

### NEED TO KNOW

Otega Oweh has scored in double-figures in all 17 games for Kentucky this season, and topped 20 points in six of his last seven outings. Oweh has now reached double-figures in 50 of his 53 games at Kentucky and 20-straight dating back to last season. He is the only player in the country averaging at least 20 points per game (21.3) and at least 3.0 steals per game (3.0) against league foes this season among players to appear in all conference games. Oweh is the first UK player since Jodie Meeks in 2008-09 to have at least 20 points in each of his first four SEC games. Meeks opened league play with seven straight 20-point games.

Kentucky point guard Jaland Lowe has been ruled out for the season with a shoulder injury. UK played just three games at full strength this season and has used eight different starting lineups.

Kentucky erased an 18-point deficit to come from behind and defeat LSU on Wednesday, capped by a game-winning buzzer beater from Malachi Moreno. UK trailed by 16 at the half. It ties Gonzaga (12/7/24), Louisville (12/18/04) and LSU (2/15/94) for the largest halftime deficits overcome in program history.

With their wins over Mississippi State and LSU, the Cats have come from at least 12 points down to win in consecutive games for the first time since rallying from 17 down against West Virginia (Jan. 27, 2018) and 14 down against Vanderbilt (Jan. 30, 2018)

UK has won three-straight meetings against the Vols in Knoxville, including a 78-73 upset over No. 8 Tennessee last season. Kentucky went 2-1 against Tennessee in the three matchups last year.

### Media Information

#### CREDENTIAL REQUESTS

Requests for single-game credentials are now open and the window to apply will close **three** days prior to game day online at [sportssystem.com/Kentucky](http://sportssystem.com/Kentucky).

#### CREDENTIAL CRITERIA

The University of Kentucky's decision to issue credentials to a media outlet for the purposes of covering a UK basketball home or away event is determined by a variety of factors. They include the following:

- Priority is given to outlets based on circulation size/ household reach/unique site visitors
- Additional consideration is based on amount of original content generated, number of full-time employees of the outlet, length of existence of the outlet and the journalist experience of the reporter(s)
- Attendance at Kentucky media sessions, including Olympic sport opportunities and the intention/ability to cover all sports at Kentucky both at home and on the road, also is considered
- Professionalism, which includes is not limited to conduct at games, press conferences, practices, on social media, etc.

Being granted credentials at another institution/event does not equate to meeting the criteria for the University of Kentucky. Being granted credentials for one UK event does not guarantee approval for other UK events. The University of Kentucky has the right to deny or revoke credentials under its own discretion. Credentialing also is dependent on space availability.

#### INTERVIEW POLICIES-GENERAL

All interviews with University of Kentucky basketball players or staff members must be arranged through the Communications and Public Relations office. Media should never contact a player or coach directly.

The Wildcat Coal Lodge, dormitories, team locker rooms and other team quarters are private team areas. Media members are not permitted in these areas unless accompanied by appropriate university personnel.

#### PRACTICE/PRESS CONFERENCES

Other than announced exceptions, UK basketball practices are closed to the media.

Player interviews are conducted pregame weekly and will be available to all UK media. UK will accept requests for player interviews, but they must be submitted 24 hours prior to the scheduled availability.

Coach Mark Pope will meet with members of the media at least once a week in the Memorial Coliseum Media Room.

Game-day shoot-arounds are closed to the media.

#### TELEPHONE PLAYER INTERVIEWS

Telephone interviews are available to the media on a call-back basis. Individual player and coach telephone numbers will not be given to members of the media.

Players are instructed not to conduct interviews when contacted directly by telephone. The Communications and Public Relations office will arrange for telephone interviews at a time most convenient for the student-athlete.

Other special requests are handled on a case-by-case basis.

#### POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Following each game, there is a cooling-off period, during which time the players shower and dress. Approximately 10 minutes after the game ends, Coach Pope conducts his postgame press conference while a player speaks to the UK Sports Network.

Following Coach Pope's press conference in the Rupp Arena interview room and the cooling-off period, selected UK players are available in the interview room.

## Know Your Opponent: Tennessee

Kentucky returns to the road for a matchup with its border-state rival in Tennessee:

- Kentucky leads the all-time series, 163-79, and is 60-53 in Knoxville. UK has won three straight in Knoxville, including a 78-73 upset win a season ago
- Last year's meeting in Knoxville, Koby Brea scored 18 points and Jaxson Robinson had 17. The Cats were without starting point guard Lamont Butler in an upset of No. 8 Tennessee. The Cats connected on 50% of their 3s, making 12 of 24
- Seventeen years ago this week, Jodie Meeks set the UK single-game scoring record against the Vols in Knoxville. Meeks poured in 54 points and made 10 3-pointers on Jan. 13, 2009
- The most points UK has ever scored in the series came on Jan. 15, 2022 in a 107-79 triumph in Lexington. Earlier that day former head coach Joe B. Hall died at the age of 83. UK began the game by paying homage to Hall's famous 1-3-1 zone
- The Volunteers are 12-5 overall and 2-2 in league play. Tennessee earned an 87-82 double-overtime win over Texas A&M on Tuesday
- Ja'Kobi Gillespie is averaging 18.2 points per game and has made 47 3-pointers to lead the Vols. Nate Amet is posting 15.4 points and a team-high-tying 6.4 rebounds per outing
- Tennessee once again has one of the nation's most stout defense's ranking 11th in the Jan. 15th KenPom rankings

## Last Time Out

Behind a magical finish from Malachi Moreno, Kentucky erased an 18-point second-half deficit to rally for a 75-74 win at LSU on Wednesday:

- It wasn't quite the Mardi Gras Miracle – when Kentucky rallied from a 31-point second-half deficit to win 99-95 on Feb. 15, 1994 – but perhaps it is the Mardi Gras Mini-Miracle as the Wildcats came back from an 18-point second-half deficit to win 75-74
- The 18-point rally matched the largest comeback of the Coach Mark Pope era. The Wildcats trailed by 18 last year vs. Gonzaga before rallying for a 90-89 overtime win in Seattle
- Kentucky won the second half, 53-36, shooting 65.4 percent from the field and 72.7 percent (8 of 11) from 3-point land
- Kentucky led for only one minute, 10 seconds of the game
- Kentucky had fewer turnovers, 12-9, and won points off turnovers 16-11
- Kentucky shot 43.5 percent on 3-pointers, 10 of 23. UK is 5-0 this season when shooting at least 40 percent on long balls, including the last two games
- Kentucky won fast break points, 15-7. UK has won fast break points in every game this season
- Otega Oweh led the Wildcats with 21 points, his fourth straight 20-point game. It is his sixth 20-point game of the season, all coming in the last eight games
- Malachi Moreno hit the game-winning jumper at the buzzer, capping his night with 10 points, a game-high eight rebounds and two steals. Moreno played the last 8:56 of the game with four fouls
- After going scoreless in the first half, Denzel Aberdeen warmed to the task in the second half with 17 points in the second stanza. He led the Wildcats in assists with four
- Making his first start at UK, Andrija Jelavic tied his season high with 11 points, his third double-figure game as a Wildcat

## Comeback Cats

Kentucky has earned four notable come-from-behind wins this season. UK used strong second halves to pick up two key wins over Indiana and St. John's, and then mounted double-digit deficits to win vs. Mississippi State and at LSU.

### Indiana and St. John's Notes:

- It marked the first time in program history that Kentucky

overcame halftime deficits of seven or more points in consecutive games (Indiana and St. John's)

- Kentucky scored an average of 28.5 points in the first half of the two contests, upping that number to 46.5 points in the second half
  - UK shot just 33.9 percent on average in the first half, but 49.2 percent in the second half
  - Jaland Lowe averaged 11.0 second-half points in the games
  - The Wildcats' average turnover margin in the first halves was -2.0, but +7.0 in the second halves
- ### Mississippi State and LSU notes:
- Kentucky rallied from a 12 point first-half deficit vs. Mississippi State behind 14 steals, which marked the most against a league foe since 2009
  - The Wildcats then erased an 18-point second-half deficit at LSU. That ties the largest comeback in the Mark Pope era (also overcame 18 points vs. Gonzaga in 2024-25) with a buzzer-beating shot by Malachi Moreno as time expired
  - UK trailed by 16 points at halftime. It ties wins over Gonzaga (12/7/24), Louisville (12/18/04) and LSU (2/15/94) for a program record, all 16-point halftime deficits
  - It marked the first time Kentucky had overcome consecutive games trailing by at least 12 points since the Cats rallied from 17 back at West Virginia on Jan. 27, 2018 and then a 14-point second-half deficit against Vanderbilt on Jan. 30, 2018

## Otegatron Finding His Footing

Otega Oweh missed most of fall camp as he recovered from a turf toe injury. It's taken a few weeks to find his footing, but Oweh is looking more and more like the preseason pick for SEC Player of the Year.

- Oweh has scored in double figures in all 17 games and has topped double figures in 50 of 53 games played in the Blue and White overall
- As of Jan. 14, Oweh is one of 27 players in Division I to reach double figures in each of his team's games
- His 50 games in double figures over the last two seasons ranks third in Division I behind only Jaron Pierre Jr. (52 with Jacksonville St. and SMU) and P.J. Haggerty (51 with Memphis and Kansas St.)
- He is averaging 21.25 points per game in SEC play, ranking fifth in the conference. He is the first UK player since Jodie Meeks (7 games) to have 20 points in each of his first four SEC games in a season
- Oweh is the only player averaging at least 20 points and three steals against league foes this season
- Despite missing shootaround while fighting an illness, Oweh played a season-high 37 minutes in the come-from-behind win over LSU. He scored a game-high 21 points and added four rebounds and a pair of steals in the win
- Oweh led UK with 22 points and five steals in the win over Mississippi State
- On the road at Alabama, Oweh scored 22 points to lead Kentucky, while also sharing team-high honors in rebounds (8) and assists (3)
- He had team highs in points (20), rebounds (5), assists (4) and steals (4) vs. Missouri
- Oweh is logging 21.3 points, 5.0 rebounds, 3.3 assists and 3.0 steals per game against SEC foes
- He drained the longest shot in program history with a 69-foot heave at the end of the first half against Missouri
- The Newark, New Jersey, native nearly had a triple-double in the win over Bellarmine with 10 points, a season-high eight rebounds and a career-high 10 assists. He also generated a pair of steals for his eighth-consecutive game with multiple steals, the longest streak of his career
- He scored 21 points vs. NC Central while also matching a career high with three made 3s

- Against St. John's, Oweh scored a game-high 20 points and had three steals
- During his two seasons at Kentucky, Oweh has totaled 853 points. That is the sixth most points by a Wildcat transfer all-time. He needs 98 points to move past Travis Ford for fifth on the list. Kyle Macy tops the list with 1,411 points

### Magical Mali's Mardi Gras Moment

Freshman center Malachi Moreno has quickly developed into a valuable frontcourt piece for the Wildcats this season and has provided UK with its most magical moment yet.

- A native of Georgetown, Kentucky, Moreno lived out every young kid's dream who grows up wanting to play for the in-state Wildcats. With 1.9 seconds remaining and UK trailing by one point at LSU, Moreno caught a three-quarter-court pass from Collin Chandler and swiftly turned and drained a 17-foot buzzer beater to lift Kentucky to a 75-74 win. Kentucky overcame an 18-point second-half deficit and tied a program record by overcoming a 16-point halftime deficit in the victory. Moreno had 10 points and a team-high eight rebounds in the win, and played the final 8:56 of the game with four fouls
- Moreno scored 17 points and added eight rebounds, six assists and four steals in a statement performance against Mississippi State. He became the first 7-footer in Division I with those numbers since at least 1996-97 and just the third Kentucky player, joining Rajon Rondo and Shai Gilgeous-Alexander
- He posted double-doubles against Valparaiso and Tennessee Tech
- He is the team's leading rebounder at 6.4 rebounds per game and has led the squad in rebounds in nine games. He also paces the Cats with 43 offensive rebounds, an average of 2.5 per game
- Moreno leads the team with 1.24 blocks per game
- Moreno owns a .645 field-goal percentage, the top mark on the team
- He has a team-high 34 dunks this season

### Injury Bug Bites Again; Lowe out for the Season

Kentucky played its first game at full strength vs. St. John's on Dec. 20, and will play just three games overall with everyone available.

- Jaland Lowe suffered a shoulder injury in the Blue-White Game, and missed both exhibition games and the season-opener. He ended up playing just nine total games. Mark Pope announced on Jan. 12 he would need surgery and will miss the remainder of the season after suffering his most recent injury against Mississippi State
- Jayden Quaintance missed the first 11 games of the season as he returned from ACL surgery. He then missed the outings vs. Mississippi State and at LSU
- Otega Oweh missed the majority of preseason camp with turf toe. He returned to full action just prior to UK's two exhibition games
- Mo Dioubate suffered a high ankle sprain against Michigan State. He returned to action vs. Indiana
- Trent Noah injured an ankle in the season-opener and missed the Valpo game

### Notable Achievements Thus Far

Kentucky is off to a 11-6 start to the season and has achieved a few notable achievements:

- The 18-point rally at LSU matched the largest comeback of the Coach Mark Pope era. The Wildcats trailed by 18 last year vs. Gonzaga before rallying for a 90-89 overtime win in Seattle
- Kentucky's 16-point halftime deficit overcome vs. LSU matches a program record. UK also trailed by 16 in wins over Gonzaga (12/7/24), Louisville (12/18/04) and LSU (2/15/94)
- In its win over Mississippi State, UK generated 14 steals, its most against an SEC opponent since 16 vs. Georgia in 2009. Kentucky also held the Mississippi State to just 15 percent from behind the 3-point arc, the lowest by an opponent (min.

20 attempts) since Tennessee shot 14.3 percent in 2023)

- UK picked up its first win over a top-25 opponent this season with a 78-66 victory over No. 22 St. John's
- In its wins over Indiana and St. John's, Kentucky overcame halftime deficits of seven or more points in consecutive games for the first time in program history
- Twelve different players have scored in double figures for the Cats this season. It matches the 1992-93 team for the most players in program history to score in double-figures in at least one game during a season
- Kentucky committed just four turnovers in its win over Indiana. That marked the fewest against a Power 4 opponent since Jan. 5, 2021 when UK committed just two
- Against NC Central, Kentucky shot better than 60% from the field, 40% from 3-point range and 90% from the free-throw line for the first time in the same game since Jan. 15, 2022 vs. Tennessee
- Kentucky had its best shooting performance on 2-point field-goals (77.1%, 27-35) against North Carolina Central, since Nov. 29, 2024 vs. Georgia State (80.5%, 33-41)
- The Wildcats went 13 of 14 from the line against NC Central, marking the best shooting performance from the charity stripe with at least 14 attempts since going 14 of 15 vs. Auburn on Feb. 25, 2023
- The 50-point margin of victory over Tennessee Tech is largest for UK under head coach Mark Pope. Kentucky has four wins this season with at least 40-point margins, the quickest into a season in UK history (seven games) with four such games.
- Kentucky did not allow a member of Loyola (Md.) to score more than seven points in the win over the Greyhounds. It was the first time a UK defense prevented a scorer of more than seven points since Nov. 23, 2014 vs. Montana State
- UK has had three games already with nine players scoring at least six points. That only happened three other times between 2004-05 and 2024-25
- Kentucky limited each of its first two opponents of the season to 59 points or fewer for the first time since 2014-15
- The Cats have at least one win by 48 or more points in consecutive seasons for the first time since 2011-12 and 2012-13
- Kentucky limited Nicholls to just 15 points in the opening half, it was the lowest points yielded in the first half in Rupp Arena by the Cats since ECU scored 14 on Dec. 7, 2014
- The Cats have scored over 100 points, three times (Valparaiso, Tennessee Tech, NC Central)

## Have a Day, Zel!

Denzel Aberdeen has stepped into a key role for Kentucky this season. He's currently averaging 11.6 points per game, while adding a team-high 55 assists.

- Aberdeen scored a career-high 26 points in the loss at Louisville. It marked just his fourth-ever 20-point output. He also snagged a then-career-best seven rebounds
- Through 17 games played, Aberdeen has career best marks in points per game (11.6), rebounds per game (2.9), field-goal percentage (.463), free-throw percentage (.822) and assists per game (3.2)
- He opened the season by scoring in double figures in each of the first eight games, the longest streak of double-digit scoring of his career. He's topped double figures in 11 games thus far
- Aberdeen scored all 17 of his points in UK's come-from-behind win at LSU to lift the Cats to a school-record-tying 16-point halftime deficit overcome. He drained a pair of 3s and made all five of his free-throw attempts, while also leading UK with four assists

## Balanced on the Stats Sheet

Balance has been the name of the game for the Cats thus far this season.

- UK has had eight different leading scorers or co-leaders
- Twelve different players have scored in double figures for the Cats this season. It matches the 1992-93 team for the most players in program history to score in double-figures in at least one game during a season
- UK has also had six different players lead or co-lead in rebounds
- Six players have led or co-led in assists
- Kentucky has had nine players score at least six points in three games already this season (Valparaiso, Eastern Illinois, Loyola (Md.))

## S-E-C! S-E-C! S-E-C!

Kentucky is the Southeastern Conference's gold standard. Since the SEC's inception in 1932-33, the Wildcats are the most dominant team in the league, recording a 1,071-318 mark (77.1%) in regular-season conference play. Only Alabama and Tennessee have won more than 800 regular-season SEC games and no other team owns a better winning percentage.

- UK has averaged 11.6 wins and only 3.4 losses per season in 92 seasons in the SEC
- Kentucky has won 49 SEC regular-season titles and 31 SEC Tournament championships
- UK won its 1,000th game in SEC regular-season action vs. Alabama on Jan. 11, 2020. Kansas has won 1,000 conference games when combining its records in the Big 6, Big 7, Big 8 and Big 12, but no other team in the country had won 1,000 or more regular-season league games

- Fourteen teams made the 2025 NCAA Tournament field, the most from any conference all-time
- The league has advanced at least one team to the Elite Eight in 11 of the last 14 tournaments
- Seven teams from the SEC made the Sweet 16, a new NCAA Tournament record for most teams by a conference
- The SEC sent four teams to the Elite Eight, the first time the league has done so, joining the 2009 Big East and the 2016 ACC as the only conferences to accomplish the feat
- Two SEC teams faced each other in the Final Four for the first time
- The SEC's 22 NCAA Tournament wins broke the ACC's record of 19 in 2019

## Second Half Surges

Kentucky is 12-4 thus far, and in 10 games against Power Conference opponents, the Cats are 4-6. In first halves of those games, Kentucky is getting outscored by 89 points. However, the Cats have rallied and played significantly better in the second half. Kentucky is outscoring opponents in the second half by a 55-point margin. ## Happy to Assist

True to the team's "Make Plays for Teammates" motto, Kentucky has done a nice job sharing the basketball this season.

- The Wildcats are averaging 17.5 assists per game, ranking 36th in the country
- In wins, UK is posting 20.5 assists per game, the eighth-most among power conference schools and the 24th most in Division I
- Just eight teams in college basketball have had 27 or more assists in three different games this season: Kentucky, Cornell, Indiana, Lindenwood, Miami (FL), Michigan, SMU and Texas A&M
- Eight different players are averaging at least 1.0 assist per game
- Eleven players have at least one game with three or more assists

## Dioubate Giving The Cats Something 'Mo'

Mo Dioubate is having one of the best statistical seasons of his career.

- In the first four games since returning from injury, Dioubate averaged 11.5 points, 7.5 rebounds, 2.0 steals and 1.3 blocks per game. He shot 60.7% from the field
- Dioubate had 14 points and 12 rebounds for his second double-double of the season in a come-from-behind win over Indiana
- He added seven offensive rebounds -- the most of any UK player this season against the Hoosiers
- Dioubate had a career-high five steals in the win over the Hoosiers, also the most swipes for a Kentucky player this season
- In the win over St. John's, Dioubate had six points, five rebounds and a pair of blocks
- Dioubate then poured in a season-high-tying 20 points on 9-of-11 shooting in the win over Bellarmine. He added a career-high-tying three blocked shots in the win and a pair of steals
- Dioubate and Otega Oweh are the only two players on the team with multiple 20-point performances this season
- Dioubate tied for the team lead with eight rebounds in the SEC opener at Alabama

## Oweh! Oweh! Oweh!

Kentucky senior Otega Oweh was selected as the Southeastern Conference Co-Player of the Week, it was announced by the league office on Dec. 22. Oweh shared the award, the first weekly honor for UK this season, with Tennessee's Ja'Kobi Gillespie.

- Oweh scored a game-high 20 points as the Wildcats picked up their first win over an Associated Press Top-25 opponent, defeating No. 22 St. John's, 78-66, in the CBS Sports Classic in Atlanta on Saturday
- UK's star guard also contributed five rebounds and three steals in the winning effort, marking his seventh-consecutive game with multiple steals, the longest streak of his college career
- Oweh's defensive prowess was paramount in holding the Red Storm to a season-low 33.3 percent field-goal clip, while his 20-point effort was his second outing reaching the 20-point threshold this season. He also made 8-of-9 free throws in the contest

## The Long Ball

A staple Mark Pope team is known for shooting the long ball. Pope has discussed the desire to average 35 3-point attempts per game since he arrived in Lexington.

Kentucky is currently averaging 8.5 made 3s per game on 24.7 attempts per game through 16 games this season. The Cats are hitting at a 34.3% rate. Kentucky has made 144 thus far on the year.

UK made 11 of 28 (39.3%) in its win over Valpo, marking the first double-digit 3-pointers made of 2025-26. Kentucky then hit 12 at Louisville, 10 against Loyola (Md.), 15 against Tennessee Tech, 12 against NC Central, a season-high 16 in the win over Bellarmine, and 10 at LSU, including eight coming in the second half.

Kentucky is 22-4 overall under Mark Pope when eclipsing double-digits from distance, after going 16-3 a season ago.

## **Kam Williams Joins Elite 3-Point Company**

Kentucky sophomore guard Kam Williams joined elite company in the UK history books with his 8 of 10 performance from distance in the win over Bellarmine. Williams poured in a career-high 26 points, while making a career-best eight from distance. Notable achievements in that performance:

- He is one of just 16 high-major players to have a game this season with at least eight made 3s
- Williams matches Jamal Murray's single-game record for 3-point percentage with a minimum of 10 attempts from 3-point range at .800. Murray went 8 for 10 in a win over Florida in 2016
- Williams' eight 3s ranks as the fourth-most in program history in a single game. Jodie Meeks owns the record with 10 makes from distance in a win at Tennessee in 2009
- Williams is the ninth player in program history to have at least one game with eight makes from distance joining: Meeks, Tony Delk, Cameron Mills, Derrick Miller, Eric Bledsoe, Murray, Malik Monk and Immanuel Quickley
- Williams became the first player with eight makes since Quickley had eight in a win at Texas A&M in 2020

## **"Hoppy" Chandler**

Kentucky sophomore guard Collin Chandler has made improvements in his sophomore campaign.

- Chandler is averaging 8.2 points per game
- He has scored in double figures seven times this season after doing so just once last year as a freshman
- He is 28-72 from 3-point range, good for 38.9 percent shooting
- He has hit career bests in points (15 vs. Nicholls), rebounds (6, at Louisville), assists (8 vs. NC Central), 3-pointers (4, three times), blocked shots (2, vs. Michigan State), steals (3, vs. Gonzaga), and minutes played (34, vs. North Carolina)
- Chandler became the first player in program history to drain at least four 3s in each of the team's first three games
- Chandler earned the No. 1 play on ESPN's Sportscenter for a massive dunk in his record-breaking performance to open the 2025-26 season
- He was named MVP of the BBN United Tipoff Classic, averaging 11 points, 4.0 assists and 3.0 rebounds while shooting 52.9 percent from 3-point range
- He made the inbounds pass to Malachi Moreno for the game-winning buzzer-beater at LSU

## Recapping Year One of the Mark Pope Era

When his alma mater came calling, Mark Pope knew there was no place like home.

Pope, a captain of the University of Kentucky's 1996 National Championship team, returned to Lexington as the 23rd head coach of Kentucky's storied men's basketball program on April 12.

- Became the first coach to take a team with zero returning scoring from the year prior to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament
- In his first year at the helm, Kentucky set a program record with 341 made 3s and had six players average double-figures for the first time in program history
- Earned his first career NCAA Tournament win with a victory over Troy in the opening round in 2025
- Defeated Oklahoma to advance to the SEC Tournament Quarterfinals in his first appearance as coach in the league tournament
- UK went 8-5 against AP Top 15 opponents in Pope's first season. The eight wins over top-15 teams tied an NCAA record for the most in a single season
- Otega Oweh scored the team's final 18 points, including the game-winner at Oklahoma to help UK win 83-82. It was the second win of the season by a one-point margin. He got his third one-point win when Oweh scored a second last-second shot against his former club in the SEC Tournament vs. the Sooners. He was the first UK coach (dating back to Rupp) to win two one-point games in his first season as coach, and now has three. Calipari (1-1 in first two such games over first two seasons); Gillispie (0-1), Smith (1-1 over first two seasons), Pitino (1-1 over first two seasons), Sutton (2-0, both occurred in second season), Hall (0-2 in his first year), Rupp (1-1, both in second season)
- Pope picked up his 200th career win as Kentucky defeated Mississippi State on Jan. 11. It also marked his first win in a "true" road game as head coach of the Wildcats
- With his win over No. 6 Florida on Jan. 4, Pope became just the second Kentucky head coach to win their first three matchups against AP Top 10 opponents. He joins Adolph Rupp who won his first seven such games from 1948-51.
- Pope was victorious in his first Kentucky vs. Louisville showdown as head coach, earning a 93-85 win over the Cards. The scoreline was the same as Rick Pitino's first win over Louisville at UK back in 1990
- Kentucky matched the largest halftime deficit overcome in program history when rallying from 16 down at the intermission to eventually beat No. 7 Gonzaga in overtime. Pope joined Adolph Rupp as the only two coaches in program history to win their first two games against AP top 10 ranked opponents
- UK set a single-game program record by connecting on 80.5% of its 2-point attempts in a win over Georgia State on Nov. 29. The previous record was 78.1% set vs. Lamar on Dec. 13, 1986
- The Wildcats connected on 10 or more 3s in each of the first five games of the season for the first time in program history
- Came back from a nine-point halftime deficit to down No. 6 Duke in the Champions Classic in just his third game as UK's head coach, the quickest coach at Kentucky to win a game against an AP Top 10 opponent
- Coached UK to a season-opening win by a 103-62 win, a 41-point margin. The 103 points were the most for a Kentucky coach in a debut game. The previous high was 88 points vs. Morehead State in Tubby Smith's first game in 1997

## Kentucky's 2025-26 Team

A season after not returning a single player to their roster, the Wildcats have assembled a mix of returning players, first-year collegiate performers and talented transfers. Here's a snapshot of UK's roster:

- **Otega Oweh, Senior, Guard:** Preseason All-America candidate and SEC Player of the Year | Set career highs in points per game (16.2), rebounds per game (4.7), assists per game (1.7) and steals per game (1.6) in his junior campaign with the Cats
- **Denzel Aberdeen, Senior, Guard:** A member of Florida's 2025 National Championship squad | Averaged 7.7 points in 39 appearances with five starts a season ago | Had back-to-back 20-point games, scoring 20 on the road at Mississippi State and a career-high 22 points on five made 3s vs. South Carolina | Averaged 14.4 points and shot 41.4 percent from 3-point range in his five starts
- **Jasper Johnson, Freshman, Guard:** Five-star prospect, ranked as a top-25 prospect in the class | Won gold at the 2025 FIBA U19 Men's World Cup with Team USA this summer.
- **Kam Williams, Sophomore, Guard:** Started 28 of the 33 games played during his freshman campaign at Tulane | Logged 14 double-figure scoring efforts and shot 41.2 percent from 3-point range | Put up a season-high 24 points in the regular-season finale vs. UAB
- **Andrija Jelavić, Sophomore, Forward:** Played for Mega Superbet in the Adriatic League, averaging 11.0 points, 7.4 rebounds, 1.5 assists and 1.0 steals | Played at the 2022 U18 Euro Championships averaging 11.3 points, 11.0 rebounds and 2.4 assists per game in seven outings
- **Collin Chandler, Sophomore, Guard:** Saw action in 30 games during his freshman campaign | Hit a 3-pointer in each of the team's final seven games | Logged 60 of his 82 points over the final 11 games of the season for an average of 5.5 points per game
- **Trent Noah, Sophomore, Forward:** Appeared in 24 games during debut season | Averaged 2.7 points and 1.9 rebounds per game | Was key in home win over Tennessee, finishing with a season-best 11 points while hitting three 3s in the game. He became just the third player in program history to connect on three or more 3s off the bench against an AP Top 5 opponent
- **Brandon Garrison, Junior, Forward:** Averaged 5.9 points, 3.9 rebounds and 1.9 assists per game as a sophomore | Had a season-high 15 points, four assists, three steals and two boards in the home finale against LSU
- **Jaland Lowe, Junior, Guard:** Preseason Third-Team All-SEC by media | Led Pitt in scoring at 16.8 points per game and was one of eight players in Division I to average at least 16.5 points, 4.0 rebounds and 5.5 assists | Recorded sixth triple-double in Pitt history with 11 points, 10 rebounds and 10 assists vs. VMI

## Associated Press Poll All-Time Leader

Not only is Kentucky the nation's all-time wins leader and the team with the best all-time winning percentage, it has been ranked in the Associated Press more than any other program.

Kentucky has been ranked in the AP poll during 996 weeks in the poll's 77-year history. North Carolina (972), Duke (924), Kansas (886) and UCLA (749) round out the top five.

The Wildcats were ranked No. 1 for the first time in the second month of the poll in Feb. 1949. UK has played a total of 252 games as the nation's top-ranked team.

The Nov. 18, 2024 jump from No. 19 to No. 9 was the largest single-week rise for Kentucky in program history (10 spots). The previous record was a nine-spot jump accomplished in February of 2001.

## Kentucky Boasts Nation-Leading 27 Players on NBA Opening-Day Rosters

The 2025-26 NBA season tipped off on Oct. 21st and Kentucky men's basketball continued its extensive presence with a nation-leading 27 players featured on opening day rosters across the league. It marks the 14th consecutive season in which Kentucky has set the benchmark for alumni in The Association.

The total of 27 players is based off the NBA's official opening-day roster list and includes all two-way and inactive players.

UK is represented on 20 NBA franchises, with seven teams featuring multiple Wildcats on their rosters. The Phoenix Suns lead the league with three UK products, while the Dallas Mavericks, Miami Heat, Minnesota Timberwolves, Oklahoma City Thunder, Philadelphia 76ers and San Antonio Spurs each have two.

Two Cats from the 2024-25 Kentucky Wildcats earned spots in the NBA to begin the season including Koby Brea on the Phoenix Suns and Amari Williams on the Boston Celtics.

Kentucky's decorated NBA group is coming off a highly successful 2024-25 season. Shai Gilgeous-Alexander became the first Kentucky men's basketball product to capture the NBA Most Valuable Player award on his way to leading the Oklahoma City Thunder to an NBA Championship alongside Cason Wallace. Gilgeous-Alexander was joined by Karl-Anthony Towns as an All-NBA performer. Those two, along with Anthony Davis and Tyler Herro, were selected as NBA All-Stars.

### Notable nuggets about UK's NBA stars:

- Shai Gilgeous-Alexander (Thunder) and Tyrese Maxey (76ers) were named the Western and Eastern Conference Players of the Week, respectively, on Nov. 3
- Gilgeous-Alexander registered his 93rd consecutive game with at least 20 points scored in a win over the Trail Blazers on Nov. 30. That streak is now the second-longest in NBA history, trailing only Wilt Chamberlain's streak of 126 games.
- Koby Brea (Suns) and Amari Williams (Celtics) both scored their first career points early in the season. Brea had a layup vs. the Spurs on Nov. 2, while Williams' first tally came on a left-handed hook in the lane on Nov. 1 vs. the Rockets
- Only two players in NBA history have opened a season with 10 straight games of at least 25 points scored and at least five assists dished: Maxey in 2025-26 and Allen Iverson in 2005-06
- Reed Sheppard (Rockets) scored a career-high 31 points and had a career-best nine boards against the Warriors on Nov. 26. He became the second youngest player in Houston history to record 30+ points, 8+ boards and 5+ assists in a game
- De'Aaron Fox (Spurs) had 37 points, the most in his career as a Spur, and added eight assists in a win over Portland on Nov. 26
- Jamal Murray (Nuggets) poured in 52 points and drained a career-best 10 of 11 from distance on Dec. 2 vs. the Pacers. He was named NBA Player of the Week on Dec. 8
- As of Dec. 5, Gilgeous-Alexander in his last 100 regular-season games had the following stats (3,243 points, 637 assists, 164 steals, 52.3 field-goal percentage) - the only other player to match or exceed those numbers over a 100-game span since steals began being tracked was Michael Jordan
- Karl-Anthony Towns and the Knicks claimed the NBA Cup on Dec. 16. Towns had 16 points, 11 rebounds and a pair of steals in the win. The Knicks downed De'Aaron Fox and Keldon Johnson from the Spurs. Fox had 16 points and nine assists in the loss, while Johnson posted three points and four boards
- Karl-Anthony Towns (Knicks), De'Aaron Fox (Spurs), and Shai Gilgeous-Alexander (Thunder), were all named to the NBA Cup All-Tournament Team
- Jamal Murray (Nuggets) had 35 points and 10 assists, while making nine 3s. He's the first player in the history of the NBA to have those numbers in a Christmas Day game
- TyTy Washington (Clippers) was signed to a two-way contract in late December pushing UK's numbers to 28 players on NBA Rosters in 2025-26
- Karl-Anthony Towns (Knicks) became the fastest player in NBA history to amass 15,000 points, 7,500 rebounds and 1,000 3-pointers. He did so in just 677 games, bettering Dirk Nowitzki's mark of 879 outings
- Shai Gilgeous-Alexander was named the Western Conference Player of the Month for the month of December

## Cats Rock at Rupp

The Wildcats are 685-90 (88.4%) in Rupp Arena. Among the most notable marks of dominance as the nation's toughest venue to play include:

- Kentucky is 366-55 (87.0%) in regular-season SEC games in Rupp
- The Wildcats set a program home record of 19 wins in 2014-15
- Kentucky has a perfect mark in 14 of Rupp Arena's 50 seasons

## 600 Wins at Rupp in Record Time

With a victory over Fairleigh Dickinson on Dec. 7, 2019, Kentucky reached the 600-win mark at Rupp Arena faster than any other program in NCAA Division I level history. UK needed just 670 games to reach win No. 600 in Rupp Arena.

It took UCLA, which previously owned the fastest pace to 600 wins, 689 games in Pauley Pavilion. Only one other team, Kansas, achieved win No. 600 in fewer than 700 games at its home venue. The Jayhawks reached the significant win in their 699th game.

## Celebrating 50 Years

UK Athletics and Rupp Arena at Central Bank Center, proudly managed by Oak View Group, will celebrate a season-long celebration for the 50th season of Kentucky men's basketball playing in one of the most iconic venues in college sports.

Since opening its doors in 1976, Rupp Arena has been home to countless unforgettable moments, including four NCAA Championship-winning teams, legendary players and generations of Big Blue Nation faithful.

The milestone season will honor that rich history with a series of in-venue celebrations, social media throwbacks and special broadcast programming through the UK Sports Network. Throughout the 2025-26 season, fans can expect a variety of tributes to the program's storied history, including highlight reels, commemorative content and special recognitions during home games. The celebration will also spotlight the fans who have made Rupp Arena one of the most electric environments in all of sports.

## The Top-Ranked Team at Home

Kentucky has lost just four times at home as the Associated Press top-ranked team in the history of the program and just three times in Rupp Arena. Prior to the losses to Evansville (Nov. 12, 2019) and UCLA (Dec. 3, 2016), the other two losses came by just one point.

The Wildcats are 54-3 all-time as the AP No. 1 team in Rupp Arena since its opening in 1976. The first loss was to Auburn, 53-52, on Jan. 9, 1988.

## Mark Pope the player in Rupp Arena

Mark Pope, the 23rd head coach in program history made his debut on Nov. 4, 2024 in a matchup with Wright State, a 103-62 win.

Prior to leading UK, he coached one time against the Cats inside of Rupp on the opposing sidelines. His Utah Valley squad held a 34-22 lead at halftime on Nov. 10, 2017, but ultimately UK would win 73-63 behind 13 points, four assists and four steals from future NBA All-Star Shai Gilgeous-Alexander.

As an active UK player, Pope's teams went 25-1 (96.2%) inside of Rupp Arena. In those 26 appearances, Pope's playing days produced:

- Kentucky averaged 89.8 points per game
- UK's average margin of victory was 25.3 points per game
- The Cats defeated four ranked squads, including one top-10 ranked foe
- Pope scored in every game in which he appeared, and averaged 8.2 points and 6.6 rebounds per game

# HEAD COACH MARK POPE



Mark Pope, a captain of the University of Kentucky's 1996 National Championship team, returned to Lexington as the 23rd head coach of Kentucky's storied men's basketball program in April of 2024.

In 10 seasons as head coach, with stops at BYU and Utah Valley before coming to Kentucky, Pope has amassed a career record of 211-120. His squads have won 20 or more games in seven of the last eight seasons and he advanced to the Sweet 16 of the 2025 NCAA Tournament, his first at the helm of the Wildcats.

Kentucky went 24-12 overall in his inaugural season at his alma mater. Included in those victories were eight against Associated Press Top 15 opponents, tying Indiana (1992-93) and Duke (1978-79) for the most in a single season in collegiate basketball history. Five of the eight wins were against top 10 foes, setting a new program record. The Cats themselves ranked inside of the AP Top 25 for the duration of the season and finished the year ranking No. 12 overall.

With a win over No. 6 Florida on Jan. 4, Pope joined Adolph Rupp as the only coaches in program history to win each of their first three matchups vs. AP Top 10 teams.

He did it in dramatic fashion as well. Pope and his squad overcame a 16-point halftime deficit to outlast No. 7 Gonzaga on Dec. 7, 2024. It matched the largest halftime hole

overcome in program history. Making the wins over AP opponents even more impressive, the squad captured only one win over a top 15 team at full strength as the season was plagued with injuries. That victory was a stunning come-from-behind victory over No. 6 Duke in the third game of the season.

The Wildcats downed Troy and Illinois to reach the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament. They became the first team in more than 20 years with zero returning points from the previous season to reach at least the second weekend of the tournament.

Kentucky finished the season ranking in the top 10 in KenPom offensive efficiency, it ranked seventh in the nation in points per game and set a program record with 341 made 3s. Furthermore, six players averaged double-digit scoring for the first time in school history.

To cap off a historic season, the Cats had two players (Koby Brea and Amari Williams) hear their names called in the 2025 NBA Draft. Brea went No. 41 overall to the Phoenix Suns, while Williams ended up with the Celtics. Lamont Butler, Andrew Carr and Jaxson Robinson all signed free-agent deals with NBA squads.

Pope returned to UK from Provo, Utah, where he compiled a 110-52 record (.679) during five campaigns at the helm of BYU. He took the Cougars to three postseason appearances, including two trips to the NCAA Tournament, and missed another bid when the 2020 event was cancelled because of the Covid pandemic. Three of his five BYU teams finished the season ranked in the top 20 of the KenPom efficiency ratings.

Pope went 23-11 in 2023-24. It was BYU's first season in the Big 12 Conference and the Cougars' 10-8 league record featured victories over No. 7 Kansas, No. 11 Baylor and No. 24 Iowa State. BYU's first win in the Big 12, on January 13 at Central Florida, also marked Pope's 100th victory as head coach of the Cougars.

The Cougars ranked third in the country with 11.1 made 3-pointers per game in 2023-24, and also ranked in the top 10 in assists per game (3rd) and assist-to-turnover ratio (6th). BYU led the Big 12 in scoring at 81.4 points per game. They were ranked as high as No. 12 in the AP Poll after going 12-1 in nonconference action, winning the Vegas Showdown, BYU's first multi-team event title since 2011. Pope was named to the 2024 Naismith College Coach of the Year Late Season Watch List for his efforts.

Pope's teams also hit the postseason in 2020-21, finishing with a 20-7 mark and making BYU's first appearance in the NCAA Tournament since 2015. The Cougars were 24-11 in 2021-22 and advanced to the quarterfinals of the National Invitation Tournament. The Cougars captured win No. 60 under Pope in January of '22, making him the fastest BYU coach to achieve the mark.

Pope began his head coaching stint at BYU in the 2019-20 season, tallying a 24-8 record, the most wins for a first-year coach in program history. He finished the season ranked No. 18 in the Associated Press poll and No. 16 in the USA Today/Coaches poll, becoming the first head coach at BYU to conclude the season with a national ranking in his first season. The Cougars finished second in the West Coast Conference with a 13-3 record. The Cougars also toppled No. 2-ranked Gonzaga, earning their best win over a ranked opponent inside their home venue in program history. The COVID pandemic prevented an almost-certain bid to the NCAA Tournament.

Pope's Cougars were statistically among the top offenses in the nation in '19-20. The Cougars finished the season ranked first in 3-point field goal percentage, second in assist-to-turnover ratio, third in field-goal percentage, fourth in 3-point field goals per game and fifth in assists per game.

Following his first season with the Cougars, Matt Norlander of CBS tabbed Pope as the best hire of the year. He was also awarded with the United States Basketball Writers Association District VIII Coach of the Year honor. He was a semifinalist for the Werner Ladder Naismith Coach of the Year.

Pope's first head coaching stint was a four-year term at Utah Valley. Beginning in 2015-16, the Wolverines increased their win total during every season of Pope's tenure, culminating in a 25-10 overall mark and a runner-up finish in the Western Athletic Conference in 2018-19. Utah Valley was 30-2 at home from 2017-19, and the 25 wins in 2019 were a single-season school record.

He began his collegiate playing career at the University of Washington, where he was tabbed the 1992 Pac-10 Freshman of the Year. After his sophomore season, he transferred to Kentucky, where he appeared in every game of his two-year career with the Wildcats. UK won the 1995 and '96 regular-season Southeastern Conference championships, the '95 SEC Tournament title and the 1996 NCAA Tournament. He averaged 7.9 points and 5.7 rebounds per game in 69 career games. Pope was named to the All-SEC Tournament Team in 1995, behind a pair of double-doubles in three games, including one in the title game that went to overtime.

Pope was selected in the second round of the 1996 NBA Draft by the Indiana Pacers. He played professional basketball from 1997-2005, including terms with Indiana, Milwaukee Bucks, New York Knicks and Denver Nuggets. In 2000-01, he started 45 games and helped the Bucks reach the Eastern Conference Finals.

Following his playing days, Pope enrolled in medical school at Columbia University and completed two years before returning to basketball. He joined Mark Fox's staff at Georgia in 2009. He then spent one season as an assistant coach for Jeff Bzdelik at Wake Forest and four seasons at BYU under Dave Rose. The Cougars posted four straight 20-win seasons and advanced to postseason play in each of those four years, including three bids to the NCAA Tournament. His success as an assistant at BYU was the springboard to become head coach at Utah Valley.

Pope and his wife, Lee Anne, have four daughters, Ella, Avery, Layla and Shay. He is a 1996 graduate of Kentucky with a degree in English.

# HEAD COACH MARK POPE

## Career Highlights

### Kentucky

- UK captured eight wins over AP Top-15 opponents this season, the most in program history. That mark is tied with 1992-93 Indiana and 1978-79 Duke for the most top 15 wins ever in a single season. Kentucky defeated only one AP Top 15 team (Duke) at full strength
- Kentucky made 341 3-pointers on the year, which is the most in a single-season in program history in Pope's first season
- UK was the only team in the last 20 years to make the Sweet 16 having not returned a single point scorer from the prior season
- Six players finished the season averaging double-figure points per game. It marked the first time in school history a team had six double-digit scorers

### BYU

- After being picked to finish last in its first season in the Big 12, Pope led the Cougars to a fifth-place finish with wins over No. 7 Kansas, No. 11 Baylor and No. 24 Iowa State
- 2024 Naismith College Coach of the Year Late Season Watch List
- The 2023-24 Cougars spent 16 weeks in the AP Top 25, the second-most appearances in school history
- One of four coaches in program history to win 20 or more games in first three seasons as head coach, joining G. Ott Romney, Roger Reid and Dave Rose
- Led BYU to its first appearance in the NCAA Tournament since 2015 in 2021
- Named USBWA District VII Coach of the Year after leading BYU to a 24-8 record before COVID-19 canceled postseason play
- The 24 wins in his inaugural season was a program record
- Cougars ranked first in the nation in 3-point percentage in 2020, marking just the second time in program history that BYU ranked first nationally in any offensive statistic
- In 2023-24, BYU ranked second in the nation in 3-point attempts and third in made 3-pointers per game and assists per game
- Was the fastest coach to 60 wins in program history
- Became only the second coach in program history to earn an AP Top 25 ranking in his first season, and the first to finish the year among the top 25
- Downed No. 2 Gonzaga in 2020 at home, marking the highest-ranked foe ever defeated in the Marriott Center
- Four of his five BYU teams spent time in the AP Top 25. Prior to his hiring in 2019, BYU had not appeared in a single poll since the 2010-11 season

### Utah Valley

- Increased total victories every season at the helm
- With 23 wins in 2017-18 and 25 in 2018-19, Pope guided the Wolverines to the first back-to-back 20-win seasons in program history
- The 25 wins in 2018-19 were the most ever in the program's history
- Coached the 2019 Western Athletic Conference Player and Freshman of the Year
- Utah Valley was 20-2 at home from 2017-19
- Led the Wolverines to 22 consecutive home wins from 2017-19. It was the nation's second-longest active home winning streak at the time and the longest in school history




