Be visible

Have the appropriate lighting on vehicles or wear reflective clothing for better visibility.



Keep a safe distance

Leave at least a one-meter distance between other road users to allow them to have a safe space.



Yield to pedestrians

Pay attention to walkers at crossovers, crosswalkers, and school crossings.



Be mindful

Always be respectful, courteous, cautious, and patient with other road users.



Remain focused at all times

Minimize distractions like using your phone, wearing headphones, or scrolling through your playlist.



Follow the rules of the road

Ensure road safety by making complete stops, crossing only in permitted areas, and using hand signals.
