FIIA has concluded two projects that focused on EU's Eastern Neighbourhood and the role of Russia in Finland's neighbouring areas. In addition, the 3rd Helsinki Summer Session focused on various transatlantic topics.

Russia's changing role in Finland's neighbourhood

FIIA has conducted a one-year research project entitled "Russia's changing role in Finland's neighbourhood". The final report examined Russia's political system, the country's energy and Arctic policies as well as its role in the Baltic Sea region security environment and made policy recommendations for the Finnish government.

In October, a Finnish Foreign Policy Paper will be published summarising the conclusions of the project in English.

The project was part of the implementation of the Government Plan for Analysis, Assessment and Research for 2015. It was directed by Teija Tiilikainen and supervised by the Ministry for Foreign Affairs of Finland. At FIIA, the project was coordinated by Toivo Martikainen, and several FIIA researchers contributed to the project.

Key Actors in the EU's Eastern Neighbourhood

On 13 September, FIIA organised the seminar "Changing Geostrategic Tensions around Ukraine" with Dr Stephen Blank as the keynote speaker. The seminar marked the launch of the FIIA report "Key Actors in the EU's Eastern Neighbourhood: Competing perspectives on geostrategic tensions" edited by Kristi Raik and Sinikukka Saari.

Bringing together both FIIA researchers and external experts, the report explores the interests and policies of major states and organisations in the region - EU, Russia, US, Turkey, China and the OSCE. The report concludes that EU foreign policy should not shy away from confrontation at any price, and highlights the need for a more confident and proactive EU foreign policy in the eastern neighbourhood.

The analytical framework of the report was developed during a workshop held in January 2016 in Helsinki, where the authors of individual chapters exchanged ideas with a number of FIIA researchers.

3rd annual Helsinki Summer Session

In September, the Center on US Politics and Power (CUSPP) at FIIA organised the 3rd Helsinki Summer Session on the US Policies in Northern Europe.

This year's themes included US foreign policy after Obama, US-Russia relations, Transatlantic economic relations, NATO in Transatlantic security policy, societal security, stability and cyber, global governance and the US dimension of security in the Northern Baltic Sea Region.

Helsinki Summer Session gathered researchers and experts from the United States and Europe. Keynote speeches were given by Alexander Vershbow, Stephen Flanagan, Donald Jensen, Bruce Oreck, Ronald Marks and James Traub. A FIIA Report based on the Summer Session presentations will be published later.

The CUSPP activities strengthen FIIA's international networks and research on the US global role. Within the framework of CUSPP's Visiting Research Fellow programme, Senior Visiting Fellow Leo Michel, an expert on US foreign and defence
