### SEC GYMNASTICS WEEKLY HONORS PRESENTED BY ALLSTATE

**SEC Gymnast of the Week** – Oklahoma’s Addison Fatta, a sophomore from Wrightsville, Pa., won two all-around titles as she helped the Sooners earn wins over No. 4 Alabama and at the Metroplex Challenge over No. 10 Arkansas, Arizona and Texas Woman’s. On Friday against the Crimson Tide, Fatta won the event title with a 39.725, her second mark of 39.700 or better this season and the highest score in the SEC this past weekend. She also won the vault title with a career-high 9.975 as the anchor in the vault lineup and the floor title with a 9.950. On Sunday, Fatta recorded a 39.675 to win the all-around title and a career-high 9.975 on floor to claim her first floor title of the season and help the Sooners to a season-high 39.750, the highest score in the nation this season on any event.

**SEC Specialist of the Week** – Missouri’s Addison Lawrence, a senior from Olathe, Kan., took home a share of the beam title with a 9.95 in the win over No. 2 Florida. Lawrence earned her fourth event title of the season after recording her fifth score of 9.95 in six meets on the apparatus. She is one of just three gymnasts in the nation this season with five marks of 9.950 or higher on the balance beam.

**SEC Freshman of the Week** – Oklahoma’s Mackenzie Estep, a freshman from Auburn, Wash., collected five podium finishes in the wins over No. 4 Alabama and at the Metroplex Challenge over No. 10 Arkansas, Arizona and Texas Woman’s. On Sunday in Fort Worth, Estep earned her first career perfect 10 on vault, becoming just the third person in the nation to capture a perfect score on the event. She is the first OU freshman since Jordan Bowers in 2022 to earn a perfect score and only the third to do so on vault joining Bowers and Maggie Nichols. Estep rounded out the quad meet with a 9.95 on floor to tie for second place and a 9.875 on bars. On Friday, she made her debut in the all-around and took third place with a final score of 39.300. Versus the Crimson Tide, Estep tied for first place on bars with a 9.925 and tied for second on vault with a 9.95.

No. 2 Florida gymnastics opens February with loss at No. 7 Missouri on February 6 in front of 2,976 at the Mizzou Arena.

The Tigers took the win at 197.20 while Florida finished with a season-low 196.50.

Leading the Gators on bars were winning marks of 9.90s from both eMjoe Frazier and Kayla DiCello.

Florida posted a 49.25 on vault. Boosting that score was meet-leading vaults from junior Danie Ferris (9.90) and Selena Harris-Miranda (9.95). The win was Harris-Miranda's third of the season.

Ferris and Harris-Miranda again led the Gators on the next rotation with floor marks of 9.90 as UF tallied a 49.325 on the event.

Florida's finishing event was its top scorer, as the Gators tallied a 49.425 on beam. DiCello matched her season-best of 9.95 for the second consecutive meet to share the win. Harris-Miranda posted a 9.90 to tie for third.

On Friday, February 13, Florida will host Oklahoma for the 20th Annual Gators Link to Pink presented by UF Health. The meet will begin at 6:45 p.m. ET and air live on ESPN2.

The No. 6 Georgia GymDogs posted a 197.050 in a 197.450-197.050 loss to No. 10 Arkansas on February 6 at Bud Walton Arena in Fayetteville, Arkansas.

The GymDogs' team total marked Georgia's season-high score in away competition.

Senior Csenge Bácskay recorded a season-high 9.875 on bars, while senior Ja' Free Scott tied her season high with a 9.900. Junior Lily Smith anchored the bars lineup with a 9.925 to earn second overall and push Georgia to tie a season-high of 49.400 on the event.

Sophomore Harley Tomlin posted a career-high 9.925 on floor, followed by sophomore Nyla Aquino, who tied her season high with a 9.925. Tomlin and Smith tied for second on the event. Smith anchored the rotation with a 9.950 to claim the event title, her sixth floor title this season.

Scott earned a 9.925 on beam to tie her career high and place second. Freshman CaMarah Williams anchored the event with a 9.900 for third, marking the freshman's third career routine and third score of 9.900 or higher.

C. Williams tied for second overall on vault, scoring a 9.900 on the apparatus.

Georgia Gymnastics will travel to Fort Worth, Texas to compete in the Metroplex Challenge on Saturday, February 14, facing off against Stanford, California and Air Force at the Fort Worth Convention Center at 8:15 p.m. ET.

Kentucky put together its most complete performance of the season, using season high scores on all four apparatuses to earn its first victory of the season, a 197.325-196.275 win at No. 12 Auburn.

The Wildcats scored 49.2 or higher on all four events to break the 197 barrier for the first time in 2026 and set a season-best team score. The victory also marks Kentucky first road victory in SEC action since February 2, 2024 at Alabama.

The Wildcats posted the highest score of the meet on all four events and took home all five individual event titles. Delaynee Rodriguez put together another career night, setting or matching career highs on vault (9.925), bars (9.95), and in the all-around (39.650) to take home the title on all three events. Rodriguez has now won eight event titles in 2026, including the all-around crown in four out of five meets.

Freshman Gabby Van Frayen won the first event title of her career, tying for first on the balance beam (9.90). Creslyn Brose continued her excellence on floor (9.95), winning her second consecutive title on the event and eighth of her career.

Kentucky will head back to Lexington for another home meet, hosting Missouri at 7 p.m. ET on Friday, February 13, live on SEC Network.

The No. 3 LSU Gymnastics team defeated No. 14 Penn State on February 6 in a top-25 victory inside the Pete Maravich Assembly Center.

The program welcomed 11,603 fans at their meet as the Tigers extended their home win streak to 17 consecutive wins inside the PMAC.

LSU swept all five event titles on the night over Penn State. Kailin Chio was the only gymnast to compete in all four events, taking home the all-around with her second straight 39.600 performance plus the vault and beam titles with her 9.975 and 9.925 scores, respectively. Madison Ulrich took home the bars title with her 9.950 and Amari Drayton took home the floor title with her 9.950.

Chio moved her total to 14 this season and 37 in her career, while Ulrich earned only her second event title at LSU and Drayton earned her second this year and fifth total.

The Tigers will continue their homestand with an SEC showdown against Auburn on Friday, February 13 at 7:45 p.m. CT on SEC Network inside the PMAC.

No. 7 Mizzou gymnastics earned the highest-ranked win in program history, defeating No. 2 Florida, 197.200-196.500, on February 6 at Mizzou Arena in front of a crowd of 2,976.

The Tigers posted a season-high 49,525 on floor exercise and outscored the Gators on uneven bars, 49.250-48.475.

Five Tigers combined to earn event titles across three events. Addison Lawrence scored her fifth 9.950 of the year on beam to secure a share of the title. Maiya Terry claimed a share of the uneven bars crown after posting a career-best 9.900. On floor exercise, Ayla Acevedo, Kaia Tanskanen and Kennedy Griffin shared the event title with scores of 9.925.

Tanskanen competed in the all-around for the first time in her career, totaling 39.400.

Missouri will face Kentucky on Friday, February 13, at 6 p.m. CT in Lexington, Ky.. The meet will be broadcast on SEC Network.

The No. 1 Oklahoma women's gymnastics team shined on February 6, securing their second home win with a 198.200-197.475 victory over No. 4 Alabama inside Lloyd Noble Center.

It was the second top-five victory for the Sooners at home in 2026 after defeating then-No. 5 Georgia in the home opener.

Addison Fatta secured the all-around title with her second mark of 39.700-plus on the year as the sophomore notched a 39.725. Fatta also won the vault title with a near-perfect 9.975 and shared the floor title with Alabama's Azaraya Ra-Akbar with matching 9.950s. Lily Pederson, Ella Murphy, Mackenzie Estep and Alabama's Chloe LaCoursiere recorded 9.925s on bars to share the title. Faith Torrez won the beam title with a near-perfect 9.975.

Estep earned her first career perfect 10 and the No. 1 Oklahoma women's gymnastics team tallied a 198.175 in a quad meet victory over No. 10 Arkansas (197.700), Arizona (195.825) and TWU (195.025).

Estep is the first OU freshman since Jordan Bowers in 2022 to earn a 10.0 on any event and the first freshman to earn a perfect 10 in 2026. Estep is only the third athlete this season to earn a 10.0 on vault and earned the first perfect score of the year for the Sooners. Along with Estep's vault title, Fatta won the all-around with a 39.675 and floor with a 9.975.

A top-five matchup is on deck for the Sooners as they head to Florida on Friday, February 13. The meet will air on ESPN2 at 5:45 p.m. CT.
