Here are the facts:

The cost to other European countries of treating Brits abroad is more than **five times** the cost to the NHS of treating EU visitors here.

(Department of health)

Most migration to the UK is from outside the EU – so controlled by the UK government NOT the EU.

(ONS - Long-Term International Migration Estimates)

Between 2001 and 2011, EU migrants contributed 34% more in taxes than they took out in benefits and services.

(Centre for Research and Analysis of Migration – CreAM, UCL)

Compared to the UK average, EU migrants are much less likely to claim benefits

(Labour force survey)

EU migrant's eligibility for benefits based on National Insurance contributions is dependent on your contributory record – just like everyone else. Unless you are working you cannot get help with emergency or longer term housing from the Council or Housing Benefit.

(UK Visas and Immigration – Guidance on EEA)

- For decades we have not built enough homes since local councils were stopped from building on a large scale in the early 1980s. To tackle the housing crisis we need to build more homes. That is the cause of the housing crisis not migration.
- Government cuts are why NHS waiting times are going up and some services are disappearing altogether not EU migration.
- Between 2001 and 2011 migrants made a net **contribution** to public finances of **£25 billion** (ONS)
- To have a 'right to reside' in the UK after 3 months here you need to be working, self-employed, a student or you have enough money yourself to live on.
