## The Nordic Foreign Policy Institutes strengthen cooperation

The five Nordic institutes of International Affairs have recently established more systematic cooperation thanks to funding made available by the Nordic Council of Ministers.

This new cooperation covers an exchange programme for researcher visits between the institutes. During 2016–2017 13 researchers visited another Nordic institute for up to one year. Joint research projects have been established on issues such as Brexit, Russian foreign policy and Nordic responses to geopolitical changes.

The five Nordic institutes also engage in an annual roundtable with key Chinese foreign policy institutes where topics of common interest are discussed.

## Upcoming report on North Korea

In October, FIIA will publish a report, *North Korean Conundrum: International responses and future challenges*, edited by Senior Research Fellow [Elina Sinkkonen](#). The report provides an overview of the so-called North Korea problem and discusses the main options that the international community has at its disposal for dealing with it.

The study is the final report of Sinkkonen's research project "Geopolitical and Ideological Tensions on the Korean Peninsula



and Their Regional Ramifications" partly funded by the Korea Foundation. Project Director [Bart Gaens](#) and Senior Research Fellow [Katja Creutz](#) also contributed to the project.

## CUSPP Summer Session

The fourth FIIA Center on US Politics and Power (CUSPP) Summer Session took place on 29–31 August. The event brought together prominent American, European and Finnish experts to discuss the theme "Reimagining Transatlantic Relations in the Trump Era".

Among the panelists were President of the US–Russia Foundation Celeste Wallander, former US Secretary of Defence's Representative to Europe [Robert Bell](#), Foreign Policy columnist [James Traub](#), and Professor [Andrew Michta](#), Dean of the College of International Security Studies at the Marshall Center. Key topics explored at the conference included security in the Baltic Sea region and the High North, external influence on Western elections, the fate of the liberal rules-based international order and the evolution of great power relations in the 21st century.

Before next year's Summer Session, FIIA will publish a report which will further develop the themes raised during the conference.

The event was organized with the support of the Jane and Aatos Erkko Foundation, and in cooperation with the United States Embassy in Finland and the Finnish Ministry for Foreign Affairs.

In his **essay on China**, Sitra's Teppo Turkki focuses on the concept of Chinese meritocracy. Beijing admires Singapore, which has created a modern mix of Chinese culture, capable leaders and a strong state. Those are the ingredients with which China seeks to become the leading power.
