THE FIRST TOUCH

-Addison Lawrence (No. 4 beam) and Kimarra Echols (No. 5 bars) give Missouri two top-five individual event rankings in the same week after all teams have competed for the first time in program history.
 -Missouri is coming off its highest-ranked win in program history against No. 2 Florida.
 -The Tigers are coming off a four-week stretch where they faced off against a team ranked No. 3 or better, all of which were in the 2025 NCAA Championship Semifinal or Final.
 -Missouri ranks No. 7 nationally for the fifth

consecutive week and sits in the top five on floor, continuing to establish Mizzou among the NCAA's top tier this season.
 -Missouri has scored 197.000 or higher in 36 of its last 43 meets dating back to 2023.
 -Under head coach Shannon Welker, the Tigers have finished inside the national top 15 in six consecutive seasons.
 -Missouri is one of eight teams to advance to the NCAA Championship Regional Final in each of the last five seasons.

Mizzou sits top 10 nationally on all four events for two consecutive weeks for the first time in program history.



THE MATCHUP

- Mizzou is 19-20 all-time against Kentucky.
- The Tigers defeated the Wildcats twice last season - in Columbia on January 25, 2025, and at the SEC Championship on March 22, 2025.
- In the previous regular-season meet in Columbia, Mizzou posted its highest score in series history against Kentucky, winning 197.200-196.800.

SETTING HISTORY IN MIZZOU ARENA

- Missouri earned its highest-ranked win in program history in its contest against No. 2 Florida on Friday, Feb. 6, winning 197.200-196.800.
- This marks the Tigers' third win and second-straight against Florida, most recently in the NCAA Championship Semifinal on April 17, 2025.
- MU's previous highest-ranked win came against No. 3 teams, which it has done three times in program history: against Florida last season, at home against LSU on Jan. 26, 2024, and in the NCAA Championship Semifinal over Michigan on April 15, 2022.

AMONG THE BEST OF THE BEST

- Missouri is one of only five programs nationally with at least five different gymnasts recording scores of 9.950 or higher across multiple events this season, joining Oklahoma, LSU, Florida and Utah.
- **Hannah Horton** delivered a 9.975 on vault at the team's second meet of the season.
- **Addison Lawrence** added a 9.950 on balance beam for the fourth time this season against LSU.
- Lawrence's score was matched by **Railey Jackson** at Alabama, earning a career high, and by **Lauren Macpherson** against LSU, matching her personal best.
- **Kimarra Echols** reached the threshold at Alabama on vault, becoming one of two freshmen to score 9.950 or higher on the apparatus.

THESE TIGERS ARE ON FIRE

- Mizzou ranks top 10 in all four event rankings in week six: seventh on vault, 10th on bars, seventh on beam and fourth on floor.
- Week five marked the first time in the Road to Nationals era (dating back to 1998) that Missouri ranks inside the top 10 nationally on all four events after every team has competed, and has now done so for the second-consecutive week.

ADDI'NG UP 9.950S

- **Addison Lawrence** had big shoes to fill entering her senior season in replacing the 2025 NCAA balance beam national champion Helen Hu, but has proven to be one of the best in the country on the apparatus this season.
- Lawrence has opened her final year of collegiate competition with five scores of 9.950 on beam in the team's first six meets, one of just three gymnasts nationally with five scores of 9.950 or higher.
- The Olathe, Kan., native ranks fourth nationally in balance beam scoring average at 9.937.

FAB FLOOR LOOKING FAB

- Mizzou's highest event ranking comes on the floor exercise, where it stands fourth nationally with an average of 49.433.
- The team's No. 2 floor ranking in weeks three and four tied the program's second-highest individual-event team ranking from week three onward. It previously ranked No. 1 on beam in weeks eight and nine in 2006 and No. 2 on beam in weeks three and five in 2022.
- **Kennedy Griffin** leads the team in scoring average on floor with 9.908, which stands 16th in the country, while **Hannah Horton** joins her in the top 25, standing at 24th with 9.892.
- Mizzou is one of two programs nationally with four or more gymnasts ranked in the top 50 on floor.

BEAM QUEENS

- Mizzou ranks seventh on beam after week six with a scoring average of 49.267 and a high of 49.400.
- The Tigers are one of five programs with four gymnasts ranked in the top 50 nationally on the apparatus.

KIMARRA ECHOLS - A NAME TO WATCH

- **Kimarra Echols** was named to the College Gym News 2026 Freshman of the Year Watchlist on Dec. 22, 2025, and has proven to be one of the best first-year gymnasts in the nation.
- The Henderson, Nev., native ranks fifth nationally on uneven bars with a scoring average of 9.900. She is the fourth Mizzou gymnast since 2004 to rank in the top five of the event after all teams have competed.
- She added a career-best 9.950 on bars at Alabama and a pair of 9.925s at the Ameritas Master's Classic and against LSU.
- Echols won the all-around at the Black & Gold exhibition (39.600) before making her collegiate debut against Iowa State with a 38.650 all-around, highlighted by a 9.900 on bars.

JUST HORTON THINGS

- Following the first six meets of the season, **Hannah Horton** is among the nation's best in two of the three events



she's competed in.

- The Brooklyn Park, Minn., native ranks 14th after a career-best 9.975 on vault at the Ameritas Master's Classic, and 24th on floor after earning 9.925 in four of the team's six meets this season.
- The junior won event titles on vault, bars and floor in the team's meet against Iowa State and on vault and floor at both the Ameritas Master's Classic and against Oklahoma.

GODDESS WITH GLASSES

- After not breaking into competition lineups as a freshman, **Ayla Acevedo** trained largely on her own during the summer, consistently attending voluntary morning practices, going to class and returning later in the day for conditioning while balancing a biochemistry major.
- Acevedo earned a new floor routine after approaching the staff and being told she could get one if she became competition-ready. She received the routine roughly one month before the season during Black & Gold exhibition meet week.
- The sophomore made her collegiate debut on floor at the team's season opener against Iowa State, scoring a 9.900, and matched that score in the third meet against Oklahoma.
- Her 9.885 scoring average on the apparatus ranks tied for 29th nationally.
- She performs to K-pop music from KATSEYE, the first known NCAA floor routine using that group, according to program research.

TANSKANEN AMONG THE WORLD'S BEST

- Sophomore **Kaia Tanskanen** represented Finland internationally throughout the offseason, highlighted by a 15th-place finish in the all-around final at the FIG Artistic Gymnastics World Championship, marking the best all-around finish by a Finnish gymnast in history at the event.
- Tanskanen was the only active NCAA women's gymnast to compete in the World Championship all-around final and one of just two NCAA athletes to qualify, competing among the world's top 24 gymnasts.
- She advanced to the world final after placing 16th in qualifications, posting consistent routines across all four events and debuting upgraded difficulty on bars and floor as part of her elite development.
- Earlier in the summer, Tanskanen placed 11th all-around at the European Gymnastics Championships, recording a 50.799 total to qualify for the World Championships and finish as the top Finnish athlete in the field.

NO SHORTAGE OF ALL-AMERICANS BACK IN COME

- Of the nation-leading nine Women's Collegiate Gymnastics Association (WCGA) All-America honors MU tallied following the 2025 NCAA Championship Semifinal meet, four return to Mizzou, tied for most in the country along with Alabama, Oklahoma and Florida.
- **Elise Tisler** was named a WCGA Vault First Team member. On the WCGA Second Team, **Hannah Horton** earned recognition on uneven bars, while **Olivia Kelly** was recognized on uneven bars and balance beam, and **Addison Lawrence** was also honored on balance beam.

TURNING HEADS IN THE PRESEASON

- Mizzou opened the 2026 season ranked No. 7 nationally in the WCGA preseason poll, marking its highest preseason ranking in program history.
- The Tigers earned multiple first-place votes, one of just five teams nationally to do so, and have appeared in the WCGA preseason top 10 in three of the last four seasons.

THE BEST SEASON IN MIZZOU WOMEN'S SPORTS HISTORY

- The 2025 Mizzou gymnastics season finished as the most successful season of any varsity women's team in school history, placing third at the NCAA Championship Final.
- It marked the first time the program advanced to the NCAA National Championship Final and the second time it had competed in the NCAA Championship Semifinals, having done so for the first time in 2022.
- **Helen Hu** captured the program's first individual national title after scoring 9.9875 on balance beam.
- The coaching staff was recognized for its outstanding season, as head coach **Shannon Welker** garnered 2025 WCGA National Coach of the Year and SEC Coach of the Year honors, while the staff was named the 2025 College Gym News Coaching Staff of the Year.

NO FLUKE

- The Tigers' best season in program history reflected sustained growth rather than a one-year breakthrough.
- Under **Shannon Welker's** leadership, Mizzou has consistently become one of the premier programs in the nation, finishing in the top 15 in each of the last six seasons after only doing so four times between 1998 and 2014.
- Both times the Tigers ranked among the top five to finish the season were under Welker - 2022 (fifth) and 2025 (third).
- Mizzou has scored 197.000 or better in 35 of its last 42 meets dating back to 2023.

A NEW ERA

- Mizzou gymnastics announced it has changed its primary home venue to Mizzou Arena on Oct. 21, 2025.
- The Tigers compete in five of six regular-season home meets at Mizzou Arena during the 2025-26 season.
- Mizzou Arena previously hosted select gymnastics meets, with the most recent coming at the team's 2025 season opener, the Beauty and the Beast meet.

- Hearnes Center remains part of the schedule, hosting Senior Day vs. Arkansas for the team's last meet in Columbia for the season on March 1.
- Mizzou Arena opened in 2004 and is home to Mizzou men's and women's basketball, known as one of the nation's top home-court advantages, with both programs beating a No. 1-ranked opponent in the last four seasons.

ELITE COMPETITION COMING TO MIZZOU ARENA

- In the program's first season at Mizzou Arena, the Tigers welcome some of the best teams in the country.
- No. 2 Oklahoma (Jan. 16), No. 2 LSU (Jan. 30) and No. 2 Florida (Feb. 6) are all slated to compete in CoMo.
- This marks the first time since at least 1998 that Mizzou competed against multiple top-two teams at home in the same season.

2026 SIGNING CLASS AMONG BEST IN MIZZOU HISTORY

- Mizzou welcomes the No. 6 recruiting class nationally for 2026-27, according to College Gym News, marking the second top-10 signing class in the past three years and the program's second-highest ranked class ever.
- The six-member class—**Addison Anderson, Ashtyn Conley, Dakota "Coco" Haynes, Raegan McCarty, Kendall Morgan and Imani White**—ranks fifth in the SEC and continues Mizzou's run of three consecutive top-20 classes.
- The group features two five-star recruits and multiple national, regional and state champions, bringing proven success across all four events and depth throughout the lineup.
- White headlines the class as the highest-rated signee in program history, ranking No. 5 nationally, with a decorated résumé that includes multiple national team selections.

FEATURE - THE GIRL WITH THE KOI FISH TATTOO: GROWTH COMES FROM WITHIN

- **Addison Lawrence's** journey is defined by perseverance, symbolized by a koi fish tattoo inspired by Japanese folklore, reflecting her belief in growing through adversity rather than avoiding it.
- After starting gymnastics at age five, Lawrence navigated injuries, pressure and a hip surgery that sidelined her for the entire 2024 season, strengthening her resolve as she leaned on her support system and long-term growth.
- She returned in 2025 as a WCGA All-American, crediting Mizzou's culture for reshaping her relationship with the sport, and now aspires to coach and mentor young gymnasts, emphasizing joy, communication and confidence beyond results.

FEATURE - HORTON BOUNCES BACK

- **Hannah Horton's** freshman season tested her resilience as she navigated the twisties late in 2024, stepping back to reset mentally with support from her coaches and teammates.
- That approach fueled her 2025 breakout, highlighted by WCGA Uneven Bars Second Team All-America honors and an NCAA Seattle Regional bars title.

FEATURE - AN IMPACT IN AND OUT THE GYM

- **Olivia Kelly** arrived at Mizzou as one of the nation's top recruits and has used gymnastics as a platform to uplift others beyond competition.
- A native of Barbados, she is one of the few collegiate gymnasts representing the Caribbean and became the first Barbadian woman to compete at the Pan American Championships and qualify for the World Championships, while openly sharing her experience competing with scoliosis.
- She co-founded the Stronger Together Foundation, authored *Am I Too Tall for Gymnastics?*, and earned 2025 WCGA Uneven Bars and Balance Beam Second Team All-America honors.

FEATURE - THE ART OF THE LEO

- Leotard design at Mizzou is a collaborative process, led by associate head coach **Whitney Snowden** with input from staff and direct feedback from student-athletes throughout the year.
- The Tigers try on and train in sample leotards so the staff can evaluate how designs move, fit and catch the light, while athletes share what feels best and what helps them compete confidently.
- Athlete comfort is the priority, as the design goal is to balance Mizzou pride with performance-ready fit, ensuring gymnasts can focus on routines rather than how a leo feels or moves.
- With multiple fabrics, stones and revisions involved, the team's GK partnership helps streamline the process and allows more testing and refinement—making the final look a true player-first, team-built product.

At the helm of the Mizzou gymnastics program, two-time SEC Coach of the Year, 2025 WCGA National Coach of the Year and leader of the College Gym News Coaching Staff of the Year head coach Shannon Welker continues to make the Tigers a rising power nationally.

2025

The 12th season of Welker's tenure at Mizzou marked the best in program history, leading the Tigers to the NCAA Championship Final for the first time ever and a third-place finish, the highest final ranking of any Mizzou women's team.

Missouri gymnastics achieved many program firsts along the way - its first individual national champion (Helen Hu on the balance beam), its first score of 198, the best balance beam (49.575) and floor exercise (49.725) scores in program history, the most 10s in a single season (five) among a number of others.

In the postseason, the Tigers earned their first appearance in Session II of the Southeastern Conference Championship, where they finished fourth with a score of 197.400 - tying for the best finish in the conference championship since joining the SEC. The team went on to win its NCAA Championship Second Round meet over No. 10 Georgia, No. 21 Arizona and No. 26 Arizona State with a postseason-best score of 197.650 and earned a spot at nationals after taking second with a 197.425 in the Regional Final in Seattle.

With its appearance in the NCAA Championship Regional Final, Mizzou became one of seven schools to reach the round in the last five seasons. At the NCAA Championship Semifinal, Missouri advanced to its first national title meet in dramatic fashion, trading sticks with Florida as the Tigers finished the meet on beam before Hu stepped up and earned 9.9875 to clinch the win over UF and earn the national title on the apparatus. MU then finished in third place over Utah for its best final ranking ever.

With success comes awards, and the 2025 squad collected a number of them. Coach Welker earned SEC Coach of the Year for the second time of his career and Women's Collegiate Gymnastics Association South Central Coach of the Year. The gymnasts' accolades were numerous, with the Tigers accounting for nine WCGA All-America honors and six WCGA Regular Season All-Americans - both of which were program bests.

Under Welker's development, Hu was named both a WCGA First Team All-American and a WCGA Regular Season First Team All-American, an All-SEC Team Member, SEC Specialist of the Year, SEC Balance Beam Champion, NCAA Seattle Regional Balance Beam Champion and a record-setting five SEC Specialist of the Week awards. Mara Titarsolej claimed her second-consecutive SEC Uneven Bars Champion while also being named both a both a WCGA First Team All-American and a WCGA Regular Season First Team All-American, while Amari Celestine was named WCGA South Central Gymnast of the Year and a Second Team WCGA Second Team All-Around Member and a Second Team WCGA Regular Season Second Team All-Around and Floor Member.

2024

In Welker's 11th season, Missouri reached new heights, finishing with a 13-6 record and a program-record 197.420 NQS that ranked No. 13 in the country. The Tigers posted a score of 197 or higher in 12 of their 14 meets, the most in team history.

In postseason competition, the Tigers finished fifth at the SEC Championship meet, posting a school-record 197.275 to win the afternoon session. Missouri reached the NCAA Regional Final for a fourth consecutive season and finished the country ranked 11th in the nation, the team's second-best year-end ranking in program history.

Welker's squad started off its season with a bang, peaking at No. 3 in the first rankings of the year for the team's highest ranking ever. Three weeks later, the

Tigers earned their biggest upset in program history, knocking off the eventual NCAA champion No. 3 LSU on Jan. 26 inside Hearnes Center.

As a team, Missouri set program records on three different events. The Tigers posted a 49.600 on bars at the Mizzou Quad on March 10, then scored a 49.500 on vault and a 49.700 on floor at the Illinois Quad on March 17 to end the regular season strong.

The Tigers racked up several accolades over the course of the season. Three Missouri gymnasts — Jocelyn Moore, Sienna Schreiber and Mara Titarsolej — each earned WCGA Regular Season All-America honors, marking the most gymnasts to earn the honor in a single season for the Tigers.

At the conference level, Missouri's awards were headlined by Jocelyn Moore winning 2024 SEC Event Specialist of the Year and Mara Titarsolej claiming a share of the SEC bars title to become Missouri's first bars conference champion. Additionally, Missouri earned a conference-best and program-record seven All-SEC selections at the SEC Championship.

2023

Another record-breaking season for the Tigers led by Welker, ending with the highest regional score in program history with 197.600 and a 3rd place finish at the NCAA Regional Final. Mizzou's score of 49.450 also earned them the highest vault score in regional competition. The Tigers set a new program-high championships score, beating both Arkansas and Georgia at the SEC Championships, along with a 2nd place finish at the NCAA Regional Second Round. Under Welker's coaching, the Tigers secured the 14th rank nationally and a 10-3 record, including wins over five nationally-ranked opponents.

Five gymnasts earned All-SEC Honors for the second year in a row: Amari Celestine, Helen Hu, Jocelyn Moore, Alisa Sheremeta and Sienna Schreiber. Moore and Hu were also named Women's Collegiate Gymnastics Association (WCGA) Regular Season All-Americans for the season. Claiming first-team honors on vault, Moore posted this accolade for the second consecutive time and Hu claimed second-team honors on beam.

2022

In a remarkable 2022 season, Welker led the Tigers to a 5th place finish in NCAA National Championships in April — the best finish in program history. The Tigers ranked 11th nationally, defeating LSU and Iowa in the NCAA Regional Second Round. Missouri grabbed hold of a top-two finish, topping UCLA and Iowa State, at the Raleigh Regional to secure a spot at the NCAA Championships for only the second time ever. Under Welker's leadership, the Tigers also won on the road against Georgia for the first time.

Two gymnasts received Women's Collegiate Gymnastics Association (WCGA) Regular Season All-America honors — Jocelyn Moore and Sienna Schreiber. Moore claimed first team honors on vault, while Schreiber took second team honors on the beam and all-around. Welker received SEC Coach of the Year for his performance.

2021

Mizzou concluded the 2021 campaign ranked 14th nationally for the second year in a row, the first time since the 2009 and 2010 seasons the Tigers posted back-to-back top 14 finishes. Competing in a Southeastern Conference-only regular season, Welker led Missouri to wins over No. 15 Georgia and No. 19 Auburn, while also finishing ahead of No. 9 Arkansas at the 2021 SEC Championship.

In the NCAA Tuscaloosa second round, the Tigers erupted with a 197.325, the third-highest score in program history, to advance to the NCAA Regional Final. It marked the first time Mizzou competed in a regional final in the revamped postseason format.

Individually, the Tigers had a WCGA Regular Season All-American for the second year in a row, as sophomore Sienna Schreiber nabbed second team accolades on beam. Schreiber and freshman Amaya Marshall also claimed All-SEC honors, with Schreiber earning a spot on the All-SEC Team and Marshall on the SEC All-Freshman Team.

2020

In 2020, Welker's Tigers vaulted up the rankings as the season progressed, reaching 14th in late March when the season was abruptly cut short prior to



the regular season finale. Over the course of the season, Mizzou defeated No. 11 Minnesota and No. 19 Nebraska and twice posted team scores among the top 10 in program history. Additionally, Welker's vault squad notched two scores that ranked in the program's top 10 on the event.

The Tigers' National Qualifying Score (NQS) of 196.635 at the time the season ended was the third-best such score in program history and the team's highest since 2004. Freshman Helen Hu emerged as one of the nation's top gymnasts, claiming NACGC/W All-America first team (beam) and second team (bars) honors, as well as SEC Event Specialist of the Year accolades.

2019

The 2019 Tigers finished 17th in the national rankings, which tied the team's best finish since 2010. At the 2019 NCAA Athens Regional, Missouri tallied both the highest regional score (196.625) and the top regional beam total (49.200) in program history. Senior Brooke Kelly became the 10th Tiger to earn an individual berth to the NCAA Championships after she qualified on beam.

Mizzou knocked off four top 25 teams during the 2019 season, including a win over No. 10 Kentucky and a tie with No. 7 Michigan.

The Tigers also recorded the second-highest beam score in program history (49.425), the sixth (49.425) and seventh (49.400) best floor scores and the ninth-best vault total (49.275) over the course of the campaign.

2018

Welker's fifth season at Mizzou saw the Tigers knock off three top 10 teams during the regular season. On March 2, Missouri defeated No. 5 Florida, 196-925-196.925, for the first victory over the Gators in program history. Mizzou also defeated Arkansas twice this year while the Razorbacks were ranked in the top 10.

Overall, the Tigers went 9-7 in the regular season, including conference wins over No. 5 Florida and No. 10 Arkansas. The squad also concluded the year ranked 20th in the nation, the third-straight season Mizzou ended the year in the top 20.

2017

In his fourth year with Missouri, Welker's Tigers finished 17th in the national rankings and a third-place finish at the NCAA Gainesville Regional, only one spot shy of qualifying for the NCAA Championships. The 2017 season also saw Mizzou go 3-4 in Southeastern Conference dual meet action, with wins over No. 12 Arkansas, No. 12 Kentucky and No. 18 Auburn.

The Tigers entered the season with just one SEC dual win in program history. Additionally, Missouri recorded the third and fourth-highest scores in program history in 2017, with a 197.200 against Auburn and a 197.150 one week later against Kentucky.

2016

During the 2016 season, Welker led Mizzou to its highest NCAA Regional (third) finish since 2010. Overall, the Tigers finished the year ranked 19th in the national rankings, the team's highest since 2010, and ahead of Southeastern Conference foes Arkansas and Kentucky. Missouri recorded three scores of at least 196.625 or higher during the year in 2016, only the second time Mizzou accomplished that in the 37 year history of the program.

Additionally, the Tigers defeated No. 9 Georgia 195.800-195.350 for the team's first top-10 win since 2012. Under Welker's tutelage, freshman Morgan Porter earned SEC Freshman of the Year honors and was the first Tiger gymnast to qualify for the NCAA Championships since 2012.

2015

Under Welker's direction, the Tigers were the nation's most improved program in 2015. Mizzou finished the season ranked 21st, a full 20-spot increase from the previous year and the biggest jump in the country.

The 2015 Tigers also qualified for their first NCAA Regional since 2012, where they scored a 196.100, the second-best Regional score in program history. Additionally, Mizzou entered the top-25 for the first time since 2012 and scored at least 195.10 times in 13 meets. The Tigers also topped 196 twice during the season for the first time since 2012 as well.

2014

In his first year in Columbia in 2014, Welker quickly installed his Championship Culture to the squad. Over the season, the Tigers went 6-7 in the regular season and scored the sixth-best bars score (49.300) in program history against George Washington.

Welker brought a wealth of experience to Columbia after five years as an assistant coach at the University of Michigan and nine years as the head coach and program director at the St. Louis Gymnastic Center.

PRIOR TO MIZZOU

During his time at Michigan, Welker was primarily responsible for coaching the vault and floor squads in addition to serving as the recruiting coordinator. Welker guided his vault squads to three top ten finishes during his time at Michigan, and his 2012 vault team finished at No. 11 in the nation. Under his direction, the Michigan floor squads also finished among the nation's top-10 four times, while the team earned top-15 finishes in each of his seasons in Ann Arbor.

Welker coached five gymnasts to 12 All-American honors while at Michigan including the 2013 NCAA National Floor Champion, Joanna Sampson. He also produced three NCAA Regional Championship floor title winners and back-to-back NCAA Regional Champions on vault. Four of his gymnasts won event titles at the Big Ten Championships, and Welker assisted the Wolverines to three NCAA National Championships as well.

Before coaching at Michigan, Welker spent one year as an assistant coach at Bowling Green, where he coached two gymnasts to the NCAA Regional Championships for the first time in program history. Before working with the Falcons, Welker served as the head women's gymnastics coach and program director at the St. Louis Gymnastic Center for nine years.

ABOUT WELKER

A four-year competitor on the University of Illinois at Chicago men's gymnastics team, Welker served as a team captain for three years and earned NCAA All-American honors in 1996. He was also awarded UIC Athlete of the Year honors that season. Welker spent a year as an assistant men's gymnastics coach for UIC, and was also inducted into the University of Illinois at Chicago Athletics Hall of Fame in 2005.

Welker earned his undergraduate degree in kinesiology from the University of Illinois at Chicago in 1998, and also received his master's degree in sports management from Eastern Michigan University in 2012. Welker and his wife, Molly, have two sons, Ian and Brendan.






