections in Waltz and sophomore Taylor Puryear.

In 2014, Garrison led Kentucky to a 6-1 home record, its best mark at Memorial Coliseum since 1991. The Wildcats set a school-record NCAA Regional score for the second consecutive season and provided an individual appearance at the NCAA Championship. In an upset win over No. 11 Auburn, UK scored a 196.275, then the fifth-best team score in program history. The Cats totaled two scores that landed in the top 10 in school history and four in the top 20 at the time. Along with a then-record NCAA Regional score of 195.925, senior Audrey Harrison tied for an individual win on balance beam. The victory qualified Harrison for the NCAA Championship, marking UK's first appearance since 2010.

Kentucky had a record-setting 2013 campaign that saw numerous school records fall. UK earned a ninth-consecutive NCAA Regional bid with a school-record RQS of 196.06 after breaking the team best score twice. A 196.775 in the regular season finale at Penn State bested the previous high score set earlier in the season at Ball State. The Wildcats notched three wins against SEC opponents, then the most in program history, and earned a school-best 3-3-1 league mark. All three wins were against teams ranked in the top 15, with two over top-nine foes. In postseason play, UK tallied the program's highest-ever NCAA Regional team score of 195.575 and finished fourth at the regional.

Kentucky wrapped up the historic 2013 season by claiming Team of the Year and two individual awards at UK Athletics' annual CATSPY Awards. Garrison was named Coach of the Year alongside baseball coach Gary Henderson and rifle coach Harry Mullins, while sophomore Shannon Mitchell picked up the Scratch Award, given to the top non-scholarship student-athlete.

The Wildcats finished 2012 with three consecutive scores of 195.875 or higher, then the program's best three-meet stretch. UK also sealed the first winning regular season since 2008 in Garrison's first campaign. Garrison guided Kentucky to a final No. 25 ranking with a NQS of 390.240 in 2012. The ranking made Garrison the first head coach in school history to take his team to a top-25 final ranking in his first season. The Cats earned back-to-back victories over top-25 teams when UK took down SEC foe Auburn at home and nationally ranked Illinois on the road. Kentucky also posted just the 10th score of 196 or higher in school history with a 196.025 against George Washington and Ball State during Garrison's inaugural season.

Garrison arrived at Kentucky after helping the University of Nebraska-Lincoln reach new heights with two NCAA Super Six appearances and two Big 12 Conference championships. Garrison served as the Huskers' vault, floor and strength and conditioning coach, while also helping in all facets of recruiting.

In his five years at Nebraska, Garrison was responsible for producing 10 All-Americans, while his vault and floor teams consistently ranked as one of the top 10 teams in the nation. In 2011, Garrison helped lead the Huskers back to the NCAA Super Six Finals, where they matched their best finish in school history, finishing fourth. Two of Garrison's vault performers ended the individual finals in the top five, while two other gymnasts were in the top 12 on floor.

In his first year on the job at NU in 2007, Garrison's vault team finished sixth in the nation, while the floor squad was in the top five of the final rankings. In 2009, Nebraska was ranked sixth nationally on floor, and in 2010, the Huskers were fifth on vault. Garrison's vault and floor teams finished third and seventh, respectively in 2011. Nebraska made the NCAA postseason in each of Garrison's five years, advancing to nationals three times.

Prior to Nebraska, Garrison developed a reputation as one of the most successful club coaches in the country, serving as a head coach for SCEGA Gymnastics in Temecula, California, for 10 years. SCEGA Gymnastics is one of the largest and most thriving gymnastics teams in the nation. While with SCEGA, Garrison produced 27 national champions, 10 Junior Olympic National Team members and four Elite National Team members. For his efforts, Garrison was named Coach of the Year for Southern California by USA Gymnastics five times, including four consecutive from 2001 to 2004.

In 2001, Garrison coached Rachel Tidd to the World Championships in Ghent, Belgium, where she captured a team bronze medal and finished eighth on beam. A year prior, Garrison coached Tidd to a 10th-place showing in the 2000 U.S. Olympic Trials.

Garrison spent three years at SCATS Gymnastics in Huntington Beach, California, where he was responsible for conditioning and meet preparation for a group of optional and compulsory gymnasts. During his time there, Garrison produced a national qualifier every year at both the Junior Olympic National Championships and the Elite Classic competitions. Garrison also coached at Karolyi's Gymnastics in Houston, Texas, alongside famed former U.S. Olympic Team coach Bela Karolyi.

Garrison served as a director for the Nebraska School of Gymnastics during his time in Lincoln, where he successfully increased the enrollment in the program from 40 participants to over 170 members. Garrison also was named Nebraska's USAG Coach of the Year in 2009.

Garrison is a native of Conroe, Texas, and graduated from California State University, Fullerton with a Bachelor of Science in Physical Education in 1995. Tim is married to UK gymnastics associate head coach Rachel Garrison and the father of three daughters and two sons.

Rachel Garrison enters her eighth season as gymnastics associate head coach—after a four-year stint as assistant coach and four additional years volunteering with the program—at the University of Kentucky in 2026.

Garrison, a 2018 and 2023 National Association of Collegiate Gymnastics Coaches/Women National Assistant Coach of the Year, has helped guide the Wildcats to over 100 wins while splitting duties as a recruiter and beam coach.

Garrison has coached five Wildcat All-Americans—Sidney Dukes, Alex Hyland, Mollie Korth, Raena Worley, and Isabella Magnelli—to 11 national honors. Dukes was a First Team Regular Season All-American in 2016, followed by a First Team Regular Season honor from Korth and a Second Team Regular Season laurel from Hyland in 2017. Hyland added another All-America honor on beam at the 2019 NCAA National Championships. 14-time All-American Raena Worley earned her first All-America honor on the balance beam during a historic 2024 season, picking up Second Team Regular Season honors.

Under the guidance of Garrison, Magnelli blossomed into one of the school's most decorated balance beam worker, earning six All-America honors on the event—including three First Team mentions. Magnelli also finished as the SEC Runner-Up on the event in 2023 and 2024 and placed fourth at the 2023 NCAA National Championships and third at the 2024 NCAA National Championships.

In 2025, Garrison's beam team matched a school record with a 49.575 in the regular season finale at Florida on March 14. This came one week after the Cats posted a 49.525 on the event in a Senior Night win against Arkansas—the highest beam score for the program inside Historic Memorial Coliseum. Magnelli earned First Team Regular Season All-America honors for the first time in her career with a career-high matching 9.935 NQS, highlighted by a near-perfect 9.975 performance on her Senior Night. The team finished ranked inside the top ten on the apparatus for the second year in a row—ranking ninth with a 49.385 NQS. Seven Wildcats—Chesney Bennett, Creslyn Brose, Carly Busch, Skylar Killough-Wilhelm, Sharon Lee, Magnelli, and Delaynee Rodriguez—all set or matched their career highs on the balance beam during 2025.

A historic 2024 season that saw the Wildcats earn their highest score in program history, the highest NQS, and the highest national seed in program history was highly influenced by success on the balance beam under Garrison's guidance. Two Wildcats—Magnelli and Worley—earned Regular Season All-America honors while the team finished seventh in the final apparatus rankings with a 49.445 beam NQS. Worley nearly scored the program's second perfect 10.0 on beam, earning a career-best 9.975 at the 2024 Kidney Care Women's Gymnastics Championships on March 16. Magnelli delivered loads of postseason success, scoring a 9.950 at the SEC Championships and NCAA National Championships to finish as runner-up at the conference meet and as the bronze medalist at nationals.

Kentucky set a new school record with a beam rotation of 49.575 in the NCAA Norman, Okla. Regional on April 1, 2023. The Wildcats previously held its program best on the apparatus of 49.525 in the NCAA Salt Lake City Regional final on April 3, 2021. The Wildcats finished the 2023 season ranked 13th on beam in the Road to Nationals Team National Standings while ranking seventh at the conclusion of the 2024 regular season. UK did not count a fall all season in 2023 while being one of three NCAA DI gymnastics program to score 49.000+ in every event in every meet of the season.

In 2022, All-Southeastern Conference performer Bailey Bunn competed as an individual on beam at the NCAA Championships, while Worley was named a second-team Women's Collegiate Gymnastics Association Regular Season All-American on all-around.

Garrison oversaw a Kentucky beam rotation that finished among the nation's top 15 with a Team National Qualifying Score of 49.190 on the event in a 2020 season cut short due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Garrison helped guide the Wildcats to their best national ranking of any event with a No. 8 finish on beam in 2019. Kentucky tied the second-best single-meet beam score in program history with a 49.425 total in an upset of No. 5 LSU on Feb. 18, then surpassed the mark with a 49.450 versus Central Michigan on March 8. Kentucky had an individual match or surpass the 9.900 benchmark on beam 15 times on the season.

Senior Alex Hyland was named a second-team WCGA All-American and All-Southeastern Conference on beam (as well as a WCGA All-American and second-team WCGA Regular Season All-American as an all-around competitor), while Josie Angeny was named SEC All-Freshman on beam.

In 2017, Garrison helped coach Hyland to an SEC Championship on the balance beam, the program's first individual conference title in 21 seasons.

Garrison's coaching experience spans over 20 years, as she developed gymnasts ranging from beginners to level 10 and elite status.

Prior to her time as a volunteer assistant for the Cats, Garrison served as a program director at the Nebraska School of Gymnastics for five years. While in Lincoln, Garrison guided gymnasts to qualify for Junior Olympic nationals in each of her five years. Garrison also produced a regional beam champion and played a critical role in recruitment, successfully increasing the enrollment in the program from 40 participants to over 170 members during her tenure with the School of Gymnastics.

Before heading to Nebraska, Garrison spent over a decade coaching at multiple clubs across California, with the most prominent being SCEGA in Temecula.

Garrison is a graduate of San Diego State University, where she earned a Bachelor of Science in Kinesiology with a specialization in pre-physical therapy in 1999. Rachel is married to UK gymnastics head coach Tim Garrison and the mother of three daughters and two sons.

ASSISTANT COACH CHAD WIEST



Chad Wiest enters his fifth season as gymnastics assistant coach at the University of Kentucky in 2025. With a major role in recruiting, Wiest leads the Wildcats on vault and floor exercise.

In 2025, Wiest helped Kentucky finish in the top ten of the NCAA rankings on both vault and floor. The vault squad ended the year ranked No. 5 for the second consecutive season while the floor team finished the year ranked No. 10—a second consecutive season ranked inside the year-end top ten.

The Wildcats posted the third-highest floor score in program history against Arkansas on March 7, earning a 49.725 to come within .025 of the school record. In that meet, Creslyn Brose scored her first career 10.0 on floor exercise. Wiest has now guided three athletes to perfect scores across his two event in the past two seasons.

In the 2024 season, and for the first time since Jenny Hansen in the late 1990's, two members of Team 50 earned perfect 10.0's. Makenzie Wilson was awarded two perfect marks on vault while Raena Worley earned three 10.0's on floor. In addition to record-setting perfect scores, Wiest also produced All-Americans in Arianna Patterson (Second Team Vault), Creslyn Brose (Second Team Floor), Wilson (First Team Vault), and Worley (First Team Floor). Worley was also named All-SEC while Brose was named SEC All-Freshman. Worley, a two-time AAI Award finalist represented the Cats at Nationals placing second overall on floor (9.9500).

Kentucky posted a new program record on vault (49.550) against Georgia on Excite Night. The same night, the Wildcats tied its program best on floor with 49.650 which was first set in 2014. However, Kentucky later broke that record setting a new program best against Missouri (49.750). The Cats saw their highest ranking on vault at No. 1 which they held from Week 4 to Week 7. Additionally, the floor team was ranked No. 3 for four consecutive weeks. Worley held the No. 1 ranking on floor for eight consecutive weeks while Wilson was nationally ranked in the top-five on vault for nine consecutive weeks.

The 2023 season came with national recognition for associate head coach, Rachel Garrison, and Wiest as they were named WCGA Central Region Co-Assistant Coaches of the Year. Kentucky saw the most accomplished season to date as Team 49 qualified for nationals for the second time in program history. In the regular season, Worley was

named First Team All-America on floor. In the postseason at the NCAA National Championship, Wiest produced two All-Americans in Worley and Wilson. UK closed the 2023 season ranked No. 6 on vault and No. 11 on floor.

In 2022, Kentucky finished No. 9 in the Road to Nationals All-Around Team National Standings. The Cats made program history with its highest score of 197.750 in the second round of the NCAA Auburn Regional. Worley and Hailey Davis represented the Wildcats at the NCAA National Championships on floor with Worley earning All-American First and Second Team Honors.

Wiest comes to Kentucky after five seasons at the University of Washington. As an assistant coach with the Huskies, Wiest led the charge on vault and floor while also serving as the team's recruiting coordinator.

Washington flourished during Wiest's tenure, qualifying for back-to-back NCAA Championships to end a 19-year drought. The GymDawgs recorded their highest regular-season finish in school history with a No. 8 national ranking in 2018. In 2020, Wiest guided the Washington floor unit to a No. 4 finish on the event.

Wiest co-produced three NCAA All-Americans, seven WCGA Regular Season All-Americans and 17 All-Pac-12 honors in Seattle.

Before landing at Washington, Wiest spent three years as an assistant at his alma mater, the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign. The Butler, Pennsylvania, native coached the Illinois vault and floor lineups, overseeing an NCAA Championship appearance in 2014. The Fighting Illini shattered the program scoring record, as well as the mark for best vault rotation, with Wiest on staff.

Before embarking on his coaching career at Bowling Green State University for two years, Wiest was a team captain, two-time All-American and Big Ten champion as a student-athlete on the storied Illinois men's gymnastics team.

Wiest resides in Lexington with his wife, Jaclyn.

ASSISTANT COACH ANNA MARSH



Anna Marsh is entering her first season as an assistant coach in 2026. Marsh was a Wildcat gymnast from 2019-2022, earning All-SEC honors in 2021. The Cincinnati, Ohio native also served as a volunteer assistant coach for Kentucky in 2023, helping guide the Wildcats to the program's second berth to the NCAA National Semifinals.

"Words can't describe what it means to be back representing this program", Marsh said regarding her return to Lexington. "Being able to help these athletes reach their full potential, whilst working

alongside such an incredible staff, is truly a dream come true. This place holds special meaning to me and I am so excited to bring my competitiveness, passion, and loyalty to this role. Go Cats!"

"We are thrilled to welcome Anna back to Kentucky as a member of our coaching staff", head coach Tim Garrison commented on the hiring of Marsh. "She understands exactly what makes this program special—our energy, our grit, and the relentless work ethic required to compete at the highest level. She lived the full journey during her time at Kentucky—evolving from someone fighting for a role into an All-SEC competitor—and that experience has shaped her into a leader who values accountability, culture, and daily investment."

"As a coach, Anna brings the same competitive edge and uncompromising standards she demanded of herself as an athlete, along with a unique ability to connect with today's gymnasts and recruit in an authentic, relatable way", Garrison remarked. "Her attention to detail will immediately elevate our athletes and her passion for this program and university is undeniable. Welcome back, Anna!"

As a gymnast at Kentucky, Marsh competed on both the balance beam and floor exercise. Marsh earned two career wins on the floor and scored a career-high 9.975 on the apparatus against Michigan State in March 2022, ranking her No. 4 all-time at Kentucky. Marsh also

posted a career-high beam score of 9.850 in the 2022 NCAA Auburn Regional.

In 2022, Marsh competed ten floor routines, with all ten scoring at 9.850 or better. The Wildcat scored 9.900 or better five times, highlighted by a near-perfect 9.975 on her Senior Night to win the event title. Marsh also competed on the beam five times that season, including both meets at the 2022 NCAA Auburn Regional. During the regional semifinals, Marsh posted her best two-event total of her career, posting a career high 9.850 on the beam and a 9.950 on the floor.

In 2021, Marsh competed in every meet on floor, scoring 9.900 or better five times. Marsh posted a season high 9.925 on floor twice, once in a dual meet against Auburn to earn her first career event title and again at the SEC Championships to earn All-SEC distinction. At the 2021 NCAA Utah Regional, Marsh posted a 9.900 in both the semifinal and final. Marsh also competed on beam six times during the season, earning a season-high 9.800 against Alabama.

Marsh did not compete during the 2019 season and featured in a pair of beam rotations in 2020. Marsh earned WCGA Scholastic All-America and SEC Academic Honor Roll distinction in all four years at Kentucky. She graduated from the University of Kentucky with a bachelor's degree in Kinesiology in May 2022.

After exhausting her athletic eligibility in 2022, Marsh stayed with the program and served as a volunteer assistant coach for the 2023 season. The Wildcats enjoyed one of the most successful seasons in program history, advancing to the NCAA National Semifinals for just the second time in program history and earning a program-best final ranking of No. 6. During that campaign, the Wildcats posted their first undefeated home slate since 1984 and five Wildcats earned either All-SEC or All-America distinction.

After her stint as a volunteer assistant coach, Marsh continued to coach gymnastics at the youth level, working at Perfection Gymnastics in Cincinnati.
