THE SKIP
 Kentucky Head Coach Nick Mingione was named the 2024 National Coach of the Year for the second time in his tenure with the Wildcats, picking up the laurel from Perfect Game and the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association's Dick Howser Trophy. Mingione, the 2024 SEC Coach of the Year, guided the Cats to the program's first-ever Men's College World Series berth, the program's second-ever SEC Regular Season Championship, a program record 46 wins, and a program best 22 SEC victories. Kentucky also reached a school-record ranking of No. 2 in all five major polls, as well as the program's highest national seed (2). In the NCAA Tournament, the Wildcats swept a regional for the first time, hosted the first-ever Lexington Super Regional, and claimed the first two Super Regional wins in Kentucky history on the way to Omaha. Mingione was also named the National Coach of the Year, as well as SEC Coach of the Year, in 2017 after taking the program to its first Super Regional during his first year at the helm.

YOU GET A ROS(ZEL)
 Kentucky's pitching staff has benefitted greatly from the work of Dan Roszel, who has spent the majority of his coaching career at East Carolina and Kentucky. He also helped develop Atlanta star lefty Chris Sale. Since arriving at UK prior to the 2020 season his pitching staff has struck out nearly 10 batters per nine innings. In 2022, the unit set the school record for strikeouts in a season with 593 and staff's under his guidance own three of the top four seasons in program history in that department. Roszel's groups also have the top two seasons in school history in shut-outs. UK's combined ERA through his first six seasons was 4.75.

Roszel has a lengthy track record of producing big leaguers and saw three of his former players at Florida Gulf Coast, including Sale and MLBers Richard Bleier and Casey Coleman, inducted into the school's athletics Hall of Fame in the past three years.

AUSTIN, POWERED!
 Former All-American, professional ballplayer, two-time Gold Glove winner and USA Baseball alum Austin Cousino in 2024 returned to his alma mater as an assistant coach/recruiting coordinator on Nick Mingione's staff and provided immediate dividends. Cousino already has tapped into his immense professional scouting experience with a pair of organizations to get the Wildcats' recruiting off to a strong

start with Cousino as its lead recruiter. The former Wildcat starred at UK from 2012-14 and is considered one of the top all-around players to have suited up for the Blue and White. He also played in both the Angels and Mariners' farm systems and reached Triple-A before a shoulder injury derailed his career.

BIGGIE BOX

One of the pillars of UK's offense is working its game goals in search of the big inning - "Biggie Box" - which is defined as any inning where the Cats put three or more runs on the scoreboard. The approach has been incredibly effective during the Mingione era and the Cats also are 238-49 under Mingione when scoring six or more runs. (See box on page 14 for Biggie Box innings)

BACK 2 BACK 2 BACK

Kentucky has qualified for back-to-back-to-back NCAA Regionals for the first time in program history, two of which were hosted in Lexington. During Mingione's eight seasons for which an NCAA Tournament has been held UK has made four regionals, three super regionals, a College World Series, hosted three regionals and one super regional.

TOURNAMENT EXCELLENCE

Kentucky has been one of the top teams in the SEC the past three seasons in the NCAA Tournament, ranking fourth amongst teams from the conference with 12 total victories. Only LSU, which has two national titles, Tennessee and Florida have more NCAAT wins. The Cats have 10 more wins in the tournament than longtime power Vanderbilt as well as more than Arkansas, Auburn, Georgia, South Carolina and Texas, amongst others.

RPI DARLINGS

One of the most important pieces to securing NCAA regional bids and any postential hosting opportunities is deeply tied to the Ratings Percentage Index - RPI - created and utilized by the NCAA to evaluate teams. Kentucky has been one of the nation's best in this tool over the past three seasons, ranking No. 8 in average RPI amongst Division I teams (2023-25).

LINE OF DEFENSE

Kentucky has featured one of the top defenses in the country during Coach Mingione's tenure, posting the five best single-season fielding percentage marks in the past five seasons. UK led the nation in 2023 with a .984 fielding percentage and followed it with a .980 clip in 2024 and three SEC All-Defensive Team members. Last season, UK fielded at .977. Before 2023, no Wildcat club had fielded at .980 or higher, and now, the Cats have reached that mark for in two of the past three seasons.

OUI, OUI

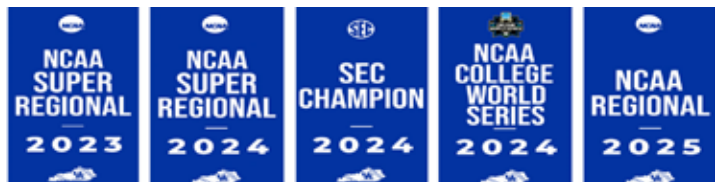
Kentucky has a rich history with Canadian baseball players, including most recently with All-American infielder Emilien Pitre. Now senior pitcher Jackson Soucie and freshman infielder and former Canadian Junior National Team member Maxime Boies (Max-M Buah like 'blah') joins alumni James Paxton, Tristan Pompey, Zach Pop, Chris Bisson and other Canadians who have starred at UK. Boies is from Quebec, while Soucie has from Ontario.

CHICAGO CATS

Kentucky has tapped into the fertile Chicagoland recruiting soil in recent seasons, expanding ever-deeper into the Midwest for acquisition of talent. Zach Reks (MLB), Ryan Ritter (2022 Gold Glove), Jackson Gray (2023) and now Tyler Bell, Luke Lawrence and Nate Harris (2026). Bell, a second round selection in the 2024 MLB Draft, attended the same high school as Ritter and continues to work out with him when both are home.

#EVERYTHINGSCHOOL

Under the direction of athletics director Mitch Barnhart, UK has greatly enhanced its athletic profile across the entire department since his arrival. In recent years, volleyball (it also was run-



ner up in 2025 and has nine consecutive SEC championships) and rifle each have national championships, football has had a 10-win season and Citrus Bowl championship, men's tennis finished national runners-up (2022), SEC Tournament Champions (2023, 2024), and SEC Regular Season Champions (2024), men's soccer completed an undefeated regular season and No. 1 overall seed in NCAA Tournament (2022), baseball reached a trio of Super Regionals (2017, 2023, 2024), reached its first CWS (2024) and won an SEC Championship (2024), softball advanced to the WCWS (2014), women's swimming won the SEC title (2021), track and field and gymnastics (2023 6th Place Finish) each cemented their status as elite programs on the national scene, and women's basketball won the SEC Tournament for the second time in 2022. That's not to mention the continued excellence of men's basketball and cheerleading, all of which culminated in a school-record ninth place finish in the Director's Cup standings for 2021-22.

MINGIONE IS SUPER-B

Kentucky coach Nick Mingione is writing his name all over the school's record books. In addition to being on the coaching staff of all four teams that have hosted a regional (assistant in 2006, head coach in 2017, 2023 and 2024), he is the only head coach to guide UK to a Super Regional, now having done so three times in the last eight NCAA Tournaments, and the Men's College World Series. Mingione also has guided the program to an NCAA Regional in three consecutive seasons, the first time that has been accomplished in Lexington. Kentucky has captured the heart of the Big Blue Nation, playing an exciting brand of baseball that has bred large crowds, top RPI ratings and belief.

In 2024, when the Cats shattered school attendance records, went 5-0 at home in the NCAA Tournament and won only their second SEC regular season title in history. For the effort, Mingione was named the SEC and National Coach of the Year, both for the second time in his first seven full seasons as a head coach.

LEAVE IT TO CLEAVER

Lefty Ben Cleaver burst onto the scene in 2025 as one of the SEC's top weekend starters, leading UK in wins, innings pitched, strikeouts, ERA, batting average against and fewest hits allowed per nine innings. The Slim Reaper™ twice recorded 11 strikeouts and no walks in 6.0 innings, had seven quality starts and at 5.61 hits allowed per nine innings last season he ranked ninth nationally and 27th in WHIP (1.00). He has struck out 118 in 97.1 career innings.

"That guy is a winner," D1Baseball.com's Aaron Fitt said. "He gives you so much confidence. He's a trustworthy guy (on the mound). Just the old school pitchability lefty that carves people up."

RINGING THE BELL

Sophomore IF Tyler Bell is betting big on himself. The Chicago-area youngster was picked 66th overall in the 2024 MLB Draft but did not agree to contract terms with the Tampa Bay Rays and instead enrolled at UK, making him the highest-ranked draft pick to make it to campus last season. He will be draft eligible again after the 2026 season. He spent last summer in the famed Cape Cod League and the with the USA Collegiate National Team. (see pages 21-22 for more on Bell's freshman season and summer with USA Baseball).

"(Bell) has that superstar potential," D1Baseball.com's Aaron Fitt said. "He

can be a first round draft pick, All-American. I think there's another step for him, too. I think he'll be a major league shortstop."

DEDICATED TO THE DETAILS

Tyler Bell is not just a talented player but when he made the decision not to sign an MLB contract out of high school he bet on himself and committed to mastering his craft and bettering himself in all areas of life. Bell maintains a disciplined lifestyle that includes Sunday meal prep for the week ahead, a 10 p.m. curfew for entertainment, early rising times and attention to details. It is not uncommon for the draft-eligible sophomore to be working on the finer points of his game before most people are out of bed and he often is having a "second breakfast" by 8 a.m.

HAVE MARCY!

Senior OF Will Marcy is back for his final season after playing only a handful of games in 2025 due to a broken lower leg suffered while baserunning. He is known for his terrific outfield defense, mostly in centerfield, and was just rounding into form last spring before getting injured.

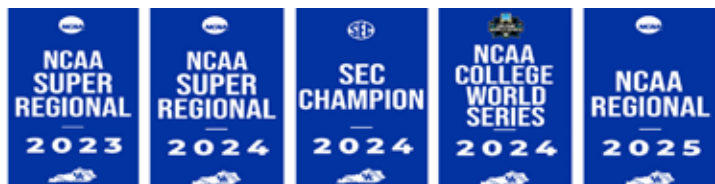
LAWRENCE OF LEXINGTON

Senior IF Luke Lawrence in many ways is the engine that makes the Wildcats go. Playing a premium middle infield position as Tyler Bell's double play partner – and roommate – Lawrence was vital in the Cats reaching a regional in 2025. He led all UK returners in average (2nd overall), topped the team in hits, was second in runs, third in RBI and steals and had 16 extra base hits. He was the only player to hit over .300 in conference play, hit nearly .500 in postseason games and made the Clemson All-Regional team. Lawrence is hitting well above .300 for his collegiate career and is closing in on 200 hits and 30 stolen bases. The Chicago native also is an accomplished hockey player.



A.D. - AFTER DEVIN

Perhaps the most jarring change for UK this spring will be the absence of longtime catcher Devin Burkes. Arguably the winningest and most influential player in school history, Burkes graduated after being the mainstay on three straight NCAA regional teams, two Super Regional clubs, the school's first College World Series team, second SEC championship team and he was a two-time Mr. Wildcat for the school, which is the highest honor bestowed upon a male athlete at the school. He finished having started 177 of 190 games played and was one of Coach Nick Mingione's most trusted players ever.

LIGHTING UP THE RADAR GUN

Senior righty Jaxon Jelkin is healthy and ready to cash in on his enormous potential this season. The twice-drafted fireballer sat out last spring as a midseason transfer while also continuing to recover from a previous injury. He drew rave reviews at the end of the season for his performance in live Abs against teammates and then topped out at 99 MPH last fall against West Virginia in an exhibition game.

“(Jelkin) has utterly electric stuff,” D1Baseball.com’s Aaron Fitt said. “It’s not just velocity. It’s the low slot with a turbo sinker. It’s all there. It’s real stuff. I’m betting on him getting more and more comfortable as he pitches more. I’m absolutely buying.”

MAY THE SCHWARTZ BE WITH YOU

Sophomore UT Ryan Schwartz has quickly made himself one of the more indispensable pieces of the club, packaging immense talent with demonstrated performance. After a wrist injury rendered him less than 100 percent until midway through the 2025 season, he made an immediate impact the second half of the season, slashing .317/.461/.500 with seven extra base hits in 60 AB. He finished the season reaching base safely in each of the final 20 games and carried over his performance with a terrific summer. A highly ranked recruit out of high school, Schwartz could be an option at either corner outfield spot, first base and even on the mound after arriving as a catcher.

THE HARRIS TWINS

Although they are not related, sophomore pitchers Leighton and Nate Harris could each play vital roles in 2026. Nate became the Friday night starter last season and then pitched a gem to eliminate Clemson from the postseason on the Tigers’ own field and is known for his even nature. Leighton did not see much game action in 2025 but was sensational over the summer in being named the NECBL’s “Stephen Strasburg Top Pro Prospect” (0.64 ERA, 39:10 K/BB ratio in 28 IP).

CERTAINLY CERNY

Senior infielder Tyler Cerny, a transfer from Indiana, comes to Lexington with extensive experience and a very similar profile to former Wildcat Mitchell Daly. Like Daly, Cerny has been a middle infielder throughout his career but made the transition to third base in the fall. Indiana’s school record holder for HBP (45), he entered the season as the active career leader in the SEC for runs scored, hits and doubles while also ranking among the leaders in games played, triples, RBI and HBP. In an unusual coincidence, Cerny played against UK in the 2023 Lexington Regional and was ejected from a game for a celebration prop

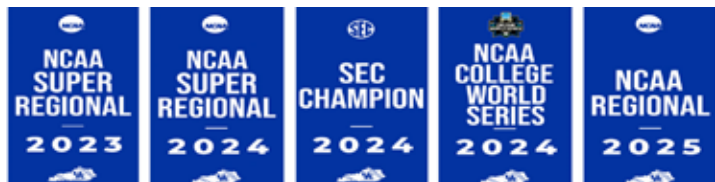

THIEVES OF THE INDUSTRY

- In 10 years under coach Nick Mingione the Wildcats have swiped 815 bases in 1030 attempts, a success rate of 79.1 percent.
- UK has stolen more bases than any other SEC team during that span (2nd - Vanderbilt) and nearly 100 more bases than Vandy since start of 2022.
- Jayce Tharnish is 52-of-54 in his career (15-of-16 in 2026).
- In 2025, seven players had at least 11 stolen bases.
- On April 19 at No. 2 Tennessee the Cats stole 10 bases. It is the most since single-game records began being kept in 2007.
- UK stole 252 bases in 2024 and 2025, second-most among Power Four teams.
- In 2023, for the first time in school history (for which stats are available, 1969) the Cats had four players with at least 15 stolen bases.
- In 2024, UK stole more than 80 bases for the fourth time in Mingione's tenure.
- In 2021, the Cats stole 78 bases in 86 attempts. It was the highest success rate (90.7) of any Division I-A team with 50+ stolen bases.

being brought onto the playing field.

CLUB MED

For much of the 2025 season the UK coaches deftly handled a pitching staff that was without three arms that were expected to be major contributors before eventually having it catch up to them in the hectic nature of the NCAA Regional. The Cats get two of those pitchers back, plus the electric right arm of Jaxon Jelkin after he sat out last season and the experienced Ryan Mullen after he missed last season at Loyola Marymount with an injury. The others (RHP Oliver Boone and RHP Chase Alderman) each have been cleared by doctors and enter 2026 full-go.

GONE IN 90 FEET

Kentucky has earned a reputation as one of the nation's most aggressive baserunning clubs under coach Nick Mingione, not only setting school records for stolen bases but also earning widespread attention for its unorthodox thefts of home plate and willingness to always try and take an extra base. The Cats continued to completely lean into that identity during the offseason when they brought in Jayce Tharnish, one of 2025's top stolen base artists. The outfielder swiped 32 bags in 33 attempts last season and is one of five players on the roster with 20 or more career steals.

BIG BLUE TO THE BONE

Nick Mingione's recruiting philosophy always has been to keep the best players from Kentucky at home in blue and white and that increasingly has meant via the transfer portal as well (RHP Darren Williams, to name one). The Cats played on those heartstrings again for this season, taking RHPs Jack Bennett and Burkley Bounds in the portal. Bennett (Paducah, Ky.) was Western Kentucky's Friday night starter last season as the Hilltoppers made a regional, while Bounds (Lexington) had a strong freshman season at Eastern Kentucky. A full list of players from the Commonwealth is on page 32.

SHINY, NOT THARNISHED

The breakout star of the fall for UK was outfielder Jayce Tharnish, a transfer from St. Bonaventure with a speedy reputation. But the 6-foot-3 fleet-footed proved to have much more in his arsenal and was terrific in the Cats' two exhibitions, batting .429 with juice, stolen bases and an ability to get on base. Tharnish has stolen 37 of 38 bases in his career and fits the Wildcats' style of play like a glove.

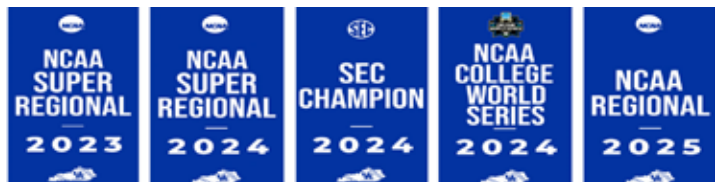

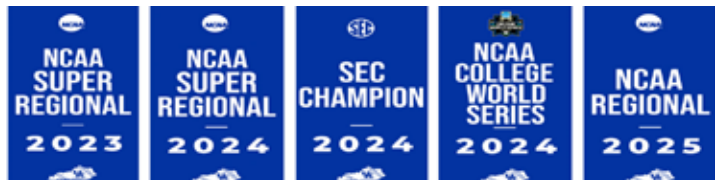

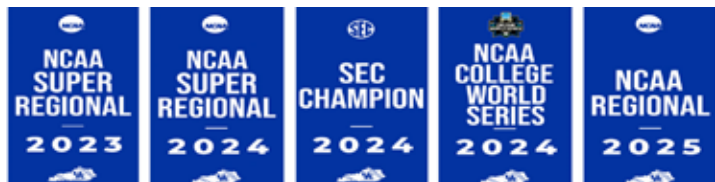

“THE HOOK”

One of the personal touches to the Wildcats’ home, Kentucky Proud Park, is “The Hook,” which is the name of the visting bullpen just beyond the right field wall. The name is a tribute to former UK pitcher Jonathan Hooker, who pitched for the Cats from 1998-2001, and died in the plane crash of Comair Flight 5191 on Aug. 27, 2006 in Lexington.

Hooker and his wife, Scarlett Parsley, were married the night before and were on the early-morning flight headed to their honeymoon when the pilots attempted to take off from the wrong runway and crashed into a neighboring field. Forty-nine of the 50 people on board were killed, including both Hooker and Parsley.

The London, Ky. native was a beloved teammate and member of UK Baseball and his family were honored on Mar. 29, 2019 during an in-game ceremony to officially unveil “The Hook,” which features a sign and memorial to the former Wildcat.

The Cats have walked it off 22 times since Nick Mingione took over as head coach before the 2017 season, including five run rule games.



MLB TRAINING GROUND

Kentucky has made its presence felt in the Major League Baseball Draft in recent years with 43 players selected during the Nick Mingione era, including 21 in 2017 and 2018, which was the most of any college program in the country over that span. In Evan White (2017), Zack Thompson (2019) and Ryan Waldschmidt (2024) the Cats have had three first-round selections under Mingione. In the last eight drafts:

- 23 Wildcats were selected in the first 10 rounds.
- 10 were selected in the first five rounds, including first-rounders Evan White (2017), Zack Thompson (2019) and Ryan Waldschmidt (2024).
- The 13 picks in 2018 are the second-most for any school in a single draft since 2006 and tied for an SEC record with Texas A&M (2016) and national champion Vanderbilt (2019).
- The 27 underclassmen drafted during that span earned \$18.4 million in signing bonus money, an average of \$681,400 per player.
- 33 of the 43 draftees had not previously been drafted.
- White was named a 2020 AL Gold Glove winner, the first rookie first baseman in either league to win the award since inception in 1957.

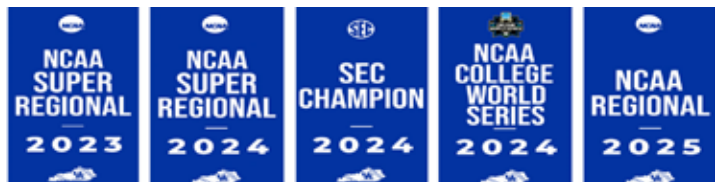
BASEBALL MINDS IN THE PROS

Collin Cowgill remains an assistant coach with the Reds and former MLB manager and UK all-time hits leader Andy Green has joined the New York Mets' front office in player development.

FORMER CATS SHINE IN 2025

It was a noteworthy 2025 for several former Wildcats. Ryan Waldschmidt was named the Arizona Diamondbacks' 2025 minor league player of the year and installed as the organization's top MLB prospect by Baseball America. MLB Pipeline.com followed suit, ranking Waldschmidt as the No. 66 overall prospect in baseball, as well as Arizona's No. 1 prospect. He reached AA last summer and slashed .289/.419/.473 across two levels with 114 runs, 49 extra base hits, 78 RBI, 96 walks and 29 stolen bases.

The 2025 season closed with a pair of alumni winning a championship in the Arizona Fall League, MLB's premier prospect league. Pitchers Daniel Harper (Phillies) and Logan Martin (Giants) both played for the Surprise Saguaros.



HEAD COACH NICK MINGIONE

Nick Mingione – who was named Kentucky’s head coach on June 13, 2016 – has already made his mark after just nine seasons in Lexington, becoming a respected piece of the UK Baseball program and local community, while guiding the Wildcats to three Super Regionals and a first-ever College World Series appearance in school history.

In his rookie season as a head coach, Mingione proved a quick study as the 2017 Wildcats etched their name all over the school’s record books. The program made a trip to the NCAA Tournament Super Regionals for the first time and finished ranked in the Top 10 of every major college baseball poll. In year seven, Mingione repeated the feat by returning to the Super Regional and climbing into the Top 10 during the season. A year later, Big Blue Nation took over Omaha.

UK has hosted a regional four times in history, all of which Mingione was on staff for, including twice as head coach.

Additionally, the Cats’ 43 wins in 2017 were just two shy of the school record at the time and the most for a first-year coach in the program’s history. The 19 wins in Southeastern Conference play were the second-most in school history, just one shy of the 2006 championship team’s 20, which Mingione also was a part of as an assistant coach. The 2024 SEC championship team set a new mark with 22 wins. In 2018, the Cats spent the majority of the season in the Top 25, including ten weeks in the Top 10. The 77 victories in Mingione’s first two seasons are the most in a two-year period at UK since John Cohen won 78 games in 2007-08.

Many of those accolades were again rewritten in a record-breaking 2024 season that earned Mingione his second SEC and National Coach of the awards. UK set a new school record with 46 victories and won the SEC regular season crown for just the second time.

The success has carried over to the Major League Baseball Draft, where Mingione and his staff’s ability to groom players for a professional career has led to 43 players being selected. The 21 players selected in the 2017 and 2018 drafts were the most of any program in the country and Mingione has helped mentor two top 20 overall picks in first baseman Evan White (17th, 2017) and left-handed pitcher Zack Thompson (19th, 2019). He added a third first rounder in 2024 (Ryan Waldschmidt) and coupled that with Emilien Pitre (58) to have two UK players selected in the top 60 overall picks in its history.

In 2018, 13 Cats were selected in the draft, the highest total of any program in the country. The total set a new program record for most draftees in a single year, shattering the previous mark of nine. Additionally, UK has had 23 players drafted in the first 10 rounds over the past eight seasons. The 27 underclassmen who have been drafted through 2024 and signed during Mingione’s tenure have garnered a total of \$18.4 million in signing bonus money, more than \$681,400 per draftee.

Already, six players from the 2017 team – RHP Sean Hjelle, LHP Zach Logue, RHP Zach Pop, OF Zach Reks, LHP Zack Thompson and 1B Evan White – have made it to the big leagues. In all, 28 players coached by Mingione during his career have reached The Show.

Mingione – who spent eight seasons as an assistant to Cohen at Mississippi State – was an immediate hit with fans and community leaders. He made it a point to have his team involved in the community, part of his “Student. Person. Player.” guiding principle of the program, participating in numerous philanthropic events in Lexington while also taking time for more than 100 local speaking engagements.

In his first season at UK his ethos for the program was on full display as UK players earned SEC Pitcher of the Year, SEC Scholar Athlete of the Year and SEC Community Service Team honors.

"Nick Mingione is exactly the kind of coach we hoped to hire when we began our search," UK Director of Athletics Mitch Barnhart said. "His passion, tactical mind and tireless recruiting efforts made him an important part of Mississippi State's staff during some great years for the program. More than that, he is a man of substance who is committed not only to developing young men as baseball players, but as students and people."

His impact on the Commonwealth culminated in being named a Kentucky Colonel on Oct. 23, 2017. The designation is the highest honor a civilian can receive in Kentucky. He also was named the 2022 winner of the Fellowship of Christian Athlete's Jerry Kindall Character in Coaching Award for his work on and off the field.

Mingione took over the Kentucky program after serving as assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Cohen at Mississippi State starting before the 2009 season. Working with the team's outfielders, first basemen and hitters, Mingione helped lead MSU to an incredible run of success, including the program's first Southeastern Conference regular-season championship since 1989 in 2016, a runner-up finish in the College World Series in 2013 and an SEC Tournament championship in 2012.

"This is an opportunity I've dreamed about for more than a decade," Mingione said. "From the moment I first stepped foot on campus I knew it would be a place I could call home. What an incredible feeling to be back. Kentucky is a special place and this baseball program has had great moments over the years, including some that I have been a part of."

Prior to his time at Mississippi State, Mingione spent two seasons at UK as an assistant under Cohen in 2006-07. UK won 33 SEC games in those two seasons, including in 2006 when UK claimed its first SEC championship. After the historic regular season, the Wildcats hosted an NCAA Regional for the first time. Mingione worked extensively at UK with the likes of All-American Collin Cowgill and John Shelby III.

Mingione has a sterling reputation as a recruiter. He also has an unmatched track record of player development, coaching 90 players selected in the MLB Draft, as well as 47 All-Americans and six conference players of the year. His first recruiting class at Kentucky was ranked in the Top 10 of all the major industry outlets.

The Cats also have been dominant in the classroom, having 31 players receive SEC Academic Honor Roll and First-Year Honor Roll in 2018, eight more than any other school in the conference. Zach Logue was named the SEC Scholar Athlete of the Year in 2017, Troy Squires won the prestigious Senior CLASS Award in 2018, the first Kentucky player to do so, and Marshall Gei was First-Team Academic All-America in 2019. T.J. Collett then became the second Wildcat in four years to win the Senior CLASS Award when he was honored in 2021. UK also has had an Academic All-American in five of the past six years and Evan Byers was named the NCAA Elite 90 Award winner for top student-athlete at the 2024 College World Series.

Entering 2026, the Cats have had a conference-best 314 players earn All-SEC academic honors, including a league-high 34 in 2020 and 39 in 2021. The program has earned the ABCA's prestigious Team Academic Excellence Award, which requires a cumulative team grade point average of at least 3.00, each of the 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022, 2023, 2024 and 2025 seasons, the only school in the SEC to accomplish that feat.

"Nick Mingione has been preparing for this opportunity for the last 13 years and I absolutely know that he will make the most of it," Cohen said. "He is one of the nation's elite recruiters. He is a brilliant tactician of the game. His ability to prepare kids for success in the SEC is of the highest level."

"He will make himself an irreplaceable part of the Kentucky baseball community and his wife is one of the finest people I've ever met. You try and surround yourself with people who make you a better coach and a better person. Nick Mingione has been that kind of person for me and like a member of my family."

"He's a special coach," LSU coach Jay Johnson said. "They know how to play. They know how to win. Their pitchers know exactly who they are, how to execute it. They know exactly the style of offense that they are, and they play it great. He's a special dude. He's a special competitor. He's a great coach and a great human

being."

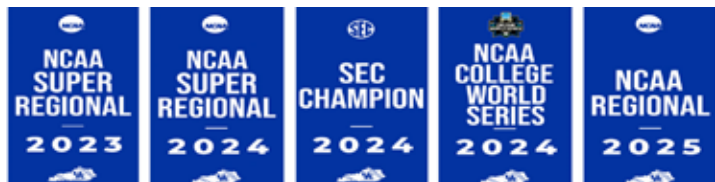
Before rejoining Cohen at MSU, Mingione spent a season at Western Carolina as assistant coach and recruiting coordinator. There, Mingione helped lead the Catamounts to top-40 national ranking in 11 different offensive categories.

Prior to his first stint at Kentucky, Mingione spent three years as an assistant coach at Embry-Riddle University, his alma mater. The Eagles appeared in the NAIA College World Series in each of those seasons, culminating in a runner-up finish in 2005. Mingione also coached at Florida Gulf Coast in 2002, helping lay the foundation for the program before its inaugural season in 2003. He began his coaching career in 2001 at Mariner High School, his alma mater.

Mingione graduated from Embry-Riddle in 2000 with a degree in aerospace studies, as well as a triple minor in business, psychology and humanities. He was also a four-year letterman on the school's baseball team.

Away from coaching, Mingione travels often for both speaking engagements and mission trips. In 2013, he and six current and former members of the MSU program helped build houses and run baseball clinics for youth on the Bahamian island of Eleuthera. When he returned stateside, he was inducted into the "Be The Best You Are" Baseball Clinic Speaker Hall of Fame. Other past inductees include Ted Williams (2002), Ron Polk (2003), Leo Mazzone (2006) and Cohen (2008).

Mingione and his wife, Christen, have one son, Reeves.

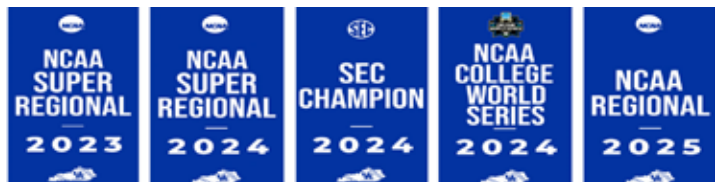

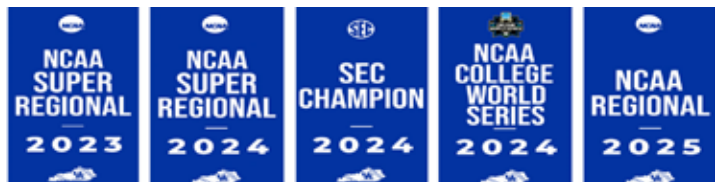

KENTUCKY PROUD PARK

Kentucky baseball moved into a new home for the 2019 season, opening the \$49 million Kentucky Proud Park, a state-of-the-art facility immediately considered one of the top facilities in all of college baseball. The Wildcats won their first game in their new home, defeating Eastern Kentucky, 7-3, on Feb. 26, 2019.

The stadium features permanent seating for nearly 2,500 fans with additional space on grass berms to accommodate 5,000 fans for regular season games. Beyond the outfield wall, temporary bleachers can be installed for NCAA Tournament games to bring the seating capacity to more than 7,000.

The team areas were a priority and give our players and coaches everything they need to compete at a high level in a single location. The facility features a team lounge, locker room, training area, indoor hitting and pitching areas, and coaching offices, as well as a recruiting room. All spaces are either new to UK baseball or significantly larger than previous ones.

The name is a tribute to farmers and businesses of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and the Big Blue Nation. Kentucky Farm Bureau secured the rights to name the stadium from JMI Sports, UK Athletics' multimedia rights partner. In turn, Kentucky Farm Bureau elected to name the stadium for Kentucky Proud, the state's official agricultural marketing program housed at the Kentucky Department of Agriculture. No state taxpayer dollars were used in funding the agreement. The Kentucky Proud program is funded through the generosity of the Kentucky Agricultural Development Fund. The fund is directed by the Kentucky Agricultural Development Board and administered by the Governor's Office of Agricultural Policy.
