Storylines

- The Tigers sit at No. 4 in the national standings with their average of 197.175.

- LSU's score in their 2026 season opener (197.500) was their highest road opener in program history and their second-highest score for a season opener ever, only trailing a 197.825 in their 2017 season opener.

- The Tigers sit in the top-10 on vault, bars and beam nationally, including being the No. 3 squad in the nation on bars.

- LSU returned 14 gymnasts from last year's squad, including four fifth-year seniors, while welcoming three transfers and

four freshman to their 2026 roster.

- This year's squad is composed of a total of 21 gymnasts: seven seniors, five juniors, five sophomores and four freshmen.

- Jay Clark begins his sixth season at the helm alongside Associate Head Coaches Courtney McCool Griffeth and Garrett Griffeth, who begin their fifth season.

- National Champion, two-time individual NCAA Champion and Honda and AI Award Winner Haleigh Bryant joins the LSU staff in 2026 for her first season as Assistant Coach.

- Clark has led the Tigers to three consecutive NCAA Championship appearances.

- LSU enters 2026 as back-to-back SEC Champions, claiming the conference title in both 2024 and 2025. The Tigers also won the regular season title last year for the first time since 2018.

- LSU is on a 15-0 win streak when competing inside the PMAC, having not lost at home since January 16, 2023.

- The teams theme for the 2026 season is "Clear Path," meaning they are focused on clearing anything that would path in their route to nationals.

The Matchup

LSU Gymnastics Welcomes Kentucky in 2026 Home Opener

The No. 4 LSU Gymnastics team (2-1-1) will welcome Kentucky (0-4) for their 2026 home opener on Friday, January 23 at 6:30 p.m. CT inside the Pete Maravich Assembly Center. The meet will air live on ESPN2 with John Roethlisberger (PxP), Sam Peszek (Analyst) and Taylor Davis (reporter) calling the action. The Tigers are looking to continue a 15-win streak inside the PMAC this Friday against the Wildcats. LSU is 89-10-0 all-time against Kentucky and 25-2-0 when competing against them at home. LSU won their last regular season dual-meet against Kentucky in 2024. Both teams are coming off losses, with the Tigers losing at No. 8 Georgia and the Wildcats losing against Arizona State.

JAY CLARK

HEAD COACH • 6th Season

Jay Clark and the LSU Tigers made history in 2024 as the first team to bring a national championship home to Baton Rouge. The Tigers claimed their first national title on April 20, 2024 with their score of 198.225 in the NCAA Championship Finals to defeat California (197.850), Utah (197.800) and Florida (197.4375). With the win, LSU became just the eighth program in NCAA history to win the women's gymnastics championship, thanks to the leadership of Clark, who owns over 30 years of experience in college gymnastics.

A native of Roswell, Georgia, Clark was tabbed as the third head coach in program history in August 2021 following the retirement of former coach D-D Breaux. A 33-year veteran of the sport, he continues to lead the LSU Gymnastics program to new heights. He enters his sixth season as the head coach and 15th season overall at LSU in 2026.

During his time at the helm, Clark and the Tigers have marked multiple milestones together, including one national title, back-to-back SEC Championships, two regional titles, three straight appearances in the NCAA Championships and more. The Tigers even set a school record score (198.475) in 2024 and earned their first ever No. 1 seed in the postseason in 2025.

Clark was named the 2024 SEC Co-Head Coach of the Year after winning the program's fifth SEC Championship and the Region One Head Coach of the Year after winning the Fayetteville Regional. He was also named the Top Collegiate Coach in Louisiana by Allstate Sugar Bowl, but his accolades don't end there. Clark owns multiple Central Region coaching honors, including National Assistant Coach of the Year in 2006, 2014, 2016 and 2017. He is also a member of the USA Gymnastics Region Eight Hall of Fame.

Over the last two years, the program has also seen record attendance numbers thanks to Clark's efforts. The Tigers have gone undefeated at home in the past two seasons, with a current 15-0 unbeaten streak, and haven't lost in the PMAC since January 16, 2023. In 2024 and 2025 combined, the program welcomed seven sold-out crowds. LSU finished the regular season No. 1 in attendance nationally the past two years, averaging over 13,000 fans per meet and marking the highest average in school history in 2025. A total of over 65,700 Tiger fans showed out to the PMAC across five home meets in 2025.

Clark has seen much success in his career, both in the gym and on the recruiting trail. As the Tigers' associate head coach for eight seasons and co-head coach for one, Clark's leadership and expertise has helped bring unprecedented success on the recruiting trail and in the gym for LSU. In her senior season, he coached one of the most decorated gymnasts in LSU Gymnastics history in Haleigh Bryant, who was the 2024 SEC Gymnast of the Year, NCAA All-Around Champion, AAI Award Winner and Honda Sport Award Winner. He's regarded as one of the best recruiters in the sport, as highlighted by ESPN and ESPN The Magazine when he was named the ninth-best recruiter in college athletics in 2011.

As a coach, LSU has earned some of their best performances in school history since Clark's arrival, including eight appearances in the NCAA Championship Finals, numerous school records, 11 NCAA individual national champions, and five SEC Championships. Under his leadership, he led the Tigers to their first Final Four appearance under his tenure in 2023 before becoming the first gymnastics coach to bring home a national title.

His work with the Fighting Tigers of LSU has not gone unnoticed. Clark has been named the Central Region Co-Assistant Coach of the Year along with former LSU assistant Bob Moore five times.

Clark also earned the 2014 and 2017 National Co-Assistant Coach of the Year award with Moore. It marked the third time in his distinguished coaching career he has garnered the nation's top award.

He was inducted into the USA Gymnastics Region 8 Hall of Fame in 2018.

In the gym, Clark is viewed as the top bars coach in collegiate gymnastics history. Under his supervision, LSU has seen 45 All-America honors on bars, four of the five highest bars team scores in school history and the top two bars champions in LSU history. LSU's bars lineup has finished in the top-10 in the nation 12 times, including the No. 1 team in 2018.

Clark tutored Sarah Finnegan, who ended her career in April 2019 as one of the greatest gymnasts in LSU history. Finnegan became the first NCAA bars champion in school history in 2017 and earned the title once again in 2019. Finnegan and Lexie Priessman won SEC bars champions in 2019 and 2017 respectively, scored perfect scores in 2019 and led the squad that finished fourth in the nation.

The 2018 season on bars under Clark marked the best lineup in LSU history and one of the best in the history of the NCAA. The group posted a school record score of 49.725 and once again went on to break the record against Arizona with a 49.750 for the second-highest in all of NCAA Gymnastics since 1988. The lineup, anchored by Finnegan, led the nation on bars for the first time in school history. Finnegan became the first gymnast in school history to finish the season ranked No. 1 on the event and joined Sharene Mamby (2001) and Syreeta Barnett (1997) as the only gymnasts at LSU to score a perfect 10.0 on the event.

In 2017, Clark coached Finnegan to the first NCAA Uneven Bars Championship in school history. Clark set the record for the most individual national champions on the event in NCAA gymnastics history.

The Tigers have posted a Top-10 national ranking on Clark's event for the last 11 consecutive years, including a seven year stretch in the top-5 from 2014-2020, and No. 1 finish in 2018.

In his first season with the Tigers, Clark coached Morrison and Wyrick to First-Team All-America honors on bars, and it marked the first season LSU produced at least two All-Americans on bars since 2010.

Before Clark joined LSU after he spent 20 seasons at the University of Georgia where he helped guide the Gym Dogs to seven NCAA National Titles and 14 SEC Championships.

Clark primarily coached bars at Georgia, and he coached the Gym Dogs to 64 All-America honors and seven NCAA individual national titles on bars, including two-time champions Courtney Kupets and Kat Ding.

From 2009-12, Clark served as the head coach at Georgia, and during that time the Gym Dogs captured three NCAA individual national championships, won the 2012 NCAA Auburn Regional, and produced 23 All-America honors. In 2012, his Georgia team won the Bulldog Cup, which recognizes the UGA team that excels academically, supports their peers in athletics and consistently serves the community.

Prior to his stint as head coach, Clark was the recruiting coordinator at Georgia from 1999-2009 while serving as assistant coach from 1999-2004 and associate head coach from 2005-09 when Georgia won an NCAA record five-straight national titles.

Clark also coached at the club level for 13 years from 1992-2005 as the founder, owner and head coach of Classic City Gymnastics in Athens, Georgia. He coached several Classic City gymnasts to state, regional, national championships and to the Junior Olympic National Team, and eight gymnasts went on to compete collegiately at the NCAA Division I level.

A native of Roswell, Georgia, Clark earned his undergraduate degree in exercise science from Georgia. He has two children – a son, Cole, and a daughter, Kinsey.

NOTEBOOK

Last Time On The Floor

- The Tigers fell to No. 8 Georgia in their second road meet of the season last Friday night by a final score of 197.200-196.850.
- Despite the loss, multiple Tigers put up career high numbers against the Bulldogs. In only her second beam routine of her career, Lexi Zeiss put up a career high 9.875 to finish out a strong three-event night for the sophomore.
- Amari Drayton captured a career high 9.925 on beam and Kaliya Lincoln put up a career high 9.925 on floor in the anchor spot.
- The team took home four individual event titles after the meet in Athens.
- Chio put together a standout performance, outright winning the vault and beam titles. McClain also finished the meet tied for first on bars with her 9.950 and Ulrich's 39.275 on the night earned her the first all-around title of her LSU career.

Week 3 Road To Nationals Rankings

- The Tigers sit at No. 4 in the country after their first two meets of the 2026 season with an average of 197.175. Florida sits in first with an average of 197.575, while Oklahoma and Alabama round out the top three this week.
- In the event rankings, LSU sits in the top 10 on vault (49.200), bars (49.463) and beam (49.400). The Tigers are the No. 3 bars squad in the nation currently.
- Kailin Chio and Madison Ulrich are two of the top 20 all-arounders in the nation in the week three rankings, as Ulrich sits at No. 13 and Chio at No. 17.
- Chio also sits No. 4 in the country on vault and No. 2 on beam.
- Konnor McClain ranks No. 4 on bars with her average of 9.938 and Courtney Blackson ranks No. 12 with an average of 9.900.
- Amari Drayton and Kaliya Lincoln also sit amongst the top 25 performers on two events. Drayton is No. 8 on beam and Lincoln is No. 22 on floor after two career high performances from the duo last week.

Kailin Chio Week 2 SEC Gymnast of the Week

- Kailin Chio was named the Week 2 SEC Gymnast of the Week following her standout performance in the Tigers' season-opening meet in the third-annual Sprouts Collegiate Quad.
- In the first meet of her sophomore season, Chio captured the all-around title in Session I of the Sprouts Quad on January 10 against some of the top teams in the nation, finishing as the top all-arounder with her score of 39.600. The performance set the tone for her sophomore campaign and helped LSU open the 2026 season in strong fashion.
- In the Tigers season opener in Utah, Chio recorded three scores of 9.900 or higher across four events. She tallied scores of a 9.900 on vault, 9.850 on bars, 9.900 on floor and matched her career-high score on beam with a 9.950 to secure her first all-around win of the year.
- The Las Vegas native picked up right where she left off after an exceptional freshman season in 2025 that saw her become the NCAA Vault Champion and SEC Freshman of the Year. After just one meet, the now sophomore has already claimed her first SEC Award of 2026.
- Chio previously won SEC Freshman of the Week honors nine times in 2025 — the most by any freshman in SEC history — breaking the previous conference record of eight.

2025 Season Recap

- The LSU Gymnastics team posted a strong season in 2025, earning their third consecutive appearance in the NCAA Championships, becoming back-to-back SEC Champions, SEC Regular Season Champions and Regional Champions for the second straight year.
- Throughout the 2025 regular season, the Tigers did not rank lower than No. 3 in the national standings all year, including claiming the top-spot in Week 12 that propelled them into the postseason.
- LSU went on to win the 2025 SEC Championships in Tulsa on March 22 with a record breaking score of 198.200 in Session II of the championships.
- The Tigers final score of 198.200 was the best score in LSU's history at the SEC Championships to finish as the top team across both sessions of competition. No. 1 Oklahoma finished in second with their score of 197.925 and Florida in third with their 197.825.
- LSU has now won the SEC title in five of the last eight years, including two consecutive under head coach Jay Clark.
- Following SEC's, the squad improved their NQS to 198.115, earning them the top spot previously mentioned in the final rankings before the NCAA postseason began. LSU was the first team to end Oklahoma's reign at the top of the national leaderboard since 2022.
- The Tigers entered the NCAA postseason as the No. 1 seed for the first time in

program history in 2025, claiming their 40th straight regional berth to the Penn State Regional. It was there that the squad became regional champions to secure their spot at nationals in Fort Worth.

- No. 1 LSU (198.050) defeated No. 8 Michigan State (198.00), No. 9 Kentucky (197.625) and No. 16 Arkansas (197.325) in the Penn State Regional Final on April 5 to finish in the top two and advance to the NCAA Semifinals.
- Last year's NCAA Regional berth was the Tigers 42nd overall appearance in the postseason. LSU currently owns 34 NCAA Championships appearances and 15 NCAA Regional championships in program history.
- The No. 1 LSU Gymnastics team had their 2025 season come to a close in the evening session of the 2025 NCAA Championship Semifinals after finishing third with a 197.5250 team score on April 17 in Dickies Arena.
- The Tigers finished behind Utah (197.7625) and UCLA (197.7375) in the meet, who advanced to Saturday's final round with their top two finishes. The Tigers defeated Michigan State (197.3625) on the night.
- Kailin Chio won the NCAA Vault title following her 9.9750 routine in the semifinals, the best by any gymnast on the day.
- LSU combined for 10 All-America honors in 2025 between current team members Kailin Chio, Konnor McClain and Amari Drayton. The program earned a total of 21 honors in 2025 and now own 348 All-America awards entering 2026.

The 2026 Roster

- This year's roster combines seasoned returners and promising newcomers. LSU returned 14 from the 2025 squad, including four fifth-year seniors, and welcomed seven newcomers. The roster is composed of a total of 21 gymnasts – seven seniors, five juniors, five sophomores and four freshmen.
- The program welcomed three transfers, one fifth-year senior, one true senior and one junior, as well as four freshmen.
- Courtney Blackson, Emily Innes and Madison Ulrich are the three transfers who joined the Tigers in 2026.
- While LSU graduated veteran all-around competitors Haleigh Bryant and Aleah Finnegan and key multi-event performers such as Sierra Ballard, KJ Johnson and Alyona Shchennikova, the Tigers reloaded over the summer and feel confident in their current team to step into those lineup roles.
- 2025 SEC Freshman of the Year Kailin Chio is ready for her second season with the Tigers following a historic freshman season that made her a seven-time All-American. Her classmates – Lexi Zeiss, Kaliya Lincoln, Victoria Roberts and Zoe Miller – have also been building for year two.
- Zeiss is ready to go on all four events, while Lincoln is ready on three and Roberts on two. Miller is easing back in from two previous shoulder surgeries, but is currently training beam and floor for the Tigers.
- Konnor McClain, Amari Drayton, Kylie Coen and Leah Miller make up this year's junior class. • McClain is a six-time All-American and two-time All-SEC member who primarily competes on bars, beam and floor for the Tigers, while Drayton earned her first regular season All-America honor on floor in 2025 and primarily competes vault and floor, but is ready to go on beam as well this year.
- Coen made her debut on beam and floor for the Tigers in 2025 and will look to be a mainstay in those two lineups again in 2026.
- Ashley Cowan is now a true senior in 2026 and is a veteran to the bars lineup alongside fifth-year seniors Tori Tatum and Alexis Jeffrey on that event.
- Kathryn Weilbacher and Chase Brock are also back for their fifth-year and are training the all-around. Weilbacher debuted routines on vault, beam and floor for the Tigers at Open Mike Night showcase on January 2nd.
- Transfers Courtney Blackson, Emily Innes and Madison Ulrich joined the Tigers roster in 2026, providing depth on multiple events for LSU this year.
- Blackson returned to gymnastics for her fifth and final season after taking a year off. She competed at Boise State from 2021-2024, where she was two-time All-American and finished as the national vault runner-up at the NCAA Championships in 2023. Blackson brings career highs of 10.000 on vault and 9.950 on bars and floor.
- Innes came from the University of Washington, where she competed three seasons from 2023-2025. She is a 2025 Big Ten All-Conference selection on floor and a Big Ten All-Championship Team honoree who also captured the NCAA Regional Floor title in 2024. She owns career highs of 9.875 on vault, 9.900 on beam and 9.950 on floor.
- Ulrich begins her junior season at LSU after a standout two-year career at Denver, where she competed in the all-around in every meet and became one of the program's most decorated gymnasts. She comes to LSU a three-time All-American and an individual qualifier at the 2025 NCAA Championships. She earned All-Big 12 Conference honors in 2025 and was named the Big 12 Newcomer of the Year in 2024.
- The junior will be pivotal in the all-around for the Tigers with career bests of 9.925 on vault, 9.975 on bars, 9.900 on beam, 9.950 on floor and 39.575 in the all-around.
- Nina Ballou, Molly Brinkman, Haley Mustari and Elyse Wenner round out this year's roster as the freshmen class. Ballou and Brinkman trained the all-around all preseason for the Tigers while Mustari has been consistently training bars, beam and floor.
- Ballou is a five-time National Champion and three-time Nastia Liukin Cup qualifier who trained at American Twisters in Coconut Creek, Florida. She medaled in the all-around at three consecutive national championships, including winning gold in 2022.
- Brinkman is a native of Chandler, Arizona, who trained at Gold Medal Gymnastics. She is a five-time

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Arizona state champion and three-time national qualifier. She earned gold on vault, bars, and floor at the 2025 Arizona State Championships while also claiming the floor title at Regionals in 2025.

- A native of Edmond, Oklahoma, Mustari is a decorated Level 10 gymnast with multiple national accolades who trained at Dynamo Gymnastics. A six-time national champion with five nationals appearances, Mustari recorded nine perfect 10's in her Level 10 career, including eight on bars.
- Wenner is a native of Breinigsville, Pennsylvania, who trained at Stallone Gymnastics. Wenner is a two-time nationals and Nastia Liukin Cup qualifier. She earned three national titles in her Level 10 career, including two on beam and one on vault.
- Across all four events, LSU looks to leverage its blend of experience and youthful talent as it navigates one of the country's toughest schedules, highlighted by competitive outings against SEC rivals and nationally ranked programs throughout the season.

2025 All-Americans

- LSU combined for 21 All-America honors in 2025, with 14 coming in the regular season, matching the program record for the most honors in a single season set in 2018, and seven in the postseason.
- In the regular season All-America awards, Haleigh Bryant claimed three honors on vault, beam and floor at the conclusion of the regular season, including first team honors on vault and floor with her NQS of 9.925 and 9.945 on each event, respectively.
- Kailin Chio took home All-America honors on every event and the all-around in her first regular season with the Tigers, the most by any Tiger in their debut season. She was also one of only four gymnasts in the nation to earn All-America honors on every event and the all-around during the regular season.
- Chio finished as one of the top eight performers in the country on two events and in the all-around, earning first team on VT (9.955), BB (9.935) and AA (39.670). She finished the regular season with the second highest NQS on vault in the country as a freshman.
- Aleah Finnegan claimed four regular season All-America honors on vault, beam, floor and the all-around. The senior finished amongst the top all-arounders in the country with her NQS of 39.645.
- Konnor McClain earned her fifth career honor on bars, her second on the event. The sophomore placed amongst the top bars performers in the country all year long, finishing the regular season with an NQS of 9.925
- Amari Drayton earned her first career All-America honor for her performance on floor, finishing the regular season ranked at No. 11 with her NQS of 9.935.
- Bryant, Finnegan, McClain and Chio went on to also earn postseason All-America honors following the 2025 NCAA Championship Semifinals.
- NCAA postseason All-America honors celebrate the top student-athletes participating in the NCAA National Collegiate Gymnastics Championship.
- Bryant capped off a legendary career adding three more All-America honors to her resume. Already the gymnast with the most career All-America honors in LSU history, she concluded her career with 33 honors after claiming more on vault, floor and the all-around in the postseason. She finished amongst the top five all-around performers in the evening session with her score of 39.5625.
- Finnegan claimed first-team postseason All-America honors on floor after finishing as one of the top three floor performers in the semifinals with her score of 9.9375. She finishes her career as a 13-time All-American, the eighth most in LSU history.
- McClain claimed her sixth career All-America honor and her third on beam following her performance in the NCAA postseason.
- Chio added two postseason All-America honors to her resume on vault and in the all-around after already earning WCGA All-America recognition on every event and the all-around during the regular season.

Packing the PMAC

- The Tigers continue to set new attendance records every year, earning the No. 1 spot in the nation in attendance the last two years. The first time that LSU claimed the top spot was in 2022.
- With over 8,000 season ticket holders,
- The Tigers went undefeated at home in both 2024 and 2025, finishing another season with the highest average attendance in the nation.

- The squad enters 2026 with a 15-0 win streak inside the PMAC, having not lost at home since January 16, 2023.
- 2025's attendance average marked the eighth-straight season the Tigers have marked an average of 10,000 or better. A total of over 65,700+ Tiger fans showed out to the PMAC in 2025, including four out of five sold-out crowds.
- The program saw a record average attendance last year with an average of 13,157 fans throughout five home meets in 2025.

Program History

- Head Coach Jay Clark enters his sixth season leading the Tigers and 15th season overall as he continues to grow the LSU Gymnastics program.
- The Tigers have reached the NCAA Championships in Fort Worth for the last three consecutive seasons under Clark's leadership. LSU's last appearance in the finals came in 2024, when they won it all, and marked the program's 10th overall appearance in the finals.
- The 2025 season was the program's 40th straight appearance in the NCAA postseason and 42nd overall postseason appearance for the Tigers. With the team advancing out of Penn State regional last year, LSU claimed their 34th program appearance in the NCAA Championships.
- After finishing on top of the Penn State Regional Final on April 5, the Tigers claimed their 15th regional championship title in program history in 2025.
- LSU has a total of 19 individual national titles across 12 gymnasts in program history, including one title from current sophomore Kailin Chio.
- The Tigers now own six SEC Championship titles in program history, winning three consecutive titles from 2017 to 2019, 2024, and defending their SEC title again last year in 2025.
- LSU also claimed the 2025 SEC Regular Season title for only the third time in program history after defeating No. 14 Auburn on March 14. The Tigers shared the regular season title with No. 1 Oklahoma, who had the same 7-1 conference record.
- It was the Tigers first regular season title in six years, having previously won in 2017 and 2018.

Our Emmy Award-Winning Docuseries "The Climb"

- LSU Gymnastics docuseries titled "The Climb" will return for season four next week, airing nationally on LSU Plus, ESPN+ and on local affiliates throughout the 2026 season.
- The docuseries is now three-time Emmy nominated and two-time Suncoast Regional Emmy Award Recipient.
- "The Climb" is an exclusive docuseries that follows the LSU Gymnastics program, allowing fans to view behind-the-scenes content of the team that can't be found anywhere else.
- The show, which is presented by Baton Rouge Super Chevy Dealers, gives fans behind-the-scenes access to the team like no other. From team meetings to one-on-one interviews with coaches and student-athletes, the docuseries allows viewers to get an inside look at the program and get to know the story behind the team.
- The show – produced by the LSU Athletics team of creatives at South Stadium Productions – will once again take fans through the 2026 season, as the Tigers embark on a new journey to Fort Worth.
- Viewers can find all full-length episodes of all seasons on LSU Plus, the home of "The Climb" and all exclusive LSU sports content.

Tigers On TV

- The Tigers will be featured on TV eight times in 2026 across multiple ESPN networks, with televised matchups on ABC, ESPN2 and SEC Network throughout the year and solidifying LSU as one of the most visible and followed programs in the nation.
- The defending NCAA Champion Oklahoma Sooners and back-to-back SEC Champion LSU Tigers headlined this year's television lineup, sharing the top spot with eight broadcasted regular-season meets apiece.
- With eight of their 11 regular season meets being covered nationally next year, LSU matches their most appearances on TV since 2023. The squad's meets against Penn State and Arkansas will also be available via streaming on SECN+.
- The Tigers 2026 TV slate began with a marquee national appearance on ABC to open the season as LSU was featured in the third-annual Sprouts Farmers Market Collegiate Quad on January 10 live from West Valley City, Utah. The quad meet featured four of the top programs in the nation to kick off the new season: LSU, Oklahoma, UCLA and Utah.
- LSU's first SEC meet on television came last Friday when they traveled to Georgia as part of an SEC Network Friday Night Heights doubleheader.
- The Tigers will return home the following week for their home opener inside the Pete Maravich Assembly Center — a top SEC showdown against Kentucky on Friday, January 23 at 7:30 p.m. CT on ESPN2.
- One of the most anticipated matchups of the year comes on February 20, when the Tigers face the 2025 National Champion Sooners on the road in primetime in Norman, Oklahoma. Additional TV appearances for LSU include:

LSU at Missouri — Jan. 30 on SEC Network

Auburn at LSU — Feb. 13 on SEC Network

Alabama at LSU — Feb. 27 on SEC Network

LSU at Florida — March 8 on SEC Network

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- In total, LSU will appear twice on ESPN2 and five times on SEC Network, part of the network's "Friday Night Heights" national showcase.
- The 2026 SEC Gymnastics Championships, hosted at the BOK Center in Tulsa, Okla., will air exclusively on SEC Network. Coverage of the afternoon session begins at 2 p.m. CT, with the evening session tumbling along at 7 p.m. CT.
- ESPN networks will once again cover the postseason, starting with NCAA Women's Regional action streaming live on ESPN+ from Wednesday, April 1 to Sunday, April 5. Championship weekend coverage includes the Women's Semifinals on ESPN2.
- The road to Fort Worth begins in Baton Rouge, as the PMAC will once again serve as one of the NCAA Regional host sites in 2026. Tiger fans will have the opportunity to watch first, second and third round action at home for the first time since 2019.
- ABC is the home of the 2026 NCAA National Collegiate Women's Gymnastics Championships for the sixth consecutive season, culminating with the NCAA Women's Gymnastics Championships live on Saturday, April 18 at 3 p.m. CT. A live championship preview show will air at 2:30 p.m. CT ahead of the Four on the Floor.

The Freshmen Class

- This year's freshman class is made up of four newcomers - Nina Ballou, Molly Brinkman, Haley Mustari and Elyse Wenner. All four train every event for the Tigers.
- A native of Boca Raton, Florida, Ballou is a decorated all-around gymnast, including a five-time National Champion and three-time Nastia Liukin Cup qualifier.
- Ballou medaled in the all-around at three consecutive national championships, including winning gold in 2022. At the 2024 Women's Development Program National Championships in Daytona, she claimed gold on both floor and bars, marking her second career title on floor and first on bars.
- Ballou trained at American Twisters in Coconut Creek, Florida.
- Brinkman is a native of Chandler, Arizona, who trained at Gold Medal Gymnastics.
- She is a five-time Arizona state champion and three-time national qualifier who earned gold on vault, bars, and floor at the 2025 Arizona State Championships. She also claimed the floor title at Regionals in 2025.
- Brinkman consistently ranked among the top competitors in her division and finished her Level 10 career recognized as one of the top 30 gymnasts in the country.
- A native of Edmond, Oklahoma, Mustari is a decorated Level 10 gymnast who trained at Dynamo Gymnastics. She is a six-time national champion with five nationals appearances who earned her first career title in 2021 on bars and went on to win two additional bars national titles.
- In 2023, she claimed the all-around title for the first time in her career and added a national title on beam in 2024 to round out her accomplishments.
- Mustari recorded nine perfect 10's in her Level 10 career including eight on bars, and accumulated more than 25 Top-100 scores across her competitive seasons.
- A native of Breinigsville, Pennsylvania, Wenner is a decorated all-around gymnast who trained at Stallone Gymnastics.
- A two-time nationals and Nastia Liukin Cup qualifier, Wenner earned three national titles in her Level 10 career, including two on beam and one on vault.
- She posted multiple Top-100 scores throughout 2023 and finished among the top-10 gymnasts on every event at regionals, highlighted by a first-place finish on vault. She also claimed gold on beam at the 2024 national championships in Daytona and placed among the top-10 all-arounders in the Senior B division.

The Chio Files

- Now a sophomore, Kailin Chio authored one of the most historic freshman seasons in LSU and SEC history during the 2025 season.
- Chio wrapped up her first season at LSU as the 2025 NCAA Vault Champion and now seven-time All-American. She added two postseason All-America honors to her resume on vault and in the all-around after earning WCGA All-America recognition on every event and the all-around during the regular season.
- Chio competed in the all-around in all but one meet for the Tigers in 2025. The Las Vegas, Nevada, native recorded career highs of 10.000 on vault, 9.950 on bars and beam, 9.975 on floor and a 39.800 all-around total — the highest all-around score by a freshman in LSU history and the highest in the nation during the 2025 season.
- She also became the first freshman in the country to earn a perfect 10 in 2025 after sticking a perfect yurchenko one-and-a-half on vault against Auburn on March 22, marking just the fourth perfect score in the nation that season. She ranked inside the top five gymnasts in the country for five consecutive weeks and amongst the top 10 for eight of 12 weeks overall, including claiming the No. 1 vault ranking in weeks seven and 11.
- She earned SEC Freshman of the Week honors nine times during the regular season — the most by any freshman in SEC history — breaking the previous conference record of eight and surpassing LSU's prior freshman record of five. Chio finished the regular season ranked in the top 20 nationally on every event with

9.900-plus NQS marks across the board, posted nine meets with scores of 9.900 or higher on at least three events, and claimed 20 individual titles during the year.

- In her postseason debut, Chio finished among the top 10 performers at the 2025 SEC Championships on vault, bars, floor and in the all-around, including a runner-up finish on floor with a 9.950 and a fourth-place all-around showing with a 39.650.

The Coaching Staff

- Jay Clark, who served on the LSU staff for eight seasons prior to his stint as head coach, was named the third head coach of the Fighting Tigers in 2021. Clark owns over 30 years of NCAA Gymnastics experience and is one of the most respected coaches in the country.
- Clark enters his sixth year as the head coach of the Tigers and 15th season overall at LSU. He primarily coaches bars while overseeing all four events.
- Clark's bars squad has finished in the top three nationally the past two seasons.
- Courtney McCool Griffeth enters her fifth season the Associate Head Coach for the Tigers in 2026.
- McCool Griffeth has primarily coached the LSU floor squad to be one of the best in the nation over the years, including the No. 1 floor team in the nation for six weeks in 2024.
- Under McCool Griffeth's leadership, LSU has also set a program record score 49.775 against Arkansas on February 2, 2024, and set a program-record NQS on floor in 2024, the highest in NCAA history.
- McCool Griffeth will now take on all primary beam responsibilities in 2026 with the assistance of first-year Assistant Coach Haleigh Bryant.
- Garrett Griffeth also enters year six as the Associate Head Coach and recruiting coordinator. He coaches the LSU vault squad, who finished second in the nation in 2024 and first in 2025.
- Under his leadership, the Tigers have recorded the program's second-highest score on the event (49.675) at the Podium Challenge on March 8th, 2024.
- Haleigh Bryant, a 2024 national champion, two-time NCAA individual champion, five-time SEC Champion, 33-time All-American, Honda and AAI Award Winner, has joined the LSU coaching staff in 2026 after her final season of competition in 2025.
- Bryant primarily assists McCool Griffeth on beam as well as helps manage all events.
